Post-Game

- The Lobos' 27-point victory over CSUN marks the largest final point margin in the series. The previous series high dates back to December 1, 1969 where the Lobos defeated the Matadors 99-82 for a 17-point victory.
- Five Lobos scored in double digits including JaQuan Lyle (18), Carlton Bragg Jr. (17), Corey Manigault (17), Zane Martin (13) and Keith McGee (10).
 - \circ $\;$ This is the second game in a row for all but Lyle to post in double digits.
- UNM held one of CSUN's leading scorers, Terrell Gomez, below his PPG average, posting 14 points with a 19.2 PPG average.
- With the 20+ point victory, the Lobos have now posted a 20+ point margin in both of their games so far this season.
- The Lobos shot at a clip of 60.0% from the field (36-60). This is the second game in a row for the Lobos posting a field goal percentage at or above 60.0%.
- In the second half, the Lobos scored 54 points. The last time the Lobos scored 50 points in the second half was on March 13, 2019 vs Wyoming (51).
- The Lobo defense forced a total of 16 turnovers that they converted into 26 points.
- The Lobos doubled the amount of points both off the bench and in the paint compared to that of the Matadors (42-21 off the bench and 56-24 in the paint, respectively).
- Redshirt-junior Zane Martin posted a new career high at UNM in assists with five.
- Redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell posted a new season high in points (9), shooting a perfect 3for-3 in field goals and 3-for-3 from the free throw line.
 - Four other Lobos were also perfect from the charity stripe:
 - Vance Jackson (2-2), JaQuan Lyle (2-2), Zane Martin (3-3) and Keith McGee (1-1).
- Although there were six lead changes in the game, the Lobos spent 36:57 of the game in possession of the lead (57 seconds for CSUN).
