## SCENE SETTER (through the games of Sun, Jan. 13 )

- San Diego State and New Mexico meet for the first time this season at Viejas on Tuesday evening in a rematch of the 2019 Mountain West tournament championship game (won by the Aztecs, 82-75).
- The Aztecs and Lobos, both charter members of the Mountain West, rank first and second in men's basketball titiles. San Diego State owns a conference record 11-league crowns, while New Mexico has claimed eight championships. No other current league member has more than three.
- New Mexico leads the all-time series, 47-39, but the Aztecs have won five of the last eight encounters.
- This marks New Mexico's first appearance in Viejas Arena since Jan. 1, 2017. The teams split two meetings last season, with UNM winning, 79-75, in Albuquerque and SDSU posting an $82-75$ win in Las Vegas (MW title game).
- New Mexico won on its most recent visit to Viejas (68-62 on Jan. 1, 2017), but SDSU is $4-1$ in the last five home games against the Lobos and $7-2$ in the last nine visits by UNM.
- Brian Dutcher will be on the SDSU sideline for the 44th time in games played between the teams ( 41 times as part of Steve Fisher's staff and third time as head coach). The Aztecs are 22-21 in those contests.
- In the last two games, SDSU has started one senior, three sophomores and one true freshman. This marks the first time the Aztecs have started four underclassmen since February 12, 2005 vs. UNLV. Against the Runnin' Rebels that day, SDSU started two freshmen (Tyler Smith and Maft Thomas), two sophomores (Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter) and a junior college transfer (Mohamed (amara). That team finished 11-18 and marks the last time the Aztecs finished a campaign below .500. SDSU would make the postseason each of the next 11 seasons.
- A fairly significant streak were broken in Saturday's loss at Air Force. The Aztecs

- At home, SDSU has significant advantages in field goal shooting (46.4-38.5), three-point field goal percentage (41.9-28.4) and has nearly made more free throws (157) than its opponents have attempted (158).
- San Diego State is 18-8 in its last 26 games - regardless of location - dating back to last season.
- San Diego State is $16-6$ in its last 22 contests against teams that were not ranked in the AP Top 25 at game time.


## PLAYER QUICK HITS (through the games of Sun., Jan. 13)

- Sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels is coming off the most productive five-game stretch of his career. In his last five outings, McDaniels is averaging 18.6 points, 9.4 rebounds with six assists and nine steals. In addition, he has connected on 38 -of- 69 field goal attempts ( 55.1 percent), including $35-0$ - 60 inside the arc ( 58.3 percent).
- McDaniels is 12 -of-19 from the field ( 63.2 percent) in 26 post-up possessions. His 1.231 points per possession in those situations is 10th nationally among all Division I players with at least 25 possessions.
- Last week, senior guard Devin Watson surpassed the 1,500-point plateau for his career and now has 1,517 points (869 at USF and 648 at SDSU) in his career. He is one of only 46 active Division players who has scored at least 1,500 points and of those only eight have 400 assists (Watson has 433 assists).
- Watson is one of only seven players in the nation to average at least 15 points, 5 assists and 2.5 three-point field goals per game this season. He has scored or assisted on 40.3 percent of San Diego State's field goals this season and averages an astonishing 1.435 points per possession and shoots 47.8 percent (22-of-46 3FGs) from the field on his 46 catch-and-shoot possessions this season. The 1.435 ppp ranks 43 rd nationally among all players with at least 45 such possessions.
- Sophomore guard Jordan Schakel has 140 points this season (in 16 games), 34 points more than he accumulated during his entire freshman season ( 33 games). Schakel, who is averaging 8.8 points and 4.4 rebounds has connected on 29-0f-68 three-point field goal attempts this season ( 42.6 percent). He is averaging 1.228 points per all possessions which ranks 68 th nationally among all players with at least 100 possessions.
- Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley is in 16th place on the school's career scoring list with 1,224 points. In his last 10 games he is 12-of-30 from three-point range ( 40.0 percent). SDSU career ranks: 8th in three-point field goal attempts (389), 9th in three-point field goals (134), 11th in field goal attempts (998), 13th in minutes played (3,080), T-13th in games played (116), 16th in freethrow attempts (366), 16th in points (13th in DI history) (1,224), T-17th in field goals (421), 18th in games started (77), 19th in free throws (248), 21st in assists (231).
■ Sophomore forward Matt Mitchell is third on the team in scoring at 12.3 points and 3.6 rebounds per contest. Excluding post-ups,

he is averaging 1.556 points per possession in 36 opportunities around the basket. That includes 27 -of-36 from the field ( 75.0 percent).

## SERIES HISTORY VS. NEW MEXICO

- This is the 87 th meeting between New Mexico and San Diego State with the Lobos owning a 47-39 advantage in the series.
- San Diego State snapped a three-game series losing streak against New Mexico with an $82-75$ victory in the championship game of the 2018 Mountain West tournament.
- Since 2010, San Diego State has won 12 of the 22 meetings (12-10) with New Mexico.
- Since the 2005-06 campaign, San Diego State has won 18 of the last 30 meetings (18-12).
- Brian Dutcher has been on the Aztec sideline for 22 of SDSU's 39 all-time wins vs. New Mexico and eight of the school's 11 victories at The Pit.
- Since 2006, San Diego State has beaten the Lobos on Bob King Court seven times. Since that MW championship season, the Aztecs are $7-6$ at The Pit.
- Since the start of 2005-06, SDSU has handed New Mexico seven of their 36 home losses, which is the most by any opponent. Since that season, the Lobos are 174-36 at home.
- San Diego State has won seven of the last nine (7-2) and nine of the last 12 (9-3) at home vs. New Mexico.
- Twelve of the last 14 meetings between SDSU and UNM at Viejas Arena have been decided by 10 points or less, and 20 of the last 23 have also had a winning margin of 10 or less.
- At neutral sites, New Mexico has won five of the eight all-time meetings (5-3).
- San Diego State has made at least 13 free throws in each of the last six meetings against the Lobos ( 104 total; $17.3 \mathrm{FTM} / \mathrm{gm}$ ).
- The Aztecs has held New Mexico to 41.4 percent shooting or less in each of the last nine meetings between the teams. During that stretch New Mexico is 177 -of-481 from the field ( 36.8 percent).
- Since the start of the 2014-15 campaign, five of New Mexico's 17 lowest field goal percentage games have come against San Diego State.

## San Diego State 82, New Mexico 75

LAS VEGAS - Trey Kell scored 21 of his 28 points in the second half, including 11 down the stretch, to lift fifth-seeded San Diego State over third-seeded New Mexico, 82-75, in the MW Championship game.

The Aztecs captured their conference-record fifth MW tournament title and first since 2011. SDSU's 11 overall MW championships are also the most in league history.

Trailing, 63-57, with 7:35 left in the game, Kell hit a pair of free throws, Jeremy Hemsley buried a three-pointer and Max Montana completed a four-point play after being fouled on his trey, igniting a 15-2 run. Suddenly, San Diego State was back in front 72-65, with 3:57 remaining.

For his efforts, Kell was named the MW tournament MVP, the fourth SDSU player to win the award in league history (also Randy Holcomb in 2002, Marcus Slaughter in 2006 and Kawhi Leonard in 2010).

Kell's 28 points matched the most by a San Diego State player in MW tournament history (also Billy White vs. New Mexico on March 3, 2010 and Brandon Heath vs. Air Force on March 10, 2005).

It was the ninth consecutive win for the Aztecs, who also received 16 points from Malik Pope, and 12 points and five assists from Devin Watson. Pope surpassed Heath for the most points in league tournament history by a San Diego State player with 152, while Watson's play earned him a spot on the MW all-tournament team with Kell.

SDSU limited the Lobos, who came into the game ranked fifth in the country with 11.13 -pointers per game, to just 33.3 percent (8-for-24) from the three-point line.

San Diego State also snapped a three-game losing streak to UNM in the MW tournament.

## SAN DIEGO STATE SNAPSHOT

- The last two games San Diego State has started a true freshman (Nathan Mensah), three sophomores (Jalen McDaniels, Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel and a senior (Devin Watson). This marks the first time the Azters have started four underclassmen since the 2015 season.
- Prior to this stretch, in the first 14 games of the season, San Diego State started two seniors and three sophomores.
- The Aztecs have a wealth of experience in the backcourt with a pair of seniors, Devin Watson and Jeremy Hemsley.
- Watson, who is in his third year with the program affer playing two seasons at the Univ. of San Francisco, is second on the team this season in scoring (15.3), minutes played (34.0), assists (5.3) and has connected on $41-0 f-108$ attempts from beyond the arc ( 38.0 percent). He is one of only seven players in the nation to average at least 15 points, 5 assists and 2.5 three-point field goals per game this season. The senior has scored or assisted on 40.3 percent of San Diego State's field goals this season.
- Hemsley, has played extensively for San Diego State the last four seasons logging 116 games and 77 starts. He is averaging 30.1 minutes (second on the team), 9.1 points, and is considered the team's best defender. Over his last 10 games he is $12-0$ - -30 from three-point range ( 40.0 percent).
- The other three starters come from the Azters' sensational sophomore class of Jalen McDaniels, Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel. The group has been sensational to date and is a major reason why Aztec fans are excited about the future.
- Mitchell has six career games with 20 or more points, four of them come in the last 15 games, including three in the last seven games. He also has recorded six games with at least three assists this season. For the year, he is averaging 12.3 points, good for third on the team, with 3.6 rebounds and 1.8 assists per contest. He has attempted 58 free throws and made 15 straight at one point this season.
- Schakel has already surpassed his offensive production from his entire freshman season. The sophomore is averaging 8.6 points, 4.4 rebounds and has connected on $29-0$ - -68 three-point field goals this season ( 42.6 percent). He has 140 points this season affer scoring 106 points in 33 games last season.
- After spending the summer working out for NBA teams, McDaniels has returned to campus with an improved jumper and a more consistent and well-rounded game. The sophomore has scored in double-digits in 16 of his last 17 games. He leads the team in scoring (15.4) and rebounding (7.8) and has played particularly well of late averaging 18.6 points, 9.4 rebounds and shooting 55.1 percent from the field over his last five games.
- SDSU has five freshen on the roster, with two contributing significantly. True freshman forward Nathan Mensah is averaging 11.4 points and 12.0 rebounds per 40 minutes of action. Only seven players in the nation have more rebounds than he does ( 80 ) in fewer minutes (266). He has played at least 10 minutes in all 16 games.
- Redshirt freshman guard Adam Seiko has seen action in 15 games and is averaging 13.6 minutes per appearance. He has just five turnovers in 204 minutes of action this season and has shown the ability to hit the three-pointer, going 9 -for- 18 from bonus distance ( 50.0 percent).


## SEASON SCENE SETTER

- Dutcher welcomes back three returning starters in redshirt sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels (2018 all-MW third team by media, honorable mention by coaches) sophomore forward Matt Mitchell and senior guard Devin Watson. The trio played in all 33 games a year ago with Watson starting every game, Mitchell receiving the opening nod 32 times (starting the final 31 outings) and McDaniels starting 21 of the final 22 contests (did not start on Senior Night).
- The aforementioned threesome ranked №. 2, 3 and 4 in scoring in 2017-18 with Watson leading the way at 12.2 points and falling seven points shy of tying outgoing senior Malik Pope for the team lead in the category. Mitchell and McDaniels, meanwhile, each finished with 10.5 scoring averages.
- SDSU returns from last year its leader in rebounding average (McDaniels - 7.5), assists (Watson - 124), steals (Mitchell - 36), fieldgoal percentage (McDaniels - .586), free-throw percentage (MCDaniels - .788), three-point field-goal percentage (Watson - .389), three-pointers (Mitchell and Watson - 49) and minutes (Watson - 1,031).
- Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley and junior forward Nolan Narain are back for their respective seasons after receiving the starting nod at different times throughout the 2017-18 campaign. Hemsley ( $7.3 \mathrm{ppg}, 1.22 \mathrm{a} /$ to) played in 32 of 33 games last year, starting seven times, and enters ' $18-19$ with 63 starting assignments in 101 career games, which is the most on the active roster. Narain, meanwhile, started once in 23 games and averaged career highs in every category ( $4.7 \mathrm{ppg}, 2.0 \mathrm{rpg}$, 688 FG ).
- Sophomore guard Jordan Schakel returns as one of the team's top three-point threats. Hailing from Torrance, Schakel ranked fourth on the team last year in three-point makes (27) and percentage (.346; min. 40 3FGA), while playing in all 33 games ( 13.8 mpg . Schakel averaged 3.2 points and 2.1 rebounds, and took great care of the ball, committing just nine turnovers in 455 minutes. In fact, he only had one multi-turnover game all season and finished the year with 26 straight one-turnover-or-less outings.


## THE PROGRAM (through the games of Sun, Jan. 13)

- Head coach Brian Dutcher is in his second season at the helm after guiding San Diego State to a $22-11$ record in his first season. He was the only first-year coach to lead his team to the NCAA tournament in 2018. In 96 previous seasons of Aztec basketball, no head coach had won more games and/or won a conference title in his first year until Dutcher accomplished the feat.
- San Diego State had advanced to the NCAA tournament seven times in the last nine seasons, making Sweet 16 appearances in both 2011 and 2014. Only 26 schools nationally have played in at least seven of the last nine NCAA tourneys.
- The Azters' NCAA appearance in 2018 was their first since 2015, and their 12th postseason berth in the last 13 years (8 NCAA, 4 NIT).
- SDSU claimed its Mountain West-leading Ilth conference title last year and broke a tie with New Mexico by claiming its fifth MW tournament crown. The Aztecs, who played in their fourth Mountain West championship game in the last five seasons, won the tourney for the first time since 2011.
- San Diego State has been one of the elite programs in the nation since the start of the 2010-11 season, posting a cumulative record of 219-78. SDSU's. 737 winning percentage is the 15th-best nationally over the last nine years.
- SDSU enters the this season having won at least 20 games and advanced to the postseason in 12 of the last 13 years ( $8 \mathrm{NCAA}, 4$ NIT). In the last 13 seasons, the Aztecs have averaged 25.2 victories.
- The Aztecs have won the Mountain West regular-season crown (outright or shared) five times in the last eight years.
- San Diego State has won at least 19 games in 13 consecutive seasons.

## DEFENSE A KEY

A key component to San Diego State's success this season can be traced to defense.

In the nine victories, SDSU's opponents are shooting 36.3 percent from the field ( 33 rd nationally), 24.5 percent from threepoint range ( 12 th nationally), and have an effective field goal percentage of 41.1 percent ( 24 th nationally). National rankings are compared to all other Division I teams number in games in which they have won (minimum 5 games, 316 teams qualify).

In the seven losses, San Diego State opponents are shooting 49.2 percent from the field (197th nationally), 40.6 percent from three-point range (237th nationally), and have an effective field goal percentage of 58.9 percent ( 251 st nationally). National rank-

Last Saturday at Air Force, the SDSU defense was solid, limiting the Academy to 39.0 percent field goal shooting and 32.1 percent from beyond the arc in a loss. That is rare. In fact, it marked the first time San Diego State has lost a game in the Brian Dutcher head coaching era in which an SDSU opponent failed to shoot 40 percent from the field and 35 percent from three-point range. SDSU is now $23-1$ in those situations.

## 87 POINTS AND 50 PERCENT FG SHOOTING

Since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State is 190 when scoring at least 87 points and shooting 50 percent or better from the field.

The Aztecs have done that three times this season and nine times in the Brian Dutcher era (48 games) after doing so only 10 times in the previous 248 games.

San Diego State has done it six times in the last 26 games.
The Aztecs narrowly missed out doing it again last Tuesday when SDSU tallied 84 points and shot 50.9 percent from the floor in the victory over Wyoming.

## JALEN IS BACK FOR MORE

- After a phenomenal freshman debut, Jalen McDaniels is back for his sophomore campaign with the Aztecs. McDaniels, who spent the offseason auditioning for NBA teams, withdrew from the draft just prior to the deadline.
- McDaniels, who focused on being a becoming a better longrange shooter while working with NBA teams this past summer, is looking to better on a remarkable debut campaign.

- Currently, McDaniels is averaging 15.4 points, 7.8 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game. № SDSU player has averaged 14 points, seven rebounds and 2.5 assists in a single-season since Jamaal Franklin during the 2012-13 campaign ( $17.0 \mathrm{ppg}, 9.5 \mathrm{rpg}$ ). Only two Aztec players have produced a season with those averages in the last 23 seasons (Kawhi Leonard in 2010-11 and Jamaal Franklin, 2012-13).
- Jalen posted a special game in the 2018-19 season-opening victory against Arkansas-Pine Bluff. The sophomore became the first SDSU player in nearly seven years and just the fourth Aztec player, regardless of class, in the last 22 seasons to produce a game with at least 15 points, nine rebounds, five assists and three steals. He joined:

- In his last five games, McDaniels is averaging 18.6 points, 9.4 rebounds and 1.8 steals, while connecting on 55.1 percent of his field goal attempts.
- McDaniels is 12 -of-19 from the field ( 63.2 percent) in 26 post-up possessions. His 1.231 points per possession in those situations is 10th nationally among all Division I players with at least 25 possessions.
- McDaniels has scored in double figures in 15 of 156 games this season and has reached double figures in a career-high 11 consecutive games (broken in the victory over Brigham Young).
- San Diego State is 7-4 this season and 25-12 in his career when McDaniel connects on at least 40 percent or better from the field.
- The Aztecs are 15-6 when McDaniel scores at least 14 points and shoots at least 40 percent from the field.

Below is a look at a few of his accomplishments last season:

- For starters, McDaniels averaged 10.5 points, 7.5 rebounds and shot 58.6 percent from the field and 78.8 percent from the line last season. He led the team in rebounding as a freshman last season.
- McDaniels was one of just four freshman in the nation to average 10.5 points, 7.5 rebounds and connect on at least 58 percent from the field. Other than McDaniels, lowa State's Cameron Lard is the only other 2017-18 freshman who returned for his sophomore campaign.
- He is the only San Diego State player, regardless of class, to post those numbers over an entire season in at least 22 seasons.
- For comparison sake, SDSU great Kawhi Leonard averaged 12.7 points and 9.9 rebounds as a freshman in 2009-10. However, McDaniels had an edge in field-goal percentage as Leonard connected on 45.5 percent from the field and 72.6 percent from the line.


## hemsley climbing charts in 4Th Season

- In his senior season, Jeremy Hemsley is in rare company. A native of Rancho Cucamonga, Calif., Hemsley will spend this season climbing the Aztecs career statistical charts in many categories.
- Here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on:
- First off, Hemsley is a member of the 1,000 -point, 200 rebound, 200 assist club. In school history, there have been 33 players to score 1,000 points at San Diego State and 24 to record 200 rebounds, but in the Brian Dutcher/Steve Fisher era only nine players have reached the 1,000-200-200 club. The players to accomplish that since 1999-2000 are (listed chronologically): Tony Bland, Brandon Heath, Lorrenzo Wade, D.J. Gay, Chase Tapley, Xavier Thames, Winston Shepard, Trey Kell and Hemsley.
- Hemsley has 1,224 points. That ranks 16 th on the school's all-time list.
- Hemsley has 231 assists. That ranks 21 st on the school's all-time list.
- Hemsley has 134 three-point field goals. That ranks 9 th in school history.
- Hemsley has played 3,080 minutes. That ranks 13th on the school's all-time list.
- Hemsley has 248 made free throws. That is tied for 19th on the school's all--ime list.


## DON’T COUNT US OUT

San Diego State has recorded two of the more dramatic comebacks in all of college basketball this season. The Aztecs rallied from 19 points down to defeat Xavier at the Maui Jim Maui Invitational on Nov. 20 and followed that up by ringing in the New Year with a 19-point second-half comeback against CSUN on Jan. 1.

In th the last five seasons there have been 1,740 teams to play Division I basketball ( 351 in 2018-19, 351 in 2017-18, 347 in 2016-17, 346 in 2015-16 and 345 in 2014-15). The 2018-19 San Diego State team is just the sixth to overcome two deficits of at least 19 points in a single season.

Furrhermore, the comebacks rank among the most epic in school history. Only twice in recorded history (since the start of the 199697 season) has SDSU rallied from a bigger deficit to win a game and the 19 -point second half rally against CSUN ranks as the second largest comeback after intermission in school history.

## BRIAN DUTCHER TURNS 30

Second-year head coach Brian Dutcher picked up career victory number 30 earlier this month against CSUN and did so in just his 46th game as head coach.

By doing so in just 46 games, he became the fastest Aztec head coach to record 30 wins since the program's first head coach, C. E. Peterson went $30-13$ during his first 43 games in the 1921-22 and 1922-23 seasons.

It is worth noting that the strength of schedule has changed from those initial seasons on The Mesa. While Dutcher has already

Furthermore, Dutcher became the first Aztec head coach with a winning record when recording win number 30 since Tim Vezie was $30-25$ (he started coaching the Aztecs in the 1974-75 season).
Two-time national coach of the year Steve Fisher, with Brian Dutcher serving as an assistant on that staff, was $30-43$ at SDSU when he claimed his 30th victory with the Aztecs.

## TOUGH AT HOME

- San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament seven of the last nine seasons and has a NIT national semifinalist appearance as well during that span. One reason for the success is that the Aztecs have been a very tough out as Viejas Arena.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, San Diego State has the 9th-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 136 19 home record, winning 87.7 percent of its home games during that span.
Here are a few tidbits on the recent home success.
- In its last 158 home games, San Diego State has compiled a $139-19$ mark, including a $69-9$ record against non-conference competition at Viejas.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Azters are 91-15 at home, including a 44-8 record in non-conference home contests during that stretch ( $42-6$ against non-top 25 non-conference foes).
- The Azters are $36-7$ in their last 43 non-conference home games.

## Air Force 62, San Diego State 48

USAFA, Colo. - Lavelle Scottie and Ryan Swan recorded double-doubles for Air Force and the Falcons withstood a frantic second-half
rally to defeat San Diego State, 62-48.
The Air Force victory, which snapped a three-game San Diego State win streak in the series, came in large part due to the performances of Swan ( 15 points and 15 rebounds) and Scottie ( 16 points and 11 rebounds).
SDSU was unable to win despite holding the Falcons to 39.0 percent field goal shooting and 32.1 percent from three-point range.
Neither team shot the ball well early, with San Diego State connecting on just 5 -of-22 attempts (22.7 percent) from the floor in the first half and Air Force making 9 -of-30 shots ( 30.0 percent). However, the Falcons were able to build a $28-14$ halftime advantage on the strength of eight offensive rebounds in the first half (leading to 13 second-chance points) and forcing seven Aztec turnovers.

The Falcons pushed the lead to 16 points by scoring the first basket of the second half before the Aztecs started to chip away. Trailing $45-30$ with 10 minutes to play, the Aztecs used a $14-3$ run over the next four minutes to cut the deficit to four points. Jalen McDaniels capped the run with to cut the Air Force advantage to 48-44.
However, on its next three offensive possessions, the Azters missed a pair of free throws and had consecutive turnovers (one of which led to an uncontested layup) to allow Air Force to open the game back up.
McDaniels continued his strong play, posting his second consecutive double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds. Senior guard Devin Watson added nine points, four rebounds and four assists. Freshman forward Nathan Mensah, making his second career start added four points and five rebounds.

## NOTING THE AIR FORCE GAME

- San Diego State trailed by 16 points in the second half but used a $30-18$ run to pull within four points with $5: 41$ to play.
- SDSU set season lows for points (48), three-point field goals (2), assists (7), points in a half ( 14 , first) and players to reach double figures (1).
- San Diego State held Air Force to 39.0 percent field goal shooting and had a seven-game win streak when holding its opponent to 40 percent or less. SDSU is now $231-32$ the last 263 times they have done that.
- San Diego State shooting by half: 1st: 5-22 FG (22.7 percent); 0-7 3FG ( 0.0 percent); 2nd: 14-28 (50.0 percent); $2-10$ ( 20.0 percent).
- Freshman Nathan Mensah started for the second consecutive game.
- Jordan Schakel recorded three steals (one off his career high). He now has a steal in six consecutive games. He also converted l-of5 three-point attempts and has a trey in eight straight games.
- Jalen McDaniels - 18 points, 11 rebounds, 8-15 FGs

Led the team in scoring for the 6th time this season and 15th time in his career and rebounding for the 12th time this season and the 30th time in his career... Posted his second career double-double against Air Force, the fourth double-double of th season and the 13th of his career (SDSU is $11-1$ in those games)... ## PRESEASON MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE POLL

- San Diego State has been picked second in the annual Mountain West preseason media poll.
- The preseason favorite, according to the media that regularly cover the conference, is Nevada, which won the 2017-18 regular-season title. The Wolf Pack earned 207 points and 18 first-place votes to finish in front of SDSU, the reigning Mountain West tournament champions who garnered 188 points and one first-place tally.
- The Aztecs won the MW tournament crown a season ago when they beat New Mexioo in the final. The Lobos' run to the championship game set them up for a third-place finish in this year's preseason poll. UNM picked up 153 points to finish ahead of fourth-place Boise State (139 points) and fifth-place Fresno State (138).
- UNLV ( 6 th; 122 points), Wyoming (7th; 88) and Colorado State (8th; 80) were the next three teams to fall in line behind the Bulldogs with Utah State (9th; 78), Air Force (10th; 42) and San José State (11th; 19) rounding out the poll.
- SDSU has finished either first or second in the Mountain West preseason poll and received at least one first-place vote in each of the last five years. It is also the 10 th time in 20 seasons the Azters have been picked first or second in the poll. All 10 times, additionally, have occurred in the last 14 years.
- Despite being considered the second-best team in the league, San Diego State did not have a player voted to the preseason all-conference team or as one of the of-the-year award winners (player, freshman, newcomer).
- The Aztecs are set to return three of their top four scorers from last season (Devin Watson, Matt Mitchell, Jalen McDaniels) and four of their top six (Watson, Mitchell, McDaniels, Jeremy Hemsley) off a 2017-18 team that went 22-11, won their Mountain West-high 1lth conference title and advanced to the NCAA tournament for the seventh time in the last nine years.

## BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach • 31-18 record as head coach at San Diego State and overall
2nd Season • 20th Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher, a long-time San Diego State men's basketball assistant coach, is entering his second season as head coach after a first year in which he led the Aztecs to their Mountain West-high 11th conference title and back to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2015. Dutcher, who took over the helm of the program following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons. He held the fitle of associate head coach/head coach in waiting for six years and is the program's 15th head coach.

Over the course of his time at San Diego State, Dutcher helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 11 Mountain West titles and record 13 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet $16(2011,2014)$ and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games seven times and captured eight MW championships (five regular season, three fournament).

Dutcher arrived at SDSU shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid and finishing with a $21-12$ record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 season that produced the school's first Mountain West regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories.

The run to the NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a $25-9$ record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruifful in 2010-11 when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and a freshman named Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as №. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top- 25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher from associate head coach to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Azters advanced to the 2011-12 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next season, SDSU was again an at-large selection to the 2013 NCAA tournament, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the season by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25 . In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an atlarge invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64 . One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, San Diego State won three games and qualified for the NIT national semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

Last season, SDSU won six consecutive games to end the regular season and all three in the MW tournament to capture the program's 11th league crown to return to the NCAA tournament. Despite the NCAA first-round exit, SDSU finished the campaign with a $22-11$ record, with the 22 wins representing the most by a first-year Aztec men's basketball head coach and the second-most among first-year coaches last season.

Before Dutcher arrived at San Diego State, he served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Fisher on the bench.

The Bloomington, Minn., native led UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship (1997).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years, according to recruiting analyst Bob Gibbons.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Jefferson High School in Bloomington, Minn., and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Gopher head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten championship, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.

SAN DIEGO - Senior guard Devin Watson connected on a careerhigh six three-point field goals and had a team-high 20 points as San Diego State opened its 2018-19 campaign with a $76-60$ victory over Arkansss-Pine Bluff at Viejas Arena.

It was the sixth straight season-opening win for SDSU and the Aztecs have now won 14 consecutive home openers (regardless of the game being a season opener).
San Diego State led $39-36$ with 17:38 to play when the Azters went on a $15-2$ run to open up a comfortable 16 -point lead. Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley had seven points during the spurt and was one of three Aztecs (Jordan Schakel and Watson) to connect on a trey during the decisive run.

The lead grew to 23 points (following a 30-10 run) before the Aztecs settled for the 16 -point final margin.

San Diego State's trademark stellar defense on full display, limited Arkansas-Pine Bluff to 35.7 percent field goal shooting and forced the Golden Lions into 18 turnovers.
Watson recorded his fifth game with the Aztecs with at least 20 points, a figure he has reached 24 times in his career. His six treys are the fourth most by an Aztec player in Viejas Arena history.
Hemsley added 14 points, three assists and three steals. Sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels narrowly missed a doubledouble with 15 points and team highs with nine rebounds and five assists. Sophomore forward Matt Mitchell rounded out four Aztec players in double figures with 10 points and five rebounds.

McDaniels became just the fourth Aztec player in the last 22 seasons to record at least 15 points, nine rebounds, five assists and three steals in a game, joining Jamaal Franklin, Kawhi Leonard and Chase Tapley.

SAN DIEGO - Six San Diego State players scored in double figures, including all five starters, as the Azters never trailed and cruised to a 103-64 victory over Texas Southern.
San Diego State, which improved to 2-0 for the first time in four seasons, received a game-high 21 points from Matt Mitchell. The sophomore also added five rebounds and three assists.
Classmate Jordan Schakel had a career-high 16 points on 3-of3 three-point field goal shooting and 7-of-7 from the charity stripe, and had seven rebounds.
Sophomore Jalen McDaniels added 14 points and a game-high nine rebounds, while Devin Watson poured in 14 points and had eight assists for SDSU. Senior Jeremy Hemsley scored 10 points and freshman Nathan Mensah came off the bench to score 11 points and pull down five rebounds.

San Diego State scored the first eight points of the game and led by as many as 41 points in claiming the team's eighth straight home win.
The Aztecs produced its highest point total in nearly five years (118 vs. Saint Katherine College, Dec. 27, 2013) connected on 52.3 percent from the field and was 27 -of-36 from the free throw line.

Meanwhile, SDSU limited the Tigers to 33.3 percent field goal shooting and forced 14 turnovers on the evening.

San Diego State won for the 68th straight time when shooting at least 50 percent from the field and has won 71 consecutive contests when shooting 50 percent and committing 13 or fewer turnovers.

LAHAINA, Hawaii - Duke made five of its first seven attempts from beyond the arc to build a 13 -point advantage in the opening 10 minutes of the game and the top-ranked Blue Devils defeated San Diego State, $90-64$, in the opening day of the Mavi Jim Maui Invitational.

San Diego State held Duke without an opening possession and quickly got a transition follow basket from sophomore Matt Mitchell to put the Azters on top, 2-0. It was the only lead of the day for SDSU.

The Blue Devils feature one of the nation's most dangerous lineups and on this day that fearsome unit made nine first-half three-point field goals to build a 49-32 halftime advantage.

Senior Jeremy Hemsley and sophomore Jalen McDaniels made consecutive lay ups early in the second half to cut the deficit to 13 , but the Aztecs were not able to draw any closer.

Despite the loss, there were plenty of positive takeaways for SDSU. The Aztecs made 27 trips to the line and drew 25 fouls on the Blue Devils. McDaniels and Mitchell fied for team-high honors by drawing five fouls apiece.

San Diego State was led by senior guard Devin Watson's 15 points. Hemsley added 12 points and McDaniels and Mitchell each chipped in with 11 points apiece.

Duke was led R.J. Barrett who had 20 points and five assists. The Aztecs held Zion Williams, a projected NBA lottery pick, to 13 points on 5 -of-11 attempts from the line.

The game marked just the fourth all-time matchup for the Azters against the nation's top ranked team. On two occasions, the opponent has been the Blue Devils.

LAHAINA, Hawaii - San Diego State made one of the most dramatic comebacks in school history, overcoming a 19 -point deficit, to defeat Xavier, 79-74, on the second day of the Maui Jim Maui Invitational.
The Aztecs trailed $32-13$ with $9: 21$ to play in the first half against a Musketeers' program that is the defending Big East Conference champions, was a No. 1 -seed in the NCAA tournament and finished the campaign 29-6.
SDSU scored the next seven points as part of a $27-5$ run to cut the deficit to three points at half.
After allowing the opening basket of the second half, the Azters went on a $17-2$ run to open up a nine-point advantage. In all, SDSU outsored Xavier, $45-17$, over approximately a $20-$ minute period in the middle of the game.
San Diego State was led by sophomore sensation Jalen McDaniels. McDaniels scored a career-high 26 points on the strength of 9-of-14 shooting, including a career-high three threepoint field goals. He added eight rebounds and three blocked shots.

Senior guard Devin Watson tallied 21 points, including four three-point field goals, and added a game-high seven assists. Sophomore guard Jordan Schakel made three three's en route to a 13 -point, five-rebound performance.

San Diego State shot 53.8 percent from the field and ran its winning streak to 68 games when shooting at least 50 percent from the floor. Equally impressive was the fact the Azters outrebounded their bigger Big East opponent, 33-29.
The comeback was the third largest in SDSU recorded history and the largest in Brian Dutcher's tenure as SDSU's head coach.
Xavier raced out to the big lead by making eight of its first 10 and 13 of its first 19 field goal attempts. As if that was not bad enough, the Musketeers converted on five of its first seven attempts from beyond the arc.

The Aztecs, coming off a 30 -point loss six days earlier, scored the first 11 points of the game, raced to a $24-5$ advantage and built a 49-21 halftime lead.

Five San Diego State players scored in double figures, led by sophomores Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel. Mitchell had 15 points to go along with six rebounds and three assists and Schakel had 15 points and four steals.

Classmate Jalen McDaniels had 14 points and junior forward Nolan Narain came off the bench to add 11 points and four rebounds.

Offensively, San Diego State was efficient, connecting on 50.9 percent of its field goal attempts, including 57.6 percent of its twopoint field goal attempts. The Aztecs had 20 assists on 29 field goal attempts.

San Diego State has now won 70 consecutive games when shooting 50 percent or better from the floor.

Defensively, the Aztecs limited Jackson State to 25.9 percent from the field, the lowest mark for an SDSU opponent in the Brian Dutcher era. This was just the 33 rd time this season that a Division I opponent was held to less than 30 percent field goal shooting and was forced into more than 20 turnovers (23).

With the victory, San Diego State has followed each of its last four defeats with a victory in the next game.

San Diego State 75 Illinois State 65

## Dec. 1, 2018 • Normal, Ill.

Redbird Arena * Att.: 6,245
NORMAL, III. - San Diego State received strong play from its starting senior backcourt and used a relentless team effort on the glass and on the defensive end to pick up a road win at Illinois State, 75-65.

The game was part of the eighth annual Mountain West Missouri Valley Challenge and the SDSU victory helped the Mountain West salvage a tie in the 10 -games played between the teams this season.
The Azters snapped the Redbirds 10 -game homecourt winning streak thanks in part to Devin Watson's season-high 23 points and game-high seven assists and classmate Jeremy Hemsley timely shooting en route to 17 points and five rebounds.
Possibly overlooked was another outstanding performance by sophomore Jalen McDaniels who reached double figures for a per-sonal-best eighth straight game. McDaniels recorded his 10th career double-double with 12 points and a personal-high 15 rebounds.
The Azters had their best rebounding game of the season, with a 47-36 rebound advantage in the contest. It marked the second straight game in which the Aztecs enjoyed a double-digit advantage on the glass after being outrebounded in three of the first five contests of the season. The -11 rebound margin marked the worss of the season for the Redbirds.
SDSU limited Illinois State to 31.0 percent field goal shooting, its lowest percentage in nearly 21 months, since No. 21 Wichita State limited the Redbirds to 29.3 percent on March 5, 2017.

San Diego State led for 37:20 of the contest, including the entire second half. The Aztecs were never really in danger in the second half, but when Illinois State cut the deficit to $55-49$ with 11:37 to play, the Aztecs responding with an $8-0$ run. Hemsley converted on a basket and followed it with a try on the next possession and Watson made a three-pointer of his own to push the lead back to 14 points.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego connected on seven three-point field goals after intermission and shot 56.0 percent after the break to overcome a halftime deficit and defeat San Diego State, 73-61.
The Toreros snapped the Azters 11 -game win streak in the series in games played indoors and won enemy ground for the first time since 2000 .
The Aztecs played stellar defense in the first half, limiting USD to 35.7 percent field goal shooting and 0 -for- 11 from beyond the arc. Despite the strong performance on that side of the floor, the Aztecs, which led by as many as nine points, only entered halffime with a seven-point lead.
San Diego used a $16-5$ run to open the second half to build a four-point advantage. The Aztecs took their final lead of the evening on a pair of free throws by sophomore Jordan Schakel with $10: 57$ to play.
USD responded with a $10-0$ run to take an eight-point advantage with 7:23 to play.

The Azters made a final push, cutting the deficit to four points on a Devin Watson basket with 3:04 to play, but USD drew a foul late in the shot clock, converted two free throws and SDSU could draw no closer.
San Diego State was led by Watson, who tallied a game-high 22 points and added three assists. Sophomore Matt Mitchell added 13 points, four rebounds and three assists for SDSU. McDaniels reached double-figures for a career-high ninth straight game with 12 points.

USD, who had six different players make a three-point basket in the game, was led by Isaiah Pineiro with 21 points and five rebounds.

California 89 San Diego State 83

BERKELEY, Calif. - California converted of four of its final five three-point field goal attempts over the final 4:21 of the contest to overcome a late eight-point deficit and defeat San Diego State, 89-83.

The Aztecs led $78-71$ with $3: 53$ to play in the contest, but the Bears outscored the SDSU $18-5$ over the final stretch to hand SDSU just its second loss to California in the last six meetings.

The loss was the second in a row for San Diego State, which had responded from its previous four losses with a victory in the following game.

San Diego State produced a tremendous offensive game. The Aztecs posted 83 points, connected on 54.7 percent of its field goals and a remarkable 57.1 percent of its three-point field goals (12-of-21).

This marked just the second time since Dec. 27, 2013 that San Diego State scored at least 83 points, made at least 12 three-point field goals, and shot at least 55.6 percent from the field (other was vs. Colorado State, 1-24-18).

Unfortunately, California enjoyed a big offensive night as well, connecting on 52.7 percent from the floor and making 13 threepoint field goals.

The Aztecs were led by sophomore Jalen McDaniels, who had a team-high 20 points and added six rebounds and five assists. Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley was sensational, connecting on 5-of-6 three-point field goals en route to 19 points and six rebounds.

Sophomore Jordan Schakel (14 points) and senior guard Devin Watson (13 points) rounded out the double-figure scoring Aztecs.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State used a $23-0$ run in the first half to cruise to a $99-46$ victory at Viejas Arena over Division II member Cal State Dominguez Hills.
The 53 -point victory was the fifth largest margin of victory in school history and the largest since an 83-point win over St. Katherine College on Dec. 27, 2013.

Four Aztecs scored in double figures led by sophomore forward Matt Mitchell's 20 points. Mitchell connected on 3 -of-6 from beyond the arc en route to his fourth career 20 -point scoring effort and second of the 2018-19 campaign.

Sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels added 13 points, six rebounds and four assists for San Diego State.
The Azters, who were meeting Dominguez Hills for the first time, broke a two-game losing streak.
The game was tied at nine with $13: 40$ to play in the first half when the Aztecs went on their monster spurt. SDSU got points from eight different players during the 23-0 run - Jordan Schakel 5, Nolan Narain 4, Nathan Mensah 3, Adam Seiko 3, Devin Watson 3, Jeremy Hemsley 2, Matt Mitchell 2 and Jalen McDaniels. Dominguez Hills was held without a point for 7:45 during the SDSU run.

San Diego State dominated every statistical category, including rebounding (53-27), field goal percentage (49.3-30.9), threepoint field goal percentage (51.9-12.5), assists (28-10) and turnovers forced (18-10).

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State used an 18-3 run early in the first half, built a 20 -point first half lead and were never threatened in a $90-81$ victory over Brigham Young.
The Aztecs tied a school record by claiming its third consecutive victory in the series and defeated the Cougars in San Diego for the first time since Feb. 23, 2008.
San Diego State posted 90 points on the strength of 52.8 percent shooting from the field, 12 three-point field goals and 22 free throws. The Aztecs had 20 assists on their 28 made field goals.
It marked the second stroight game SDSU has scored at least 90 points for the first time since Nov. 30 and Dec. 2, 2000.
Four San Diego State players reached double figures, led by senior guard Devin Watson.
Watson scored 23 points and added eight assists, four rebounds and three steals. The senior got to the free throw line 16 times (making 12) and recorded his fifth 20-point game of the season.
Sophomore Matt Mitchell scored 22 points, on the strength of $9-0 f-12$ shooting from the field. Mitchell was instrumental in getting the Aztecs off to a good start, scoring six of SDSU's first seven points. It marked the 10th time in his career he has scored at least 15 points, with San Diego State posting a 9-1 record in those games.

Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley had 14 points, five rebounds, four assists and three steals, while sophomore Jordan Schakel had 12 points, career-high eight rebounds and two assists.

San Diego State led $10-9$ with $16: 56$ left in the first half before going on an $18-3$ run to open up a 16 -point advantage. After that, the Aztecs led by at least eight points the final $35: 18$ of the contest.

SAN DIEGO - Desmond Cambridge scored 25 points, including making four 3 -point shots in a dizzying first-half barrage that helped carry Brown to an 82-61 victory against San Diego State on Saturday night.

The Bears (9-4) made six 3-pointers overall in a $26-0$ run that gave them a $50-22$ lead just before halftime.
As the Bears were draining 3 s , San Diego State (7-5) went more than eight minutes without scoring. After Aguek Arop made a 3-pointer to pull the Aztecs to $24-20$ with $8: 32$ left before halftime, they didn't score again until Arop had a slam dunk with 29 seconds left to make it 50-22.

SDSU simply had no answer for Brown during the decisive run. After Tamenang Choh made a layup for a 26-20 Brown lead, the Azters missed three jumpers on their next possession. Brown's Travis Fuller, who played at La Costa Canyon High in northern San Diego County, rebounded to set up a 3-pointer by Cambridge.

Brown made 3s on its next four possessions, with Cambridge and Okolie alternating shots from behind the arc. Okolie's second 3 made it $41-20$. The run continued with nine more points by Brown, with Cambridge hitting another 3 and Okolie making a turn-around jumper and a layup.

Cambridge went down hard after committing his third foul with 14 minutes left and got up favoring his right knee. He came out of the game but later returned.

Jalen McDaniels scored 19 and Arop 11 for SDSU, which was coming off a 90-81 win against Brigham Young.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State overcame a 19-point second half deficit to defeat CSUN, 65-60, at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs overcame their second 19 -point deficit to win for the second time this season. Against the Matadors, the Aztecs trailed $46-27$ with $15: 12$ to play but closed the game on a 38-14 run to win their fourth straight game in the series.
Sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels led the way for the Aztecs, recording his second double-double of the season with team-highs 20 points and 13 rebounds. Senior guard Devin Watson added 14 points ( 12 in the second half) and six assists, while senior guard Jeremy Hemsley tallied 13 points (10 in the second half).
For the second consecutive game, San Diego State struggled to score in the first half. The Aztecs connected on just 9 -of-32 shots in the first half ( 28.1 percent) and $2-0$ - 15 from three-point range ( 13.3 percent) prior to intermission. That helped enable CSUN to close the half on a $12-4$ run in the final $4: 29$ of the first half and open a $32-21$ halftime advantage.
Entering the game, SDSU had overcome a double-digit halftime deficit to win on three occasions in the last 23 seasons.
The deficit grew to 19 points in the opening minutes of the second half and the Aztecs trailed by 15 with $11: 17$ to play. SDSU got the deficit to eight points with a $7-0$ run, on the strength of a bucket by McDaniels and consecutive field goals by Hemsley ( 5 points).

CSUN pushed the lead to 10 points but SDSU erased that with a 10-0 run. This time Watson (two treys) and Matt Mitchell (4 points) keyed the run.

CSUN led for the final time, $60-58$, with $2: 12$ to play but SDSU took the lead for good by scoring on consecutive possessions, first on a Hemsley three (1:57) than a driving layup by Watson (1:02) put SDSU up for good.
The 19-point second-half deficit marked the second largest ever overcome by San Diego State in recorded history (since 1996-97).

BOISE, Idaho - Derrick Alston had a career-high 30 points on 9 -of14 shooting and Boise State led by throughout the second half in an $88-64$ win over San Diego State on Saturday night.
Alston's 30 points was the first 30 -point game of the season for any Boise State player. His 30 points also was the 55th 30 -plus point game in program history. He recorded careeer highs in made field goals (9), field goals attempted (14), made free throws ( 10 ) and free throws attempted ( 12 ) in 29 minutes of play.
Alex Hobbs added 18 points for the Broncos (7-8, 2-0 Mountain West Conference), who have won three of their last four games.

Boise State led by 23 late in the first half and went into the break with a 46-25 lead. San Diego State opened the second half with a $12-2$ run to cut the deficit to eleven but that was as close as the Aztecs $(8-6,0-1)$ would get.
The loss snapped a San Diego State six-game Mountain West regular-season win streak and a nine-game win streak against teams from the Mountain West Conference.

Devin Watson had 24 points on 7-of-14 shooting from the field. It was his sixth 20 -plus scoring game of the season, 10th while at San Diego State and 29th of his career. Watson led the Aztecs in scoring for the sixth time this season in 15th time in his career.
Jalen McDaniels added 14 points for San Diego State, which made just 3 -of-21 from 3 -point range. With the 14 points in Boise, McDaniels tallies 53 points in his last three game, averaging 18.3 points per game. He also tallied a team-high five rebounds for SDSU against the Broncos.

## San Diego State 84 Wyoming 54

SAN DIEGO - Jalen MCDaniels had 22 points and 12 rebounds, and Matt Mitchell scored 20 as SDSU ran past Wyoming $84-54$ Tuesday night. Jordan Schakel scored 14 points and Devin Watson had 12 points and eight assists for the Aztecs ( $9-6,1-1$ ), who lost $88-64$ Boise State on Saturday night.

After making only 3 of 213 -point shots at BSU, the Azters made their first five from behind the arc - two each by Mitchell and Schakel - in taking a 23-9 lead against the Cowboys. They made 9 of 15 en route to a $48-25$ hallfime lead and 12 of 24 overall.

Jalen McDaniels notched his third double-double of the season and 12th of his career and led SDSU in scoring for the fifth time this season and 14th time of his career.

The Azters beat Wyoming for the 11th straight time at Viejas Arena. Four of SDSU's last 10 MWC wins have been by 30 points.

It was Wyoming's worst loss since Jan. 29, 2011, when fourthranked SDSU won 96-57.

Justin James scored 18, Hunter Thompson 11 and Trevon "TJ" Taylor 10 for Wyoming (4-12, 0-3), which lost for a third straight game and six of its last seven.

The Cowboys were without five players, including two of their top five scorers, Hunter Maldonado and Jake Hendricks. They added walk-on guard KC Henry, a redshirt sophomore, to the roster.

Nolan Narain was a scratch because he was still sore after a collision in the Boise State loss and senior guard Jeremy Hemsley had the flu and was sent home.

USAFA, Colo. - Lavelle Scottie and Ryan Swan recorded doubledoubles for Air Force and the Falcons withstood a frantic secondhalf rally to defeat San Diego State, 62-48.
The Air Force victory, which snapped a three-game San Diego State win streak in the series, came in large part due to the performances of Swan ( 15 points and 15 rebounds) and Scottie (16 points and 11 rebounds).
SDSU was unable to win despite holding the Falcons to 39.0 percent field goal shooting and 32.1 percent from three-point range.
Neither team shot the ball well early, with San Diego State connecting on just 5 -of-22 attempts ( 22.7 percent) from the floor in the first half and Air Force making 9 -of-30 shots ( 30.0 percent). However, the Falcons were able to build a $28-14$ halftime advantage on the strength of eight offensive rebounds in the first half (leading to 13 second-chance points) and forcing seven Aztec turnovers.
The Falcons pushed the lead to 16 points by scoring the first basket of the second half before the Aztecs started to chip away. Trailing 45-30 with 10 minutes to play, the Azters used a 14-3 run over the next four minutes to cut the deficit to four points. Jalen McDaniels capped the run with to cut the Air Force advantage to 48-44.
However, on its next three offensive possessions, the Aztecs missed a pair of free throws and had consecutive turnovers (one of which led to an uncontested layup) to allow Air Force to open the game back up.

McDaniels continued his strong play, posting his second consecutive double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds. Senior guard Devin Watson added nine points, four rebounds and four assists. Freshman forward Nathan Mensah, making his second career start added four points and five rebounds.
