The UNLV men's basketball team will head back out on the road this weekend as it travels to Albuquerque for a game at New Mexico on Saturday, Feb. 15 at 4 p.m. MT/3 p.m. PT.

The Runnin' Rebels are coming off a record sixth overtime game this season, as they dropped another close game to intrastate rival UNR, 82-79, on Wednesday night at the Thomas & Mack Center. Prior to that, the Runnin' Rebels defeated Fresno State by a point, 68-67, last Saturday on a last-second shot by sophomore guard Marvin Coleman.

Sophomore guard Bryce Hamilton and junior guard Amauri Hardy lead the Runnin' Rebels (12-14, 7-6) in scoring, averaging 15.2 and 14.1 points per game, respectively. Hamilton has scored in double figures in 13 straight games and has tallied 23 or more in five of his last seven outings. Junior forward Mbacke Diang is the team's leading rebounder with 8.3 per contest (4th in MW). UNLV is under new leadership this year in head coach T.J. Otzelberger.

New Mexico (17-9, 6-7) is in its third year under its head coach, Paul Weir. The Lobos have lost four of their last five games but are 14-1 at home this season. UNM is led in scoring by JaQuan Lyle's 16.1 ppg.

UNLV won the season's first meeting, 99-78, in Las Vegas on Jan. 18.

Saturday's game will be televised by CBS Sports Network with Rich Waltz and Chris Walker calling the action. Jon Sandler, former Runnin' Rebel Curtis Terry and Steve Cofield (sideline reporter) will handle the UNLV radio call, which may be heard live on ESPN Radio 1100 in Las Vegas and online via the UNLVGameday App and Tuneln (link at UNLVRebels.com).

THE UNLV RUNNIN' REBELS (12-14, 7-6 MOUNTAIN WEST)

- The 2019-20 season marks the first for UNLV under new head coach T.J. Otzelberger.
• Otzelberger was hired in March after an extremely successful three-year tenure as head coach at South Dakota State.
• Otzelberger's Jackrabbits were one of the top offensive teams in the nation, ranking in the top 10 among all NCAA teams in scoring during the last two seasons: 2017-18 (7th), 2018-19 (5th).
• Otzelberger's UNLV coaching staff includes Tim Buckley, Kevin Kruger and DeMarlo Slocum.
• This year's Runnin' Rebel team returned six letterwinners, including two starters, from last season (17-14 overall, 11-7 Mountain West, T-4th).
• The team welcomed five newcomers that are eligible this season and two additional transfers who must sit out the year as redshirts.
• Junior guard Amauri Hardy is the team's returning leading scorer (13.1 ppg), while junior forward Mbacke Diong (6.8 rpg) is the leading returning rebounder.
• Sophomore guard Bryce Hamilton and Hardy lead the Runnin' Rebels in scoring, averaging 15.2 and 14.1 points per game, respectively.
• UNLV's roster includes no freshmen.
• UNLV was picked to finish seventh in this year's Mountain West race by the media in October.
• UNLV started 3-0 in Mountain West play with a double-overtime win at Fresno State on Dec. 4, a 70-53 win over Utah State at home on Jan. 1 and a 71-59 home win over Air Force on Jan. 4.
• UNLV's 6-1 start to conference play was its best in 12 years (2007-08).
• UNLV's six-game home win streak was snapped with the loss to No. 4 San Diego State.
• UNLV's longest home win streak in five years (2014-15).
• The Runnin' Rebels have now won seven of their last nine home games with the only two losses being against No. 4 San Diego State by four and UNR by three in overtime.

THE NEW MEXICO LOBOS (17-9, 6-7 MOUNTAIN WEST)

- New Mexico is in its third year under head coach Paul Weir. He has a 50-42 (.543) record with the Lobos and a career mark of 78-48 (.619) over four years as a collegiate head coach.
• UNM has lost four of its last five games, but are 14-1 this year at home.
• New Mexico is led in scoring by JaQuan Lyle's 16.1 ppg (7th in MW). He is also the team's assist leader (4.7 apg, 2nd in MW).
• UNM ranks 17th in the country in field-goal percentage (47.9, 1st in MW), 20th in scoring (78.8 ppg, 1st in MW) and 48th in steals (8.0 spg, 1st in MW).
• The Lobos lost on Tuesday at No. 4 San Diego State in their last game, 82-59.
• UNM returned seven letterwinners from last year's team, including two starters.
• The Lobos went 14-18 overall last season, finishing tied for seventh in the Mountain West with a 7-11 mark.
• UNM was picked to finish third in this year's Mountain West standings in the media's preseason poll.

SERIES HISTORY

- This will mark the 62nd meeting between UNLV and New Mexico in men's basketball.
• UNLV leads the all-time series 36-25.
• UNLV won this season's earlier meeting, 99-78, in Las Vegas on Jan. 18.
• UNLV has won three straight over the Lobos. Prior to this win streak, UNM had won three straight.
• UNLV is 13-14 all-time on the road vs. New Mexico.
• UNLV has won four of the last six meetings at The Pit.
• The Runnin' Rebels swept the season series last year winning at The Pit, 80-69, and at home 74-58.
• The first meeting between the two schools occurred in 1976.
• UNLV is 367-182 (.668) all-time vs. teams that currently make up the Mountain West.

HAMILTON EARNS FIRST MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARD

UNLV sophomore Bryce Hamilton was named Mountain West Men's Basketball Player of the Week on Jan. 6. It was his first career weekly honor and also the first for a Runnin' Rebel player this season.

COLEMAN ALSO WINS WEEKLY HONOR AFTER TRIPLE-DOUBLE

UNLV sophomore Marvin Coleman was named Mountain West Men's Basketball Player of the Week on Jan. 20. It was his first career weekly honor and the second for a Runnin' Rebel player this season.

INJURY BUG

UNLV has been without two starters for various periods of time this season. Junior guard Jonah Antonio missed six straight games because of a hand injury before returning vs. Pacific.

WIN STREAKS

UNLV had its four-game win streak (its longest of the season) snapped with the loss at Boise State on Jan. 8. Prior to that, the Runnin' Rebels defeated Robert Morris, Eastern Michigan, Utah State and Air Force.

6 STRAIGHT VICTORIES AT HOME

UNLV had won six straight home games before falling to No. 4 San Diego State on Jan. 26. The six-game Thomas & Mack Center win streak marked the Runnin' Rebels' longest since also winning six straight at home five years ago (2014-15).

FROM WALK-ON TO STARTING POINT GUARD

Sophomore guard Marvin Coleman, who began his UNLV career as a walk on, earned a scholarship prior to the start of the 2019-20 season. He has taken full advantage of the opportunity, working his way into the starting lineup.

THE REBELS WERE RUNNING

Jan. 18 vs. New Mexico marked UNLV's second straight game scoring in the 90s. After scoring a then-season-high 98 vs. San Jose State on Jan. 15, the Runnin' Rebels bested that by a point with 99 vs. the Lobos.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

Eastern Michigan's 49 points was a season low by a UNLV opponent and the fewest points given up by a Runnin' Rebel team since holding New Mexico Highlands to 45 on Nov. 16, 2015. Then, in their next game, the Runnin' Rebels limited Utah State to just 53 points, which is the Aggies' lowest point total of the season. UNLV held Utah State to just 2 of 19 on 3-pointers (10.5 percent) and 17 of 52 overall from the field (32.7 percent). To top it off, against Air Force, UNLV limited the Falcons to their second-lowest point total of the season (at the time) and held them to just 34.6 percent shooting (18 of 52) - which was their lowest of the season. After Air Force made each of its first five 3-point attempts, the Falcons shot 5 of 22 from long distance the rest of the game.

3-0, THEN 6-1 START IN MOUNTAIN WEST PLAY

Prior to its loss on Jan. 8 at Boise State, UNLV started Mountain West play with a 3-0 record, leaving UNLV as one of the last three teams in the league without a conference loss. The others were then-No. 7 San Diego State and UNR. It marked just the second time in its history that UNLV has started the MW season 3-0. UNLV then improved its MW record to 6-1 before falling at UNR on Jan. 22. It was the Runnin' Rebels' best start to a conference season in 12 years (2007-08).

OUTREBOUNDING THE OPPONENT

UNLV has outrebounded its opponent in 19 of its 26 games this season. UNLV is 11-8 in those contests.

IS FIELD-GOAL PERCENTAGE THE KEY?

UNLV won its first 11 games this season when shooting a higher field-goal percentage than its opponent. With the loss to No. 4 San Diego State on Jan. 26, while shooting 43.6 percent to the Aztecs' 41.8 percent, the Runnin' Rebels are 11-1 when shooting a higher FG percentage than their opponent. In addition, when the Runnin' Rebels shoot 50 percent or better they are 6-0 and when they hold their opponents to 59 points or less, they are 5-0.

AMONG THE LEADERS, STATISTICALLY

UNLV ranks No. 1 or No. 2 in the Mountain West for conference-only games in rebounding, rebound margin, steals, offensive rebounding and defensive rebounding. Nationally, the Runnin' Rebels are 17th in offensive rebounds per game, 18th in rebound margin, 21st in total rebounds and 45th in total rebounds per game.

HAMILTON HOT

Sophomore guard Bryce Hamilton has scored in double figures in 13 straight games and 18 times overall this season, including a career-high 35 points vs. New Mexico, which was UNLV's highest scoring output in a game by an individual in four years. In fact, Hamilton has scored 23 or more in five of UNLV's last seven games. Last year as a freshman, Hamilton tallied double digits in scoring in just three games. In conference play this year, Hamilton leads the team in scoring with 21.8 ppg (2nd in MW) and is second in rebounding with 6.7 rpg.

TOTAL TEAM EFFORT

In UNLV's win vs. Robert Morris on Dec. 21, the Runnin' Rebels used a starting lineup that hadn't played together all season: senior forward Nick Blair, senior forward Vitaliy Shibel, junior forward Mback Diong, sophomore guard Jay Green and sophomore guard Marvin Coleman. In all, 11 players saw action for UNLV with four scoring in double figures, including two with career highs: Coleman with 16 points (then career high) and Shibel with 13 points.

MARGINS OF VICTORY

UNLV's 21-point win over New Mexico (99-78) was its largest margin of victory of the year. Previously, UNLV's biggest wins were a 17-point win over Utah State (70-53) and 15-point victories over Eastern Michigan (64-49) and Purdue Fort Wayne (86-71).

CLOSE GAMES

23 percent of UNLV's games this season have gone to overtime (6 of 26). The Runnin' Rebels are 1-4 in single overtime games this season and are 1-0 in double overtime contests. UNLV's six overtime games this season is a program record.

EARLIEST ROAD GAME IN PROGRAM HISTORY

UNLV's first road game at California on Nov. 12 marked its earliest road game to start a season in program history. For comparison, last year's first road game for the Runnin' Rebels wasn't until Dec. 8 at Illinois. Prior to this year, UNLV's earliest road game in its history was on Nov. 17, 2007 at San Diego under Lon Kruger.

EARLIEST CONFERENCE GAME EVER

The Dec. 4 game at Fresno State was UNLV's earliest start to conference play in program history. The reason for the early Mountain West start this season is that the conference tournament will take place a week earlier than normal because of a major convention in Las Vegas. UNLV's previous earliest start to conference play was on Dec. 15, 1988 vs. UC Irvine when it began Big West action.



BACK-TO-BACK OVERTIME LOSSES FOR THIRD TIME IN PROGRAM HISTORY

With back-to-back overtime losses vs. Kansas State on Nov. 9 and at Cal on Nov. 12, it marked just the third time in program history that UNLV has dropped back-to-back games in overtime. The last time prior to this season was during 2017-18 (Nov. 29 at Northern Iowa, Dec. 2 vs. Arizona) and the time before that was in 2008-09 (Feb. 3 vs. San Diego State, Feb. 7 at New Mexico). UNLV has played back-to-back overtime games only five times in its history. The other years: 2011-12 (W, W) and 1960-61 (the only time UNLV has played three straight overtime games: L, W, L).

SIX OVERTIME GAMES IN ONE SEASON

UNLV has gone 2-4 in its six overtime games this season. UNLV has never before had six overtime games in one season. The last time before this season that UNLV played five overtime games was in 2017-18 under Marvin Menzies. That squad was 2-3 in those contests.

HAMILTON SCORES 20+ SEVEN TIMES, HARDY FIVE

Sophomore guard Bryce Hamilton has scored 20 or more points seven times this year, while junior guard Amauri Hardy has tallied 20 or more five times. The others with 20 or more in a game: senior guard Elijah Mitrou-Long tied his career-high with 29 points at Cincinnati, and junior forward Donnie Tillman scored a career-high 28 at Fresno State.

THE T.J. OTZELBERGER ERA

The 2019-20 season marks the first for UNLV under head coach T.J. Otzelberger. Formally introduced in late March as the new head coach of the Runnin' Rebels, Otzelberger came to Las Vegas after most recently serving as head coach at South Dakota State, leading the Jackrabbits to two NCAA Tournaments and one NIT appearance in his three years at the helm. Otzelberger lifted the program at SDSU to new heights during his three-year tenure (2016-2019), where he compiled an overall record of 70-33, led the team to three straight postseason appearances, clinched the outright regular-season Summit League title the past two seasons, and earned the conference's Coach of the Year honors. Under Otzelberger, the Jackrabbits were one of the top offensive teams in the nation, ranking in the top 10 among all NCAA teams in scoring during the last two seasons: 2017-18 (7th), 2018-19 (5th). Prior to SDSU, Otzelberger served on the coaching staffs at Iowa State and Washington. A native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Otzelberger, 42, earned a degree from the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater where he played collegiately and was a two-year team captain. His coaching career started at Burlington Catholic Central High School in Wisconsin before spending one season at Chipola JC in Florida. Otzelberger is married to Alison Lacey, a former Iowa State standout who also played for the WNBA's Seattle Storm. The couple has three children, Jayce, Olivia and Stella.

ROSTER MAKEUP

UNLV returned seven letterwinners from last year's team, including two starters, while it has welcomed five newcomers that are eligible to play this season. The returning starters are junior guard Amauri Hardy, the Runnin' Rebels' leading returning scorer (13.1 ppg), and junior forward Mbacke Diong (6.8 rpg), the team's leading returning rebounder. Other contributors from last year's team that returned include Bryce Hamilton, Nick Blair, Cheickna Dembele and Marvin Coleman. Newcomers that have made an impact this season are Jonah Antonio, Donnie Tillman, Elijah Mitrou-Long and Vitaliy Shibel. Tillman was named the 2018-19 Pac-12 Sixth Man of the Year as a sophomore at Utah. In a bit of an anomaly, UNLV has no freshmen on this year's roster.

"3-POINT GOAL..." - UNLV HOLDS NCAA RECORD

UNLV holds the NCAA record for most consecutive games scoring at least one 3-pointer. Since the 3-point field goal was adopted by the NCAA in 1986-87, UNLV has converted at least one 3-pointer in all 1,096 games played. With Vanderbilt failing to make one Jan. 18 (0 for 25), UNLV and Princeton are the only schools left that have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the shot was introduced.

2020 RECRUITING CLASS

Coach Otzelberger and his staff have hit the ground running at UNLV in the area of recruiting. The Runnin' Rebels' 2020 class has been ranked as high as No. 9 in the nation.

AT THE THOMAS & MACK CENTER

The 2019-20 season marks the 37th year of Runnin' Rebel basketball in the Thomas & Mack Center. UNLV has posted an all-time record of 498-131 (.792) in the arena since it opened in 1983.

62ND YEAR OF RUNNIN' REBEL BASKETBALL

The 2019-20 season marks the 62nd year of Runnin' Rebel basketball at UNLV. Since the program's inception in 1958-59, the Runnin' Rebels have posted an all-time record of 1,300-581 (.691).

FIFTH-WINNINGEST PROGRAM EVER

With an all-time record of 1,262-557 (.694) against four-year American institutions (entering the 2019-20 season), UNLV ranks as the fifth-winningest program by percentage in NCAA Division I history (min. 25 years in Div. I). The only schools ahead of UNLV are Kentucky, North Carolina, Kansas and Duke.

NBA DRAFT PICKS

UNLV had a total of four NBA Draft picks over a four-year span from 2013-16: Anthony Bennett (No. 1 overall in 2013 by the Cleveland Cavaliers), Rashad Vaughn (No. 17 overall in 2015 by the Milwaukee Bucks), Patrick McCaw (No. 38 overall in 2016 by the Golden State Warriors) and Stephen Zimmerman Jr. (No. 41 overall in 2016 by the Orlando Magic).

RUNNIN' REBELS IN THE NBA

There are four former Runnin' Rebels on NBA rosters. They are Khem Birch (Orlando Magic), Derrick Jones Jr. (Miami Heat), Patrick McCaw (Toronto Raptors) and Christian Wood (Detroit Pistons). Birch, Jones Jr., and Wood all went undrafted, while McCaw was a second-round selection in 2016.







LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) - All five UNLV men's basketball starters scored in double figures as the Runnin' Rebels (1-0) won their season opener in head coach T.J. Otzelberger's debut, 86-71, over Purdue Fort Wayne at the Thomas & Mack Center on Nov. 5.

RUNNIN' REBELS FALL AT HOME IN OVERTIME TO KANSAS STATE, 60-56

Junior guard Amauri Hardy scored a career-high 27 points

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) - UNLV junior guard Amauri Hardy scored a career-high 27 points, but the Runnin' Rebels lost to Kansas State in overtime, 60-56, at the Thomas & Mack Center on Nov. 9.

Hardy tied the game at 54 in the extra period with 44 seconds left on a floater from the baseline, but K-State's Xavier Sneed put the Wildcats ahead for good with a jumper with 28 seconds to play.

On the ensuing possession, a rebound that went out of bounds that was originally called UNLV ball was overturned after an official review. Sneed then made two free throws to seal the game.

Senior guard Eli Mitrou-Long also scored in double figures for the Runnin' Rebels (1-1) as he added 10 points, while K-State (2-0) was led by Xavier Sneed's 19 points. Cartier Diarra added 12.

STAT OF THE GAME: Defense ruled as both teams were held to under 40 percent shooting from the field. Kansas State shot 17.4 percent from 3-point range, while the Runnin' Rebels made 26.9 percent.

QUOTABLE: "I'm proud of our guys for how they came out today, fought and competed. I thought it was really impressive to hold a Big 12 champion program, one that we have a lot of respect for, to 16 first-half points. I felt like the thing that we need to correct is the start to the second half. That has not been great to us. We have to get better there and better executing late. Overall I am happy with the competitive spirit that our guys played with. We knew it was going physical match. I think we were outsized at most positions, but the fight that our guys played with, I was really proud of. If we can bring that effort and energy every night out, we are going to like the outcome of a lot of nights." - UNLV head coach T.J. Otzelberger

RUNNIN' REBELS FALL 79-75 AT CAL IN OVERTIME

Junior forward Donnie Tillman scored a team-high 17 points in UNLV men's basketball's second straight overtime loss

BERKELEY, Calif. (UNLVRebels.com) - Three Runnin' Rebels scored in double figures, led by junior forward Donnie Tillman's team-high 17 points, but the UNLV men's basketball team (1-2) suffered its second straight overtime loss, 79-75, at California Nov. 12.

It was UNLV's first road game of the season. Trailing 77-75 late in the extra period, senior guard Elijah Mitrou-Long drove the lane but couldn't get the shot off, turning the ball over with 1.3 seconds left.

The Runnin' Rebels held their largest lead of the game (65-56) with just under six minutes to play in regulation, but shot just 1 of 8 to close the second half.

Mitrou-Long scored 16 points, while junior guard Amauri Hardy added 15. The Golden Bears (2-0) had four players in double-figure scoring led by Matt Bradley's game-high 23 points.

TURNING POINT: Cal used a 16-2 run over the last six minutes of regulation and the first two and a half minutes of overtime.

LOS ANGELES (UNLVRebels.com) - The UNLV men's basketball team fell behind early at UCLA and fought to make several comeback attempts but they weren't enough as it lost 71-54 Nov. 15 at Pauley Pavilion.

CINCINNATI (UNLVRebels.com) - The UNLV men's basketball team came back with a late run to force overtime, but fell 72-65 at Cincinnati on Nov. 30 at Fifth Third Arena.

BOISE, Idaho (UNLVRebels.com) - Sophomore guard Bryce Hamilton led three Runnin' Rebels in double figures with 19 points, but the UNLV men's basketball team lost 73-66 to Boise State Jan. 8 at Extramile Arena.

Marvin Coleman and Jonah Antonio made key 3-pointers in the extra period to propel UNLV to its second road win in conference

LARAMIE, Wyo. (UNLVRebels.com) - UNLV sophomore guard Marvin Coleman and junior guard Jonah Antonio both made 3-pointers early in overtime to give the Runnin' Rebels a six-point lead and eventual 78-69 win over Wyoming on Jan. 11 at Arena-Auditorium.

Sophomore guard Bryce Hamilton led the Runnin' Rebels (9-9, 4-1) in scoring with 19 points. Antonio added 15, Coleman had 14 and junior forward Donnie Tillman contributed 10.

Wyoming (5-13, 0-6) had three players score in double digits, led by Kwane Marble's 19. Jake Hendricks made a game-high six 3-pointers, scoring 18 points, while Hunter Maldonado added 16 as he was 10 of 13 on free throws.

It was UNLV's fifth win in its last six games and improved its Mountain West record to 4-1.

RUNNIN' REBELS IMPROVE TO 6-1 IN MW PLAY FOR FIRST TIME IN 12 YEARS, WIN SIXTH STRAIGHT AT HOME

Marvin Coleman records program's first triple-double in 20 years, Bryce Hamilton scores most points by a Runnin' Rebel in four seasons as UNLV defeats New Mexico 99-78

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) - Sophomore guard Marvin Coleman recorded UNLV's first triple-double in 20 years and sophomore guard Bryce Hamilton scored more points in a game than any other Runnin' Rebel in the last four seasons as the UNLV men's basketball team defeated New Mexico 99-78 Jan. 18 at the Thomas & Mack Center.

The win kept UNLV (11-9, 6-1) in sole possession of second place in the Mountain West and its 6-1 league start is its best in 12 years (2007-08). It also was UNLV's sixth straight home win, matching its longest such streak in five years (2014-15), its third straight victory overall and seventh in the last eight games.

Coleman's 11 points, 12 rebounds and 11 assists marked first triple-double for a Runnin' Rebel since Mark Dickel accomplished the feat on Nov. 19, 1999 vs. Mississippi Valley State (17-10-12). It is also just the fifth triple-double in Mountain West history.

Hamilton led five Runnin' Rebels in double-figure scoring with a career- and game-high 35 points on 14 of 19 from the field, which was the highest scoring game by a UNLV player since Ike Nwamu's 38 vs. Air Force on March 9, 2016.

New Mexico (15-5, 4-3) also had five players score in double figures, led by JaQuan Lyle's 20 points. Corey Manigault recorded a double-double with 19 points and 11 rebounds.

TALE OF TWO HALVES: UNLV used a 9-0 run to close the first half and led 43-40 at the break. The Runnin' Rebels then outscored New Mexico by 18 points in the second half (56-38).

THE REBELS ARE RUNNING: Saturday marked UNLV's second straight game scoring in the 90s. After scoring a then-season-high 98 vs. San Jose State on Wednesday, the Runnin' Rebels bested that by a point with 99 vs. New Mexico.

50 PERCENT FROM THE FIELD: UNLV also shot over 50 percent from the field for the second straight game, making 50.7 percent vs. UNM. The Runnin' Rebels are now 6-0 on the season when making at least half of their shots.

- NOTES: UNLV's bench outscored New Mexico's 42-3, thanks to Hamilton's 35 points. UNLV outscored UNM in points in the paint by 30, 58-28. RUNNIN' REBELS' THREE-GAME WIN STREAK SNAPPED AT UNR

Bryce Hamilton and Amauri Hardy combined for 49 points in 86-72 loss in Reno

RENO, Nev. (UNLVRebels.com) - The UNLV men's basketball team had its three-game win streak snapped Jan. 22 as it suffered an 86-72 loss at UNR.

Sophomore guard Bryce Hamilton and junior guard Amauri Hardy combined for 49 points on 19 of 38 shooting, but the rest of the Runnin' Rebels went 4 of 26 for 23 points.

UNLV (11-10, 6-2) lost for just the second time in its last nine games.

UNR (12-8, 5-3) had four players score in double figures, led by Jalen Harris' 28 points.

If we were able to do that, we thought we could get out and run, but we weren't successful in that endeavor so we were playing from behind the majority of the night. They hit some shots early to open the game up. We knew we were going to have some of those same shots that we didn't hit early and then that gave them that separation." - UNLV head coach T.J. Otzelberger

UNLV held second-half lead, but Aggies closed strong in Logan

LOGAN, Utah (UNLVRebels.com) - Sophomore guard Bryce Hamilton scored 15 points and junior guard Amauri Hardy added 10, but the UNLV men's basketball team (11-13, 6-5) lost 69-54 at Utah State on Feb. 5.

The Aggies (18-7, 7-5) were led by Neemias Queta's 21 points, six rebounds and five assists, while Sam Merrill added 20 points.

THE TURNING POINT: UNLV led 35-27 two-and-a-half minutes into the second half. The two teams exchanged the lead and after the game was tied at 48-48 with eight minutes to go, Utah State went on a 16-1 run over the next six minutes.

STAT OF THE GAME: The Aggies made 50 percent of their shots, while the Runnin' Rebels finished at 38.5 percent. UNLV made just 30.8 percent of its shots after halftime, including 17 percent on 3-pointers.

QUOTABLE: "Overall, I thought our guys came out very intentional and focused. We had great effort and execution in the first half, and we came out of the locker room and did a great job. As the game settled in, we had our struggles. Even though their zones and switching defenses kept us off balance, I still think it was the defensive side when we were getting stops and playing with pace that was allowing us to be successful. We weren't able to maintain that consistency of getting stops down the stretch of the game." - UNLV head coach T.J. Otzelberger

Sophomore guard goes high off the glass with under a second to play to give Runnin' Rebels their seventh win in last eight games at Thomas & Mack Center

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) - Sophomore guard Marvin' Coleman's shot high off the glass dropped in with 0.8 seconds left to give the UNLV men's basketball team a 68-67 win over Fresno State on Feb. 8 at the Thomas & Mack Center.

Junior guard Amauri Hardy scored a team-high 18 points, while sophomore guard Bryce Hamilton added 17 for his 12th straight game scoring in double figures for UNLV (12-13, 7-5). Senior forward Vitaliy Shibel was also in double figures as he tied his career high with 13 points.

Fresno State (8-16, 4-9) had three players in double-figure scoring, led by Orlando Robinson's game-high 24.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV only committed seven turnovers, a season low.




