#### **ABOUT THE MATCHUP**

- The Lobos enter Wednesday night's contest coming off of a 12-point victory over Colorado State at home on Saturday night.
- In UNM's last matchup vs CSU, sophomore Makuach Maluach led the Lobos, registering his first career double-double and a season-high 23 points.
- Wednesday night marks UNM's final home contest of the season and will be Senior Night.
- Lobo seniors Anthony Mathis and Dane Kuiper will be honored following Wednesday's game.
- Boise State is entering the matchup with the Lobos coming off of a five-game losing streak including a pair of overtime losses to Utah State (78-71) and UNLV (85-81).
- The Lobos lead the series 10-5 over the Broncos but have fallen in the last two meetings.
- UNM is 4-2 with Boise State over the last six meetings and holds a 5-2 advantage at home inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit.
- Last time the two teams faced each other was on Feb. 6, 2018 when the Lobos dropped a narrow heartbreaker to (RV) Boise State at home, 73-71, after the Broncos finished with an 8-0 run over the final minute.
- The Lobos are led by four players scoring in double figures in conference play including senior Anthony Mathis (14.9), redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson (13.1), redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee (10.8) and sophomore Makuach Maluach (10.5). Redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg follows with 9.9 ppg.
- Boise State has a trio of players averaging scoring double digits including junior Alex Hobbs (15.3), redshirt-sophomore Derrick Alston (15.2) and junior Justinian Jessup (15.1).

#### SCOUTING BOISE STATE

Boise State kicked off the 2019 conference season with three straight victories over Wyoming (69-55), San Diego State (88-64) and San José State (87-64) before dropping three straight to Nevada (72-71), Fresno State (63-53) and Air Force (74-60).

Since then, the Broncos have gone 3-8 and currently rank tied for eighth with UNM in the Mountain West standings.

On the season, the team averages scoring 71.6 points per game compared to 76.0 for the Lobos while allowing just 69.1 points from opponents while UNM allows 76.2. The Broncos also shoot at a higher rate than UNM, firing at a clip of 46.7 percent from the floor compared to 42.7 for the Lobos.

#### LAST TIME OUT

The Lobos snapped their streak on Saturday night with a 77-65 victory over Colorado State in front of 11,207 fans inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. UNM was led by sophomore Makuach Maluach who collected a game-high 23 points for a new season high.

The Lobos outrebounded the Rams by a margin of 22, 47-25 marking the second straight game that UNM has outrebounded its opponent by more than 15 boards.

Not only did Maluach lead the Lobos in scoring, he also registered his first career double-double with 10 rebounds. He was one of three Lobos to rack up 10+ rebounds, led by redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg (14) and junior Corey Manigault (11).

#### RISING REBOUNDS

In the last two contests, the Lobos have racked up the rebounds. Last Tuesday night, UNM outrebounded San José State 53-37, marking the most for UNM against an NCAA Division I opponent this season. The 53 rebounds was the second-highest total on the year after the Lobos posted 54 against the University of the Southwest.

The Lobos also racked up 26 offensive rebounds in the contest, marking the first time since Nov. Last season, senior Anthony Mathis went 21, 2015 against USC that UNM has tallied 20+ 19 straight games with a made 3-point shot,

offensive rebounds (23).

The Lobos followed it up with a 47-board showing against Colorado State, outrebounding the Rams by 21 including 17-4 offensively.

#### **MALUACH'S CAREER NUMBERS**

On Saturday night, sophomore Makuach Maluach put up a season-high 23 points and a career-first double-double with a career-high 10 rebounds.

Maluach has registered double figures in 15 games this season including the last two, and has scored over 20 points twice. He has led the Lobos in scoring three times this season.

#### MCGEE BREAKS OUT

Redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee has led the Lobos in three of the last seven games in scoring, including his 25-point performance against SJSU last Tuesday. His 25 points marks the fourth-highest point total of any Lobo this season behind 30 for redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson on Feb. 16 against Fresno State, senior Anthony Mathis' 27 on Jan. 5 against then No. 5/6 Nevada and 27 for Jackson against New Mexico State on Nov. 17.

## **MATHIS RECORD ALERT**

Senior Anthony Mathis boasts 98 3-pointers so far this season, just four away from the UNM record of 102, set by Kevin Henry in the 1998-99 season. Mathis' 98 threes ties his own 98 3-pointers from last season for third in UNM program history for threes in a single season.

Mathis set the UNM program record for most 3-pointers in a conference season last year with 66. He currently has 53 in MW play.

#### 3-POINT STREAK

tied for seventh in program history. Mathis is now at 21 straight games and tied for fifth in UNM history for longest 3-point streak. At least one three on Wednesday will put him at 22, tied for fourth in program history.

#### 30-FOR-JACKSON

Redshirt-sophomore Jackson hit a career-high 30 points Feb. 16 against Fresno State going 8-for-15 from the floor including 4-for-6 from 3-point range while shooting 10-of-11 from the free-throw line. His 30 points marks the first time a Lobo has netted 30 this season, and also the first time a Lobo has scored 30 points since Feb. 21, 2017 when former Lobo Elijah Brown achieved the feat against Wyoming.

His 30-point game came after three straight contests scoring less than 10 points. Prior to that three-game streak, Jackson had netted double figures in 12 straight games.

#### 25 POINTS OR MORE

Of the Lobos' six conference wins, three have been victories of 25 points or more including wins over then No. 5/6 Nevada (85-58, 27 points), Wyoming (83-53, 30 points) and San José State (92-60, 32 points).

#### SPEAKING OF LARGE VICTORY MARGINS

The Lobos' 32-point win over San José State on Feb. 13 marked the largest victory margin over an NCAA Division I opponent for UNM this season.

#### STEALING LOBOS - 2ND IN THE MW

The Lobos are currently second in the Mountain West on the season in steals per game with 6.8. UNM is led in the category by senior Anthony Mathis (27), redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson (26) and senior Dane Kuiper (25).

#### BRAGGIN' BOARDS

Redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg leads the Lobos in rebounding with 8.8 per game. In UNM's Feb. 2 game at Fresno State, he racked up a career-high 15 and followed it up with 16 last Tuesday night at SJSU. On Saturday, Bragg notched 14 more.

The last time a Lobo collected 15 boards in a game was on Nov. 21, 2015 when former Lobo Tim Williams achieved the feat at USC.

To date, Bragg has accumulated seven 10+ rebound games and averages 9.2 rpg in conference play (T5th in the MW).

#### MATHIS 11th, 12th \$ 17th in the nation

Lobo senior Anthony Mathis is currently ranked 11th in the nation in free-throw percentage (89.3), 12th in 3-point field goals per game (3.50) and 17th in total 3-point field goals made (98). He is also ranked 27th in the country in 3-point field goal percentage (42.8).

#### **MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

For his efforts against then-ranked No. 5/6 Nevada on Jan. 5 and against Air Force on Jan. 2, senior Anthony Mathis earned his first Mountain West Player of the Week honor. Mathis averaged 22.0 points per game going 12-for-31 (.387) from the field including 8-for-23 (.348) from behind the arc. He also went 12-for-14 from the free throw line.

#### IT'S RAINING THREES

The Lobos are averaging 9.1 3-pointers per game and have racked up 10 or more in 13 games this season, including a season-most 14 against SJSU on Feb. 13. Conversely, the Lobos have allowed opponents to make 10 threes or more just seven times this season.

#### BRAGG IS BACK

Redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg finally earned his debut as a Lobo on Sunday, Dec. 16 after a year and a half off the court. Bragg posted 16 points on 7-for-12 from the floor and tallied seven rebounds in his debut against Central Arkansas.

To date, he has accumulated 175 rebounds and 206 points in 20 games, starting 17.

He has also racked up 26 blocks on the season and is tied for second in league play with 1.5 per game.

The 2018-19 Lobos have just four returning letterwinners from the 2017-18 squad, New Mexico), most points in a conference including leading-scorer Anthony Mathis game (119 at Wyoming) and most points in (12.7 ppg) who finished fourth in the nation in 3-point percentage and broke the UNM record for most 3-point field goals in a conference season (66) as a junior. The squad

also adds nine newcomers and returns a pair of sitting transfers to the team that finished third in Mountain West regular-season play last season.

In addition to Mathis, UNM's returners include senior Dane Kuiper, who is the lone returning starter, and sophomores Makuach Maluach and Vladimir Pinchuk. Maluach finished his inaugural season averaging 9.6 points per game and ranks fourth all-time on the Lobo freshman single-season scoring list.

#### **Lobos Split with Colorado State to Break Streak**

**ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.** --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team snapped its streak on Saturday night with a 77-65 victory over Colorado State in front of 11,207 fans inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. The Lobos were led by sophomore Makuach Maluach who collected a game-high 23 points for a new season-high.

The Lobos (12-16, 5-10 MW) outrebounded the Rams (12-17, 7-9 MW) by a margin of 22, 47-25 marking the second straight game that UNM has outrebounded its opponent by more than 15 boards.

Not only did Maluach lead the Lobos in scoring, he also registered his first career double-double with 10 rebounds. He was one of three Lobos to rack up 10+ rebounds, led by redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg (14) and junior Corey Manigault (11).

Bragg also posted three steals and finished just one point shy of his third double-double of the season with nine points.

The last time UNM had two or more 10+ rebounders was on Jan. 5 against then-No. 5/6 Nevada.

"Certain elements of tonight's game went the way we wanted them to," head coach Paul Weir said. "We've really been emphasizing rebounding lately and tonight I thought that's what really made the difference for us."

The Lobos also had four players score in double figures including Maluach, senior Anthony Mathis (16) and redshirt-sophomores Vance Jackson (12) and Keith McGee (10).

UNM led by as many as 19 points in the second half against the CSU squad that claimed a 15-point victory the last time the teams met on Jan. 12 (91-76) in Fort Collins.

The Lobos got out to a five-point lead in just the first 1:41 on a pair of layups by Jackson and Bragg and a three from Mathis (7-2) before CSU tied it up for the first of three times in the match, 9-9, at the 16:51 mark.

The first half was a lot of back-and-forth before the Lobos slowly crept out to another 5+ point cushion when McGee hit a three with 9:14 left in the first half to put the Lobos up by seven, 22-15.

Colorado State again battled back and cut the Lobo lead to four with 6:57 left in the frame before the Lobos embarked on a 7-1 run, capped by a Bragg layup to put UNM up by 10, 32-22, with 3:29 left.

At the break, the Lobos went into the locker room on top by eight, 35-27. UNM is now 8-3 on the season, 5-2 in Mountain West play, when leading at the half.

The Lobos built on the lead in the second half. With 12:11 left on the clock, CSU had whittled a 14-point Lobo lead down to nine, 51-42, before the Lobos went on an 11-1 run to extend the UNM lead to a game-high 19, 62-43, with 7:31 left on the clock.

The 11-1 run included four points from Bragg on a pair of layups, two points each from Mathis and Manigault, followed by a three from Jackson to cap the run and bring fans to their feet.

The Rams got the game back down to single digits just twice, fouling as the clock ran down while using all four of their timeouts.

The Lobos made all eight of their free throws over the final 1:18 including six from Mathis. He was 6-for-6 from the line on the night and is shooting 89.3 percent from the stripe on the season.

On the night, the squads finished relatively even statistically with the Lobos outshooting the Rams 46.4 percent to 46.3 from the floor. Both teams made nearly 65 percent of their free throws while UNM outshot CSU from behind the arc 33.3 - 26.7 percent.

UNM is set to return to action on Wednesday, March 6 as the squad takes on Boise State for the only time this season on Senior Night at 7 p.m.

Lobos Drop Heartbreaker to (RV) Boise State, 73-71

**ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.** --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team suffered a narrow 73-71 loss to (RV) Boise State after leading by as many as 13 points on Tuesday night in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. The Lobos led by six with 1:47 left but an 8-0 run by the Broncos over the final minute sealed the Lobo loss.

Boise State (20-4, 10-2 MW) led for just 2:34 the entire night while the Lobos (12-13, 7-5 MW) held the advantage for 36:28 before the final Bronco push.

"Their offensive rebounding really hurt us, and our offensive ineptitude really got us in the second half," head coach Paul Weir said. "We, unfortunately, turned the ball over at some really inopportune times, on some really basic plays."

"...Our defense really stepped up tonight and had a pretty good game, and our offense really let us down...We have to get better offensively, it was a rough night."

The Lobos ultimately outshot the Broncos 46.2 percent to 43.5 percent from the floor, but UNM had a commanding 55.2 percent to 39.3 percent advantage at the halfway mark. In the second half, Boise State roared back with a 47.1 shooting percentage while UNM shot just 34.8 percent from the field.

UNM dominated from behind the arc, connecting on 11 3-point attempts while the Broncos scored just four from 3-point land. Tuesday's contest marked the sixth straight game that the Lobos have scored 10 3-pointers or more, a feat which the squad has achieved 17 times this season. UNM also entered the game ranked seventh in the nation in 3-pointers made per game (11.0).

Junior Anthony Mathis led the Lobos in scoring with 17 points, going 4-for-6

from behind the arc, 5-for-10 from the floor, followed by classmate Dane Kuiper (11 points, 5 rebounds) and senior Antino Jackson (10 points, 3 assists). Senior Joe Furstinger collected eight points and seven rebounds along with a new career-high five blocks.

Mathis is riding a 12-game streak scoring in double figures.

The Lobos began the game with high energy in front of their home crowd of 11,357, getting out to an early four-point lead, 10-6. The early advantage was fueled by a quick eight points from Kuiper, who tallied a pair of threes and a jumper in the first 3:32 of the game.

Boise State called its first timeout when junior Chris McNeal hit a three to make it 19-14 and the Broncos came out of the timeout to tie it, 19-19. The Broncos called three of their four timeouts in the first half of the game.

With 6:24 left in the first half, Kuiper hit a jumper to put UNM up by three, 28-25. It was then that Mathis posted back-to-back 3-pointers to jump ahead by nine, followed by a pair of free throws for a 10-0 run, eight of which were off the fingertips of Mathis.

UNM went into the break with a commanding 11-point lead, 40-29, and was able to maintain at least a five-point advantage until the 5:12 mark in the second half when Boise State cut it to four. The teams went back-and-forth but the Lobos went up by seven on a pair of free throws from senior Antino Jackson with 3:03 left.

It was then that the Broncos turned up the gas, closing on a 10-2 run from there for the win.

The Lobos led with 53 seconds on the clock, 71-68, but after BSU standout Chandler Hutchison stole the ball from junior Troy Simons and followed it with a dunk, the Lobos found themselves up by just one, 71-70, with just 22 seconds left. A defeated-looking Lobo squad then took a timeout, committed a turnover, missed a 3-pointer and committed a foul, all within 11 seconds.

Hutchison hit a layup to take the lead 72-71 with 16 seconds left, and was followed with a free throw from Justinian Jessup to clinch the win with nine seconds on the clock.

The close, intense game finished in surprising fashion as both teams got into a scuffle following the expiration of the game clock.

Hutchison helped lead BSU with 23 points and 12 rebounds on the night after posting eight points and four rebounds in the first half. Chris Sengfelder was Boise State's leading scorer with 24 points to go along with eight rebounds.

The Lobos are set to return to action on Saturday, Feb. 10, as they travel to Air Force for a 2 p.m. contest to be aired live on ESPN3.

#### **Broncos Heartbroken in Overtime**

LAS VEGAS - Boise State was once again left heartbroken and on the wrong end of another close game, as UNLV was able to pull out the 85-81 overtime win in Las Vegas on Saturday at the Thomas & Mack Center. The Broncos (11-18, 6-10) fell to 1-8 this season in games decided in overtime or by three or less points in regulation – the most such games in single-season program history.

Down by two points with 11 seconds to play in regulation, Jessup stepped up huge and hit a pull-up 18-footer to tie the game at 73-73 and push the game to overtime. Alex Hobbs was able to hit a three at the start of OT and Boise State led until the 1:45 mark, but UNLV (16-13, 10-7) made enough plays and hit enough free throws down the stretch to fend off the Broncos for the 85-81 victory.

Derrick Alston was the high scorer for the Broncos with 21 points. The performance gives the redshirt sophomore his sixth 20-point game of the season – a team high.

Justinian Jessup was sensational for the fourth-straight game and poured in 18 points to go with five rebounds and three assists. With the 18 points, Jessup now has 1,013 career points, making him the 29th 1,000-point scorer in program history. Today was his 93rd career game as a Bronco, making him the 15th-fastest player to 1,000 career points in program history.

Hobbs (15 points), Zach Haney (13 points) and RJ Williams (11 points) also reached double-digit points. The five Boise State players scoring 10 or more points marked the third time this season the feat has been achieved by the Blue and Orange. The team is 2-1 in such games.

The result pushes the all-time series between the two teams to an even 9-9 tie. Boise State is now 3-6 in true road games against UNLV at Thomas & Mack.

- The floor is named Bob King Court in honor of the former head coach who led the Lobos from 1963 to 1972.





#### Lobos Win Opener on Mathis 3-Point Buzzer-Beater

NORTHRIDGE, Calif. --- Senior Anthony Mathis of The University of New NORTHRIDGE, Calif. --- Senior Anthony Mathis of The University of New Mexico men's basketball team hit a buzzer-beating three to lift the Lobos over the CSUN Matadors on Tuesday night, officially opening the 2018-19 season with an exciting 87-84 victory. Four Lobos scored in double figures on the night that saw UNM's new squad shoot 51.9 percent from the floor and 42.3 percent from 3-point range.

The Lobos (1-0) and the Matadors (0-1) battled throughout 40 minutes with 13

Despite a shaky start full of first-game-of-the-season-nerves, UNM outshot CSUN in every category including from the floor (51.9 - 45.8 percent) from behind the arc (42.3 - 35.0 percent) and from the free throw line (75.9 - 52.4 percent).

In his first game as a Lobo, junior Corey Manigault led the squad on the night with 16 points going 4-for-6 from the floor and 8-for-9 from the charity stripe. Senior Dane Kuiper and sophomore Makuach Maluach followed with 15 points apiece. Kuiper went 3-for-5 from behind the arc, 5-for-8 from the floor and Maluach was 5-for-9 from the floor with a three and four free throws.

Mathis was the fourth player to score in double figures, registering 12 points with a 4-for-7 performance from 3-point range.

CSUN freshman Lamine Diane led all players on the night with 34 points going 15-for-28 from the field. Diane scored 30 and 23 points in CSUN's exhibition matchups.

"Ball control was clearly an issue for us tonight," head coach Paul Weir said. "Our size was almost a problem tonight (because CSUN was so quick), but you've got to tip your cap to CSUN, they played their hearts out. Diane is a tremendous player, puts a lot of pressure on defenses, particularly on the glass, and they were able to go out and show that tonight."

The Lobos opened Tuesday night's contest with a 2:54 drought before sophomore Vladimir Pinchuk registered UNM's first points on a pair of free throws with 17:06 on the clock to make it 6-2 CSUN. A minute later, Manigault shot a pair of free throws to make it 6-4 but the Lobos did not score from the floor until 5:08 into the game when Kuiper hit a jumper to make it 8-6 Matadors.

Kuiper's jumper was followed by a three-pointer just 32 seconds later to spark a Lobo 10-0 run over 2:57, putting UNM on top 16-10.

Both teams continued to respond and with CSUN leading by one at the conclusion of the half, a foul was called at the buzzer that sent Maluach to the line. He hit the shot and tied it 42-42 heading into the locker room.

Over the first half, UNM was out-rebounded 21-15.

Once again it was Kuiper in the second half to give the Lobo offense life as he came out of the locker room with the first six points for UNM on a pair of threes split by a jumper by Diane, 48-44.

The fifth tie of the game occurred at the 4:07 mark when redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson hit a free throw to tie it up 77-77. The Lobos built a four-point lead, 84-80 before a layup by CSUN's Cameron Gottfried made it 84-82 with just 30 seconds left on the clock.

The Lobos attempted to keep the ball and run down the clock but a UNM turn over allowed the Matadors to have one more possession that ended in another jumper by Diane to make it 84-84 with 6.1 seconds left.

The Lobos gained possession with the clock winding down and took about 4.5 seconds to cross half-court. Mathis looked up, saw the clock and took a long three from the right wing and sunk it for the win, 87-84.

On the night, CSUN dominated in the paint, 44-24 and registered 25 points off of turnovers compared to 22 for UNM. CSUN also tallied 13 second-chance points to just four for the Lobos and 12 on the fast break.

The Lobos are set to return to action on Saturday, Nov. 10 when they take on Northern New Mexico in exhibition competition as part of the second-annual New Mexico Classic tournament hosted by UNM.

## Lobos Open 2-0 With 90-83 Win over Iona

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- Two Lobos racked up double-doubles on Tuesday night as The University of New Mexico men's basketball team earned a 90-83 win over the visiting Iona Galest to start the 2018-19 season 2-0. Junior Corey Manigault and redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson led the Lobos with 20 and 18 points, respectively while collecting 10 and 12 boards apiece.

The victory marks the 16th straight season in which the Lobos came away with the win in their home opener.

After a slow start offensively, seniors Anthony Mathis and Dane Kuiper closed the game, combining for the thrilling final 10 points, including a pair of fast-break layups, to keep the Lobos on top throughout the final three minutes.

"The depth that we have, the way we spread our minutes and the style that we play allowed us to break away at the end and get a big win," head coach Paul Weir said. "It was a good basketball team that we beat, and we have come a long way in the last 12 months. We have not arrived and we have a lot of work to do the next few days in order to continue to get better, but just to get a win against a good basketball team early in the year shows our progression as a program." program.

The Lobos held the lead for 24:35 of the game that had nine lead changes and five ties. On the night, UNM outshot Iona from the floor 50.9 - 40.0 percent and 40.0 - 34.6 percent from behind the arc. Five Lobos scored in double fig-ures including Manigault (20), Jackson (18), Mathis (14), redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee (13) and sophomore Vladimir Pinchuk (10).

Pinchuk's 10 points went along with seven rebounds, one steal, three assists and two blocks in a new career-high 30 minutes.

With just 7:05 left in the game and the Lobos down by one, 72-71, Manigault poked the ball out of the hands of Iona's Isaiah Still, raced to the other end of the court unguarded and slammed a crowd-pleasing dunk to put the Lobos back on top for the final time, 73-72.

When the Gaels reduced the Lobo lead back to one, 75-74, sophomore Makuach Maluach sunk a dagger of a three at 5:28 that put the Lobos back up by four, 78-74. Iona was able to take a five-point lead to just two, 80-78, at the 2:59 mark on a 5till three before Mathis nailed his fourth 3-pointer of the night to put the Lobos back up by five, 83-78, and spark a Lobo offensive surgestions of the description of the control of the property of the control of through the final minutes.

commanding 45-39 lead before Iona whittled it back down to one with 16:20 on the clock.

Overall the teams finished relatively even in points off of turnovers (15-14 UNM), points in the paint (28 apiece), second-chance points (13-12 UNM), fast-break points (31-29 Iona) and bench points (29-20 UNM).

The Lobos return to action on Saturday November 17 when they take on instate rival New Mexico State for a 4 p.m. clash in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. The game will be the Lobos' Nike N7 contest featuring the highly-anticipated turquoise uniforms and will be televised on AT&T SportsNet.

#### Late Comeback Falls Short, Three score 20+ Points

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- After falling behind by as much as 19 points with just 9:08 left to play. The University of New Mexico men's basketball team put on an impressive show in a comeback attempt that saw the Lobos rack up a 13-0 second-half run in front of over 14,000 fans inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. The run fell short however, as UNM eventually suffered a four-point loss, 98-94, to the Aggies in the Rio Grande Rivalry matchup.

A trio of Lobos racked up 20 points or more including redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson (27), senior Anthony Mathis (22) and junior Corey Manigault (20). The game marks Manigault's second straight in which he has netted 20 points. The fourth Lobo to score in double figures was senior Dane Kuiper, who posted 10.

Jackson added a team-high six rebounds to his 27 points and drew nine fouls on the night. He was also one of six Lobos to accumulate four or more fouls

The Lobos outshot NMSU in every category including 59.6 - 56.6 percent from the field, 55.0 - 52.2 percent from behind the arc and 70.0 - 66.7 percent from the foul line, but the Aggies' redshirt-junior AJ Harris went an unstoppable 9-for-11 from the field, 6-for-6 from 3-point range and 7-for-10 from the free throw line to total 31 points, leading NMSU to victory. NMSU also knocked in 26 free throws compared to 21 for UNM, accounting for the four-point differential.

"First, thank you so much to all of the fans that came out today," head coach Paul Weir said in a press conference. "It was an exceptional sign of how far I think we've grown and where our program is hopefully headed. Unfortunately, the result is not what we wanted. It's incredibly disappointing, and inevitably that falls on me."

The teams remained within three points over the first five minutes until the Lobo began to pull ahead on a Mathis three and a jumper by sophomore Vladimir Pinchuk, making the score 13-5 for an eight-point lead, the most for UNM of the day.

The Aggies closed the gap and claimed a one-point advantage, 14-13, with 9:46 left in the first half and extended it to six at the break, 44-38. It was the first time the Lobos have been down at the half so far this season as UNM has tied its opponents heading into the break in both of its first two regular-season games.

Mathis cut the six-point deficit to three within the first 12 seconds of the second half (44-41) to set the tone, but NMSU took off on a 16-3 run over the ensuing 4:34 to get back out to a commanding 16-point lead, 60-44.

It was then that Manigault took the game into his own hands, scoring the next 10 points for the Lobos on three field goals and four free throws. Manigault scored eiglipoints in 56 seconds including a 5-0 run to reduce the deficit to 11, 49-60, before he was substituted at the 13:02 mark with NMSU leading by 13, 65-52.

Manigault was off the floor for 1:42 during which the Lobos endured a scoring drought and allowed the Aggies to pull back ahead by 19. Manigault re-entered and hit a jumper at the 10:36 mark to cut it back to 17 as UNM continued to battle.

With the Aggies up by 19 for the third time in the contest, the Lobos erupted for a 16-5 run over 3:15 to cut the score back to single digits, 80-72, with 5:12 on the clock. After suffering another barrage of Aggie points, UNM cut another 14-point deficit down to eight over 1:15 on a pair of threes by Mathis and Jackson as well as a pair of Mathis free throws with 1:10 left, 92-84.

The score was 96-89 with just 34 seconds left on the clock and the game looked over until Jackson hit a huge three to make it a four-point game followed by a Weir

Mathis notched a layup out of the timeout to make it a two-point game with seven seconds left but with little time left on the clock, the Lobos were forced to play the foul game, allowing for a pair of free throws from NMSU for the 98-94 final.

The Lobos caused 14 turnovers, committing 15, and collected eight steals to six fo NMSU. The Aggies capitalized on turnovers for 23 points compared to 18 for UNM while the Lobos outscored NMSU 32-30 in the paint.

UNM has a week to recuperate before returning to action on Saturday, Nov. 24 when it hosts UTEP at  $5:30\ \mathrm{p.m.}$  on the Mountain West Network.

#### Lobos Move to 3-1 with 84-78 Win Over UTEP

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- Over 11,000 Lobo fans got another close one to watch on Saturday night as The University of New Mexico men's basketball team pulled off an 84-78 victory over the visiting UTEP Miners inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. Senior Anthony Mathis led UNM with 18 points while racking up four 3-pointers for the fourth straight game.

Mathis entered the matchup ranked 15th in the nation in 3-pointers per game at 4.0. The game also marked the fourth straight in which the Lobos (3-1) have had at least four players score in double figures. Mathis led the pack and was followed by sophomore Makuach Maluach (13), redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson (12) and sophomore Vladimir Pinchuk (10).

"Great game on a lot of levels. Obviously to get over the disappointment of our last home game, but to get a crowd like that today, meant a lot," head coach Paul Weir said. "It meant a lot to me personally and it meant a lot to our guys. Quite honestly, I prefaced them all week that we might have lost some fans with what we did last weekend. To have our fans respond like that, it's just a blessing to be a Lobo."

Weir registered his 50th career win with Saturday night's victory over UTEP, his 22nd as a

UNM held the Miners (2-3) to just seven points over the first 7:04 but offensively started just as slow. The Lobos falled to register a single point until a Jackson three at the 12:23 mark, meaning UNM fans stood for 7:37 in anticipation of a Lobo point.

"I'd be lying if I said I loved where we are at, but we're winning and this was a game that quite frankly we would have lost. So, there is growth in that regard and hopeful able to grow here as the season progresses," Weir said.

For the fourth straight game, Jackson led UNM in rebounds with five, tied with Pinchuk, while Jackson and freshman Drue Drinnon each posted four assists. Drinnon's team-high four assist came in just 11 minutes on the court. Last game he racked up a team-best four assists in 14.

Following Jackson's first Lobo bucket, UNM went scoreless for another 3:11 while UTEP got out to its biggest lead of the game, 11 points (14-3), with 9:27 left in the first half. The teams went back-and-forth but the Lobos entered the locker room down five after a Drinnon layup with 36 seconds left, 34-29.

At the end of the first frame, the best shooting team in the Mountain West  $(54.1 \, \mathrm{percent})$  was shooting just  $23.3 \, \mathrm{percent}$  from the field (7-30), but still firing  $42.9 \, \mathrm{percent}$  from behind the arc (3-7). The first half also saw both teams combine for  $25 \, \mathrm{fouls}$  including a trio of technicals (one was a double).

UNM opened the second half on a 9-5 scoring advantage capped by Maluach's third 3-pointer of the night to cut the UTEP lead to two, 40-38, at the 16:56 mark. The Miners again extended their lead to seven before the Lobos cut it back to two and ultimately took the lead.

Down by four, 53-49, with 12:36 left to play, Mathis drilled back-to-back threes within 21 seconds, his first and second of the game, to close the UTEP lead to one, 53-52, and then take the lead 55-53. The teams would tie it twice before the end of 40 minutes, but the Lobos did

Mathis' three was part of a 14-4 run that ended with a Jackson free throw and a four-point Lobo advantage, 57-53. During the 405 pan, UNM went 4-for-5 from the floor including a momentum-turning dunk by redshirt-sophomor Keith McGee. Pinchuk collected a steal at the other end of the floor, tossed it to Drinnon who drove toward the basket but at the last second, passed to McGee who went up for two (47-49 UTEP).

The teams tied the score at 57-57 and again at 59-59 before the Lobos began to pull away with a 7-0 run that was capped by another Mathis three to make it 67-60 at the 628 mark. Mathis scored just two points in the first half and finished with 16 in the second.

UTEP got it as close as two with 2:03 left, 74-72 Lobos, but a three from senior Dane Kuiper stretched UNM's lead back to five, 77-72. With 43 seconds left on the clock, UTEP cut it back to three, 79-76, but Mathis fourth three of the night with 20 seconds left proved to be a dagge for the Miners, 82-76 UNM. UTEP'S Nigel Hawkins made a layup at the other end with 13 seconds left but a Miner foul sent Mathis to the line for two more and the 84-78 final.

On the night, UNM finished shooting 44.8 percent from the floor, marking the first time this season that the Lobos have shot under 50 percent. Maluach shot 4-for-9 from the floor, 3-for-4 from behind the arc while Mathis was 5-for-7 overall, 4-for-4 from 3-point range and 4-for-5 from the free throw line.

The Lobos once again debuted a new starting lineup consisting of a pair of freshmen, a pair of sophomores and one senior leader in Mathis. The lineup marked the first official start for freshmen Drue Drinnon and Jordan Arroyo. Arroyo started in UNN's exhibition contes against Northern New Mexico, but this was his first that will count in the books. Pinchuk remains the only consistent starter for the Lobos as the only player to have started all four

After four straight home contests, the Lobos are set to hit the road next Saturday with the Missouri Valley/Mountain West Challenge game at Bradley on Dec. 1. At Saturday's game in Il linois, Lobo assistant coach Jerome Robinson will be inducted to his alma mater's Hall of Fam

#### Mathis Nets Seven Threes to Lead UNM Past Bradley

PEORIA, III. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team earned an 85-75 victory over Bradley University on the road on Saturday night. Senior Anthony Mathis, who averaged 4.0 3-pointers per game prior to Saturday, scored seven on the night en route to 23 points to lead the Lobos.

With the victory, UNM improves to 4-1 while Bradley slips to 6-3.

Saturday's game also marked the finale of the 2018 Mountain West / Missouri Valley Challenge Prior to the game, the Mountain West was down 5-4, but the Lobo victory made it 5-5 and marked the third consecutive season that the challenge resulted in a tie.

Also of note on the night, Lobo assistant coach and Bradley alum Jerome Robinson was officially inducted into the Braves' Hall of Fame for his outstanding accomplishments during his time at Bradley.

Mathis led UNM with his 23 points, 18 of which came on six 3-pointers in the first half, to finish just two points short of his career high (25). He was followed by junior Corey Manigault who scored 18 and fellow senior Dane Kupre who tallied 15. Manigault registered the only double-double on the floor for the night with 18 points and 11 rebounds. He went 4-for-9 from the floor and 10-for-11 from the free throw line. Kuiper was 6-for-10 from the floor, 2-for-5 from behind the arc and 1-for-1 from the stripe.

Much like the first few games of the season, the Lobos started out slow on Saturday and even got behind by as much as 11 points before roaring back to take the lead and claim the victory

"You have to tip your cap to Bradley, I thought the first five or so minutes of the game was terrific and I thought the last \$1.0 minutes was a very good basketball team working to get back," head coach Paul Weir said, "Fortunately that 20-25 minutes or so in the middle, we really able to establish our style of play and do it in such a way that it overcame that last 15 minutes that we still have to improve upon."

oradley opened the contest on an 11-0 run over the first 2:34 on a starting lineup that consisted fa trio of freshmen, Tavian Percy, Drue Drinnon and Jordan Arroyo, along with Kuiper ald sophomore Makuach Maluach. A jumper from sophomore Vladimir Pinchuk, who until aturday night was UNM's lone consistent starter, at the 16:44 mark started the scoring for

The Lobos were quick to get back in it, however, taking a 10-point Brave lead (14-4) down to two (16-14) within 2:56 on a 10-2 run. The run included a pair of threes from Mathis.

A three from Bradley's Nate Kennell at the 8:28 mark put the Braves up by four, 22-18, but a Mathis 3-pointer just 38 seconds later brought the Lobos within one, 22-21.

Mathis followed with another less than a minute later to give the Lobos their first lead of the game, 24-22. Bradley's Dwayne Lautier-Ogunleye made a jumper to tie it at 24-24 before Mathis followed with yet another from behind the arc, his fifth of the game to take a three-point lead that the Lobos never again relinquished.

UNM extended the first-half lead to eight with 2:46 left on a jumper and a dunk by Manigault before Bradley whittled it back to four, 36-32.

The Lobo seniors closed the first half in style as Dane Kuiper dunked with 46 seconds left and Mathis hit his sixth three of the night with nine seconds on the clock for a nine-point lead at the half, 41-32.

UNM held onto a double-digit advantage for most of the second half en route to the 85-75 victory. It was Kuiper and Manigault that led the Lobos in the second frame. Kuiper scored 11 points including a pair of 3-pointers while Manigault scored twice from the floor and added eight free throws for 12 second-half points.

The Lobos turned Bradley over 15 times, including - in a two-minute span during UNM's first-half run.

For just the second time this season, UNM outrebounded its opponent, 40-33. The Lobos also outshot their opponent in every category. UNM was 43.3 percent (26-60) from the field, 37.5 percent (21-32) from 3-point range and 87.5 percent (21-24) from the free throw line.

UNM held Bradley to 43.1 percent from the floor (25-58), 35 percent from three (35 percent) and Bradley shot 62.1 percent from the free throw line.

Bradley outscored the Lobos in the paint 32-24 and off of turnovers 17-15, but UNM held advantage in second-half points, 16-11, and in points off of the bench, 60-11. Mathis' 23 pe ranks him tied for 13th in program history with most points off the bench.

Both the Braves and the Lobos had three players score in double figures. Mathis led all players on the night but the other 20-point scorer on the floor was Bradley's Darrell Brown, who posted 20 on 7-for-15 from the field and 3-for-6 from behind the arc. Lautier-Ogunleye followed with 16 and standout Elijah Childs was held to 13.

The Lobos return to action on Tuesday, Dec. 4 when they take on New Mexico State in Las Cruces. Tipoff is set for 7 p.m.

#### Lobos Toppled by Aggies in Las Cruces

LAS CRUCES, N.M. --- Despite being outscored by just seven points in the second half, the first-half deficit was too great to overcome as The University of New Mexico men's basketball team fell on the road to the New Mexico State Aggies by a final score of 100-65. Freshman Drue Drinnon led the Lobos with a career-high 13 points in the second half.

"When you get absolutely dismantled like that, you're just shocked," head coach Paul Weir said. "It's probably one of the most shocking games since Boise State last year ... I thought their defense was terrific, (JoJo) Zamora was exceptional and their rebounding was really good to keep us off the glass .. There are so many different parts to this game that they just beat us.

"We have another game in three days, and it's my job to get us ready to play in three days.

The 35-point deficit marks the most for the 13th-ranked team in the nation in scoring offense in the Rio Grande Rivalry since Jan. 3, 1959 when the Lobos fell the Aggies 96-59 (37 points) in Albuquerque.

NM State (7-1) got off to a hot start with an 11-0 lead and held the Lobos (4-2) silent for the first five and a half minutes. The Lobos answered with four points off of layups from junior Karim Ezzeddine and redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee and held the Aggies scoreless for 2:47. NMSU reclaimed its' offensive dominance, however, and followed with an 18-0 run over 5:20 (from the 8:05 - 2:45 marks) to put the game out of reach

Senior Anthony Mathis broke the streak with a pair of free throws UNM closed the final 2:05 of the first half with threes from Mathis and Ezzeddine, along with a layup by sophomore Makuach Maluach.

In the first half, the Lobos were outscored 50-22, outrebounded 31-12 and outshot 44.1 percent to 21.2 percent from the field (41.7 - 26.7 from 3-point range).

The Lobos were outscored by just seven points in the second frame, 50-43. Drinnon led the second-half Lobo squad going 4-for-6 from the field, 3-for-4 from behind the arc and 2-for-4 from the foul line - all in just 10minutes. He also fueled an 8-0 run over 1:33 that included five straight points on a 3-pointer and a layup with less than four minutes left to play.

On the night, UNM was led by three players scoring in double figures including Drinnon, Ezzeddine (11) and redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson (11). Ezzeddine and Jackson also led the Lobos in rebounds with six and eight, respectively. NMSU was led by JoJo Zamora who scored 27 points, followed by Ivan Aurrecoechea (23) and Eli Chuha (13). Chuha and Aurrecoechea finished with double-doubles, posting 10 and 11 boards, respectively.

The Lobos are set to return to action on Friday to finish off their threegame road stint with a contest against Saint Mary's in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic at the STAPLES Center in Los Angeles, Calif. Tipoff is scheduled for 5 p.m MT.

#### Lobos Fall to Saint Mary's in BHOF Classic

LOS ANGELES, Calif. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball LIOS ANGELES, Callf. --- Ine University of NeW Mexico mens basketonal team dropped a 25-point contest to Saint Mary's (CA) on Friday night, 80-65, at the STAPLES Center in Los Angeles, Callf. in the 2018 Basketball Hall of Fame Classic. The Lobos were led by redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson who scored 12 points and tallied eight rebounds.

"These last two games have been been exposing to us in a lot of ways that we're not where we want to be," head coach Paul Weir said. "(Right now) we're 4-3, we've won some games that I was really really happy about, we've lost two games by incredibly wide margins, and we just have to keep pushing forward from here.

"Hopefully the reps that we're getting these guys, just like the reps for the guys last year, will allow us to grow as the season unfolds and make us a really good team as the season unfolds."

Just two Lobos scored in double figures on the night including Jackson and sophomore Makuach Maluach (10), followed by sophomore Vladimir Pinchuk (9). Saint Mary's (6-4) was led by a trio of double-digit scorers including Jordan Ford who went 10-for-15 from the floor en route to 28 points. Hunter was followed by Malik Fitts (15) and Tommy Kuhse (10).

The Lobos (4-3) were outshot 34.8 - 60.0 percent from the floor and 15.4 - 33.3 percent from 3-point range. Seniors Anthony Mathis and Dane Kuiper combined for 0-11 behind the arc, contributing to UNM's season-low four 3-pointers on the night. Friday night's game marks the first time this season the Lobos have failed to reach 10 or more threes.

Like the last couple of matchups, UNM got out to a slow start, getting behind by 15 points in the first 6:35 by a score of 19-4. Saint Mary's eventually pushed the lead to 17 with 7:41 left in the first but the Lobos went on an 8-2 run that included four points by Pinchuk and layups from Maluach and redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee to make it an 11-point game, 35-24.

The Gaels hit a free throw but freshman Drue Drinnon followed with a three at the 3:02 mark to cut the Saint Mary's lead back to single digits, 36-27. The comeback was short lived however, as the Gaels once again increased their lead and finished the half on top by 14, 43-29.

At halftime, UNM was shooting 38.7 percent from the floor and 20.0 percent from 3-point range compared to 53.8 and 20.0 percent for the Gaels. Mathis and Kuiper went scoreless throughout the first half including an 0-for-4 mark from behind the arc for Mathis. Kuiper registered three fouls early and saw action in just 15 minutes on the night.

The Lobos looked to capitalize on some carryover momentum from near the end of the first half, but Saint Mary's quickly dispelled that hope. The Gaels exploded for a 13-0 run, forcing Coach Weir to call a timeout, and converted it to a 17-1 run to make it a 30-point game, 60-30, just four minutes into the half.

It was then that Mathis registered his first (and only) points of the game on back-to-back jumpers. The Gaels held a 25+ lead for the remainder of the

UNM turned the ball over just 10 times on the night and turned over Saint Mary's 15 times. Ten turnovers marks the least of any game so far this season for the Lobos while the next lowest of the season was 11 against NM State on Tuesday night - two of UNM's largest losses.

The Lobos were missing junior Corey Manigault on Friday night, sitting out due to a pregame incident that occurred Tuesday night. Manigault averages 12.8 points per game.

UNM returns to action on Tuesday night (December 11) at home against Colorado. Tipoff is scheduled for 7 p.m. on ESPN2.

#### Lobos Edged by Colorado in Last-Minute Thriller

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team trailed by just one point with seven seconds left on the clock against Pac-12 opponent Colorado on Tuesday night in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit, but the Buffaloes closed the game with a pair ws to win it 78-75. Tuesday's game was featured on ESPN2 and played in front of

UNM, which led for over 32 minutes on the night, was once again led by senior Anthony Mathis who registered his third 20-point game of the season with 23 before fouling out in the final seconds. He was followed offensively by senior Dane Kuiper (11) and redshirt-sophomor Vance Jackson (10).

Mathis was back in full force Tuesday night going 4-for-4 from deep and 4-for-5 from the floor in the first frame. He finished 7-for-10 from 3-point range on the night matching his career high.

Lobos (4-4) jumped out to an early lead on the Buffaloes (8-1), getting ahead by as much as 17 points with 7:07 left in the first half before Colorado began to close the gap. UNM led by nine at the half after CU's Deleon Brown hit a long three at the buzzer to cut a 12-point Lobo

In the first half, the Lobos embarked on an 11-0 run and fired at a clip of 45.7 percent from the floor while holding the Buffaloes to 364 percent. From 3-point range, UNM shot 41.7 percent in the first half compared to 27.3 for the Buffs. The Lobos were explosive in the first half, racking up 43 points while causing 12 turnovers for 25 points at head coach Paul Weir's targeted break-neck speed. The Lobo energy faded in the second half however, as UNM forced just one more turnover through the final 20 minutes.

'We had 10 deflections in the second half and forced one turnover. We got out to an early lead which is unusual for us. Early leads don't mean anything," Weir said. "The first half was a good 20 minutes, they might have been 20 of our better minutes of basketball on the season but when you have 10 deflections in a half you're never going to win a game.

"Our energy dropped as if we didn't know how to play with a lead and we missed some 50/50 balls that could have gotten us a few more (deflections). Hopefully we will be able to fix this

In the second half, UNM built a 14-point lead at the 15:54 mark with a 7-0 run that included layups from freshman Drue Drinnon and junior Karim Ezzeddine, as well as a three for Mathis to make it 52-38 Lobos.

Colorado whittled UNM's lead down to four over the ensuing 4:58 to make it a 52-48 game with 10:56 left. The game remained a single-digit game.

The Buffaloes continued the comeback and made it a one-point game with 8:53 left before Mathis and Jackson hit threes on a 6-2 Lobo run to push the Lobo lead back to five. Colorado responded with the next five to tie the game at 64-64 on a pair of free throws by CU's Namon Wright. The Buffaloes added two more points on a layup from McKinley Wright to take the lead, 66-64, with 4:33 left. Colorado never relinquished the advantage

Colorado extended its lead to six for its largest lead of the game with 1:35 left but the Lobos cut it back to one, 76-75, with seven seconds left on another pair of back-to-back threes from Mathis and Jackson along with a jumper from sophomore Vladimir Pinchuk.

With the clock winding down, Mathis committed his fifth foul to stop the clock with five seconds left. The Lobos attempted to overcome a narrow one-point deficit, but CU's Lucas Siewert hit both free throws to make it a three-point game.

The Lobos fired off one last shot, a long, contested three by Jackson at the buzzer, but it didn't fall and Colorado escaped with the 78-75 win.

On the night, UNM shot 41.4 percent from the floor compared to 41.9 percent for Colorado while the Lobos outshot the Buffaloes from 3-point range 40.0 - 26.3 percent. For the seventh game out of eight this season, UNM racked up at least 10 3-pointers (10-25). UNM was outrebounded 51-38 and capitalized on turnovers for 25 points compared to 13 for Colorado.

The Lobos are set to return to action on Sunday, Dec. 16 when they host Central Arkan. 2 p.m. The game marks the first that highly-anticipated transfer Carlton Bragg will be eligible compete

#### Maluach, Bragg Lead Lobos Past Central Arkansas

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- Sophomore Makuach Maluach scored a season-high 22 points while redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg tallied 16 in his first game on the floor as a Lobo to power UNM to an 82-70 victory over the visiting Central Arkansas Bears inside Dreamstyle Arena -The Pit on Sunday afternoon.

Over 10,000 fans roared at the 14:58 mark of the first half when Bragg touched the court for the first time in a year and a half coming off of sitting as an NCAA Division I transfer. Bragg scored just four points in the first half as he was getting acclimated to competition, but finished with a career-high 16 points and seven rebounds (he posted 15 points twice while at Kansas).

"When (Carlton) made his first two free throws right out of the gate, I felt good," head coach Paul Weir said of Bragg's performance. "I felt like he's not too excited... he calmly stepped up, made two free throws. That first layup or two, I think he was a little off, but as the game went on, he was able to turn and finish around the rim. I thought he did a pretty good job tonight."

With the win, the Lobos improve to 5-4 on the season while UCA falls to 4-6.

Maluach completed his breakout afternoon with his 22 points on four threes and 8-for-11 from Manuact completed ins Dreasout arteritoriou with in 82 22 points on four threes and 8-101-11 from the field along with a career-high seven rebounds. Junior Karim Ezzeddine also had a standout day finishing just one rebound short of his first double-double of the season with 10 points and nine rebounds marking just the second time this season he has scored in double digits.

Freshman Drue Drinnon notched season-best numbers with seven assists and four rebounds while collecting a pair of steals. He also leads UNM with 24 assists on the season

Four Lobos scored in double figures including Maluach, Bragg, Ezzeddine and senior Anthony Mathis who posted 13 including four 3-pointers on the night for his seventh double-digit game

"I think that it was (Makuach's) best breakout game of the year, and not just because he made some threes," Weir said. "It was the best offensive rebounding game and he had some energy to him ... That was really encouraging to see him come forward."

The Lobos got out to a seven-point lead in the first six minutes, 13-6, before the Bears went or an 11-4 run to tie it at 17-17 with just less than 10 minutes on the clock. The score differential remained under five for the remainder of the half until Mathis hit a three at the 2:13 mark to make it a five-point game, 35-30.

A Bear dunk followed by a pair of Mathis free throws and a layup from junior Corey Manigault made it a six-point lead for UNM, 38-32, which was extended to eight at the half after Bragg's first bucket as a Lobo with 13 seconds left, 40-32. Manigault also posted eight rebounds on

The Lobos forced a trio of turnovers in the final five minutes of the half en route to the break and forced a till of uninversin the milarity limites of the final rich fundes of the first half and held UCA to 16.7 percent from behind the arc (2-12). The Lobos were 6-for-16 from three in

Bragg picked up where he left off in the second half with his second layup of the game just 14 briggs proceed by Microscope in each of the Seconds and min insection apply or the game just 14 seconds into the frame for UNM's first double-digit lead of the day, 42-32. UNM went on an 11-3 run with 15:39 left that included back-to-back threes from Maluach and redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee and was capped by another layup from Bragg, 61-47 Lobos.

UNM's largest lead of the game came at the 10:58 mark when Bragg made it a 15-point game, 65-50. UCA battled back to cut UNM's lead to nine, 67-58, with 8:43 to play but a three from freshman Tavian Percy, his second of the season, pushed the Lobo lead back to 12.

After the final media timeout of the game with the Lobos leading by nine, Central Arkansas cut the Lobo lead to six on a three from UCAs Eddy Kayouloud before UNM closed on a 10-4 run that included back-to-back Mathis threes and a Maluach dunk. On the night, UNM shot 45.5 percent from the floor, 30.6 from three, while holding UCA

to 39.4 and 25.0 percent, respectively. The Lobos outscored UCA from the bench 60-22 and outrebounded the Bears 49-38 for the largest rebound margin of an opponent this season (1 Sunday night marked the eighth game this season that UNM has scored at least 10 3-pointers.

UCA had four players score in double figures including Kayouloud (10), Khaleem Bennet (14), Hayden Koval (11) and Jared Chatham (10).

UNM is set to return to action in just two days as the Lobos take on North Texas (10-1) on Tuesday night in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit at  $7~\rm p.m.$

#### Mathis Scores 20, Lobos Fall to (RV) North Texas

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team dropped a nine-point contest to (RV) North Texas on Tuesday night, 74-65, inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. Senior Anthony Mathis led the Lobos in scoring for the fourth time this season with 20 points, also marking the fourth time this season he has scored 20 or more.

The Mean Green (11-1) is currently receiving votes in the Top 25 USA Today Poll and jumped out to an early lead over the Lobos (5-5), putting UNM at a nine-point disadvantage within the first six minutes. UNM made its first five points off of free throws, but failed to score from the floor until sophomore Makuach Maluach hit a three at the 12:53 mark to make it 12-8 UNT.

Mathis went 4-for-8 from the floor, 1-for-5 from three and went a perfect 11-for-11 from the foul line for a new career-high. Tuesday night marks his fourth game this season shooting perfect from the stripe.

Redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee finished second on the squad with 11 points including a 3-for-5 showing from behind the arc. At the half, he was 3-for-3 in just 12:11 on the court. He was one of three Lobos to score in double figures including redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson who posted 10 on 4-for-6 from the floor and 2-for-4 from 3-point range.

Defensively, UNM was outrebounded 31-29, led by redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg with seven in his second game of the season. He was followed by junior Corey Manigault (6) and Jackson (5). Bragg also collected three steals on the night en route to UNM's season-high nine.

"I thought for parts of the game we did really well. Unfortunately, offensively we couldn't get going in the first half, and we couldn't get any momentum behind us," head coach Paul Weir said. "The turnovers really hurt us and gave them a lot of breakout opportunities ... (With) a team of that caliber, it's hard to overcome."

After North Texas built the early lead, the Lobos surged back to close a ninepoint deficit in just 1:13 in the middle of the first half. Mathis was fouled on a three and hit all three from the stripe to make it 17-11 before McGee hit a fast-break three to close it to three points, 17-14.

A Mathis steal led to yet another three from Jackson to tie it 17-17, capping the 9-0 run. North Texas responded with a 10-0 run over 2:51 however, reclaiming the lead 27-17 with 5:41 left in the half. UNM went on a 10-2 run to close it back to a two-point game, 29-27, before UNT took off for a six-point differential at the half, 35-29.

UNM was held shooting at just 28.6 percent from the floor in the first frame but fired 41.7 percent from three and 92.3 percent from the free throw line. North Texas shot 46.7 from the floor in the first half but just 30.0 percent behind the arc and 57.1 percent from the stripe.

In the second half, the Lobo defense held UNT without a bucket for nearly three minutes before allowing the Mean Green to increase a five-point lead to 12 at the 15:37 mark (42-30). The Lobos would get no closer than four the rest of the way as North Texas posted its largest lead of 13 with 5:41 left on the clock.

While UNM posted its second-lowest point total on the season in the contest (65), North Texas's defensive unit entered Tuesday's game allowing just 58.7 points per game. UNM finished shooting 36.4 percent from the floor, 30.4 percent from three and 83.9 percent from the free throw line.

UNM was outscored in the paint 44-18 and in second-chance points 16-9. The Lobos forced 17 turnovers but committed 21.

New Mexico returns to action on Saturday night as it faces 2018 NCAA Tournament team Penn, continuing the competitive holiday home stand at Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit at 2 p.m.

#### Lobo Comeback Not Enough, Penn Prevails 75-65

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- After going down by as many as 15 points early in the first half, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team tied it up, took the lead and threatened Penn until the final minutes on Saturday afternoon in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit, but the Quakers ultimately broke a 61-61 tie with six minutes left to win it 75-65.

The Lobos were outshot 47.5 percent to 39.3 percent from the floor while finishing a season-low 43.5 percent (10-23) from the free-throw line. Despite its offensive struggles on Saturday, UNM debuted a new zone defense that helped even out points in the paint as Penn outscored the Lobos down low just 38-30.

"(The zone) was great in the first half, at almost double the success rate of our man (defense), but early in the second half they were scoring against our man (defense)," head coach Paul Weir said. "We probably stayed in the zone a little too long, and I thought Penn got into a little bit of a rhythm there towards the end of the second half.

"I really believe in this team ... We have enough. We did some things today that hinted at what I need to work on to piece the team together further."

For the fifth time this season, UNM had four Lobos score in double figures led by senior Anthony Mathis, redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg, and redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee, who each posted 13 points. Redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson scored 10 and finished two rounds short of a double-double with eight rebounds.

Jackson and Manigault led in rebounds with eight apiece followed by Bragg who collected seven for his third-straight game. The Lobos and the Quakers each emerged with 41 rebounds on the night while UNM posted 13 offensive boards to just nine for Penn.

Penn jumped out to an early 10-point lead (12-2) in the first 6:18 and extended the lead to 15 points at the 12:24 mark (19-4) for the largest Quaker lead of the game.

The Lobos responded with a 20-5 run over 6:43 to tie the game at 24-24 with 5:41 left in the half. The run included 10-straight points by Mathis on a pair of free throws, a pair of threes and a jumper to make it a seven-point game 21-14.

The run continued with a pair of free throws by Manigault, a Jackson 3-pointer, a Mathis fast-break three and was capped by a layup from sophomore Vladimir Pinchuk, assisted by Jackson.

The Quakers went up by two on a jump shot by the game's second-leading scorer Michael Wang (19 points) before a three from Jackson gave the Lobos their first lead of the game, 27-26 with 5:28 to go in the half.

The teams went back and forth throughout the remainder of the half and the Quakers reclaimed the lead and extended it to six points before Jackson made it a four-point game with 47 seconds left for the 42-38 halftime score.

UNM came out of the break with a fast-break layup from Bragg to make it a two-point game, 42-40 Penn, and UNM kept the Quaker offense in check, allowing just a six-point advantage through the first 4:26.

Penn made it an eight-point game at the 14:37 mark before UNM embarked on another comeback run, going 9-0 to take a one-point lead on back-to-back threes from McGee and freshman Drue Drinnon at the 11:06 mark.

UNM went down by three with 10:08 left but powered back for another one-point advantage on a Bragg layup, 57-56, for the Lobos' last lead of the game.

The squads tied twice more at 59-59 and 61-61 before the Lobo steam ran out and Penn closed on a 14-4 run for the 10-point win.

"Our coaches are putting us in the right position to be successful," Mathis said. "We need to get a little bit more disciplined and we need to get better at finishing out games. That will come with experience and we'll learn how to finish some basketball games."

The Lobos are set to return to action on Sunday, Dec. 30 as they travel to Hobbs, N.M. to take on the University of the Southwest at Ralph Tasker Arena. Tipoff is scheduled for 2 p.m.

#### Lobos Take Down Southwest in Historic Hobbs Game

HOBBS, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team used a 31-point halfitime lead to earn an eventual 103-47 victory over the University of the Southwest on Sunday afternoon in Hobbs at the historic Ralph Tasker Arena. The victory marks the first regular-season game of 2018-19 that the Lobos have amassed 100 points.

With the win, the Lobos improve to 6-6 on the season while USW falls to 3-9.

UNM was led by senior Anthony Mathis who dropped a game-high 18 points on six 3-pointers, followed by redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson who tallied 16 that included three 3-pointers and a 6-for-10 mark from the field.

Mathis and Jackson were two of four Lobos to score in double figures including redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg (12) and freshman Tavian Percy (10). Percy's 10 points and six rebounds marked career highs in a career-most 22 minutes on the floor.

All 12 players that suited up on Sunday entered the contest, including all four freshmen. Freshman Drue Drinnon tallied a career-high 12 assists with no turnovers to go along with seven points. Twelve assists in a single game is just one short of cracking the top 10 for most assists in a single game in program history. Classmate Jordan Arroyo netted a career-best six points. Redshirt-freshman and transfer Clay Patterson also saw the court marking his first appearance of the season.

The contest in Hobbs was an exciting one for Lobo fans as the night was full of history - along with a plethora of dunks, alley oops and even a behind-the-back pass down low from Drinnon to Arroyo. The Lobos rebounded from the Dec. 2g game against Penn in which they short just 43.5 percent from the free throw line and demonstrated their proficiency from the stripe at a more-regular 77.8 percent (14-18).

On the defensive end, junior Karim Ezzeddine racked up a game-high 10 rebounds and nearly grabbed a double-double with eight points. UNM came down with the most boards of the season at 55.

"The reason we created this game was to merge our two basketball communities ... there's a lot of similarities," head coach Paul Weir said. "I'm hoping this can be the start of a lot of good things, not only basketball—wise but community-wise, enrollment-wise ... just good feelings between these two basketball communities.

"We've been making some schematic changes and this became a really good game for us to go out and continue to practice things that are new to us and almost give us an exhibition game kind of like it would be in the beginning of the season."

The Lobos got out to a swift start, jumping out to a 10-point lead in just the first three minutes (12-2). The Mustangs netted their first four points of the game off of free throws but it wasn't until the 12-53 mark that they registered their first field goal on a jumper in the paint by Chamar Morgan.

UNM made it a 20-point game on the first of two straight Dane Kuiper free throws at the 6:15 mark (33-13) and nearly made it a 30-point game on back-to-back threes from Mathis fueled by a Percy steal, 42-13 at the 4:34 mark.

A Drinnon three with 2:12 left in the first half finally put the Lobos ahead by 30 en route to a 31-point advantage at the break, 50-19.

Sunday's game marks the first time the Lobos have scored 50 points in the first half since scoring 58 at Colorado State on Feb. 28, 2018. USW put up just 19 points in the first half, marking the first time since Dec. 27, 2017 that UNM has limited an opponent to 20 points or less in the first frame.

The Lobos continued the offensive dominance in the second half and went on a game-best 21-point run from the 14:02 mark to the 7:16 mark (86-31). The run lasted 21 points and the USW scoring drought lasted 6:46.

The Mustangs never overcame the 50+ point deficit and UNM finished with a final score of 103-47, allowing the final jumper by USW with just 37 seconds left on the clock.

On the day, the Lobos shot 48.1 percent from the floor, 36.1 percent from three, while Southwest shot at a rate of 30.4 percent from the floor and 36.4 from 3-point range.

UNM returns to action on Wednesday, Jan. 2 when it kicks off conference play on the road at Air Force at 7 p.m. MT.

#### Lobos Open MW Play 1-0, Top Air Force 65-58

USAF ACADEMY, COLO. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team extended its Mountain West opener win streak to eight on Wednesday night with a 65-58 victory over Air Force on the road. After being held scoreless throughout the first half, senior Anthony Mathis led the Lobos with 17 second-half points.

With the win, UNM improves to 7-6, 1-0 MW, while Air Force slips to 5-8,

The Lobos had four players register double figures on the night including Mathis, who scored 13 straight points, redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson (14), sophomore Makuach Maluach (12) and senior Dane Kuiper (10). Redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg finished with a season-high nine rebounds while Maluach was second on the squad with seven.

Air Force junior Lavelle Scottie led the Falcons with 20 points.

In a strong defensive showing, the Lobos and the Falcons kept it close at the noset, tying the game three times over the first 10:34, the final time at just 15-15 with 9:26 left in the first half. During that stretch, the Falcons got out to five-point lead, 13-8, on a 9-0 run that included a trio of jumpers from Lavelle.

Kuiper tied it up with a jumper at 15 apiece before a Falcon layup gave the RAUPET URG IT UP WITH A JUMPET AT 15 apiece before a Falcon layup gave the home team a one-point advantage. Kuiper followed it up with a three to put UNM back up by one, a lead the Lobos would not relinquish. Kuiper went right back at it on the other end of the floor with a steal and a couple of quick passes up the court which allowed junior Corey Manigault a slam dunk for a three-point lead.

The Lobos continued on an 11-0 run to extend the lead to nine with 6:20 left. UNM got out in front by as many as 11 points during the remainder of the half but went into the locker room on top by nine, 29-38.

At the break, the Lobos were outshooting Air Force 46.7 - 35.3 percent from the floor and 35.3 - 16.7 percent from behind the arc. Jackson led UNM with 13 points in the first half, followed by Maluach who posted 10, each with a pair of threes.

The Lobos added 27 points in the second half, 17 of which were from Mathis who exploded in the second frame. The senior went 3-for7 from behind the arc and 5-for-10 from the floor. The nationally-ranked free-throw shooter also went a perfect 4-for-4 from the stripe. Bragg racked up six of his rebounds in the second half while collecting a pair of blocks.

After getting ahead by 13 points with 13:20 left to play, UNM's lead was overcome by another Air Force run as they cut the Lobos' lead to just four with 5:47 left and then to three with 1:05 left on the clock (61-58).

A foul by Air Force's Ryan Swan with 23 seconds left forced Mathis to take a A found by hir Potec's sylari swam with 25 seconds left force Mathis to face a pair of clutch free throws, increasing the Lobo lead to five, 63-58. Mathis then turned Air Force's Sid Tomes over with 12 seconds left on the wing and held on for the foul. He netted two more points from the stripe to clinch the 65-58

The Lobos turned the ball over 19 times while forcing 14. Air Force held an advantage in points in the paint (38-18), points off of turnovers (20-14) and fast-break points (8-2).

On the night, UNM outshot the Falcons 43.4 - 38.1 percent while holding Air Force to just 13.3 percent from behind the arc (2-for-15) and shooting 34.6 from 3-point range (9-for-26).

The Lobos are back in action on Saturday when they host No. 5/6 Nevada at Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit at 6 p.m. on ESPNU.

#### Lobos Rout Undefeated No. 5/6 Nevada, 85-58

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team handed No. 5/6 Nevada its first loss of the season on Saturday evening at home in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. The 27-point win breaks the UNM record for largest victory margin over a top-10 ranked team, surpassing the previous record of 20 points set on Jan. 29, 1974 against No. 8 New Mexico State (88-68).

The game also marks the first time the Lobos topped a ranked team since Jan. 3, 2015 when UNM claimed a 66-53 win over No. 24 Colorado State in Albuquerque and snaps Nevada's four-game win streak in the series

"This was about players. These guys played their butts off and bought into wha I'm selling," head coach Paul Weir said. "I am happy for them. I am happy that they get to enjoy this moment."

The Lobos (8-6, 2-0 MW) were powered by a career-high 27 points from senior Anthony Mathis and a near triple-double for redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson who tallied 18 points, 10 rebounds and seven assists. Jackson was one of two Lobos to register double-figures on the boards including redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg who racked up 12 rebounds and nine points along with a pair of blocks.

Nevada (14-1, 1-1 MW) entered the contest as one of just four undefeated teams in NCAA DI and allowed just 66.1 points per game of opponents so far this season. Nevada also entered the game averaging just 5.7 turnovers per game and the Lobos turned them over 14 times while committing just nine, tying the season low.

The Lobos held Wolf Pack leading-scorer, Preseason MW Player of the Year and Preseason All-American Caleb Martin to just eight points on the night (2-for-14-M)

Sporting brand new, gold, "We Are New Mexico" jerseys, the Lobos got out to a strong start defensively and did not let up. Nevada scored its first basket 1:23 into the contest but did not score again until the 16:29 mark to make the score 3-2 just 3:31 into the game.

The Lobos then embarked on a 20-6 run over 7:52 to take a 13-point lead, 22-9, over the historically-comeback-proficient Wolf Pack. Nevada cut it back to single digits at eight, 24-16, but UNM pushed the lead back to 15 on four points by senior Dane Kuiper, a layup by sophomore Vladimir Pinchuk and a three from Mathis, 33-18 with 2:27 left.

The teams went back and forth for the rest of the half and with UNM up 15 (38-23), Nevada's Jazz Johnson hit a three at the buzzer to make it a 12-point Lobo advantage at the break.

UNM fired at a clip of 45.9 percent from the field in the first half and 30.8 percent from 3-point range while holding Nevada to 37.9 from the field, 30.0 percent from behind the arc.

The second half kicked off much like the first in a strong defensive showing by both squads as the first bucket was a Wolf Pack alley-oop at the 18:27 mark. Nevada scored three straight points to cut UNM's lead back to single digits (38-29, 17:57) but a Jackson jumper outside the paint, a pair of Nevada's Jordan Caroline free throws and a pair of Mathis free throws put UNM back up by 11, 42-31, and UNM did not again relinquish the double-digit lead.

The teams kept the game within 16 points until sophomore Makuach Maluach hit a three at the 7-48 mark to make it a 19-point game, 64-45. The basket marked the beginning of a 10-3 run that included another pair of threes from Maluach and Jackson, 74-48, 5-40 left.

UNM continued to pile on the points building almost a 30-point lead with 2:31 remaining on a Mathis three, and again at 1:44 on a Mathis free throw, 85-56.

Nevada's Cody Martin hit one last fast-break layup for the 85-58 final with 1:36 left on the clock.

On the night, UNM outshot the Wolf Pack 45.6 percent to 33.3 percent. The Lobos also scored 20 points off of Nevada turnovers compared to just five points for the Wolf Pack.

The Lobos are set to return to action on Tuesday, Jan. 8, when they host UNLV at 9 p.m. on ESPN2.

#### Lobos Fall to UNLV in Final Minutes Tuesday

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- Following a historic victory over top-10 ranked Nevada on Saturday. The University of New Mexico men's basketball team was outscored in the final minutes by UNLV on Tuesday night, tallying its first conference loss of the season, 80-69. The Lobos are now 2-1 in Mountain

The Lobos (8-7, 2-1 MW) led for 19:40 in the contest that saw 17 lead changes. The Runnin' Rebels (9-6, 3-0 MW) led for 15:57 including the final 9:04. UNM led by as much as nine in the first half with a seven-point advantage at the break before UNIV outscored the Lobos by 18 in the second half for the eventual 11-point victory.

"I thought UNLV played terrific tonight and unfortunately, we did not play anywhere near the level that we need to play to win a game like this against a good team," head coach Paul Weir said.

"I thought the pace was good, but their pressure bothered us, particularly on the perimeter. We unfortunately couldn't get anything consistent at the defen-sive end to get through an off night."

New Mexico was led by four players scoring in double figures including redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson (14), junior Corey Manigault (13), redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg (12) and sophomore Makuach Maluach (12) marking the eighth time this season that UNM has had four or more Lobos score in double figures.

Bragg led the team on the glass with a team-high seven rebounds while Manigault added five boards and three steals.

Lobo leading scorer Anthony Mathis was held to just nine points including 2-for-10 from behind the arc, but he racked up four assists and pulled down

UNLV was led by senior and leading scorer Kris Clyburn who managed 25 points against the Lobo zone defense. He went 8-for-13 from the floor including 2-for-2 from three and 7-for-7 from the free throw line.

The Lobos came out with a fast start, winning the tip and racing down the court where Maluach drained a three just 16 seconds into the matchup. UNLV did not match it until a minute later, at the 18:45 mark and the teams were off.

At the 9:47 mark, the teams tied it up for the sixth time at 23 apiece and UNLV got out to a three-point advantage on a fast-break layup by Bryce Hamilton and a free throw by Joel Ntambwe. It was then that Bragg went off, scoring eight straight points on a trio of low hook shots and a pair of free throws for an 8-0 Lobo run to put UNM back on top by five, 31-26 with 6:13 left in the half. He finished the first half with eight points in just four minutes due to early foul trouble.

The Lobos got ahead by as much as nine with 56 seconds left on the clock with an 8-2 run to make it 42-33 before a pair of UNLV free throws made it a seven-point halftime score, 42-35 Lobos.

The Lobos outshot UNLV 56.7 percent to 42.9 percent from the floor in the first half, but finished getting outshot 50.0 percent to 41.8 including 46.2 - 22.2 from 3-point range. The last time the Lobos shot less than 30 percent from behind the arc was on Dec. 7 against Saint Mary's in the STAPLES Center.

Bragg came out of the break with a fast layup to push the UNM lead back to nine before UNLV embarked on an 8-0 run to make it a one point game wit 17:20 left, 44-43.

The teams tied the score three more times until UNLV started to take command of the game, using a 7-2 run to get on top by five with 8:39 left, 64-59.

Manigault scored four points as the teams went back and forth and a pair of Maluach free throws made it a one point game with 5:11 left 66-65 UNLV.

Over the next 2:36, the teams combined for just seven points and the Runnin' Rebels took off. UNLV was sparked by a three from Clyburn with 56 seconds left to make it a seven-point game and hit four straight free throws for an 11-point lead. Mathis hit one last layup before two more free throws for UNLV clinched the 11-point victory.

The Lobos are headed on the road for a pair of conference matchups at Colorado State on Saturday and at San Diego State on Tuesday.

#### Jackson Posts Double-Double; Lobos Fall at CSU

FORT COLLINS, Colo. --- Despite having four players score in double figures and redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson register his third double-double of the season, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team fell to Colorado State by a score of 91-76 on Saturday afternoon on the road.

With the loss, the Lobos fall to 8-8, 2-2 MW, while CSU improves to 7-10, 2-2 MW.

Jackson led the Lobos with 18 points, 12 rebounds and four steals, followed by senior Anthony Mathis who, after scoring just five points in the first half (2-for-2, 1-for-1 from three), racked up 11 in the second half en route to 16 points.

The other two Lobos to hit double figures included sophomore Makuach Maluach who went 3-for-7 from three, and senior Dane Kuiper, who netted all 10 of his points in the first half going 4-for-7 from the floor, 2-for-5 from behind the arc to open the contest. He shot just once more in the second 20 minutes.

Colorado State had five players score in double figures, led by redshirt-junior Hyron Edwards who racked up a season-high 20 points in a season-most 28 minutes. The last time UNM allowed five scorers in double figures was on Nov. 24 against UTEP.

Both teams were on point from the floor throughout the game as neither fired below 40 percent for the entirety of the contest. The Lobos shot 47.3 percent he day and entered Saturday's game 6.2 when scoring between 40.0 and 49.9 percent (2-1 in MW play). The Lobos also went 12-for-29 from behind the arc for 41.4 percent.

Despite the lofty Lobo numbers, Colorado State ultimately outshot UNM at 56.1 percent from the field and 46.7 percent from three.

Turnovers again proved to be a problem for the Lobos as New Mexico turned the ball over 17 times to just nine for the Rams. Colorado State capitalized on UNM's miscues as it converted the 17 Lobo turnovers into 24 points in the eventual 15-point loss. The Rams also dominated in the paint, outscoring UNM 44-22 in the key.

"I thought they came out of the gate making a lot of really good shots," head coach Paul Weir said. "Toward the end of the first half and through most of the second half, thought our defense was pretty good, unfortunately when you turn the ball over like that against a team with that kind of speed, you're not even giving yourselves a chance. Just to allow 24 points off of turnovers is harf for any defense."

The refs were quick to the whistle to kick off Saturday afternoon's matchup as Jackson registered his first point off of a free throw just 11 seconds into the game to put the Lobos on top 1-0. Three straight CSU 3-pointers however over a one-minute span quickly put the Rams up by eight at the 17:37 mark, 9-1.

A layup from Mathis and a successful and-1 for redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee cut the deficit back to three, 9-6, but the Rams pushed their lead to nine on a layup by their season's leading scorer Nico Carvacho. Mathis followed by hitting his first three of the night to cut it back to a six-point game, 19-13 with 13:36 left to play in the half.

The teams battled back and forth but Maluach hit a three at the 12:33 mark to make it a four-point game, 22-18, but CSU followed with a 12-5 run over the next 4:57 to get out to an 11-point advantage.

The Rams increased it to 13 before Kuiper and Jackson hit back-to-back threes within 26 seconds to make it a seven-point game, 42-35 with 1:20 left.

Despite an and-one from redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg with 21 seconds left, the Rams pushed the lead back to double figures, 48-38, at the half.

The Lobos cut the CSU lead back to single digits just twice more after the break, the last time at the 12:17 mark of the second half on a jumper by junior Corey Manigault, 57-49 Rams, before Colorado state went on a 7-0 run to make it a 16-point game, 65-49, and put the game out of reach. The Lobos would get no closer than 13, which came on the next play on a three from Jackson, 65-52.

Over the final 1:38, UNM cut a 25-point deficit down to 15 on a furious comeback rally attempt with threes from Mathis, Jackson and Maluach, along with a free throw from sophomore Vladimir Pinchuk, but it wasn't enough to overcome the Ram lead.

The Lobos were outscored by the Rams by a 10-point margin in the first half and a five-point margin in the second. On the day, the teams finished evenly matched on the glass, 31-30 in favor of the Rams. UNM shot 63.2 percent from the free-throw line (12-19) compared to 80.0 percent for CSU.

Other standouts on the day include McGee, who finished with eight points and a team-high five assists, along with Bragg who scored five points, registered six rebounds and posted one block.

The Lobos are set to return to action on Tuesday, Jan. 15 at San Diego State at 9 p.m. MT.

#### Mathis Scores 21, Defense Unravels in Second Half

SAN DIEGO, Calif. — After trailing by just five points at halfitime, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team fell by a final score of 97-77 to defending Mountain West Champion San Diego State on the road on Tuesday night. Senior Anthony Mathis registered his sixth 20+ point game of the season and went 6-for-10 from behind the arc.

The loss marks the third straight for the Lobos (8-9, 2-3 MW) after topping then No. 5/6 Nevada in exciting fashion in The Pit on Jan. 5. The win improves the Azterecord to 10-7, 2-2 in conference play.

Mathis went an outstanding 4-for-4 from behind the arc in the first half, along with free throw, for a total of 13 early points. He finished the night 6-for-10 from 3-point range and went 3-for-4 from the line.

Mathis led four Lobos to score in double figures including redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson, 16 points and a team-high six rebounds, as well as redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg (12 points), and senior Dane Kuiper (11 points). While starting sophomore Makuach Maluach did not continue his double-digit scoring streak, finishing with no points. he did lead the Lobos in assists with five.

UNM shot 42.9 percent from the floor, 40.6 percent from 3-point range including 13 made threes, but SDSU fired at a clip of 55.1 percent from the floor, 43.5 percent from behind the arc. Heading into Tuesday night's game, the Lobos were 6-3 when shooting over 40 percent from the floor. While 40 percent is usually enough for the Lobos to win, New Mexico has allowed the last three straight opponents to shoot 50 percent or better.

The Lobos got out to another slow start on Tuesday as the Aztecs jumped out to a 10-point lead, 17-7 at the 15:08 mark. After SDSU increased the lead to 11 at the 13:10 mark, the Lobos embarked on an exciting 11-2 run that included back-to-back threes from Mathis, the second allowed by a steal from Ezzeddine on the Aztec side of the court. The run also included a pair of free throws and a three from redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee, 21-19 SDSU with 11:20 left.

The Aztecs made it 23-19 before another Mathis three, his third in less than three minutes, made it a one-point game, 23-22, with 10:14 left to play in the first half.

The Lobos tied it up twice in the first half, the first at the 5:02 mark at 30-30 on a free throw by sophomore Vladimir Pinchuk to cap a 5-0 run, and the second at the 4:16 mark on a pair of free throws by Bragg (32-32).

With just 55 seconds left to play in the half, Bragg cut yet another SDSU four-point lead to two, 41-39 on a jumper before SDSU's Aguek Arop stole the ball under the Lobo basket with four seconds left. Arop sprinted toward half court, looked up at the clock as it dwindled, and fired a hall-Mary shot from the free throw line. The 3/4-court shot went in at the buzzer and the Attecs were up at the half by five,

"I thought the last play of the first half and probably the first four minutes of the second half were the difference in the game," head coach Paul Weir said. "We were controlling the ball and they weren't making threes. Unfortunately in the beginning of the second half, we turned it over three times in the first four minutes and they started making threes."

The second half quickly got out of control as Bragg registered a layup to make it a three-point game out of the break, 44-41, but then SDSU's Devin Watson hit a pair of threes within 31 seconds to begin to squelch the Lobo momentum.

The Aztecs got out to a 10-point lead on another three from Watson with 16:58 left and Kuiper responded to cut the game back to single digits - twice - with a pair of back-to-back threes. His 3-pointer at the 14:47 mark to cut the game to eight points (57-49) was the last time the Lobos would keep the game within single digits.

SDSU responded by rattling off seven straight points and continued to pile them on for the eventual 20-point victory. SDSU got out by as many as 26 points with as little as 3:47 on the clock, but UNMY slackson, Mathis, McGee and freshman Drue Drinno put up a layup, a pair of threes and four free throws to get the game closer before time expired.

The Lobos turned the ball over 17 times on the night, compared to just 13 for SDSU. The Aztecs outscored UNM in the paint, 50-16, off of turnovers, 27-21 and in second-chance points, 18-10.

UNM is set to return to action on Saturday, Jan. 19 at home against Wyoming. Tipoff is scheduled for 4 p.m. MT and the game will be broadcast on ESPN3.

#### Lobos Snap Streak with 30-Point Win Over Wyoming

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team snapped a three-game slide on Saturday afternoon at home with a dominant, 30-point victory over conference foe Wyoming, 83-53. Six Lobos racked up double digits, led by redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg who tied his career-high 16 points, while redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson posted his fourth double-double of the season, his second in three games.

With the victory, UNM improves to 9-9 overall, 3-3 in Mountain West play, while Wyoming falls to 4-14, 0-5 in the league.

The Lobo offense continued to shine Saturday afternoon, firing at a clip of 48.3 percent from the field. UNM has shot over 40 percent from the field in each of its six conference games this season, but defense has been the inconsistent factor. On Saturday, the Lobos held the Cowboys to just 35.2 percent from the field and outrebounded by an outstanding 17-rebound margin, 43-26.

The Lobos are now 6-0 when outrebounding their opponent.

"I think tonight we defended, and that's been a tough go for us this year," head coach Paul Weir said. "We had over 40 deflections, which is something that is important to me, and that was indicative of our energy tonight."

Bragg's 16 points led the Lobo squad as he also collected five rebounds, two steals and a trio of blocks. All five of the Lobo starters scored in double figures: Jackson (13), senior Anthony Mathis (12), sophomore Makuach Maluach (11) and senior Dane Kuiper (10). Redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee also netted a season-best 14 points and finished 5-for-7 from the field, 3-for-4 from behind the arc.

Jackson posted 13 points, 10 rebounds and five assists, Kuiper added four assists and tied his career-high four steals while Mathis also racked up four assists a career-high eight rebounds.

New Mexico started out fast and never let up. Kuiper put the Lobos on the board with a jumper outside the paint just 22 seconds into the contest on the Lobos' first possession. It was followed by a Wyoming jumper for the only tie of the game, 2-2, before UNM went on a 6-0 run over 51 seconds on a pair of threes from Mathis and Jackson, 8-2 UNM.

The Lobos converted the 6-0 run into a 12-2 run that put UNM up by 10, 14-2, just over six minutes into the game. After some back-and-forth, Wyoming cut the Lobo lead to eight with 10:22 left in the first half, but UNM unleashed a 14-0 run to get out to a 22-point advantage, 38-16, holding the Cowboys scoreless for 4:07 with 5:45 left in the first frame.

The teams went into halftime with the Lobos up by 17, 42-25. UNM shot 50 percent from the field in the first half (14-28) while holding the Cowboys to 35.7 percent (10-28).

Wyoming came out of the break with a layup to cut the Lobo lead to 15, but that was as close as the Cowboys would get as UNM ran away with the 30-point win. The Lobos' largest lead of the game, 33 points, came with 1:08 left as freshman Tavian Percy made a pair of free throws.

All dressed Lobo players saw action in the contest, including walk-on and redshirtfreshman Clay Patterson who scored his first career points on a pair of free throws.

On the night, the Lobos outscored Wyoming 32-22 in the paint, 29-8 on the fastbreak and  $21-11\ \text{from the bench}.$ 

UNM is set to return to action as it once again hits the road to take on UNLV in Las Vegas on Tuesday night at 8 p.m. on CBS Sports Network.

#### First Half Too Much, Lobos Fall at UNLV

LAS VEGAS, Nev. --- Despite being outscored by just four points in the second half, the first-half deficit was too much on Tuesday night as The University of New Mexico men's basketball team ultimately fell to UNLV by a final score of 74-58.

The loss comes after the Lobos claimed a 30-point victory over Wyoming on Saturday afternoon and marks the second time this season that the Runnin' Rebels have topped UNM immediately after a big win. The first was after UNM topped nationally-ranked Nevada by 27 points on Jan. 5.

With the loss, the Lobos slip to 9-10, 3-4 MW, while UNLV improves to 11-7. 5-1 in conference play

Redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson led the Lobos in scoring for the fourth time this season with 16 points while adding eight rebounds, three steals a an assist. Redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee and redshirt-junior Carlton Bra each posted 12 points while Bragg registered his first double-double of the season adding 12 rebounds. Bragg also posted a trio of dunks.

Senior Anthony Mathis was held to just eight points on the night. The last time Mathis was held to single digits was on Jan. 8 against UNIV. The two games mark the only two in the last 12 games that the senior standout has been held below 10 points.

On the night, UNM was outshot 43.9 percent (25-58) to 35.5 percent (22-62) from the field and 56.0 percent (14-25) to 26.1 percent (6-23) from 3-point range. The Lobos did, however, outrebound the Runnin' Rebels 42-41. Prior to Tuesday night's game, UNM boasted a record of 6-0 when outrebounding

The Lobo defense started the contest on fire, allowing just five points through the first 8:30 while getting out to a six-point lead, 11-5.

At the 8:59 mark, a three from UNLV's Nick Blair put the home team up by two, 16-14 before a layup from Jackson gave the teams the first tie at 16-16. The squads tied again at 17 and 18 before UNLV took off on a 9-0 run on three straight 3-pointers, including two by Noah Robotham, to make it 27-18 Runnin' Rebels with 5:44 on the clock.

UNLV increased the run to 19-4 to take its largest lead of the first half, 15 points, at 37-22 with 1:26 left. Both teams registered a layup before McGee made a buzzer-beating three to make it a 12-point game at the break, 39-27

Just 16 seconds into the second half, UNLV's Kris Clyburn hit a three to reenergize the Runnin' Rebel offense. Clyburn, who hit 25 points in the Lobos' last meeting with the Runnin' Rebels, was held to 14 points.

Trailing by 15 with 18:18 left, the Lobos went on a 7-0 run that included a pair of Bragg dunks and a Mathis three to cut the deficit to eight and get the

The teams kept it close over the next minute until a 5-0 UNLV run put the difference back to double figures at 13, 51-38 with 12:48 to play.

UNM cut it back to single digits just once more at the 9:35 mark on a Jackson three, 54-45, but Clyburn responded with a three of his own to make it a 12-point game and the Runnin' Rebels never looked back.

McGee finished the second half like he did the first, with a three in the final seconds, for the 74-58 final.

Fifty-eight points marks the least the Lohos have scored this season against any opponent. On the night, UNIV converted UNIV's 14 turnovers into 23 points while the Lobos scored just two off of 11. UNIM led in second-char points (18-11), and in the paint (24-22) while the Runnin' Rebel bench outscored the Lobos' 31-22.

UNM led for 11:18 of the contest while UNLV led for 27:18.

The Lobos are set to return to action at home on Saturday as they host Utah State at 2 p.m. inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit.

The Lobos (9-11, 3-5 MW) trailed the Aggies (15-5, 5-2 MW) by as much as 10, 50-40, at the 12:51 mark in the second half but reduced the deficit to just one with a 9-0 run over 3:44 to make it 50-49 with 9:07 left. The run was sparked by a layup from senior Anthony Mathis followed by another from sophomore Makuach Maluach and then a dagger of a three from Mathis to make it a three-point game, 50-47.

Mathis finished with 16 points on the night, all of which were in the second

With the crowd on its feet and the energy in The Pit nearly palpable, redshirt junior Carlton Bragg, who led the Lobos with a career-high 18 points, hit a pair of free throws to make it a one-point game, 50-49 and then, after an Aggie jumper, hit a jumper of his own to keep it at one, 52-51.

Utah State standout and leading scorer Sam Merrill hit another jump shot to put the Aggies back ahead by three before Mathis responded just nine seconds later with a three of his own to tie the score at 54-54 with 7:55 left.

A three from redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson tied it up again at the 6:32 mark, 59-59 and the Aggies got ahead by two before Mathis hit an exciting, fast-break three, his fourth of the night, to give the Lobos their first lead since the first 15 seconds of the game, 62-61 UNIM with 5:33 left.

Utah State responded with a triple of its own and the teams tied the game once more at the four-minute mark when Mathis made yet another layup, 64-64. The Lobos increased the lead to two, 66-64 on a Jackson jumper with

A Utah State free throw with 1:25 on the clock made it a one-point game, 66 65 Lobos, and a jump ball was forced with 37 seconds left in favor of UNM.

Mathis took the ball out and brought it to half court in pressure, looking to hold on to the one-point advantage. He approached half court, looked and passed ahead to Jackson in attempt to get out of trouble, but the referees called backourt to the dismay of Lobo fans, causing the potential gamewinning possession to turnover to the Aggies with 31 seconds left.

The Aggies ran out the clock and sophomore Abel Porter hit just his eighth 3-pointer of the season with 1.8 seconds left to put Utah State back up by

Both coaches called timeouts and Mathis made a last-ditch effort from half court to hit another gamewinner, but the shot bounced off of the backboard for the 68-66 final.

The Lobos had four players score in double figures including Bragg with 18 followed by Mathis with 16. Jackson (13) and Maluach (12), Jackson also led the Lobos in rebounds with seven followed by Bragg who posted six.

LINM shot just 27.6 percent from the floor in the first half, but in the second fried at a clip of 50 percent including 45.5 percent from 3-point range. The Lobos' totals for the night were 39.0 percent from the field compared to 49.1 percent for the Aggies and 33.3 percent from behind the arc compared to 50 percent for Utah State.

The Lobos turned the ball over just 11 times while forcing 13 and the UNM bench outscored Utah State's 32-8. The Aggies led for 32:23 of the contest while UNM was in front for 4:59.

UNM has its first bye this week and returns to action on Saturday, Feb. 2 at Fresno State on ESPNU.

#### Mathis Scores 19, Lobos Struggle to Hold On

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- In a game with nine lead changes in which the Lobos led for over 13 minutes, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team struggled to hold onto the lead on Saturday night and ultimately fell to third-place Fresno State by a final score of 82-70.

The Lobos led by as many as nine in the first half but went into the locker room down by two at the break. Fresno State outscored UNM by 10 points in the second frame as the Lobo offense shot just 29.7 percent in the second

Senior Anthony Mathis netted 19 points on six threes and a free throw. He has now tallied 12 or more points in 17-of-21 games this season. Redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg registered a career-high 15 rebounds to go along with

Two other Lobos scored in double figures on the night including redshirt-sophomores Vance Jackson (16) and Keith McGee (10). Jackson has now scored 10 or more points in the last 12 straight games.

"We started out the game really well defensively, I thought we did some good things, and then you look up at halftime and you're down two," head coach Paul Weir said. "I thought we played really well the first 20 minutes... (but) that early to middle part of that second half ... the defensive game plan went

"The results are the results, but we have to find a way offensively to get more

The Bulldogs were led by three players in double figures including a pair of 20-point scorers in Braxton Huggins (22) and Deshon Taylor (20). Nate Grima also had a big night tallying a double-double with 19 points and a Save Mart Center-record 19 rebounds.

The Lobos started out strong, jumping out to a nine-point advantage just 5:41 into the contest, 16-7. The 8-0 run included four points from Bragg ar three from Mathis, along with a layup from sophomore Makuach Maluach

Fresno State responded and eventually closed the gap to one, 19-18, with 8:15 left in the first half. The teams battled throughout the remainder of the period, tying the game four times in the final six and a half minutes, includir with 1:02 left. A MCGee free throw made it 32-32 and another by Bragg put the Lobos up by one with 24 seconds left.

The Bulldogs' Taylor hit a jumper and-one to take the two-point advantage heading into the break.

The Lobos slipped into a five-point deficit with 16:28 on the clock in the second half and it looked like the game was about to get out of control, UNM rebounded and tied it up at the 12:41 mark, 48-48, on a steal and coast-to-coast three from Mathis.

The tie marked the last however, as UNM had the game at one on a McGee three at the 9:41 mark, 54-53, but an ensuing 13-3 Fresno State run put the game out of reach at 11 points, 67-56, with 6:49 left to play.

The Lobos cut the game back to single digits three times, but would get no closer than nine points the rest of the way.

Both teams amassed a significant amount of fouls as the Lobos totaled 23 to Fresno State's 21. Both squads had its leading scorer foul out - UNM's Mathis fouled out with 1:18 left to play while Fresno State's Huggins fou

On the night, UNM was outscored in the paint 42-20 and 17-9 in second-chance points, but the Lobos scored 11 fast-break points to none for the Bulldogs while also outscoring Fresno State's bench 44-12. UNM exercised its ball-handling skills on the night, turning the ball over just 10 times, 4.75 less than its season average. Conversely, the Lobos forced 15 from the Bulldogs.

Fresno State fired at a clip of 44.4 percent from the floor (28-63), 20 percent from three (4-20) while the Lobos were 31.9 (22-69) from the field and an uncharacteristically-low 21.6 percent from 3-point range (8-37).

The Lobos have a short turnaround as they take on San Diego State for the second time this season on Tuesday, Feb. 5, at 9 p.m. Mountain Time on ESPN2.

#### Lobos Overpower 4th-Place SDSU: McGee Scores 19

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- Behind a season-high 19 points from redshirtsophomore Keith McGee, The University of New Mexico came back from a one-point halftime deficit with 47 second-half points to take down fourth-place San Diego State 83-70 on Tuesday night in The Pit on ESPN2.

The last time the Lobos scored at least 47 points in the second half was in UNM's 27-point victory over then-No. 5/6 Nevada, exactly one month ago (Jan. 5), handing the Wolf Pack its only loss of the season to date.

UNM improves to 10-12 overall, 4-6 in league play, while SDSU falls to 13-9,

The Lobos fired at a clip of 53.8 percent from the field, marking the second-highest shooting percentage of the season behind 59.6 on Nov. 17 against NMSU. After allowing the Aztecs to shoot 45.2 percent in the first half, UNM limited SDSU to just 38.2 percent in the second frame (13-34) for a total of 41.5 percent on the night.

"San Diego State was awesome to start, but over the course of the game, we got a feel for our defense. We are growing into it every day," head coach Paul Weir said. "We've been tinkering with our team all season, but we will keep chipping away at it.

"SDSU is a great basketball team. They are athletic and are playing very well right now, so for us, this is a good win."

McGee, who went 8-for-10 from the floor, senior Anthony Mathis and sophomore Makuach Maluach were the three Lobos to lead in double figures Mathis registered 17 points, marking his 18th game this season scoring 10 or more, and scored all 17 in the second half. Maluach collected 11 points and tied his career-high three blocks.

Redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg brought down 11 boards for the second straight game in double figures on the glass.

SDSU was led by standout Jalen McDaniels who collected 25 points and

The first half was a back-and-forth of runs as the Aztecs jumped out to a 16-6 lead in the first four minutes, but the Lobos went on a 9-0 run over 3:23 to make it 16-15 SDSU at the 12:37 mark.

The teams tied it three times before SDSU went on another run, this time 11-0 over 4:01 to take a 33-22 lead with 5:37 left in the first half.

With SDSU leading by eight with 3:10 left, the resilient Lobos refused to let the Aztecs score again, going on a 7-0 run over the remainder of the half. UNM held the Aztecs scoreless over the final 3:10 of the half to go into the break down by one, 37-36.

Tuesday night not only breaks SDSU's three-game win streak, but also snaps UNM's three-game loss streak and breaks UNM's seven-game streak of losing after trailing at the half.

SDSU came out with the first shot of the second half to increase its lead to three, but UNM exploded with a 22-4 run to get out to a 15-point advantage, 58-43 with 13:46 left, and didn't let up from there.

The Lobos made it a 20-point game by the 8:09 mark and the Aztecs tried to battle back, but would get no closer than 14 until the final free throw of the game with 51 seconds left for the 13-point final.

On the night, UNM outscored SDSU in the paint 36-34, on the fast break (30-20) and off the bench (38-15). Additionally, the Lobos capitalized on SDSU's 16 turnovers for 25 points to just 13 points for the Aztecs.

UNM is set to return to action on the road on Saturday, Feb. 9 at No. 6/6 Nevada. The game is scheduled to air on CBS Sports Network at 4 p.m. MT.

#### Lobos Suffer Defeat at No. 6 Nevada

RENO, Nev. — After handing the top-ranked team in the Mountain West its only loss of the season in the first meeting, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team suffered a loss in its rematch with No. 6 Nevada on Saturday evening, 91-62, in Reno. Sophomore Makuach Maluach led the Lobos with 19 points.

The Lobos (10-13, 4-7 MW) topped No. 6 Nevada (23-1, 10-1 MW) by 27 points in Albuquerque and the Wolf Pack responded with a 29-point victory their home arena Saturday.

Nevada was led by five players scoring in double figures including a pair of 20-point scorers in seniors Trey Porter and Caleb Martin. UNM was led by Maluach with 19 points and seven rebounds followed by redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg who scored 13 points and posted a team-high eight rebounds. Redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee was UNM's third-leading scorer with nine

"Nevada was really good tonight, they established themselves around the rim defensively and they really established themselves around the rim offensively," head coach Paul Weir said. "I thought (Trey) Porter was terrific tonight and them as a group, they just won that war around the paint. Our post feeds were way off the lane and their post feeds were in the paint.

Those were the things that really stuck out to me the most (tonight). Our ability to take care of the ball and their ability to control the rim area

Highlights of the night included that UNM held Nevada to just six threes on the day while forcing the most Wolf Pack turnovers of the season (17). Prior to Saturday's contest, Nevada averaged just 9.6 turnovers per game.

The Lobos and the Wolf Pack battled through the first five minutes of the contest, but Nevada slowly crept out to a 12-point lead at the 14:48 mark and it increased from there. The sixth-ranked team in the nation opened on a 25-4 run over the first 10:13 before a dunk from junior Corey Manigault gave the Lobo offense some spark.

Just 14 seconds later, senior Anthony Mathis hit his first of two threes of the game to cut the once 21-point deficit to 16, 25-9.

Nevada followed with a 9-0 run to get back up by 25 with 6:44 left on the

The Wolf Pack got the lead up to 29 before Maluach hit a layup, a free throw and a three for six points within 30 seconds to make it a 23-point game,

Nevada eclipsed 50 points in the first half behind a combined 21 points from the Martin twins, Cody and Caleb, marking the first time UNM has allowed ar opponent to score 50 or more points in the first half since New Mexico State on Dec. 4 on the road.

The Lobos went into the locker room down 25, 51-26, with three players in foul trouble including Manigault, Mathis and Bragg, each with three. At the break, UNM had forced eight turnovers. The Lobo defense also held Nevada from three-point range as the first half closed, including a 1-of-7 stint from behind the arc.

The Lobos fared better from the floor in the second half, shooting 40 percent (12-30) but Nevada shot an even 50 percent from the floor in both the first and second halves to finish 34-for-68 on the day.

Bragg hit 11 of his 13 points in the second half in an attempt to power the Lobos to a comeback, but despite the improved Lobo performance throughout the second 20 minutes, the Wolf Pack would lead by no less than 24 points throughout the remainder of the contest.

Overall, Nevada outscored UNM in the paint 42-20, off of turnovers 22-9 and in second-chance points 11-9. New Mexico's bench outscored that of Nevada 23-15 and both teams registered 10 fast-break points.

The Lobos will host a pair of contests in Dreamstyle Arena – The Pit this week as they take on San José State on Wednesday, Feb. 13 at 7 p.m. on AT&T SportsNet before hosting Fresno State on Saturday, Feb. 16 on ESPN3.

#### McGee Hits 20, Lobos Top SJSU by 32

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team rebounded from a tough loss against No. 6 Nevada with a 32-point victory over San José State on Wednesday night at Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit marking the largest victory margin for the Lobos over a Division I opponent this season.

Three of the Lobos' five conference wins on the season have come by a margin of 25 points or more.

Redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee led the Lobos for the second time in the last three games with his UNM-career-high 20 points that included a 4-for-6 performance from 3-point range, 7-for-10 from the floor. McGee has scored 10 or more points in three of his last four games and is now averaging 10.4 points per game in Mountain West play.

McGee led four Lobos to score in double figures including junior Corev Manigault (17), senior Anthony Mathis (16) and sophomore Makuach Maluach (14). Sophomore Vladimir Pinchuk led UNM in rebounds with seven in just 15 minutes on the court while Manigault added six.

A pair of Lobos tallied five assists apiece including redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson and senior Dane Kuiper, contributing to UNM's successful offensive

The Lobos (11-13, 5-7 MW) fired at a clip of 50.0 percent from the field for the second time in the last three games including a 51.9 percent mark from behind the arc. UNM held SJSU (3-20, 0-11 MW) to 35.3 percent from the floor and 23.5 percent from three-point range.

All 12 eligible Lobos saw action in the game including all four freshmen.

McGee got the game off on the right foot with an early three at the 18:58mark and didn't let off the gas from there. While the Spartans were able to keep the game close through the first 16 minutes that included eight tied scores, UNM went on a 15-2 run to close the last 5:01 of the first half.

The key run was sparked by back-to-back threes from Jackson and put the Lobos in the locker room up by 10 at the break, 42-32.

The Lobos extended the run into the second half to 30-7 and continued to dominate offensively, increasing the lead to a game-high 33 points (90-57) with 1:18 left en route to the 32-point final, 92-60. During the 30-7 run, the Lobos were 11-of-13 from the field, shooting 3-for-4 from behind the arc to go along with five free throws.

UNM outscored the Spartans 50-28 in the second half for the final score. limiting SJSU to just 33.3 percent (11-33) from the floor and 16.7 percent (1-for-6) from behind the arc

The Lobos committed just 10 turnovers while forcing 11, but converted them for 14 points compared to just two for the Spartans

New Mexico is set to return to action on Saturday, Feb. 16 when it hosts Fresno State inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit on ESPN3.

#### Lobos Upended in Second Half; Jackson Scores 30

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- After firing at 40 percent from the floor and going into halftime with a three-point advantage, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team was outscored in the second half by second-place Fresno State on Saturday, falling by a final score of 81-73. Redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson scored a career-high 30 points in the contest, including 20 in the first half, marking the first time a Lobo has done so since 2017.

Jackson went 8-for-15 from the floor including 4-for-6 from 3-point range while shooting 10-of-11 from the free-throw line. His 30 points marks the first time a Lobo has netted 30 this season, and also the first time a Lobo has scored 30 points since Feb. 21, 2017 when former Lobo Elijah Brown achieved the feat against Wyoming.

The Lobos (11-14, 5-8 MW) were led by Jackson and another pair to rack up double figures including junior Corey Manigault (16) and senior Anthony Mathis (13). Manigault's 16 points marks the second straight game in which he has scored 15 points or more while Mathis has scored 10+ points in 20-of-25 games this season.

Redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg pulled down 10 boards and was the only player to do so in the game

Throughout the first half, UNM went 40.0 percent from the floor, 45.5 perce from three, and made 13 free throws for 86.7 percent from the line (13-15). Fresno State got into early foul trouble, forcing limited minutes for Bulldog leading scorer Braxton Huggins. Huggins saw just 4:32 of action in the first half and went scoreless, but tallied 19 in the second half during Fresno State comeback. He followed Deshon Taylor who led Fresno State with 26 points, 7-for-15, 5-for-8 from three, and 7-for-9 from the stripe.

"Taylor made a couple (threes) in the first half, Huggins made a couple in the second, and Taylor made another in the second. They made about five threes from beyond NBA range, and quite honestly that's not something that we are going out to try and take away." head coach Paul Weir said. "You have to tip your hat at some of those, they are great players making very deep shots."

Fresno State (19-6, 10-3 MW) got out to an early six-point lead, 10-4 at the 14:55 mark in the first half before Mathis hit his first three of the game to c it back to three, 10-7. The Bulldogs again took a six-point lead but the Lobox went on a 6-0 run that included an and-1 for Jackson, followed by Mathis' second three of the night to tie it up 13-13.

With 5:39 left in the half, the Lobos trailed by eight, 30-22, but the UNM offense caught fire and went on a 16-5 run to close the first half.

The Lobo run included four free throws by Manigault (2) and Jackson (2) along with a layup from Manigault before Jackson hit a three to make it a one-point game, 32-31 Fresno State. The Bulldogs responded with a three of their own to make it a four-point game, 35-31.

Just 38 seconds after Jackson's three, redshirt-sophomore Keith McGeo capitalized on the momentum and made a massive dunk to bring The Pit crowd of 12,494 to is of eet. Jackson followed with another three 50 seconds later to put the Lobos on top by one, 36-35 with 1:04 left in the half.

Jackson finished the half with a pair of free throws for the 38-35 lead at the

The Lobos extended their run throughout the first minute of the second half with another Manigault layup and a Mathis three for their largest lead of the game, eight, 43-35. The triple capped a 21-5 run before Fresno State battled back with a 12-0 run to get ahead by four at the 16:27 mark, 47-43.

UNM would battle back and tie it 49-49 and neither team led by more than five until Fresno State got on top by six, 67-61 with seven minutes left.

The Lobos brought it within one just once more, 71-70 Bulldogs, on a Jacksor layup, but Fresno State finished on a 10-3 run for the final.

Both squads posted runs of 12-0 in the game and held their largest leads of eight in the contest that saw seven lead changes.

Overall, UNM outrebounded Fresno State 40-33 and outscored the Bulldogs in the paint 22-20. Fresno State was whistled for 26 fouls that led to 28 point for UNM from the stripe compared to just 18 fouls for the Lobos, 17 points from the stripe for Fresno State.

UNM is set to return to action on Wednesday, February 20 when the Lobos travel to Utah State for a 9 p.m. MT contest on ESPNU.

#### Lobos Overcome by Utah State, Mathis Drops 20

**ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.** --- Despite outshooting its opponent on the night, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team ultimately suffered a 71-55 loss on the road at Utah State on Wednesday night in a 9 p.m. league clash. Senior Anthony Mathis led the Lobos for the 11th time this season with his seventh 20-point game of 2018-19.

With the loss, UNM falls to 11-15 overall, 5-9 in Mountain West play, while Utah State improves to 21-6. 11-3 MW.

On the night, UNM outshot the Aggies 40.0 - 37.1 percent, marking the first time in conference play this season that the Lobos have lost when outshooting their opponent (5-1). UNM also fired more accurately from 3-point range, going 7-for-23 (30.4 percent) to USU's 7-for-27 (25.9 percent).

Utah State was led by freshman Neemias Queta who scored a game-high 23 points and registered his eighth double-double of the season with a game best 10 rebounds.

"I thought we started off the game defensively perfect, exactly how we wanted. We got the shots that we wanted ... and I think it led to some good things offensively," head coach Paul Weir said. "At the end of the day, the issue was our turnovers. We just gave them a lot of easy stuff in transition that we just couldn't get because they took care of the ball."

The Lobo defense limited the Aggies to just 35 points in the first half and 36 in the second, but turnovers continued to plague UNM as the Lobos committed eight in the first half before adding 10 in the second, seven within 6:04. UNM's 55 points marks the least the Lobos have scored all season, following 58 at UNLV on Jan. 22.

UNM came out hot allowing USU to get out to a three-point advantage, 3-0, on a jumper and a free throw from Queta before powering back with a 14-2 run that included a trio of Mathis jumpers, a three from sophomore Makuach Maluach and redshirt-sophomore Vance Jackson, as well as a layup from junior Corey Manigault.

The spree put the Lobos on top by nine, 14-5 and UNM held the lead until the seven-minute mark when USU's Brock Miller hit a three to get the Aggies back on top by one, 21-20.

UNM held the Aggies for a pair of possessions and forced a foul, sending Mathis to the line to tie it back up at the 5:28 mark, 21-21, and take the lead with the second, 22-21.

Twenty-five seconds later, Mathis hit another three to give the Lobos a four-

Two more ties ensued, once at the 2:47 mark and another with 24 seconds left when Manigault hit a free throw to make it 32-all.

Standout junior Sam Merrill hit a three with three seconds left on the clock to send the teams to the locker room with the Aggies leading by three, 35-32 The Lobos are now 1-7 in conference play when trailing at the half.

Utah State continued the momentum into the second half as the Aggies got ahead by seven at the 14:57 mark and never looked back. The Lobos would get as close as five but the Aggies continued to pile onto the lead, extending the advantage to double-digits with 9:01 left on a good three by sophomore Abel Porter, 52-41.

UNM cut a 13-point lead down to seven on an 8-2 run that included a Jacksor layup, a three from redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee and another triple from Mathis, 56-49 with 4:30 left. A 6-0 run put Utah State back ahead by 13, however and the deficit remained in double figures from there en route to the 16-point final.

The Lobos have a bye week on Saturday and are set to return to action on Tuesday, Feb. 26 at San José State. Tipoff is scheduled for 8 p.m. MT on AT&T SportsNet.

Four Lobos scored in double figures in the 89-82 loss at San José State, including redshirt-sophomore Keith McGee who posted a UNM-career-high 25 points on 10-for-19 from the floor and 5-for-11 from behind the arc.

McGee has led the Lobos (11-16, 5-10 MW) in three of the last six games in scoring. Leading scorer for UNM on the season, senior Anthony Mathis, was able to register just five points, but his lone three on the right extended his 3-pointer streak to 20 straight games, good for seventh in Lobo program history.

The other three Lobos to score in double figures included junior Corey Manigault (17) and redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg (17) followed by sophomore Makuach Maluach (14). Bragg also registered his second double-double of the season with a season-high 16 rebounds.

The Spartans (4-23, 1-14 MW) fired at a rate of 48.4 percent on the night, markin their fourth-highest shooting percentage on the season behind a pair of 20-point scorers in sophomore Noah Baumann (26) and junior Michael Steadman (21).

"I thought Steadman was terrific, we quite frankly we couldn't guard him," head coach Paul Weir said. "Baumann obviously made some terrific shots, really challenged deep ones. Some of them you've got to tip your cap to him, some of them are obviously defensive lapses as well.

"I thought our second-half defense was a lot better but that first half, was awful. I thought Steadman and Baumann were the two best players on the court tonight, they were exceptional."

The Lobos' loss to the Spartans marks just the second in program history, UNM is now 14-2 in the series and 5-1 on the road.

UNM went into halftime down by just one, 47-46, but with 7:35 left on the clock in the second half, found itself down by 11, 76-65. The Lobos held the Spartans scoreless for three minutes before cutting the deficit down to seven on a pair of Bragg free throws and a Manigault layup with 3:21 left to play, 76-69.

The renewed, second-half Lobo defense held SJSU scoreless for 6:13 before SJSU's The terrewed, section-and Lood electric field of 30-5 scores of 0-25 ores (378-69). Break ley made a layup with 1-22 left to bring the Spartan lead back to nine (378-69). Despite holding SISU scoreless, the Lobos were unable to capitalize offensively throughout the silent stift.

A McGee layup made it a seven-point game with 1:14 left, 78-71, before SJSU's Zach Chappell responded with a pair of free throws to even it back out, 80-71 with 1:08 left.

The Lobos attempted the comeback, forcing fouls to stop the clock, but SJSU went 7-for-8 from the free throw line over the last 50 seconds to prevent UNM from reclaiming the lead.

New Mexico got the game as close as six, just two possessions, with 47 seconds left after the pair of free throws from Chappell followed by a three from McGee, 82-76, and Coach Weir took his final timeout.

McGee fouled at the 45-second mark and Ivey made another pair of free throws to increase the SJSU lead to eight.

Another McGee three with 29 seconds left provided hope for UNM, trailing five points (84-79) with 29 seconds to go, but three more free throws and an alley-oop with 12 seconds left sealed the win for the Spartans. Maluach made a three with two seconds left, but with UNM down by 10, it resulted in the seven-point final.

While the Spartans shot 72.7 percent from the charity stripe on the night, UNM shot a dismal 42.1 percent, its lowest percentage on the season from the line. The Lobos went 8-for-19 from the stripe, accounting for 11 points left behind in the seven-point loss. The Lobos struggled in the first half, allowing SJSU to get out to an early seven-point

lead, 14-7, at the 14:58 mark before responding with an eventual 10-0 run from the 12:27 mark (20-14) to the 10:51 mark to make it 24-20 Lobos. The run was capped by a McGee three with Mathis on the assist. iesday night's game had nine lead changes and four ties while the Lobos led by a uch as six in the first half and the Spartans led by as much as 13 with 14:09 left ir ie second. Both teams posted evening-best runs of 10-0.

On the night, UNM shot 40.2 percent from the floor, 23.5 from three, while SJSU was

48.4 percent from the floor and 50 percent from three (11-22).

The Lobos are back in action on Saturday, March 2 as they return home to host Colorado State inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit at 8 p.m. MT on ESPNU.

#### Lobos Split with Colorado State to Break Streak

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team snapped its streak on Saturday night with a 77-65 victory over Colorado State in front of 11,207 fans inside Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit. The Lobos were led by sophomore Makuach Maluach who collected a game-high 23 points for a new season-high.

The Lobos (12-16, 5-10 MW) outrebounded the Rams (12-17, 7-9 MW) by a margin of 22, 47-25 marking the second straight game that UNM has outrebounded its opponent by more than 15 boards.

Not only did Maluach lead the Lobos in scoring, he also registered his first career double-double with 10 rebounds. He was one of three Lobos to rack up 10+ rebounds, led by redshirt-junior Carlton Bragg (14) and junior Corey Manigault (11).

Bragg also posted three steals and finished just one point shy of his third double-double of the season with nine points.

The last time UNM had two or more 10+ rebounders was on Jan. 5 against then-No. 5/6 Nevada.

"Certain elements of tonight's game went the way we wanted them to," head coach Paul Weir said. "We've really been emphasizing rebounding lately and tonight I thought that's what really made the difference for us."

The Lobos also had four players score in double figures including Maluach, senior Anthony Mathis (16) and redshirt-sophomores Vance Jackson (12) and Keith McGee (10).

UNM led by as many as 19 points in the second half against the CSU squad that claimed a 15-point victory the last time the teams met on Jan. 12 (91-76) in Fort Collins.

The Lobos got out to a five-point lead in just the first 1:41 on a pair of layups by Jackson and Bragg and a three from Mathis (7-2) before CSU tied it up for the first of three times in the match, 9-9, at the 16:51 mark.

The first half was a lot of back-and-forth before the Lobos slowly crept out to another 5+ point cushion when McGee hit a three with 9:14 left in the first half to put the Lobos up by seven, 22-15.

Colorado State again battled back and cut the Lobo lead to four with 6:57 left in the frame before the Lobos embarked on a 7-1 run, capped by a Bragg layup to put UNM up by 10, 32-22, with 3:29 left.

At the break, the Lobos went into the locker room on top by eight, 35-27. UNM is now 8-3 on the season, 5-2 in Mountain West play, when leading at the half.

The Lobos built on the lead in the second half. With 12:11 left on the clock, CSU had whittled a 14-point lobo lead down to nine, 51-42, before the Lobos went on an 11-1 run to extend the UNM lead to a game-high 19, 62-43, with 7:31 left on the clock.

The 11-1 run included four points from Bragg on a pair of layups, two points each from Mathis and Manigault, followed by a three from Jackson to cap the run and bring fans to their feet.

The Rams got the game back down to single digits just twice, fouling as the clock ran down while using all four of their timeouts.

The Lobos made all eight of their free throws over the final 1:18 including six from Mathis. He was 6-for-6 from the line on the night and is shooting 89.3 percent from the stripe on the season.

On the night, the squads finished relatively even statistically with the Lobos outshooting the Rams 46.4 percent to 46.3 from the floor. Both teams made nearly 65 percent of their free throws while UNM outshot CSU from behind the arc 33.3 - 26.7 percent.

UNM is set to return to action on Wednesday, March 6 as the squad takes on Boise State for the only time this season on Senior Night at 7 p.m.
