LOBOS HEAD TO TEXAS FOR JAVELINA BATTLE ON THE BEACH

New Mexico beach volleyball is aiming to build on its current run of success as it competes at the Javelina Battle on the Beach in the penultimate weekend of the regular season.

After stretching their hot streak to four wins in their five matches, the Lobos (6-10) will look to continue winning when they play Texas A&M-Kingsville, Abilene Christian, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and St. Edward's in Kingsville.

With just two more weeks remaining in the regular season, the Lobos can finish their 2018 campaign on a high note if they can keep playing at a high level.

UNM has played some of its best ball over the past two weeks and heads to the Javelina Beach Courts with a chance to even its season record after a challenging start to the year.

But, the team's early trials have translated to success over the past few weeks of competition, as evidenced by UNM's 4-1 record over the last two weeks.

This jaunt east is shaping up to be another productive weekend for New Mexico. Bolstered by its burgeoning consistency, the Lobos have had multiple partnerships rack up the wins during their recent run.

At the No. 2 position, **Eastyn Baleto & Lauren Twitty** have shined, winning five straight matches. The team leaders with a 9-4 record, They have powered the Lobos this season, providing key stability at the top of the lineup.

Maddie Irwin & Erin Martin have also contributed strong play from the No. 1 court, sitting with an 8-8 record.

The Lobos' No. 3 tandem of **Chloe Crappell & Yasmin** Tan has won six of their last eight matches together, including back-to-back threeset thrillers. Their latest three-set win helped clinch the Lobos' road win at CSU Bakersfield last Friday.

Additionally, **Mercedes Pacheco & Carly Beddingfield** have shown sparks of strong play at the No. 4 slot, while the triumvirate of **Abbey Willison, Kayla Long** and **Emily Nenninger** have all won multiple matches at the No. 5 position.

Through the first three years of the program, one Lobo has stood above the rest as the winningest player for UNM.

Eastyn Baleto, a senior from Seattle, enters the penultimate week of her collegiate beach volleyball career with 61 career wins in the sand, easily tops in the team's record books.

A three-year alum of the program, Julia Warren, is second with 47 wins, while Marisa Doran and Lise Rugland both have 41.

The next closest active player is **Lauren Twitty** with 27 career wins.

Baleto's career record is 61-21 (.744), which stands second-best in program history with a minimum of 20 matches played. Only Doran (41-10, .803), her former partner, stands ahead of Baleto in regards to career winning percentage.

STREAKING

So far this season the Lobos have registered some strong results at the top of their lineup, with their Nos. 1 and 2 pairings both tallying winning streaks over at least four matches over the last few weeks of competition.

At the No. 2 position, **Eastyn Baleto & Lauren Twitty** have an active five-match winning streak. The tandem swept through the Lobos' home tournament, winning every contest in straight sets, and added a gutsy three-set win at CSU Bakersfield.

The pair's winning streak is tied for the ninthlongest in program history and the longest by any pair this season.

This winning streak also gives Baleto six of the 15 longest pairs winning streaks in program history.

Also logging a significant winning streak this season was the tandem of **Maddie Irwin & Erin Martin**, who won four in row to set the program record for most consecutive wins out of the top-seeded position.

The duo started at the Stetson/Hickory Point Lake Bash with wins over UNC Wilmington and the College of Charleston and continued at the team's home tournament with wins over Colorado Mesa and Abilene Christian.

The duo didn't drop a point over the four matches, tying for the ninth-best set-winning streak in program history.

FIVE FOR FIGHTING

Over the course of the four-year history of New Mexico beach volleyball, only two players have managed to play at least one match in every position. Those players: **Chloe Crappell** and **Lauren Twitty**.

Crappell, a senior from Albuquerque, and Twitty, a sophomore from The Broadlands, Virginia, have seen action at the 1's, 2's, 3's, 4's and 5's positions for the Lobos.

For Crappell, she's played the bulk of her 42 career matches at the Nos. 2 and 3 courts, going 5-7 and 6-9, respectively. She is also 1-4 all-time at the 1's, and 4-2 at the 4's and 3-1 at the 5's.

For Twitty, the majority of her 36 career matches have come at the No. 5 position, where she's posted a 14-4 record. She's also gone 5-1 at the 2's, 4-3 at the 3's and 3-1 at the 4's.

Twitty achieved the feat of playing all five positions during the Lobos' only homestand of 2018 as she made her only appearance at the 1's, which she won. She is 26-9 in her career.

The only other players who have come close to the platinum sombrero are current teammate **Eastyn Baleto** and alumnae Julia Warren and Lise Rugland, who played in four of the five positions during the first four years of the program.

ALL MY X'S LIVE IN TEXAS

For New Mexico, there aren't many X's in Texas. Nor are there many W's in Texas.

In fact, as the Lobos head to Kingsville, Texas, for the Javelina Battle on the Beach, they'll be looking to earn their first wins in the state.

Over the first four years of the program, UNM is 0-3 in the state, having dropped three matches

at TCU during its breakthrough 2016 season.

It's the only state the Lobos have never won in out of the seven they've played in over the course of the program's history.

SUCH NICE NEIGHBORS

New Mexico is a bit of an island in the world of NCAA beach volleyball. The Lobos are the only team in the state of New Mexico to sponsor beach volleyball as an NCAA varsity sport, so with the lack of in-state competition, UNM has to find nearby neighbors for games.

With multiple schools in Arizona sponsoring the sport, the Lobos can travel west for some matches, which means New Mexico has played its fair share of games against those schools.

In fact, of the 83 matches ever played in UNM history, 21 have come against Arizona schools. (That's just over 25 percent at 25.3 percent.)

The Lobos have played Arizona and Arizona State seven times each and Grand Canyon six times. The 21st match came in the team's 2017 opener vs. Benedictine University at Mesa.

UNM will get more opportunities to add to this list during the 2018 season as it plays Arizona twice and Arizona State, Grand Canyon and Benedictine once each.

Home Away from Home?

As noted above, the Lobos have played schools from Arizona a number of times, with 21 matches against Copper State schools through the first three seasons of the program.

However, New Mexico's affinity for the state of Arizona doesn't stop there.

Over the program's 83-match history, UNM has played 39 of its matches in the state of the Arizona, which is just under half of its total number of matches (right around 47 percent).

This season, UNM will again venture west as it's scheduled to play nine of its 22 matches in Arizona.

HOME COOKING

New Mexico beach volleyball hosted its only home matches of the season to end March, picking up three wins as it hosted Colorado Mesa, Abilene Christian and Arizona State.

Despite playing relatively few matches at home, UNM continued its considerable home-court advantage in Albuquerque.

The Lobos have played 16 home matches over the program's first 82 matches, winning 13 for an all-time .813 winning percentage in Albuquerque.

New Mexico had a 12-game winning streak going for the better parts of four seasons as the team didn't lose a home match between its April 18, 2015 contest vs. Colorado State and its March 30, 2018 contest vs. Abilene Christian. Arizona State snapped the streak on March 31, 2018.

SCOUTING ABILENE CHRISTIAN

For the fourth time this season, the Lobos and the Wildcats will square off in the sand. New Mexico has won the previous three meetings, contributing significantly to Abilene Christian's 1-11 record during their debut year.

ACU's last action came in Albuquergue, were they dropped all four matches, including two to the Lobos. The Wildcats were able to pick up a point in one match vs. UNM, but were swept in the other three.

ACU's only win so far this season was a rematch against Benedictine at Mesa on March 9.

Jacey Smith & Kendall Bosse are 3-9 from the No. 1 position for the Wildcats.

SCOUTING TEXAS A&M-KINGSVILLE

Texas A&M-Kingsville enters the week on a roll, having won the AVCA Division II National Championship last weekend at the AVCA Small College Beach Championships.

The Javelinas are 16-10 on the season, but have lost just once to a non-Division I school while earning four wins over DI teams, including a UAB team currently receiving votes in the one of the national polls.

TAMUK has also yet to lose at home, owning an 8-0 record at the Javelina Beach Courts.

Gabby Atchley/Whitney Walker are 13-13 from the top-seeded court, but the Javelinas rely significantly on their Nos. 2 and 3 duos, with Macy Berg/Madison Brabham sitting 17-9 at the 2's and Tenley Housler/Erin Umbel 19-7 at the 3's. TAMUK is .500 or better on every court except the 5's, where they're 11-15.

UNM is 1-0 all-time vs. the Javelinas, having earned a sweep last March in Tempe, Arizona.

SCOUTING ST. EDWARD'S

As for St. Edward's, there's not much to say as the Division II school from Austin, Texas, doesn't officially sponsor beach volleyball.

The Hilltoppers' indoor volleyball team did go 16-11 in 2017 while playing out of the Heartland Conference.

SCOUTING TEXAS A&M-CORPUS CHRISTI

Texas A&M-Corpus Christi owns a 6-7 record this season, and returns to the sand after a week off. The Islanders dropped three straight their last time out at the LSU Beach Invitational.

A&M-Corpus Christi has just three Division I wins this season, and fell to Texas A&M-Kingsville in March.

Selina Marolf/Abigail Devido lead the Islanders this season with a 7-4 record at the No. 1 position, including a three-set win over Florida Atlantic in March.

This is the first meeting all-time between the Lobos and Islanders.

BEACH VOLLEYBALL CONTINUES ACADEMIC SUCCESS IN FALL 2017

After posting another strong campaign in the sand last spring, the University of New Mexico beach volleyball team posted a superb semester in the classroom last fall.

The Lobos registered a team GPA of 3.84 for the Fall 2017 semester, the second-highest team GPA in the seven-semester history of the program. The Lobos' Fall 2017 GPA trails only their Spring 2017 GPA of 3.85.

This past semester was the sixth semester that the team registered a mark of at least 3.4.

The beach team combined with the rest of the women's sports at UNM for a 3.57 GPA. It's the 21st straight semester of at least a 3.3 GPA and the ninth straight semester with at least a 3.5 recorded by the combined women's teams, as well.

BEACH VOLLEYBALL EARNS AVCA TEAM ACADEMIC AWARD IN 2017

New Mexico beach volleyball was honored by the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) on Monday, July 24, as the Lobos earned the AVCA Team Academic Award for the 2016-17 academic year.

The team recorded team GPAs of 3.46 in both the Fall 2016 and Spring 2017 semesters.

The award, which was initiated in the 1992-93 academic year, honors collegiate and high school volleyball teams that displayed excellence in the classroom during the school year by maintaining at least a 3.30 cumulative team GPA on a 4.0 scale.

19 collegiate beach teams were recognized for the 2016-17 academic year.

This honor was the first such selection for the program, which wrapped up its third season of competition last spring. The Lobos logged back-to-back program records in GPA during the 2016-17 academic semesters.

A PRIMER ON BEACH VOLLEYBALL

Beach volleyball and court volleyball share many of the same basic rules. Each side gets three hits, there's rally scoring, and a team earns a points when the ball hits the ground or goes out of bounds. But there are some key difference between the two sports:

- Beach volleyball is a partner sport played during the spring. Court volleyball is a six-player sport played during the fall.
- Beach volleyball plays the best of three sets, with the first two sets played to 21 points, and a tiebreaker set played to 15 points, if necessary. A set must be won by at least two points.
- Open-handed tipping is prohibited in beach volleyball and the block touch counts as one of three permitted contacts.
- Coaches may only speak or give any kind of input to their players during timeouts or between sets.

- Beach volleyball players switch sides of the court every seven points during a 21-point set and every five points during a 15-point set.
- Beach volleyball is usually contested in dual matches, where the winning team is the school that wins three of five individual matches versus its opponent. Similar in format to tennis, each of those individual matches consist of a doubles — a pair of teammates ranked by ability — that are matched against their corresponding doubles from the opposing team.

BEACH VOLLEYBALL ENTERS 3RD SEASON AS 90TH NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Before the 2016 season, the NCAA approved beach volleyball as the 90th NCAA Championship at the 2015 NCAA Convention, which allowed the sport to advance from the emerging sports for women list to a full-fledged NCAA championship.

The NCAA Beach Volleyball Committee also determined the sport will be officially referred to as "beach volleyball". When the sport was placed on the list of emerging sports for women in 2009, it was called sand volleyball. But because the sport is known as beach volleyball at all other levels of play throughout the world, the committee made its decision to refer to the sport as beach volleyball.

The third-annual NCAA Beach Volleyball Championships will take place May 4-6, 2018 at the Beach at Gulf Shores in Gulf Shore, Alabama. The championship will have an eightteam bracket that will be played in a doubleelimination format.

USC has won the first two NCAA National Championships, 3-0 over Florida State in 2016 and 3-2 over Pepperdine in 2017.

Beach volleyball is the fastest-growing NCAA sport with 55 Division I colleges and universities sponsoring. NCAA rules require 40 sponsoring schools to request an NCAA championship. Data shows that on average, 60 percent of participants at a sponsoring school participate only in beach volleyball instead of playing both beach and indoor volleyball.
