**San José State vs. New Mexico

San José State record: 1-0, 1-0 Mountain West. The Spartans opened the 2020 season defeating Air Force, 17-6. San José State has wins in its last two games dating back to the 17-16 victory over Fresno State to conclude the 2019 season.

New Mexico record: 0-0, 0-0 Mountain West. The Lobos' season-opening game at Colorado State on October 24 was canceled.

San José State head coach Brent Brennan: In his fourth season as the Spartans' head coach. Has a major college coaching record of 9-29, all at San José State. Received a three-year contract extension through the 2024 season in December 2019. Brennan returned to San José State for 2017 after six seasons as a receivers coach at Oregon State. He was a Spartan assistant coach during the 2005 through 2010 seasons. Brennan is 1-0 as a head coach against New Mexico.

New Mexico head coach Danny Gonzales: In his first season as a major college head coach. As an assistant coach at New Mexico (2006) and at San Diego State (2015 and 2016), he is 1-2 in games against San José State.

Series history: San José State leads the series, 13-5-1. The Spartans have wins in four of the last five contests.

The home team won the last three meetings between these squads. The Spartans came away with a 32-21 victory in CEFCU Stadium on October 4, 2019.

New Mexico's most recent win in the series was a 48-41 win on October 11, 2016.

The last time the visiting team won in this series was when San José State posted a 20-12 triumph in the inaugural New Mexico Bowl.

Aiming for a 2-0 start to the season: The last time a San José State team began a season with a 2-0 record was in 1987 when the Spartans defeated Eastern Illinois, 24-3, and topped California, 27-25.

A 2-0 conference start is possible: The 2020 San Jose State football team can become the university's first to post a 2-0 record in conference play since joining the Mountain West. The last time the Spartans had a 2-0 conference record was in 2011 as a Western Athletic Conference member after wins over New Mexico State and Hawai'i.

The last three-game winning streak: With wins over Fresno State to end the 2019 season and Air Force to open 2020, San José State has an opportunity to win three consecutive games for the first time since 2013. That year, the Spartans won at Hawai'i, at Colorado State, and at home against Wyoming.

The last road win: San José State's last road win was a 34-29 win at Army West Point on October 26, 2019. Since then the Spartans lost their last two road games in 2019 at Hawai'i and at UNLV.

Limiting the opponent: The 17-6 win over Air Force marked the first time since a 24-0 season-opening win over Sacramento State in 2013 that San Jose State limited an opponent to fewer than 10 points. Eighty-five (85) consecutive opponents scored 10 or more points against the Spartans between the Sacramento State and Air Force wins.

San José State heads into the New Mexico game ranked tied for second nationally in scoring defense at 6.0 per game.

Goal line stands in consecutive games: In each of San Jose State's last two games, the 2019 finale hosting Fresno State and the 2020 opener against Air Force, the San José State defense stopped its opponent at the end of the second quarter inside the Spartans' 5-yard line and returned the ball to the offense on downs.

In the 2019 Fresno State win, the defense made stops on the 6, 8 and 1-yard lines on the final three downs of the half.

In the 2020 victory over Air Force, the Falcons' possession ended with stops at the 1-yard line on second, third and fourth down. Safety **Tre Webb**, who finished the game with 11 tackles, was credited with an assisted tackle on third down and a 1-yard tackle for loss on fourth down from 1-yard line.

Starting the season with a positive turnover margin: Tied for tenth in the country last year in turnover margin with a +10, San Jose State began 2020 by recovering two fumbles, but had one pass intercepted against Air Force for a plus-1 in turnover margin. San Jose State scored a touchdown on its possession after the second fumble recovery and was not scored on after the interception.

In the Spartans' last 13 games, San Jose State has scored 82 points off of turnovers and yielded 28.

First-time starters: Four players made their first major college start in the Air Force win. The four first-time starters is a smaller number of players to make their debut in a starting lineup in an opening game compared to seven in 2019 and five in 2018.

Gaither makes it 30: Graduate student **Bailey Gaither** became the 30th San Jose State University football player to catch at least 100 passes in a career with his eight-catch, 110-yard contribution in the win over Air Force. Gaither enters the New Mexico game with 102 career receptions and is in 27th place on the San Jose State career list. Team-mate **Tre Walker** is in eighth with 148 career receptions.

Walker/Gaither duo in NCAA's top-20: San Jose State University wide receivers **Bailey Gaither** and **Tre Walker** are one of three pairs of players each ranked in the top-20 in average yards per catch among Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) players.

Starkel a winner in his first San Jose State start: Quarterback **Nick Starkel** can claim wins as a starter at Texas A&M, Arkansas and San Jose State following the 17-6 win over Air Force. Starkel completed 22-of-29 passes with one interception for 226 yards and two touchdowns, both to tight end **Derrick Deese**. Starkel is the first San Jose State quarterback to win in his first start since **Blake Jurich** in a 42-10 win over North Dakota in 2014.

12 days at Humboldt State: In preparation for the 2020 season, the San Jose State University football program practiced at Humboldt State University from Saturday, October 3 through Wednesday, October 14. The six-bus caravan traveled roughly 650 miles round trip to Arcata, Calif., and back. The state of California's classification of COVID-19 protocols and guidelines in Humboldt County were less restrictive than in Santa Clara County where San Jose State is located.

Spare The Air impact: During San Jose State's workouts prior to contact practices, the Spartans restarted their schedule twice in August and September due to the unprecedented number of Spare the Air days in Santa Clara County. The campus was closed August 19 through August 25, September 11 through September 15, and October 2 through October 4. During the third campus closure, the Spartans had relocated to Humboldt County and the Humboldt State University campus.

Coordinator continuity: For the first time since the 1987 through 1989 seasons, San Jose State has the same head coach, offensive coordinator, defensive coordinator in three consecutive seasons. **Brent Brennan** and **Derrick Odum** enter their fourth season as head coach and defensive coordinator, respectively. **Kevin McGiven** joined the staff in 2018 as the offensive coordinator.

Exercising one's right on November 3: The entire San Jose State University football team of players and coaches eligible to vote in the November 3 general election are registered to vote.

Some "first time since" to keep in mind:

- Offensive left tackle **Jackson Snyder** became the first San Jose State offensive lineman in 26 years and sixth in the modern era of football to score a touchdown when he was credited with a 4-yard run after catching a pass ruled as a lateral.

- San Jose State entered the NCAA record book in its game at Hawai'i when neither team punted in the Spartans' 42-40 loss. The Spartans had eight possessions in the game scoring four touchdowns and four field goals.

- San Jose State recovered its first onside kick in five years when **Christian Webb** came up with the football in a successful attempt in second game of the season against Tulsa. The Spartans had gone 0-for-10 in onside kick attempts during the 2015 through 2018 seasons.

CEFCU Stadium evolving: CEFCU Stadium's new scoreboard and videoboard made its debut at the north end of the stadium for the Air Force game.

During the summer of 2019, nearly 9,000 spectator seats were removed from the east grandstand to complete Phase #1 of the Spartan Athletics Center project at CEFCU Stadium. Scheduled to open in 2023, the Center will be the new home for San Jose State football, women's soccer and men's soccer and be available for use by the entire Spartan student-athlete population.

Phase #2, demolition of the east side of CEFCU Stadium, occurred in 2020. In 2023, the east side of CEFCU Stadium will be rebuilt with bleacher seating, concession stands and other amenities.

Versatile Spartans: Center **Kyle Hoppe** and defensive linemen **E.J. Ane** are San Jose State players to play both offense and defense for the Spartans.

Ane played on both sides of the ball in the 2018 UNLV and Nevada games.

Hoppe, a two-year starter at center, played a reserve defensive lineman in 2017.

Running back **Brendan Manigo** and wide receiver **Jamar Simpson** were members of the San Jose State University 2019 outdoor and 2020 indoor track and field teams, respectively.

Family ties: This year's San Jose State team has a range of internal family ties.

- Head coach **Brent Brennan**, is the son of former SJSU wide receiver the late Steve Brennan.

- Running backs coach **Alonzo Carter** is the stepfather of freshman wide receiver **Malikhi Miller**.

- Safeties **Tre Jenkins** and **Andrew Jenkins** are twin brothers.

- * Quarterback **Nick Nash** is a second-generation Spartan. His dad, Kenny Nash, was a wide receiver on the 1985 and 1986 San Jose State football teams.

- Special teams player/Running back **Brendan Manigo** is the second Manigo brother to play football for SJSU. His brother, Alex Manigo, was a linebacker on the 2015 and 2016 Spartan teams.

A master's degree in their future: Wide receiver **Bailey Gaither**, offensive lineman **Jack Snyder**, quarterback **Nick Starkel**, and linebacker **Christian Webb** are four San José State players playing as graduate students.

Gaither and Webb are pursuing a master's degree in interdisciplinary studies; Starkel, justice studies; and Snyder, urban planning.

Beyond Football: The San José State University "Beyond Football" program encompasses personal growth, identifying career objectives and fostering community service. From August 1, 2018 through July 31, 2020, the Spartans logged more than 10,000 hours of activities, an average of about 50 hours a player.

Carter wins a Zoomtopia, Zoom's Oscar equivalent: San Jose State University running backs coach Alonzo Carter earned a 2020 Zoomtopia Award from Zoom Communications for Innovation in the category of "Emphasis on Diversity: Bridging the Divide" during the company's annual two-day online webinar October 14 and 15. Zoom, based in San Jose, also honored a winner in the categories of Extraordinary Connections and Experiences, Exemplary Educators, Exceptional Healthcare, and Evolution of Business.

This year, Carter was the ringleader and master of ceremonies for the West Coast Zoom Coaches Clinics that attracted more than 8,000 total participants, mainly minority football coaches at all levels, focusing on listening, learning, mentoring and networking during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Carter is the only known college football coach with a platinum record and a Grammy Award for his work as a lead dancer and choreographer for hip-hop icon MC Hammer and a Zoomtopia Award.

Home stadium name history: San José State and Citizens Equity First Credit Union (CEFCU, pronounced SEFF-cue) are in year three of a 15-year naming rights agreement for the university's football stadium, built in 1933, to be called CEFCU Stadium - Home of the Spartans. CEFCU and San José State Athletics first became partners in 2011 with signage on the stadium scoreboard and at the West gate entry point.

Apparel: In July 2017, San José State University began a six-year, all-sports apparel agreement with adidas. The 2020 season is the Spartans' fourth with adidas.
