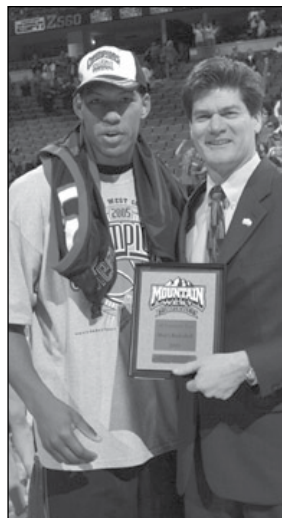

NEW MEXICO NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

1968 -- New Mexico's first exposure in the NCAA Tournament came under head coach Bob King in 1968. King was named WAC Coach of the Year after capturing the WAC crown with an impressive 23-5 overall record. The Lobos were 7th in the national rankings and also had the advantage of playing on their home floor in the West Regional. UNM lost the first night to Santa Clara, 86-73, as its star center Greg (Stretch) Howard was ineligible to play due to the NCAA rule that did not allow transfers to play in postseason games. In the consolation game, UNM fell to intrastate rival New Mexico State, 68-62, a team it had beaten twice during the regular season. The Aggies had lost the night before to Lew Alcindor-led UCLA, which went on to win the national title.

1974 -- The 1974 WAC championship team finished 22-7 and 18th in the polls. The Lobos traveled to Pocatello, Idaho, and defeated Idaho State, 73-65 in the first round. From there it was on to Tucson for the West Regional where the Lobos lost a heartbreaker to San Francisco in the last 22 seconds, 64-61. UNM redeemed itself the following night by winning the consolation game over Dayton, 66-61. The Flyers had taken UCLA into triple overtime the previous night.

1978 -- A 13-1 conference mark (24-3 overall) earned the Lobos a Western Athletic Conference title and a trip to Tempe, Arizona. UNM's first-round opponent was Cal State Fullerton, which became that year's Cinderella team. Had the Lobos defeated the Titans, they would have returned home to Albuquerque for the West Regional and 18,000 hometown fans. But in one of the biggest upsets of the year, unranked Fullerton dumped 4th-ranked New Mexico 90-85. The Titans advanced to Albuquerque where they upset San Francisco then lost to Final Four participant Arkansas by three points in the regional final.

1991 -- New Mexico made its first appearance in 13 years by receiving an at-large bid with a 20-9 record. Seeded 14th in the East Region, New Mexico faced No. 3 seed Oklahoma State in the first round at College Park, Md. The game was tied at halftime, 26-26, however, the Cowboys' second-half defense was too much for the Lobos in the 67-54 loss. Luc Longley had 16 points and 9 rebounds in his final collegiate game. OSU advanced to the Sweet 16 before falling to Temple.

1993 -- The Lobos received an automatic bid to the tournament by winning the WAC Tournament in Salt Lake City. Entering the tournament with a 23-7 record, UNM was ranked 21st by the Associated Press and received a No. five seed. The Lobos drew 12th-seeded George Washington as its first-round opponent in the West Region at Tucson, Ariz. New Mexico was in trouble before the team bus ever got to the McKale Center. Several Lobos, including starters Khari Jaxon and Steve Logan, were afflicted by food poisoning from a meal eaten the night before. That malady and the Colonials' brawn proved to be the difference in the 82-68 defeat. George Washington eventually lost to national runnerup Michigan in the Sweet 16.

1994 -- UNM advanced to the NCAA West Regional in Sacramento, Calif., on the strength of its regular-season WAC title. The 23-6 Lobos were a No. 10 seed and faced the 16-11 Virginia Cavaliers, the No. 7 seed. Five minutes into the second half, New Mexico appeared primed to snap its three-game NCAA Tournament victory drought and advance in the tourney for the first time since 1974. Outplaying the stronger Cavaliers, UNM forged a 41-26 lead five minutes into the second half on the strength of freshman Charles Smith. That's when the 3-pointers stopped falling. After making 6 of its first 15, UNM missed its last 10. The Lobos still led 54-49 with 2:46 remaining. However, in the last two minutes UNM turned it over once and missed its last five shots, including three game-tying 3-pointers in the final 12 seconds. The result was a tough 57-54 loss and an early exit. Smith led UNM with 20 points.

1996 -- The Lobos' four-game, 22-year victory drought in the NCAA Tournament came to a resounding halt in the East Regional in Richmond, Va. UNM won the WAC Tournament in Albuquerque and took a gaudy 27-4 record and an AP ranking of No. 23 into the tourney. New Mexico was a No. 7 seed and faced 10th-seeded Kansas State in the first round. UNM trailed early but rallied for a 31-30 halftime lead. It was still close at 43-41 when the Lobo defense took over. K-State was held to just one field goal the final 13:34 of the game as UNM closed with a 26-7 run and a convincing 69-48 victory. Sophomore forward Clayton Shields had 25 points and 10 rebounds. KSU shot just 29% (15-52) from the floor.

The Lobos' were rewarded by playing No. 2 seed and fourth-ranked Georgetown in the second round. New Mexico's magic continued in the first half against the Hoyas as it was a 35-32 ballgame in the Lobos' favor at intermission. Georgetown All-America Allen Iverson, the Hoyas' superior strength and foul trouble to UNM freshman center Kenny Thomas crippled the Lobos' chances in the second half. Iverson scored 19 of his 25 points in the final 20 minutes and Thomas picked up two personals in the first three minutes as the lead slipped away. Georgetown prevailed 73-62 to advance to the Sweet Sixteen. Shields led the Lobos again with 19 points. Due to foul trouble, Thomas was limited to only 37 minutes in the two tournament games. UNM finished with a 28-5 ledger, setting a school-record for victories.

1997 -- The Lobos were sent to the East Region for the second straight year, playing at the Civic Arena in Pittsburgh, Pa. UNM received an at-large berth as a No. 3 seed, the highest for the Lobos since the NCAA began the seeding process in 1979. New Mexico got past No. 14 seed Old Dominion in the first round, 59-55. Kenny Thomas' rebound and two free throws with two seconds remaining sealed the victory. Thomas had 15 points and 8 rebounds while freshman Lamont Long added

14 points and 9 boards.

UNM met No. 6 seed Louisville in the second round and came within a basket of advancing to the Sweet Sixteen for only the second time in school history. Trailing 64-63, the Lobos forced a Louisville turnover with 16 seconds remaining. UNM's set play coming out of the timeout broke down, and point guard David Gibson was forced to take an awkward shot driving to the basket, which missed. It marked the first time in 23 games that UNM led at halftime and lost. It was also the first time in 20 contests that New Mexico fell while holding an opponent to less than 70 points. Thomas, who fouled out with three personals in the second half, his third and fourth in a span of 22 seconds, and his fifth occurring during a Louisville free throw, had just 8 points and 3 rebounds. Senior Charles Smith had 16 points and 7 rebounds in his final game as a Lobo. Long again led UNM in rebounds with 8.

1998 -- The Lobos took a 23-7 record into their fifth NCAA Tournament in the past six seasons. UNM was sent to the South Region in Lexington, Ky., where it was a No. 4 seed, and faced Butler University in the first round.

UNM won 79-62, however, all did not look good early in the second half. Kenny Thomas, who finished with just three points and five rebounds, was on the bench with three fouls. Senior point guard David Gibson had to leave the game with 18:16 left after suffering a concussion and a broken right middle finger on a drive to the basket. The score was tied at 40-40 when the Lobos went on a 12-0 run to salt the game away. Some unlikely heroes stepped up. Senior post Ben Baum scored a season-high 14 points, making all three of his 3-point attempts, and tied a career-high with six rebounds. Freshman guard Tom Starkey, who had played just 35 minutes in nine games before the tournament, scored five points and grabbed a career-high seven rebounds in a career-best 13 minutes. Freshman guard Kevin Henry, normally the 2-guard, was forced to the point in the second half when Gibson went out. Henry responded with 14 points, while setting career-highs for FTs made (9), FT attempts (10) and assists (5). Sophomore Lamont Long led UNM with 22 points.

The Lobos advanced to the second round for the third straight season where they met Syracuse. UNM could never crack the Orangemen's 2-3 zone in the 56-46 setback. New Mexico converted just 14 of 55 shots (25.5%) overall and 6 of 25 from 3-point. Thomas had 12 points and 12 rebounds. Long added 11 points and 11 caroms.

1999 - The Lobos advanced to their fourth straight NCAA Tournament and seventh in the decade of the '90s. That streak was in serious jeopardy earlier in the season. Following a road loss at Hawai'i, the Lobos were 17-6 and had dropped four of five decisions. An upswing ensued, however, as UNM closed the regular season by winning five of its last six. Add an improbable run to the championship game of the WAC Tournament, and UNM locked up its 10th tournament berth.

Advancing as an at-large selection, New Mexico took a 24-8 record in the tournament. Surprisingly, the Lobos were kept in the West Region where they faced Missouri in the first round in Denver. Lamont Long's 8-foot jumper with six seconds left provided the margin in the 61-59 victory. Long paced UNM with 17 points and a season-high 12 rebounds. Senior Kenny Thomas had his finest showing in the NCAA Tournament with 20 points, 10 rebounds and four blocks before fouling out with 1:31 to go. New Mexico joined Cincinnati, Kansas, Kentucky, Purdue, Stanford and Utah as the only schools to win at least one NCAA Tournament game every year since 1996.

UNM fell to eventual national champ Connecticut 78-56, in a second-round matchup. UConn raced to a 17-0 lead and never looked back. The Huskies were ranked third in the polls and came in as the West's No. 1 seed. The Lobos shot a season-low 26.3% (15-57) from the floor and only 19% (4-21) from 3-point. After a stellar performance in the first round, Thomas was held without a field goal for the only time in his 123-game collegiate career. He finished with one point and 11 rebounds. Damion Walker came off the bench to lead the Lobos with 21 points.

2005 - After a six-year absence, New Mexico returned to the NCAA Tournament for the 11th time in school history off a strong run through the Mountain West Conference Tournament. This was also the first appearance in the NCAAAs for head coach Ritchie McKay, either as a player, an assistant, or a head coach. Despite posting a 26-7 record, the second most wins in school history, the Lobos were given a No. 12 seed in the Syracuse Regional.

pullled to within 52-47 with 29 seconds left, but they couldn't overcome their dismal start, falling to the Wildcats, 55-47. Danny Granger led New Mexico with 15 points and Mark Walters had 14 - all in the second half.

2010 - UNM returned to the Big Dance for the first time in five seasons after winning its second consecutive Mountain West Conference regular-season title. Despite losing in the semifinals of the MWC Tournament, the Lobos earned a No. 3 seed as an at-large team based on their 29-4 overall record and strong schedule that included a 6-0 mark against top-25 teams.

UNM drew a stubborn Montana team in an East Region first round game at San Jose, Calif. Roman Martinez had 19 points, six rebounds and four assists and the Lobos overcame a shaky start to beat the 14th-seeded Grizzlies 62-57. Darington Hobson added 11 points, 11 rebounds and six assists while playing with a sprained left wrist for the Lobos, who used a 17-0 run after halftime to briefly break open the game after trailing by a point at the break.

Martinez made three 3-pointers, including one with 7:44 to play, and Dairese Gary converted seven free throws over the final 3:36 as New Mexico staved off an upset. The Lobos won despite shooting 41.5% from the floor (22-53), 25% (5-20)

from 3-point, 56.5% (13-23) from the FT line and being outrebounded 37-31. UNM, however, did commit just 6 turnovers and held Montana's Anthony Johnson to 6 points on 1-12 FGs. Johnson came into the game averaging almost 20 a game. UNM did hold the Grizzlies to 37% shooting in the 2nd half (10-27) and 29% (4-14) from beyond the arc.

In the second round, Quincy Pondexter scored 18 points, Isaiah Thomas added 15 and 11th-seeded Washington won 82-64. The Lobos simply couldn't keep up with the breakneck offensive pace, falling behind by 23 points midway through the second half.

Dairese Gary matched his career high with 25 points and Darington Hobson had 11 points and nine rebounds for New Mexico. Hobson led the Lobos in points, rebounds and assists, but the junior hurt his left wrist and back on a first-round tumble to the court. He insisted he could play through the pain, but appeared to be favoring the wrist in pregame warmups - and he went 1 of 3 in the first half, failing to score after a 3-pointer in the opening minutes.

Roman Martinez was badly cut over his left eye with 12 minutes left in a collision with a teammate. He returned in a different jersey, finishing with 10 points.

2012 - New Mexico rode a conference regular season and tournament title into the 2012 NCAA Tournament, and the hot streak earned UNM a No. 5 seed into the West Regional, where UNM would face a tough 5-12 matchup with Long Beach State at the Rose Garden in Portland.

In one of the best second round games of the tournament, the Lobos used a closing 16-7 run over the final five minutes to come from behind and pull out a 75-68 win. Down 61-59 at the five-minute mark, Kendall Williams drained a three out of a timeout and right in front of the UNM bench to give UNM a 62-61 lead, one they would not relinquish. Casper Ware had a rare free throw miss on a one-and-one and UNM made Long Beach State pay with a Drew Gordon layup for a three-point lead. UNM would make five free throws in the final 39 seconds to keep the 49ers at bay.

Drew Gordon had another spectacular game with 18 points and 13 rebounds, and Kendall Williams added 16 points for UNM, which went .500 from the field at 25-for-50. Hugh Greenwood had 12 and Demetrius Walker had 11.

In the third round, New Mexico matched-up with No. 4 Louisville, and the Cardinals nipped the Lobos 59-56 to end UNM's season. The Lobos held an 11-6 lead early, but Louisville got a big day from Russ Smith off the bench with 17 points and three steals.

Louisville eventually took a 15-point lead at 44-29 before UNM came storming back. Jamal Fenton scored twice in 11 seconds to ignite the Lobos, who would eventually cut the lead all the way down to two on a three-pointer by Demetrius Walker with 1:43 left. Down six again with under 10 seconds left, Gordon got a rebound and hit a fadeaway three-pointer with 4.3 left to make it 59-56. Louisville then missed a one-and-one, but Gordon could only get off a halfcourt heave, which was off the mark.

Gordon had 21 points and 14 rebounds, coming back after hyperextending his knee in the first half. Kendall Williams added 11 for the Lobos, who went just 5-for-23 from the three-point line.

2013 - New Mexico earned a three-seed, tying for the best in school history, but UNM's season-long shooting struggles finally caught up with it, as the Lobos suffered a defeat to 14th-seeded Harvard in a Second Round West matchup in Salt Lake City.

The Lobos hit just one of their first 11 shots but UNM's defense kept them in the ballgame, not allowing Harvard to get more than a 6-point lead early, but UNM never led in the first half, trailing by four at the break after a late Tony Snell layup.

In the second, UNM bolted out to a quick tie and a two point lead with an opening 6-0 run before Harvard answered with a six-point run of its own. The Lobos would take a lead on four separate occasions, the last at 53-52 with 6:26 left on an Alex Kirk layup. However, everytime the Lobos took a lead, Harvard answered on the ensuing possession. Down one, Laurent Rivard hit one of nine Crimson triples which kickstarted a devastating 11-2 run that effectively won the game for Harvard.

The loss put a damper on a huge effort by UNM's post players Kirk and Cameron Bairstow, who combined for 37 points and 21 rebounds, with Kirk going for 22 and 12, and Bairstow 15 and nine. However the Lobos shot just .375 from the field while Harvard went 22-of-42, .524 from the field, and that spelled the difference in the game.

2014 - New Mexico as the seven-seed earned a date with Stanford, but the Harvard of the West did exact what Harvard did the year before, shoot lights out from three to upset the nationally-ranked Lobos, winning 58-53.

Stanford jumped out to a 20-4 lead in the first 6:22 of the game, and UNM spent the better part of the next 23 minutes trying to draw even, which it did when Cullen Neal hit a driving layup to tie the game at 45 with 10:07 to go. Neal was fouled in the process but couldn't give UNM its first lead since 4-3, and the Lobos went ice cold, ending the game on a 2-for-16 skid.

Right after tying it up, UNM went empty on 11 straight possessions (0-of-8 FGs, 0-2 FTs, two turnovers) until Hugh Greenwood hit his third three of the game to make it 54-50 with 1:06 to go. After UNM forced a turnover, Alex Kirk hit two free throws with 30.6 left to make it 54-52, but Stanford walk-on Robbie Lemons hit two free throws with 22.6 left.

UNM needed a miracle and almost got a chance. Down four with 7.2 left, Hugh Greenwood fouled Chasson Randle, who hit him in the head with an inadvertent elbow. Randle was assessed a technical, and UNM would get two free throws and the ball after Randle's two free throws. Needing him to miss one, he bounced the second one in for a 58-52 lead. Williams hit one of two and then missed a three that ended it.

QUICKLY ON THE 2013-14 LOBOS

New Mexico returned six lettermen and four starters from the 2012-13 season in which the Lobos went 29-6 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament's second round. The Lobos just missed winning a fifth regular season title over the last six years, finishing one game behind San Diego State. However, UNM became the first Mountain West team to win the conference tournament three straight years, giving UNM eight MW championship trophies, tying for the most in league history with San Diego State. The Lobos are the only team in Mountain West history to win both the regular season and tournament titles in back-to-back seasons.

All four returning starters earned All-Mountain West honors. Kendall Williams was First Team All-Mountain West as was Cameron Bairstow, and Williams and Alex Kirk were both named to the All-Defensive team. Alex Kirk was a Third Team selection. Hugh Greenwood was an Honorable Mention All-Conference. Williams, Kirk and Bairstow were named to the All-MW Tournament team, with Bairstow earning MVP honors, the third straight Lobo to do so.

Bairstow ended up as a four-time All-American, earning second team honors from Sports Illustrated, Third Team honors from NBC Sports and CBS Sports, and Honorable Mention honors from the Associated Press. Kendall Williams finished the season up for the Lefty Driesell Award for the top defensive player in the nation, and Craig Neal was up for the Joe B. Hall Award for the nation's top rookie head coach, and the Jim Phelan Award for the national Coach of the Year.

Bairstow, Kirk and Williams all earned All-District honors, and Bairstow was the USBWA District Player of the Year, and Craig Neal was the USBWA District Coach of the Year.

THE LOBOS IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The University of New Mexico is 8-16 all-time in NCAA Tournament, and this was the third straight year that the Lobos have qualified for the Big Dance. It was also the 16th appearance overall. The Lobos have made it three straight times just one other time, and that was when the school went four times in the Dave Bliss era from 1996 to 1999.

The Lobos, as has been pointed out by media, fans, Walter White ... pretty much everyone in Albuquerque, have never made it to the Sweet 16. Now, in 1974, when it was a 32-team tournament, the Lobos went to the mecca that is Pocatello, Idaho and won a game over Idaho State to make it to the round of 16. UNM then lost in the regional semifinal, and then won the regional semifinal consolation game, because it was a much simpler time back in the mid-70s. However, for the purposes of the modern 64 team tournament (or 65, or 68, or whatever it may ultimately become), UNM hasn't made the Sweet 16 by winning two games to start the tournament.

THE LOBOS AS A SEVEN-SEED

In hindsight it was a good thing the Lobos were able to defeat No. 8 San Diego State in the finals of the conference tournament, because the Lobos earned themselves the final 7-seed in the bracket.

New Mexico, who had a final NCAA RPI of 12 along with three wins over teams 1-25 in the RPI (that's as many as Wichita State, Villanova, VCU, UCLA and Gonzaga combined by the way), had been a 7-seed once before. Back in 1996, the Lobos went all the way out East to Richmond, Virginia and defeated No. 10 Kansas State 69-48 before bowing out to second-seeded and No. 4 Georgetown 73-62. UNM in that game had no answer for Allen Iverson (get it?) who scored 25 points as the Hoyas came back from a 35-32 halftime deficit.

That team for UNM was ranked No. 23 and the initial win over Kansas State ended a 22-year drought without a win in the tournament.

The Lobos however saw Stanford roll to a 17-0 run early in the game and a 20-4 start, and UNM could never recover, tying the game at 46 but ultimately never getting back the lead, losing 58-53.

CHA-CHA-CHA-CHANGES

Next year's Lobos will look slightly different than this year's Lobos did, and no, they aren't getting new uniforms (although with Coach Neal we are sure there is a trick or two up his sleeve). Along with losing seniors Cameron Bairstow, Kendall Williams and Chris Perez, Alex Kirk graduated and declared for the NBA Draft, and Nick Banyard (sophomore forward) and Tim Myles (freshman forward) have both asked for an been granted their releases.

Slated to return next year are seniors Hugh Greenwood and Deshawn Delaney, juniors Merv Lindsay, Arthur Edwards and Cleveland Thomas, and sophomores Cullen Neal, Obij Aget and Devon Williams.

We here at the University of New Mexico continue to be amazed that a program like ours, one with seven straight seasons of 22 wins (one of only 11), three straight NCAA tournaments, three straight seasons of at least 27 wins, All-Americans, Players of the Year, The Pit...you think folks would understand the next sentence.

WE ARE NEW MEXICO. Not New Mexico State. Those guys are south of us.

But nope...it continually gets screwed up, including three times in three days over the conference tournament weekend. However, it's not new. Below is a list in order of some of the more egregious mistakes of folks thinking we are New Mexico State.

*On Nov. 8 during the New Mexico-Air Force football game, the graphic for the first down marker was the New Mexico State logo.

*On Nov. 22, on the rundown on ESPN's SportsCenter, it said New Mexico St./UMass highlights. New Mexico played UMass that day, ironically on ESPN2.

*On Nov. 23, the social media feed for the New Mexico-Fresno State football game, again being shown on ESPN2, had the twitter feed for New Mexico State being run. New Mexico State was playing and losing to Florida Atlantic at the time.

*On Dec. 15, from the studio show prior to the game between New Mexico and Kansas on ESPN2, the announcers said to stay tuned to New Mexico State and Kansas.

*On Feb. 28, a panelist on ESPN's SportsCenter referred to New Mexico's chances in the NCAA Tournament getting damaged because of the fight with Utah Valley players and fans. That was actually New Mexico State hat played Utah Valley. FoxSports1 and Bleacher Report also had major issues with this incident as well.

*On March 3, the ESPN SportsCenter App ran a headline for three hours that said "No. 25 New Mexico State defeats Nevada" even though it was New Mexico that defeated Nevada and the game was shown on ESPN3. Apparently the Associated Press sent it out that way as it also showed up incorrectly for a little while on CBS Sports and Yahoo Sports.

*On March 13th, Jeff Eisenberg's Mountain West recap referred to the Lobos as New Mexico State in his recap of the win over Fresno State.

*On March 14th at the end of New Mexico's win over Boise State, Dan Bonner proclaimed "New Mexico State!" to a national audience on CBS Sports

*On March 16, about two hours after the brackets were announced, the Associated Press sent out it's preview of the Stanford-New Mexico matchup with two pictures: one of Stanford coach Johnny Dawkins, and one of New Mexico State's 7-6 center Sim Bhullar.

Now, it doesn't help that in 2010, 2012, 2013 and now 2014, the Lobos have been a top 20 team that has either won the regular season or Mountain West title, and in all four of those years, New Mexico State has won the WAC Tournament, meaning both schools are in the NCAA Tournament (and in 2012, both were in Portland, where for UNM's third round game with Louisville, the scoreboard said New Mexico State).

With all of that in mind, consider the following a handy dandy guide to understand which program is which.

*New Mexico's colors are Cherry and Silver, and the jersey colors are pretty much red. New Mexico State is Crimson and Black, and the jersey colors are pretty much maroon. Red = New Mexico; Maroon = New Mexico State.

*New Mexico is a member of the Mountain West Conference in all sports except for skiing (Rocky Mountain Intercollegiate Skiing Association) and men's soccer (Conference USA). New Mexico State is in the WAC, except for football, which is an independent, and next year moves to the Sun Belt. This might lead to confusion. New

*New Mexico's jerseys all say LOBOS. New Mexico State's jerseys do not say LOBOS. If the jersey in the highlight package says LOBOS, it is New Mexico in the highlights. If the jerseys say AGGIES, it's New Mexico State. Or Utah State. Or UC Davis. Or Texas A&M...it all depends on the color... but if it says LOBOS...that's New Mexico.

*New Mexico State uses a lot of black in it's uniforms, and at least for this pod, they will never wear white as a 13-seed. New Mexico will be wearing white uniforms on Friday. If you see a team in white it's New Mexico. If they are wearing maroon...or black, or something really really dark in color...it's New Mexico State.

*New Mexico has been nationally ranked in four of the last five years. New Mexico State hasn't, except for a few weeks ago was a voter in the Coaches Poll got the two schools confused and voted for New Mexico State when he meant New Mexico.

Sigh.

BAIRSTOW, WILLIAMS NAMED FIRST TEAM ALL-MOUNTAIN WEST

Kendall Williams was named First Team All-Conference for the second consecutive year, alongside teammate Cameron Bairstow, as the Mountain West released the 2014 postseason awards.

Bairstow, the conference's leading scorer and the only player in the Mountain West that is a national Player of the Year finalist (for the USBWA's Robertson Award), lost out the conference Player of the Year award to Xavier Thames. While Bairstow's was the conference's leading scorer, SDSU won the regular season title on the final day of the season, and in the 15 year history of the Mountain West, the Player of the Year has come from the team that won the regular season title, including a current streak of 11 straight.

It doesn't diminish what Bairstow has done, however, in which he has had a breakout season. Bairstow more than doubled his career points this season, leading the Mountain West in scoring at 20.4 points per game and in field goal percentage (where in conference play he was the only player over 50% at .576 as his teammate Alex Kirk was at .500).

His scoring average was the fifth-highest scoring average in the history of the conference, and his 368 points was the third-most in conference history. He is the first Lobo to ever lead the league in field goal percentage.

He also ranked 11th in rebounding in the conference as well as sixth in blocked shots and 10th in defensive rebounding.

He certainly was the league's most consistent player, never scoring fewer than 14 points in any game over the 18 game-schedule with a season-high of 29 coming against Colorado State in a game where UNM played without Alex Kirk. He had four double-doubles on the year, and he shot under 50% just three times, two of those by just one field goal. His scoring average dipped below 20 points per game just once, when it went to 19.7 after the third game of the year, and he had 22 20-point games.

Joining him on the first team was Kendall Williams, who became the fourth player in school history to earn back-to-back First Team All-Mountain West honors, and the first since Dairese Gary did the trick in 2010 and 2011. The others were Danny Granger in 2004 and 2005, and Ruben Douglas in 2002 and 2003. Douglas, like Williams, was a three-time honoree as a Second Team All-Mountain West selection as well.

Williams finished seventh in scoring, fifth in three-point percentage, second in steals, first in assists, and second in asst/turnover ratio. He also was the first player in school history to record a double-double in scoring and assists with no turnovers, and he was the only player in the league with three different games of nine or more assists and one or fewer turnovers.

WILLIAMS, KIRK NAMED ALL DEFENSE, KIRK THIRD TEAM ALL-MW

Kendall Williams was also named to the league's six-man All-Defensive Team, along with teammate Alex Kirk. Kirk, who was second in the league in blocks and seventh in rebounding, is the first two-time back-to-back All-Defensive Team member since Dairese Gary in 2009 and 2010. It marks the first time that the Lobos have had two players on the all-defensive team, and it makes sense. The defensive unit allowed just 63.2 points per game, and finished the year holding 12 straight opponents under its scoring average. Also, the team has held the last six opponents under 60 points for the longest streak since the 1964-65 season, and all six of those have been held at least 12 points under its average.

Rounding out the honors for UNM was junior guard Hugh Greenwood, who was named Honorable Mention for the second straight season.

BAIRSTOW, WILLIAMS, KIRK HONORED AT MW TOURNAMENT

Just a year after winning All-Tournament honors and asking his head coach "what does that mean?" while up on the interview dais, Cameron Bairstow was not only all-tournament, but the Mountain West Tournament MVP. joining him on the all-tournament team was Kendall Williams and Alex Kirk. The other two players to make the squad were San Diego State's Dwayne Polee II and Xavier Thames.

NCAA RANKS THE PIT AS ONE OF TOP FIVE LOUDEST ARENAS

Over at www.ncaa.com, the folks have been releasing little "Top 5" videos ... top five this, and top five that. On Tuesday, they released the Top 5 Loudest Arenas in College Basketball, and The Pit checked in at Number 5. The only arenas it was behind was Gallagher-Iba (Oklahoma State) at No. 4, The Carrier Dome (Syracuse) at No. 3, Cameron Indoor Stadium (Duke) at No. 2 and Phog Allen Fieldhouse (Kansas) at No. 1.

THE LOBOS VS. THE FIELD

The Lobos played eight games against five other NCAA Tournament teams, going 4-4 in those eight matchups. New Mexico has already faced off against Kansas, who was in UNM's pod, losing 80-63. UNM went 2-1 against San Diego State, winning in The Pit 58-44, losing in Viejas Arena 51-48, and winning in the conference

tournament 64-58. UNM defeated Cincinnati 63-54 in December, split with New Mexico State (winning 79-70 in Las Cruces and losing 67-61 in The Pit), and lost to UMass 81-65 after UNM went double-overtime the day before with UAB.

If you want to delve into the other postseason tournaments, UNM was 1-0 against teams in the NIT (beat Davidson 79-58), 4-0 against CBI teams (sweeping Wyoming and Fresno State), and going 2-0 against CIT teams (beating San Diego and Grand Canyon). Overall, UNM went 11-4 against teams in the postseason.

Also, of UNM's 11 non-conference opponents (UNM played the Aggies of NMSU twice), New Mexico played seven teams (and eight games) against postseason teams.

BAIRSTOW SAYS G'DAY AND LATER MATE TO HIS COUNTRYMAN!

When Cameron Bairstow hit the 1,000 point club, he became the seventh player in the last six years that the Lobos have had a player hit the 1,000-point mark. Here is that list.

Cameron finished has 694 points this season. Now that is ridiculously good. It's even better when you look at it like this:

Cameron Bairstow, first 3 years:	100 games	545 points
Cameron Bairstow, this year:	34 games	694 points

How many other Lobos have doubled their career totals in their final season to hit 1,000 points? Just two, and both were JC players. Marvin "Automatic" Johnson scored 673 points as a senior after a 573-point junior season. The other was Johnny Brown, who scored 649 points as a senior after a 508-point junior season.

Bairstow is now sixth on the single-season scoring list at New Mexico. It's the most points by a Lobo in a single-season since Ruben Douglas scored 783 in the 2002-03 season.

Bairstow also picked up his 600th-career rebound on March 8, making him one of eight Lobos in school history with 1,200 points and 600 rebounds in his career.

I COULD SERIOUSLY JUST TALK ABOUT CAM AND KENDALL AT THIS POINT...

We should probably review where Mr. Bairstow and Mr. Williams stand in the Mountain West record books on a few things. For points, his 694 points this season was the fifth-most in MW history (and unless he pulled a Frank Selvy, he wasn't going to catch the first place guy Jimmer Fredette at 1,068 points. The 694 was also the third-most ever for a senior in the Mountain West.

Bairstow's 219 made free throws this season is also fifth on the all-time MW charts. Of course, Kendall has those 556 made free throws for his career, which is third-most in Mountain West history. Kendall's 727 career free throw attempts are also second all-time in the league, and Cam's 298 attempts this season is second as well.

MOVE OVER JIMMER

Cameron Bairstow's 41 free throw attempts were a new Mountain West single tournament record, besting Jimmer Fredette's 38 from the 2010 tournament. Bairstow went 33-of-41 from the line, and .805 clip.

A TRIUMVIRATE UNLIKE ANY OTHER

Kendall Williams entered the season with 1,269 points (he finished fifth on the all-time UNM scoring list). In early January, he was joined in the 1,000 point club by teammate Cameron Bairstow. That meant the 2013-14 was the 10th season in Lobo basketball history that had two 1,000-point scorers as teammates on the floor at the same time.

However, on March 15 during the Mountain West championship game, Alex Kirk scored eight points, the first of which made him the 32nd player in Lobo basketball history to join the 1,000-point club. By doing so, Williams, Bairstow and Kirk are the first triumvirate of teammates to play on the same Lobo team, all as members of the 1,000-point club. The game against Stanford is the only time in school history three current 1,000-point club members started the same game.

POLL POSITION

The Lobos finished in the national polls, ranking No. 17 in the AP Poll and as the first team in the "others receiving votes" section in the Coaches Poll. Other UNM opponents in the AP Poll or receiving votes include Kansas at No. 10/14, San Diego State at 13/12 and Cincinnati at No. 15/22, with UMass getting votes in the AP Poll. The last AP poll is released prior to the NCAA Tournament, while the Coaches Poll is after the tournament. That means in the final AP Poll finished ahead of both national championship game participants UConn (18th) and Kentucky (RV).

The Lobos have been ranked in the AP poll for 37 weeks this decade, which is the 27th most weeks in the country (ahead with Indiana). In the western U.S., only three programs have spent more weeks ranked than the Lobos this decade; Arizona (50 weeks), San Diego State (59 weeks) and Gonzaga (60 weeks).

The Lobos have been ranked in four of the last five seasons. Prior to this run, the last time UNM had been ranked was at the end of the 1999 season, when the Lobos were ranked 25th and lost to eventual national

The Lobos went 9-4 on the road last season and 8-3 in 2011-12.

This season continued a trend as New Mexico and San Diego State both went 7-2 on the road. The MW title every year has been won by the team with at least a tie for the best road record except the first season in 2000.

The 7-2 mark is the sixth time in the last seven seasons the UNM has been at least .500 on the road in conference play (the team went 3-5 in 2010-11). The only other New Mexico team with a winning road record? That very first Mountain West season of 1999-2000, under Fran Fraschilla.

Now, while you can win some road games in a season, consistency is doing it year after year.

In 2012-13 UNM went 9-4 on the road, and this year the team went 8-3, giving UNM 17 road wins over a two-year period. That ties the school record of 17 set by the 2011-12/2012-13 Lobos. The previous record of 16 was set by the 2008-09/2009-10 Lobos and the 2009-10/2010-11 Lobos.

YOU KNOW, SPEAKING OF TRIUMVIRATES UNLIKE ANY OTHER

New Mexico in the last three seasons has gone 28-7, 29-6, and now 27-7. Over the last three seasons, the Lobos are 84-20. That easily is the best three-year stretch in school history. The previous best three-year stretch was an 80-25 record from 2009-10 through 2011-12.

Of these teams, all of whom made the NCAA Tournament, New Mexico has the fifth-best winning percentage in the nation.

KENDALL BREAKS A MAJOR UNM MILESTONE

Kendall Williams, who is one of eight Lobos with 200 career free throws, hit a major milestone with his made free throw with 18.6 seconds left against Boise State.

He finished his career with 556 made free throws in his career, and moving ahead of Phil Smith for the all-time school record. He also finished with 727 free throw attempts, and he needs three behind Smith's UNM record of 730.

Williams already hit the major milestone of scoring 400 points in all four of his seasons, becoming the second Lobo in school history to accomplish that feat, joining the great Kenny Thomas. Williams scored 406 as a freshman, 410 as a sophomore, and 453 as a junior and he now has 509.

The hidden story is it almost wasn't ever to be. Williams entered the second round NIT game at Alabama with 388 points, and scored just four in the first half. However, sitting at 397 points with under a minute to go, Williams hit three threes in 24 seconds to put him at 406 for the season.

The following year he entered what ended up being UNM's final game, the third round NCAA game against Louisville, with 399 points, but he safely scored 11 to end up at 410.

KANSAS AND GONZAGA ARE THE ONLY TWO NOW...

New Mexico missed a chance to join Kansas and Gonzaga as the only teams to win five conference titles in the last six years. Kansas has won an incredible 10 straight conference titles, and Gonzaga has won five of the last six West Coast Conference titles.

I GUESS FOR ONE WEEK A YEAR THERE ARE TWO LAS VEGAS, NEW MEXICOS

Only two teams has won its conference tournament in each of the last three years, and apparently the best conference tournament basketball is being played by teams from the Land of Enchantment. New Mexico and New Mexico State are the only two programs in the nation to have won back-to-back-to-back conference tournament titles. Both were won in Las Vegas, Nevada. Ironically, most folks don't know this but there is a Las Vegas, New Mexico as well, although apparently in mid-march there are two of those.

Twice this year Lobos have gotten up to 51 straight games started before having that streak end. Hugh Greenwood saw his streak end at 51 when he didn't start against New Mexico State, and on Saturday, Alex Kirk saw his starting streak end at 51 games with a foot injury. Deshawn Delaney had started 18 straight (UNM went 16-2) but sat out so walk-on freshman Chris Perez could make his first start.

Kendall Williams finished with 52 straight games.

CERTAINLY SHOULD MAKE THE SUMMER-TIME GOLF OUTINGS ENJOYABLE

The Lobos finished 27-7, moving Craig Neal ahead of his former boss Steve Alford for the most wins by a rookie Lobo head coach, as Alford went 24-9 in his first season in 2007-08. His 27 wins are the second-most by a first-year head coach this season behind Stephen F. Austin's Brad Underwood (32-3), although Underwood was a JC head coach for seven seasons.

UNM went 15-3 in the Mountain West this year, which is pretty much spectacular. However, it's better when you look at it this way. Counting the Mountain West Tournament last year and this year, UNM has now won 27 of it's last 31 MW games, and the four losses were by 1 to Air Force (missed a shot at the buzzer), 3 to UNLV (missed three shots to tie in the final 10 seconds, including one at the buzzer), 1 at Boise State (missed a shot at the buzzer), and 3 at San Diego State (missed a shot with 10 seconds left).

The Lobos, again counting the MW Tournament, are now 15-3 in its last 18 conference road/neutral games, with all three losses by a combined five points in which UNM had chances to win or tie in the last 10 seconds.

JUST SOME MORE RECORDS TO REPORT

No team has ever gone undefeated on the road in conference play in Mountain West history, but three teams have gone 7-1 and two have gone 7-2, with the seven wins being the most wins on the road in a single-season in MW history. The Lobos and the Aztecs both have won seven games twice, with both teams going 7-1 once (UNM in 2010, San Diego State in 2011), and then both teams went 7-2 this season. BYU was the only other team to go 7-1 in MW road play, doing so in 2011 as well.

Also, New Mexico and San Diego State were the first Mountain West teams to ever win as many as 15 games in a season, and the 15 wins is UNM's conference record (the most in the WAC era was 13).

KENDALL, CAM AND CP JOIN THE CENTURY CLUB

In 2011, Dairese Gary became the winningest scholarship Lobo player of all-time, winning 98 career games, besting Kenny Thomas, who won 96 (Kenny's teams won 102, but he was declared ineligible by the NCAA, so he can not be credited with the six games won while he was ineligible).

In 2012, A.J. Hardeman and Phillip McDonald surged past Gary, winning 102 games to best his scholarship record, and tie the record of former walk-on Marcos White, who won 102 games, although he only played in 38 in his career.

Chad Adams and Jamal Fenton overtook that mantle last season, as Adams and Fenton each had 109 wins for the most by a player, scholarship or otherwise, in Lobo history. This year, Cameron Bairstow, Kendall Williams and Chris Perez are now all tied for third on the wins list at UNM.

GETTING TRENDY...

Here were some of the fun trends of 2013-14:

- *New Mexico went 23-2 this season when leading at the half, and 4-5 when trailing.
- *New Mexico is now 23-2 when outshooting its opponents, and 4-5 when not doing so.
- *UNM has allowed 33 points or less in the first half of 19 of its last 22 games
- *After suffering through a three-game stretch (Cincinnati, Kansas, New Mexico State) where UNM hit just five three-pointers combined, the Lobos have made at least five in 20 of the 24 games since.
- *UNM has had more assists than turnovers in 21 of the last 24, and in one of the games it didn't occur, the assists and turnovers were even.
- *UNM has registered more blocks than its opponent in 26 of 34 games this season.
- *The Lobos have committed more fouls than its opponents only seven times all year, going 4-3 (UMass, Davidson, at Colorado State, both UNLV games and both regular season San Diego State games).
- *The Lobos have committed single-digit turnovers in 11 of the last 22 after accomplishing the feat just twice in the first 12 games.

AS THE WORLD TURNS (SINCE IT DOESN'T TURNOVER IN UNM'S WORLD)

The basketball is a precious commodity, and UNM is treating it as such. In the Lobos' 18 Mountain West games this season, UNM turned the ball over in double digits just seven times (14 in the possession filled game against Fresno State, 13 in overtime against Wyoming, 16 and 13 against San Diego State, 13 against Air Force, 11 against Colorado State and 10 vs. Utah State). In the other 11 games, UNM has had eight turnovers five times, seven turnovers four times, four turnovers against Boise State and a school-record low of three against SISU.

As a team, New Mexico had 12 or fewer turnovers in 18 of its last 25 games. In conference play, UNM had a turnover rate of 14.2%, meaning that the Lobos will suffer a turnover in one out of every eight offensive possessions. Nationally, the Lobos finished 42nd in turnover rate. In addition, the Lobos had 361 turnovers this year in 34 games, or an average of 10.62 turnovers per game, setting a new school record for fewest turnover average per game. The previous school record for fewest turnovers per game on average is 11.06, set in the 30-5 season in 2009-10 when in 35 games the team had 387 turnovers.

ALGEBRA LESSON (7-0) + (6-9) = NO 25

The Lobos have two very talented big men in Alex Kirk and Cameron Bairstow, who stand 7-0 and 6-9 respectively. UNM also has some solid young talent that comes off the bench in 6-7 Merv Lindsay and 7-1 Obij Aget. All that athleticism and height means UNM can defend the paint. Really defend the paint. The Lobos, who ranked 10th nationally in field goal percentage defense, rank third in 2-pt defense, allowing opponents to shot just 41.4 from the field. Here is the top five:

UNM is also 21st in effective field goal percentage defense, which counts a three-pointer as 1.5 field goals in the equation.

KENDALL, MEET JIMMER...JIMMER, THIS IS KENDALL

When Kendall Williams hit a three-pointer last in the first half against Colorado State on January 8, it pushed him over the 1,500-point mark in his career, and it put him in exclusive Mountain West company. Kendall now is a member of the exclusive 1,500-point, 500-assist, 150-steal club, and the only other player in Mountain West history to accomplish those three milestones is BYU's Jimmer Fredette.

40 DAYS AND 40 NIGHTS

The University of New Mexico basketball team has pretty much lived and died by the number 40. The Lobos this season are 25-3 when shooting 40% or more, and 2-4 when shooting below 40%. New Mexico's worst shooting night in a win while shooting 40% was against Wyoming at home, going 23-of-54, .426. UNM came close to 40% against UMass, shooting .391. The lowest game this season in which UNM shot under 40% and still won was against UAB, when the Lobos went 31-for-91, shooting .341.

The only games that the Lobos have lost when shooting above 40% was when UNM lost 76-73 to UNLV as the Lobos shot 44.4% at 24-of-54 but lost when UNLV was 50% at 24-of-48. Against Boise State, UNM shot .512 from the field and lost.

Going back to last year, UNM is 45-4 when shooting 40% or more. Since the 2010-11 season, UNM is 69-5 in games in which it shoots 40% or better, and UNM is 15-15 when shooting under 40%.

LOBO DEFENSE UNDER 40% AGAIN

New Mexico's defense has given up more points this season on average than last season as UNM is allowing 66.1 points per game after allowing 60.6 per game a year ago.

The Lobos however played tough defense, as evidenced by this note: UNM forced opponents to shoot .389 from the field. Last year UNM's opponents shot .391, and the year before they shot .384, meaning UNM had three straight years of under 40% field goal defense. The only time that has happened was a string of six straight years from 1952-53 to 1957-58.

In the previous 53 years before this current run started, the Lobos had held an opponent under 40% for the season just once, and that was the 1964-65 season, when UNM held opponents to a .367 field goal percentage.

THEY AREN'T BOOING...THEY ARE SAYING HUUUUUUUUUGH

Hugh Greenwood played 986 minutes this year, and suffered 30 turnovers. That's it...30 turnovers in just 31 games. Greenwood's assist-to-turnover ratio is 3.50-to-1 (105 assists, 30 turnovers). His 3.50-to-1 ratio was sixth in the NCAA.

I MEAN THESE LOOK REALLY GOOD

ALWAYS A GOOD SIGN

You are in good shape if you make more or as many free throws than your opponent attempts...and that was the case again. UNM made 625 free throws (of 864) while its opponents have attempted 625 (making 453). It was the second straight year that UNM has made more or as many free throws than its opponents had attempted. It is the first time in school history that this has occurred in back-to-back seasons, and just fifth time in the previous 63 seasons (2013-14, 2012-13, 1998-99, 1993-94, 1983-84).

#DUNKINGBAD

Lots of Lobos tweets regarding the team use the hashtags #GoLobos (official UNM hashtag) and #MWBB (official Mountain West basketball hashtag). Many fans love the hashtag #UnfinishedBusiness (as does the team...it's on the gray wristbands the players and staff wear), and of course, Vice President of Athletics Paul Krebs famously announced the hiring of Craig Neal with the simple Tweet Noodles, which immediately became #Noodles and earned our VP for Athletics tremendous street cred from the student-athletes for his twitter game.

However, a totally new hashtag was in order, as the Lobos turned into a high-flying dunking machine. New Mexico is outdunking their opponents 117-48.

The Lobos already had seven players record dunks with Alex Kirk's 47 leading the way, and Cameron Bairstow's 34 in second. With #DunkCity taken apparently, this year @UNMHoops used a truly fitting hashtag that UNM broke out for dunks...#DunkingBad.

CAMERON PASSED THE ENTIRE 2012-13 TEAM

Last year for the 35-game season, the Lobos totalled 16 20-point games, with only one game having a player score more than 27, and that was Kendall Williams' 46-point night at Colorado State. In 2013-14, through 34 games, the Lobos had 38 20-point games, and 22 of those belong to Cameron Bairstow, more than our entire total from last year. UNM has also had eight different games of 27 points or more.

The entire rest of the team has now equalled the rest of the team from last year.

Last year, only three players, Tony Snell, Alex Kirk, and Kendall Williams, scored 20 or more, while five have this year (Williams, Kirk, Cameron Bairstow, Cullen Neal and Hugh Greenwood).

New Mexico's offense averaged 74.0 points per game.

UNM VS. THE TOP 10

Craig Neal warned everyone about the season Cameron Bairstow was going to put up...he really did. However, not even he foresaw a 20.4 points per game scoring average, .556 FG%, .735 FT%, second in blocks, fourth in steals, and fifth in assists.

For certain, no one saw the 20-point thing, and why would anyone, because Cameron is on the way to accomplishing something never done in school history. In the history of the University of New Mexico, no player has ever gone from averaging single digits in a season to averaging 20 points per game. Bairstow averaged 9.7 points per game last year, and is currently averaging 20.4, a jump of 10.7 points per game.

Now we get to delve into why we have great fans. Previous research had Hunter Greene's 10.0 points per game jump as the highest season-to-season jump in school history, but Lobo fans Laszlo and Ken Hansen of thelobolair.com actually discovered two others...Ron Nelson and Willie Long. With apologies to those two great Lobos, here is the complete list of the best single-season scoring jumps in school history, with Bairstow sitting in third place.

With Cameron Bairstow leading the team in scoring this season, an interesting note can come out of that (which is what I live for by the way). With Bairstow leading the team in scoring, it made him the seventh different player in the last seven years to lead the team in scoring. In order from 2007-08, it has been J.R. Giddens (16.3), Tony Danridge (14.9), Darington Hobson (15.9), Dairese Gary (14.1), Drew Gordon (13.7), Kendall Williams (13.1) and now Bairstow (20.4).

It has only happened once before in school history, when Willie Long, Mike Faulkner, Darryl Minniefield, Bernard Hardin, Bill Hagins, Larry Gray, and Marvin Johnson led the team from the 1970-71 season through the 1976-77 season. With Bairstow and Williams gone, it means UNM would set the record next season, as the team has to have a new scoring leader next year. If it happens to be one of the seniors, then this streak will amazingly go to nine for nine after the 2015-16 season.

WILLIAMS NOT ON FINAL COUSY LIST

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced on Monday, February 17 the 23 watch list finalists for the 2014 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award. Named after Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, the annual honor recognizes the top point guards in men's college basketball. The original watch list of 80 candidates was narrowed down to the below list of 23 by a nationally based committee.

"The 23 athletes on this list represent the most committed, determined and skillful point guards in college basketball," said John L. Doleva, President and CEO of the Basketball Hall of Fame. "We are honored to be recognizing their strengths and are excited to move forward in the selection process."

"The men on this list all have the athletic qualities of an exceptional true point guard in the game of college basketball, the same qualities that made Mr. Cousy an iconic player," said Ken Kaufman, Chair of the Bob Cousy Award and former president of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). "All of these young men are on this list because they deserve to be competing for this well-respected award."

Through Monday March 10th, fans from around the country will have the chance to vote for the top point guard in college basketball – fan voting is at www.cousyaward.com. The current listing of 23 finalists for the 2014 Bob Cousy Award will be narrowed down to five players by early March. The final five players in contention for the award will be presented to Mr. Cousy and the Hall of Fame's selection committee. The Hall of Fame committee is made up of top college basketball personnel including media members, head coaches, Hall of Famers and Sports Information Directors.

The winner of the 2014 Bob Cousy Award will be presented at the Hall of Fame's Class Announcement on Championship Monday in North Texas as part of NCAA Final Four weekend.

In 2009 and 2010, Dairese Gary was on the first Cousy Watch list (prior to this season the list was announced in December). In 2011, Williams was on the list, and last year both Williams and Hugh Greenwood made the initial list. Williams made it to the semifinal list of 20 names last year. This year's group has been cut to six, and Williams is not on the list.

BAIRSTOW NAMED TO MIDSEASON NAISMITH, WOODEN AND ROBERTSON WATCH LIST

On Wednesday of last week was some great news as Cameron Bairstow advanced to the final 15 names and is officially a finalist for the USBWA Oscar Robertson Award for National Player of the Year. The next day however he was not on the semifinal list of 10 names for the Naismith Award. He is expected to be on the final Wooden List.

On Thursday, February 13, Cameron Bairstow was named to the Naismith Award Top 30 List, making him three-for-three on getting named to National Player of the Year Watch Lists. The Naismith Award is conducted by the Atlanta Tip-Off Club.

Senior forward Cameron Bairstow was one of 23 players named to the Oscar Robertson Trophy Midseason Watch List by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association. Members of the association's board of directors chose the players to be included on the list as contenders for the Oscar Robertson Trophy. He also was one of 25 players named to the Wooden Award Midseason Top 25 List as announced by the Los Angeles Athletic Club.

Bairstow was one of 17 players that are on all three midseason lists for national player of the year. Joining him on both lists are Keith Appling (Michigan State), Cleananthy Early (Wichita State), Tyler Ennis (Syracuse), C.J. Fair (Syracuse), Aaron Gordon (Arizona), Nick Johnson (Arizona), DeAndre Kane (Iowa State), Doug McDermott (Creighton), Shabazz Napier (Connecticut), Jabari Parker (Duke), Casey Prather (Florida), Julius Randle (Kentucky), Marcus Smart (Oklahoma State), Russ Smith (Louisville), Andrew Wiggins (Kansas) and Chaz Williams (Massachusetts).

FANS FLOCKED TO THE PIT ONCE AGAIN

The University of New Mexico has finished in the national top 25 in attendance for each of the 46 seasons that The Pit has been around, and 2013-14 is proving to be no different. This season the Lobos averaged 15,212, with eight complete sell-outs and five other lower bowl sell-outs. UNM played to 98.71% capacity. It is believed to be the best capacity percentage in school history.

The Lobos are currently 16th in the country in attendance at 15,212, and the 98.71% capacity number is 22nd nationally. Only BYU at 15,875 has a higher attendance among schools in the western conferences.

KENDALL IS ALL ALONE

Kendall Williams is the only player in school history with 1,500 points, 500 assists and 150 steals.

NEAL INKS TWO IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

Craig Neal has announced the signings of Xavier Adams, a 6-5 wing out of Texas, and Joe Furstinger, a 6-8 forward from to National Letters of Intent. Adams and Furstinger will join the team for the 2014-15 season.

The signings are the fourth and fifth for Neal since becoming the 20th head coach of the New Mexico Lobos in April of 2013. He signed Cullen Neal out of Eldorado High School along with junior college players Arthur Edwards and Deshawn Delaney.

In Adams the Lobos will have a 6-5 guard who starred at Alvarado High School in Alvarado, Texas last year, although he will be spending the 2013-14 season with Marcus High School. Adams averaged 25.7 points per game as a junior, scoring 720 points on the year, shooting 46% from the field and adding 33 three-pointers. A solid free throw shooter, he hit 73% last year, getting to the line 293 times.

He averaged a double-double last year, grabbing 13.6 rebounds per game and totaling 76 assist and 71 steals. He also added a whopping 76 blocked shots last season as well.

Over his junior season at Alvarado, he recorded double-doubles in 24 of his 28 games played. Perhaps his best night was a 41-point, 11-rebound effort in a 51-46 win over Cleburne. He scored at least 20 points 21 times, at least 30 seven times, and at least 40 twice for Alvarado.

He earned a slew of postseason honors, including District MVP along with First Team All-District. He was also named to the Texas Association of Basketball Coaches All-State and All Region.

Adams spent his summers playing for The Dream 2014 AAU.

"He's a really good kid and a really good student," said Neal of Adams. "He's one of those kids who was a bit under the radar. He went from an unknown to like No. 8 in the state of Texas but he's really talented. He's had some big scoring nights in high school and he's going to continue to get better and better.

Joe Furstinger also averaged a double-double last year as well for Santa Margarita Catholic in Rancho Santa Margarita, California. The 6-8, 200 pound forward averaged 16.6 points per game and 10.7 rebounds per game last season as a junior. He shot 54% from the field (200-of-374), and even showed touch from long range with seven three-pointers. Furstinger's high school coach Jeff Reinert was a two-year letterwinner for the Lobos from 1980-82.

Furstinger was a 69% shooter from the line, going 125-for-181, and blocked 91 shots and added 61 assists and 28 steals.

He recorded in double-figures in 28 of 32 games last year with 21 double-doubles. His topped the 20-point mark 11 times and a 30-point mark twice, including a high of 32 in a 65-49 win over Huntington Beach.

Furstinger spent his summers playing for Pangos Elite AAU.

Said Neal of Furstinger, "Joe is a late bloomer... (he's) 6-8, 6-9, probably about 210, 215 pounds. I was really impressed with him this summer, and he plays for a former Lobo. I think he's going develop and be a really good player. Both of these guys will have a chance to play as freshman."

UNM has three scholarships to fill for the 2014-15 season.

GETTING HALFWAY THERE

The Lobos have had four seasons in the decade of the 2010s, and it has started out pretty good. As of right now, New Mexico is 106-33 in the decade, and the .763 is the best winning percentage of any decade in Lobo basketball history.

SEASON NO. 111 COMPLETE

The University of New Mexico men's basketball program played its 111th season on the hardwood in 2013-14. The Lobos first laced up the high tops on Feb. 2, 1900, when they lost 8-6 to the Albuquerque Guards. This season is actually the 114th anniversary of that inaugural year, UNM did not field a team for various reasons in 1900-01, 1903-04, 1917-18 and 1920-21.

The Lobos have been playing continuously since 1921-22 and have compiled an all-time record of 1,445-1,056 (.578).

YEAR 15 IN MOUNTAIN WEST COMPLETE

New Mexico has an 135-93 overall record in Mountain West play, but 83-29 in the last seven seasons.

The Lobos are 87-27 in The Pit and 48-66 on the road. UNM has gone 35-20 the past seven seasons on the road after going just 7-37 in league road games the previous six. A look at UNM in MW play:

collegiate and professional ranks afforded him a chance to learn and coach on many stages. Neal is heavily involved in the UNM offensive setup, and he is well respected nationally for his recruiting ability, game strategy, and knowledge of the game.

The Lobos flourished with Neal in the

After spending the past six years as New Mexico's Associate Head Coach, Craig Neal was named the 20th head coach of the Lobos on April 2, 2013, and was introduced to a pack house of media members and fans a day later. Neal was the right-hand man of former coach Steve Alford for the past six years at New Mexico, and the previous three years before UNM at the University of Iowa. In his nine years in college basketball, Neal's teams at UNM and Iowa have averaged 24.2 wins per year with eight seasons of 20 wins or more and eight post-season berths, including five trips to the NCAA Tournament.

Neal agreed to a five-year contract with the university.

"I'm truly honored to be the head coach at the University of New Mexico," said Neal. "Over the past six years my family and I have been overwhelmed by the support we have received in this community. Coach Alford allowed me the opportunity to really make an impact on this program, and I'm excited to continue building on what we started six years ago."

"We are excited that Craig Neal will be our next basketball coach," said Krebs. "We did a tremendous amount of work and research in a very short time. Craig was a major part of a staff that has not only won championships but graduated student-athletes, raised our academics to record levels, and poured a tremendous amount of energy into our community in the form of service projects. Craig probably had as much freedom with our program in making decisions as any associate head coach in the country, and his time working with Coach Alford has prepared him fully for this task."

Said President Robert Frank, "Coach Neal understands what being a Lobo is all about. He impressed me with his vision, dedication, and passion for leading here."

Craig Neal was emotional at his introductory press conference when talking about his family and the Lobo program.

Known throughout the college basketball landscape as "Noodles", a nickname he received in high school due to his thin stature, Neal has been actively involved in all facets of the program for the last six years, from on-the-floor coaching to all of the behind-the-scenes work for a major college basketball program. Neal is considered one of the finest tactical coaches in the nation, as his diverse background in the

associate head coach role, winning 155 games over the past six seasons, the most successful six-year period in school history. Neal, who handled the offense for the Lobos, has helped New Mexico consistently finish at the top of the conference in most offensive statistics.

The Lobos have finished in the top four in scoring offense in each of the past six seasons, and in top four in both scoring margin, field goal percentage, and three-point field goal percentage. UNM has also finished in the top four in assists in all five years, and in the top three in assist-turnover ratio as well.

With New Mexico Neal has been a part of three of the winningest teams in school history, as the 2009-10 team won a school record 30 games, the 2012-13 team won 29 games, and the 2011-12 team tied for the third-most wins in school history with 28.

Iowa posted a 63-35 record while Neal was on staff, including consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament. The Hawkeyes won 25 games in 2005-06, the second highest total in school history. They also captured the Big Ten Conference tournament title, set a school record with 10 wins over top 25 opponents and ran off a school-record 18-game winning streak in Carver-Hawkeye Arena, winning all 17 home games in 2005-06. Neal was instrumental in Iowa's recruiting efforts. More than one publication ranked the 2006-07 class as one of the top 10 catches in the nation.

Neal served as an assistant coach with the Raptors from 2000-03 and was involved in scouting and player development in 2003-04. With Toronto he served under Lenny Wilkens, the winningest coach in NBA history. He was also a Toronto scout for four seasons before becoming an assistant coach in 2000.

Neal was a scout in North America and Europe for one year before joining the Iowa staff, scouting high school, junior college, college and European players for the NBA Draft and for trade possibilities. He was also involved with development of current roster players, recruiting of free agents and selecting players for summer league and training camps.

As an assistant coach from 2000-03, Neal was involved with practice preparation, advance scouting, and the preparation and implementation of opponent scouting reports. He managed and directed Toronto's player development program, both during the season and

the summer. Neal coached Toronto's summer league team for three years and was the lead coach in directing all Raptor college pre-draft workouts. His duties also included assisting with the operations budget, working with advance scouting team and coordinating schedules for Toronto scouts.

Neal was a two-year starter at Georgia Tech in the mid-1980s. He earned all-Atlantic Coast Conference honors as a senior in 1988 when he set the ACC single-season record with 303 assists. Neal's playing career at Tech spanned five seasons, as he was limited to just four games in 1984-85 due to injury. He averaged 7.7 points as a senior. Neal averaged a league-best 9.5 assists per game (11.6 in conference games) that season, which still stands as a single-season record at Georgia Tech. His 659 career assists was a school record at the time and now ranks third best at Tech. Neal's 5.2 career assist average is fourth best at Tech and his 127 career steals is the 11th best total at the school.

Neal was a member of five Yellow Jacket teams that advanced to postseason play, including an NIT appearance in 1984 and NCAA Tournament berths the following four years. Tech advanced to the regional final in 1985 before losing to top-seed Georgetown, and the Sweet Sixteen in 1986. After a first round loss in 1987, Georgia Tech defeated Iowa State in 1988 before falling to Richmond in the second round. Neal earned his bachelor's degree in management from Georgia Tech in 1988.

The native of Washington, Ind., played prep basketball at Washington High School, for his father, Stan. Craig earned all-America recognition and was a member of the Indiana All-Star team following his senior year in 1983. Neal played eight professional seasons in the NBA, CBA and Europe, beginning in Portland where he was a third-round draft pick of the Blazers in 1988. He also played in Miami and Denver in the NBA and played in three championship series while competing in the CBA. Neal served as a player and coach in his final season in the CBA (1994-95) before joining the Toronto organization. He was involved in professional basketball for 16 years.

Neal was involved with the NBA's Team Up community service program in Toronto. He founded the Craig Neal/Grant Delagrange benefit golf tournament in Fort Wayne, Ind., with proceeds dedicated to schools for autistic and Down Syndrome children.

Neal was born February 16, 1964. He and his wife, Janet, have two sons, Cullen and Dalton.
