MW FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

CHAMPIONSHIP GAME SCENARIOS

Boise State and San José State control their own destiny, while Nevada remains in the hunt. Below is a look at championship game scenarios, assuming no games are canceled this weekend:

- Boise State: defeat Wyoming on Saturday and the Broncos qualify.
- San José State: defeat Nevada on Friday and the Spartans qualify.
- Nevada: defeat San José State on Friday, combined with a Boise State win over Wyoming and the Wolf Pack qualify.

Boise State is looking to qualify for its fourth consecutive MW championship game, an active streak that ranks third-best nationally, while Nevada and San José State are seeking their first appearance.

AROUND THE MOUNTAIN WEST

- Boise State is riding a 13-game Mountain West win streak, third-longest active streak nationally. Ohio State owns the longest conference win streak with 20 consecutive Big Ten victories.
- The Broncos, who end the regular season with a road game at Wyoming, currently hold a five-game road win streak, which is tied for the fourth-longest active streak nationally. The last road contest Boise State dropped was in October 2019.
- Nevada sophomore QB Carson Strong is one of the top signal-callers in the country: third in completions per game (27.7), sixth in passing yards per game (332.4), 11th in completion percentage (69.5), 11th in passing touchdowns (21), 15th in total offense (317.6) and 16th in passing yards (2,327).
- Nevada sophomore kicker Brandon Talton was named one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award. On the season, Talton is 13-of-14 with his lone missing coming from 51 yards.
- San José State is off to its first 5-0 start since 1939. The Spartans are also riding
 a six-game win streak, the tied for sixth-longest active win streak nationally. A
 victory over Nevada on Friday would give the Spartans their first seven-game win
 streak since the 2012-13 seasons.
- The Spartans are one of just six FBS programs with a 1.000-win percentage after playing at least five games.
- Air Force defeated Navy on Oct. 3, 40-7, in the Mountain West's first game of the season. The MW now owns a 12-10 record all-time against opponents from the American.
- The Falcons own the nation's top rushing attack, averaging 336.0 rushing yards per game.
- Last week against Nevada, Fresno State QB Jake Haener racked up 502 yards of total offense, tying for the fifth-most in a single game in program history. The junior quarterback threw for 485 yards and rushed for 17.
- San Diego State owns one of the nation's top defenses, ranking third in total defense (269.1), eighth in scoring defense (16.3) and eighth in rushing defense (100.7).
- Utah State senior Savon Scarver has tallied six career kickoff returns for a touchdown, which is the second-most in Mountain West history. The record is currently held by Rashaad Penny (San Diego State; 2014-17).
- The Cowboys lead the Mountain West with a nine-game home win streak, tied as the 10th-longest active streak in FBS. Wyoming will close the 2020 season with a home contest against Boise State on Dec. 12. The last home defeat was suffered on Oct. 20, 2018.

LONG-TERM SUCCESS

- In the past 16 years, the Mountain West has been the top nonautonomous 5 conference nine times and second five times.
- The Mountain West has been nationally-ranked in 20 of the last 26 College Football Playoff Rankings.
- Against all autonomous 5 competition, the Mountain West has won 11 of its last 22 games, including nine against the Pac-12.
- The Mountain West produced the first non-automatic-qualifying FBS team into a BCS bowl game (Utah - 2005 Fiesta Bowl) and into the College Football Playoff (Boise State - 2014 Fiesta Bowl).

POSTSEASON SUCCESS

The Mountain West has sent at least six teams to the postseason in seven consecutive years.

The MW, which has earned 103 bowl bids, including Boise State's 2018 appearance vs. Boston College, since 1999 and holds a 56-46 (.549) all-time record, owns the second-best win percentage in bowl games in the last 15 seasons among the 10 FBS conferences (.563), trailing only the SEC (.629).

MW FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP HOST DETERMINATION PROCEDURE

Host Determination: The Mountain West Football Championship Game shall be played at the site of the team with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only.

Host Tie Breaker: In the event of a tie, the following procedure shall be used to determine the host location for the Championship Game:

- 1. Head-to-head result between the tied teams.
- 2. The best record against common Conference opponents.
- If still tied:
 - If one team was ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking and wins in the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared the host. If in that same scenario, the team that was the highest-ranked team in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking loses in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used;

OR

 If both teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking, the highest-ranked team that wins in the final weekend of the regular season;

OR

• If neither of the ranked teams win in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used;

OR

- If neither team is ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee ranking going into the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used
- 4. If still tied, a draw will be conducted virtually by the Commissioner.

2020 MOUNTAIN WEST FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

The 2020 Mountain West Football Championship game will be played on Saturday, December 19. The contest will be played at the home stadium of the MW team with the highest winning percentage in Conference games only. FOX or FS1 will broadcast the matchup this year.
