#### 20-20 VISION FOR WINNING

After posting a 24-7 record last season, the Lobos have won over 20 games in consecutive seasons for the first time since the 2007-08 – 2008-09 campaigns. The 24 wins this past season were tied for the fifth-most in season in program history. Additionally, the 49 wins the past two seasons are the most since the 2003-04 and 2004-05 seasons.

### <u>FRESHMAN F(PH)ENOM</u>

JAYLA EVERETT burst onto the scene last season for the Lobos in her true freshman campaign. A native of St. Louis, Mo., Everett's rookie year at UNM was one for the record books as she set a new program freshman single-season scoring record with her 417 points scored. Her instant success on the court was also recognized by the Mountain West as she was named the league's Freshman of the Year. That plaudit was historic for Everett and the Lobos as she became the first player in program history to be named league Freshman of the Year.

#### <u>Familiar faces</u>

Lobo fans will be treated to several familiar faces returning to the court that they can cheer for this coming season. The Lobos return six letterwinners from a year ago and all six played at least 26 games last year. Among those returners are: *ANTONIA ANDERSON, JAEDYN* De *LA CERDA, JAYLA EVERETT, AHLISE HURST, SHAIQUEL INCGRUDER*, and *AISIA ROBERTSON*.

#### NOTHING NEW WHEN IT COMES TO NEWCOMERS

Transfer newcomers under head coach **IIIKE BRADBURY** have been on a run of remarkable success in his time at UNM. In all three seasons thus far at UNM, Bradbury and the Lobos have possessed the Mountain West Newcomer of the Year. The trend started in 2016-17 when **RICHELLE UAN DER KEIJL** won the award following her transfer from Wright State. The following season, **LATESHA BUCH** garnered the award after transferring from UW-Green Bay. This past season, Kansas transfer **AISIA ROBERTSON** took home the honor. Looking ahead, the trend very well may extend to a fourth-straight year with transfers **MAJALA HOWELL, BRIDE KEINEDY-HOPOATE** and **JORDAN HOSEY** all set to play significant minutes in 2019-20.

### <u>Ready to play</u>

After sitting out last season due to NCAA transfer rules, **INJALA HOWELL** and **BRIDE KEINEDY-HOPDATE** are set to make their official Lobo debuts in 2019-20. Both players with have one final season of eligibility and figure to play a significant role this coming season. Howell, a 5-10 guard transferred from UTEP where she was a threeyear starter and averaged 7.5 points per game in 86 career games. Kennedy-Hopoate is transferring from Iowa State where she played one season and averaged 6.7 points per game and hauled in 4.2 rebounds per game. Prior to becoming a cyclone, Kennedy-Hopoate was rated as the No. 1 junior college prospect.

#### <u>NEWCOMERS TO THE FOLD</u>

In addition to the six returning letterwinners from a year ago, the Lobos have bolstered their 2019-20 roster with the addition of eight newcomers. Five of the newcomers hail from the prep ranks and three via transfer. Of the transfers, two were in the program last year, but sat out due to NCAA transfer rules. Among the newcomers fresh to the program are: **ANDRIANA AVENT, CORINA CARTER, CELINE DUPONT, JORDAN HOSEY, AZARIA ROBINSON, AUTUMN WATTS**.

#### Lobos from near and far

The Lobo women's basketball roster has a mixture of athletes from near and far on its 2019-20 roster. The Lobos have players from seven different states and three by way of the international route. The Lobos feature players from Alaska, California, Colorado, Missouri, New Mexico, Ohio, and Texas. Additionally, the Lobos have a pair of players from "Down Under" in Australia and one hailing from The Netherlands.

### THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit is nationally recognized as one of the top basketball venues for college basketball. Need proof?! How about Sports Illustrated ranking it as one of the Top-20 sporting venues, of any sport, in the world for the 20th century!

Yes, The Pit is truly a special place, and it has created an unparalleled environment for the New Mexico women's basketball program over the years. The Lobos have led the Mountain West in attendance every year of the conference's existence since the 1999-00 season. Additionally, during that same span, the program has ranked in the Top-20 nationally in attendance in each of those years.

Wanna talk records?! The UNM women's basketball team is an impressive 421-207 at home all-time, a winning percentage of .670 heading into the 2019-20 season.





## MIKE BRADBURY | @COACHBRADBURY Record at UNM: 64-33 (4th Season) Career Record: 242-150 (13th Season)

### **NOTEWORTHY** :

- Named the sixth head coach in program history on March 31, 2016
- Led UNM to 25 wins in 2017-18; tied for second-most wins in program history
- Spent six years at Wright State (2010-16) and went 128-73 for the Raiders
  - Most single-season wins in Wright State history (26)
  - Five 20-win seasons at Wright State with five postseason appearances

Mike Bradbury enters his fourth season as head coach for The University of New Mexico women's basketball team. In his previous three seasons at the helm, Bradbury has guided the Lobos to a 64-33 overall record. In each of the last two seasons, the Lobos have eclipsed the 20-win mark and totaled 49 victories over that time. The consecutive 20-plus win seasons under Bradbury are the first for the program since the 2007-08 – 2008-09 seasons.

In his third year at the helm, Bradbury continued to put his mark on the program while also continuing to bring Lobo women's basketball back to national prominence. Overall, Bradbury's 2018-19 team went 24-7 and earned a bid to the WNIT for a second-straight season. It marked the first time since the 2008-09 – 2009-10 seasons that the program made consecutive trips to the postseason.

After dropping a one-possession game to Auburn in the preseason WNIT, the 2018-19 Lobos ripped off 11-straight wins to tie the program record and were on the cusp of cracking the national top-25 rankings as well by receiving votes from the WBCA during that stretch.

Bradbury would also receive an individual plaudit from the WBCA last season as he was named as one of 13 finalists for the 2019 United States Marine Corps/WBCA National Coach of the Year Award. Impressively, Bradbury was the only coach from a non-Power 5 conference to be a finalist.

In his time at UNM, Bradbury has coached eight All-Mountain West performers with Cherise Beynon, Jayla Everett, Jaisa Nunn, Aisia Robertson and Richelle van der Keijl making the All-Mountain West Team. Tesha Buck, Mykiel Burleson and Nike McClure have also earned MW recognition with Buck being the 2017-18 Newcomer of the Year, Burleson being named to the All-Freshman team in 2016-17 and

McClure landing on the All-Defensive team in 2018-19.

In terms of major individual awards, Bradbury has coached the league's Newcomer of the Year each season in charge of the Lobos with van der Keijl earning the award in 2016-17, Buck in 2017-18 and Robertson in 2018-19. Additionally, Bradbury has coached the MW Player of the Year in Nunn (2018-19) and the Freshman of the Year in Everett (2018-19).

In year two under Bradbury the Lobos had a breakout season, especially offensively as they ended the 2017-18 season averaging 80.4 points per game while also posting an impressive +9.7 scoring margin. Both marks led the Mountain West and the point-per-game total was 16th-best in NCAA DI last season.

A significant reason for the jump in offensive production was the fact that the Lobos were one of the most potent three-point shooting threats in the country. For the season, the Lobos attempted the eighth-most overall trifectas in DI hoisting 932 long distance shots. Successful 34% of the time, the Lobos made the 11th most 3's burying 319.

> Prior to coming to Albuquerque, Bradbury built a successful nine year run as a Division-I head coach with stops at Morehead State (Morehead, Ky.) and Wright State (Dayton, Ohio). Most recently with the Raiders, Bradbury led his squad to five 20-win seasons, including each of his final three seasons. During that time, Wright State has amassed a 75-28 record, the best amongst the 13 Division I programs in the state of Ohio.

> Overall at Wright State, Bradbury had five winning seasons, all of which were 20-plus win seasons, in six years - a feat made all the more remarkable as Wright State had just one winning season in the previous 22 before his arrival. In the previous 37 seasons of women's basketball at Wright State, the Raider program had tallied 20 wins just





once before Bradbury led the team to 20 wins in five of his six seasons.

His most prominent three-year run at Wright State started in 2013-14, when the Raiders won a school-record 26 games on the way to a 26-9 season and the program's first-ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament. That season saw the Raiders finish second in the Horizon League and win its first Horizon League Tournament. It also featured the program's first road win at perennial league power Wisconsin-Green Bay. Kim Demmings was named the Horizon League Player of the Year and Tournament MVP, and it marked the first time in school history the program had a pair of first team All-Conference selections.

He followed up that by earning Horizon League Coach of the Year in 2014-15 after a 25-9 season that saw his squad lose its Horizon League Preseason Player of the Year less than two minutes into the season opener. The Raiders just missed a second straight NCAA Tournament appearance, falling in overtime in the conference championship game. The team did make its first appearance in the Women's NIT as the league's automatic qualifier, and in 2015-16, the team made it back-to-back WNIT appearances after a 24-11 season, earning the program's first at-large bid. Those three seasons are the three winningest seasons in the history of Wright State women's basketball.

In his first two seasons at Wright State, he led the team to a 20-13 campaign and a 21-13 mark and berths in the Women's Basketball Invitational, the first NCAA Division I postseason berths for the program. Overall, Bradbury has coached three Horizon League Players of the Year (all in his last three seasons), six first-team All-Horizon League players, three second-team members and four All-Freshman team members.

Prior to his time at Wright State, Bradbury was the head coach at Morehead State where he led the Division I program to a 50-44 mark in three seasons, including a watershed 22-11 season, which was the second-most wins in Morehead State history and the most wins by the Eagles in the previous 38 years.

At Morehead State he coached one Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Year, along with one first-team All-OVC pick (two seasons) and three second-team All-OVC picks.

Bradbury also spent time as an assistant coach at Xavier (2002-06), Cincinnati (1996-02), VCU (1995-96), East Tennessee State (1994-95) and Chattanooga (1991-94). In his 28 seasons as an assistant and as a head coach, Bradbury has had 26 winning seasons.
