ABOUT THE MATCHUP

- The Lobos enter Wednesday's matchup coming off of two straight wins including against Wisconsin in Brooklyn on Tuesday followed by a home win against Montana on Sunday, 72-63.
- Boise State is riding a three-win streak after topping BYU 72-68 at home, Pacific 82-76 on the road and UNCW on Friday in Boise by a score of 80-59.
- Wednesday's game kicks off conference play for the 2019 season and marks the earliest the Lobos have taken on a conference opponent in Mountain West history (the Lobos joined the league in 1999-2000).
- The Lobos lead the series with the Broncos 11-5 including a 6-2 advantage inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit.
- UNM is 1-2 in the last three games of the series but is 5-2 over the last seven.
- The Lobos and the Broncos met just once last season due to the Mountain West's 11-team field in which UNM earned a down-to-the-wire, 73-72 win on Senior Night on March 6.
- The Lobos are led by four players averaging scoring in double figures including redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle (16.8), redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg (11.9), junior Makuach Maluach (10.4) and senior Corey Manigault (10.0). Bragg leads the Lobos with a near double-double as he also posts 9.6 rebounds per game.
- Boise State is led by a trio of players averaging scoring in double figures including 2019-20 Preseason All-Mountain West team honoree Derrick Alston. The junior is averaging 21.8 points per game, followed by seniors RJ Williams (15.8) and Justinian Jessup (14.8). Williams is Boise State's leading rebounder with 9.0 per game.

LAST TIME OUT

The University of New Mexico men's basketball team extended its unbeaten streak at home to 5-0 on Sunday afternoon with a 72-63 win over the Montana Grizzlies. The Lobos were powered by a 20-point, 14-rebound effort from redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr. in his second double-double of the season.

On the night, the Lobos were edged in field goal percentage 43.1 - 43.3 but fired at a clip of 46.2 percent from behind the arc while holding the Griz to just 31.8 percent from three. UNM outrebounded Montana 43-31 while turning the ball over just nine times, marking UNM's lowest turnover total of the season.

EARLY SEVEN WINS

The Lobos have racked up seven

victories so far this season and mark the fastest Lobo squad to do so since the 2012-13 season when UNM went 29-6 overall (13-3 MW) and finished MW Regular Season and Tournament Champions. That season, the squad reached seven wins by Nov. 28 as part of a 12-win streak through Dec. 19.

HALFTIME TRENDS

So far this season, if the Lobos go into the halftime break with the lead, the Lobos win. UNM is a perfect 6-0 when leading at the half this season, 1-1 when trailing and 0-1 when tied at the break.

LOBOS DOWN A POWER 5

The Lobos topped Wisconsin on Tuesday, Nov. 26 marking the first time UNM earned a win over a Power 5 school since Dec. 5, 2012 when New Mexico topped USC 75-67 in Albuquerque.

MINIMIZING THE TURNOVERS

This year's Lobos have been turnover-prone with so many guards willing to pass on the court. Last game against Montana, however, UNM posted a season-low nine turnovers on the day. The last time UNM allowed just nine turnovers was last season in the Lobos' home victory over No. 5/6 Nevada on Jan. 5, 2019.

The next-lowest turnovers for the Lobos this season was 13, which happened against Wisconsin on Nov. 26. So far this year, the Lobos have accumulated 20 or more twice and 15 or more six times in nine games.

UNSELFISH CALDWELL

Redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell is known as the assist man on the Lobo squad, but he showed that he can also score last Tuesday against Wisconsin. Caldwell racked up 12 points for his first time scoring in double figures as a Lobo.

Caldwell ranks second in the Mountain West in assists per game with 5.1. He ranks first in the league in total assists (46) while ranking 22nd in the nation.

His number of assists on the season nearly matches his number of points

scored on the season (46 asts/49 pts).

AND HE STEALS TOO...11TH IN THE NATION

Redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell not only leads the Lobo squad in assists, but he also leads UNM in steals with 46, ranking 11th in the country and first in the Mountain West in total steals.

CALDWELL'S 32%

In leading the Lobos in both assists and steals, redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell accounts for 32 percent of UNM's totals in both categories.

LOBOS IN THE NATION

Through the first nine games of the season, the Lobos have emerged at the top of some of the national charts. Here is a look at some of the highlights:

'10" BRAGG - THE FREE THROW SHOOTER?

In Sunday's contest against Montana, redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg registered a career-high nine free throws on a career-most 11 attempts.

Prior to Sunday, the most free throws Bragg had hit during a game was five,

which he did twice last season and once while at Kansas during his sophomore season in 2016-17. That year, he went 27-for-42. So far this year, he is 32-40 from the stripe and posts the second-best average on the team at 80 percent.

LOBO DEFENSE, RISING TO THE CHALLENGE

The Lobos held Wisconsin last Tuesday to just 34.0 percent shooting from the floor and just 7.7 percent shooting from behind the arc. The last time the Lobo defense stepped up like that was on Jan. 5, 2019 in UNM's exciting defeat of then No. 5/6 Nevada inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit.

In that win, which shattered the Wolf Pack's 14-win streak last season, UNM allowed Nevada to shoot just 33.3 percent from the floor (19-57) and 18.2 percent from three (4-22). The numbers mark the last time the Lobos allowed an opponent to shoot less than 35 percent from the floor and less than 20 percent from 3-point range.

4 GAMES OF 90+

The Lobos registered at least 90 points in each of their first four wins this season. The last time the Lobos scored in the 90s in four straight games was in Paul Weir's first year toward the end of the season during the Lobos' exciting, unexpected 7-0 run en route to a loss in the Mountain West title contest.

In that run, UNM topped Wyoming 119-114, UNLV 91-90, Colorado State 108-87 and Fresno State 95-86.

LYLE MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle was named Mountain West Player of the Week on Nov. 18 for his outstanding performance that included a career-high 31 points in UNM's Legends Classic contest against Green Bay on Nov. 13. In that contest, Lyle went 9-for-16 from the floor, 5-for-9 from 3-point range and a perfect 8-for-8 from the free throw line.

He followed up his performance with 18 points against McNeese on Nov. 16 that included a trio of threes and 7-for-8 shooting from the line. The seven shots included the final four of the game in the final minute to seal the Lobo win.

On the week, Lyle averaged 24.5 points per game to go along with 5.0 rebounds per contest.

LOBOS RECEIVING VOTES

Prior to UNM's loss against No. 18/19 Auburn, the Lobos were receiving votes in the Associated Press poll for the first time in Paul Weir's tenure at UNM. In fact, the last time New Mexico received votes in the polls was on Nov. 23, 2015 with a vote in the USA Today Coaches Poll. Prior to that, the Lobos were ranked No. 17 in the final AP poll of 2014.

LYLE ON FIRE

Redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle is officially on fire as he has worked to get back into the groove after missing a pair of seasons on the court. He has steadily improved his scoring production from nine points in game one of the season to 18 in game two and a career-high 31 in game three.

Lyle has registered in double figures in all of UNM's nine games except two. He has amassed 151 points in nine games and ranks second in the MW in total points.

THE QUIET LEADER

Junior Makuach Maluach, who is the only Lobo to have seen the court consistently for UNM over the past three seasons, continues to serve as a consistent but quiet leader on the court. He has racked up double figures in five of UNM's nine games this season, averaging 10.4 points per game in 25.4 minutes per contest. He leads the UNM squad with 33 games as a Lobo scoring in double digits.

BRAGG ABOUT IT

Redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr. nearly boasts a double-double on average this season with 11.9 points and 9.6 rebounds per game on the season. He has also collected 12 blocks and 10 steals and ranks 17th in the nation in total rebounds with 86.

LOW THREES? NO PROBLEM.

Head coach Paul Weir in his first two seasons has had a squad that has lived and died by the three. Last season, UNM posted 15 games in which the Lobos scored 10 3-pointers or more. In the first four games of the season, UNM won by a hefty margin and averaged 93.0 points, without reaching the 10-three threshold.

In fact, UNM has still not reached the 10-three threshold and is 7-2 on the season. UNM has been outscored from behind the arc in all but one game this

LONG NOVEMBER

The Lobos had a long, action-packed November this season. Last season, UNM competed in just five contests in Turkey Month while this season, the Lobos took on eight different regular-season opponents, including 2019 Final Four participant Auburn. Four of those contests were at home while the other four were on a pair of road trips. UNM completed its lengthy November with a 6-2 record.

ABOUT THE 2019-20 LOBOS

The 2019-20 Lobos feature eight returning letterwinners including three starters. Starters include redshirt-junior Vance Jackson, junior Makuach Maluach and redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr. Joining the trio are senior Corey Manigault, redshirt-junior Keith McGee, sophomore Tavian Percy, redshirt-sophomore Clay Patterson and sophomore Jordan Arroyo.

STARTER STATS

The trio of returning starters from the 2018-19 season return some impressive stats. Jackson collected 13.1 points per game last season to go along with 7.0 rebounds and a 40.5 percent shooting clip. Jackson saw action in all 32 games last season along with Maluach, who started 28 of them. Maluach registered 9.9 points per game while Bragg posted 10.5 points and 8.8 rebounds per contest to go along with shooting 49 percent from the floor.

Adding to his experience from Ohio State, redshirt-junior Zane Martin hails from Towson while redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell last saw the floor at Texas A&M and redshirt-sophomore Vante Hendrix last competed at Utah.

SWITCH IT UP

For a fresh look this season, several players have made some jersey number switches. Redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg will don #15 instead of #35 this season while redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle will rock the #5 jersey instead of last season's #13. Last year's #5, Clay Patterson, has also switched to #20.

PAIR OF KWACHES?

Don't adjust your speakers this season or yell at the television thinking the announcers have it wrong. The Lobos now have TWO "Kwaches." Junior Makuach Maluach serves as the original "Kwach" while freshman Emmanuel Kuac (pronounced Kwach) is affectionately referred to by the team as "Baby Kwach." Lobos Remain Undefeated at Home; Top Montana 72-63

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team extended its unbeaten streak at home to 5-0 on Sunday afternoon with a 72-63 win over the Montana Grizzlies. The Lobos were powered by a 20-point, 14-rebound effort from redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr. in his second double-double of the season.

With the win, the Lobos improve to 7-2 on the season while the Grizzlies drop to 3-5 overall. Montana's losses this season include Sunday's game against UNM, as well as Stanford, Arkansas and No. 25 Washington.

On the night, the Lobos were edged in field goal percentage 43.1 - 43.3 but fired at a clip of 46.2 percent from behind the arc while holding the Griz to just 31.8 percent from three. UNM outrebounded Montana 43-31 while turning the ball over just nine times, marking UNM's lowest turnover total of the season.

The first half of Sunday's contest was one heavy on defensive effort as neither team reached double digits through the first 7:34. In fact, the Lobos went scoreless for 6:56 before Bragg registered a pair of free throws to make it a two-point game, 10-8, in favor of Montana.

"What's been best [about Bragg] has been his free throw shooting," head coach Paul Weir said. "To have a big of his size, that you can feel confident with every time he goes to the free throw line is a great benefit to the program and our team. Today he was [also] finishing around the rim terrific and [had a big block]."

Three minutes and nine seconds after snapping UNM's cold spell from the floor, Bragg was found behind the arc by redshirt-junior Zane Martin, who collected 11 points of his own on the night, and Bragg sunk his first career 3-pointer to spark a 9-0 run that included back-to-back-back threes by not only Bragg, but also sophomore Tavian Percy and redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle.

The burst of energy and points took UNM from trailing by four to leading by five, 19-14 at the 6:51 mark of the first half. UNM would not relinquish the lead for the remainder of the half.

The Lobos traded quick threes with Montana as freshman Josh Vazquez, who posted 16 points on the day, followed Lyle's three but on the next possession, redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell knocked one down from 3-point range to keep it a five-point game, 22-17 Lobos.

It was Bragg that gave UNM its largest leads of the half with a layup at the 4:54 mark for a seven-point Lobo advantage, 24-17, and again with just 50 seconds left when he hit a pair from the stripe. He pushed the Lobo lead to eight to cap an 8-0 run, 32-24. Montana hit a jumper with 25 seconds left to end the half on an 8-2 Lobo run for the 32-26 score at the break.

Montana came out of the locker room with a pair of free throws at the 19:06 mark to make it a four-point game, 32-28, before junior Makuach Maluach, who had a quiet first half, scored five straight for UNM. Maluach hit a fast-break three to make it a seven-point game, followed with a dunk, his third of the season, to put the Lobos up by nine.

Montana reclaimed the lead just once more with 8:59 left on the clock when redshirt-senior Kendal Manuel hit a three to put the Griz up by one, 50-49. The lead was short-lived however as Bragg hit yet another pair of free throws to put UNM up for good, 51-50 with 8:35 left to play.

UNM continued to add to the lead and eventually got out to a 10-point advantage, the largest lead of the game, with 1:09 left when Martin hit a free throw to make it 69-59 en route to the nine-point, 72-63 final.

Bragg went 9-for-11 from the free throw line and 5-for-8 from the floor on his way to leading UNM with his 20 points. He was followed by Lyle who registered 16 points and three assists. Martin was the third Lobo to collect double figures with 11 while Caldwell led UNM with five assists and three steals.

Montana was led by senior Sayeed Pridgett who posted 25 points, 10 rebounds and five assists along with Vazquez who notched 16 points.

The Lobos are set to return to action Wednesday, Dec. 4 when they kick off Mountain West play with a 7 p.m. contest against Boise State inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit.

Alston Guides Broncos to Big Win

BOISE, Idaho - Derrick Alston Jr. turned in a complete performance to lead Boise State men's basketball to a 80-59 win Friday, over UNC Wilmington at ExtraMile Arena. Alston finished with 24 points, seven rebounds and a career-high seven assists. The Broncos (4-2) have won three consecutive games.

RJ Williams added 21 points and eight rebounds, while Justinian Jessup contributed 19 points and six boards. Jessup had 16 points and four rebounds in the decisive second half.

Boise State scored the first 10 points of the game, but UNC Wilmington (5-4) rallied back to within two and at halftime the Broncos led 35-30. Early in the second half, the Seahawks cut the margin to one at 39-38, before the Broncos took over.

"Each and every game we're just trying to get a little bit better at everything we do," Alston said. "We definitely wanted to play well tonight and get this win before getting into conference play."

The Broncos' next home game is Saturday Dec. 7, against Colorado State. Tipoff is at 7 p.m. MT, following the Mountain West Football Championship, which kicks off at 2 p.m. at Albertsons Stadium. Fans with a ticket to the football game can purchase tickets for the men's basketball game that night for \$5 each, while supplies last.

Lobos Heating Up, Edge Boise State on Senior Night

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team is heating up at the right time - heading into the close of the regular season and into the conference tournament - after edging Boise State 73-72 at home inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit on Senior Night Wednesday.

Following the evening's matchup, seniors Dane Kuiper and Anthony Mathis were honored in front of over 10,000 fans, accompanied by friends and family after their four years as Lobos.

"That's the perfect way to end," Mathis said. "We all finally came together and played for one another. Everyone kept saying 'let's do it for the seniors' and I really appreciate it. It's been a crazy year and to just finally come together and win one of those close games (is great.)"

Mathis hit a pair of threes on Wednesday night to put him at 100 3-pointers this season, just three away from breaking the UNM single-season 3-pointer record (102 set in 1998-99 by Kevin Henry). He also ranks fifth in program history in career 3-pointers with 216 and extended his 3-pointer streak to 22 games for tie for fourth in UNM history.

A clutch 3-pointer from sophomore Makuach Maluach put the Lobos ahead by just one point, 73-72, with 1:27 left on the clock as UNM attempted to close out the back-and-forth match that saw eight lead changes and six ties. After a pair of missed Lobo free throws with 8.2 seconds left on the clock it was the Broncos to get the defensive rebound and one last chance at the win.

Boise State drove down the court and worked to the right wing, where Kuiper was waiting. He swatted the ball and collected the steal, his 26th of the season, to seal the victory for UNM.

"It felt great that I could contribute something to the team and win a game by doing it (getting the steal)," Kuiper said. "I just saw him bring that ball up and I swiped at it, and I got it. So it's a great feeling, on Senior Night especially."

"Dane Kuiper is one of the best defenders I've ever played with, or against," Mathis said. It's a picture-perfect ending."

The Lobos led by as many as 13, 38-25, with 4:24 left in the first half when Boise State cut it to 10 points on a layup and a jumper split by a Maluach free throw, 39-29.

Sophomore Keith McGee, who totaled 11 points on the night, hit a layup to make it a 12-point game at the half, 41-29.

The Broncos came out hot in the second half, going on an 11-2 run that included a pair of threes by leading scorers Justinian Jessup and Derrick Alston, cutting the UNM lead to just three, 43-40, with 15:13 on the clock. Jessup and Alston led all players in scoring on the night with 23 points apiece.

Junior Corey Manigault, who led the Lobos on the night with 19 points, just one shy of his UNM career high, scored the next four straight points on free throws to put the Lobos back up by seven, 47-40. A BSU dunk took it back to five but Manigault hit a jumper and Maluach nailed a pair from the stripe to push the Lobo lead back to nine, 51-42, with 13:15 left.

Manigault scored the first eight points for UNM in the second half and finished 5-for-11 from the field but a perfect 9-for-9 from the free throw line. He led four Lobos to score in double figures including redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson (12), McGee (11) and redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg (11). Bragg also racked up a team-high nine rebounds, just short of his third double-double of the season while collecting three blocks.

The squads tied the contest four more times en route to the 73-72 final. Last time Boise State visited Albuquerque, the Broncos came away with a 73-71 win with a last-minute comeback on Feb. 6, 2018.

With the win, the Lobos are now tied for seventh in the Mountain West standings and could possibly finish sixth, seventh or eighth on the season heading into the tournament.

On the night, the Broncos outshot UNM 47.4 percent to 41.5 percent for the Lobos and 40.0 - 38.5 percent from behind the arc. UNM did, however, outrebound Boise State 35-29 marking the third straight game that UNM has dominated the boards.

The Lobos return to action on Saturday, March 9 as they travel to Wyoming for their season finale at 4 p.m. MT on ESPN3.

Coach Jimmy Valvano and the Wolfpack downed the Cougars on a last second put back by Lorenzo Charles. 

- Less than 30 of 345 NCAA Division I basketball programs play in a college-only arena named after a business or organization founded or headquartered in its home state.
- The Lobos have averaged an astounding 15,410 fans the past 49 years, an amazing 95% of capacity
- The Pit has ranked in the top 25 in attendance nationally nearly every season since the 1966-67 season with 35 seasons in the top ten in the NCAA in attendance
- Led the Mountain West in attendance in 10 of the conference's 15 years of existence
- The floor is named Bob King Court in honor of the former head coach who led the Lobos from 1963 to 1972.



Men's Basketball Opens Season with 20+ Point Win

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team opened its season with a 21-point victory over Eastern New Mexico on Wednesday evening inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. Five Lobos racked up double figures in the 92-71 win.

The first points of the 2019-20 season came on a steal and a layup when redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell went coast-to-coast to kick off his first outing as a Lobo 1:15 into the first half - and the action didn't stop there. The Lobos debuted at a break-neck speed in their season opener in which the fiery offense shot 60.0 percent from the field.

The Lobos were led by a quiet 16 points from junior Makuach Maluach, who scored seven points in the first half before adding eight more in just the first five minutes of the second half. Maluach was joined in the double-digit club by redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr, redshirt-junior Zane Martin and senior Corey Manigault, each with 13 points apiece, as well as redshirt-junior Keith McGee who posted 12.

The last time the Lobos had five double-digit scorers was against Iona at the start of last season, on Nov. 13, 2018.

In addition to the reliable shooting, the Lobos also saw redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle, who has sat the bench for two years as a Lobo (the first due to NCAA transfer rules, the second due to injury), not only scored nine points to go along with four rebounds, but also racked up an outstanding 11 assists. Lyle regularly found players down-court, firing passes between defenders, much to The Pit crowd's delight.

New Mexico had just one Lobo collect 10+ assists in a game last season, Druce Drinnon on Dec. 30, 2018 against the University of the Southwest. Prior to that, it was former Lobo Antino Jackson, who was known for his knack for the assist, on Feb. 10, 2018 at Air Force.

In fact, Lyle nearly posted the first double-double in points and assists since Jackson did so in that game.

UNM went into the locker room at the half up by 11, 45-34, and shooting 62.1 percent compared to 40.7 percent (11-27) for the Greyhounds. However, Eastern New Mexico was dominating behind the arc, firing at a clip of 50.0 percent compared to 36.4 percent for UNM.

"Offense isn't my concern right now," head coach Paul Weir said. "We need to value the basketball more, which I think [was tonight] a little more careless than it is skill... We have a lot of potential, but I don't think we're going to reach it unless we can find a way to become a good defensive basketball team."

"I think we showed some flashes of it tonight, but obviously not anywhere we want to be, but that's expected."

The teams traded baskets in favor of ENMU, four points to two, throughout the first 1:12 of the second half before the Lobos exploded on a 13-0 run that started with a fast-break layup by Caldwell, included a Lyle 3-pointer and ended with a Maluach free throw for his 16th point at the 15:48 mark.

The run lasted 2:20 and put the Lobos on top by 23 points, a margin that was not relinquished until 2:56 on the clock as the Lobo starters began exiting the game.

UNM got the lead up to as many as 28 points, 81-53 with 8:01 on the clock en route to the 21-point win.

On the night, UNM fired 60 points from the floor (33-55), 35 percent from 3-point range and 73.1 percent from the stripe. ENMU finished 37.3 percent from the field, 33.3 percent from 3-point range and 65 percent from the free throw line.

Leading the Greyhounds were a pair of double-digit scorers including senior Darius Sawyer (11 points) and junior Iban Zaid (10 points). UNM limited ENMU's returning leading scorer, junior Devin Pullum, to just seven points on the night. Pullum averaged 12.7 points per game last season.

The Lobos return to action on Saturday, Nov. 9 against CSUN at 7 p.m. Last season, UNM opened its campaign on the road in Northridge, claiming the victory on a buzzer-beating three.

Lobos 2-0 After 27-Point Rout of CSUN

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team has kicked off the 2019-20 season 2-0 after earning a 27-point victory over the visiting CSUN Matadors inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit on Saturday night by a score of 97-70. The win marks the second 20+ point victory margin for the Lobos as the squad is averaging 94.5 points over its first two games.

In addition, 27 points marks the largest margin of victory for the Lobos over the Matadors in series history. UNM now leads the series 7-0 (5-0 in The Pit) and the victory margin surpasses 17 points set on Dec. 1, 1969, which marked the squads' first ever meeting.

For the second straight game, UNM (2-0) boasted five scorers in double figures including redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle who powered the Lobos offensively with 18 points and five assists. Lyle went 7-for-10 from the floor, 2-for-4 from 3-point range and a perfect 2-for-2 from the free throw line.

Joining Lyle in leading the squad in scoring was redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg (17), senior Corey Manigault (17), redshirt-junior Zane Martin (13) and redshirt-junior Keith McGee. Bragg went 6-for-7 from the floor and 5-for-7 from the stripe. Saturday's game marks the second straight that Bragg, Manigault, Martin and McGee have racked up double figures.

Leading UNM defensively was junior Makuach Maluach who posted a team-high eight rebounds. Eight rebounds is just two away from Maluach's career high of 10. As a squad defensively, the Lobos outrebounded the Matadors 36-30 and forced 16 turnovers which they converted to 26 points.

"It was a step for sure defensively tonight. Probably a bigger one than I even anticipated. (CSUN) is a good team," head coach Paul Weir said. "They play hard, you could see the way they came out. They have good athletes, they made some shots early and got into a bit of a rhythm and fortunately our defense was able to still settle in after that and get enough stops to take a step."

"It's crazy that this isn't really about winning and losing as much as it is about just trusting our process and continuing to grow."

UNM started out hot with an 8-0 run to get out to an early 11-3 lead, however the squads battled throughout the first half until a 9-0 run gave the Lobos some breathing room with a 10-point advantage, 38-28 with 1:48 left in the first half. The Lobos extended the lead to as many as 14, outscoring CSUN (0-2) by a score of 18-3 over 8:47 at the end of the half. CSUN redshirt-junior Lance Coleman II hit a three with five seconds left to make it an 11-point game at the break.

At the half, the Lobos were firing at a clip of 64 percent from the field (16-25) led by Lyle with 11 points going 4-for-6. From behind the arc, UNM shot 37.5 percent in the first half to go along with an 88.9 percent shot from the stripe (8-for-9). CSUN shot 36.4 percent from the floor in the first half, 38.5 percent from behind the arc and 37.5 percent from the foul line.

With momentum in their favor, the Lobos didn't let up in the second half. The relentless Lobo offense opened with a dunk from Bragg just 13 seconds in to make the score 45-32.

UNM held CSUN scoreless for 2:51 en route to a 16-point lead at the 14:22 mark in the second half before a McGee and-1 put the Lobos on top 60-43 in front of a roaring Pit crowd of over 10,000 fans.

The Lobos continued to pile on the points, getting out to as much as a 29-point lead with 1:56 left on the clock before CSUN scored a pair of points for the 27-point final.

On the night, UNM shot 60 percent for the second straight game (36-60) but shot just 37.5 percent from 3-point range (6-16). CSUN improved its shooting percentage to 44.4 percent after the second half in which the squad shot 53.3 percent.

The Matadors were led by a pair of players in double figures including Coleman (19) and junior Terrell Gomez (14).

The Lobos are set to return to action for the third game of their four-game season-opening homestand on Wednesday, Nov. 13 against Green Bay. Tipoff is scheduled for 7 p.m.

Game 3 - New Mexico 93, Green Bay 78 Nov. 13, 2019 | Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit

Lobos Make it Three in a Row; Top GB 93-78

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- For the third-straight game, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team outscored its opponent by double figures while racking up at least 90 points on Wednesday night with a 93-78 victory over the visiting Green Bay Phoenix. Redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle led the Lobos with a career-high 31 points while fellow redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg Jr. posted his first double-double of the season en route to the victory.

The Lobos (3-0) closed the game in style Wednesday night when, despite head coach Paul Weir shouting to his team not to shoot the ball, the crowd was so loud that the squad couldn't hear the instruction. With 21 seconds left on the clock, the Lobos up by 15 and energy filling The Pit, senior Corey Manigault grabbed a defensive rebound and lobbed the ball to redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell, who drove to the other end and tossed the ball up behind him, where junior Makuach Maluach was waiting.

Maluach leapt from the ground for the dunk that put New Mexico up 17 (93-76) and the Lobo fans roared.

Green Bay (1-2) responded with a fast-break layup with 11 seconds left for the 15-point final.

Lyle's 31 points surpassed his previous career-high of 29, which he achieved as a freshman at Ohio State. The senior went 9-for-16 from the floor including 5-for-9 from behind the arc and a perfect 8-for-8 from the free throw line.

Maluach posted 16 points for the second time this season while shooting almost perfect from everywhere on the court. He made all but one (6-7) field goal attempt while going a perfect 2-for-2 from 3-point range and 2-for-2 from the line.

Bragg's double-double of 11 points and 16 rebounds marks his first since the end of last season. His career high in rebounds is 20, which he collected on March 9 against Wyoming. Bragg has posted 10+ rebounds nine times in his career at UNM but Wednesday marked his first time this season.

As a team, UNM outrebounded the Phoenix 47-38 while forcing 16 turnovers and racking up 20 steals.

The Lobos led by an early five points at the 17:47 mark on a Maluach three before Green Bay flipped the script to go up by four when junior PJ Pipes made a fast break layup to put the Phoenix up four. Pipes helped lead Green Bay tying for a team-high 17 points.

Neither team had a significant advantage until the Lobos embarked on an 8-0 run to take a one-point game to a nine-point game (32-23) with 7:31 left to play in the first half. At the 2:58 mark, McNeese had whittled the Lobo lead back down to one, but another 7-0 run capped by a three from sophomore Tavian Percy made it an eight point game with 1:06 left. The Phoenix scored a last-second layup to make it a six-point game at the half, 49-43.

Despite giving up 43 points in the first half, the Lobos allowed just 35 points in the second half to outscore Green Bay by nine in the frame, 44-35.

The Lobos jumped out with five straight points to kick off the second half including a Maluach layup and a Lyle three to give UNM an 11-point lead. The Phoenix cut it to four at the 15:07 mark but the Lobos soon began to run away with the game.

The second half was highlighted by a 9-0 run, the longest of the game, that put UNM up by 18 points with just 4:30 left. McNeese State got no closer than 13 throughout the remainder of the contest.

Wednesday night's contest was the next-to-last opportunity for fans to see the Lobos before they embark on a long road trip for four road games, not returning to The Pit until Dec. 1. Saturday's 4 p.m. contest against McNeese State will be the last opportunity - not to mention Lobo fans' first chance to purchase NM State single-game tickets.

Game 4 - New Mexico 90, McNeese 80 Nov. 16, 2019 | Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit

Manigault's 24 Powers Lobos Past McNeese, 90-80

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team finished off an exciting game on Saturday afternoon to improve to 4-0 as the Lobos claimed a 90-80 victory over McNeese (1-4) in the final minutes inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. Senior Corey Manigault tied his career-high 24 points in the contest as once again, five Lobos registered double figures on the day.

Manigault went 6-for-8 from the floor, battling in the low post, while scoring 12 more on free throws and posting six rebounds and three steals. The last time he scored 24 points was on Jan. 6, 2018 while at Indian Hills CC.

"I've said it before, I think Corey is the best low-post, left-block scorer I've ever had," head coach Paul Weir said. "For him to get six rebounds, no turnovers and three steals was huge for him. Every day I see him becoming a more impactful player on the floor and to see him finishing out the game is a big testament to how far he's come."

Additional standout performers in the matchup included redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr. who racked up 18 boards and five assists to go along with six points, redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle who collected 18 points, four assists and five rebounds, junior Makuach Maluach (12 points) and redshirt-junior Vance Jackson who registered his first double-digit scoring game of the season (11).

Redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell dishd 10 assists on the day and contributed four steals, filling in key roles off the bench while taking just one shot from the floor.

"When you play with a lot of scorers, you want to get the ball to them when they're in their spots," Caldwell said. "They're essentially our playmakers. I'm an unselfish person so I don't really care about shooting. It doesn't really matter to me as long as we get the win and our scorers are scoring."

With the score tied at 78 apiece with just 2:29 left to play, the Lobos amassed significant momentum, collecting four of their 17 steals in just the final two minutes of the contest.

Manigault put the Lobos up by two, 80-78 with a pair of free throws and then up by four (82-78) with a layup before McNeese's Leondre Washington made a pair from the stripe to cut the deficit back to two (82-80) with 1:10 left on the clock.

The Lobos got the ball back - but quickly turned it over - and it looked as if the Cowboys were about to tie it up again until - a Caldwell steal put the ball back in New Mexico possession with 42 seconds left in front of a roaring crowd. Caldwell quickly fired to Manigault who slammed an emphatic dunk to put UNM back up by four, 84-80.

Weir called a full timeout and the Lobos came out with another steal, this one from Manigault, and Lyle drew the foul to make two more free throws and give UNM a more comfortable, six-point lead (86-80).

A near-brawl under the Lobo basket caused the Cowboys' Kuxhausen to foul out and earned the Lobos four shots on both a technical foul and an intentional foul. Lyle took all four, putting them away for the 90-80 final.

In the final 2:29, UNM went on a 12-2 run with six points coming from Manigault and the other six coming from Lyle. UNM closed the game on an 8-0 run.

McNeese jumped on top early in the contest, leading UNM 10-3 just 1:40 into the first half. The Cowboys extended their lead to 10 at the 16:04 mark and again at the 15:07 mark before the Lobos started to come back.

"I have to tip my hat to McNeese, I thought they played terrific tonight," Weir said. "They made a ton of great shots, a lot of high quality shots... This team was a good test for us and I think we needed a game like that. Hopefully in the long run, games like this will serve us well."

New Mexico went on an 11-2 run to make it a one-point game, 19-18 McNeese, at the 11:48 mark before a pair of free throws put the Cowboys up three.

Redshirt-junior Keith McGee tied the game at the 10:20 mark on a dunk, assisted by Caldwell, before redshirt-junior Vance Jackson gave the Lobos their first lead on a pair of free throws, 25-23, with 8:27 left in the first half.

Jackson, who has been quiet so far this season, hit a three with 4:49 left in the half to put the Lobos ahead by two on route to a five-point Lobo advantage at the half.

On the day, McNeese outshot the Lobos 50.0 percent to 47.5 percent from the floor. The Lobos shot just 43.8 percent in the first half but followed it up with 51.9 percent in the second half. The Cowboys also outshot UNM from three as they went 44.8 percent from behind the arc compared to 40 percent for the Lobos.

UNM outscored the Cowboys in the paint, however, by a commanding margin (40-28), as well as in second-half contests (18-9), fast-break points (32-10) and points off the bench (43-23).

The Lobos are set to hit the road for a pair of road trips, the first will feature a contest against UTEP on Tuesday, Nov. 19, in El Paso before the Lobos take on in-state rival NM State on Thursday, Nov. 21 at 7 p.m.

Game 5 - New Mexico 63, UTEP 66 Nov. 19, 2019 | Don Haskins Center

Lobos Suffer First Loss at Buzzer in El Paso

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team suffered its first loss of the season on the road at UTEP on Tuesday night when JaQuan Lyle last-second score just barely missed the buzzer. The Lobos fell 66-63 in the contest that had eight ties and 6:53 of tied ball game.

With the loss, UTEP remains undefeated (4-0) while the Lobos post their first blemish of the season, slipping to 4-1.

In the first half, both teams were shooting below 40 percent from the field with a 30-30 halftime score and it was obvious the long-time rivals were going to have a defensive battle.

"I thought [UTEP's] defense was really good," head coach Paul Weir said. "We left some points ... around the rim and some layups and left some points at the free throw line as well on our end. But I don't want to take away from UTEP's defense. I thought they were very physical and played us really well, especially to start the game."

The squads went through seven possessions to kick off the contest that included three turnover/steal combos before a single point was scored. The first point of the matchup didn't come until the 15:21 mark when redshirt-junior Vance Jackson notched a free throw, his first of four points on the night.

Following the slow offensive start, UTEP began to pile on the points, holding the Lobo offense at the other end. The Miners went on a 10-0 run following the free throw to make it 10-1 at the 14:38 mark. UNM senior Corey Manigault fired off a pair of free throws to end the run and make it a seven-point game (10-3) before the Lobo offense started to find a rhythm.

UNM came back on a 9-0 run over 1:47 to tie the game 10-10 at the 12:24 mark. The run included Manigault's free throws and a pair of threes, the first from junior Makuach Maluach, the second from redshirt-senior Lyle.

At one point late in the second half, Maluach was a perfect 4-for-4 from the floor, 2-for-2 from 3-point range and 1-for-1 from the stripe. The junior finished 4-for-6 on the night including a 2-for-3 mark from the field for a total of 11 points, four rebounds and two steals.

Lyle finished with a game-high 19 points on the night following his Mountain West Player of the Week honor for his performance last week. He also posted eight rebounds, second-most on the team, and a team-high four assists.

UTEP jumped back out on top with a pair of free throws by sophomore Efe Odigie, who finished second on the Miner squad in points with 12. UTEP built a six-point lead with 5:52 left in the first half before a 6-0 Lobo run tied it at 24 apiece. The run included a Maluach and-1 to make it a three-point game (24-21), a jumper by redshirt-junior Zane Martin and a free throw from Lyle, 24-24.

The squads went back and forth for the remaining 2:40 of the first half and the Lobos got on top by two Lyle free throws with eight seconds left, but an Odigie layup at the last second marked the fifth tie of the game for the 30-30 halftime score.

At the break, both teams combined for 17 turnovers of which UNM capitalized for 14 points while UTEP collected 10.

UNM shot 36.4 percent from the floor at the half (8-22) and 33.3 percent from 3-point land (3-9) while leaving five points at the charity stripe (11-16, 68.8 percent). UTEP just barely outshot the Lobos from the floor at 37.9 percent but shot worse from three (26.7 percent, 4-for-15). The Miners did however, make 4-of-5 free throws for an 80 percent mark from the line.

The second half started out with a quick UTEP three in just the first 19 seconds of the frame, but Maluach matched it just 18 seconds later for the sixth tie of the match, 33-33. A 6-0 UTEP run made it 39-33 at the 17:09 mark before the Lobos again whittled away, making it a two-point game just 3:18 later.

Neither team was able to gain more than a four-point advantage throughout the remainder of the contest and it was the home team that had a one-point edge with 1:53 left on the clock.

A dunk from Martin put the Lobos ahead by one with 53 seconds left, 63-62, but it was followed by a jumper from UTEP's Jordan Lathan 26 seconds later to put the Miners back up by one, 64-63.

With three seconds left, Maluach attempted a three for the lead from the right wing but missed and Coach Weir called his full timeout. A Lyle foul to stop the clock allowed UTEP's Bryson Williams to score a pair of free throws for a three-point Miner advantage before Weir called a 30-second timeout with 1.1 left on the clock.

Martin threw the ball in from under the basket, finding Lyle at half court, Lyle collected the ball, dribbled a step, and fired - making the long three. But upon review, the shot did not leave Lyle's hands in time and 66-63 was the final.

Three Lobos scored in double figures on the night including Lyle (19), Maluach (11) and redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg (10). Bragg also led all players in rebounding with nine.

UTEP was led by grad student Daryl Edwards (18), Odigie (12), Lathon (10) and redshirt-sophomore Souley Boum (10).

On the night, the Miners outshot UNM 42.9 - 38.8 percent from the field and 84.6 - 64.5 percent from the free throw line. The Lobos edged UTEP from 3-point range, 26.3 percent to 25.0 percent. UNM also rebounded the Miners 36-31 and registered 26 points off of turnovers compared to 21 for UTEP.

The Lobos will get just one day of rest before taking on another long-time rival, NM State, in Las Cruces on Thursday. The squads are set to face off at 7 p.m. Thursday night at the Pan American Center.

Lobos Down Aggies in 78-77 Thriller on the Road

LAS CRUCES, N.M. --- For the first time in head coach Paul Weir's tenure, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team claimed a victory over in-state rival NM State in a thrilling fashion on Thursday night. The contest came down to the final possession and the Lobos took the win 78-77 on the road.

The Lobo victory snaps a five-win streak for the Aggies (2-3) and also marks the first time the Lobos (5-1) have won in Las Cruces since Nov. 15, 2015 when UNM claimed an 83-74 victory. UNM also improves to 122-101 over the Aggies in series history with the win.

The Aggies have suffered just 13 losses at home in the Pan American Center since the 2011-12 season and six of those come at the hands of the Lobos.

Redshirt-junior JaQuan Lyle once again led the Lobo squad with 24 points on the night going 9-for-14 from the floor, 2-for-5 from three and 4-for-5 from the free throw line. He also posted a pair of assists and three steals. Redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr. also scored in double figures, registering 14 points on the night to go along with six rebounds and a game-high four steals. He also had the only block on the night.

Thursday night's rebound leader was redshirt-junior Vance Jackson who nearly racked up a double-double with seven rebounds and nine points. Two other players collected nine points including junior Makuach Maluach and redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell.

With seven ties and 12 lead changes, Thursday night's contest was truly a rivalry battle. The Lobos started out strong with a quick four points but the Aggies roared back to get on top by as many as nine midway through first half before the Lobos chipped the NM State lead back to two with 4:03 left in the half. UNM outscored the Aggies 12-5 over 5:11 and capped the run with a Lyle three before the final media timeout of the first half.

Over the final minutes of the first frame, the Lobos kept playing catchup with NM State, which couldn't get more than a four-point advantage. A jumper by redshirt-junior Zane Martin with just 23 seconds left made it a two-point game at the half, 39-37 Aggies.

Both teams came out of the locker room on a mission in the second half. NM State's largest lead was five just 1:39 into the half but over the next two minutes, an 8-2 Lobo run put UNM up by one, 47-46, on a fast-break layup by Maluach. The play marked the first time the Lobos had led since 2:44 into the contest.

NM State quickly took the lead back on a senior Terrell Brown three with 16 minutes left and UNM didn't regain the lead again until the 11:41 mark when Bragg made a layup to make it 56-54 Lobos.

The game remained tight as neither team led by more than four for the remainder of the contest. UNM got out to a four-point lead on a 7-0 run that was sparked by a three from redshirt-junior Keith McGee and four straight points in the paint by senior Corey Manigault, 67-63 Lobos.

The squads tied the contest three more times, including on a fast-break jumper from Caldwell with just 1:33 left to play, 75-75.

Caldwell was fouled on the play and made the and-1 to put the Lobos back up by one, 76-75, and that's when things got interesting.

The Aggies went back up by one with 1:17 left, but the next 28 seconds were full of fouls and game stoppage before Bragg hit a pair of free throws to give the Lobos another one-point advantage, 78-77.

Throughout the final 43 seconds, the Lobo defense battled on the Aggie end of the court, forcing a pair of turnovers while committing two of its own. The referees continued to review the plays and possession changed back and forth. Just as the Lobos looked to head down court for a chance at extending the lead, the Aggies would get the ball back for another chance at the win.

The Lobo defense however, kept the Aggies from getting off a good shot, without fouling, and NM State senior Shunn Buchanan attempted a 3-point buzzer beater and missed for the 78-77 final.

On the night, the Lobos outshot the Aggies from the floor 53.8 percent to 43.8 percent. The Lobos also outperformed the Aggies from 3-point range 27.6 percent (4-15) to 21.2 percent (7-33).

Both teams collected seven steals, NM State registered 17 assists to UNM's 10 and the Aggies outrebounded UNM 37-29.

UNM led for just 6:31 of the contest before delivering the loss in the final minutes.

The Lobos are set to return to action on Monday, Nov. 25 and Tuesday, Nov. 26 in Brooklyn New York for the 2019 Roman Legends Classic presented by Old Trapper. The Lobos will kick off play in New York against 2019 Final Four participant (and currently undefeated) Auburn on Monday before taking on either Wisconsin or Richmond Tuesday.

Lobos Overwhelmed by No. 18/19 Auburn in Semifinal

BROOKLYN, N.Y. --- Despite a strong start against undefeated, No. 18/19 Auburn on Monday night, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team (5-2) suffered an 84-59 loss to the Tigers (6-0) in the semifinal round of the 2019 Roman Legends Classic presented by Old Trapper at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn. The contest had three lead changes before the Tigers ran away with the game.

With the loss, UNM will take on Wisconsin, which is also receiving votes in the latest Associated Press poll, on Tuesday evening at 5 p.m. ET (3 p.m. MT) in the consolation game. Wisconsin (5-2) fell to Richmond on Monday by a final score of 62-52.

Neither team shot particularly well on the night as the Lobos finished the contest shooting just 40.3 percent from the floor compared to 42.1 percent for the Tigers. Auburn did however, collect 12 3-pointers (of 38 fired from behind the arc) while the Lobos collected just four, including a pair from redshirt-junior Vance Jackson.

UNM's best scoring run of 8-0 came twice, once in the first half and the second beginning at the 13:24 mark of the second half. After heading into the locker room down 35-24 at halftime, the Lobos attempted a comeback in the second half that was sparked by a dunk by redshirt-junior Keith McGee to make it a 25-point game (56-31).

McGee's spark was followed by layups by Jackson, redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell and another pair of points for McGee to make the game an 18-point contest before Auburn again picked up steam.

McGee was the story of the second half as he collected all 13 of his points and radiated positivity on the court to try to rally the Lobos in the final minutes.

In the final six minutes, both teams were trading dunks on possessions and McGee scored seven straight points for UNM starting with an alley-opp from Caldwell and adding an emphatic dunk followed by a three with 4:05 left. The energy sparked another Jackson three and also one from freshman Kurt Wegscheider, but the burst was not enough as UNM ultimately dropped the contest by 25 points.

Leading UNM on the night was junior Makuach Maluach who was a consistent presence on the court for UNM. Maluach notched 14 points as one of three Lobos to hit double figures. He went 5-for-7 from the floor and a perfect 4-for-4 from the free throw line while missing just one 3-point attempt.

McGee was second in scoring for UNM with 13 points followed by Jackson who registered his second double-figure game of the season with 10. Jackson also led the Lobos in rebounding in his 25 minutes on the court, racking up eight.

Auburn was powered by four Tigers in double figures including senior Samir Doughty who collected 19 while senior Austin Wiley posted the only double-double on the night with 14 points and 13 rebounds before fouling out with 2:37 left. Lobo redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr. also fouled out of the contest after collecting seven boards.

Auburn converted 28 points off of 24 Lobo turnovers while UNM collected just six steals on the night.

New Mexico is set to return to action in the consolation contest on Tuesday, Nov. 25 against (RV) Wisconsin at 5 p.m. ET (3 p.m. MT). The game will be broadcast live on ESPN2.

Game 8 - New Mexico 59, Wisconsin 50 Nov. 26, 2019 | Barclays Center

Lobos Take Down Wisconsin in Brooklyn, 59-50

BROOKLYN, N.Y. --- Following a disappointing defeat against No. 18/19 Auburn on Monday night, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team rebounded with a victory over (RV) Wisconsin on Tuesday in the Lobos' first win over a Power 5 team since 2012. Redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle led UNM with 14 points as one of four Lobos to register double figures as UNM topped the Badgers 59-50.

The contest wraps up the 2019 Roman Legends Classic presented by Old Trapper in New York. With the win, UNM improves to 6-2 while the Badgers slip to 4-3.

Along with Lyle's 14 points, a trio of Lobos racked up 12 apiece including redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg as well as redshirt-juniors JJ Caldwell and Zane Martin. Lyle also led UNM in rebounds with a season-high nine boards, followed by Bragg who posted six and Caldwell who collected five.

Caldwell's 12 points marked a new season high and along with his and Martin's dozen, the pair also registered the most assists on the court with three apiece as UNM had 13 assists while forcing 14 turnovers.

UNM led for 31:48 of the contest, leading 29-20 at the half, marking the second-lowest point total for the Lobos in a half this season. It was the Lobos' first-half advantage that won the game as both squads racked up an even 30 points in the second.

The Lobos started out strong in the first half getting out to an early four-point lead on a 3-pointer by redshirt-junior Vance Jackson at the 14:50 mark (9-5). The Badgers closed the gap and took a one-point lead (14-13), but the Lobos embarked on a 7-0 run with 6:47 left in the first half, sparked by a Bragg layup. Caldwell, who is typically the assist specialist on the squad, hit a jumper followed by a Lyle three to put the Lobos up by six, 20-14.

The Lobo advantage frazzled the Badger defense and UNM continued to pile on the points with another 7-0 run kicked off by a Caldwell triple (23-16). UNM got the advantage up to 11 twice in the final seconds of the first frame, the largest lead of the game, before the 29-20 first-half score. The Lobos outscored Wisconsin 16-6 over the final 6:47 of the first half.

The Lobos shot 44.4 percent from the field compared to 38.9 percent for the Badgers in the first half.

The Badgers whittled the score as close as three twice in the second half, but UNM never relinquished the lead.

On the night, the Lobos outshot Wisconsin 44.0 - 34.0 percent from the field including a 23.1 - 7.7 percent advantage from 3-point range. The Lobo defense held the Badgers to just two threes on the night out of 26 fired from behind the arc.

Wisconsin was led by junior Nate Reuvers who registered 16 points going 7-for-9 from the floor with five rebounds. Just one other Badger racked up double digits, redshirt-junior D'Mitrik Trice, who scored 11 with a team-high seven boards.

After a long road trip that included four tough contests, the Lobos will return to action inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit on Sunday, Dec. 1 against Montana at 1 p.m. The game will be broadcast on AT&T SportsNet.

Lobos Remain Undefeated at Home; Top Montana 72-63

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team extended its unbeaten streak at home to 5-0 on Sunday afternoon with a 72-63 win over the Montana Grizzlies. The Lobos were powered by a 20-point, 14-rebound effort from redshirt-senior Carlton Bragg Jr. in his second double-double of the season.

With the win, the Lobos improve to 7-2 on the season while the Grizzlies drop to 3-5 overall. Montana's losses this season include Sunday's game against UNM, as well as Stanford, Arkansas and No. 25 Washington.

On the night, the Lobos were edged in field goal percentage 43.1 - 43.3 but fired at a clip of 46.2 percent from behind the arc while holding the Griz to just 31.8 percent from three. UNM outrebounded Montana 43-31 while turning the ball over just nine times, marking UNM's lowest turnover total of the season.

The first half of Sunday's contest was one heavy on defensive effort as neither team reached double digits through the first 7:34. In fact, the Lobos went scoreless for 6:56 before Bragg registered a pair of free throws to make it a two-point game, 10-8, in favor of Montana.

"What's been best [about Bragg] has been his free throw shooting," head coach Paul Weir said. "To have a big of his size, that you can feel confident with every time he goes to the free throw line is a great benefit to the program and our team. Today he was [also] finishing around the rim terrific and [had a big block]."

Three minutes and nine seconds after snapping UNM's cold spell from the floor, Bragg was found behind the arc by redshirt-junior Zane Martin, who collected 11 points of his own on the night, and Bragg sunk his first career 3-pointer to spark a 9-0 run that included back-to-back-back threes by not only Bragg, but also sophomore Tavian Percy and redshirt-senior JaQuan Lyle.

The burst of energy and points took UNM from trailing by four to leading by five, 19-14 at the 6:51 mark of the first half. UNM would not relinquish the lead for the remainder of the half.

The Lobos traded quick threes with Montana as freshman Josh Vazquez, who posted 16 points on the day, followed Lyle's three but on the next possession, redshirt-junior JJ Caldwell knocked one down from 3-point range to keep it a five-point game, 22-17 Lobos.

It was Bragg that gave UNM its largest leads of the half with a layup at the 4:54 mark for a seven-point Lobo advantage, 24-17, and again with just 50 seconds left when he hit a pair from the stripe. He pushed the Lobo lead to eight to cap an 8-0 run, 32-24. Montana hit a jumper with 25 seconds left to end the half on an 8-2 Lobo run for the 32-26 score at the break.

Montana came out of the locker room with a pair of free throws at the 19:06 mark to make it a four-point game, 32-28, before junior Makuach Maluach, who had a quiet first half, scored five straight for UNM. Maluach hit a fast-break three to make it a seven-point game, followed with a dunk, his third of the season, to put the Lobos up by nine.

Montana reclaimed the lead just once more with 8:59 left on the clock when redshirt-senior Kendal Manuel hit a three to put the Griz up by one, 50-49. The lead was short-lived however as Bragg hit yet another pair of free throws to put UNM up for good, 51-50 with 8:35 left to play.

UNM continued to add to the lead and eventually got out to a 10-point advantage, the largest lead of the game, with 1:09 left when Martin hit a free throw to make it 69-59 en route to the nine-point, 72-63 final.

Bragg went 9-for-11 from the free throw line and 5-for-8 from the floor on his way to leading UNM with his 20 points. He was followed by Lyle who registered 16 points and three assists. Martin was the third Lobo to collect double figures with 11 while Caldwell led UNM with five assists and three steals.

Montana was led by senior Sayeed Priddgett who posted 25 points, 10 rebounds and five assists along with Vazquez who notched 16 points.

The Lobos are set to return to action Wednesday, Dec. 4 when they kick off Mountain West play with a 7 p.m. contest against Boise State inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit.
