MW FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

AROUND THE MOUNTAIN WEST

- Air Force defeated Navy on Oct. 3, 40-7, in the Mountain West's first game of the season. The MW now owns a 12-10 record all-time against opponents from the American.
- Last week's 28-0 defeat of New Mexico gave Air Force head coach **Troy Calhoun** his 100th career victory (100-71).
- Colorado State-Air Force will play for the Ram-Falcon Trophy on Thursday. The Falcons hold a 25-15 advantage in the trophy series.
- Boise State is riding a 13-game Mountain West win streak, tied for the secondlongest active streak nationally. Ohio State owns the longest conference win streak with 19 consecutive Big Ten victories.
- Colorado State WR Dante Wright leads all FBS sophomore pass-catchers, averaging 127.5 receiving yards per game.
- Fresno State RB Ronnie Rivers, who has scored at least one touchdown in 12 consecutive games, has scored 35 career rushing touchdowns, tied for sixth-most among active FBS players.
- Nevada and San José State are two of 10 FBS programs with 1.000-win percentage after playing at least four games. Additionally, both programs lead the Mountain West with five-game win streaks, tied as the 11th-longest active streak nationally.
- The Wolf Pack are looking for their first 6-0 start since the 2010 season. Looking further ahead, Nevada hasn't opened 7-0 since 1991, when it won its first 12-consecutive games.
- Nevada WR Romeo Doubs ranks in the top-12 nationally in five major statistical categories: First in receiving yards per game (155.6), sixth in receiving touchdowns (9), seventh in all-purpose yards per game (174.8), ninth in total receiving yards (778) and 12 in receptions per game (7.2).
- Nevada placekicker Brandon Talton made 18-consecutive field goals before missing a 51-yarder against San Diego State on Nov. 21. The 18-consecutive made field goals is tied for third-longest streak in Mountain West history with Utah's Joe Phillips (2009-10) and New Mexico's John Sullivan (2007).
- San Diego State at Fresno State, originally scheduled for Friday, Nov. 27, has been canceled due to COVID-19 contact tracing with the Bulldogs.
- The Aztecs own one of the nation's top defenses, ranking third in total defense (269.4), seventh in rushing defense (90.0) and eighth in scoring defense (15.4).
- San José State is off to its first 4-0 start since 1955 and is looking to open 5-0 for the first time since 1939. A victory over Boise State on Saturday would give the Spartans their first six-game win streak since the 2012-13 seasons.
- UNLV freshman WR **Kyle Williams** is averaging 5.3 receptions per game, the third-most by a FBS freshman this season.
- Utah State senior **Savon Scarver** has tallied six career kickoff returns for a touchdown, which is the second-most in Mountain West history. The record is currently held by Rashaad Penny (San Diego State; 2014-17).
- Wyoming has rushed for at least 100 yards in 23 consecutive games. This season, the Cowboys have been led by Xazavian Valladay on the ground, who leads the Conference with 132.3 rushing yards per game.

LONG-TERM SUCCESS

- In the past 16 years, the Mountain West has been the top nonautonomous 5 conference nine times and second five times.
- The Mountain West has been nationally-ranked in 20 of the last 24 College Football Playoff Rankings.
- Against all autonomous 5 competition, the Mountain West has won 11 of its last 21 games, including nine against the Pac-12.
- The Mountain West produced the first non-automatic-qualifying FBS team into a BCS bowl game (Utah - 2005 Fiesta Bowl) and into the College Football Playoff (Boise State - 2014 Fiesta Bowl).

POSTSEASON SUCCESS

The Mountain West has sent at least six teams to the postseason in seven consecutive years.

The MW, which has earned 103 bowl bids, including Boise State's 2018 appearance vs. Boston College, since 1999 and holds a 56-46 (.549) all-time record, owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games in the last 15 seasons among the 10 FBS conferences (.563), trailing only the SEC (.629).

MW FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP HOST DETERMINATION PROCEDURE

Host Determination: The Mountain West Football Championship Game shall be played at the site of the team with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only.

Host Tie Breaker: In the event of a tie, the following procedure shall be used to determine the host location for the Championship Game:

- 1. Head-to-head result between the tied teams.
- 2. The best record against common Conference opponents.
- 3. If still tied:
 - If one team was ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking and wins in the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared the host. If in that same scenario, the team that was the highest-ranked team in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking loses in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used;

OR

• If both teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking, the highest-ranked team that wins in the final weekend of the regular season;

OR

- If neither of the ranked teams win in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used;
- OR
 - If neither team is ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking going into the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used.
- 4. If still tied, a draw will be conducted virtually by the Commissioner.

2020 MOUNTAIN WEST FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

The 2020 Mountain West Football Championship game will be played on Saturday, December 19. The contest will be played at the home stadium of the MW team with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only. FOX or FS1 will broadcast the matchup this year.
