SCOUTING FRESNO STATE

The Bulldogs enter Saturday in a tie for second place in the league standings with a 9-3 conference record. Comparatively speaking, Fresno State and the Lobos are relatively equivalent in scoring offense, but defense is a significantly different factor. The Lobos allow 76.2 points per game, compared to just 66.7 for the Bulldogs.

That figure narrows in conference competition as UNM allows 73.5 points in league play compared to 66.8 for Fresno State.

LAST TIME OUT

The Lobos rebounded from a tough loss against No. 6 Nevada with a 32-point victory over San José State on Wednesday night at Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit marking the largest victory margin for the Lobos over a Division I opponent this season.

Redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee led the Lobos for the second time in the last three games with his UNM-career-high 20 points that included a 4-for-6 performance from 3-point range, 7-for-10 from the floor. McGee has scored 10 or more points in three of his last four games and is now averaging 10.4 points per game in Mountain West play.

SATURDAY PROMOS

Saturday evening's game will be full of exciting promos for fans to enjoy including:

Lobos Love Pink - Lobos will wear special uniforms and fans wearing pink can get \$10 bench tickets!

<u>Autism Awareness</u> - The Lobo coaching staff will be wearing special pins to raise awareness for autism.

<u>Scouts Day</u> - Boy and Girl Scouts and up to three guests can get \$5 tickets in rows 1-25!

<u>Youth Sports Day</u> - Participants in youth sports can wear their jersey to the game and get a \$5 ticket for themselves, and up to three guests in rows 1-25.

<u>Razzle Dazzle Halftime Performance</u> - The highly-anticipated Razzle Dazzle halftime performance will commence on Saturday with youth cheerleaders from around the community.

MCGEE BREAKS OUT

Redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee led the Lobos with a UNM-career-best 20 points in New Mexico's last game against SJSU and has scored 10 or more points in three of his last four games.

He has led UNM in two of the last three games and is currently averaging 10.4 points per game in conference play.

25 POINTS OR MORE

Of the Lobos' five conference wins, three have been victories of 25 points or more including wins over then No. 5/6 Nevada (85-58, 27 points), Wyoming (83-53, 30 points) and San José State (92-60, 32 points).

SPEAKING OF LARGE VICTORY MARGINS

The Lobos' 32-point win over San José State on Wednesday marked the largest victory margin over an NCAA Division I opponent for UNM this season.

STEALING LOBOS - 1ST IN THE MW

The Lobos currently lead the Mountain West on the season in steals per game with 7.3. UNM is led in the category by senior Anthony Mathis and redshirt-junior Vance Jackson with 25 apiece, followed by and senior Dane Kuiper (23).

UNM is followed in the category by Fresno State, which ranks second with 6.9 per game.

LOBOS AFTER DARK

UNM will take on an opponent at 9 p.m. MT five times this season - some 9 p.m. (PT) times will actually be at 10 p.m. in Albuquerque. In addition, the Lobo schedule features four 8 p.m. (MT) contests.

HALFTIME CURSE · BROKEN

So far this season, the halftime score has been extremely telling of the outcome of the contest. Prior to the Feb. 5th game against SDSU, when the Lobos were trailing at the half, even by a small margin, the opponents had come away with the victory 10-of-11 times, including 5-of-5 times in MW play.

The curse was broken against SDSU as the Lobos entered the second half down by one, and overpowered the Aztecs with 47 secondhalf points for the win. The victory broke a seven-game streak in which UNM had fallen when trailing at halftime.

NEW MEXICO NOTES

FIRST TIME SINCE

In UNM's Feb. 2 game at Fresno State, redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg racked up a career-high 15 rebounds. The last time a Lobo collected 15 boards in a game was on Nov. 21, 2015 when former Lobo Tim Williams achieved the feat at USC.

To date, Bragg has accumulated four 10+ rebound games and averages 8.0 per game.

MATHIS 9TH & 10TH IN THE NATION

Lobo senior Anthony Mathis is currently ranked ninth in the nation in 3-point field goals per game (3.67) and 10th in total 3-point field goals made (88).

He is also ranked 16th in the nation in 3-point field goal percentage (44.7) and 23rd in free-throw percentage (88.4).

MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

For his efforts against then-ranked No. 5/6 Nevada on Jan. 5 and against Air Force on Jan. 2, senior Anthony Mathis earned his first Mountain West Player of the Week honor. Mathis averaged 22.0 points per game going 12-for-31 (.387) from the field including 8-for-23 (.348) from behind the arc. He also went 12-for-14 from the free throw line.

WELL-ROUNDED VANCE

Redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson leads the Lobos with the most double-doubles (4) and ties redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg for the most 10+ rebounding games of the season (4). Jackson has scored in double figures in 12 of the last 15 games and leads the Lobos with 58 assists on the season.

IT'S RAINING THREES

The Lobos are averaging 9.5 3-pointers per game and have racked up 10 or more in 13 games this season, including a season-most 14 against SJSU on Wednesday. Conversely, the Lobos have allowed opponents to make 10 threes or more just four times this season.

DUNK TRACKER

Redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg leads the Lobos in dunks on the season with 10, including eight in Mountain West play. In fact, in UNM's Jan. 22 contest at UNLV, Bragg posted not one, not two, but three secondhalf dunks.

Bragg isn't the only Lobo that has racked up the slams this season. Junior Corey Manigault has tallied six while senior Dane Kuiper has collected five.

BRAGG IS BACK

Redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg finally earned his debut as a Lobo on Sunday, Dec. 16 after a year and a half off the court. Bragg posted 16 points on 7-for-12 from the floor and tallied seven rebounds in his debut against Central Arkansas.

To date, he has accumulated 128 rebounds and 171 points in 16 games and has started the last 14.

He has also racked up 19 blocks on the season and is tied for second in league play with 1.5 per game.

SHOOTING HIGH

The Lobo squad is 5-0 in Mountain West play when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponents (10-1 overall).

UNM's Feb. 5 game against SDSU marked the first time in conference play that UNM fired over 50 percent from the floor (53.8) this season. The Lobos followed it up two games later with a 50.0 percent performance against SJSU.

MAGIC 805

The Lobos are 7-0 when scoring between 80 and 89 points on the season, 3-0 in MW play.

MATHIS COUNTDOWN TO 1,000

Senior Anthony Mathis has accumulated 888 points in his career. With 112 points to go to reach the 1,000-point mark, it may seem

McGee Hits 20, Lobos Top SJSU by 32

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team rebounded from a tough loss against No. 6 Nevada with a 32-point victory over San José State on Wednesday night at Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit marking the largest victory margin for the Lobos over a Division I opponent this season.

Three of the Lobos' five conference wins on the season have come by a margin of 25 points or more.

Redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee led the Lobos for the second time in the last three games with his UNM-career-high 20 points that included a 4-for-6 performance from 3-point range, 7-for-10 from the floor. McGee has scored 10 or more points in three of his last four games and is now averaging 10.4 points per game in Mountain West play.

McGee led four Lobos to score in double figures including junior Corey Manigault (17), senior Anthony Mathis (16) and sophomore Makuach Maluach (14). Sophomore Vladimir Pinchuk led UNM in rebounds with seven in just 15 minutes on the court while Manigault added six.

A pair of Lobos tallied five assists apiece including redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson and senior Dane Kuiper, contributing to UNM's successful offensive effort.

The Lobos (11-13, 5-7 MW) fired at a clip of 50.0 percent from the

field for the second time in the last three games including a 51.9 percent mark from behind the arc. UNM held SJSU (3-20, 0-11 MW) to 35.3 percent from the floor and 23.5 percent from three-point range.

All 12 eligible Lobos saw action in the game including all four freshmen.

McGee got the game off on the right foot with an early three at the 18:58 mark and didn't let off the gas from there. While the Spartans were able to keep the game close through the first 16 minutes that included eight tied scores, UNM went on a 15-2 run to close the last 5:01 of the first half.

The key run was sparked by back-to-back threes from Jackson and put the Lobos in the locker room up by 10 at the break, 42-32.

The Lobos extended the run into the second half to 30-7 and continued to dominate offensively, increasing the lead to a game-high 33 points (90-57) with 1:18 left en route to the 32-point final, 92-60. During the 30-7 run, the Lobos were 11-of-13 from the field, shooting 3-for-4 from behind the arc to go along with five free throws.

UNM outscored the Spartans 50-28 in the second half for the final score, limiting SJSU to just 33.3 percent (11-33) from the floor and 16.7 percent (1-for-6) from behind the arc.

The Lobos committed just 10 turnovers while forcing 11, but converted them for 14 points compared to just two for the Spartans.

New Mexico is set to return to action on Saturday, Feb. 16 when it hosts Fresno State inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit on ESPN3.

Mathis Scores 19, Lobos Struggle to Hold On

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- In a game with nine lead changes in which the Lobos led for over 13 minutes, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team struggled to hold onto the lead on Saturday night and ultimately fell to third-place Fresno State by a final score of 82-70.

The Lobos led by as many as nine in the first half but went into the locker room down by two at the break. Fresno State outscored UNM by 10 points in the second frame as the Lobo offense shot just 29.7 percent in the second half.

Senior Anthony Mathis netted 19 points on six threes and a free throw. He has now tallied 12 or more points in 17-of-21 games this season. Redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg registered a career-high 15 rebounds to go along with seven points.

Two other Lobos scored in double figures on the night including redshirtsophomores Vance Jackson (16) and Keith McGee (10). Jackson has now scored 10 or more points in the last 12 straight games.

"We started out the game really well defensively, I thought we did some good things, and then you look up at halftime and you're down two," head coach Paul Weir said. "I thought we played really well the first 20 minutes... (but) that early to middle part of that second half ... the defensive game plan went a little south.

"The results are the results, but we have to find a way offensively to get more than Anthony Mathis going."

The Bulldogs were led by three players in double figures including a pair of 20-point scorers in Braxton Huggins (22) and Deshon Taylor (20). Nate Grimes also had a big night tallying a double-double with 19 points and a Save Mart Center-record 19 rebounds.

The Lobos started out strong, jumping out to a nine-point advantage just 5:41 into the contest, 16-7. The 8-0 run included four points from Bragg and a three from Mathis, along with a layup from sophomore Makuach Maluach.

Fresno State responded and eventually closed the gap to one, 19-18, with 8:15 left in the first half. The teams battled throughout the remainder of the period, tying the game four times in the final six and a half minutes, including with 1:02 left. A McGee free throw made it 32-32 and another by Bragg put the Lobos up by one with 24 seconds left.

The Bulldogs' Taylor hit a jumper and-one to take the two-point advantage heading into the break.

The Lobos slipped into a five-point deficit with 16:28 on the clock in the second half and it looked like the game was about to get out of control, but UNM rebounded and tied it up at the 12:41 mark, 48-48, on a steal and a coast-to-coast three from Mathis.

The tie marked the last however, as UNM had the game at one on a McGee three at the 9:41 mark, 54-53, but an ensuing 13-3 Fresno State run put the game out of reach at 11 points, 67-56, with 6:49 left to play.

The Lobos cut the game back to single digits three times, but would get no closer than nine points the rest of the way.

Both teams amassed a significant amount of fouls as the Lobos totaled 23 to Fresno State's 21. Both squads had its leading scorer foul out - UNM's Mathis fouled out with 1:18 left to play while Fresno State's Huggins fouled out with 1:49 left.

On the night, UNM was outscored in the paint 42-20 and 17-9 in second-chance points, but the Lobos scored 11 fast-break points to none for the Bulldogs while also outscoring Fresno State's bench 44-12. UNM exercised its ball-handling skills on the night, turning the ball over just 10 times, 4.75 less than its season average. Conversely, the Lobos forced 15 from the Bulldogs.

Fresno State fired at a clip of 44.4 percent from the floor (28-63), 20 percent from three (4-20) while the Lobos were 31.9 (22-69) from the field and an uncharacteristically-low 21.6 percent from 3-point range (8-37).

The Lobos have a short turnaround as they take on San Diego State for the second time this season on Tuesday, Feb. 5, at 9 p.m. Mountain Time on ESPN2.

Gritty defense powers Bulldogs to sweep of Broncos

FRESNO, Calif. --- The Fresno State men's basketball team secured a hard-nosed 65-63 victory over the Boise State Broncos on Wednesday night at the Save Mart Center.

Fresno State (18-6, 9-3 Mountain West) remains in a tie for second place in the conference standings with Utah State (19-6, 9-3 MW) – just 1.5 games back of No. 7/6 Nevada (23-1, 10-1 MW).

With the win, the Bulldogs have clinched a regular season sweep of the Broncos, which gives Fresno State the head-to-head tiebreaker over Boise State (11-14, 6-6 MW) for seeding in the 2019 MW Tournament, if needed. Fresno State also has the head-to-head tiebreaker over UNLV, if needed.

Fresno State redshirt senior guard Braxton Huggins scored a game-high 26 points on 9-for-16 shooting to lead four Bulldogs in double figures. Nate Grimes posted his ninth double-double of the season (eighth in MW play) with 13 points and 15 rebounds for the Bulldogs, who also got 11 points from Deshon Taylor and 10 points by Noah Blackwell.

Huggins, a native of Bakersfield, Calif., has now scored at least 20 points in four straight games and six of the last seven games. He has scored 26 or more points in each of the last three contests.

Fresno State has also earned its sixth straight season with at least nine conference victories.

How it happened: Neither team led by more than six points in the competitive 40-minute contest, which featured 16 lead changes - the most in any of Fresno State's 24 games this season.

The Bulldogs opened the game with Blackwell hitting a 3-pointer and Huggins added a free throw for an early 4-0 lead. The Broncos answered with six straight points and the lead changed six times in a three-minute span before Boise State took an 18-12 lead with three consecutive field goals midway through the first half.

The Bulldogs kept chipping away at the Broncos' lead, until back-to-back scores from Huggins and Blackwell put Fresno State up 30-29 with 54 seconds left in the first half, but Boise State's RJ Williams would get to the free throw line with 31 seconds left and gave the Broncos a 31-30 lead going into halftime by making a pair from the charity stripe.

The Broncos and the Bulldogs continued exchanging baskets in the second half, but nobody could break open the game. Boise State managed to hold a slim lead over Fresno State through the first seven minutes of the second half until the Bulldogs went on an 8-2 run -- capped by a 3-pointer from Huggins to push Fresno State in front 43-41 lead with 12:28 to play.

The lead would change five more times over the next eight minutes, with neither able to take more than a three-point lead over the stretch.

Boise State retook the lead with a quick jumper but Fresno State was relentless -- tying the game two more times. Huggins would take it to the hoop to get a basket and draw a foul. He completed the three-point play to give the Bulldogs a 62-61 lead with 28 seconds remaining. A foul would send the Broncos to the free throw line with eight seconds left on the clock. Alex Hobbs, who finished with a team-high 18 points, was able to convert both to make it a one-point game.

The Broncos quickly fouled Grimes, who made one of two free throws and the Bulldogs' defense came through with a stop on a contested 3-point attempt by Hobbs in the final second.

Fresno State held Boise State to just 36.7 percent shooting, including a 3-for-17 clip (17.6 percent) from beyond the 3-point arc, and the Bulldogs had five blocks, including arguably the game-saving swat by Blackwell with 11 seconds to go in the game.

Fresno State has won 16 of its last 20 games (6-2 in last eight MW games).

Fresno State has made at least four 3-pointers in every game this season.

Fresno State senior guard Deshon Taylor moved up into No. 19 on the Bulldogs' all-time scoring list and now has 1,301 career points at Fresno State (1,551 career points in collegiate career).

THE GREATEST GAME EVER PLAYED

The Pit was the site of one of the greatest college basketball games ever played. It hosted the 1983 national championship game that saw the NC State Wolfpack upset Hakeem Olajuwon, Clyde Drexler and the Houston Cougars. Coach Jimmy Valvano and the Wolfpack downed the Cougars on a last second put back by Lorenzo Charles. The iconic shot of the late Valvano running onto the court looking for a hug is one of the lasting images in college basketball history.

- Less than 30 of 345 NCAA Division I basketball programs play in a college-only arena named after a business or organization founded or headquartered in its home state.
- The Lobos have averaged an astounding 15,410 fans the past 49 years, an amazing 95% of capacity
- The Pit has ranked in the top 25 in attendance nationally nearly every season since the 1966-67 season with 35 seasons in the top ten in the NCAA in attendance
- Led the Mountain West in attendance in 10 of the conference's 15 years of existence
- The floor is named Bob King Court in honor of the former head coach who led the Lobos from 1963 to 1972.






