MW FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

AROUND THE MOUNTAIN WEST

- Air Force defeated Navy on Oct. 3, 40-7, in the Mountain West's first game of the season. The MW now owns a 12-10 record all-time against opponents from the American.
- Boise State is riding a 12-game Mountain West win streak, tied for the secondlongest active streak nationally. Ohio State owns the longest conference win streak with 18 consecutive Big Ten victories.
- Boise State has produced a 1,000-yard rusher in 11 consecutive seasons.
- Colorado State WR Dante Wright leads all FBS sophomore pass-catchers, averaging 127.5 receiving yards per game.
- Fresno State RB Ronnie Rivers, who has scored at least one touchdown in 12 consecutive games, has scored 35 career rushing touchdowns, the fifth-most among active FBS players.
- Nevada and San José State are two of 11 FBS programs with 1.000-win percentage after playing at least four games.
- The Wolf Pack are looking to start 5-0 for the first time since the 2010 season, when they won their first six contests.
- Through just four games, Nevada WR Romeo Doubs ranks in the top-14 nationally
 in four major receiving categories: First in receiving yards per game (161.3),
 fourth in receiving touchdowns (8), 12th in receptions per game (7.8) and 14th
 in total receiving yards (645).
- San Diego State has one of the best defenses in the nation, allowing just 243.5 yards per game (second nationally) and 12.8 points per contest (fourth nationally).
- San José State is off to its first 4-0 start since 1955 and is looking to open 5-0 for the first time since 1939. A victory over Fresno State on Saturday would give the Spartans their first six-game win streak since the 2012-13 seasons.
- UNLV freshman WR Kyle Williams, who hauled in nine passes for 110 yards and a touchdown, is averaging 5.3 receptions per game, the third-most by a FBS freshman this season.
- Utah State senior Savon Scarver has tallied six career kickoff returns for a touchdown, which is the second-most in Mountain West history. The record is currently held by Rashaad Penny (San Diego State; 2014-17).
- Wyoming has rushed for at least 100 yards in 23 consecutive games. This season, the Cowboys have been led by **Xazavian Valladay** on the ground, who is second in the MW with 397 rushing yards this season.

STRONG IN THE MW RECORD BOOK

Nevada sophomore quarterback **Carson Strong** has been on a tear to open the 2020 season, leading the league with 1,517 passing yards and 12 passing touchdowns. Strong, who ranks second nationally with 379.3 passing yards per game, cemented his name in the Mountain West record book last Saturday with his sixth-consecutive 300-yard passing game.

LONG-TERM SUCCESS

- In the past 16 years, the Mountain West has been the top nonautonomous 5 conference nine times and second five times.
- The Mountain West has been nationally-ranked in 20 of the last 24 College Football Playoff Rankings.
- Against all autonomous 5 competition, the Mountain West has won 11 of its last 21 games, including nine against the Pac-12.
- The Mountain West produced the first non-automatic-qualifying FBS team into a BCS bowl game (Utah - 2005 Fiesta Bowl) and into the College Football Playoff (Boise State - 2014 Fiesta Bowl).

POSTSEASON SUCCESS

The Mountain West has sent at least six teams to the postseason in seven consecutive years.

The MW, which has earned 103 bowl bids, including Boise State's 2018 appearance vs. Boston College, since 1999 and holds a 56-46 (.549) all-time record, owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games in the last 15 seasons among the 10 FBS conferences (.563), trailing only the SEC (.629).

MW FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP HOST DETERMINATION PROCEDURE

Host Determination: The Mountain West Football Championship Game shall be played at the site of the team with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only.

Host Tie Breaker: In the event of a tie, the following procedure shall be used to determine the host location for the Championship Game:

- 1. Head-to-head result between the tied teams.
- 2. The best record against common Conference opponents.
- If still tied:
 - If one team was ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking and wins in the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared the host. If in that same scenario, the team that was the highest-ranked team in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking loses in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used;

OR

 If both teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking, the highest-ranked team that wins in the final weekend of the regular season;

OR

 If neither of the ranked teams win in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used;

OR

- If neither team is ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking going into the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used.
- 4. If still tied, a draw will be conducted virtually by the Commissioner.

2020 MOUNTAIN WEST FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

The 2020 Mountain West Football Championship game will be played on Saturday, December 19. The contest will be played at the home stadium of the MW team with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only. FOX or FS1 will broadcast the matchup this year.
