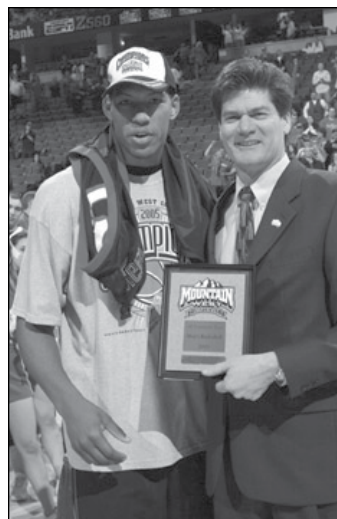

# NEW MEXICO NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

**1968** -- New Mexico's first exposure in the NCAA Tournament came under head coach Bob King in 1968. King was named WAC Coach of the Year after capturing the WAC crown with an impressive 23-5 overall record. The Lobos were 7th in the national rankings and also had the advantage of playing on their home floor in the West Regional. UNM lost the first night to Santa Clara, 86-73, as its star center Greg (Stretch) Howard was ineligible to play due to the NCAA rule that did not allow transfers to play in postseason games. In the consolation game, UNM fell to intrastate rival New Mexico State, 68-62, a team it had beaten twice during the regular season. The Aggies had lost the night before to Lew Alcindor-led UCLA, which went on to win the national title.

**1974** -- The 1974 WAC championship team finished 22-7 and 18th in the polls. The Lobos traveled to Pocatello, Idaho, and defeated Idaho State, 73-65 in the first round. From there it was on to Tucson for the West Regional where the Lobos lost a heartbreaker to San Francisco in the last 22 seconds, 64-61. UNM redeemed itself the following night by winning the consolation game over Dayton, 66-61. The Flyers had taken UCLA into triple overtime the previous night.

**1978** -- A 13-1 conference mark (24-3 overall) earned the Lobos a Western Athletic Conference title and a trip to Tempe, Arizona. UNM's first-round opponent was Cal State Fullerton, which became that year's Cinderella team. Had the Lobos defeated the Titans, they would have returned home to Albuquerque for the West Regional and 18,000 hometown fans. But in one of the biggest upsets of the year, unranked Fullerton dumped 4th-ranked New Mexico 90-85. The Titans advanced to Albuquerque where they upset San Francisco then lost to Final Four participant Arkansas by three points in the regional final.

**1991** -- New Mexico made its first appearance in 13 years by receiving an at-large bid with a 20-9 record. Seeded 14th in the East Region, New Mexico faced No. 3 seed Oklahoma State in the first round at College Park, Md. The game was tied at halftime, 26-26, however, the Cowboys' second-half defense was too much for the Lobos in the 67-54 loss. Luc Longley had 16 points and 9 rebounds in his final collegiate game. OSU advanced to the Sweet 16 before falling to Temple.

**1993** -- The Lobos received an automatic bid to the tournament by winning the WAC Tournament in Salt Lake City. Entering the tournament with a 23-7 record, UNM was ranked 21st by the Associated Press and received a No. five seed. The Lobos drew 12th-seeded George Washington as its first-round opponent in the West Region at Tucson, Ariz. New Mexico was in trouble before the team bus ever got to the McKale Center. Several Lobos, including starters Khari Jaxon and Steve Logan, were afflicted by food poisoning from a meal eaten the night before. That malady and the Colonials' brawn proved to be the difference in the 82-68 defeat. George Washington eventually lost to national runnerup Michigan in the Sweet 16.

**1994** -- UNM advanced to the NCAA West Regional in Sacramento, Calif., on the strength of its regular-season WAC title. The 23-6 Lobos were a No. 10 seed and faced the 16-11 Virginia Cavaliers, the No. 7 seed. Five minutes into the second half, New Mexico appeared primed to snap its three-game NCAA Tournament victory drought and advance in the tourney for the first time since 1974. Outplaying the stronger Cavaliers, UNM forged a 41-26 lead five minutes into the second half on the strength of freshman Charles Smith. That's when the 3-pointers stopped falling. After making 6 of its first 15, UNM missed its last 10. The Lobos still led 54-49 with 2:46 remaining. However, in the last two minutes UNM turned it over once and missed its last five shots, including three game-tying 3-pointers in the final 12 seconds. The result was a tough 57-54 loss and an early exit. Smith led UNM with 20 points.

**1996** -- The Lobos' four-game, 22-year victory drought in the NCAA Tournament came to a resounding halt in the East Regional in Richmond, Va. UNM won the WAC Tournament in Albuquerque and took a gaudy 27-4 record and an AP ranking of No. 23 into the tourney. New Mexico was a No. 7 seed and faced 10th-seeded Kansas State in the first round. UNM trailed early but rallied for a 31-30 halftime lead. It was still close at 43-41 when the Lobo defense took over. K-State was held to just one field goal the final 13:34 of the game as UNM closed with a 26-7 run and a convincing 69-48 victory. Sophomore forward Clayton Shields had 25 points and 10 rebounds. KSU shot just 29% (15-52) from the floor.

The Lobos' were rewarded by playing No. 2 seed and fourth-ranked Georgetown in the second round. New Mexico's magic continued in the first half against the Hoyas as it was a 35-32 ballgame in the Lobos' favor at intermission. Georgetown All-America Allen Iverson, the Hoyas' superior strength and foul trouble to UNM freshman center Kenny Thomas crippled the Lobos' chances in the second half. Iverson scored 19 of his 25 points in the final 20 minutes and Thomas picked up two personals in the first three minutes as the lead slipped away. Georgetown prevailed 73-62 to advance to the Sweet Sixteen. Shields led the Lobos again with 19 points. Due to foul trouble, Thomas was limited to only 37 minutes in the two tournament games. UNM finished with a 28-5 ledger, setting a school-record for

victories.

**1997** -- The Lobos were sent to the East Region for the second straight year, playing at the Civic Arena in Pittsburgh, Pa. UNM received an at-large berth as a No. 3 seed, the highest for the Lobos since the NCAA began the seeding process in 1979. New Mexico got past No. 14 seed Old Dominion in the first round, 59-55. Kenny Thomas' rebound and two free throws with two seconds remaining sealed the victory. Thomas had 15 points and 8 rebounds while freshman Lamont Long added 14 points and 9 boards.

UNM met No. 6 seed Louisville in the second round and came within a basket of advancing to the Sweet Sixteen for only the second time in school history. Trailing 64-63, the Lobos forced a Louisville turnover with 16 seconds remaining. UNM's set play coming out of the timeout broke down, and point guard David Gibson was forced to take an awkward shot driving to the basket, which missed. It marked the first time in 23 games that UNM led at halftime and lost. It was also the first time in 20 contests that New Mexico fell while holding an opponent to less than 70 points. Thomas, who fouled out with three personals in the second half, his third and fourth in a span of 22 seconds, and his fifth occurring during a Louisville free throw, had just 8 points and 3 rebounds. Senior Charles Smith had 16 points and 7 rebounds in his final game as a Lobo. Long again led UNM in rebounds with 8.

**1998** -- The Lobos took a 23-7 record into their fifth NCAA Tournament in the past six seasons. UNM was sent to the South Region in Lexington, Ky., where it was a No. 4 seed, and faced Butler University in the first round.

UNM won 79-62, however, all did not look good early in the second half. Kenny Thomas, who finished with just three points and five rebounds, was on the bench with three fouls. Senior point guard David Gibson had to leave the game with 18:16 left after suffering a concussion and a broken right middle finger on a drive to the basket. The score was tied at 40-40 when the Lobos went on a 12-0 run to salt the game away. Some unlikely heroes stepped up. Senior post Ben Baum scored a season-high 14 points, making all three of his 3-point attempts, and tied a career-high with six rebounds. Freshman guard Tom Starkey, who had played just 35 minutes in nine games before the tournament, scored five points and grabbed a career-high seven rebounds in a career-best 13 minutes. Freshman guard Kevin Henry, normally the 2-guard, was forced to the point in the second half when Gibson went out. Henry responded with 14 points, while setting career-highs for FTs made (9), FT attempts (10) and assists (5). Sophomore Lamont Long led UNM with 22 points.

The Lobos advanced to the second round for the third straight season where they met Syracuse. UNM could never crack the Orangemen's 2-3 zone in the 56-46 setback. New Mexico converted just 14 of 55 shots (25.5%) overall and 6 of 25 from 3-point. Thomas had 12 points and 12 rebounds. Long added 11 points and 11 caroms.

**1999** - The Lobos advanced to their fourth straight NCAA Tournament and seventh in the decade of the '90s. That streak was in serious jeopardy earlier in the season. Following a road loss at Hawai'i, the Lobos were 17-6 and had dropped four of five decisions. An upswing ensued, however, as UNM closed the regular season by winning five of its last six. Add an improbable run to the championship game of the WAC Tournament, and UNM locked up its 10th tournament berth.

Advancing as an at-large selection, New Mexico took a 24-8 record in the tournament. Surprisingly, the Lobos were kept in the West Region where they faced Missouri in the first round in Denver. Lamont Long's 8-foot jumper with six seconds left provided the margin in the 61-59 victory. Long paced UNM with 17 points and a season-high 12 rebounds. Senior Kenny Thomas had his finest showing in the NCAA Tournament with 20 points, 10 rebounds and four blocks before fouling out with 1:31 to go. New Mexico joined Cincinnati, Kansas, Kentucky, Purdue, Stanford and Utah as the only schools to win at least one NCAA Tournament game every year since 1996.

UNM fell to eventual national champ Connecticut 78-56, in a second-round matchup. UConn raced to a 17-0 lead and never looked back. The Huskies were ranked third in the polls and came in as the West's No. 1 seed. The Lobos shot a season-low 26.3% (15-57) from the floor and only 19% (4-21) from 3-point. After a stellar performance in the first round, Thomas was held without a field goal for the only time in his 123-game collegiate career. He finished with one point and 11 rebounds. Damion Walker came off the bench to lead the Lobos with 21 points.

**2005** - After a six-year absence, New Mexico returned to the NCAA Tournament for the 11th time in school history off a strong run through the Mountain West Conference Tournament. This was also the first appearance in the NCAA's for head coach Ritchie McKay, either as a player, an assistant, or a head coach. Despite posting a 26-7 record, the second most wins in school history, the Lobos were given a No. 12 seed in the Syracuse Regional.

UNM traveled to Nashville where it took on fifth-seeded Villanova. The Wildcats came in with a 22-7 record and were the 22nd-ranked team in the country. The Lobos managed just 11 points on 18% shooting in the first half and trailed by

as much as 24, but they made a furious second half comeback attempt. The Lobos pulled to within 52-47 with 29 seconds left, but they couldn't overcome their dismal start, falling to the Wildcats, 55-47. Danny Granger led New Mexico with 15 points and Mark Walters had 14 - all in the second half.

**2010** - UNM returned to the Big Dance for the first time in five seasons after winning its second consecutive Mountain West Conference regular-season title. Despite losing in the semifinals of the MWC Tournament, the Lobos earned a No. 3 seed as an at-large team based on their 29-4 overall record and strong schedule that included a 6-0 mark against top-25 teams.

UNM drew a stubborn Montana team in an East Region first round game at San Jose, Calif. Roman Martinez had 19 points, six rebounds and four assists and the Lobos overcame a shaky start to beat the 14th-seeded Grizzlies 62-57. Darington Hobson added 11 points, 11 rebounds and six assists while playing with a sprained left wrist for the Lobos, who used a 17-0 run after halftime to briefly break open the game after trailing by a point at the break.

Martinez made three 3-pointers, including one with 7:44 to play, and Dairese Gary converted seven free throws over the final 3:36 as New Mexico staved off an upset. The Lobos won despite shooting 41.5% from the floor (22-53), 25% (5-20) from 3-point, 56.5% (13-23) from the FT line and being outrebounded 37-31. UNM, however, did commit just 6 turnovers and held Montana's Anthony Johnson to 6 points on 1-12 FGs. Johnson came into the game averaging almost 20 a game. UNM did hold the Grizzlies to 37% shooting in the 2nd half (10-27) and 29% (4-14) from beyond the arc.

In the second round, Quincy Pondexter scored 18 points, Isaiah Thomas added 15 and 11th-seeded Washington won 82-64. The Lobos simply couldn't keep up with the breakneck offensive pace, falling behind by 23 points midway through the second half.

Dairese Gary matched his career high with 25 points and Darington Hobson had 11 points and nine rebounds for New Mexico. Hobson led the Lobos in points, rebounds and assists, but the junior hurt his left wrist and back on a first-round tumble to the court. He insisted he could play through the pain, but appeared to be favoring the wrist in pregame warmups - and he went 1 of 3 in the first half, failing to score after a 3-pointer in the opening minutes.

Roman Martinez was badly cut over his left eye with 12 minutes left in a collision with a teammate. He returned in a different jersey, finishing with 10 points.

**2012** - New Mexico rode a conference regular season and tournament title into the 2012 NCAA Tournament, and the hot streak earned UNM a No. 5 seed into the West Regional, where UNM would face a tough 5-12 matchup with Long Beach State at the Rose Garden in Portland.

In one of the best second round games of the tournament, the Lobos used a closing 16-7 run over the final five minutes to come from behind and pull out a 75-68 win. Down 61-59 at the five-minute mark, Kendall Williams drained a three out of a timeout and right in front of the UNM bench to give UNM a 62-61 lead, one they would not relinquish. Casper Ware had a rare free throw miss on a one-and-one and UNM made Long Beach State pay with a Drew Gordon layup for a three-point lead. UNM would make five free throws in the final 39 seconds to keep the 49ers at bay.

Drew Gordon had another spectacular game with 18 points and 13 rebounds, and Kendall Williams added 16 points for UNM, which went .500 from the field at 25-for-50. Hugh Greenwood had 12 and Demetrius Walker had 11.

In the third round, New Mexico matched-up with No. 4 Louisville, and the Cardinals nipped the Lobos 59-56 to end UNM's season. The Lobos held an 11-6 lead early, but Louisville got a big day from Russ Smith off the bench with 17 points and three steals.

Louisville eventually took a 15-point lead at 44-29 before UNM came storming back. Jamal Fenton scored twice in 11 seconds to ignite the Lobos, who would eventually cut the lead all the way down to two on a three-pointer by Demetrius Walker with 1:43 left. Down six again with under 10 seconds left, Gordon got a rebound and hit a fadeaway three-pointer with 4.3 left to make it 59-56. Louisville then missed a one-and-one, but Gordon could only get off a halfcourt heave, which was off the mark.

Gordon had 21 points and 14 rebounds, coming back after hyperextending his knee in the first half. Kendall Williams added 11 for the Lobos, who went just 5-for-23 from the three-point line.

**2013** - New Mexico entered the NCAA Tournament as one of the hottest teams in the land, holding back-to-back Mountain West regular season and tournament victories, along with a No. 3 seed, but the No. 14 Harvard Crimson had one of those days that sometimes gets conjured up in the NCAA Tournament as Harvard stunned the Lobos 68-62.

New Mexico struggled from the field the whole night, opening the game 1-for-11, and Harvard drained eight three-pointers in the game. Despite the struggles, UNM took a lead three times in the second half, but Harvard answered each time

to regain the lead. Alex Kirk and Cameron Bairstow combined for 37 points and 21 rebounds, but the Lobos couldn't overcome Harvard shooting .524 from the field. UNM force 13 turnovers to keep themselves in the game along with 16 offensive rebounds, but UNM's lack of touch outside proved to be its undoing.

## QUICKLY ON THE 2012-13 LOBOS

New Mexico returned eight lettermen and three starters from the 2011-12 season in which the Lobos went 28-7 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament's third round. The Lobos won their third regular season championship in the last four years, and then won the conference tournament defeating San Diego State 68-59 in Las Vegas at the Thomas & Mack Center.

The three starters that UNM returned were Hugh Greenwood, Kendall Williams, and Tony Snell. Williams was a Second Team All-Mountain West pick last season, and Tony Snell was both Honorable Mention All-Mountain West and Mountain West All-Tournament.

UNM did return a fourth starter in Alex Kirk, who started 19 games as a freshman in 2010-11 before sitting out the 2011-12 season with a back injury that he eventually had surgery for.

Other letter winners that returned to the squad include seniors Chad Adams and Jamal Fenton, and junior Cameron Bairstow and Demetrius Walker. Also returning to the squad is Chris Perez.

UNM also has four freshmen in redshirt Kory Alford, Cleveland Thomas, Nick Banyard, and Devon Williams. One other newcomer, Merv Lindsay, is a sophomore transfer from Kansas, but he will sit out the 2012-13 season due to NCAA transfer regulations.

UNM returned 66.1% of the scoring (1,683 points out of 2,545), 56.4% of the rebounding (744 of 1,320), and 84.1% of the assists from last year (482 of 573). UNM returns five of its top six scorers, but missing was leading scorer and rebounder Drew Gordon from a year ago.

## POLL POSITION

The Lobos finished the season in both national polls for the third time in the last four seasons, as the team was ranked tied for 10th in the final AP Poll (pre-tournament) and No. 19 in the final *Today/Coaches* Poll (post tournament). In the AP Poll, the Lobos were ranked for the 16th time in the last 17 weeks (and 12 straight).

No other MW team was ranked in the polls. Other UNM opponents in the AP Poll or receiving votes include Saint Louis at 16, UNLV at 28 and Colorado State at 34. In the *USA Today/Coaches* Poll, Saint Louis finished at 16 and Colorado State at 35.

The Lobos were ranked for 16 weeks this season, and have now been ranked in the AP poll for 30 weeks this decade, which was tied with Arizona, BYU, and UNLV for the 25th most weeks in the country. In the western U.S., only two programs have spent more weeks ranked than the Lobos this decade (San Diego State and Gonzaga).

The Lobos have been ranked in three of the last four seasons. Prior to this run, the last time UNM had been ranked was at the end of the 1999 season, when the Lobos were ranked 25th and lost to eventual national champion Connecticut 78-56 in Denver. Ironically, UConn's first game after winning that title the next season was a loss to Iowa 70-68 in New York City in the first game of Steve Alford's Iowa coaching stint.

The Lobos are 180-73 as a ranked team, and they went 36-14 under Steve Alford as a ranked team. New Mexico is 121-8 at home when ranked, 42-51 on the road when ranked, and 17-14 neutral. Under Alford, those splits are 20-2 at home, 11-8 on the road, and 5-4 neutral.

## CHA-CHA-CHA-CHANGES

The biggest change in the offseason occurred when Steve Alford announced his resignation on March 29 to take over the reigns at UCLA. After what seemed like an eternity but in reality was just 80 hours, including 24 of those happening on Easter Sunday, Vice President of Athletics Paul Krebs announced that long-time associate head coach Craig Neal was the new head men for the program.

Krebs made the announcement of all things on Twitter, with one simple word... "Noodles". That factoid led most of the ensuing coverage of Neal's announcement, and his hire has been lauded throughout college basketball by the likes of ESPN's Dick Vitale and Andy Katz, CBS's Doug Gottlieb, Matt Norlander and Jon Rothstein, as well as coaches throughout the NCAA.

Along with Alford, Duane Broussard also headed to Westwood. Craig Snow was promoted from Director of Operations to take his spot (joining Drew Adams), and Lamont Smith, formerly of Washington and Arizona State, was slotted to replace Neal as Associate Head Coach.

## OUT WITH THE OLD, IN WITH THE NEW

New Mexico will say goodbye to five players in seniors Chad Adams and Jamal Fenton, juniors Demetrius Walker (who will graduate) and Tony Snell, and freshman Kory Alford, and in their stead welcome Obij Aget, Tim Myles, Cullen Neal, and Arthur Edwards. Aget originally signed for this past season but tore his ACL in the summer and didn't enroll. Myles was an early fall signee that should impress with his 6-7 frame. Neal is ranked No. 87 on the 2013 ESPN Hot 100 Recruiting list, and Edwards is the 60th ranked JC recruit for the 2013 season. The Lobo under new head coach Craig Neal have one scholarship remaining.

### THE RARE DOUBLE DOUBLE-DOUBLE (NON IN-N-OUT BURGER DIVISION)

The Lobos turned a neat trick in that they have won a regular season title and a conference tournament title in back-to-back years, a double double-double if you will. How many teams can lay claim to sweeping the regular season and conference tournament titles in both 2012 and 2013? Five.

Along with New Mexico, Montana of the Big Sky, Memphis of Conference USA, and Davidson of the Southern Conference have pulled off the feat. Also doing so was Belmont, who was a potential third round opponent, however they did it in two different conferences, sweeping the Ohio Valley this year after sweeping the Atlantic Sun in 2012.

### NEW MEXICO IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Lobos earned a five-seed or higher for the third time in the last four seasons, and the program tied its record for the highest seed when it was announced as a No. 3 seed for this year's tournament. The Lobos were also a 3-seed in 2010 as a part of the East Regional, and in 1997 as a part of the East Regional. This is UNM's first time as a 3-seed in the West Regional.

The Lobos are now 8-15 all-time in the NCAA Tournament in 14 appearances, having actually lost twice in the 1968 tournament back when there were consolation games.

New Mexico's best showing was in the 1974 tournament when the Lobos traveled up to frigid Pocatello, Idaho and defeated Idaho State 73-65 to qualify what today is known as the Sweet Sixteen, but back then was the West Regional Semifinals. The Lobos then lost 64-61 to San Francisco in Tucson, Arizona.

The Lobos have never won two games in a single NCAA Tournament, although the team is 6-8 in its last seven trips to the Big Dance.

The Lobos are 2-3 as a No. 3 seed, defeating Old Dominion 59-55 in 1997 before losing to No. 6 Louisville 64-63 in Pittsburgh. In 2010, the Lobos as the 3-seed defeated 14th-seeded Montana in San Jose, Calif., 62-57, and then lost to No. 11 Washington 82-64.

Since seeding began, the Lobos are 5-4 when the higher seed in the tournament. As the three-seed, UNM was the highest seed in the pod for the opening weekend of the tournament.

The Lobos have qualified for the tournament in back-to-back years, also doing so in 1993 and 1994, and then again for a four-year run from 1996-99. New Mexico has qualified for the tournament in three of the past four seasons after making it just once in the previous 11 seasons.

### CHANGING OF THE GUARD

Tony Snell made national headlines with his play in Las Vegas at the Mountain West Tournament, and he will now ride that wave towards the NBA Draft, as he declared himself eligible in early April, foregoing his senior year. The last Lobo to leave early for the draft was Darrington Hobson, who was selected in the second round by the Milwaukee Bucks.

Snell averaged 17.7 points per game in the three-game run to the title, accounting for 29.2 percent of UNM's offensive scoring. Snell shot .515 from the field, going 17-for-33 from the field and 12-for-20 (.600) from three-point range. The Lobo guard twice set the Lobo record for threes in a conference tournament game with five, hitting five against both San Diego State and UNLV.

Snell starred in tournaments this season, earning All-Tournament honors in the beginning of the season at the Paradise Jam. He came to national attention in that tournament with a 27-point performance, including a game-winning three-pointer with 1.8 seconds left that capped off a crazy comeback in which UNM hit two three-pointers in the final 11.1 seconds to turn a five-point deficit into a one-point win.

### VICTOR GO THE SPOILS

UNM has had a great run over the last four weeks or so. The Lobos had won nine of their last 10 entering the national tournament, but even better, New Mexico received two National Player of the Week nods from ESPN. The first was after Kendall Williams struck for 46 points against Colorado State, ending the Rams' 27-game home winning streak and putting UNM in the driver's seat of what would become UNM's fourth regular season title in the last five years. This past Sunday, Tony Snell was named ESPN National Player of the Week after his performance at the Mountain West Tournament where he earned MVP honors.

## WILLIAMS NAMED MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Whether UNM was in need of scoring, dishing, or defending, Kendall Williams has been New Mexico's go to guy all year long, and that effort has been rewarded as he was named the Mountain West Player of the Year in a vote of the league's coaches and media members. Williams becomes the fourth Lobo to earn Mountain West Player of the Year honors after Ruben Douglas in 2003, J.R. Giddens in 2008 (Co-Player that year with Lee Cummard of BYU), and Darington Hobson in 2010.

Williams also is the second Mountain West Player of the Year to have earlier in his career win Freshman Player of the Year, with Andrew Bogut of Utah being the other.

Williams set a host of records with a 46-point afternoon at Colorado State in a game that basically decided the regular season championship of the Mountain West, a game UNM won 89-82. Williams hit a conference and UNM record 10 three-pointers in the effort, on just 13 attempts, and was the toast of the national scene, doing interviews with ESPN, Yahoo, CBS, NBC, and Fox afterwards.

Williams led the Lobos in scoring in conference games at 13.1 points per game, and also in assists with 79, to just 32 turnovers. He was also second in steals with 18 and with 25 three-pointers.

## ALFORD NAMED MOUNTAIN WEST COACH OF THE YEAR FOR THE THIRD TIME

Joining Williams in the honors category is head coach Steve Alford, who was named the Mountain West Coach of the Year for a third time, tying BYU coach Dave Rose for the most MW Coach of the Year honors won. Alford is the first to win three Coach of the Year distinctions in a five-year span.

Alford led the Lobos to a wire-to-wire conference title, UNM's fourth regular season title in the last five years. The Lobos sport a 26-5 overall record, and a 13-3 mark, and carry the longest active regular season win streak over the AP Top 25, winning six straight. The Lobos have done all this despite no seniors in the starting lineup and after losing two starters and a 1,000-point scorer off last year's 28-7, 10-4 conference championship team.

The honor is the sixth conference coach of the year honor in his 22 seasons, as Alford was a three-time Indiana Collegiate Conference Coach of the Year.

## UNM'S STARTING FIVE HONORED ON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM

New Mexico's starting five have been terrific for the Lobos. Apparently everyone else agrees as all five were honored in some fashion as the league announced the All-Conference teams on Monday. Kendall Williams, who was named Player of the Year, was a First Team selection, leading the way for the Lobos.

Alex Kirk was named Second Team All-Mountain West, and he was also on the All-Defensive Team. Tony Snell was named Third Team All-Mountain West, and Hugh Greenwood and Cameron Bairstow were named Honorable Mention.

It marked the first time in school history that UNM has a representative on the first, second, and third teams, and it tied for the most with the 2010 and 2005 squads. Counting the honorable mention selections, the five honorees ties with the 2005 team, which also had all five starters on the various teams.

It marked the sixth straight season under head coach Steve Alford that the Lobos have had at least one first team selection, and the fifth straight year with at least a second team pick.

Kirk's selection to the All-Defensive Team is the first since 2011, when Dairese Gary made it for the second straight season. It's also the first for a Lobo big man since Kenny Thomas in 1999 for the Western Athletic Conference.

## LOBOS NET USBWA ALL-DISTRICT HONORS

The Lobos earned a few honors from the U.S. Basketball Writers Association, as for the second time in four years, Steve Alford earned USBWA District VIII Coach of the Year honors. Along with Alford's honor, Kendall Williams and Alex Kirk both were named All-District. It marked the sixth straight year under Steve Alford that the Lobos have had a player make USBWA All-District, and it was the second time in four years that a pair of Lobos were so honored. In 2010, both Roman Martinez and Darington Hobson were named All-District.

## MORE WINS AWAY FROM THE PIT

The last two years have seen some amazing things away from The Pit, not like anything anyone has ever seen at the University of New Mexico.

The win over UNLV in the MW Championship game gave UNM its 14th win away from The Pit this year, with nine road wins and five neutral. The Lobos were the only team in the Mountain West to obtain a winning road record in conference play.

Overall, UNM went 14-5 away from The Pit, tying the record set last year for the most wins away from The Pit in school history. The Lobos have double-digit wins away from The Pit for the third time in school history, with the other two both also coming under Steve Alford.

The Lobos went 9-4 on the road this season after going 8-3 last season. With UNM winning the conference title, it continued a streak for the Mountain West in that the team with the best road record has won the title every year except the first season in 2000.

The 5-3 mark is the fifth time in the last six seasons the UNM has been at least .500 on the road in conference play (the team went 3-5 in 2010-11). The only other New Mexico team with a winning road record? That very first Mountain West season of 1999-2000, under Fran Fraschilla.

Now, while you can win some road games in a season, consistency is doing it year after year. In terms of the most road wins in back-to-back years, Alford's charges take the cake.

UNM now has 17 road wins in the last two years, besting the previous record of 16 set by the 2008-09/2009-10 Lobos and the 2009-10/2010-11 Lobos. Ironically, the fourth and fifth place marks are 14 road wins in back-to-back seasons, and those all have occurred under Alford as well.

UNM's 14 wins away from home were the second most in the NCAA this year entering the postseason tournaments, behind only Gonzaga's 16.

**CUTTING DOWN NETS, IT'S WHAT WE DO**

The team's theme this year is "Drive for Five" UNM now has won conference titles in 2005, 2009, 2010, 2012, and 2013, with 2012 and 2013 representing two titles. The win over Wyoming March 2 gave UNM four regular season titles in the last five years, and the only other team in the Mountain West to turn that trick was BYU. No team has ever won five of six.

**ALONG WITH THE NATIONAL ATTENTION...**

Lobo basketball was featured in Sports Illustrated for three straight weeks in March. Kendall Williams was in two weeks ago for his performance against Colorado State, the same issue that Hugh Greenwood was featured on the collage cover for the March Madness two weeks early preview. The next week, Steve Alford was featured in a spread on the greatest players in NCAA Tournament history. This following week UNM was mentioned as a darkhorse Final Four team.

**THIS IS PRETTY GOOD COMPANY TO KEEP**

With four conference titles in the last five years, UNM joined some elite company. The only teams in Division I that have won four titles in the last five years are Kansas (nine in nine for the Jayhawks), who has won the last five Big 12 titles and Gonzaga, which has won four of the last five West Coast Conference titles. Ohio State and Michigan State each had a chance to join this list, but Indiana came through with a win at Michigan, giving the Hoosiers the outright Big Ten title.

**LOBOS VS. THE NATIONALLY RANKED**

The Lobos are 16-7 all-time under Steve Alford in the last six years against nationally-ranked teams, including a 4-1 mark this season as UNM beat No. 21 Connecticut 66-60 in the Paradise Jam championship game, No. 8 Cincinnati 55-54 on the road, No. 19 UNLV 65-60, and No. 21 Colorado State 91-82 on the road. UNM lost to No. 25 (Coaches Poll) San Diego State 55-34. The Lobos have actually won eight of their last 10 against nationally ranked teams. UNM is 41-52 at home against nationally-ranked teams, 16-55 on the road, and 9-12 on neutral floors, going 66-119 all-time against nationally ranked teams.

The Lobos in the last six years are 3-3 against top 10 teams. In 2010-11, UNM went 0-2 against San Diego State (No. 9 and No. 6), and 2-1 against BYU, beating the Cougars when they were ranked No. 9 and No. 3, and losing when they were ranked No. 8, losing 87-76 in the Mountain West Tournament semifinals. UNM this year defeated Cincinnati 55-54 when Cincy was ranked No. 8.

When UNM lost to San Diego State earlier this year, the Aztecs were No. 25 in the Coaches Poll, but unranked in the AP Poll, an important distinction. The Lobos have won six consecutive regular season games (not counting conference or postseason tournament games) against the AP Top 25. That streak is now the longest current streak in the nation, as Indiana, who was leading with seven straight, lost to No. 14 Ohio State.

**FOLLOW-UPS**

New Mexico went 5-0 this season when following a loss. Over the last two seasons, UNM is 9-2 following a loss. The Lobos have no back-to-back losses this year, and of teams in the Top 25, the only other teams without any back-to-back losses are Indiana, Gonzaga, Florida, Duke, and Marquette.

**TOP 10 BABY...**

The Lobos went 29-6, a winning percentage this year of .829, and that winning percentage ended up as the seventh-best winning percentage in the NCAA. The 29 wins tied for the 10th-most in the NCAA.

**FANS FLOCKED TO THE PIT ONCE AGAIN**

The University of New Mexico has finished in the national top 25 in attendance for each of the 46 seasons that The Pit has been around, and 2012-13 was no different. The Lobos finished the season averaging 15,021 for the season as UNM sold out the final three games.

With the current capacity of The Pit at 15,411, the Lobos played to 97.5% capacity this season. The average attendance of 15,021 was the best attendance since the 2002-03 season, which saw UNM average 15,168 for 17 games. The capacity of The Pit that season was 18,018.

The Lobos had six complete sellouts for the year, including the final three games. Also, the Lobos had 12 consecutive lower bowl sellouts to end the season, and over the final 12 games, UNM played to a capacity of

## AND THOSE FANS FLOCKING TO THE PIT USUALLY LEAVE HAPPY

The last home win over Wyoming was the 15th home win of the season, putting UNM at 15-1 for the season. New Mexico has now won at least 15 home games in 19 of the last 27 years, and UNM has won at least 14 home games in all six of Steve Alford's seasons. It is the 45th time in 47 seasons that the Lobos have won double-figure games at home.

## THREE OUT OF FOUR AIN'T BAD

The University of New Mexico picked up win number 29 on Saturday, and the Lobos now have eight seasons of 25 wins or more, and 26 seasons of 20 or more, with all 20-win seasons having happened after the 1963-64 season. The Lobos have won 20 or more in six straight seasons, and Steve Alford and Dave Bliss are the only Lobo coaches to have done that.

Of those teams, six won their conference races: Davidson, Mercer, Valparaiso, South Dakota State, New Mexico State and Saint Louis, and five of those played in The Pit. Ten of UNM's 15 non-conference opponents won at least 20 games, and of UNM's 15 non-conference games, 11 qualified for the postseason, and a 12th, UConn would have if not for NCAA APR penalties.

## LOBOS VS. THE FIELD

New Mexico went 13-5 against opponents that made it to the NCAA Tournament, which means UNM played half of its games against the NCAA Tournament field. UNM went 2-0 vs. Boise State, New Mexico State and Colorado State, 2-1 against both UNLV and San Diego State, 1-0 vs. Davidson, 1-0 vs. Valparaiso and 1-0 vs. Cincinnati, and 0-1 vs. Saint Louis, South Dakota State, and Harvard.

Two opponents made the NIT in Mercer and Indiana State, who UNM each went 1-0 against. In the CIT, UIC and Air Force made the field, with the Lobos 1-0 vs. the Flames and 1-1 against the Falcons. In the CBI, Wyoming is in the field, as is George Mason. UNM went 3-0 against the Cowboys and 1-0 against George Mason. Overall, the Lobos went 21-5 against NCAA postseason teams, as just eight games were played against non-postseason teams.

## THIS NOTE WAS WORTH EVERY NICKELL

Boise State was the first team in the country to post two road wins over AP Top 25 teams on the road. UNM had two as well (Cincinnati and Colorado State), Sid Joe Nickell of Boise State forwarded this nugget of information. The only schools with more than one: Kansas and Indiana each have three, and Boise State, California, Georgetown, Illinois, Notre Dame, Oregon, Pittsburgh, and New Mexico each have two.

## COACH KNIGHT WOULD APPROVE

One of the many things Steve Alford learned from Coach Knight is that it is always a good thing to have made more free throws than your opponents attempt. Coach Knight would heartily approve, because this season, the Lobos have made 598 free throws (out of 829, a .721 clip), while their opponents have shot 500 for the year (making 337, a .674 clip).

Overall, the Lobos have made more free throws than their opponents have attempted in 24 of their 35 games.

## WILLIAMS MOVES INTO CAREER TOP 10 IN ANOTHER SET OF LISTS

Kendall Williams is already in the top 20 in career scoring and top 10 in career assists, but Williams is also in the top 10 in career free throws made and career free throws attempted.

## OFF COURT SUCCESS AS WELL!

The University of New Mexico has certainly had a solid season. However, the on the court success is one thing. The off the court success is quite another. The men's basketball team earned a cumulative fall GPA of 2.89, equalling the best fall semester grade point average for the basketball team in the last 19 fall semesters. The 2.89 also was a .15 jump from last fall, the third-highest jump in the department among all UNM male sports.

The team under Alford has had 10 straight semesters all told of at least a 2.7 grade point average. This spring semester with Coach Neal should make it 11 straight.

## THERE AREN'T MANY LIKE ALFORD/ALFORD

Pretty much every time UNM travels on the road, a visiting media member, or public address announcer, or someone looks at the roster and asks if Kory Alford is Steve Alford's son, and the general comment after learning he is in fact the son of the head coach is to wonder how rare it is. After some research by USA Today's Erik Brady, we now know...it's pretty rare. Steve Alford was one of only seven Division I head coaches who has a son one the team as well. Here is the complete list, and remember, Craig and Cullen Neal join this list next year.

## JUST ANOTHER YEAR OF NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

When you are 155-52, as the Lobos have gone in the last six year, it only stands to reason that the non-conference records for the teams would be pretty good, and that certainly held true again this year.

The Lobos finished non-conference play 13-2, and that record is tied for the third-best non-conference record in the Steve Alford era. Last year UNM went 14-2 in non-conference play, equalling the most non-conference wins in the Alford, or the Mountain West era as the 2009-10 team that started out 14-1 (UNM plays 15 non-conference games this season). The 13 wins tied for the third-most non-conference wins in the Mountain West era.

With the win over New Mexico State earlier in December, UNM was guaranteed at least 12 non-conference games, and clinched at least a winning percentage of .800 for the fifth time in six seasons. Below are the six non-conference seasons under Steve Alford, and an Alford coached team at UNM has won at least nine non-conference games every season.

## A COUPLE OF FIRST TIME SINCE STUFF...

New Mexico's 55-54 win over the Cincinnati Bearcats with Cincy sitting at No. 8 in both polls marked a couple of firsts in a little while, and at least one first in a long while. To recap:

\*The win over Cincinnati was UNM's first over a top 10 team since UNM's 82-64 defeat of No. 3 BYU on March 2, 2011.

\*The win was the first win over a top 10 non-conference team away from The Pit since December 22, 2006, when UNM defeated No. 8 Wichita State 71-68 in the final game of the Las Vegas Classic.

\*The win was the first win over a top 10 non-conference team in a true road game since December 21, 1999 when UNM defeated Arizona, ranked No. 2, 70-68 in Tucson.

\*The win over Cincinnati gave the Lobos a pair of wins over ranked teams for the fourth consecutive season. UNM defeated six ranked teams in 2009-10, two in 2010-11, four last year, and now three this year after beating UNLV.

\*The 16 wins over ranked teams in the last five years is three more wins than the amount of wins over ranked teams in the previous 16 years, when UNM totalled 13 wins over ranked teams.

\*Against Air Force, UNM had 29 assists to just eight turnovers. The 29 assists (on 34 baskets) tied an Alford era mark.

\*New Mexico became the first team to sweep the regular season and conference tournaments in back-to-back years in Mountain West history.

## KENDALL NOW IN SOME VERY ELITE COMPANY

Kendall Williams became the 30th Lobo in school history break the 1,000-point barrier when he scored 21 against South Dakota State on December 22. He also became just the ninth Lobo in school history to record point number 1,000 during his junior year.

He is one of five Lobos to have 1,000 points, 400 assists, and 100 steals in a career. Here is the complete list (all the players played four seasons except for Williams):

### IMPOSSIBLE TO KNOW FOR SURE....

But the Lobos must have led the nation in this statistic. New Mexico won nine games this season when shooting under 40% for the game. The team went 9-5 this year when that happens. They were only 2-6 last year when it happened.

### CONSECUTIVE START STUFF

Entering the 2013-14 season, Hugh Greenwood will have the longest starting streak for the Lobos at 42 straight games. Greenwood and Tony Snell were the only players on the squad to start all 35 games. Greenwood has started 42 straight dating back to last season, but Snell actually had the longest active streak on the team with 70 straight starts. Greenwood is also 53-10 as a starter for the Lobos.

### SOMEONE IS GOING TO MAKE IT SIX FOR SIX...

Kendall Williams led the team in scoring, making him the anchor of this note. Dating back to 1946-47, which is the first year full statistics were accurately kept, UNM had never had six different people lead the team in scoring in six straight years, but that will happen this year. In the last six years, all under Steve Alford, UNM has been led by, in order, J.R. Giddens, Tony Danridge, Darlington Hobson, Dairese Gary, Drew Gordon and now Kendall Williams. The five different leading scorers from 1990-91 through 1994-95 were Luc Longley, Willie Banks, Ike Williams, Greg Brown and Charles Smith.

### DEFENSIVE MINDED LOBOS

New Mexico forced opponents to shoot just .391 on the season, which is the second-best mark in the last 46 years, behind only last year's .384 clip. Its the first time holding opponents under 40% in back-to-back years since holding opponents to .386 and .372 ... in the 1956-57 and 1957-58 seasons. No member of the staff, support staff, or anyone associated with the travel party, was alive when that happened.

### IT WAS A GREAT START

UNM's 12-0 start was the second 12-0 start in the last four years, and it marked the third time under Alford that UNM has started at least 7-0 in his six seasons. In 2007, his first year, the Lobos opened up 7-0, and in 2009, the Lobos tied the second-best start in school history at 12-0. Here are all of UNM's 7-0 or better starts in school history, listed by length:

With his third 7-0 start, Steve Alford has joined Bob King as the only coaches to have three starts of at least 7-0 or better. UNM has started 7-0 nine times in the postseason championship tournament era, and UNM has advanced to either the NAAs or the NIT all nine of those seasons.

Alford is the only coach in the history of the university with two double-digit win streaks to start the season.

The Lobos' 12-game streak to start the season is tied for the second-best start in school history.

### IT'S A GREAT STREAK

The Lobos have won 14 consecutive home conference games, and in the Mountain West era, that is a school record. In the last 25 years, UNM has won 19 in a row at home twice, both times as members of the WAC, back in 1991-93, and 1996-98.

### GETTING UP THERE

In Steve Alford's six seasons at UNM, he had four 24-win seasons. No other Lobo coach had more than one 24-win season in his first six seasons with the Lobos. Ritchie McKay (26 in his third, only coached five), Gary Colson (24 in his fourth), Dave Bliss (24 in his fifth) and Norm Ellenberger (24 in his sixth) are the only Lobo coaches to ever win as many as 24 games in any of their first six seasons at the helm.

Alford joined Dave Bliss as the only Lobo coach with six straight 20-win seasons to open his Lobo career. Alford is the first and only Lobo coach with six consecutive 22-win seasons to open his UNM career as well.

### FOR THE THIRD YEAR IN A ROW...A CHANGING OF THE GUARD...

In 2011, Dairese Gary became the winningest scholarship Lobo player of all-time, winning 98 career games, besting Kenny Thomas, who won 96 (Kenny's teams won 102, but he was declared ineligible by the NCAA, so he can not be credited with the six games won while he was ineligible).

In 2012, A.J. Hardeman and Phillip McDonald surged past Gary, winning 102 games to best his scholarship record, and tie the record of former walk-on Marcos White, who won 102 games, although he only played in 38 in his career.

Chad Adams and Jamal Fenton have now overtaken that mantle, as Adams and Fenton each had 109 wins for the most by a player, scholarship or otherwise, in Lobo history.

### 14 OUT OF 22 IS PRETTY SPIFFY

New Mexico had a ridiculous 19-5 record against the RPI top 100, and a 10-3 record vs. the top 50. The 19 wins over the RPI top 100 was the most in the NCAA entering the NCAA Tournament, easily so. The only other teams close to the Lobos entering the tournament were Louisville, Miami and Kansas at 15 and Duke, Florida and UNLV at 14.



## IT'S TOUGH TO DO...

For most of this season, the Lobos had allowed more field goals than they had scored, but the Lobos finished plus-8, scoring 768 and allowing 760. Of course, UNM has a +261 point differential at the free throw line, just behind of Indiana's +274 in the Top 25.

## WHY KEEP SCORE?

In Mountain West play plus the tournament, UNM went 15-0 when committing less or equal turnovers than its opponent, and 1-3 when committing more.

## ALFORD ENDS LOBOS CAREER SECOND ON THE MOUNTAIN WEST CHARTS

Steve Alford ends his MW and Lobo career tied for second on the MW charts in winning percentage with a .723 mark. Alford also ranked fourth in all-time Mountain West wins with 68, and he is fifth in overall wins (Mountain West era) with 154.

## 2012-13 TRENDS

\*The last two teams to open up a 10-0 lead in The Pit have gone on to lose the game, and lose the game by exactly five points. On January 18, 2012, the Lobos blitzed the San Diego State Aztecs with a 10-0 opening run, but lost 75-70. On November 13, the Davidson Wildcats opened on a 10-0 run, but lost 86-81.

\*The Lobos have 14 wins by single digits this year, after recording six such wins in the 28-7 season of a year ago.

\*UNM went 14-4 in games decided by single digits. UNM was 6-5 last year. The last time UNM had as many as 13 wins by single digits in a season was in 2009-10, when UNM started 14-1 in single-digit games, eventually going 15-2. UNM went 12-3 in games decided by eight or less.

\*Alex Kirk has more than sextupled the number of double-figure scoring games in his career. He had four in his freshman year (three games of 10, and a freshman record 31), and this year he has scored in double-figures 27 times in 35 games (scoring eight and nine in two others).

\*Chad Adams through 102 career games never led UNM in scoring or rebounding. In game 103 of his career, he led UNM in scoring, and in game 104, he led in rebounding. He has led UNM in rebounding three times in his career now.

\*Kendall Williams has six games of 20 points or more this season, which is three more than the amount of 20-point games that he had in his first two seasons.

## IT'S YOUNG, BUT IT'S GOOOOOOOOOO

The Lobos have only had three seasons in the decade of the 2010s, but it's already started out pretty good. As of right now, New Mexico is 79-26 in the decade, and the .760 is the best winning percentage of any decade in Lobo basketball history.

## **SEASON NOTES**

### **SEASON NO. 110 IN THE BOOKS**

The University of New Mexico men's basketball program is playing its 110th season in 2012-13. The Lobos first laced up the high tops on Feb. 2, 1900, when they lost 8-6 to the Albuquerque Guards. This season is actually the 113th anniversary of that inaugural year, UNM did not field a team for various reasons in 1900-01, 1903-04, 1917-18 and 1920-21.

The Lobos have been playing continuously since 1921-22 and have compiled an all-time record of 1,418-1,048 (.574).

## **PROVED THEM WRONG AGAIN**

The University of New Mexico has now won four regular season titles in five years, twice from the No. 5 position in the preseason poll, once from the No. 3 position, and once as the No. 1. The Lobos were selected third in the Mountain West preseason poll, behind San Diego State and UNLV. Many publications had UNM pegged fourth or fifth.

The Aztecs, who tied with New Mexico for the regular season crown last year, nipped UNLV in the poll by two first place votes (10-8) and two points (153-151). Colorado State was fourth, followed in order by Nevada, Wyoming, Fresno State, Boise State, and Air Force.

In the Lobos' 91-82 victory at (22/21) Colorado State - halting the Rams' 27-game home win streak - Williams ripped the Moby Arena nets for a career-high 46 points. A few notes about his performance:
