LAST SEASON

(Nov. 23, 2019) Air Force defeated New Mexico, 44-22, to snap a three-game losing streak to the Lobos in Albuquerque. The Falcons took a 14-10 halftime lead behind touchdown runs from Donald Hammond III and Taven Birdow. Air Force exploded in the second half behind the passing of Hammond. The Falcons extended the lead to 30-16 behind a pair of Hammond touchdown passes. He added two more early in the fourth quarter to put the Falcons in front, 44-16, before the Lobos added a touchdown in the final minutes to make up the final margin. Hammond hit 9-10 passes for a career-high 327 yards, the fifth most in Air Force history and most since 1976. He threw for a career-best four touchdowns, two each to Geraud Sanders and Ben Waters. The four TD passes tie as the second most in school history. Sanders finished with five catches for 156 yards and Waters had four catches for 171 yards. They became the first duo with over 100 yards each since 2004. The Falcons had 540 yards of total offense while holding New Mexico to 358. Demonte Meeks led the defense with a career-best 14 tackles.

LAST TIME AT FALCON STADIUM

(Nov. 10, 2018) Air Force defeated New Mexico, 42-24, to snap a two-game losing streak overall and a three-game streak to the Lobos. Air Force, who led 21-17 at the half, broke open a close game in the second half with a pair of Donald Hammond III to Kade Waguespack touchdown passes in the third quarter. Air Force put the finishing touches on the win with a three-yard TD run in the fourth quarter to make up the final margin. The Falcons rolled up season highs in total yards with 623 and rushing yards with 478 while holding the Lobos to 305 total yards, including just 55 in the second half. Hammond led the way with a career-high 136 yards rushing and a score while hitting five of six passes for 145 yards and two TDs. Kadin Remsberg added a rushing. Kyle Johnson led the defense with nine tackles. Grant Theil added

AIR FORCE LAST TIME OUT

Boise State defeated Air Force, 49-30, Oct. 31 in Falcon Stadium. The 25th-ranked Broncos scored on the game's opening play with a 75-yard touchdown pass from Jack Sears to CT Thomas to take a 7-0 lead. The Falcons scored the first two times they had it on rushing touchdowns from Brandon Lewis and Matthew Murla to take a 14-7 lead. Boise State exploded for 21 points in the second quarter to take a 28-17 halftime lead. The Broncos extended the lead to 35-17 with the second TD connect between Sears and Thomas. Following an Air Force touchdown run by Murla to cut it to 35-24, Avery Williams returned the ensuing kickoff 88 yards for a score to make it 42-24. Both teams added a touchdown to make up the final margin. Boise State had 459 total yards, including 280 passing. Sears hit 17-20 passes for 280 yards and three scores. Air Force had 484 total yards, including a season-high 415 rushing. Lewis led the way with a career-high 112 yards, while Elijah Robinson chipped in with 90 and Warren Bryan 87.

- Three Falcons made their first-career start: WR Brandon Lewis, LB Johnathan Youngblood, DB Zion Kelly.
- Air Force rushed for a season-high 415 yards. The previous best was 369 vs. Navy, Oct. 3

Individual Notes

- Junior WR Brandon Lewis scored his first career touchdown, a seven-yard run in the first quarter. Lewis rushed for a career-high 112 yards to record his first-career 100-yard game. His previous best was 60 against San Jose State, Oct. 24.
- Sophomore RB Elijah Robinson's 50-yard run in the first quarter was the first carry of his career and the longest run by any Falcon this season. Robinson finished the game with a career-best 90 yards.
- Junior QB Warren Bryan completed the first pass of his career, a 19-yarder in the second quarter. Bryan posted career highs of 19 carries and 87 yards rushing. His previous highs came against Navy, Oct. 3, with two carries for 28 yards.
- Sophomore TE Kyle Patterson has caught a pass in every game this season. He tied his career high with three catches against the Broncos. He also had three against San Jose State, Oct. 24.
- Junior FS Ethan Erickson posted a career-high seven tackles. His previous high was three against San Jose State, Oct. 24.
- Senior CB Elisha Palm had eight tackles, the second most of his career. His career high of nine came against San Jose State, Oct. 24.
- Freshman ILB Johnathan Youngblood had a career-best five tackles. His previous high of four came against San Jose State, Oct. 24.
- Sophomore RB CJ McNeal had career highs of three carries for 27 yards. His previous best was one carry for 19 yards vs. SJSU, Oct. 24.
- Junior FB Matthew Murla scored a career-high two touchdowns. He also posted career highs for carries (9) and yards (23). His previous career highs were three carries (SJSU, Oct. 24) and 21 yards (Colgate, 2019).
- Junior FB Bo Gross scored the first touchdown of his career.

TEAM NOTES

FALCONS AMONG ELITE ACADEMICALLY, AGAIN

The Air Force football team has established itself among the nation's elite academically. The Falcons rank third nationally in Academic Progress Rate (APR) in 2020 with a score with a 995, according to the NCAA's latest multiyear NCAA Division I scores. This season marks the ninth straight year in the top 10. Air Force and Northwestern are the only programs in the nation to be in the top three each of the last three years. Air Force led the nation in 2019 with a 997 and was second in 2018 with a 993.

The NCAA announcement is part of the overall Division I academic reform effort and is intended to highlight teams that demonstrate a commitment to academic progress and retention of student-athletes by achieving the top APRs within their respective sports. The APR provides a real-time look at a team's academic success each semester by tracking the academic progress of each student-athlete on scholarship (recruited and on varsity roster for non-scholarship schools). The APR accounts for eligibility, retention and graduation and provides a measure of each team's academic performance.

AIR FORCE AT HOME

Air Force was picked to finished third in the Mountain West Mountain Division in the 2020 preseason poll, released by the conference office. Boise State was first with 125 points, receiving 20 of 21 first-place votes. Wyoming was second with 90 points and the other first-place vote, followed by the Falcons with 86 points. Utah State was fourth with 60, Colorado State fifth with 59 and New Mexico sixth with 21.

THIESSEN THIRD-LONGEST TENURED OC

Air Force offensive coordinator Mike Thiessen is in his 14th season at Air Force overall and 11th as offensive coordinator. Thiessen is the third-longest tenured offensive coordinator in the nation.

As offensive coordinator, Thiessen has led a unit over the last five years that has been in the top four of the nation in rushing each year, averaged 32 points per game, been in the top three nationally in passing yards per completion and among the top 10 in third-down percentage. This has been one of the most productive offensive eras in Academy history. INDIVIDUAL NOTES

LAUFENBERG NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Air Force senior offensive lineman Nolan Laufenberg was named to several preseason All-American teams for 2020. He is a second-team preseason All-American by the Walter Camp Football Foundation, USA Today and Associated Press. In addition, he is one of five All-American offensive linemen by Pro Football Focus.

Laufenberg is the first Air Force offensive lineman to earn All-American honors since Brett Huyser earned fourth-team honors by The Sporting News in 2002. He's the first All-American at any position and first multiple-team honoree for the Falcons since safety Weston Steelhammer was named to multiple teams in 2016. Laufenberg is the first offensive player to earn All-American honors since all-purpose athlete Chad Hall in 2007.

Laufenberg earned first-team all-Mountain West and all-Colorado honors in 2019 after leading the team in knockdown blocks. He anchored an offensive line that led the conference and ranked second nationally in rushing with a 298.5 per-game average. The offensive line allowed just four sacks last season, the fewest in the nation. Air Force led the conference and ranked second nationally in third-down percentage with a 53.5 mark. The Falcons led the Mountain West and ranked second nationally in time of possession at 34:28 per game.

FERGUSON JOINS LAUFENBERG ON OUTLAND TROPHY WATCH LIST

Air Force senior offensive linemen Parker Ferguson and fellow senior Nolan Laufenberg have been named to the watch list for the 2020 Outland Trophy, recognizing 85 standout interior linemen representing all 10 Division I FBS conference and independents, according to the Football Writers Association of America. Air Force one of 17 schools with multiple players selected.

Ferguson and Laufenberg were each named to the preseason all-Mountain West team this season. The pair anchored an Air Force offensive line that led the conference and ranked second nationally in rushing in 2019 with a 298.5 per-game average. The offensive line allowed just four sacks last season, the fewest in the nation. Air Force led the conference and ranked second nationally in third-down percentage with a 53.5 mark. The Falcons led the Mountain West and ranked second nationally in time of possession at 34:28 per game.

REMSBERG CLIMBING THE CHARTS

Senior running back Kadin Remsberg hit the 1,000-yard rushing mark in his career last season, becoming the 49th player in Air Force history to hit the mark. He ranks 21st in school history with 1,663 yards.

An honorable mention all-MW selection and first-team all-Colorado pick in 2019, Remsberg became the 16th player in Air Force history to rush for 1,000 or more yards in a season and first since Jacobi Owens in 2015. Remsberg rushed for 1,050 yards last season which is the 16th-most in program history. He rushed for a career-high 178 yards on a career-high 26 carries and scored the game-securing touchdown to earn most valuable players honors in Air Force's 31-21 win over Washington State in the Cheez-It Bowl. Remsberg rushed for 146 yards on 23 carries and scored the game-winning touchdown on a 25-yard run in overtime to help the Falcons win 30-23 at Colorado.

JACKSON LEADS THE FALCONS IN RUSHING

Junior fullback Timothy Jackson leads the Falcons in rushing with an 89.0 average. He has rushed for 178 yards on 34 carries and led the team in rushing in both games he has played (Navy, San Jose State. Jackson opened the season with his fifth-career 100-yard game in Air Force’s 40-7 win over Navy, rushing for team highs of 118 yards on 19 carries. He added 60 yards on 15 carries at San Jose State. Jackson has 923 yards in his career and needs just 77 to become the 50th player in school history to hit the 1,000-yard mark. He would become the 16th fullback to do it. Jackson was third on the team in rushing with 745 yards and third in rushing touchdowns with six last season. He had a career-high 155 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries vs. Army to record his fourth straight 100-yard rushing game. He became the first fullback in school history to hit the 100-yard mark in four straight games. Jackson is the first Falcon at any position to do it since Cody Getz opened the 2012 season with five straight. Jackson is the first fullback in Air Force history with four 100-yard games in a season since Pat Evans had five in 1984. He is one of just four fullbacks in Air Force history with four or more 100-yard games in a season. His four last season are tied for third most in school history.

TEVYE HITTING THE MARK

Junior kicker Tevye Schuettpeiz-Rohl ranks fourth in the MW in field goals with a 1.67 average and sixth in kicker scoring with a 7.0 norm. He is also eighth in field goal percentage (71.4), and tied for first in PAT percentage (1.000). He has hit 5-7 field goals with a long of 48 vs. Navy, which is the longest in the MW this season. He has hit all six PATs and lead the team in scoring with 21 points. Schuettpeiz-Rohl tied a school record with four field goals in his debut as a starter in the season opener vs. Navy, hitting from 48, 35, 32 and 40 yards. He opened the scoring for Air Force with his first-career attempt, hitting from 48 yards to put the Falcons in front 3-0. Schuettpeiz-Rohl is the 11th player in school history to hit four field goals in a game. He missed the first field goal attempt of his career at San Jose State, missing from 45 yards.

PALM LEADS THE WAY

Senior defensive back Elisha Palm (pronounced E-lie-SHA) leads the team in tackles with 19, including 16 unassisted. He has 1.5 tackles for loss and an interception. He is tied for ninth in the MW in interceptions with a .33 average. Palm has led the team in tackles the last two games. He had eight tackles vs. Boise State, including seven unassisted. Palm recorded career highs of nine tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss against San Jose State. He also added his first-career interception.

LEWIS LEADS THE OFFENSE AGAIN

Junior receiver Brandon Lewis had his best day as a Falcon against Boise State, hitting the 100-yard mark rushing for the first time in his career. Lewis recorded career highs of 10 carries for 112 yards and his first-career touchdown. Lewis hauled in a career-high six catches for 36 yards and tied for the team lead in rushing with 60 yards on nine carries vs. San Jose State the previous week. Lewis is the team’s career leader in receiving with 11 catches for 136 yards. His six catches this season leads the team while his 36 yards is second. Lewis is second on the team in rushing with 172 yards on 19 carries. He is averaging 9.1 yards per rush.

SILVANIC AMONG THE MW LEADERS

Senior George Silvanic is making the most of his first season of playing significantly. He leads the team in tackles for loss with 1.0 per game and in sacks with .50 per game. Silvanic is third on the team in tackles with 15. The Monument, Colo., native moved from offensive to defensive line just two weeks before the season started. Silvanic had seven tackles and 1.5 sacks vs. Navy and six tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss at San Jose State in his first-career start.

QUICK PERSONNEL HITS

- Sophomore fullback **Brad Roberts** had a great first-career game at Air Force, rushing for 103 yards and a touchdown on 10 carries. He didn’t get his first carry until the third quarter.
- Sophomore quarterback **Haaziq Daniels** made the most of his first-career game, rushing for 96 yards and a touchdown on 10 carries. He averaged 9.6 yards per carry with a team-best 32 yard carry. Daniels hit 4-9 passes for 41 yards. After missing on his first three pass attempts, he finished the game hitting four of his final six passes.

AIR FORCE TO HONOR TUSKEGEE AIRMEN WITH APLS UNIFORM

The Air Force football team will honor the Tuskegee Airmen with the 2020 edition of the Airpower Legacy Series uniform. The Falcons wore them for the Navy game and plan to for the postponed Army game.

The uniform is gray with black lettering. The chrome base gray helmet features the P-51 aircraft flown by the Tuskegee Airmen in combat with signature red tails and nose that helped identify the group. The helmet features the four squadron emblems for the 99th, 100th, 301st and 302nd fighter squadrons. The pants feature an authentic stenciled information graphic on the side. The custom nameplate on the jersey says Red Tails, inspired by hand-lettered names painted on the side of the P-51 aircraft.

This year marks the fifth season of the Airpower Legacy Series, started in 2016 to honor the Air Force’s rich history. The team honored the World War II Flying Tigers of the U.S. Army Air Forces that year, followed by the F-35 aircraft in 2017. The team honored the AC-130 in 2018 and the C-17 aircraft last season.

The Tuskegee Airmen were a group of African-American pilots and ground crew from the U.S. Army Air Forces commissioned by President Franklin Delano Roosevelt in September 1940. The pilots began their training at Moton Field in Tuskegee, Alabama. More than 900 pilots graduated from the program and more than 350 served in active duty as fighter pilots. Together with ground crew, there were more than 14,000 Tuskegee Airmen, which was a small minority of the total number of blacks that served in the Army Air Force in World War II. The first African-American officer to solo an Army Air Corps aircraft was Benjamin O. Davis, Jr., who became the commander of the 99th Fighter Squadron, the first all-African American air unit. The Air Force Academy airfield was renamed in his honor in November 2019 and is now the General Davis Air-field.

In early 1944, the 99th was joined by the 100th, 301st and 302nd to form the 332nd Fighter Squadrons. They were the only African-American fighter group in the Army Air Forces and the only group to have four squadrons instead of three. Assigned the color red for identification purposes, the 332nd became known as the Red Tails and Red Tail Angels for the success escorting bombers into enemy territory, the best record among Air Force fighter groups.

The 332nd was credited with shooting down 12 German planes in two days in January 1944, flying more than 15,000 sorties and shooting down 112 enemy planes total. The unit earned 96 Distinguished Flying Crosses and three Distinguished Unit Citations. The success of the Tuskegee Airmen helped lay the groundwork for the civil rights movement and influenced President Harry Truman’s decision to desegregate the armed forces in 1948.



SERIES HISTORY

The Air Power Legacy Series began in the 2016 season with the football team wearing an alternate uniform for the Georgia State game to celebrate the Tiger Shark teeth nose-art which has been represented on multiple Air Force aircraft dating back to World War II. During the WWII era, fighter plane pilots were called “Flying Tigers” and were part of the U.S. Army Air Corps, which later became the Air Force. The helmets worn for the game featured a shark-teeth design like those painted on the aircraft.

While 2016 focused on the past, the Falcons honored the present, and future, of air power in 2017 with the F-35 theme. The F-35 completed its first flight in 2006. In 2012, the F-35 program increased to 30 aircraft. In 2016, the F-35A was declared combat ready by Gen. Hawk Carlisle, the commander of the Air Combat Command. The helmet had five different designs. On one side of every helmet will be the familiar Air Force logo often seen on aircraft, which includes the length-wise bars intersecting the roundel. On the other side was a decal representing one of the five Air Force F-35-A operational fighter squadrons in the Air Force.

The team honored the AC-130 in 2018. The Falcons debuted the uniform in the season opener Sept. 1 vs. Stony Brook and wore them again at home against New Mexico. The helmet featured the AC-130 on one side, plus squadron patches on the other. The AC-130 gunship is a heavily armed, long-endurance ground-attack variant of the C-130 Hercules transport fixed-wing aircraft. It carries a wide array of anti-ground oriented weapons that are integrated with sophisticated sensors, navigation, and fire-control systems. Unlike other military fixed-wing aircraft, the AC-130 relies on visual targeting. Because its large profile and low operating altitudes (around 7,000 ft) make it an easy target, it usually flies close air support missions at night.

Air Force honored the C-17, a large military transport in 2019. The C-17 commonly performs tactical and strategic airlift missions, transporting troops and cargo throughout the world; additional roles include medical evacuation and airdrop duties. The C-17 is designed to operate from runways as short as 3,500 ft (1,100 m) and as narrow as 90 ft (27 m).

HEAD COACH TROY CALHOUN

Troy Calhoun is in his 14th season as head coach at Air Force, where he has a 99-71 overall record and a 59-46 mark in Mountain West play. He has led Air Force to 10 bowl games, including a school-record six straight from 2007-12.

Calhoun has led the program to an 11-win season (2019), two 10-plus win seasons (2014, 2016), a pair of nine-win seasons (2007, 2010) and three with eight wins (2008, 2009 and 2015). He has led the Falcons to the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy four times. Calhoun led the Falcons to an 8-6 overall record in 2015 and the Mountain Division championship and first-ever MW title game appearance. The 2019 Falcons posted an 11-2 overall record, the third-most wins in program history, and finished second in the MW Mountain Division with a school-record-tying 7-1 record.

Calhoun is the only coach in the 100-plus year history of service academy football to lead teams to at least seven wins and a bowl game in each of his first five seasons. Calhoun has been a semifinalist for the National Coach of the Year award three times (2007, 2010, 2019). Calhoun came to his alma mater in 2007 and took over a program that had three straight losing seasons. Air Force finished the 2007 season 9-4 overall and placed second in the Mountain West Conference with a 6-2 mark in Calhoun's first year. The Falcons earned their first bowl bid in five seasons, advancing to the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl in Fort Worth, Texas. The five-game turnaround from the previous season was the largest in the nation by a first-year head coach and tied as the third-largest overall in the nation.

Calhoun was named the conference's coach of the year for his efforts. In addition, he was named coach of the year in Region 5 by the American Football Coaches Association and was one of eight finalists for national coach of the year honors.

Calhoun brought a wealth of experience and impressive resume at the collegiate and professional levels that is flooded with success at every stop to the Academy. Calhoun came to the Academy after serving as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Houston Texans in 2006. The Texans were one of only two NFL teams to triple their number of wins from the previous year.

Calhoun became a well-rounded NFL coach, working as a defensive assistant, special teams assistant and offensive assistant with the Denver Broncos from 2003-05. He began his NFL coaching career by serving as the defensive assistant under defensive coordinator Larry Coyer in 2003.

Prior to the NFL, Calhoun was an offensive coordinator for six seasons on the collegiate level. He began his coaching career at Air Force, where he worked as a graduate assistant from 1989-90. He started at quarterback for the Academy in 1986 and was one of only two freshmen to letter for the 1985 team that finished fifth in the final polls with a 12-1 record that included wins over national powers Notre Dame and Texas.

Calhoun served his country from 1989-95 as an active duty officer in the Air Force. He was the Falcons' recruiting coordinator and the junior varsity offensive coordinator in 1993-94. He moved to Ohio University in 1995 where he served as the quarterbacks coach for two seasons. Calhoun was promoted to offensive coordinator in 1997. Calhoun moved to Wake Forest in 2001 and remained there prior to his stint with the Broncos.

Groomed on the basics of integrity and passion, Calhoun is a native of Roseburg, Ore., and was raised in a home where both kids graduated from the Air Force Academy and were varsity letter winners on nationally-ranked teams. He and his wife, Amanda, live in Colorado Springs and have two children, Tyler (18) and Amelia (16).
