ABOUT THE MATCHUP

- The Lobos are set to host Senior Night on Saturday night, honoring seniors JaQuan Lyle and Corey Manigault prior to the 8 p.m. tipoff.
- Saturday's contest marks the only time this season that the Lobos and the Aggies have met.
- Last time the Aggies were in The Pit, on Jan. 26, 2019, the Lobos executed a furious comeback and nearly claimed the win, but it was a later-determined errant back-court call, forcing a Lobo turnover on the potential game-winning possession with 31 seconds left, that allowed Utah State to run out the clock and hit a three with 1.8 seconds left for the two-point win.
- The two teams met three times last season, all Aggie wins, with the last meeting in March the MW Quarterfinals in Las Vegas against second-seeded Utah State. The Aggies earned a 91-83 victory to end the Lobos' season.
- Utah State leads the series 26-11 dating back to February 2, 1952 but the teams have drawn in The Pit, 3-3. In Albuquerque, Utah State is 11-8 over UNM.
- While the Aggies have won the last three straight, UNM is 3-4 over the last seven contests including a pair of back-to-back wins in 2018.
- The Lobos continue to be led by four players averaging in double figures in conference play including redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle (14.5), senior Corey Manigault (13.2), redshirt-junior Vance Jackson (13.1) and redshirt-junior Zane Martin (11.0). Jackson continues to lead in MW rebounding with 5.8 per game.
- The Aggies have three standouts averaging double digits in conference competition including senior MW Preseason Player of the Year Sam Merrill (19.0) and sophomores Neemias Queta (13.0) and Justin Bean (11.6). Bean also leads on the backboard with 9.9 rebounds per game.

PROMOS

Saturday night's game will not only be Senior Night, honoring Lobo seniors JaQuan Lyle and Corey Manigault, but UNM will also be hosting its "Lobos Love Pink" game.

The Lobos have partnered with the UNM Comprehensive Cancer Center to bring awareness to cancer with survivors being honored at halftime.

In addition, there will be special pink giveaways awarded to the first 4,000 people in The Pit on Saturday night.

MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The Aggies return senior Sam Merrill who was named the 2019 Mountain West Player of the Year and also earned the Mountain West Tournament MVP honor. Merrill entered the season tabbed as the 2019-20 MW Preseason Player of the Year.

FLIP-FLOP SEASONS

The Lobos and the Aggies have experienced nearly opposite conference seasons as Utah State kicked off their campaign 2-3 including a three-loss

streak but has gone 10-2 over their last 12 matchups. They boast the longest active win streak in the league at six straight victories, compared to a 4-1 start to MW play for the Lobos and a current five-loss streak for UNM.

A NEW IDENTITY

Head coach Paul Weir in his first two seasons had a squad that lived and died by the three. Last season, UNM posted 15 games in which the Lobos scored 10 3-pointers or more.

Throughout the first 19 games of 2019-20, the Lobos focused their energy on getting the ball inside to the post, and as a consequence posted just one game of 10+ 3-pointers (14 against Grand Canyon on Dec. 17).

In light of recent roster fluctuations, the Lobos have switched up the offense and have again been firing from deep. In five of the last 11 Lobo contests, UNM has registered 10 or more threes.

To put it more simply, the Lobos have registered 10 or more threes just six times this season, five of those six have come in the last 11 contests.

53 STRAIGHT STARTS

Junior Makuach Maluach has started 53 straight games for the Lobos as the only member of the squad that has been a Lobo since the beginning of Paul Weir's tenure.

He has also registered 73 career starts which currently ranks seventh among a list of prolific Lobo starters in the last decade of UNM hoops. Since the 2009-10 season, the following former Lobos occupy the top of the list: Kendall Williams (132), Hugh Greenwood (126), Obij Agert (94), Alex Kirk (86), Sam Logwood (80) and Tony Snell (76).

Maluach's starts are particularly impressive given that in Coach Weir's first two seasons, Lobo starters were based on number of defensive deflections in the previous game and UNM had the highest number of starting lineups in the nation (21) in Weir's first season.

LOBOS IN THE NATION

Below is a look at how the Lobos rank in some of the national stats:

SHOOTING VS DEFENDING

Despite the Lobos' recent struggles in the win-loss column, UNM's offense continues to stand as one of the strongest and most productive in the nation. The Lobos average the 29th-highest field-goal percentage in the nation at 47.1 and average a Mountain-West-leading 77.2 points per game. It's the Lobo defense that has fallen short as UNM ranks second-to-last in the league in field-goal percent defense, allowing opponents to score 75.9 points per game.

MCGEE MINUTES

Redshirt-junior Keith McGee, who averaged 9.1 points per game last season while shooting nearly 41 percent from 3-point range (42-103), has earned 19+ minutes in nine of the Lobos' last 10 games, including a season-high 34 on Feb. 18 against Nevada.

In that time, McGee has scored 10+ points in eight of the 10 contests after doing so just three times earlier this season. In UNM's outing against Fresno State on Feb. 1, McGee posted a season-high 18 points going a UNM career-best 6-for-9 from behind the arc.

MW LEADERS

The Lobos continue to lead the Mountain West in steals per game with 8.0. UNM has also moved back into the top spot in scoring (77.2).

STARTERS RETURNED

Following two missing games to injury followed by a two-game suspension, the Lobos returned redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle to the court on Feb. 8 against Wyoming. Lyle was joined by fellow starter Vance Jackson, who missed five games due to a knee injury.

KUAC BREAKS OUT

Freshman Emmanuel Kuac has earned some playing time as of late, experiencing his breakout contest on Jan. 15 at CSU. In that contest, Lobo coach Paul Weir worked some young talent into the rotation to rack up some minutes and develop.

Kuac burst off the bench with energy and in 12 minutes went 3-for-4 from the floor including 2-for-2 from 3-point range for eight points, three rebounds and one steal. His points also included his first career dunk.

Kuacsaw a career-high 13 minutes against UNLV on Jan. 18, sinking a 3-pointer just 12 seconds after entering the game.

In five of the last six games, he has seen less than 10 minutes, but remains a constant reliver off the bench.

Kuac racked up a career-high 18 minutes on Sunday at Boise State as Coach Weir again mixed up the lineups.

2015-16 followed by 352 as a sophomore in 2016-17 before his arrival at UNM.

MARTIN JOINS THE 1K CLUB

Redshirt-junior Zane Martin is the most recent Lobo to achieve the 1,000-point career mark with his 10-point performance against UNLV on Jan. 18. Martin racked up 815 during his time at Towson. He has so far collected 317 points as a Lobo in his junior season after totaling 180 as a freshman and an outstanding 635 as a sophomore at Towson.

JACKSON BACK ON TOP

Prior to suffering an injury on Jan. 15 at Colorado State, redshirt-junior Vance Jackson had come back out of his shell after finishing last season earning a spot on the Mountain West All-Tournament Team. After starting the first 12 games of the season averaging just 6.2 points per game, Jackson averaged 14.4 points over his last seven contests.

On Jan. 1 at San José State, he registered a season-high 25 points and his first double-double of the season with 13. His 13 rebounds also marked a UNM career high.

He followed up that outstanding performance Jan. 7 vs Fresno State with a new season-high 29 points and 13 rebounds, marking his second straight double-double this season.

In his return from injury on Feb. 8 against Wyoming, Jackson came back in style, registering 20 points as one of three players to score at least 20.

JACKSON FOR THREE

Not only did redshirt-junior Vance

SPEAKING OF FRESHMAN

Sunday's game against Boise State served as an opportunity for several young Lobos to shine, including freshman Kurt Wegscheider who, prior to Sunday afternoon's contest, had accumulated just 33 minutes on the season.

On Sunday he earned his first career start at the point guard position in place of redshirt-junior Zane Martin. Wegscheider racked up a career-high 20 minutes on the floor and scored four points.

PERCY SITS

On Monday at practice, sophomore Tavian Percy suffered a foot injury and will not play on Saturday against Utah State. He is expected to miss the remainder of the season.

TALES OF THE HALF

After falling at Air Force Wednesday the Lobos are currently 13-3 on the season when leading at the half, 5-3 in MW play. The trio of Lobo losses when leading at the break came on Feb. 1 against Fresno State in Fresno, Feb. 15 against UNLV (Lobos led 41-40 at home) and Feb. 26 at Air Force (Lobos led 33-28).

1,000 POINTS

Despite a tough defeat on the road at San José State on New Year's Day, redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle provided a sparkling moment when he reached his 1,000th career point in the contest.

After accumulating 743 points in two seasons at Ohio State, he has added 398 in his brief career on the court as a Lobo to total 1,125 career points so far.

He netted 391 as a Buckeye freshman in

NEW MEXICO NOTES

Jackson register his second straight double-double of the season against Fresno State on Jan. 7, igniting fans who have been waiting for him to rise back to the top, he also racked up a career-high six 3-pointers as he went a near-perfect 6-for-7 from behind the arc.

His 29 points fell just one shy of his career-high 30, which he also achieved against Fresno State last season.

4 STRAIGHT GAMES OF 90+

The Lobos registered at least 90 points in each of their first four wins this season. The last time the Lobos scored in the 90s in four straight games was in Paul Weir's first year toward the end of the season during the Lobos' exciting, unexpected 7-0 run en route to a loss in the Mountain West title contest. In that run, UNM topped Wyoming 119-114, UNLV 91-90, Colorado State 108-87 and Fresno State 95-86.

On Feb. 8 against Wyoming, the Lobos registered their seventh game of the season scoring 90+ points, their first since Houston Baptist on Dec. 22.

MISSING PLAYER

Redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell is expected to remain out of the lineup this week. Per a media statement released Dec. 22 by the UNM Athletic Department, he is being "withheld from competition and team activity until further notice."

LOBO PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

A pair of Lobos have collected a trio of the weekly honors bestowed by the Mountain West this season. Redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle has earned the nod twice while UNM's most recent recipient was redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg.

LOBOS DOWN A POWER 5

The Lobos topped (RV) Wisconsin on Tuesday, Nov. 26 marking the first time UNM earned a win over a Power 5 school since Dec. 5, 2012 when New Mexico topped USC 75-67 in Albuquerque.

UNDEFEATED DECEMBER

The Lobos officially finished December undefeated with a perfect 7-0 record. The last time UNM posted a 7-0

record in December was 2011-12.

LONG NOVEMBER

The Lobos had a long, action-packed November this season. Last season, UNM competed in just five contests in Turkey Month while this season, the Lobos took on eight different regular-season opponents, including 2019 Final Four participant Auburn. Four of those contests were at home while the other four were on a pair of road trips. UNM completed its lengthy November with a 6-2 record.

ABOUT THE 2019-20 LOBOS

Prior to the start of the 2019-20 season, the Lobos featured eight returning letterwinners including three starters. Starters included redshirt-junior Vance Jackson, junior Makuach Maluach and redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr. Joining the trio are senior Corey Manigault, redshirt-junior Keith McGee, sophomore Tavian Percy, redshirt-sophomore Clay Patterson and sophomore Jordan Arroyo.

STARTER STATS

The trio of returning starters from the 2018-19 season return some impressive stats. Jackson collected 13.1 points per game last season to go along with 7.0 rebounds and a 40.5 percent shooting clip. Jackson saw action in all 32 games last season along with Maluach, who started 28 of them. Maluach registered 9.9 points per game while Bragg posted 10.5 points and 8.8 rebounds per contest to go along with shooting 49 percent from the floor.

Lobos Wrap Up Road Play with Narrow Loss at AF

USAFA, Colo. --- Up by five with 2:09 left on the clock, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team was overcome by the Air Force Falcons in the final minutes on Wednesday night to fall by two, 60-58, in Colorado. Air Force, which was playing its final home game of the season, closed the game on an 8-0 run for the win.

With the loss, UNM is now 17-13 on the season, 6-11 in MW play, while Air Force improves to 11-18, 5-12 MW. The Lobos have just one regular-season matchup left, a Senior Night contest against (RV) Utah State on Saturday at 8 p.m. inside Dreamstyle Arena – The Pit.

A Senior Night ceremony honoring JaQuan Lyle and Corey Manigault will take place prior to tipoff.

Trailing by two with the clock about to expire, redshirt-senior Lyle took a corner three for the win but missed. It was sophomore Jordan Arroyo, who logged 23 minutes Wednesday after averaging just 6.8 per game throughout the season, that grabbed the offensive rebound that kept hope alive and gave the Lobos a chance to tie it, but Arroyo's swift putback just bounced off the tip of the rim as the clock expired and the Falcons claimed the 60-58 victory.

"I thought the first 8-10 minutes [of the game] was awful, and really the last 30 was as good as we've played," head coach Paul Weir said. "The guys that were out there ... they were terrific tonight. I'm really happy for Jordan, I thought he was awesome tonight, I thought he made a big impact in both the first and second half."

UNM was led by Lyle, who collected a game-high 18 points, eight rebounds and six assists, followed by redshirt-junior Vance Jackson who racked up 16 points and six boards. The duo marked the only two Lobos to reach double figures on the night that saw seven lead changes and four ties. Arroyo logged a career-high 23 minutes while racking up five rebounds, two points (1-3), one block and one steal.

Air Force had four players score in double figures, all seniors, including a pair that earned double-doubles. Just nine of the Falcons' points came from other players and were spread among three off the bench. Double-doubles came for seniors Ryan Swan (14 points, 11 rebounds) and Sid Tomes (10 points, 10 rebounds) while the squad was led by senior Lavelle Scottie who collected 16 points.

Aggressive on the ball on the night, the Lobos collected 11 steals to just four for the Falcons while Air Force committed 17 turnovers to UNM's 13. Air Force outrebounded UNM 42-32 however, and also amassed 20 assists while both teams shot just over 35 percent from the floor.

Air Force got out to an early 13-point lead at the 11:51 mark in the first half, 20-7, before the Lobo offense began to find its rhythm. UNM cut the deficit to eight, 20-12, and continued to battle for an eventual 9-0 run that made it a two-point game with 5:38 left in the first half.

With 2:43 left, Jackson drove down the court, through the lane and put up a spin move for a layup that tied the game 28-28 before a Lyle fast-break dunk gave the Lobos a two-point lead, 30-28, with 1:41 left. Lyle hit a three before the clock expired to take the UNM advantage to five at the halftime break, 33-28.

UNM closed the half on a 23-8 run over the Falcons.

The teams tied the game three times throughout the second half until the Lobos began to pull away, getting ahead by as many as six points with 6:36 left on another Lyle three. The three came as part of a Lobo hot streak that included a pair of shots from deep from both Jackson and Lyle, marking four in a span of 3:42 to get the Lobo bench fired up with 5:04 left.

It was then that Air Force went on an 8-0 run over the final stretch, including a pair of threes from Tomes over the final 1:08 for the 60-58 final.

The Lobos are set to return to action on leap day, Saturday, Feb. 29, for an 8 p.m. Senior Night matchup against (RV) Utah State on CBS Sports Network.

Utah State Wins Sixth Straight With 94-56 Victory Over San José State on Senior Night

LOGAN, Utah – Utah State's men's basketball team stretched its winning streak to six in a row as the Aggies rolled to a 94-56 Senior Night victory over San José State on Tuesday inside the Dee Glen Smith Spectrum.

Utah State (23-7, 12-5 Mountain West) honored its three seniors, guards Sam Merrill and Diogo Brito, and forward Roche Grootfaam, along with junior guard Abel Porter, prior to the game. Those four Aggies combined for 34 points, 14 rebounds and 14 assists.

USU sophomore center Neemias Queta led all scorers in the game with a season-high 23 points, to go along with 10 rebounds for his third double-double of the year. Sophomore forward Justin Bean notched his 15th double-double of the season with 12 points and 13 rebounds.

Following a tip-in by Queta with 17:34 remaining in the second half, the Aggies led the Spartans 58-16. In fact, Queta was leading SJSU all by himself at that point, 18-16.

In the final home game of his illustrious Aggie career, Merrill had 18 points, seven assists and one rebound. Porter had six points, six rebounds and two assists, while Brito chipped in six points, five rebounds, five assists and two steals.

With his 18 points, Merrill has now scored 2,096 points to rank third all-time in school history behind Jaycee Carroll (2,522) and Greg Grant (2,127). The native of Bountiful, Utah, also ranks fourth all-time in Mountain West history in career scoring.

The only other Aggie to score in double figures was junior forward Alphonso Anderson, who had 11 points and seven rebounds in 18 minutes off the bench.

Seneca Knight, coming off a career-high 37-point outing at Colorado State last Saturday, was held to 13 points on Saturday against USU. Omari Moore and Richard Washington chipped in 12 points apiece for the Spartans (7-22, 3-14 MW), who lost their seventh in a row.

Utah State dominated from start to finish, opening the game by scoring the first 19 points. During that stretch, San José State turned the ball over four times and was 0-for-6 from the field.

The Aggies' 19-0 start to the game was their best since March 1, 2010, when they led 22-0 against Fresno State.

The Spartans finally broke their scoring drought on a jumper by Trey Smith at the 14:05 mark for what proved to be his only basket of the game.

Utah State, which led 51-14 at halftime, shot 48.6 percent from the field (35-of-72), including 47.6 percent from 3-point range (10-of-21). The Aggies, who had 22 assists on 35 baskets, made 66.7 percent of their free throws (14-of-21).

SJSU was cold all night long, shooting just 28.4 percent from the field (19-of-67), including 30.8 percent from beyond the arc (12-of-39). The Spartans made 75.0 percent of their foul shots (6-of-8).

Utah State owned the paint and the glass, outscoring San José State 50-12 down low, and nearly doubling the Spartans on the boards (58-31). The Aggies, who led by as many as 43 on the night, also scored 24 second-chance points.

Winners of nine out of their last 10 games, the Aggies conclude the regular season on the road when they travel to Albuquerque, N.M., to face New Mexico on Saturday, Feb. 29. The game, which is slated to begin at 8 p.m., will be televised live on the CBS Sports Network.

Lobos Eliminated in Mountain West Quarterfinals

LAS VEGAS, Nev. --- In an exciting game that saw 16 ties and 19 lead changes, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team fell to the second-seed Utah State Aggies in the 2019 Mountain West Quarterfinals on Thursday evening by a score of 91-83 in the final minutes to conclude the season. Redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson finished with a game-high 25 points to lead the Lobos.

The contest marks the second straight game Jackson has scored 20 points or more and his fifth straight scoring in double figures. He also racked up five assists and four rebounds on the night while finishing the last five games of his sophomore campaign shooting 17.6 points per game.

The Lobos' strong defensive pressure forced 24 turnovers on the night, a season-most for Utah State. Prior to Thursday night's game, the Aggies were 0-2 when committing at least 20 turnovers and had not turned the ball over 23 times since Feb. 14, 2018 against UNM inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit.

The Lobos collected 12 steals on the night to tie for fifth-most in tournament history. The total marks the second most of the season for UNM after registering 13 against the University of the Southwest. The Lobos were led by senior Anthony Mathis in the category who collected a career-high five in his last game as a Lobo.

UNM came out hot to open the game with a defensive rebound and a fast layup from senior Dane Kuiper to set the tone for the first half. Neither team was able to get ahead by more than three points throughout the entirety of the first half while tying 10 times.

UNM was up by three with seven seconds left until Utah State's Dwayne Brown Jr. hit a jumper and an and-1 to tie it at 39-39 at the break.

The Lobos came out of the half on a 13-5 run that included a pair of threes from Jackson and a pair of jumpers from Bragg, capped by a triple for Mathis to put the Lobos up by eight, 52-44, with 15:10 left.

The three was his first of the night as he finished with three to bring his final season total and the UNM program record to 106.

The Aggies whittled away at the Lobo lead over the next 3:27 to tie it for the 12th time at 57-57 with 11:43 left. UNM went up by four at the 9:49 mark, 65-61 on a pair of free throws from Kuiper, again on a jumper from redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee, 68-64, at the 8:22 mark and again with 6:27 left on an and-1 from junior Corey Manigault, 71-67.

Both teams continued the heartfelt battle until the final tie at 78-78 with 3:13 left when Utah State began to pull ahead. The Aggies made a free throw to get up by one and called a timeout, after which Diogo Brito hit a three to make it a four-point game, 82-78 in favor of the Aggies with 2:26 left.

Manigault hit a pair of free throws to bring the game back within two, but the Lobos would get no closer as Utah State would finish on a slow 9-3 run over the final 1:54 to clinch the victory.

The Lobos fought to the final minutes but it wasn't enough en route to the eight-point final deficit. New Mexico led for 18:57 of the contest compared to 14:44 for Utah State. The score was tied for 6:19.

UNM was outshot 53.2 - 38.9 percent from the field and 46.2 - 34.5 percent from 3-point range. The Lobos did outshoot the Aggies from the stripe, however, going 81.0 percent to 77.8 percent, but Utah State made 35 free throws compared to 17 for UNM.

The Lobos capitalized on their opponent's turnovers, scoring 22 points off of turnovers to just eight for Utah State. The Aggies are set to advance to the Semifinals where they will take on third-seed Fresno State on Friday.

THE GREATEST GAME EVER PLAYED

The Pit was the site of one of the greatest college basketball games ever played. It hosted the 1983 national championship game that saw the NC State Wolfpack upset Hakeem Olajuwon, Clyde Drexler and the Houston Cougars. Coach Jimmy Valvano and the Wolfpack downed the Cougars on a last second put back by Lorenzo Charles. The iconic shot of the late Valvano running onto the court looking for a hug is one of the lasting images in college basketball history.

- The Lobos have averaged an astounding 15,410 fans the past 49 years, an amazing 95% of capacity
- The Pit has ranked in the top 25 in attendance nationally nearly every season since the 1966-67 season with 35 seasons in the top ten in the NCAA in attendance
- Led the Mountain West in attendance in 10 of the conference's 15 years of existence
- The floor is named Bob King Court in honor of the former head coach who led the Lobos from 1963 to 1972.

Men's Basketball Opens Season with 20+ Point Win

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team opened its season with a 21-point victory over Eastern New Mexico on Wednesday evening inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. Five Lobos racked up double figures in the 92-71 win.

The first points of the 2019-20 season came on a steal and a layup when redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell went coast-to-coast to kick off his first outing as a Lobo 1:15 into the first half - and the action didn't stop there. The Lobos debuted at a break-neck speed in their season opener in which the fiery offense shot 60.0 percent from the field.

The Lobos were led by a quiet 16 points from junior Makuach Maluach, who scored seven points in the first half before adding eight more in just the first five minutes of the second half. Maluach was joined in the double-digit club by redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr, redshirt-junior Zane Martin and senior Corey Manigault, each with 13 points apiece, as well as redshirt-junior Keith McGee who posted 12.

The last time the Lobos had five double-digit scorers was against Iona at the start of last season, on Nov. 13, 2018.

In addition to the reliable shooting, the Lobos also saw redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle, who has sat the bench for two years as a Lobo (the first due to NCAA transfer rules, the second due to injury), not only scored nine points to go along with four rebounds, but also racked up an outstanding 11 assists. Lyle regularly found players down-court, firing passes between defenders, much to The Pit crowd's delight.

New Mexico had just one Lobo collect 10+ assists in a game last season, Drué Drinnon on Dec. 30, 2018 against the University of the Southwest. Prior to that, it was former Lobo Antino Jackson, who was known for his knack for the assist, on Feb. 10, 2018 at Air Force.

In fact, Lyle nearly posted the first double-double in points and assists since Jackson did so in that game.

UNM went into the locker room at the half up by 11, 45-34, and shooting 62.1 percent compared to 40.7 percent (11-27) for the Greyhounds. However, Eastern New Mexico was dominating behind the arc, firing at a clip of 50.0 percent compared to 36.4 percent for UNM.

"Offense isn't my concern right now," head coach Paul Weir said. "We need to value the basketball more, which I think [was tonight] a little more careless than it is skill... We have a lot of potential, but I don't think we're going to reach it unless we can find a way to become a good defensive basketball team."

"I think we showed some flashes of it tonight, but obviously not anywhere we want to be, but that's expected."

The teams traded baskets in favor of ENMU, four points to two, throughout the first 1:12 of the second half before the Lobos exploded on a 13-0 run that started with a fast-break layup by Caldwell, included a Lyle 3-pointer and ended with a Maluach free throw for his 16th point at the 15:48 mark.

The run lasted 2:20 and put the Lobos on top by 23 points, a margin that was not relinquished until 2:56 on the clock as the Lobo starters began exiting the game.

UNM got the lead up to as many as 28 points, 81-53 with 8:01 on the clock en route to the 21-point win.

On the night, UNM fired 60 percent from the floor (33-55), 35 percent from 3-point range and 73.1 percent from the stripe. ENMU finished 37.3 percent from the field, 33.3 percent from 3-point range and 65 percent from the free throw line.

Leading the Greyhounds were a pair of double-digit scorers including senior Darius Sawyer (11 points) and junior Iban Zaid (10 points). UNM limited ENMU's returning leading scorer, junior Devin Pullum, to just seven points on the night. Pullum averaged 12.7 points per game last season.

The Lobos return to action on Saturday, Nov. 9 against CSUN at 7 p.m. Last season, UNM opened its campaign on the road in Northridge, claiming the victory on a buzzer-beating three.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team has kicked off the 2019-20 season 2-0 after earning a 27-point victory over the visiting CSUN Matadors inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit on Saturday night by a score of 97-70. The win marks the second 20+ point victory margin for the Lobos as the squad is averaging 94.5 points over its first two games.

In addition, 27 points marks the largest margin of victory for the Lobos over the Matadors in series history. UNM now leads the series 7-0 (5-0 in The Pit) and the victory margin surpasses 17 points set on Dec. 1, 1969, which marked the squads' first ever meeting.

For the second straight game, UNM (2-0) boasted five scorers in double figures including redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle who powered the Lobos offensively with 18 points and five assists. Lyle went 7-for-10 from the floor, 2-for-4 from 3-point range and a perfect 2-for-2 from the free throw line.

Joining Lyle in leading the squad in scoring was redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg (17), senior Corey Manigault (17), redshirt-junior Zane Martin (13) and redshirt-junior Keith McGee. Bragg went 6-for-7 from the floor and 5-for-7 from the stripe. Saturday's game marks the second straight that Bragg, Manigault, Martin and McGee have racked up double figures.

Leading UNM defensively was junior Makuach Maluach who posted a team-high eight rebounds. Eight rebounds is just two away from Maluach's career high of 10. As a squad defensively, the Lobos outrebounded the Matadors 36-30 and forced 16 turnovers which they converted to 26 points.

"It was a step for sure defensively tonight. Probably a bigger one than I even anticipated. (CSUN) is a good team," head coach Paul Weir said. "They play hard, you could see the way they came out. They have good athletes, they made some shots early and got into a bit of a rhythm and fortunately our defense was able to still settle in after that and get enough stops to take a step."

"It's crazy that this isn't really about winning and losing as much as it is about just trusting our process and continuing to grow."

UNM started out hot with an 8-0 run to get out to an early 11-3 lead, however the squads battled throughout the first half until a 9-0 run gave the Lobos some breathing room with a 10-point advantage, 38-28 with 1:48 left in the first half. The Lobos extended the lead to as many as 14, outscoring CSUN (0-2) by a score of 18-3 over 8:47 at the end of the half. CSUN redshirt-junior Lance Coleman II hit a three with five seconds left to make it an 11-point game at the break.

At the half, the Lobos were firing at a clip of 64 percent from the field (16-25) led by Lyle with 11 points going 4-for-6. From behind the arc, UNM shot 37.5 percent in the first half to go along with an 88.9 percent shot from the stripe (8-for-9). CSUN shot 36.4 percent from the floor in the first half, 38.5 percent from behind the arc and 37.5 percent from the foul line.

With momentum in their favor, the Lobos didn't let up in the second half. The relentless Lobo offense opened with a dunk from Bragg just 13 seconds in to make the score 45-32.

UNM held CSUN scoreless for 2:51 en route to a 16-point lead at the 14:22 mark in the second half before a McGee and-1 put the Lobos on top 60-43 in front of a roaring Pit crowd of over 10,000 fans.

The Lobos continued to pile on the points, getting out to as much as a 29-point lead with 1:56 left on the clock before CSUN scored a pair of points for the 27-point final.

On the night, UNM shot 60 percent for the second straight game (36-60) but shot just 37.5 percent from 3-point range (6-16). CSUN improved its shooting percentage to 44.4 percent after the second half in which the squad shot 53.3 percent.

The Matadors were led by a pair of players in double figures including Coleman (19) and junior Terrell Gomez (14).

The Lobos are set to return to action for the third game of their four-game season-opening homestand on Wednesday, Nov. 13 against Green Bay. Tipoff is scheduled for 7 p.m.

Lobos Make it Three in a Row; Top GB 93-78

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- For the third-straight game, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team outscored its opponent by double figures while racking up at least 90 points on Wednesday night with a 93-78 victory over the visiting Green Bay Phoenix. Redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle led the Lobos with a career-high 31 points while fellow redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg Jr. posted his first double-double of the season en route to the victory.

The Lobos (3-0) closed the game in style Wednesday night when, despite head coach Paul Weir shouting to his team not to shoot the ball, the crowd was so loud that the squad couldn't hear the instruction. With 21 seconds left on the clock, the Lobos up by 15 and energy filling The Pit, senior Corey Manigault grabbed a defensive rebound and lobbed the ball to redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell, who drove to the other end and tossed the ball up behind him, where junior Makuach Maluach was waiting.

Maluach leapt from the ground for the dunk that put New Mexico up 17 (93-76) and the Lobo fans roared.

Green Bay (1-2) responded with a fast-break layup with 11 seconds left for the 15-point final.

Lyle's 31 points surpassed his previous career-high of 29, which he achieved as a freshman at Ohio State. The senior went 9-for-16 from the floor including 5-for-9 from behind the arc and a perfect 8-for-8 from the free throw line.

Maluach posted 16 points for the second time this season while shooting almost perfect from everywhere on the court. He made all but one (6-7) field goal attempt while going a perfect 2-for-2 from 3-point range and 2-for-2 from the line.

Bragg's double-double of 11 points and 16 rebounds marks his first since the end of last season. His career high in rebounds is 20, which he collected on March 9 against Wyoming. Bragg has posted 10+ rebounds nine times in his career at UNM but Wednesday marked his first time this season.

As a team, UNM outrebounded the Phoenix 47-38 while forcing 16 turnovers and racking up 20 steals.

The Lobos led by an early five points at the 17:47 mark on a Maluach three before Green Bay flipped the script to go up by four when junior PJ Pipes made a fast break layup to put the Phoenix up four. Pipes helped lead Green Bay tying for a team-high 17 points.

Neither team had a significant advantage until the Lobos embarked on an 8-0 run to take a one-point game to a nine-point game (32-23) with 7:31 left to play in the first half. At the 2:58 mark, McNeese had whittled the Lobo lead back down to one, but another 7-0 run capped by a three from sophomore Tavian Percy made it an eight point game with 1:06 left. The Phoenix scored a last-second layup to make it a six-point game at the half, 49-43.

Despite giving up 43 points in the first half, the Lobos allowed just 35 points in the second half to outscore Green Bay by nine in the frame, 44-35.

The Lobos jumped out with five straight points to kick off the second half including a Maluach layup and a Lyle three to give UNM an 11-point lead. The Phoenix cut it to four at the 15:07 mark but the Lobos soon began to run away with the game.

The second half was highlighted by a 9-0 run, the longest of the game, that put UNM up by 18 points with just 4:30 left. McNeese State got no closer than 13 throughout the remainder of the contest.

Wednesday night's contest was the next-to-last opportunity for fans to see the Lobos before they embark on a long road trip for four road games, not returning to The Pit until Dec. 1. Saturday's 4 p.m. contest against McNeese State will be the last opportunity - not to mention Lobo fans' first chance to purchase NM State single-game tickets.

Game 4 - New Mexico 90, McNeese 80 Nov. 16, 2019 | Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit

Manigault's 24 Powers Lobos Past McNeese, 90-80

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team finished off an exciting game on Saturday afternoon to improve to 4-0 as the Lobos claimed a 90-80 victory over McNeese (1-4) in the final minutes inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. Senior Corey Manigault tied his career-high 24 points in the contest as once again, five Lobos registered double figures on the day.

Manigault went 6-for-8 from the floor, battling in the low post, while scoring 12 more on free throws and posting six rebounds and three steals. The last time he scored 24 points was on Jan. 6, 2018 while at Indian Hills CC.

"I've said it before, I think Corey is the best low-post, left-block scorer I've ever had," head coach Paul Weir said. "For him to get six rebounds, no turnovers and three steals was huge for him. Every day I see him becoming a more impactful player on the floor and to see him finishing out the game is a big testament to how far he's come."

Additional standout performers in the matchup included redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr. who racked up 18 boards and five assists to go along with six points, redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle who collected 18 points, four assists and five rebounds, junior Makuach Maluach (12 points) and redshirt-junior Vance Jackson who registered his first double-digit scoring game of the season (11).

Redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell dishd 10 assists on the day and contributed four steals, filling in key roles off the bench while taking just one shot from the floor.

"When you play with a lot of scorers, you want to get the ball to them when they're in their spots," Caldwell said. "They're essentially our playmakers. I'm an unselfish person so I don't really care about shooting. It doesn't really matter to me as long as we get the win and our scorers are scoring."

With the score tied at 78 apiece with just 2:29 left to play, the Lobos amassed significant momentum, collecting four of their 17 steals in just the final two minutes of the contest.

Manigault put the Lobos up by two, 80-78 with a pair of free throws and then up by four (82-78) with a layup before McNeese's Leondre Washington made a pair from the stripe to cut the deficit back to two (82-80) with 1:10 left on the clock.

The Lobos got the ball back - but quickly turned it over - and it looked as if the Cowboys were about to tie it up again until - a Caldwell steal put the ball back in New Mexico possession with 42 seconds left in front of a roaring crowd. Caldwell quickly fired to Manigault who slammed an emphatic dunk to put UNM back up by four, 84-80.

Weir called a full timeout and the Lobos came out with another steal, this one from Manigault, and Lyle drew the foul to make two more free throws and give UNM a more comfortable, six-point lead (86-80).

A near-brawl under the Lobo basket caused the Cowboys' Kuxhausen to foul out and earned the Lobos four shots on both a technical foul and an intentional foul. Lyle took all four, putting them away for the 90-80 final.

In the final 2:29, UNM went on a 12-2 run with six points coming from Manigault and the other six coming from Lyle. UNM closed the game on an 8-0 run.

McNeese jumped on top early in the contest, leading UNM 10-3 just 1:40 into the first half. The Cowboys extended their lead to 10 at the 16:04 mark and again at the 15:07 mark before the Lobos started to come back.

"I have to tip my hat to McNeese, I thought they played terrific tonight," Weir said. "They made a ton of great shots, a lot of high-percentage shots... This team was a good test for us and I think we needed a game like that. Hopefully in the long run, games like this will serve us well."

New Mexico went on an 11-2 run to make it a one-point game, 19-18 McNeese, at the 11:48 mark before a pair of free throws put the Cowboys up three.

Redshirt-junior Keith McGee tied the game at the 10:20 mark on a dunk, assisted by Caldwell, before redshirt-junior Vance Jackson gave the Lobos their first lead on a pair of free throws, 25-23, with 8:27 left in the first half.

Jackson, who has been quiet so far this season, hit a three with 4:49 left in the half to put the Lobos ahead by two en route to a five-point Lobo advantage at the half.

On the day, McNeese outshot the Lobos 50.0 percent to 47.5 percent from the floor. The Lobos shot just 43.8 percent in the first half but followed it up with 51.9 percent in the second half. The Cowboys also outshot UNM from three as they went 44.8 percent from behind the arc compared to 40 percent for the Lobos.

UNM outscored the Cowboys in the paint, however, by a commanding margin (40-28), as well as in second-chance points (18-9), fast-break points (32-10) and points off the bench (43-23).

The Lobos are set to hit the road for a pair of road trips, the first will feature a contest against UTEP on Tuesday, Nov. 19, in El Paso before the Lobos take on in-state rival NM State on Thursday, Nov. 21 at 7 p.m.

Lobos Suffer First Loss at Buzzer in El Paso

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team suffered its first loss of the season on the road at UTEP on Tuesday night when JaQuan Lyle last-second score just barely missed the buzzer. The Lobos fell 66-63 in the contest that had eight ties and 6:53 of tied ball game.

With the loss, UTEP remains undefeated (4-0) while the Lobos post their first blemish of the season, slipping to 4-1.

In the first half, both teams were shooting below 40 percent from the field with a 30-30 halftime score and it was obvious the long-time rivals were going to have a defensive battle.

"I thought [UTEP's] defense was really good," head coach Paul Weir said. "We left some points... around the rim and some layups and left some points at the free throw line as well on our end. But I don't want to take away from UTEP's defense. I thought they were very physical and played us really well, especially to start the game."

The squads went through seven possessions to kick off the contest that included three turnover/steal combos before a single point was scored. The first point of the matchup didn't come until the 15:21 mark when redshirt-junior Vance Jackson notched a free throw, his first of four points on the night.

Following the slow offensive start, UTEP began to pile on the points, holding the Lobo offense at the other end. The Miners went on a 10-0 run following the free throw to make it 10-1 at the 14:38 mark. UNM senior Corey Manigault fired off a pair of free throws to end the run and make it a seven-point game (10-3) before the Lobo offense started to find a rhythm.

UNM came back on a 9-0 run over 1:47 to tie the game 10-10 at the 12:24 mark. The run included Manigault's free throws and a pair of threes, the first from junior Makuach Maluach, the second from redshirt-senior Lyle.

At one point late in the second half, Maluach was a perfect 4-for-4 from the floor, 2-for-2 from 3-point range and 1-for-1 from the stripe. The junior finished 4-for-6 on the night including a 2-for-3 mark from the field for a total of 11 points, four rebounds and two steals.

Lyle finished with a game-high 19 points on the night following his Mountain West Player of the Week honor for his performance last week. He also posted eight rebounds, second-most on the team, and a team-high four assists.

UTEP jumped back out on top with a pair of free throws by sophomore Efe Odigie, who finished second on the Miner squad in points with 12. UTEP built a six-point lead with 5:52 left in the first half before a 6-0 Lobo run tied it at 24 apiece. The run included a Maluach and-1 to make it a three-point game (24-21), a jumper by redshirt-junior Zane Martin and a free throw from Lyle, 24-24.

The squads went back and forth for the remaining 2:40 of the first half and the Lobos got on top by two Lyle free throws with eight seconds left, but an Odigie layup at the last second marked the fifth tie of the game for the 30-30 halftime score.

At the break, both teams combined for 17 turnovers of which UNM capitalized for 14 points while UTEP collected 10.

UNM shot 36.4 percent from the floor at the half (8-22) and 33.3 percent from 3-point land (3-9) while leaving five points at the charity stripe (11-16, 68.8 percent). UTEP just barely outshot the Lobos from the floor at 37.9 percent but shot worse from three (26.7 percent, 4-for-15). The Miners did however, make 4-of-5 free throws for an 80 percent mark from the line.

The second half started out with a quick UTEP three in just the first 19 seconds of the frame, but Maluach matched it just 18 seconds later for the sixth tie of the match, 33-33. A 6-0 UTEP run made it 39-33 at the 17:09 mark before the Lobos again whittled away, making it a two-point game just 3:18 later.

Neither team was able to gain more than a four-point advantage throughout the remainder of the contest and it was the home team that had a one-point edge with 1:53 left on the clock.

A dunk from Martin put the Lobos ahead by one with 53 seconds left, 63-62, but it was followed by a jumper from UTEP's Jordan Lathon 26 seconds later to put the Miners back up by one, 64-63.

With three seconds left, Maluach attempted a three for the lead from the right wing but missed and Coach Weir called his full timeout. A Lyle foul to stop the clock allowed UTEP's Bryson Williams to score a pair of free throws for a three-point Miner advantage before Weir called a 30-second timeout with 1.1 left on the clock.

Martin threw the ball in from under the basket, finding Lyle at half court, Lyle collected the ball, dribbled a step, and fired - making the long three. But upon review, the shot did not leave Lyle's hands in time and 66-63 was the final.

Three Lobos scored in double figures on the night including Lyle (19), Maluach (11) and redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg (10). Bragg also led all players in rebounding with nine.

UTEP was led by grad student Daryl Edwards (18), Odigie (12), Lathon (10) and redshirt-sophomore Souley Boum (10).

On the night, the Miners outshot UNM 42.9 - 38.8 percent from the field and 84.6 - 64.5 percent from the free throw line. The Lobos edged UTEP from 3-point range, 26.3 percent to 25.0 percent. UNM also rebounded the Miners 36-31 and registered 26 points off of turnovers compared to 21 for UTEP.

The Lobos will get just one day of rest before taking on another long-time rival, NM State, in Las Cruces on Thursday. The squads are set to face off at 7 p.m. Thursday night at the Pan American Center.

Lobos Down Aggies in 78-77 Thriller on the Road

LAS CRUCES, N.M. --- For the first time in head coach Paul Weir's tenure, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team claimed a victory over in-state rival NM State in a thrilling fashion on Thursday night. The contest came down to the final possession and the Lobos took the win 78-77 on the road.

The Lobo victory snaps a five-win streak for the Aggies (2-3) and also marks the first time the Lobos (5-1) have won in Las Cruces since Nov. 15, 2015 when UNM claimed an 83-74 victory. UNM also improves to 122-101 over the Aggies in series history with the win.

The Aggies have suffered just 13 losses at home in the Pan American Center since the 2011-12 season and six of those have come at the hands of the Lobos.

Redshirt-junior JaQuan Lyle once again led the Lobo squad with 24 points on the night going 9-for-14 from the floor, 2-for-5 from three and 4-for-5 from the free throw line. He also posted a pair of assists and three steals. Redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr. also scored in double figures, registering 14 points on the night to go along with six rebounds and a game-high four steals. He also had the only block on the night.

Thursday night's rebound leader was redshirt-junior Vance Jackson who nearly racked up a double-double with seven rebounds and nine points. Two other players collected nine points including junior Makuach Maluach and redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell.

With seven ties and 12 lead changes, Thursday night's contest was truly a rivalry battle. The Lobos started out strong with a quick four points but the Aggies roared back to get on top by as many as nine midway through first half before the Lobos chipped the NM State lead back to two with 4:03 left in the half. UNM outscored the Aggies 12-5 over 5:11 and capped the run with a Lyle three before the final media timeout of the first half.

Over the final minutes of the first frame, the Lobos kept playing catchup with NM State, which couldn't get more than a four-point advantage. A jumper by redshirt-junior Zane Martin with just 23 seconds left made it a two-point game at the half, 39-37 Aggies.

Both teams came out of the locker room on a mission in the second half. NM State's largest lead was five just 1:39 into the half but over the next two minutes, an 8-2 Lobo run put UNM up by one, 47-46, on a fast-break layup by Maluach. The play marked the first time the Lobos had led since 2:44 into the contest.

NM State quickly took the lead back on a senior Terrell Brown three with 16 minutes left and UNM didn't regain the lead again until the 11:41 mark when Bragg made a layup to make it 56-54 Lobos.

The game remained tight as neither team led by more than four for the remainder of the contest. UNM got out to a four-point lead on a 7-0 run that was sparked by a three from redshirt-junior Keith McGee and four straight points in the paint by senior Corey Manigault, 67-63 Lobos.

The squads tied the contest three more times, including on a fast-break jumper from Caldwell with just 1:33 left to play, 75-75.

Caldwell was fouled on the play and made the and-1 to put the Lobos back up by one, 76-75, and that's when things got interesting.

The Aggies went back up by one with 1:17 left, but the next 28 seconds were full of fouls and game stoppage before Bragg hit a pair of free throws to give the Lobos another one-point advantage, 78-77.

Throughout the final 43 seconds, the Lobo defense battled on the Aggie end of the court, forcing a pair of turnovers while committing two of its own. The referees continued to review the plays and possession changed back and forth. Just as the Lobos looked to head down court for a chance at extending the lead, the Aggies would get the ball back for another chance at the win.

The Lobo defense however, kept the Aggies from getting off a good shot, without fouling, and NM State senior Shunn Buchanan attempted a 3-point buzzer beater and missed for the 78-77 final.

On the night, the Lobos outshot the Aggies from the floor 53.8 percent to 43.8 percent. The Lobos also outperformed the Aggies from 3-point range 27.6 percent (4-15) to 21.2 percent (7-33).

Both teams collected seven steals, NM State registered 17 assists to UNM's 10 and the Aggies outrebounded UNM 37-29.

UNM led for just 6:31 of the contest before delivering the loss in the final minutes.

The Lobos are set to return to action on Monday, Nov. 25 and Tuesday, Nov. 26 in Brooklyn New York for the 2019 Roman Legends Classic presented by Old Trapper. The Lobos will kick off play in New York against 2019 Final Four participant (and currently undefeated) Auburn on Monday before taking on either Wisconsin or Richmond Tuesday.

Lobos Overwhelmed by No. 18/19 Auburn in Semifinal

BROOKLYN, N.Y. --- Despite a strong start against undefeated, No. 18/19 Auburn on Monday night, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team (5-2) suffered an 84-59 loss to the Tigers (6-0) in the semifinal round of the 2019 Roman Legends Classic presented by Old Trapper at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn. The contest had three lead changes before the Tigers ran away with the game.

With the loss, UNM will take on Wisconsin, which is also receiving votes in the latest Associated Press poll, on Tuesday evening at 5 p.m. ET (3 p.m. MT) in the consolation game. Wisconsin (5-2) fell to Richmond on Monday by a final score of 62-52.

Neither team shot particularly well on the night as the Lobos finished the contest shooting just 40.3 percent from the floor compared to 42.1 percent for the Tigers. Auburn did however, collect 12 3-pointers (of 38 fired from behind the arc) while the Lobos collected just four, including a pair from redshirt-junior Vance Jackson.

UNM's best scoring run of 8-0 came twice, once in the first half and the second beginning at the 13:24 mark of the second half. After heading into the locker room down 35-24 at halftime, the Lobos attempted a comeback in the second half that was sparked by a dunk by redshirt-junior Keith McGee to make it a 25-point game (56-31).

McGee's spark was followed by layups by Jackson, redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell and another pair of points for McGee to make the game an 18-point contest before Auburn again picked up steam.

McGee was the story of the second half as he collected all 13 of his points and radiated positivity on the court to try to rally the Lobos in the final minutes.

In the final six minutes, both teams were trading dunks on possessions and McGee scored seven straight points for UNM starting with an alley-opp from Caldwell and adding an emphatic dunk followed by a three with 4:05 left. The energy sparked another Jackson three and also one from freshman Kurt Wegscheider, but the burst was not enough as UNM ultimately dropped the contest by 25 points.

Leading UNM on the night was junior Makuach Maluach who was a consistent presence on the court for UNM. Maluach notched 14 points as one of three Lobos to hit double figures. He went 5-for-7 from the floor and a perfect 4-for-4 from the free throw line while missing just one 3-point attempt.

McGee was second in scoring for UNM with 13 points followed by Jackson who registered his second double-figure game of the season with 10. Jackson also led the Lobos in rebounding in his 25 minutes on the court, racking up eight.

Auburn was powered by four Tigers in double figures including senior Samir Doughty who collected 19 while senior Austin Wiley posted the only double-double on the night with 14 points and 13 rebounds before fouling out with 2:37 left. Lobo redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr. also fouled out of the contest after collecting seven boards.

Auburn converted 28 points off of 24 Lobo turnovers while UNM collected just six steals on the night.

New Mexico is set to return to action in the consolation contest on Tuesday, Nov. 25 against (RV) Wisconsin at 5 p.m. ET (3 p.m. MT). The game will be broadcast live on ESPN2.

Lobos Take Down Wisconsin in Brooklyn, 59-50

BROOKLYN, N.Y. --- Following a disappointing defeat against No. 18/19 Auburn on Monday night, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team rebounded with a victory over (RV) Wisconsin on Tuesday in the Lobos' first win over a Power 5 team since 2012. Redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle led UNM with 14 points as one of four Lobos to register double figures as UNM topped the Badgers 59-50.

The contest wraps up the 2019 Roman Legends Classic presented by Old Trapper in New York. With the win, UNM improves to 6-2 while the Badgers slip to 4-3.

Along with Lyle's 14 points, a trio of Lobos racked up 12 apiece including redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg as well as redshirt-juniors JJ Caldwell and Zane Martin. Lyle also led UNM in rebounds with a season-high nine boards, followed by Bragg who posted six and Caldwell who collected five.

Caldwell's 12 points marked a new season high and along with his and Martin's dozen, the pair also registered the most assists on the court with three apiece as UNM had 13 assists while forcing 14 turnovers.

UNM led for 31:48 of the contest, leading 29-20 at the half, marking the second-lowest point total for the Lobos in a half this season. It was the Lobos' first-half advantage that won the game as both squads racked up an even 30 points in the second.

The Lobos started out strong in the first half getting out to an early four-point lead on a 3-pointer by redshirt-junior Vance Jackson at the 14:50 mark (9-5). The Badgers closed the gap and took a one-point lead (14-13), but the Lobos embarked on a 7-0 run with 6:47 left in the first half, sparked by a Bragg layup. Caldwell, who is typically the assist specialist on the squad, hit a jumper followed by a Lyle three to put the Lobos up by six, 20-14.

The Lobo advantage frazzled the Badger defense and UNM continued to pile on the points with another 7-0 run kicked off by a Caldwell triple (23-16). UNM got the advantage up to 11 twice in the final seconds of the first frame, the largest lead of the game, before the 29-20 first-half score. The Lobos outscored Wisconsin 16-6 over the final 6:47 of the first half.

The Lobos shot 44.4 percent from the field compared to 38.9 percent for the Badgers in the first half.

The Badgers whittled the score as close as three twice in the second half, but UNM never relinquished the lead.

On the night, the Lobos outshot Wisconsin 44.0 - 34.0 percent from the field including a 23.1 - 7.7 percent advantage from 3-point range. The Lobo defense held the Badgers to just two threes on the night out of 26 fired from behind the arc.

Wisconsin was led by junior Nate Reuvers who registered 16 points going 7-for-9 from the floor with five rebounds. Just one other Badger racked up double digits, redshirt-junior D/Mitrik Trice, who scored 11 with a team-high seven boards.

After a long road trip that included four tough contests, the Lobos will return to action inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit on Sunday, Dec. 1 against Montana at 1 p.m. The game will be broadcast on AT&T SportsNet.

Lobos Remain Undefeated at Home; Top Montana 72-63

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team extended its unbeaten streak at home to 5-0 on Sunday afternoon with a 72-63 win over the Montana Grizzlies. The Lobos were powered by a 20-point, 14-rebound effort from redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr. in his second double-double of the season.

With the win, the Lobos improve to 7-2 on the season while the Grizzlies drop to 3-5 overall. Montana's losses this season include Sunday's game against UNM, as well as Stanford, Arkansas and No. 25 Washington.

On the night, the Lobos were edged in field goal percentage 43.1 - 43.3 but fired at a clip of 46.2 percent from behind the arc while holding the Griz to just 31.8 percent from three. UNM outrebounded Montana 43-31 while turning the ball over just nine times, marking UNM's lowest turnover total of the season.

The first half of Sunday's contest was one heavy on defensive effort as neither team reached double digits through the first 7:34. In fact, the Lobos went scoreless for 6:56 before Bragg registered a pair of free throws to make it a two-point game, 10-8, in favor of Montana.

"What's been best [about Bragg] has been his free throw shooting," head coach Paul Weir said. "To have a big of his size, that you can feel confident with every time he goes to the free throw line is a great benefit to the program and our team. Today he was [also] finishing around the rim terrific and [had a big block]."

Three minutes and nine seconds after snapping UNM's cold spell from the floor, Bragg was found behind the arc by redshirt-junior Zane Martin, who collected 11 points of his own on the night, and Bragg sunk his first career 3-pointer to spark a 9-0 run that included back-to-back-back threes by not only Bragg, but also sophomore Tavian Percy and redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle.

The burst of energy and points took UNM from trailing by four to leading by five, 19-14 at the 6:51 mark of the first half. UNM would not relinquish the lead for the remainder of the half.

The Lobos traded quick threes with Montana as freshman Josh Vazquez, who posted 16 points on the day, followed Lyle's three but on the next possession, redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell knocked one down from 3-point range to keep it a five-point game, 22-17 Lobos.

It was Bragg that gave UNM its largest leads of the half with a layup at the 4:54 mark for a seven-point Lobo advantage, 24-17, and again with just 50 seconds left when he hit a pair from the stripe. He pushed the Lobo lead to eight to cap an 8-0 run, 32-24. Montana hit a jumper with 25 seconds left to end the half on an 8-2 Lobo run for the 32-26 score at the break.

Montana came out of the locker room with a pair of free throws at the 19:06 mark to make it a four-point game, 32-28, before junior Makuach Maluach, who had a quiet first half, scored five straight for UNM. Maluach hit a fast-break three to make it a seven-point game, followed with a dunk, his third of the season, to put the Lobos up by nine.

Montana reclaimed the lead just once more with 8:59 left on the clock when redshirt-senior Kendal Manuel hit a three to put the Griz up by one, 50-49. The lead was short-lived however as Bragg hit yet another pair of free throws to put UNM up for good, 51-50 with 8:35 left to play.

UNM continued to add to the lead and eventually got out to a 10-point advantage, the largest lead of the game, with 1:09 left when Martin hit a free throw to make it 69-59 en route to the nine-point, 72-63 final.

Bragg went 9-for-11 from the free throw line and 5-for-8 from the floor on his way to leading UNM with his 20 points. He was followed by Lyle who registered 16 points and three assists. Martin was the third Lobo to collect double figures with 11 while Caldwell led UNM with five assists and three steals.

Montana was led by senior Sayeed Priddgett who posted 25 points, 10 rebounds and five assists along with Vazquez who notched 16 points.

The Lobos are set to return to action Wednesday, Dec. 4 when they kick off Mountain West play with a 7 p.m. contest against Boise State inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit.

Lobos Extend Home Win Streak to 6-0

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- Behind a career-high tying 31 points from redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team earned a thrilling 80-78 victory over Boise State in UNM's earliest conference opener in Mountain West history on Wednesday. With the victory, the Lobos extend their unbeaten streak at home to 6-0 and improve to 8-2 on the season.

The 8-2 start marks the best 10-game start since the 2012-13 season when the Lobos went 10-0 through the first 10 contests, eventually stretching the streak to 12.

The last time the Lobos were 6-0 at home was in the 2016-17 season when UNM ultimately went 7-0 before failing. Prior to that, it was a 9-0 streak in 2010-11.

With the victory, the Lobos improve to 12-5 in the series (7-2 in The Pit) and the contest marks the third straight game with the Broncos (4-3) that has been decided by one possession. Last season, UNM won 73-72 on Senior Night and in the previous meeting, it was Boise State that came out on top 73-71 on Feb. 2, 2018 - all three contests were in Albuquerque.

Wednesday night's exciting contest was a back-and-forth battle that resulted in 10 ties and 17 lead changes while UNM led for just 10:38.

After a first half that ended deadlocked at 39-39, the Lobos turned up the energy in the second half and battled for a four-point advantage (53-49) on a dunk by senior Corey Manigault in the 13:47 mark before getting out to a five-point lead on a layup from redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr. with 10:16 left to play.

Bragg smashed a dunk and a layup within 39 seconds to keep The Pit crowd roaring and extend the Lobo lead.

The squads tied the score again at 68-68 with just 5:35 left on a Lyle free throw that marked the start of 10 straight Lobo free throws over the final stretch (11 total).

With the score 68-68, Boise State's RJ Williams, who is one of three Broncos to average scoring in double figures on the season, committed a personal foul under the Bronco basket. After exchanging words with Bragg, the pair received a double-technical foul, followed by another technical, to eject Williams and award Bragg a pair of free throws. Bragg made both, going 5-for-7 on the night from the stripe, to put UNM up by two, 70-68.

The fouls also put the Lobos in the double bonus with 2:46 left to play.

Lyle was awarded two more shots with just 15 seconds left as he gave the Lobos a four-point advantage, 72-68 with 4:53 left.

Boise State got back on top 76-73 with 2:28 on the clock but the Lobos tied it back up 76-76 with a pair of free throws from Bragg and one from Lyle before Lyle put UNM back up by one (77-76) with his second of a pair with just 1:02 left.

Bragg put the Lobos back on top by just one with a layup in the paint with 34 seconds on the clock (79-78) and the clock wound down to three seconds left with the Lobos still holding the advantage.

Boise State attempted a go-ahead three on a right corner three from senior Alex Hobbs, who collected 14 points on the night, but the shot missed and Lobo redshirt-junior Zane Martin collected the defensive rebound and was fouled with 2.1 seconds left.

Martin made one of his two from the stripe to put UNM up by two (80-78) and Boise State attempted to fire the ball down court where Caldwell intercepted it, but went out of bounds. After official review, 0.9 seconds were put back on the clock and the Broncos called their final timeout to attempt one last shot, a corner three from leading-scorer Justinian Jessup (24 points). The shot missed its target for the 80-78 final.

On the night, UNM turned the ball over just six times marking a season low.

New Mexico is set to return to action on Saturday, Dec. 7 at 2 p.m. for its second Mountain West contest on the road in Laramie, Wyoming.

Game 11 - New Mexico 79, Wyoming 65 Dec. 7, 2019 | Arena - Auditorium

Lobos Top Wyoming 79-65 on the Road

LARAMIE, Wyo. --- For the third time in the last four contests, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team (9-2, 2-0 MW) held its opponent to less than 30 points in the first half on Saturday afternoon and used the 11-point halftime advantage to claim a 14-point victory over the Wyoming Cowboys (3-7, 0-2 MW) on Saturday afternoon. UNM topped Wyoming 79-65 as redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr. registered his third double-double of the season, his second in the last three games.

Senior Corey Manigault led the Lobo scoring effort with 18 points to go along with seven rebounds while redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell nearly posted a triple-double on the day with eight points, 10 rebounds and nine assists. Redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle collected 13 points while junior Makuach Maluach added 12.

Bragg, who collected a double-double at Arena-Auditorium last season as well (22 points, 20 rebounds), posted 15 points and 15 boards on the day to go along with three blocks and one steal.

Saturday's win marks the seventh time in the last eight seasons that the Lobos have kicked off conference play 2-0 and the second time in the last three meetings that UNM has earned a victory at Wyoming. UNM improves to 25-42 inside Arena-Auditorium with Saturday's win.

The Lobos outshot the Cowboys 48.3 percent to 37.5 percent from the floor while tying their season-high 47 rebounds and limiting Wyoming to just 29 boards, the third least the Lobos have allowed this season.

UNM kicked the contest off with the first basket from Bragg before extending the early lead to five, 8-3, on a Maluach layup at the 15:12 mark.

Wyoming tied it up with 9:02 left in the first half 10-10 before the Lobos used a 7-0 run, sparked by a Maluach layup to make it 17-10 Lobos with 7:39 left in the half. UNM extended its lead to 10 on a clutch three from sophomore Tavian Percy to make it 22-12 UNM.

Just 2:32 later, Manigault slammed an alley-oop from Caldwell at the 2:47 mark to make it a 15-point game, 32-17.

The Cowboys closed the first half on a 4-0 run for the 32-21 halftime score.

Bragg had collected a game-high nine rebounds at the halfway mark while Manigault led all scorers on the court with nine, followed by Maluach with eight.

The Lobos maintained the double-digit lead until the 15:11 mark when redshirt-sophomore and Saturday's leading scorer Hunter Maldonado registered a three with 14:55 on the clock to make it a nine-point game, 46-37.

The rally was short-lived, however. Nearly five minutes later, Lobo junior Vance Jackson, who finished last season averaging 13.1 points per game but has struggled so far this season to heat up from the floor, nailed a three to give UNM a 17-point advantage on the back of a 6-0 Lobo run that included a three from redshirt-junior Zane Martin.

The Lobos continued to pile on the points, getting out to as much as a 20-point lead with just 4:04 left (71-51) before the Cowboys started chipping away for the 14-point final, 79-65.

Wyoming was led by Maldonado who registered 27 points going 10-for-18 from the floor, 4-for-5 from three and 3-for-5 from the stripe. He also tied for the Cowboys' most rebounds with six.

The Lobos return to non-conference play on Saturday, Dec. 14 when they host the NM State Aggies in game two of the 2019-20 Rio Grande Rivalry, UNM topped NM State in Las Cruces on Nov. 21 by one, 78-77. The Lobos and the Aggies tip off on AT&T SportsNet inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit at 5 p.m. Saturday.

Game 12 - New Mexico 69, NM State 62 Dec. 14, 2019 | Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit

Make it a Sweep! Lobos Top Aggies 69-62 in The Pit

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- For the first time since the 2015-16 season, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team earned a sweep over in-state rival NM State, capping this season's series with a 69-62 victory inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit on Saturday evening in front of over 14,000 fans. The win marked the fifth straight for the Lobos and UNM extended its home win streak to 7-0.

The Lobos (10-2) earned the first win over the Aggies this season on Nov. 21 in Las Cruces by a score of 78-77 before claiming the sweep on Saturday. With the loss, NM State is now 6-6 overall on the season while the Lobos continue their best start since 2012-13 when UNM went 12-0 to open its campaign.

Redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr., on his birthday, racked up his fourth double-double of the season, his third in the Lobos' last four games, with 17 points and 17 rebounds. He drew a game-high 10 fouls and went 9-for-10 from the stripe to go along with a 4-for-5 mark from the floor. Bragg also collected four steals, an assist and a block on the evening.

"[Bragg's] offensive rebounding is at the professional level and it really changes the game for us," head coach Paul Weir said. "His running of the floor has always been terrific and having JaQuan and the other guys find him in transition resulted in some really amazing finishes. He's a great player who makes some very athletic, agile plays."

It was Bragg and classmate JaQuan Lyle who led UNM as Lyle finished with 16 points for his 10th game of the season registering double figures.

"It felt amazing to actually be a part of the win rather than sitting and watching like I did last year," Bragg said. "This win was amazing and it was definitely one of the best games I've ever played in."

While the Aggies outshot UNM 43.6 - 42.0 percent and outrebounded 35-33, UNM still persevered. The Aggies slowly built a six-point lead, 12-6, at the 13:35 mark before the Lobos tore away on a 10-1 run to take a three-point lead, 16-13, within four minutes. The run started with a Lyle jumper and a dunk by senior Corey Manigault before redshirt-junior Keith McGee put the Lobos on top with a layup under the basket, 14-13.

The Aggies pulled back ahead by one within 56 seconds, 17-16 before it was McGee again that put the Lobos back on top. NM State had the lead for just another 19 seconds before McGee drained a three to put the Lobos back on top, 19-17 - and the Lobo crowd went wild.

NM State's Jabari Rice, who entered the game second on the Aggies in scoring with 13.0 points per game, hit a pair of threes and a layup intermixed with a few Lobo free throws to put NMSU back up by seven with just 12:01 left in the half, but UNM battled back again with five straight points over the stretch. Junior Makuach Maluach nailed a jumper before Lyle knocked down one a three to make it a two-point game at the break, 33-31 Aggies.

UNM has entered halftime trailing just three times this season, and has now won two of those contests.

In the second half, the Lobos heated up and took off as they extended their 5-0 run at the end of the first half to a 10-0 run on a three by redshirt-junior Vance Jackson, 36-33 Lobos.

UNM continued the run until it was eventually 17-4 over 6:32. The exciting Lobo run was capped by a pair of back-to-back massive Bragg dunks, forcing NM State head coach Chris Jans to call a timeout, Lobos leading by seven, 42-37.

The Aggies tied the game again with 12:46 left on an open three by senior Trevelin Queen, who was coached by current UNM director of operations Ralph Davis at NM State prior to his arrival at NM State. Queen entered the game leading the Aggies in scoring with 14.9 points on the season and finished with a game-high 19 points on Saturday.

Queen hit another from 3-point range just 45 seconds later to give NM State its last lead of the matchup before the Lobos overtook them again on another McGee three with 10:16 left. UNM never again relinquished the lead and pushed it to as many as nine twice over the final 10 minutes. NM State called all of its timeouts and fouled through the end as UNM posted its last 10 points on free throws.

On the evening, UNM outshot the Aggies 82.1 - 40.0 percent from the free throw line, marking the highest percentage from the stripe this season. The Lobos led for 19:42, just edging NMSU's 16:48.

New Mexico is set to continue its four-game home stand with a quick contest on Tuesday, Dec. 17 when the Lobos host Grand Canyon at 7 p.m. MT.

Game 16 - New Mexico 85, San José State 88 Jan. 1, 2020 | Provident Credit Union Event Center Late Energy Burst Too Late, Lobos Fall at SJSU

SAN JOSE, Calif. --- Despite a 14-point lead in the first half, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team (13-3, 2-1 MW) dropped a narrow, three-point final to the San José State Spartans (5-10, 1-2 MW) on the road on Wednesday. Despite the outcome, UNM had a pair of 25-point scorers including redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle who registered his 1,000th career point in the contest.

The loss marks just the third to the Spartans in program history and the second straight on the road in the series. It also marks just the third Lobo New Year's Day loss in straight on history and snaps an eight-win streak that started Nov. 26 against Wisconsin.

It was Lyle and redshirt-junior Vance Jackson who led UNM with 25 points apiece while Jackson also posted a UNM career-high 13 rebounds for his first double-double of the season, his sixth as a Lobo. The pair combined for 20 points over the final stretch as the Lobos nearly executed an 18-point comeback to win in the final seconds.

Lyle also nearly posted a double-double in points and assists as he dished eight on the night while collecting a team-high three steals. The pair were joined in the double-digit scoring club by senior Corey Manigault (15 pts, 7 rebs) and redshirt-sophomore Vante Hendrix (13 pts, 5 rebs).

After a close first five minutes of the matchup, the Lobos exploded on a 17-2 run over 4:12 that put UNM up 23-9 at the 13:09 mark, but the Spartans rallied back with a 17-3 run to tie it up just 3:43 later, 26-26, with 9:26 left to play in the half. The squads battled and with the score tied 33-33 with 5:14 left in the first frame, it was SJSU that again broke free, finishing the last five minutes on a 13-3 run for a 10-point Lobo halftime deficit.

The Spartans led 46-36 at the break marking just the second time this season UNM has trailed by 10 or more at the break, the first was against Auburn on Nov. 25.

Despite being down by 10 at the half, UNM was outshooting SJSU from the floor 48.3 - 45.9 percent however, the Spartans had capitalized on 10 Lobo turnovers, converting 20 points, compared to just three points on just two SJSU turnovers in the first half. UNM left seven points on the free throw line, shooting 41.7 percent (5-12) through the first half from the stripe.

San José State increased its lead to as much as 18 points with 12:46 left to play before the Lobos began chipping away at the Spartan lead. It was at the 8:03 mark that a Manigault dunk made it a single-digit game, 68-59, and the Lobos' fighting spirit returned.

A pair of Jackson free throws with just less than seven minutes on the clock again made it a single-digit game (eight points) and a Lyle layup made it seven (72-65) before SJSU jumped back out by 13 with 5:17 left.

It was in the final 2:17 that the Lobos really turned on the gas.

SJSU led by 10 points on a jumper by senior Brae Ivey before Jackson and Hendrix nailed back-to-back threes to make it a four-point game, 84-80, with 1:07 left, sparking the Lobo bench and Lobo fans in attendance.

The threes kicked off an eventual 11-0 run that included a pair of Lyle free throws with 1:01 on the clock and a Martin layup to tie it up at 84-84 with less than 15 seconds left, causing SJSU to call a timeout.

Martin drew a foul in the paint and was awarded the and-one, which he made to put UNM up for the first time since the 5:14 mark in the first half, 85-84.

The Lobo defense attempted to retain the lead, but the breakout shooter of the night, junior Richard Washington, who headed into the contest averaging 7.4 points per game, sunk his seventh 3-pointer of the night to put SJSU back up by two, 87-85, with eight seconds left and the Lobos took a full timeout.

UNM reclaimed possession and hoped to reclaim the lead, but a fast dribble down the court with three seconds left resulted in another UNM turnover, kicked out of bounds, and the ball was given back to the Spartans, up by two.

An intentional Lobo foul to stop the clock allowed Ivey to register one more from the stripe to make it 88-85 and the Spartans took their final timeout, followed by UNM's final timeout as the Lobos attempted to work up one final play to tie it.

With less than two seconds on the clock, the Lobos attempted to bring the ball in from under the opposite basket and Lyle took a pass at half court, turned and shot the long three, but the ball hit the rim for the 88-85 final as time expired.

On the night, the Lobos outshot from the floor (49.2 - 47.8), but fired just 6-for-24 from three-point range (25 percent) compared to 12-for-33 for the Spartans. UNM committed 18 turnovers compared to just 12 for SJSU that resulted in 29 points for the Spartans compared to just 15 for UNM.

The Lobos return home for a pair of conference contests, starting with Fresno State on Tuesday, Jan. 7 at 9 p.m. MT on ESPNU.

Game 17 - New Mexico 78, Fresno State 64 Jan. 7, 2020 | Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit Lobos 11-0 in The Pit; Down Fresno State, 78-64

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team improved to 11-0 inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit for the first time since 2005-06 with a 78-64 win over Fresno State (5-11, 1-4 MW) on Tuesday night. With the victory, UNM is now 14-3 overall, 3-1 in conference play.

Redshirt-junior Vance Jackson led the Lobos with 29 points and 13 rebounds for his second straight 25-point game and double-double this season. His 29 points landed him just one shy of tying his career-high 30 points, which he also scored against Fresno State last season, on Feb. 17, 2019.

Jackson was nearly perfect from the floor on Tuesday night going 9-for-12, 6-for-7 from behind the arc and 5-for-7 from the stripe.

Redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle also had a standout performance, posting UNM's first double-double in points and assists since Antino Jackson did so on Feb. 10, 2018, two seasons ago. Lyle racked up 14 points and 10 assists to go along with three steals.

The pair led four Lobos to score in double figures including junior Makuach Maluach, who was 3-for-6 from 3-point range, and senior Corey Manigault who posted 10 points.

Head coach Paul Weir also reached a landmark, hitting his 75th career win with the victory.

UNM went down by as many as nine early in the first half after an 8-0 Fresno State run made it 14-5 Bulldogs just under five minutes into the contest. Fresno State kept the lead until the 8:10 mark when an 8-0 run, capped by a Maluach triple, tied it up at 22-22.

The teams posted three more first-half ties before the Lobos scored 11 straight points, kicked off by another Maluach three, including a trio of Lyle free throws and a layup by redshirt-sophomore Vante Hendrix. The run was capped by another three from Jackson to make it an eight-point Lobo lead, 41-33, with 2:00 left on the clock. Fresno State scored four straight for the four-point halftime score, 41-37 Lobos.

At the break, Jackson had 17 points and the Lobos were outshooting the Bulldogs 43.3 - 38.9 percent from the floor.

UNM started the second half with six straight points to make it a 10-point game on a Maluach dunk at the 17:52 mark, 47-37. A Hendrix dunk again made it a 10-point Lobo lead with 12:35 left, 57-47.

With 5:35 left, Fresno State had reduced the Lobo lead to seven, but UNM embarked on a stellar 11-0 run over 3:33 to take its largest lead of the contest, 18 points (78-60), with just 2:02 to play. Over the final two minutes, Fresno State added four more points on a pair of layups for the 14-point final, 78-64.

Fresno State was led by freshman Orlando Robinson who posted 16 points and 12 rebounds. UNM held Bulldog senior New Williams, who scored 32 points on a Mountain West-record 10 3-pointers on Saturday, to just 10 points and a pair of threes.

The Lobos are set to return to action on Saturday, Jan. 11 when they host Air Force on STADIUM at 4 p.m. inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit.

Game 18 - New Mexico 84, Air Force 78 Jan. 11, 2020 | Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit Lobos Remain Undefeated in The Pit; Top Air Force

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- In one of its best shooting performances of the season, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team improved to 15-3 on the season (4-1 MW) with an 84-78 victory over Air Force (8-9, 2-3 MW) on Saturday afternoon in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. The win also extended the Lobos' home win streak to 12-0 which UNM has not done since the 2005-06 season.

UNM was led by five scorers in double figures for the sixth time this season. Despite fouling out with nearly four minutes left, it was redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle who led the Lobos, netting 20 points for the second time in the last three games. He also added four assists, two rebounds, a steal and a block.

Following Lyle was redshirt-junior Zane Martin who scored 18 points, just one point shy of his most as a Lobo, while dishing a team-high five assists. Senior Corey Manigault added 16 points, six rebounds and three blocks while redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg nearly notched his sixth double-double of the season with 11 points and seven boards. The final Lobo to reach double figures was redshirt-sophomore Vante Hendrix who collected 10 points going a near-perfect 3-for-4 from the floor including 2-for-3 from 3-point range and 2-for-2 from the stripe.

On the night, UNM outshot Air Force in every category, firing at a clip of 57.7 percent from the floor (30-52) including 35.3 percent from behind the arc (6-17). From the stripe, the Lobos shot 72.0 percent (18-25), just edging the Falcons' 71.4 percent (10-14).

Not only was the Lobo offense hot, but the UNM defense was strong, holding the Falcon squad that entered the contest shooting 41.5 percent from behind the arc to just 28.6 percent from long range.

While Air Force was led by senior Lavelle Scottie, who tallied a game-high 26 points, the Lobos held Falcon leading scorer Ryan Swan to just 10 points. Swan entered the game averaging 19.3 points per game in conference play.

The squads traded 10-2 runs in the first half but ultimately UNM went into the locker room after three, 37-34, after Air Force whittled down a nine-point Lobo lead with 4:20 left in the half with an 11-5 run to close the first frame. UNM is now undefeated (11-0) on the season when leading at halftime.

It was Manigault that was the star performer of the first half, posting 11 points, five rebounds, three assists and a block in the first 20 minutes.

Redshirt-junior Vance Jackson opened the second half with a layup to increase the UNM advantage to five before Air Force went on a 7-0 run to jump ahead by two with 17:57 left. It was a fast-break Lyle 3-pointer 16 seconds later however, that stopped the run and put the Lobos back on top for the remainder of the game.

UNM took off, got the score to double digits on a Martin dunk at the 11:38 mark, and even got out to as much as a 10-point lead in the second half en route to the six-point final score.

With five, second-half Lobo scorers including two in the final minute from junior Makuach Maluach and senior Carlton Bragg Jr., the second half and the end of the contest had fans roaring and on their feet.

The Lobos forced Air Force to expire all of its timeouts, one of which came after a Martin-to-Maluach alley-ooop with 1:00 on the clock to make it a five-point game. The Bragg dunk came with just five seconds left, also assisted by Martin.

UNM will spend the next two games on the road, taking on Colorado State on Wednesday, Jan. 15, on ESPN3 before continuing the road trip with a Saturday contest at UNLV on Jan. 18 on CBS Sports Network. The Lobos return home on Tuesday, Jan. 21, as they host San José State at 8 p.m. on AT&T SportsNet.

Lobos Suffer 4th Loss of the Season on CSU Threes

FORT COLLINS, Colo. --- In a record-breaking night for the Colorado State Rams (12-7, 3-3 MW), The University of New Mexico men's basketball team (15-4, 4-2 MW) fell by a score of 105-72 on the road on Wednesday night, breaking the Lobos' two-win streak in just their fourth loss of the season. UNM is now 10-2 over its last 12 games.

Colorado State broke a program record with 19 3-pointers on the night going an outstanding 67.9 percent from the field (19-28). The Rams were led by six scorers in double figures including freshman Isaiah Stevens who went 5-for-6 from 3-point range and 7-for-10 from the floor to total 19 points.

New Mexico was led by redshirt-junior Zane Martin who fired off 17 points going 7-for-11 from the floor including 2-for-3 from behind the arc and 1-for-2 from the stripe. Martin finished just two points shy of his 1,000th career point after totaling 815 at Towson. Martin has scored 183 points so far as a Lobo putting him at 998 career points heading into Saturday's game at UNLV.

Wednesday's 33-point loss marked UNM's largest defeat margin of the season after falling by 25 points to now-No. 4 Auburn. That week, the Lobos began receiving votes for the first time and suffered their largest loss of the season. Wednesday's outcome is similar as UNM received votes again for the first time since on the week before falling. The Lobos have however, shown a resiliency after losses, bouncing back after each loss of the season. UNM is 3-0 in 2019-20 after a loss.

Nineteen threes marks the most allowed by the Lobos this season after Boise State netted 14 on Dec. 4. The Lobo record for most threes made by an opponent is 20, which occurred just once in 2004.

Colorado State got out to a quick nine-point lead just three minutes into the contest, going a perfect 4-for-4 from behind the arc in the span. The Rams increased the lead to 12, 19-7, at the 15:10 mark with another three and kept piling on the points.

It was just midway through the first half that the game was out of hand with CSU leading by 20, 37-17.

At halftime, Colorado State was leading by 23, 56-33, with the largest lead a team has had at the break over UNM this season. The Rams were outshooting 56.8 percent from the floor compared to 45.5 percent for the Lobos and 68.8 percent from three (11-16) compared to 23.1 percent (3-13) for UNM.

The Lobos, who entered the game leading the nation in both free throws made and free throws attempted, did not have a single attempt in the first half while CSU had just three attempts as the teams combined for just nine called fouls in the first frame. On the night, both teams combined for just 22 free throw attempts on 28 total fouls.

UNM attempted a second-half comeback but with Colorado State rarely missing, the Lobos got no closer than 20 the rest of the way.

The end of the contest marked a great opportunity for the Lobo bench to work on development as redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle exited the game with 11:46 left to play. Redshirt-junior Vance Jackson also departed early, leaving the game with 5:43 left in the first half with an injury while senior Corey Manigault saw limited minutes due to early foul trouble.

Standouts from the bench included freshman Emmanuel Kuac who pleasantly surprised fans with a 3-for-4 performance from the floor in his 11:46 on the court. He made the most of his time, exhibiting contagious energy and going a perfect 2-for-2 from 3-point range while collecting three rebounds and a steal. He registered his first career points on the night, totaling eight.

The Lobos will get not quite three days of rest before taking on UNLV in Las Vegas on Saturday at 4 p.m. on CBS Sports Network.

Shorthanded Lobos Run Out of Energy at UNLV

LAS VEGAS, Nev. --- For the first time this season, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team (15-5, 4-3 MW) suffered its second-straight road loss with a 99-78 showing at UNLV (11-9, 6-1 MW) on Saturday night. While the Lobos led for the majority of the first half, the Runnin' Rebels jumped ahead in the final minute with a halftime lead that they did not again relinquish.

The five Lobo starters played over 30 minutes of the 40-minute game including 35 or more from four of them: senior Corey Manigault (35), redshirt-sophomore Vante Hendrix (35), junior Makuach Maluach (37) and redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle (39).

"Unfortunately, we ran out of gas," head coach Paul Weir said. "We turned the ball over 12 times in the second half, three times in the first half. I thought our guys actually competed and played hard and rallied and responded to where we were at, but you've got to give it to UNLV, it just was a better team -- it is the better team right now."

Despite the lengthy minutes and obvious wearing down of the Lobo personnel, UNM was behind by single digits with just 4:26 left on the clock. Redshirt-junior Zane Martin made a pair of free throws to make it an eight-point game, 76-68 before the Runnin' Rebels followed with a 9-0 run to extend the UNLV lead to 17, 85-68.

Lyle hit a pair of free throws and a three, broken up by a UNLV dunk, to make it a 14-point game with 2:27 left in a last-ditch effort at some energy from the Lobo squad. The energy burst wasn't quite enough however, as UNLV closed on a 12-5 run over the final 2:27 for the 21-point Runnin' Rebel win.

UNLV collected six dunks in the second half as the Lobo defense grew visibly tired, including three in the final two and a half minutes.

Despite the struggles of the Lobo defense on the night, the Lobo offense hit 10 3-pointers for just the second time this season en route to its 78 points. Lyle led the charge with four on the night followed by Hendrix (3-7). Manigault even registered two from deep, marking a new career-high for the big man.

The final three came from freshman Emmanuel Kuac, who saw 13 minutes on the court, which he registered just 12 seconds after entering the contest.

The Lobos were led on the night by Lyle, who registered his seventh 20+ point game of the season with an even 20 points. He has scored at least 20 in three of the Lobos' last five games.

Finishing just behind Lyle was Manigault who posted his second double-double of the season with 19 points and 11 boards. All five starters finished in double figures.

UNLV was led by a massive effort from sophomore Bryce Hamilton who put up a career-high 35 points going 14-for-19 from the floor. Another outstanding performance on the night was Runnin' Rebel sophomore Marvin Coleman who posted a triple-double with 11 points, 11 assists and 12 rebounds.

Coleman's triple-double marks the first in the Mountain West since 2016.

On the night, the Lobos were outshot 50.7 - 41.3 percent from the floor but fired at a clip of 38.5 percent from behind the arc compared to 30.8 percent for UNLV.

UNM was outrebounded 47-31 including 15-8 in offensive boards while turning the ball over 15 times compared to 10 for the Runnin' Rebels.

The Lobos are set to return to action on Tuesday, Jan. 21 when they host San José State inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit on AT&T SportsNet at 8 p.m. MT.

Lobos Improve to 13-0 in The Pit; Top SJSU by 27

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- Despite being down four starters on Tuesday night, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team executed an energetic 27-point victory (86-59) over San José State inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit, improving the Lobo record to a perfect 13-0 at home this season. The victory margin ties the largest for UNM so far this season.

The victory also came on "Suits & Sneakers" night, in which UNM worked to raise funds and awareness for pediatric cancer and the Children's Cancer Fund of NM, marking the first time this season that head coach Paul Weir donned a suit instead of his familiar red sweater.

The Lobos (16-5, 5-3 MW) earn their first 13-0 mark at home since the 1998-99 season. UNM's last season as a member of the WAC. That season, UNM went on to 16-0 at home. The win also gives the Lobos the series split with SJSU (6-14, 2-6 MW) after the Spartans claimed a three-point victory over the Lobos in San Jose on New Year's Day. UNM is now 9-1 against the Spartans in Albuquerque and 15-3 in series history.

The Lobos were led by a pair of players scoring 20 points or more including redshirt-junior Zane Martin (20) and senior Corey Manigault (21). Martin's marks a season-high for the former Towson high-scorer as he has taken on a traditionally different role so far in his time at UNM.

Junior Makuach Maluach also had a standout game as the only Lobo starter to remain suited up on Tuesday night, starting his 44th consecutive matchup. He registered his first double-double of the season, just the second in his career, with 15 points and 13 rebounds.

Redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee was the fourth Lobo to register double figures with 10 points, collecting his most in his last 11 contests while redshirt-sophomore Vante Hendrix accumulated eight points, four rebounds, a season-high five assists and two steals.

The Lobos jumped on top of the Spartans early and never let up, limiting SJSU to just one point through the first 3:30 with an 8-1 run for a seven-point lead. SJSU went on a 5-0 run to make it a two-point game at the 14:45 mark, but that was as close as the Spartans would get for the remainder of the contest as Maluach hit a three on the next possession to spark a 6-0 run that made it an 11-point game just midway through the first half, 19-8.

With just 3:37 left in the half, the Spartans had whittled the score down to four (31-25) before the Lobos closed the first half on a devastating 12-4 run for a 12-point Lobo halftime advantage, including a last-second layup by Hendrix, 41-29.

The Lobos brought the momentum into the second half and the game was out of reach for the Spartans for the remainder of the contest as UNM piled on the points for a 30-point advantage with 11:11 left.

San José State was led by sophomore Seneca Knight who was the only Spartan to score in double figures. In the teams' last meeting, it was junior Richard Washington who put up seven threes on the Lobo defense. In Tuesday night's matchup, UNM's defense held him to just 1-for-2 from the floor in 17 minutes, his one make was from 3-point range.

Overall the Lobos outshot the Spartans 56.6 - 27.0 percent from the floor including 31.3 - 20.0 percent from deep. UNM also outscored SJSU 44-20 in the paint and capitalized on the Spartans' 14 turnovers for 16 points compared to 10 points off of 11 Lobo turnovers.

UNM is set to return to action on Saturday for a highly-anticipated matchup on the road in Reno as the Lobos take on the Nevada Wolf Pack, led by former UNM head coaches Steve Alford and Craig Neal. Fans unable to make the journey to Reno can watch live on CBS Sports Network at 6 p.m. MT.

Second Half Run Falls Short, Lobos Downed at Nevada

RENO, Nev. --- A late 13-0 run by The University of New Mexico men's basketball team (16-6, 5-4 MW) fell short on Saturday evening as the Lobos dropped a 96-74 final on the road against Nevada (13-8, 6-3 MW), which entered the contest tied with UNM for third in the Mountain West standings. The Lobos were led by redshirt-junior Zane Martin who collected a season-high 23 points to go along with four assists and three rebounds.

UNM fell behind early and went into the halftime break down by its second-largest halftime deficit of the season, 20 points (49-29), but came out shooting in the second half. The Lobos were outscored by just two points, 47-45 in the second half.

UNM entered the second half outshot by the Wolf Pack 56.3 percent (18-32) to 37.9 percent (11-29) including 56.3 - 20.0 percent from behind the arc in the first. The Lobos rebounded in the final 20 minutes however, going 46.9 percent from the floor (15-32) and 57.1 percent from 3-point range, hitting eight of their 10 3-pointers in the second half.

The game marked just the third time this season that UNM has made 10 threes.

Down by 20 at the start of the half, Nevada extended its advantage to 25 in the first 2:40 (57-32) before back-to-back threes from redshirt-junior Keith McGee and sophomore Tavian Percy cut the deficit back to 19.

The momentum couldn't quite take off and Nevada went back to piling on points however, making it a 28-point game with 8:54 left on a dunk from freshman K.J. Hymes to cap an 11-4 run.

It was at that point that Lobo head coach Paul Weir called a timeout, after which UNM posted its best scoring run of the game, 13-0, sparked by back-to-back threes from redshirt-sophomore Vante Hendrix and McGee. Hendrix made four free throws and McGee netted another three to make it a 15-point game and for a brief moment, it looked like the Lobos had gotten themselves back in the game with 5:48 left on the clock.

The hope was short lived however as the Nevada called a timeout and closed the game out 14-7 for the 96-74 final.

Not only did Martin lead all scorers on the floor on the night, but he scored 14 straight points for the Lobos leading up to halftime.

Martin was one of four Lobos to score in double figures, followed by Hendrix with a career-high 19. Martin and Hendrix both went 3-for-7 from behind the arc while Martin was 8-for-19 from the floor and Hendrix went 6-for-12 including a perfect 4-for-4 from the free throw line.

Senior Corey Manigault registered 13 points and five rebounds while McGee collected 11 points and a trio of assists.

The Lobos dressed just 10 players on the night, nine of which saw the court on Saturday, compared to a field of 11 for the Wolf Pack. The short Lobo bench required its starters to play 26 minutes or more while McGee came off the bench going 3-for-4 from 3-point range in 26 minutes. He was a perfect 3-for-3 from deep in the second half.

The Wolf Pack was led by senior Nisrê Zouzoua who scored 20 points as one of six members of the Wolf Pack to register double figures. The game marked the second time in four games that a UNM opponent has had six players in double digits.

Nevada's JohnCarlos Reyes finished with the only double-double on the floor with 10 points and 11 rebounds.

Overall on the night, Nevada fired at an outstanding clip of 48.6 percent from three compared to 41.7 percent for UNM, racking up 17 from behind the arc. The short Lobo bench was outscored 50-26 though UNM did well controlling the ball, turning it over just seven times compared to 11 for Nevada.

Current Nevada head coach and former Lobo head coach Steve Alford collected his 600th career victory on the night, 155 of which were at UNM, while Weir was looking for his 50th at the helm of the Lobos.

UNM is set to return to action on Wednesday, Jan. 29 inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit when it hosts No. 4 San Diego State at 7 p.m. on CBS Sports Network. The last time the Lobos hosted an undefeated, top-10 opponent, UNM came away with an exciting 85-58 victory over then undefeated No. 5/6 Nevada.

Lobo Underclassmen Shine Despite Loss to #4 SDSU

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- With four starters down on a previously 15-man roster, underclassmen on The University of New Mexico men's basketball team had the chance to prove themselves on the court on Wednesday evening, posting career-nights against the only undefeated team left in the country in nationally-ranked, No. 4 San Diego State.

The 85-57 loss ends UNM's 13-0 undefeated streak in The Pit and ends the Lobos' conference record at 5-5, 16-7 on the season. San Diego State remains undefeated and improves to 22-0, 11-0 Mountain West.

Six of the 10 Lobos to see action on the court Wednesday were underclassmen and combined for 94 of the 200 Lobo minutes on the night.

While UNM was led offensively by senior Corey Manigault with a team-best 12 points, Manigault scored all of his points in the first half, seeing just four minutes in the second. Redshirt junior Keith McGee, who registered his first start of the season, followed with 10 points including a pair of 3-pointers accounting for half of the Lobos' total from deep.

Sophomore Jordan Arroyo saw his best career game against the Aztecs, racking up a career-high seven rebounds in a career-most 21 minutes against a team that featured a duo of 6-10 seniors to go along with a 6-10 sophomore. UNM was outscored by just three on the night, 36-33.

Freshman Emmanuel Kuac was also a bright spot on the night, tying his career-most 13 minutes on the court while going 3-for-5 from the floor for six points and three rebounds, tied for his career high. With the game already out of hand at 74-43 with 7:44 left, redshirt junior Zane Martin, who collected a team-high three assists, tossed the ball up over the hoop where Kuac one-handed it into a dunk.

San Diego State was led by five players in double figures including senior KJ Feagin who went 6-for-9 from 3-point range for 18 points, tying his career-most made threes in a game. Feagin entered the game averaging just 7.5 points on the season, 7.2 points per game in MW play.

SDSU junior Jordan Schakel nearly finished as the only player on the night with a double-double, registering 11 points and nine rebounds.

On the night, SDSU collected 17 fouls to just 11 for the Lobos finishing the first half 10-4 in favor of UNM. Despite getting into the double bonus early, UNM was still down by as many as 23 points in the first half with just 42 seconds left to play.

SDSU outshot UNM 58.2 - 33.8 percent from the floor and 45.5 - 17.4 percent from 3-point range.

The Aztecs got out to a quick 17-point lead on a 17-0 run that extended to the 15:16 mark before a jumper from Manigault ended the Lobo scoring drought. UNM never got the game back to single digits.

UNM's best scoring run of the game, 8-0, came in the final 4:34 and was sparked by a triple from McGee to reduce the deficit from 33 points to 30. It was followed by a jumper from freshman Kurt Wegscheider and capped by another McGee three to make it a 25-point game for the first time since the 17:05 mark.SDSU closed the game 5-2, with the two points coming on another Kuac dunk with 1:11 left.

The Lobos are set to return to action on Saturday, Feb. 1, when they travel to Fresno State to take on the Bulldogs at 3 p.m. MT on AT&T SportsNet.

Lobo Defense Unable to Hold On at Fresno State

FRESNO, Calif. --- Despite a strong offense that saw The University of New Mexico men's basketball team shooting 44.4 percent with 12 threes and a 17-point lead, the Lobo defense couldn't hold off the Fresno State Bulldogs on Saturday afternoon on the road. Fresno State roared back in the final minutes for an 82-77 victory in the Save Mart Center.

With the loss, the Lobos slip to 16-8 on the season, 5-6 MW, while Fresno State improves to 8-14, 4-7 in league play.

The Lobo offense was led by four players in double figures including a trio that finished with 18 points apiece: senior Corey Manigault and redshirt-juniors Zane Martin and Keith McGee. McGee's 18 points marked his most of the season as he went 6-for-9 from 3-point range. Saturday's game marked just the fourth time this season that UNM has registered 10 or more from behind the arc.

The fourth Lobo to hit double digits was junior Makuach Maluach for the 12th time this season. Maluach collected 13 points to go along with a team-high six rebounds.

Maluach was one of five players to finish the game with 30 minutes or more as the Lobos ran out of steam in the final minutes. He was joined by Manigault, Martin, McGee and redshirt-sophomore Vante Hendrix, who contributed eight points, two rebounds and three steals.

With the teams tied 16-16 at the 13:15 mark of the first half, the Lobos put on a dominant show on the Bulldogs' court, embarking on a 19-2 run over 6:25 to take a 17-point lead with 6:35 left in the first half.

The hefty run was sparked by a pair of back-to-back threes from McGee and Martin and included two more McGee threes along with one by Hendrix and a pair of free throws by Martin. The run was capped by a layup from freshman Emmanuel Kuac, who collected two points, three rebounds and two assists in 10 minutes on the night.

Fresno State scored six straight points within 1:14 to gain momentum and reduce the UNM lead to 11, forcing UNM head coach Paul Weir to call his first, 30-second timeout at the 4:57 mark.

UNM got back up by 16 three times but Fresno State freshman Anthony Holland hit a three with four seconds left to reclaim the Bulldog momentum and go into the break with the Lobos up by 11.

"I thought the end of the first half unfortunately started [the momentum change]," Weir said. "They made those two threes at the end of the first half to cut it to 11 and I think it just gave them a little bit of momentum and took a little bit of the wind out of our sails."

"[Fresno State] just kept fighting and fighting and fighting and unfortunately I thought we just ran out of gas ... We just didn't quite have the defensive effort we needed down the stretch."

Fresno State fought to close the gap, posting an 11-1 comeback run, and finally tied the game with 6:23 left in the contest on a layup from Bulldog leading-scorer New Williams (66-66). Williams entered the game leading Fresno State with 15.5 points per game in league play. On the night, the Lobos held him to just nine points, going 1-for-9 from 3-point range after tying the Mountain West record with 10 earlier this season.

The squads tied the game three more times at 4:21 (71-71), 3:00 (73-73) and finally at 1:18 (75-75). The tie marked the ninth and final of the game.

Williams hit a three to put Fresno State up 78-75, followed by a layup by Martin with 52 seconds left on the clock to make it a one-point game, 78-77.

A Lobo foul with 22 seconds left on a Bulldog 3-point attempt allowed freshman Jarred Hyder to make two of three free throw attempts to put the home team back up by three, 80-77. With no more timeouts left, the Lobos were forced to foul to stop the clock with eight seconds left, but the Bulldogs closed the game on a pair of made free throws for the 82-77 final.

Saturday's game marks the first time this season that UNM has not earned the win after heading into halftime with the victory. Prior to Saturday, the Lobos were a perfect 12-0 when leading at the break.

Fresno State outshot New Mexico 56.5 - 44.4 percent including 44.0 - 42.9 percent from behind the arc.

The Bulldogs were led by three players scoring in double figures including two with a double-double. Freshman Orlando Robinson racked up 20 points for the fourth time this season to go along with a career-high 15 rebounds. Senior Nate Grimes collected 15 points and 13 boards on the night.

On the day, UNM led for 29:46 holding the largest lead of the game at 17 in the first half. Fresno State led for just 4:31 with its largest lead of the game at five with eight seconds left and the ultimate final score.

UNM has a bye week and is set to return to action at home on Saturday, Feb. 8, at home inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit at 4 p.m. on STADIUM.

Three Lobos Hit 20 in 29-Point Win Over Wyoming

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- On the back of a trio of players to rack up 20 points, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team rebounded from its recent three-game skid with a 29-point victory, 97-68, over the visiting Wyoming Cowboys on Saturday evening inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. The win improves the Lobos' home record to 14-1 and marks head coach Paul Weir's 50th victory at the helm of the Lobos.

Win the win, UNM improves to 17-8 on the season (6-6 MW) while Wyoming falls to 6-19, 1-12 MW. The contest marks the first time since Dec. 22 that UNM has registered at least 90 points and is the seventh time UNM has done so this season after starting the 2019-20 campaign with four straight games scoring 90 or more.

Senior Corey Manigault posted a career-high 28 points to lead UNM along with nine rebounds, four assists and three steals. Manigault's points included a 10-for-11 mark from the free throw line. He was joined in the 20-point club by redshirt-junior Zane Martin who collected a UNM career-high-tying 23 points, as well as redshirt-junior Vance Jackson who scored 20 while going 6-for-8 from 3-point range. Six three ties Jackson's UNM career high.

In his first game back on the court after missing the last four to injury, Jackson scored just three points in the first half before draining 17 points in the second on the way to his third 20-point game of the season. He registered 14 straight Lobo points within 7:52 to take the Lobos from an 18-point advantage to a 24-point lead by 2:27 left to play.

UNM entered the halftime break with an 11-point lead after Martin went on a 5-0 run to claim the momentum for the Lobos with just under 2:30 left in the half. Leading by five, Martin hit a three and then collected his second steal of the game just four seconds later and drove for the dunk to put UNM up by 10 at the 2:27 mark.

When the Lobos came out of the locker room at the half however, it looked like Wyoming might take the momentum away. After UNM held Cowboy leading scorer Hunter Maldonado to nine points in the first half, the redshirt-sophomore scored six of Wyoming's first 10 points out of the break and the Cowboys opened with a 12-8 advantage to reduce the Lobo lead to seven with 15:47 to play.

The Lobos followed by scoring five straight, on a layup from redshirt-junior Keith McGee, who was UNM's fourth Lobo in double figures on the night with 13 points, and a three from Manigault. The back-to-back points put UNM back up by 12.

Jackson's run just over four minutes later put UNM back on top by 24. Jackson's final three in his 14-point run sparked a Lobo 8-2 run that included a Manigault three-steal-dunk combo to give UNM its largest lead of the game, 29 points, 84-55. Wyoming was able to get as close as 25 points before the eventual, 29-point final score.

The final Lobo point was punctuated by an emphatic dunk from McGee, igniting Lobo fans and the Lobo bench, with just 21 seconds left.

The dunk was the last of nine on the night including three from McGee, four from Manigault, one from Martin and one from freshman Emmanuel Kuac.

On the evening, UNM outscored Wyoming 46-27 marking the highest Lobo rebound margin of the season, 19. The Lobos also outshot the Cowboys 50.7 - 42.9 percent from the floor and 41.4 - 19.0 percent from 3-point range. UNM registered 12 threes on the evening marking just the fifth time this season that the Lobos have registered 10 or more from deep, the fourth time in the last six contests.

The Lobos are set to return to action on Tuesday, Feb. 11 as they travel to still-undefeated No. 4 San Diego State for a 9 p.m. MT contest in San Diego on ESPN2.

Hendrix Scores 20; Lobos Fall at No. 4 SDSU

SAN DIEGO, Calif. --- The Lobos had a one-point lead with four minutes left in the first half, but No. 4 San Diego State executed an outstanding comeback in the second to down The University of New Mexico men's basketball team, 82-59, on the road on Tuesday night. The Aztecs remain the only undefeated team in the nation and secured the 2020 Mountain West Regular-Season Championship with the win.

No. 4 San Diego State improves to 25-0 on the season, 14-0 in Mountain West play, while UNM is now 17-9 overall with a 6-7 mark in league competition.

The Lobos were led by redshirt-sophomore Vante Hendrix who recorded a career-high 20 points to go along with four rebounds and four steals. Hendrix was the only Lobo to register double figures on the night while UNM was led by redshirt-senior JaiQuan Lyle and junior Makuach Maluach on the boards. The pair registered six rebounds apiece.

SDSU had four players rack up double digits including a pair of 20+ point scorers in junior Matt Mitchell (22) and senior Yanni Wetzell (20). Mitchell was also the only player on the floor to record a double-double with 12 rebounds.

The Lobos dominated from the floor in the first half, outshooting the Aztecs 45.2 - 39.4 percent. UNM got out to an early five-point lead, 10-5, just three minutes into the contest on a dunk from senior Corey Manigault. SDSU responded with a 5-0 run over the next 2:08 to tie it up at 10-10 before a Maluach layup and a Hendrix three again put UNM up by five, 15-10, at the 11:38 mark of the first half.

The Aztecs tied it again 15-15 at the 10:22 mark and the squads battled it out through the remainder of the first half. UNM's last lead was 28-27 with 4:08 left in the first on a dunk from redshirt-junior Zane Martin. An SDSU 6-0 run made it a five-point game in favor of the home team but through the final stretch of the first half, Hendrix posted another Lobo dunk, SDSU hit a pair of free throws and Hendrix finished with another from behind the arc for just a two-point SDSU advantage at the break, 35-33.

The first-half Arcs exhibited a well-balanced scoring and defensive effort in which Manigault and Hendrix led with just eight points apiece. UNM was outscored by just one in the first half, 19-18, including a 10-8 offensive board count. Neither team led by more than five in the first half, posted nearly-matching runs and the Lobos led for 9:15 compared to just 6:14 for the last undefeated team in the nation.

It was in the second half however, that the momentum shifted drastically to the other side of the court. Neither team scored for the first minute and a half but it was SDSU that struck first with a fast-break layup from Mitchell to start off the half.

Martin hit a jumper for UNM to cut SDSU's lead back to two before the Aztecs began to take control of the game with a 7-0 run to get out to a nine-point lead, 44-35. The game got out of hand quickly from there despite a Lyle three, one of just two for the senior on the night, making it a six-point game at the 16:42 mark.

The Lobos would cut it to six just once more 2:38 later but would get no closer as another 7-0 run for SDSU gave the Aztecs a double-digit lead they would not again relinquish.

UNM's careful first-half squad unraveled in the second as SDSU mounted a 20-point lead over the next five and a half minutes. The Lobos struggled through the remaining time on the clock but the Aztecs remained on top by at least 21 for the rest of the contest en route to securing the 2020 MW Regular-Season title.

The Lobos entered the contest third in the nation in made free throws (420) but did not draw a single attempt in the first half. The squad finished 7-for-9 from the stripe compared to 14-for-19 for SDSU.

The second half numbers tell a very different story than this as UNM's shooting from the floor was just 26.5 percent compared to 51.6 percent for the Aztecs. On the night, the Lobos finished shooting 35.4 percent to 45.3 percent for SDSU. After a two-point, first-half deficit, SDSU outscored the Lobos 47-26 in the second half en route to the 82-59 final score.

The Lobos will return to action on Saturday, Feb. 15 when they host UNLV on CBS Sports Network at 4 p.m. MT. UNM looks to defend its 14-1 record at home in the contest.

Lobo Comeback Falls Short; Nevada Sweeps Series

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team battled back from a 16-point deficit with an 8-0 run on Tuesday night, but it wasn't enough as the Lobos fell to the visiting Wolf Pack by a final score of 88-74 inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. UNM was led by four players in double figures in the game that saw three lead changes and five ties.

UNM (17-11, 6-9 MW) is now 14-3 inside The Pit on the season while former Lobo head coach Steve Alford, now at the helm of the Wolf Pack, earned his 17th win of the season, 10th in conference play. Nevada improves to 17-10, 10-5 in league competition and takes sole possession of third place in the MW standings. UNM remains in seventh.

"Every time we seemed like we were on the verge of something, somebody on their team stepped up and made a big shot," head coach Paul Weir said. "You have to give them credit for being able to go on the road and shoot that way and make those big shots."

It was clear from the outset of the game that the energy in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit was going to be high, and it stayed that way. Lobos fans remained on their feet for the first 2:08 that included seven possessions as the two teams battled to be the first to score. It was UNM junior Makuach Maluach, who finished the night with 11 points for his second straight game in double figures, that scored the first bucket on a fast-break layup to give the Lobos their first advantage.

His basket was followed 33 seconds later on the next possession by a three from Nevada's Jazz Johnson, who registered 15 points on the night, shifting the advantage to the Wolf Pack and the teams were off from there.

The 3-pointer was the first of 13 for the Wolf Pack marking the 14th time UNM's opponent has scored 10 or more from behind the arc, the fifth time in the last seven games.

The Lobos also scored from deep on the night however, registering 11 threes for their sixth time this season hitting 16 or more. Over the last nine games, UNM has scored 10 or more threes in five of them.

Nevada extended its lead to six by the 13:15 mark but a 6-0 Lobo run on threes from senior JaQuan Lyle, who finished the night with a team-high 16 points, and redshirt-junior Vance Jackson, who finished with 15, tied it back up, 14-14, with 11:45 left on the clock in the first half.

The squads tied the game again at 20:20 (9:37), 25-25 (7:22) and 28-28 (6:16) before Nevada began to build its lead that it would not relinquish. The Wolf Pack went on a 15-5 run over 4:12 to take a 10-point lead with 2:04 left in the half on the way to a nine-point halftime score of 44-35, Nevada.

At the break, Jackson led the Lobos with 10 points marking his third time this season registering double figures in the first half.

Nevada built a 16-point lead midway through the second half at the 12:40 mark but the Lobos responded with an 8-0 run sparked by a Maluach jumper and ended by a crowd-pleasing alley-oop from redshirt-junior Zane Martin to Maluach to again make it an eight-point game, 63-55, with 10:34 left. The momentum shift forced Alford to call a Wolf Pack timeout.

Nevada came out of the timeout with a 9-2 run that included a pair of threes from senior Lindsey Drew and made it a 15-point game with 7:34 left. UNM responded with its own 9-2 run that included four points from Jackson and two apiece for Martin and redshirt-sophomore Vante Hendrix to cut the Lobo deficit back to eight, 74-66, with 5:12 left.

Nevada took off over the final 4:20 and built a game-high 17-point lead with 52 seconds left en route to the win.

The Wolf Pack was led by junior Jalen Harris who registered 26 points on the night marking his sixth straight game scoring 25 points or more. Harris has registered double figures in all but two games this season and has collected 538 points on the year.

New Mexico was outshot from the floor 50.0 - 38.8 percent and edged from behind the arc 38.2 - 32.4 percent.

UNM has a pair of road contests as it wraps up the end of the 2019-20 regular season. The Lobos head to Boise State on Sunday, Feb. 23 before traveling to Air Force on Wednesday, Feb. 26. The Lobos will conclude the regular season with senior night on Saturday, Feb. 29 against Utah State.

Lobos Split with Broncos After Sunday Road Loss

BOISE, Idaho --- Despite 19 points from redshirt-junior Vance Jackson and shooting 46.8 percent from the floor as a team, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team fell by a final score of 74-61 at Boise State on Sunday afternoon in the Broncos' Senior Night. The Lobos were as close as six points with 7:34 left to play.

With the loss, UNM falls to 17-12 on the season, 6-10 in Mountain West play, while Boise State improves to 19-10, 11-6 MW.

UNM was led by Jackson who collected a team-high seven rebounds in addition to his 19 points. He was one of two Lobos to score in double figures, going 5-for-9 from the floor, 3-for-5 from 3-point range and 6-for-9 from the free throw line. Redshirt-junior Keith McGehee was the other Lobo to rack up double figures, registering 12 points on 5-for-8 from the field, 1-for-2 from behind the arc and 1-for-1 from the stripe.

Boise State was powered by senior RJ Williams who posted a career night on his senior night. Williams registered a double-double that included a career-tying 27 points and a career-high 17 rebounds.

The Lobos hung tough through the first half, staying close through the first nine minutes before Boise State went on a 6-0 run to take a seven-point lead, 17-10, with 11:47 on the clock. UNM executed the comeback to take a one-point lead on an 11-3 run that included a quick five points from Jackson on a jumper and a three to spark the run.

Redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle collected three of his six points with a deep three from the sideline as the shot clock wound down to four and then hit a free throw to make it a one-point game, 20-19 Boise State.

Junior Makuach Maluach, in his 52nd straight start for UNM, put the Lobos ahead by one, 21-20, with a layup at the 7:10 mark.

It was the third media timeout of the first half at the 6:56 mark that broke the Lobo momentum and the Broncos came out of the brief break on a 10-0 run over just less than two minutes to put Boise State back up by nine, 30-21, with 4:15 left in the first.

The Broncos extended the lead to 11 by halftime, 37-26, closing the first half on a 17-5 run.

Out of the break, Boise State began to pile on the points, getting out to a 16-point lead with 16:09 left. The Lobos, down but not out, powered back on a 19-9 run over 8:35 capped by a pair of Jackson threes to close the gap to six points, 60-54, with 7:34 left.

Again the media timeout broke the Lobo stride and over the next four minutes, the Broncos had again reached a 16-point advantage en route to the 13-point victory.

Freshman Kurt Wegscheider earned his first career start and a career-high 20 minutes as one of several Lobos to get more playing time than usual. Classmate Emmanuel Kuac collected a career-high 18 minutes while a total of five Lobos saw 12 minutes or more off the bench.

On the night, the Lobos outshot the Broncos 46.8 - 44.3 percent from the floor including a narrow 1.0 percent advantage from behind the arc. The Broncos outrebounded UNM 35-27 including 13-5 on the offensive boards. The Lobos had just two more turnovers than the Broncos (18-16) but Boise State capitalized in 20 points compared to just 16 for UNM.

The Lobos are set to return to action on Wednesday, Feb. 26 when they travel to Air Force to finish off the regular-season road slate. Following Wednesday's contest against the Falcons, the Lobos will host (RV) Utah State on Senior Night on Saturday, Feb. 29 in The Pit.

Lobos Wrap Up Road Play with Narrow Loss at AF

USAF, Colo. --- Up by five with 2:09 left on the clock, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team was overcome by the Air Force Falcons in the final minutes on Wednesday night to fall by two, 60-58, in Colorado. Air Force, which was playing its final home game of the season, closed the game on an 8-0 run for the win.

With the loss, UNM is now 17-13 on the season, 6-11 in MW play, while Air Force improves to 11-18, 5-12 MW. The Lobos have just one regular-season matchup left, a Senior Night contest against (RV) Utah State on Saturday at 8 p.m. inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit.

A Senior Night ceremony honoring JaQuan Lyle and Corey Manigault will take place prior to tipoff.

Trailing by two with the clock about to expire, redshirt-senior Lyle took a corner three for the win but missed. It was sophomore Jordan Arroyo, who logged 23 minutes Wednesday after averaging just 6.8 per game throughout the season, that grabbed the offensive rebound that kept hope alive and gave the Lobos a chance to tie it, but Arroyo's swift putback just bounced off the tip of the rim as the clock expired and the Falcons claimed the 60-58 victory.

"I thought the first 8-10 minutes [of the game] was awful, and really the last 30 was as good as we've played," head coach Paul Weir said. "The guys that were out there... they were terrific tonight. I'm really happy for Jordan, I thought he was awesome tonight, I thought he made a big impact in both the first and second half."

UNM was led by Lyle, who collected a game-high 18 points, eight rebounds and six assists, followed by redshirt-junior Vance Jackson who racked up 16 points and six boards. The duo marked the only two Lobos to reach double figures on the night that saw seven lead changes and four ties. Arroyo logged a career-high 23 minutes while racking up five rebounds, two points (1-3), one block and one steal.

Air Force had four players score in double figures, all seniors, including a pair that earned double-doubles. Just nine of the Falcons' points came from other players and were spread among three off the bench. Double-doubles came for seniors Ryan Swan (14 points, 11 rebounds) and Sid Tomes (10 points, 10 rebounds) while the squad was led by senior Lavelle Scottie who collected 16 points.

Aggressive on the ball on the night, the Lobos collected 11 steals to just four for the Falcons while Air Force committed 17 turnovers to UNM's 13. Air Force outrebounded UNM 42-32 however, and also amassed 20 assists while both teams shot just over 35 percent from the floor.

Air Force got out to an early 13-point lead at the 11:51 mark in the first half, 20-7, before the Lobo offense began to find its rhythm. UNM cut the deficit to eight, 20-12, and continued to battle for an eventual 9-0 run that made it a two-point game with 5:38 left in the first half.

With 2:43 left, Jackson drove down the court, through the lane and put up a spin move for a layup that tied the game 28-28 before a Lyle fast-break dunk gave the Lobos a two-point lead, 30-28, with 1:41 left. Lyle hit three before the clock expired to take the UNM advantage to five at the halftime break, 33-28.

UNM closed the half on a 23-8 run over the Falcons.

The teams tied the game three times throughout the second half until the Lobos began to pull away, getting ahead by as many as six points with 6:36 left on another Lyle three. The three came as part of a Lobo hot streak that included a pair of shots from deep from both Jackson and Lyle, marking four in a span of 3:42 to get the Lobo bench fired up with 5:04 left.

It was then that Air Force went on an 8-0 run over the final stretch, including a pair of threes from Tomes over the final 1:08 for the 60-58 final.

The Lobos are set to return to action on leap day, Saturday, Feb. 29, for an 8 p.m. Senior Night matchup against (RV) Utah State on CBS Sports Network.
