- .@BroncoSportsFB, @CSUFootball & @GoAztecs have earned bowl eligibility this season. SDSU was the first Group of 5 team to reach bowl eligibility, winning six straight games to open the 2017 season.
- .@USUFootball's Jalen Davis is a semifinalist for the Paycom Jim Thorpe Award, given annually to the nation's best defensive back.
- .@GoAztecs RB Rashaad Penny is a semifinalist for the @MaxwellFootball Award, given annually to the nation's best player.
- The @MountainWest has three RBs ranked in the top-12 nationally in total rushing yds: SDSU's Rashaad Penny (1,368), Hawai'i's Diocemy Saint Juste (1,134) & UNLV's Lexington Thomas (965).
- The @MountainWest is one of two conferences with multiple 1,000-yard rushers through eight weeks, joining the Pac-12.
- .@SJSUSpartanFB LB Frank Ginda is tied for first nationally with 13.8 tackles per game. He is also 1 of 2 FBS defenders with more than 100 total tackles (124).
- .@GoAztecs' win vs. #19/19 Stanford on Sept. 16 is the highest ranked opponent a MW team has defeated since Oct. 3, 2014 (Utah State over #19/18 BYU).
- .@GoAztecs have won 36 straight games when rushing for at least 200 yards as a team.
- .@GoAztecs RB Rashaad Penny is the 1st player in @MountainWest history to win player of the week honors in four consecutive weeks (9/4-25).
- Penny ranks second nationally in rushing yards (1,368) and total touchdowns (15), third in all-purpose yards per game (199.89) and fourth in rush yards per contest (152.0).
- .@CSUFootball's Michael Gallup leads the nation in receiving yds (1,167) and receiving yds/game (129.7) and is third in receptions per game (8.0).
- .@CSUFootball's Michael Gallup is the FBS' active career leader in receiving yards per game (110.9).
- .@CSUFootball's Nick Stevens ranks third nationally with 2,755 passing yards. Stevens' 2,755 passing yards are the most among Group of 5 QBs.
- .@unlvfootball's Devonte Boyd needs 524 receiving vds to hold the @MountainWest career record.
- Boyd's 3,107 career receiving yards are the 3rd-most among active pass-catchers nationally.
- .@wyo_football DB Andrew Wingard ranks third nationally in career average tackles per game (9.71).
- .@USUFootball is tied for fourth nationally with 20 takeaways (10 fumble recoveries and 10 interceptions).
- .@CSUFootball's 31-point win over Oregon State on Aug. 26 is the largest against an Autonomous 5 opponent in program history.
- .@CSUFootball's 31-point victory is the 5th-largest by a @MountainWest member over an Autonomous 5 team since 2010.
- .@BroncoSportsFB has been selected to win the Mountain Division for the fourth consecutive season.
- .@GoAztecs are the first team in MW history to be selected as unanimous divisional champs in back-to-back seasons.
- In the 18 seasons since the league's inception, the @MountainWest's champion or a current MW member has been a BCS/CFP participant 8 times.
- .@BroncoSportsFB has produced a 1,000-yd rusher in eight straight seasons, which is tied with Auburn as the longest active streak in the nation.

WIN IMPROVEMENT

Fresno State entered the 2017 campaign coming off an 1-11 season and the hiring of head coach Jeff Tedford. The Bulldogs, who have compiled a 5-3 record this year, have the nation's best win improvement (+4). Marshall, Michigan State and Virginia have all improved its win total by three games from 2016 to 2017.

Last season, Wyoming tied for the nation's largest improvement in wins from 2015 to 2016 at plus-six.

THROUGH THE AIR

Colorado State senior quarterback Nick Stevens ranks in the top-15 nationally in several passing categories this season. Stevens ranks third in total passing yards (2,755), eighth in passing touchdowns (22) and 12th in passing yards per game (306.1). The native of Murrieta, California, also ranks 11th in points responsible for (138) and is just outside the top-15 in total offense (319.5). He leads the Mountain West in all five statistical categories.

More about Stevens:

- His 2,755 passing yards are the most among Group of 5 signal-callers. Has thrown multiple touchdown passes in 15 of the Rams' last 16 games. • .
- Two passing touchdowns away from setting the career program record. Completed 21 consecutive passes, his final 12 passes against Hawai'i on Sept. 30 •
- . and first nine on the road vs. Utah State on Oct. 7, which is the second-longest streak in Mountain West history.
- In MW play, has completed 100-of-154 passes (64.9%) for 1,528 yards and 15 touchdowns.

SUCCESS ON THE GROUND

The Mountain West is one of two conferences with multiple 1,000-yard rushers this season. San Diego State's Rashaad Penny (1,368) and Hawai'i RB Diocemy Saint Juste (1,167) are two of 10 1,000-yard FBS rushers.

Saint Juste has rushed for 200 yards on three occasions this season, joining Wisconsin's Jonathan Taylor as the only player to have two 200-yard performances this year. Additionally, the native of Boynton Beach, Florida, is the first Rainbow Warrior to register 1,000-yard rushing seasons in back-to-back years.

The Hawai'i program record for rushing yards in a single season is 1,498, set by Travis Sims in 1992.

UNLV's Lexington Thomas is ranked No. 12 nationally with 965 rushing yards. Thomas is on pace to become the first Rebel running back to eclipse the 1,000-yard mark since 2013 (Tim Cornett). Additionally, Thomas would become the programs 10th 1,000yard single-season rusher.

MOUNTAIN VS. WEST

The Mountain Division holds an all-time record of 56-30 (.651) against opponents from the West Division since divisional play was established in the Mountain West in 2013.
