Next Up

Following a week off, the NM State football team is set to travel to Albuquerque, N.M. to take on Rio Grande Rival New Mexico on Saturday at 6 p.m. The contest will air on ROOT Sports and will be broadcast on AM 570 in Las Cruces. The Aggies dropped a heartbreaking 50-47 overtime loss to Battle of I-10 rival UTEP on Sept. 19. After NM State took an early lead on their first drive, the two teams traded touchdowns often for a regulation score that was knotted at 44-44. The Aggies began overtime with the ball, and freshman Parker Davidson hit his second career field goal, this time a 44-yard score, to give the home team the lead. On UTEP's drive, Miner quarterback Ryan Metz found Cedrick Lang in the end zone for a 6-yard pass and the win. NM State led the game in passing yards with 285 yards compared to UTEP's 273 yards and in total offense with 551 yards to the Miners' 542 yards. The Aggies scored on all six red zone chances with five touchdowns and one field goal from inside the 20-yard line. Davidson also went 2-for-2 on field goals. Larry Rose III continues to lead the Aggies' rushing efforts as he amassed 196 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries. The sophomore averaged 9.8 yards per carry and had a long rush of 82 yards. Rose III now has 329 total rushing yards and three touchdowns. He averages 109.7 yards per game and 6.6 yards per carry. Teldrick Morgan racked up 151 yards and a touchdown on four receptions. The Hanover, Md. native had a long reception of 78 yards against the Miners. He also collected 45 return yards and nine rushing yards for a game-high 205 all-purpose yards. Morgan is second on the team in receiving yards with 249 on 13 catches. He averages 83.0 yards per game and 19.2 yards per catch. Tyrian Taylor leads the team in receiving with 264 yards and three touchdowns on 14 catches. The junior chipped in 39 receiving yards and a touchdown on two catches against UTEP. Tyler Rogers completed 14 of his 28 pass attempts for 285 yards and three touchdowns. Rogers has seven touchdowns on the season and has thrown for 866 yards through the first three games. Overall, the junior has completed 60-of-111 pass attempts for a 54.1 percent completion rate. Jaden Wright garnered a career-high 15 tackles against UTEP. He has a team-high 33 tackles on the season, with 19 unassisted tackles and 14 assisted tackles. The sophomore also has one interception and one fumble recovery returned for a touchdown. Derek Ibekwe ranks second on the team in tackles. He amassed 12 tackles, one tackle for loss and one fumble recovery against the Miners. Overall, Ibekwe has 23 tackles, one tackle for loss and a forced fumble this season. NM State and New Mexico have a long history, with their first meeting occurring on New Year's Day in 1894, eight years before the first Rose Bowl. The teams played six games against each other before New Mexico became a state. New Mexico leads the series 69-31-5 and has won the last three meetings. NM State last defeated the Lobos on Oct. 1, 2011 as they captured a 42-28 win in Albuquerque. UNM holds a 2-2 record on the season after defeating Wyoming 38-28 last Saturday. Lamar Jordan racked up 150 rushing yards and one touchdown on 15 carries, while Jhurell Pressley added a touchdown and 109 yards on 17 carries. Richard McQuarley gained 55 yards and scored two touchdowns on five carries.

Storylines

- NM State's game captains were Rodney Butler (defense), Alex Trujillo (defense), Robert Wagner (defense), Teldrick Morgan (offense) and Andy Cunningham (offense).
- NM State wore special commemorative helmets with the Zia Sun Symbol as the decal. This is the first time these decals have been worn on an NM State helmet.
- NM State led 13-9 at the end of the first quarter. This is the first time the Aggies have led at the end of the first quarter since 2002 when they held a 21-7 lead against UTEP in Aggie Memorial Stadium.
- This was the first overtime game for NM State since 2005 when they fell 38-37 in double-overtime to Idaho in Aggie Memorial Stadium.
- Greg Hogan scored his first touchdown of the season.
- Teldrick Morgan had a career-long 77-yard reception in the third guarter. NM State scored on the next snap.
- Larry Rose III had a career-long 82 yard rush. On the next snap, Rogers completed an 8-yard pass to Tyrian Taylor for a touchdown.

- Jacob Nwangwa had his first career interception, which he returned 41-yards for a touchdown, in the third quarter. This was the first time an Aggie returned an interception for a touchdown since Davon House against Hawai'i in 2010.
- Quarterback Tyler Rogers had his second career punt, this time a 23-yard punt for a touchback.
- Freshman Parker Davidson kicked his first career field goal, a 38-yard field goal to give NM State a 16-9 lead. He also made a 44-yard field goal to take the lead in overtime
- Tyler Rogers accounted for four touchdowns (3 pass, 1 rush). He is the first Aggie to have done this since Kenny Turner vs. Fresno State in 2011.



THIRD SEASON • OCOACHMARTINNMSU

Doug Martin begins his third season at the helm of the NM State football program in 2015. The Aggies joined the Sun Belt Conference for the 2014 season after playing as an independent team during Martin's inaugural season at NM State.

Martin was officially announced as the Aggies' 34th head football coach on Feb. 1, 2013, after the departure of former head coach DeWayne Walker to the NFL. Martin was no stranger to the NM State program as he was the Aggie offensive coordinator under Walker in 2011.

NM State went 2-10 for the second year in a row in 2014. During Martin's second year, the Aggies began the season 2-0 for the first time since 1999. After topping Cal Poly in a 28-10 victory, NM State defeated Georgia State, 34-31, in its first Sun Belt Conference game.

The Aggies also faced I-10 rival UTEP, Rio Grande rival New Mexico and No. 17 LSU in 2014. Under Martin's tutelage, Larry Rose III became the first freshman to rush for over 100 yards against LSU since 2011. Later in the season, Rose III rushed for 229 yards against UL-Monroe to become the first NM State player to rush for over 200 yards since 2003 when Eric Higgins ran for 218 yards. This feat ranked Rose III as No. 7 all-time for single game performances.

With Martin guiding him, Rose III amassed 1,102 yards over the season to become the first 1,000 yard rusher since Kenny Turner in 2011. This was also the first time a freshman rushed for over 1.000 yards since Denvis Manns in 1995.

As a team, the Aggies averaged 420.9 yards of total offense per game after amassing 2,252 rushing yards and 2,899 receiving yards through 12 games. Defensively, NM State had two players amass triple-digit tackling on the season as Rodney Butler racked up 119 tackles and Derek Ibekwe accumulated 102 tackles. In addition, 21 student-athletes garnered double-digit tackles on the season. In all, the defense had 1,028 tackles, fivesacks, 11 interceptions and 10 fumble recoveries.

NM State went 2-10 in 2013 during Martin's first season as head coach after playing one of the toughest schedules in the school's history. The Aggies faced five teams that had participated in a bowl game the previous season while also playing two teams ranked in the top 15 in the nation.

NM State kicked off the 2013 season with a trip to Austin, Texas, to face the 15th-ranked Texas Longhorns and also made a trip to Los Angeles during the season to play No. 13 UCLA. The Aggies' home schedule included games versus Minnesota, which was the first school out of the Big Ten to play at Aggie Memorial Stadium, and Boston College, which was the first school out of the Atlantic Coast Conference to make a trip to Las Cruces.

The Aggies averaged 20.9 points per game and 382.2 yards per game in 2013, including 141.8 yards per game on the ground and 240.5 yards per game through the air. The team had a season-high 224 yards rushing against Abilene Christian on Oct. 26 and a season-high 380 yards passing and receiving versus Boston College

on Nov. 9.

Martin's influence and system began to take shape during the final five games of the season as NM State went 2-3 in those games and had fourth-quarter chances for a win in two of the three losses.

Martin would start making an impact on the squad as soon as he accepted the head coaching position. Before the season began, the Aggies had four players placed on six different preseason watch lists, the most for any NM State football team in the school's history. NM State also had 12 players honored on the College Sports Madness Independent Preseason All-Conference team and 11 players on the Phil Steele College Football Preview All-Independent team.

During the season, senior safety Davis Cazares was nominated as a Bulsworth Trophy finalist, honoring the most outstanding collegiate football player who began his career as a walk-on. Linebacker Clint Barnard would be named to the Capital One Academic All-District VII first team. The Aggies would also pick up three FBS Independent Player of the Week nods in 2013 under Martin, Cazares and Barnard on the defensive side and punter Cayle Chapman-Brown on special

At the conclusion of the 2013 season, NM State would place five players on the All-Independent Football team including Cazares, Trashaun Nixon, Austin Franklin, Andy Cunningham and Davonte Wallace.

In 2012, Martin left his offensive coordinator position at NM State to take the same position for Boston College out of the ACC. The Eagles ranked 47th in the nation in passing offense, as Martin guided wide receiver Alex Amidon and offensive tackle Emmett Cleary to All-ACC honors. Amidon finished the season ranked 11th among all receivers in the country in receiving yards per game (100.8). He ranked second among all ACC receivers in both receptions per game (6.5) and receiving yards per game.

As the offensive coordinator for the Aggies in 2011, Martin helped NM State rank 47th in the country in total offense and 26th in passing offense. He helped guide the Aggies to a win over Minnesota, the program's first win against a team from the Big Ten. Under Martin, the Aggies had three All-WAC selections in wide receiver Taveon Rogers, offensive tackle Davonte Wallace and running back Kenny Turner. Quarterback Matt Christian led the Aggies with 2,158 vards passing and 15 touchdowns in 2011.

With seven seasons under his belt as the head coach at Kent State University and eight as the offensive coordinator, Martin was instrumental in building a true football program at the university. A total of 20 Golden Flashes earned All-Mid-American Conference accolades from 2007-10, including Eugene Jarvis, who was atop the active Football Bowl Subdivision running backs list with 3,722 career yards on the ground, and Brian Lainhart, whose 17 career interceptions was also tops among active FBS players.

In 2010, Roosevelt Nix was named the MAC Defensive Player of the Year under Martin's watch. Also under Martin, four players were

selected in the NFL draft including Jameson Konz (2010 - 7th round, Seattle Seahawks), Usama Young (2007 - 3rd round, New Orleans Saints), Jack Williams (2008 - 4th round, Denver Broncos) and Julian Edelman (2009 - 7th round, New England Patriots), with Young becoming the sixth-highest pick in the history of the program.

Over the past four years, Martin's offense at Kent State recorded a remarkable 16,907 yards of total offense, averaging 422.6 yards per game during that spanned including 26.3 points a game.

In December of 2006, Martin signed a four-year extension that kept him in Blue and Gold through 2010. The extension rewarded a 2006 campaign that saw Kent State pull off the fourth-largest turnaround in the nation, improving by five wins over the previous year's total.

Included in the performance was a five-game winning streak, including four straight MAC victories - the Flashes' longest conference streak ever. Furthermore, the nation's 25th-ranked team in total defense in 2006, limited Miami and Bowling Green to a combined 17 points as Kent State won road games against the RedHawks and Falcons in the same season for the first time since 1972. Kent State saw five players earn All-MAC accolades.

In addition to his head coaching duties, Martin also served as quarterbacks' coach and was the offensive coordinator for all but the 2009 season.

Martin is widely regarded as one of the nation's premier quarterback mentors. His list of protégés includes three-time All-Conference USA selection and current NFL passer David Garrard, record-setting CFL quarterback Marcus Crandell and other pros Richard Alston and Joshua Cribbs, who both played quarterback in college under Martin before switching positions in the NFL.

In 2005, Martin's spread passing attack posted the third-highest yardage total in school history while the team's 15 touchdown passes were the sixth most in a single year at Kent State. The Flashes also reached the 30-point mark three times in 2005, running the total number of games with at least that many points to 16 since 2003.

In Martin's first season, the Golden Flashes posted a 5-6 overall record, winning their final four games for the program's longest winning streak since 1976. The team also finished in fourth place in the MAC East Division with a 4-4 mark while producing three All-MAC players and two honorable mention All-Americans.

Martin also handled the offensive play-calling duties and the unit responded to his coaching, scoring 335 points and racking up 4,168 yards, the second- and third-highest totals, respectively, in school history.

Under his guidance, the Flashes averaged 30.5 points per game, just the third time in school history a team averaged 30 or more points. The team also set a single-game scoring mark in its 69-17 win over Eastern Michigan Nov. 13. Four times in 2004 the Flashes totaled more than 400 yards on offense, including two games over 500.

Additionally, in two years tutoring All-MAC quarterback Joshua Cribbs, Martin saw Cribbs develop into one of the top dual threats in the country. Always a talented runner, Cribbs finished his career as the owner of KSU career records for total offense, passing yardage, touchdowns, points and completions. He also ranked fourth nationally in total offense and completed a school-record 64.5 percent of his passes. As a team, the Flashes had a completion rate of 62.8 percent, also a school record.

While his spread offensive style is his calling card, Martin revamped his defensive coaching staff and saw that unit go from ranking 12th of 14 teams in the MAC in total defense in 2003 to first in the league in 2004. It marked the first time since 1987 that the team led the MAC in total defense and just the second time since joining the conference in 1951. Kent State also ranked 15th nationally in total defense.

Martin was named the school's 19th head coach on March 1, 2004, replacing Dean Pees. Martin joined the Kent State staff in January 2003 as offensive coordinator. After just one year on the staff, Martin made an instant impact on the Golden Flashes' offense. In its first season under Martin's system, Kent State averaged 26.8 points per game, the second-highest in the last 30 years, and scored 30-or-more points in each of the final six games and did so in a school-record eight games overall.

From 2002-04 Martin's teams averaged nearly 30 points per game and posted the highest offensive totals in back-to-back years in school history. From 2002-03 alone, scoring offense increased by 10 points, touchdowns grew from 24 to 40, total offense was up by more than 40 yards per game and passing yardage increased by nearly 100 yards per game.

In 2004, that trend continued as the Flashes' increased their scoring, touchdowns, passing yards and total yards per game.

Martin arrived at Kent State following 11 seasons at East Carolina University, the last seven of which he was in charge of the team's offense. He was at ECU for all of Steve Logan's tenure there, serving as the tight ends coach and special teams coordinator for two seasons (1992-93), then another two years as wide receivers coach (1994-95) before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 1996.

At East Carolina, Martin played a significant role in the development of quarterback David Garrard, who broke 28 school passing records and total offensive records from 1998-01. In addition, Martin coached the top three receivers in ECU history. During Martin's time at ECU, the team advanced to five bowl games; the Liberty Bowl in 1994 and 1995, the GMAC (formerly Mobile Alabama) Bowl in 1999 and 2001 and the galleryfurniture.com Bowl in 2000.

Prior to joining the staff at East Carolina, Martin was a graduate assistant at the University of Kentucky, his alma mater, from 1986-87 and then spent the 1988-91 seasons at East Tennessee State University, where he coached the running backs his first year, then served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks/wide receivers coach his final three seasons.

Martin was a four-year letterwinner at Kentucky from 1981-84, spending time as a part-time starter at quarterback before injuries limited him to the holder role. A native of Oak Ridge, Tenn., Martin earned a bachelor's degree in history from Kentucky in 1985.

Martin and his wife Vicki have a daughter, Molly, and two sons, Cory and Bobby.

The Series: NM State vs. New Mexico

The Lobos lead the series 69-31-5... New Mexico has won the last three meetings, which includes a 38-35 victory in 2014... The Aggies last won in 2011 with a 42-28 victory on Oct. 1... NM State and UNM first played each other on Jan. 1, 1894, which was eight years before the first Rose Bowl... The two teams played six games before New Mexico became a state in 1912... The two teams used to trade the Maloof Trophy, which was presented by First Security Bank to the winner of "The Big Game"; this trophy was first traded in 1993, but was discontinued in 2001... The two athletic departments announced the introduction of a new traveling trophy in 2007... The NM State vs. UNM rivalry series (called the Rio Grande Rivalry) began during the 2007-08 athletic calendar year and allows each school to earn points based on each athletic victory over the other school in each sport; there are 25.5 possible points, and if two teams face each other more than once during the year, each game will have points on the line; at the end of the year, the winner receives the trophy and holds it for a year.

NM State 35, New Mexico 38 September 20, 2014

Aggies Fall in Back-and-Forth Contest with In-State Rival New Mexico

LAS CRUCES, N.M. — Tyler Rogers racked up 333 passing yards as the New Mexico State football team dropped a heartbreaking 38-31, back-and-forth game to in-state rival New Mexico on Saturday night in Aggie Memorial Stadium.

The Aggies (2-2) used a strong defensive effort to limit New Mexico (1-2) to just 67 passing yards.

Xavier Hall led the NM State rushing effort with 15 carries for 61-yards, while Tyler Rogers added 44-yards on just five attempts.

In addition to his rushing yards, Rogers completed 32-of-47 passes for his 333 passing yards. He completed nine of these passes to Teldrick Morgan for 122-yards. Josep Matthews chipped in eight receptions for 79-yards.

Derek Ibekwe racked up 13 tackles to lead the NM State defense, including six solo tackles, while Kawe Johnson garnered 12 tackles.

Cole Gautsche and Clayton Mitchem completed 2-of-6 passes for 13-yards and 2-of-4 passes for 20-yards, respectively, while Crusoe Gonbay led the Lobos with 139 rushing yards on 16 attempts.

The rivals traded possession of the ball for the first five drives of the game, with the Aggie defense holding New Mexico to a missed-field goal attempt, but the Lobos were able to put points on the board first. The visitors used a three-play, 52-yard drive as Jhurell Pressley racked up a rushing touchdown to give New Mexico a 7-0 advantage with 00:57 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

NM State responded with a nine-play, 67-yard touchdown of their own at the beginning of the second half. The Aggies opened the drive with an 18-yard pass from Rogers to Matthews and concluded the play as Rogers rushed into the end zone for an 18-yard touchdown to knot the score at 7-7.

The Lobos then regained the lead with a 10-play, 72-yard drive, capped by a 27-yard rushing touchdown from Quinton McCown for a 14-7 advantage, but the Aggies responded quickly with a touchdown of their own. Rogers and Matthew connected again, this time to cap a 13-play, 75-yard drive as the quarterback found the receiver on a nine-yard pass into the end zone.

New Mexico responded with a touchdown of their own. This time, it took six plays and 65-yards as the Lobos extended their lead to 21-14, a score the two teams would take into the locker room.

NM State drew even with the Lobos early in the second half as Hall used a three-yard rush to reach the end zone, a run that completed the Aggies' four-play, 12-yard drive with 11:13 in the third quarter.

The home team took its first lead of the game after limiting UNM to a 28-yard field goal. Hall racked up another rushing touchdown, this time a 17-yard run with 3:04 left in the third quarter to give NM State a 28-24 lead.

The Lobos then used 8 plays and 54 yards as Gonbay rushed for a 17-yard touchdown of his own to put New Mexico back on top, 31-28, but 14 plays and 74 yards later, Rogers completed a 10-yard pass to Joshua Bowen for a touchdown and a 35-31 lead.

New Mexico used 10 plays and 65 yards, concluded with a five-yard pass from Jordan to Reece White to give New Mexico the victory.

The Aggies take the gridiron again next Saturday as they travel to LSU for a 5:30 p.m. (MT) kickoff in Tiger Stadium.

Notables

- NM State led 13-9 at the end of the first quarter. This is the first time the Aggies have led at the end of the first quarter since 2002 when they held a 21-7 lead against UTEP in Aggie Memorial Stadium. The Aggies also led at the end of the first half, which is the first time this has happened since 2011.
- This was the first overtime game for NM State since 2005 when they fell 38-37 in double-overtime to Idaho in Aggie Memorial Stadium.
- Teldrick Morgan had a career-long 77-yard touchdown in the third guarter. NM State scored on the next snap.
- Larry Rose III had a career-long 82 yard rush.
- Jacob Nwangwa had his first career interception, which he returned 41-yards for a touchdown, in the third quarter.
- Freshman Parker Davidson kicked his first career field goal, a 38-yard field goal to give NM State a 16-9 lead. He then remained calm under pressure and kicked a 44-yard field goal in overtime to take the lead for the home team.

The Paul Hornung Award, presented by Texas Roadhouse and the Louisville Sports Commission, is given annually to the most versatile player in major college football.

1,000-yard rusher

Larry Rose III racked up a team-high 1,102 rushing yards and nine touchdowns on 186 carries during the 2014 season. The Fair-field, Texas native became the first NM State player to eclipse the 1,000-yard rushing mark since 2011 and was the first freshman to accomplish this feat since 1995. Rose III had a career-high 229 rushing yards against UL-Monroe on Nov. 22 to become one of just six conference players to rush for more than 200 yards in a single game.

Veteran Offensive Line

NM State returns four starting offensive linemen from the 2014 roster. Thomas McGwire (right tackle), Houston Clemente (left Tackle), Isaiah Folasa (left guard) and Abram Holland (left tackle). The Aggies are one of just 34 schools with four starters returning for the offensive line. Additionally, Andy Cunningham, who had three starts, and Dezmand Candielaria, who started in four games, will also be returning for the 2015 season.

Team Captains

Rodney Butler

During the 2014 season, Butler led the Aggies with 119 tackles, which included 58 unassisted and 61 assisted tackles to earn a Second Team All-Sun Belt selection. Butler collected eight games with double-digit tackles and had a career-high 17 tackles at UTEP on Sept. 13.

Alex Trujillo

Trujillo played in five games during the 2014 season and started against UTEP. The redshirt senior amassed 10 tackles and one tackle for loss during his five games.

Robert Wagner

During the 2014 season, Wagner appeared in five games. The redshirt junior helped the defensive unit garner 14 tackles for loss and four forced fumbles during his five games.

Teldrick Morgan

Morgan had 75 receptions for 903 yards to average 12.0 yards per catch and 82.1 receiving yards per game in 2014. The redshirt junior had a career-long 57-yard reception at UTEP on his way to a personal-best 202 receiving yards. Overall, Morgan amassed four games of at least 100 receiving yards, eight games with 50 or more receiving yards and seven touchdowns. Morgan was recently selected to the Preseason All-Sun Belt Second Team.

Andy Cunningham

Cunningham, a four year starter, has played every position on the offensive line. He played in the first six games of the 2014 season before being sidelined due to injury for the second time in his collegiate career. Prior to his injury, the redshirt senior helped anchor an offensive line that allowed Tyler Rogers to throw for 1,471 yards and Larry Rose III to rush for 290 yards in the first half the season.
