GAME STORYLINES

▶ The game is dubbed "Military Night" and UH will honor the 75th anniversary of the bombing of Pearl Harbor by recognizing the Varsity Victory Volunteers (VVV), primarily made up of UH ROTC students. The VVV included a pair of UH football legends and Circle of Honor inductees - Tommy Kaulukukui, who served as lieutenant, and Jyun "Curly" Hirota, one of 169 VVV members.

▶ The family of the late U.S. Congressman Mark Takai will serve as the game's honorary captains. UH has been wearing a decal of his initials (KMT) on their helmets throughout the season.

▶ A UH win would give the Warriors their most league wins in a single-season since joining the Mountain West in 2012 and their highest overall win total since 2010 (10).

▶ UH is averaging 36.0 points in MW play and have scored at least 34 points in each game. UNM leads the MW in scoring, averaging 40.0 points per game.

▶ Wide receiver **Marcus Kemp** has 277 yards on 13 catches with two TDs in the last two games. Seven of his 13 catches went for 20+ yards.

▶ Linebacker **Jahlani Tavai** is the reigning MW Defensive Player of the Week, after tallying 13 tackles (10 solo), 2.5 TFL, a sack, and forced a fumble in the third quarter which led to a game-tying field goal.

▶ The Lobos have won the last six meetings in the series since 1993. Prior to that, UH had won nine straight in the series which began in 1964.

ABOUT NEW MEXICO

- ▶ UNM improved to 4-3 overall with a 59-17 non-conference win over ULM last Saturday in Albuquerque.
- ▶ The Lobos have won their last two games (Air Force and ULM) and three of four.
- ▶ UNM is 0-2 in road games (1-0 in neutral site) with losses to New Mexico State and Rutgers.
- ▶ UNM leads the Mountain West in scoring average (40.0), rushing offense (374.1), and total offense (484.3).
- ▶ Leading rusher Tyron Owens rushed for 171 yards on just nine carries, including an 83-yard TD run in the first quarter last week vs. ULM. Owens leads the team with 687 yards (7.8 ypc), which ranks fifth in the MW.
- ▶ Running back Teriyon Gipson is averaging 124.6 yards in five games played with a team-best 13.0 yards per carry.
- ▶ Richard McQuarley has 10 rushing TDs on the season.
- ▶ Head coach Bob Davie has a 22-35 record in his sixth season at UNM. In his 11-year head coaching career, he boasts a 57-60 mark.
- ▶ UH leads the series 14-9, including an 11-5 advantage in Honolulu.
- ▶ Prior to UNM's current six-game win streak in the series, UH had won the previous nine from 1983-91.
- ▶ In last season's game, UH kicker Rigoberto Sanchez missed a 22-yard field goal attempt in the closing minutes and the Lobos marched down field with a touchdown for a 28-27 win.

HAWAII-AFA POST GAME NOTES SERIES INFORMATION

- ▶ Hawaii and Air Force met for the 21st time and the eighth time in Colorado Springs. Air Force leads 13-7-1 overall. Air Force leads 6-2 in Colorado Springs.
- ▶ UH defeated Air Force for just the second time in the last eight meetings.
- ▶ UH regains possession of the Kuter Trophy. UH's last win against the Falcons came in 2001 and their last win in Colorado Springs was in 1992.
- ▶ UH moved to 7-29 all-time in the Mountain West and 3-14 in conference road games.

STREAKS

- ▶ UH has won back-to-back road games for the first time since 2010 (at Fresno State and Utah State).
- ▶ UH has not trailed at halftime in the last four games (last at Arizona).
- ▶ UH has turned the ball over at least once in each game this season and in 17 straight dating back to last season.
- ▶ Dru Brown's streak of 118 consecutive passes without an interception came to an end when Brodie Hicks picked him off in the red zone in the first quarter.
- ▶ Steven Lakalaka scored a TD in his sixth straight game and has scored in 7-of-8 games this season.
- ▶ Dejon Allen made his 32nd straight start, the longest streak on the offensive side of the ball.

TEAM NOTES

- ▶ UH won just for the third time in its last 18 conference road games.
- ▶ UH won away from Aloha Stadium for just the third time in the last 30 games.
- ▶ UH played its first overtime game since a 59-56 loss at Wyoming in 2013. UH improved to 8-4 overall in overtime and 6-1 on the road. UH's last overtime win came at San Jose State in 2009.
- ▶ UH led at halftime on the road for the second time this season (also 24-10 at San Jose State)
- ▶ UH won its second consecutive day game and for just the third time in its last 17 day games dating back to 2012.
- ▶ Through eight games, UH has already passed its 2015 totals in wins (4), points (247), first downs (165), TDs (32, 17 rush, 15 pass)

INDIVIDUAL PLAYER NOTES

- ▶ Dru Brown finished the game with career highs in yards (312), touchdowns (3), attempts (37) and interceptions (2).
- ▶ It was the first 300-yard performance by a UH quarterback since Ikaika Woolsey (356 yards) vs. Utah State in 2014.
- ▶ Steven Lakalaka's nine rushing touchdowns this season are the most since Alex Green scored

18 rushing touchdowns in 2010.

- ▶ Marcus Kemp recorded a 41-yard reception in the second quarter and has nine catches on the year over 30 yards.
- ▶ Kemp finished with a career-high 151 yards receiving on six catches and posted his second straight 100-yard game, third this season and ninth of his career.
- ▶ Kemp moved past Royce Pollard and Channon Harris for 12th on the school's all-time receiving list and now has 2,257 career yards.
- ▶ John Ursua tallied career-highs of seven catches and 108 yards, including a 40-yard touchdown reception from Dru Brown that tied the game 20-20 in the 4th quarter.
- ▶ Rigoberto Sanchez made a successful field goal for the sixth game this season, and improved to a perfect at 8-for-8 on the year with field goals of 25- and 35-yards.
- ▶ Redshirt freshman Rojesterman Farris made his first career start at cornerback in place of an injured Jamal Mayo and finished with two tackles.

HAWAII IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

Hawaii holds a **7-29 (.194)** record in its fifth season in the Mountain West. UH's three MW wins this season is tied for the most in a single-season (3 in 2014). Hawaii is 4-15 (.211) in MW home games and are 3-14 (.176) in road games.

BIG TEST

UH's next three MW opponents (New Mexico, San Diego State, Boise State) have a combined 8-1 league record while SDSU and BSU lead their respective divisions with 3-0 marks. In contrast, UH's four previous MW opponents have a combined 5-11 record.

BOWL IN THEIR SIGHTS

UH will need to win three of its final five regular season games in order to become bowl eligible for the first time since 2010. The Warriors will earn a spot into the Hawaii Bowl on Christmas Eve with seven wins.

BIG-PLAY 'BOWS

The Warriors have accumulated at least seven "explosive" plays in each of the past four games. In last Saturday's win at Air Force, UH tallied a season-high eight explosive plays — seven pass plays of over 20 yards and one run play over 20. On the season, Hawaii has 47 explosive plays — 30 passing, 16 rushing, 1 special teams — for an average of nearly six per game. Of those, 12 have gone for touchdowns, including the longest pass play from scrimmage — 62 yards from Ikaika Woolsey to Marcus Kemp vs. UT Martin, and the longest rush — 62 yards by Dru Brown against San José State.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?

Quarterback Dru Brown became the first UH quarterback to win his first two career starts since Tim Carey in 1997 with wins over Nevada and San José State. In four games as UH's starter, Brown has thrown for 1,038 yards on 77-of-120 passing and nine touchdowns. The Monte Sereno, Calif., native, had a streak of 118 consecutive attempts without an interception snapped with a first quarter interception against Air Force last Saturday. However, in that game, Brown threw for a career-high 312 yards (21-of-37) and three scores in leading UH to a double-overtime win. Two of his TDs went to wideout Marcus Kemp in each overtime. Brown currently ranks third among MW quarterbacks in passing efficiency (147.4) and fourth in completion percentage (62.0).

2K KEMP

With a career-high 151 yards receiving against Air Force, senior wideout Marcus Kemp moved into 12th place on the program's all-time receiving list with 2,257 yards. The Layton, Utah native, is just the 15th player to surpass 2,000 career receiving yards and is on pace for a 1,000-yard single-season, which would be the 19th time in school history. Kemp also has 145 career receptions and 11 touchdowns. This season, he has 42 catches for 787 yards and six scores. He ranks second in the Mountain West and 17th nationally, averaging 98.4 yards per game while his 5.3 receptions per game average ranks fourth in the MW.

MR. TOUCHDOWN

Scoring touchdowns is becoming a common theme each game for running back Steven Lakalaka. The Honolulu native, has scored at least one touchdown in each of the past six games and boasts a team-high nine scores this season. Lakalaka is third on the team with 317 yards (4.9 ypc) and has reached the endzone in seven of eight games. With 1,618 career rushing yards, Lakalaka ranks 14th on the all-time UH rushing list. He has only one lost fumble in 412 career touches (385 rushing attempts, 27 receptions).

A RESURGENT D

The UH defense has made huge strides in helping UH win three of its first four Mountain West games. In wins over Nevada, San José State, and Air Force, the UH D combined for 11 sacks and 27 tackles-for-loss. The UH secondary came up with three interceptions at SJSU, the highest total in four years, and six sacks, the highest total in five years. Against, Air Force, UH forced three turnovers — two fumbles and the game-winning interception by Jalen Rogers in the second overtime. Under defensive coordinator Kevin Lempa, UH is looking more and more like the play-making outfits that he ran during his first stint as DC in 2000-02.

#4 STEVEN LAKALAKA, RB

RUNNING WITH THE 'BOWS

Through the halfway point of the season, UH has already tallied its highest rushing touchdown (17) total since 2011 (22). At 183.0 yards per game, the Warriors are also on pace to rush for their highest total since 1995. Against Nevada, UH ran for a season-high 344 yards on the ground, the third highest single-game total in the last two decades. Running back Diocemy Saint Juste became just the 10th player in school history to surpass the 200-yard mark finishing with 205 yards on 19 carries for a remarkable 10.8 yards per carry against the Wolf Pack.

THE GOLDEN BOOT

Multi-talented all-MW honorable mention kicker Rigoberto Sanchez is once again proving to be one of the team's most valuable weapons. Last year he was one of only five kickers in the FBS who handled all of the kicking duties. He's doing the same once again this year. Sanchez has converted on all 39 of his kicks — 8-of-8 in field goals and 31-of-31 in PATs this year, including a career-long 55-yard boot at Michigan. The 55-yarder was one yard shy of the school record. Sanchez is averaging 44.4 yards on his punts (17th nationally) with 12 inside the 20 and 12 punts of 50+ yards. The Hamilton City, Calif., native, was picked as the MW's Special Teams Player of the Week after converting two field goals and averaging 44.5 yards on six punts versus San José State.

MOVING THE BALL

UH's new spread offense has produced five games of 400+ yards of total offense, including a season-high 566 yards (344 rush, 222 pass) against Nevada. Thus far, UH ranks fourth in the Mountain West and 57th nationally, averaging 418.9 yards per game. The Warriors are seventh in the MW and 54th nationally in rushing (183.0) and second

in the MW and 60th nationally in passing (235.9). UH cracked the 400-yard mark just four times in each of the past two seasons.

GOOD TO HAVE YOU BACK

After sitting out most of the 2015 season with a knee injury, ball-hawk Trayvon Henderson has returned to his safety position and making a mark on the defense. The Sacramento, Calif., native, recorded his sixth career interception against San José State, and his first in nearly two years. Henderson currently ranks second on the team with 56 tackles (41 solo, 15 assisted). He also has 5.0 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, one interception and five pass breakups. He began the year with 12 tackles versus Cal and had nine against Arizona and posted a career-high three PBUs against UNLV.

WOOLSEY PASSES ROLO

With his 15-yard touchdown pass to John Ursua in the first quarter at Arizona, Ikaika Woolsey moved past his coach Nick Rolovich for ninth all-time on the UH passing yardage list. He finished the game with 117 yards passing and now has 4,233 career passing yards.

Mark Takai, a former UH swimmer and ardent supporter of the University of Hawai'i, who passed away this past summer after a year-long battle with cancer.

FREQUENT FLYERS

Through the course of the 13-game slate, the Rainbow Warriors will make seven road trips and play in four different time zones, including a trek to Sydney, Australia. UH will rack up 46,568 miles by air during the season, enough to circle the globe twice. The "Road Warriors" will also log 766 miles by bus. Of course this type of travel is nothing new for the Rainbow Warriors who posted 40,125 air miles last year and was the only FBS team to play in five different time zones.

DIVERSITY U

Hawai'i is among the most diverse, if not the most diverse football squads in the country. UH has players from 15 different states, encompassing the Hawaiian, Pacific, Mountain, Central and Eastern time zones. More than half of the team hails from Hawai'i (42) and California (31). The Rainbow Warriors also boast six players from American Samoa, three from Australia and one from Japan.

GOOD WORK MAKANI

Senior defensive lineman Makani Kema-Kaleiwahea was among a select group of 24 college football players – 12 in FBS – named to the 2016 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, one of the most coveted off-the-field honors in college football. Kema-Kaleiwahea's story is one of strength, courage, and perseverance. He and his wife Brianna were among the honorees for the 2016 Casey Excellence for Children Awards. Kema-Kaleiwahea grew up on O'ahu in an adoptive family of six children, including his brother, a female cousin and three other boys. To remove the children from an abusive environment, the couple created a home for the children in Arizona and made sacrifices to become their caregivers so they would not be separated in the child welfare system – this despite the time commitment assumed by Makani as a full-time student playing collegiate football. Permanent homes were found for three of the children, while Makani and Brianna have since officially adopted two of the boys, Luke and Kaimana Kaleiwahea, since returning to Hawai'i.

RECORD-BREAKING ATTENDANCE

With 110,222 fans in attendance at Michigan on Sept. 3, UH played before its largest crowd in school history. It eclipsed the 107,145 fans for UH's game at top-ranked Ohio State last year. Three of the top six road crowds in school history have occurred in the past two seasons—all at Big Ten venues. In addition to Michigan and Ohio State, more than 80,000 fans watched UH at Wisconsin last year.

In 2015, UH posted its fifth consecutive non-winning season and sixth in the last seven seasons, a streak the Warriors hope to break in 2016. The last time UH posted five straight non-winning seasons was from 1994-98. Hawai'i's last winning season occurred in 2010 (10-4), also its last bowl appearance (Hawai'i). Head coach Nick Rolovich served as the team's quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator that year.

VIRAL WARRIORS

Before playing a single down of football in 2016, UH was featured on the SportsCenter Top Plays list four times since this spring. The Rainbow Warriors did it through a variety of viral videos including the "April Fools Massacre," "Big Man Punt Return," "Caddyshack Pool Party" and the "UH Penalty Kick Challenge" The videos can be viewed on Twitter @HawaiiFootball, HawaiiAthletics.com and Instagram @Rolovich.

LIVE ALOHA, PLAY WARRIOR

Since his hiring late last year, head coach Nick Rolovich has spread a culture of "Live Aloha, Play Warrior." Community outreach and team building have been integral to the program. UH trained with the U.S. Army's 25th Infantry 'Tropic Lightning' Division, helped island residents load up groceries and supplies ahead of Tropical Storm Darby, welcomed young fans to the UH Lower Campus to play Pokémon GO and hosted a Ladies Clinic that benefited the Domestic Violence Action Center.

NICK ROLOVICH

Nick Rolovich is the 23rd head coach for the Rainbow Warrior program.

At 37, he is the eighth-youngest head coach in NCAA Division I FBS and the youngest to lead the Rainbow Warriors since Dick Tomey in 1977.

Regarded as one of the top offensive minds in the country, Rolovich has proven an accomplished play-caller in operating the Run and Shoot, as well as the Pistol offense. The former UH offensive coordinator and record-setting quarterback returns to Mānoa from Nevada, where he aided the Wolf Pack to bowl eligibility in three of the past four seasons as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Under Rolovich's guidance at Nevada, quarterback Cody Fajardo made NCAA history in 2014, reaching 9,000 yards passing and 3,000 yards rushing in a career—only the second player in NCAA history, following fellow Wolf Pack signal caller Colin Kaepernick, to reach that mark. In addition, he tutored Bryant Moniz to 10,169 career passing yards during his tenure at Hawai'i.

Since joining the Nevada staff in 2012, Rolovich's Wolf Pack offense has ranked as high as eighth nationally (2012) in total offense, generating 2,786 yards passing with Fajardo at quarterback, while boasting a seventh-ranked rushing attack paced by Stephon Jefferson's 1,883 yards.

During his time in Reno, the Wolf Pack made three bowls: the 2012 Gildan New Mexico Bowl, the 2014 R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl and the 2015 NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl.

Rolovich's first coaching stint at UH was wildly productive from 2008-11, directing one of the top passing offenses in the nation. He was the quarterbacks coach all four seasons and spent the final two years as the Warriors' offensive coordinator.

For the latter three years of his time with the Warriors, he had play-calling duties, while UH threw

for 13,915 yards—an average of 347.9 yards per game—and 96 touchdowns. That includes the 2010 season in which Hawai'i led the nation in passing offense (394.3 ypg) and finished sixth in total offense (500.6 ypg). That year, Rolovich mentored former walk-on quarterback Moniz to the top of the NCAA charts in passing yards, total offense, and touchdowns, and to an eighth-place ranking in passing efficiency. Moniz's favorite targets were receivers Greg Salas and Kealoha Pilaes, both of whom spent time in the NFL. Salas finished his career as the school's all-time leader in receiving yards (4,345), while Pilaes is eighth in all-purpose yards (3,379).

Rolovich was a two-year letterwinner at quarterback for Hawai'i from 2000-01, starting the bulk of the 2001 season and leading the team to an 8-1 record as a starter. He passed for 4,176 career yards and 40 touchdowns and still holds six school passing records. As a senior that season, he ranked 10th nationally in passing efficiency with a 150.5 rating and broke 19 school passing and eight total offense records.

COACHES NOTES

HOMECOMING

Nick Rolovich is one 18 head coaches in the FBS who've returned to lead their alma mater. Joined by **Brian Smith** (offensive coordinator/RB), **Craig Stutzmann** (QB) and **Abe Elimimian** (secondary), UH boasts four former players on its full-time coaching staff. Only three other schools — BYU (9), Air Force (7), and Boise State (5) — have more alumni on their staff. What's more, all four were teammates on the 2001 squad that finished the season 9-3. Rolovich (QB), Smith (C), and Stutzmann (WR) were senior starters on offense, while Elimimian was a redshirt freshman who started six games at cornerback.

STARTING YOUNG

Sean Duggan is getting a head start on his coaching brethren. At 23 years, 5 months, the UH linebackers is the youngest assistant coach in the FBS, nearly two years younger than the next youngest on the list, LB coach Pat Bastian of Georgia Southern. In fact Duggan is younger than six members of the 2016 UH squad. Duggan finished his playing career in 2014 at Boston College before serving as a defensive graduate assistant. Along with BC secondary coach and current UH defensive coordinator **Kevin Lempa**, Duggan helped the 2015 BC squad that led the nation in total defense.

MORE NOTES

► Special teams coordinator **Mayur Chaudhari** is the son-in-law of Dick Tomey, former head coach at Hawai'i, Arizona, and San Jose State. Chaudhari served as a graduate assistant at San Jose State under Tomey, coaching special teams, the secondary and linebackers.

► Offensive line coach **Chris Naeole** was picked 10th overall by the New Orleans Saints in the 1997 NFL Draft, at the time the highest drafted player from the state of Hawai'i (Ka'a'awa; Kahuku HS). Naeole, who also played for the Jacksonville Jaguars, enjoyed a 12-year NFL career.

► While at Montana, **Legi Suaiaunoa** developed a pair of NFL players. Tyrone Holmes, who led the FCS in sacks in 2015 now plays for the Jacksonville Jaguars. Zach Wagenmann, who holds the school records for sacks and tackles for loss was a member of the 2015 Arizona Cardinals.

► After much success on the FCS and Division II levels, 13-year coaching veteran **Kefense Hynson** takes on his first FBS coaching job. Hynson has served as an offensive coordinator at three different schools, including Montana, where he coached alongside current UH defensive line coach Legi Suaiaunoa.

Contact the UH Sports Media Relations Office to arrange player or coach interviews at least 24 hours in advance. Players and coaches will be available for interviews after practice on Tuesday and Wednesday. Every effort will be made to accommodate interview requests but players will not be asked to miss class, study hall, practices, or medical treatment. Players mobile or home numbers will not be released by the Sports Media Relations Office.

MEDICAL POLICY

The UH Sports Media Relations Office abides by federal law pertaining to the releasing of injury information. We will not disseminate any information about a student-athletes' injury without written consent. The only information given to the media will be if a student-athlete is "probable," "questionable," or "doubtful" to play. However, the student-athlete may release information about his/her injury.

WE ARE THE "RAINBOW WARRIORS"

When referring to the UH football team, please use the nickname "Rainbow Warriors." In an effort to standardize its nicknames, on July 1, 2013, the University of Hawai'i officially changed its men's team nickname to "Rainbow Warriors." The school's women's teams are still referred to as "Rainbow Wahine." The word "Wahine" (pronounced wah-HEE-nay) means woman in the Hawaiian language. The rainbow has been part of UH's nickname since 1923.

WHAT'S AN 'OKINA?

What's that punctuation mark in the word Hawai'i? A: In the Hawaiian language, it's called an 'okina, which translated literally in English means separator. Phonetically it is referred to as a glottal stop, similar to the sound that would be made in the English oh-oh. The 'okina is actually a letter in the Hawaiian language and typed out looks like a backwards, inverted apostrophe. The practice of the UH Sports Media Relations office is to use the 'okina in all Hawaiian words in which they occur.

POST-GAME PRESS CONFERENCE

Head coach Nick Rolovich and selected players will be available at the Aloha Stadium Hospitality Room approximately 15 minutes after each home game. The media will NOT be allowed to conduct interviews with players and coaches on the field or in the locker room. There will be a 10-minute "cooling off" period for all games (home and away).

PARKING GATES: Upper and Lower Halawa parking lot (Gates 3 & 4) opens 5 (five) hours prior to kickoff while all other gates (UH Reserved) will open 4 (four) hours prior. Parking is \$7. Alternate parking is available at Kam Drive In (\$5 per vehicle with FREE shuttle service) and Leeward Community College (FREE parking with \$2/ person shuttle service). Shuttle service runs two and a half hours prior to kickoff until one hour after the game. Parking is also available at Radford High School beginning three and a half hours prior to kickoff to one hour after the game (\$5 parking with no shuttle service). No tailgating is allowed at alternate parking sites.

STADIUM GATES: Stadium turnstiles open one and a half hours prior to kickoff.

STADIUM SECURITY: Security measures are in effect. Only fanny packs, purses, backpacks and handbags will be allowed into the stadium, but are subject to inspection by stadium security.

Contraband items include: weapons, noise makers, illegal narcotics, outside food or beverages, cans or bottles, umbrellas, coolers, fireworks, inflatable objects, confetti, balloons, laser pointers, poles or sticks, skateboards, scooters, rollerblades, bicycles, animals (except service animals), motorized remote controlled devices (drones) and/or any item that may pose a health or safety issue to guests and/or employees.

Smoking is prohibited except within a posted designated smoking area. (this includes vapor and electronic cigarettes).

UH FOOTBALL EXPRESS: Air-conditioned bus transportation to Aloha Stadium is available throughout O'ahu by Roberts Hawaii's "UH Football Express." Season passes can be purchased for \$78 for all six games, \$65 for five games, or \$16 for one game. One-way rides can be purchased on-site for \$10 per person if space is available. Reservations for the UH Football Express are required for all round-trips and may be made online at UHFootballExpress.com, or by calling Roberts Hawaii at 808-954-8625.

Pick-up locations are: Hawai'i Kai Park n' Ride; Kahala Mall curbside near Bank of Hawai'i; Kailua (Kailua Recreation Center, Kainalu Drive, Kane'ohu (Alaloa Street above Sears at Windward Mall), and Mililani Mauka (Mililani Mauka Park n' Ride).

SYDNEY, Australia – In a historic matchup Down Under, Hawai'i fell to California, 51-31, in the opening game of the 2016 college football season at ANZ Stadium.

Cal racked up 630 yards of total offense to spoil the debut of UH head coach Nick Rolovich. The Bears were led by the exploits of senior transfer Davis Webb, who finished with 441 yards passing and four touchdowns. His target of choice was Chad Hansen who posted 14 catches for 160 yards and a pair of scores.

UH hung tough through more than a quarter and half before the game turned on miscues in the final four minutes of the opening half. That's when the Bears scored 17 straight points to take a commanding 34-14 lead at the break. UH would get no closer than 17 points in the second half.

The Rainbow Warriors did produce a strong ground performance with 248 yards rushing, including 118 yards and a touchdown from junior Diocemy Saint Juste. He was one of three UH running backs to score, with Steven Lakalaka and Paul Harris also finding the end zone.

Senior quarterback Ikaika Woolsey, starting for the second time in a UH season-opener, went 17-of-34 for 234 yards with one touchdown and one interception.

UH came aggressively out of the gates, attempting an onside kick on the game's opening play. Cal recovered and capitalized right away on a Khalf Muhammad 34-yard scoring run a little more than a minute in.

However, UH countered with a Marcus Kemp 39-yard catch-and-run down the sideline for UH's first touchdown of the season. After Cal went up 14-7 on a Hansen 19-yard catch from Webb, UH again came right back with an electrifying run 53-yard touchdown run by Saint Juste.

Cal led just 17-14 late in the second quarter but a pair of special team miscues put UH in a quick hole. The Bears were able get a field goal after a UH leaping penalty on a Cal punt allowed the Bears to extend a drive. UH then fumbled the ensuing kickoff. Cal struck on the next play with a 34-yard touchdown from Hansen. The Bears concluded the pivotal stretch with an 85-yard drive in the final 1:35 of the half, capped by a Webb 4-yard touchdown run.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. – No. 7 Michigan displayed its Top 10 pedigree with a 63-3 win over Hawai'i at Michigan Stadium. UH dropped to 0-2 while playing in front of 110,222 fans, the biggest crowd ever for a UH game.

The Wolverines flexed their muscles on both sides of the ball, finding the end zone on the ground, in the air, and twice on defense. Michigan took a 35-0 lead into the locker room at halftime and eventually out-gained UH 512-232 for the game.

Chris Evans rushed for 112 yards and two touchdowns, while junior quarterback Wilton Speight went 10-of-13 for 145 yards and three touchdowns in a little more than a half of action.

Marcus Kemp led the UH offense with five catches for 96 yards. Signal caller Ikaika Woolsey went 7-of-13 for 88 yards, while sophomore Dru Brown came in the second half to go 5-of-10 for 63 yards and added 49 yards rushing in his first action as a Rainbow Warrior.

UH put up 31 points and gained 482 yards in its opener against Pac-12 opponent Cal, but it was far different story against one of the best defenses in the land.

Michigan held UH to -17 yards in the first quarter alone and for the game returned a pair of interceptions for touchdowns.

The UH defense got off to a great start with a Damien Packer interception on Michigan's first offensive play of the game. But after that it was all Michigan.

The Wolverines got on track with drives of 98 and 68 yards as Speight shook off the early interception with a pair of TD passes in the first quarter. Speight's third touchdown pass of the day gave the Wolverines a 21-0 lead in the second quarter, while Delano Hill's 27-yard pick-six and Evans' 18-yard run capped the Michigan scoring in the second half.

The UH offense started to show signs of life on its final possession of the first half. UH got its initial first down with five minutes left in the first half and put together a drive deep into Michigan territory. But after getting inside the Wolverine 10-yard line, an intentional grounding penalty extinguished the clock and any chance for UH points in the opening half.

But later, Rigoberto Sanchez provided the biggest bright spot for UH in the fourth quarter when he nailed a career-long 55-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to prevent the shutout. The field goal was one yard short of the school-record shared by Jason Elam (1992) and Justin Ayat (2004).

HONOLULU - In a roller coaster of a game Hawai'i pulled off a thrilling 41-36 win over UT Martin in its home opener at Hawaiian Tel FCU Field at Aloha Stadium.

After dropping their first two games of the season nearly a world away from the islands, home field proved the remedy for the Rainbow Warriors who improved to 1-2, using a big second half to rally past the Skyhawks.

UH scored three unanswered touchdowns in the second half to erase a 10-point deficit, but needed another touchdown late in the fourth to capture its first win of the year and hand Nick Rolovich his first win as UH head coach.

Ikaika Woolsey overcame three interceptions by throwing a career-high four touchdowns, including a 63-yard pass to Marcus Kemp that gave UH the lead for good with 6:43 left in the game. All three of Kemp's catches went for touchdown as the senior also finished with a game-high 103 receiving yards. Saturday marked Kemp's first 100-yard receiving game of the year and seventh of his career.

The first half was a rough one for UH, who managed just five first downs and 107 yards of total offense. UTM's Troy Cook completed just four passes in the first half but two of the them went for touchdowns and the Skyhawks racked up 159 yards on the ground to take a 17-14 lead into the locker room at the break.

Things didn't get much better for UH early in the second half with an interception on its first possession. The Skyhawks capitalized with a 26-yard Jaimiee Bowe touchdown run on a 4th-and-2 play to go up 24-14.

However, UH roared back with scores on back-to-back possession, making the most of big plays. After Ammon Barker recovered a punt tipped off a UTM player for a short field, Diocemy Saint Juste rolled in from 24 yards to trim the deficit. Kemp followed with a 33-yard touchdown reception over the middle, dragging a defender the final 10 yards and UH to a 28-24 lead heading into the fourth quarter.

A Metuisela 'Unga touchdown catch, the first of his career, gave the 'Bows a 35-24 lead early in the fourth. However, the Skyhawks wouldn't cave, responding with 14 straight points, including a 65-yard scoring strike and a dramatic 79-yard punt return with 9:02 left in the game to take a 36-35 lead.

That set the stage Kemp's heroics whose 63-yard touchdown from Woolsey also put him over the century mark in receiving yards. With time winding down, Jalen Rogers capped a final UH defensive stand with an interception, following key sacks by Makani Kema-Kaleiwahea and Trayvon Henderson to hold off the upset-minded Skyhawks.

TUCSON, Ariz. - Hawai'i got off to a sluggish start and couldn't recover in a 47-28 loss to Arizona at Arizona Stadium. The Rainbow Warriors dropped to 1-3 on the season with all three losses coming away from the islands.

Arizona jumped out to a 20-point lead just 10 minutes into the game and carried a 34-7 lead into the locker room at the half to cruise to victory. Sophomore quarterback Brandon Dawkins rushed for three touchdowns and passed for another—all in the first half—to lead the Wildcats (2-1), who racked up 585 yards of total offense. JJ Taylor added 168 yards rushing and a touchdown as Arizona finished with 347 yards on the ground.

Dawkins scored on each of Arizona's first two possessions, capping 88- and 82-yard drives, then Arizona tacked on another rushing touchdown following a UH interception deep in their own territory.

The Rainbow Warriors gained some momentum late in the first quarter, as UH got on the board with an 81-yard drive, fueled by a pair of catches by John Ursua, including a 15-yard scoring strike from Ikaika Woolsey. It was Ursua's first career touchdown catch.

A key play happened in the second quarter when a Woolsey 48-yard touchdown bomb to Dylan Collie was wiped out by a holding penalty. That potential score would've cut the UH deficit to 20-13. Instead, after the penalty, the 'Bows subsequently turned the ball over on downs and Arizona went on to score two more touchdowns in the quarter to take a commanding lead into the half.

The Rainbow Warrior offense was able to put together three scoring drives after the break under the direction of sophomore Dru Brown, who played the entire second half at quarterback. Running back Steven Lakalaka, who recorded a team-high 16 carries for 63 yards, had a pair of touchdown runs. Meanwhile, Brown (144 yards passing, 33 yards rushing) scored on a 3-yard run in the fourth quarter. However, it was too little, too late for the 'Bows who remain winless in five all-time meetings with Arizona.

HONOLULU – Hawai'i opened Mountain West play with a convincing 38-17 win over Nevada on Hawaiian Tel FCU Field at Aloha Stadium. With the win the Rainbow Warriors broke a nine-game conference losing streak dating back to 2014 and delivered first-year head coach Nick Rolovich a victory over his former team.

UH also snapped a five-game losing streak to Nevada, where Rolovich spent the past four seasons as offensive coordinator. UH's last victory over the Wolf Pack was against a Colin Kaepernick-led squad in 2010 in Honolulu.

Junior running back Diocemy Saint Juste rushed for a career-high 205 yards, earning the No. 8 spot on UH's all-time single-game list. The Boynton Beach, Fla., native also became the 10th player in school history to rush for 200 yards, and the first since Joey Iosefa against UNLV in 2014. On the receiving front, tight end Metuisela 'Unga supplied two touchdown grabs while wideout Marcus Kemp added six catches for 88 yards. Brown finished the night 15-of-18 passing for 222 yards and two scores.

Defensively, junior linebacker Russell Williams, Jr., tallied a career-high 12 tackles.

Hawai'i led 3-0 as neither team was able to generate much offense in the first quarter. The Wolf Pack turned the ball over on downs after a 7-play, 66-yard drive while the Rainbow Warriors embarked on their own promising drive, featuring a 29-yard run by Saint Juste. The drive however, stalled in the red zone after a pair of penalties. It was the first time this season that Hawai'i held a lead after the first quarter.

The UH offense caught fire early in the second quarter, pushing ahead with Saint Juste, who piled up 114 yards on 10 carries by halftime. Running back Steven Lakalaka struck first for six on the scoreboard, punctuating an 88-yard drive with a 4-yard plunge. Later, with time winding down in the first half, 'Unga's twisting one-handed, highlight-reel grab for his first touchdown of the game gave the Warriors a 17-3 advantage. The scoring drive was highlighted by a 32-yard catch by wideout Makoia Camanse-Stevens. On the other side of the ball, the Hawai'i defense kept Nevada out of the end zone and held them to 62 passing yards in the first half.

UH broke the game wide open in the third quarter with three touchdown drives. Wideout John Ursua capped a 75-yard drive with a touchdown run before 'Unga later produced his second score of the night. Sophomore Kaiwi Chung capped off the quarter with 1-yard run.

SAN JOSE, Calif. – Hawai'i won its second consecutive contest and snapped a nine-game road losing streak with an emphatic 34-17 win over San José State (1-5, 0-2 MW) at CEFCU Stadium.

With the win, UH (3-3, 2-0 MW) has already matched its win total from last year (3-10) and is off to its first-ever 2-0 conference start since joining the Mountain West in 2012. The last time UH started 2-0 in conference was 2010 when the Warriors won their first five WAC games en route to a share of the regular-season title.

Coming off a huge home win over Nevada last week, the Rainbow Warriors continued their momentum with an impressive display in all three phases of the game. The UH offense kept humming with another 30-plus point performance and 431 yards of offense. Special teams got a pair of field goals and blocked an SJSU field goal that kept the Spartans at bay in the second half.

However, most impressive was the UH defense which recorded six sacks, 11 tackles-for-loss, and three interceptions. After allowing SJSU to score on each of their first two drives, the Rainbow Warriors pitched a shutout the rest of the way as the Spartan offense failed to score on their final 12 possessions.

The first 20 minutes of the game was a back-and-forth affair. Each of the first four drives of the game resulted in points and 10-10 tie early in the second quarter. But the game turned in UH's favor midway through the second quarter after a gutsy call by UH head coach Nick Rolovich. UH went for it on 4th-and-1 from the team's own 38-yard line and the result was a 62-yard touchdown run by quarterback Dru Brown. The sophomore signal caller followed up with a 39-yard toss to Ammon Barker with 26 seconds remaining in the half, allowing UH to take a 24-10 lead into the locker room.

San José State got back in the game in the second half when Frank Ginda returned a UH fumble 19 yards for a score, cutting the UH lead to 24-17 with 4:16 left in the third quarter. The Spartans forced another UH fumble on the very next possession and looked to cut into the lead even further with a field goal. However, UH freshman Viane Moala blocked Bryce-Crawford's 50-yard attempt.

Heading into the fourth quarter, safety Trayvon Henderson's interception – UH's third of the game – helped set up a Steven Lakalaka 30-yard run with 12:53 left to push the 'Bows' lead back to two touchdowns. UH never looked back with a stout defensive effort led by Jahlan Tava'i's 10 tackles, including two sacks and three TFLs.

Last week it was UH's run game that powered the offense. This week UH took to the air as Brown finished with 287 yards passing and two touchdowns on 24-of-33 passing. A total of 228 of his yards came in the first half alone. His top target on the day was Marcus Kemp, who hauled in six catches for 69 yards.

HONOLULU - Hawaii'i lost a heartbreaker to UNLV, 41-38, for its fifth straight Homecoming defeat in front of a season-high 31,281 on Hawaiian Tel FCU Field at Aloha Stadium.

After a back-and-forth contest, Rainbow Warriors (3-4, 2-1 MW) appeared to catch a couple of breaks in the fourth quarter only to watch the Rebels close the gap and eventually secure the victory with a 28-yard field goal by Evan Pantels with 49 seconds left.

First, after an apparent UNLV fumble recovery, Marcus Kemp alertly touched his fumbled ball while his own feet were out of bounds, allowing Hawaii'i to retain possession after review. Running back Paul Harris punched in a score two plays later to give the Warriors a 38-31 lead. UNLV (3-4, 2-1 MW), however, would answer quickly to tie the game with a touchdown on its ensuing drive on a 34-yard touchdown run by Lexington Thomas.

Later, UNLV's Darius Mouton scooped up a Dru Brown fumble - the only turnover of the game - and his apparent touchdown return was called back due to penalty. The Rebels still managed to march down field setting up Pantels' game-winning field goal.

Offensively, Brown finished the night going 17-for-32 with two touchdowns. Kemp caught six passes for a career-high 126 yards and surpassed 2,000-yard career mark. Harris led the team with 94 yards rushing and 254 all-purpose yards while Diocemy Saint Juste chipped in with 81 yards on the ground and caught his first career receiving touchdown in the fourth quarter. After holding each of the previous two opponents to 17 points, the Hawaii'i defense surrendered 536 yards of total offense. Jahlani Tavai led the Rainbow Warriors with a career-high 14 tackles.

Neither team could shake free of the other through the first three quarters. UNLV struck first with a touchdown pass from Dalton Sneed before Saint Juste's 55-yard scamper set up a 1-yard touchdown plunge by Steven Lakalaka. The teams exchanged blows for the remainder of the half, each scoring two touchdowns in the second quarter to go into halftime tied at 21-21.

Both defenses settled in as the scoring slowed in the third quarter. The Rebels got on the scoreboard with a 24-yard field goal before Warrior kicker Rigoberto Sanchez answered with an 18-yarder of his own. UH freshman Kaimana Padello blocked a punt late in the third quarter, which led to Saint Juste's score to start the fourth quarter. The touchdown gave Hawaii'i its first lead in the second half and the marked first time the UH offense led in total yardage since the opening quarter. Neither lead would hold as a resilient Rebel squad would not go away. UNLV tied the game on the subsequent possession on David Greene's 1-yard run, his second touchdown of the game.

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - Hawaii'i gave one of its grittiest efforts in recent memory to pull out a 34-27 double-overtime road win over Air Force (4-3, 2-2 MW) at Falcon Stadium, just its second-ever win in Colorado Springs and first since 1992.

The Rainbow Warriors, who won at San Jose State two weeks ago, have now earned wins in consecutive road games for the first time since 2010. In the process UH also snapped Air Force's 15-game home win streak, the second-longest streak in the nation. In addition to the road streak brewing, UH was able to return the Kuter Trophy to the islands, ending its 15-year stint in Colorado Springs.

Marcus Kemp had a career-high 151 yards receiving and pair of overtime touchdowns, including a 25-yarder from Dru Brown in the second overtime that proved to be the game-winner. Senior defensive back Jalen Rogers sealed the win for UH when he intercepted Nate Romine's last ditch effort to the endzone on 4th-and-7 on Air Force's ensuing possession.

The teams went to overtime only after a surprising key play at the end of regulation. After a back-and-forth contest, especially in the second half, Air Force strung together a 19-play, 75-yard drive that ate up the final 8:18 of the clock. However, Luke Strelbel's 32-yard field goal to win the game as time expired went wide-right for his first miss in 14 attempts this season.

The UH defense played a huge part in the UH win, setting up the team's first 13 points and holding the vaunted Air Force offense below its season averages in total offense and points. Down 7-0, the defensive unit helped turn the tide early in the second quarter, beginning with a fourth-down stop of Air Force near midfield. That helped the Rainbow Warriors get on the scoreboard with a 25-yard field goal by Rigoberto Sanchez, cutting the lead to 7-3.

The defense came up big again late in the second quarter. Kory Rasmussen forced an Air Force fumble that was recovered by Damien Packer. Those efforts gave UH prime field position on the Air Force 36-yard line and the UH took full advantage, as Steven Lakalaka's 1-yard touchdown gave UH a 10-7 lead heading into the locker room.

In the third quarter, Air Force notched a pair of Strelbel field goals to retake the lead at 13-10, but again the Warrior defense would keep UH in the game. Jahlani Tavai forced a fumble recovered by Mefy Koloamatangi that set UH up at the Air Force 11. UH couldn't punch it into endzone but a 35-yard Sanchez kick tied it up, 13-13.

The team traded 75-yard scoring drives in the fourth quarter, including a UH drive that ended with a 40-yard touchdown pass from Brown to John Ursua, drawing the score to 20-20 with less than nine minutes remaining. Brown finished with a career-high 21-of-37 for 312 yards and three touchdowns, while throwing two interceptions, snapping a streak of 118 attempts without a pick. Ursua also had a career game with seven catches for 108 yards and one touchdown.
