MW FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

AROUND THE MOUNTAIN WEST

- Air Force defeated Navy on Oct. 3, 40-7, in the Mountain West's first game of the season. The MW now owns a 12-10 record all-time against opponents from the American.
- The Falcons travel to Army (11:30 a.m. ET on CBS) and with a victory can secure their 21st Commander-in-Chief's Trophy. Air Force holds more CIC titles than Navy (15) and Army (7).
- Boise State puts an eight-game home win streak on the line when the Broncos host #9/9 BYU on Friday, Nov. 6 (7:45 p.m. MT on FS1). The Broncos, who are ranked in both the Amway Coaches Poll and *Associated Press* Top 25, have won four consecutive games against top-10 opponents.
- Boise State is the all-time winningest FBS program, narrowly edging out Ohio State by winning percentage. The Broncos have a 462-170-2 (.7303) winning percentage, while the Buckeyes are second at 926-326-53 (.7299).
- Boise State has produced a 1,000-yard rusher in 11 consecutive seasons.
- Colorado State and Wyoming meet on Thursday, Nov. 5, in the annual Border War, competing for the Bronze Boot. The Cowboys have held the boot for the past four seasons. This is the longest continuous rivalry west of the Mississippi River.
- Colorado State punter Ryan Stonehouse currently holds the NCAA's career punt average record at 46.9. The current record is 46.31.
- Fresno State RB Ronnie Rivers, who has scored at least one touchdown in 10 consecutive games, has scored 31 career rushing touchdowns, tied for ninthmost among active FBS players.
- Nevada, which has the 13th-best total offense nationally (496.5), has a chance to open the season 3-0 for the first time since 2010, when the Wolf Pack went 13-1.
- Wolf Pack QB Carson Strong has thrown 230 passes without an interception, the second-longest stretch in Mountain West history. Fresno State's Derek Carr (2013) holds the Conference's record at 306 consecutive pass attempts without an interception.
- San Diego State, which has opened the season 2-0 for the fourth time in the last five years, has the top ranked scoring defense nationally, allowing just 6.5 points per game this season. Dating back to the start of 2019, the Aztecs have allowed the fewest points per contest among FBS teams at 11.9.
- When San José State and San Diego State meet on Friday, Nov. 6, a win streak will come to an end. The Aztecs (four straight wins) and Spartans (three straight wins) hold the two longest active win streaks in the Mountain West.
- San José State is off to its first 2-0 start since 1987 and is looking to open 3-0 for the first time since 1982.
- Spartans QB **Nick Starkel** threw for 467 yards and five touchdowns in last week's victory over New Mexico. For his performance, Starkel was named Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week, a Manning Award Star of the Week and to the Davey O'Brien Award's Great 8 list.
- Wyoming has rushed for at least 100 yards in 22 consecutive games. This season, the Cowboys have been led by **Xazavian Valladay** on the ground, who has 250 rushing yards this season, the second-most in the MW.

LONG-TERM SUCCESS

- In the past 16 years, the Mountain West has been the top nonautonomous 5 conference nine times and second five times.
- The Mountain West has been nationally-ranked in 20 of the last 24 College Football Playoff Rankings.
- Against all autonomous 5 competition, the Mountain West has won 11 of its last 21 games, including nine against the Pac-12.
- The Mountain West produced the first non-automatic-qualifying FBS team into a BCS bowl game (Utah - 2005 Fiesta Bowl) and into the College Football Playoff (Boise State - 2014 Fiesta Bowl).

NATIONALLY RANKED

After opening the season with a 2-0 recording, knocking off Utah State and Air Force, Boise State is ranked No. 21 in the Associated Press Top 25 and No. 23 in the Amway Coaches Poll.

Boise State has been nationally ranked in 19-consecutive seasons, tied for the seventhlongest active streak in the nation. Boise State has been ranked for at least one week in either the AP or Coaches Poll every season since 2002.

Nevada and San Diego State are receiving votes in the Amway Coaches Poll, while the Aztecs are also receiving votes in the AP Top 25.

POSTSEASON SUCCESS

The Mountain West has sent at least six teams to the postseason in seven consecutive years.

The MW, which has earned 103 bowl bids, including Boise State's 2018 appearance vs. Boston College, since 1999 and holds a 56-46 (.549) all-time record, owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games in the last 15 seasons among the 10 FBS conferences (.563), trailing only the SEC (.629).

MW FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP HOST DETERMINATION PROCEDURE

Host Determination: The Mountain West Football Championship Game shall be played at the site of the team with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only.

Host Tie Breaker: In the event of a tie, the following procedure shall be used to determine the host location for the Championship Game:

- 1. Head-to-head result between the tied teams.
- 2. The best record against common Conference opponents.
- 3. If still tied:
 - If one team was ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking and wins in the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared the host. If in that same scenario, the team that was the highest-ranked team in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking loses in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used;

OR

• If both teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking, the highest-ranked team that wins in the final weekend of the regular season;

OR

- If neither of the ranked teams win in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used;
- OR
 - If neither team is ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking going into the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used.
- 4. If still tied, a draw will be conducted virtually by the Commissioner.

2020 MOUNTAIN WEST FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

The 2020 Mountain West Football Championship game will be played on Saturday, December 19. The contest will be played at the home stadium of the MW team with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only. FOX or FS1 will broadcast the matchup this year.
