- The Rams return to home for a pair of key Mountain West games on national television, hosting New Mexico Feb. 9 and 11.
- Tuesday's game will tip at 9 p.m. on FS1 with Lane Grindle and former CSU head coach Tim Miles on the call. Thursday
 night will be a 6 p.m. MT tip on CBS Sports Network, with Rich Waltz and former Gonzaga standout and NBA player Dan
 Dickau handling the broadcast.
- The audio will be on the Colorado State Sports Radio Network (along with online at CSURams.com), with Brian Roth and Adam Nigon on the call. CSU Sports Network broadcasts can be also accessed on mobile devices through the Tuneln app (free on all Apple, Android, Windows, Blackberry and Amazon Kindle devices) once downloaded, search "Colorado St. Rams Sports Network" in the app for the games and coaches' show broadcasts.
- The game will also have live stats on CSURams.com.

2020-21 Rams Quick Hits

- Colorado State is under the direction of third-year head coach Niko Medved, who took over the helm of the Rams'
 program in 2018-19. In his eighth season as a head coach, Medved has a 125-123 record overall but improved on the
 previous season's record in each of his seven years as a head coach, including both years now at CSU.
- The 2020-21 season marks the 117th in the history of the Colorado State men's basketball program. The Rams are 1,296-1,288 (.502) in 2,584 games all-time.
- CSU concluded the 2019-20 season in the Mountain West Tournament first round and finished the year with an 20-12 overall record, including 11-7 in MW play, an eight-game improvement over 2018-19.
- The Rams earned their eighth invitation for postseason play in the last 11 years, though postseason events were eventually cancelled due to the CoVID-19 virus worldwide pandemic.
- CSU returns four starters and seven letterwinners to this year's squad along with five newcomers to Division I action.

The Leaders

- Colorado State Head Coach Niko Medved (Minnesota, '97) is in his third season at CSU as head coach with a 46-36 mark and has an 125-123 overall record is in his eighth season as a head coach.
- New Mexico Head Coach Paul Weir (York, '04) is in his fourth season with the Lobos with a 57-57 record and fifth as a head coach overall with a 85-63 mark.

A Familiar Face In Fort Collins

• While he may be in just his second season in charge of the program, head coach Niko Medved was already a familiar face around Fort Collins and to Ram fans. Medved previously was on the coaching staff from 2007-13 under two different coaches. He was a key part of recruiting players that helped the Rams to four consecutive postseason appearances, the last two in the NCAA Tournament that included a win over Missouri in 2013.

A Quick Look at New Mexico

- Returning one starter and six letterwinners from last season's 19-14 squad that was 7-11 in the Mountain West, the Lobos were picked to finish seventh in the league's preseason poll.
- Redshirt-senior guard/forward Makuach Maluach is the lone returning starter and is the undoubted leader for the Lobos, pacing the squad in minutes, points, rebounds, three-pointers and steals.

History Versus New Mexico

- New Mexico has had the better of the series, holding a 78-48 lead, including 71-47 in conference matchups. However the story is different in Fort Collins, as CSU had a 35-26 advantage, including four of the last six.
- Last year, the Rams dominated from the three-point arc for a resounding 105-72 victory, only the second time in their history they have scored 100 points or more against a Mountain West opponent (box score on page 19).
- CSU leader Niko Medved has an 2-1 record against New Mexico as a head coach.

Improvement Always

- Head coach Niko Medved has had extensive success wherever he has coached, both as a head and an assistant.
- As an assistant coach, he helped turn around the CSU program to improving its win totals from his first year in each successive year, ending in four straight postseason appearances.

- He continued that trend at Furman and Drake, improving both programs' win totals from the previous year in each of his five seasons as a head coach, finishing his last three years in postseason play.
- In his first year at CSU in 2018-19, he continued that trend, surpassing the previous season's win totals at CSU, both overall and in Mountain West play.
- This past season, the Rams had nine non-conference wins, surpassing last year's total of five. The squad has also won 20 games overall, surpassing last year's total of 12.
- The five-game win streak during the 2020-21 season was the longest for CSU since the Rams won seven straight during 2016-17.
- This year, Medved had the Rams off to their best conference start in the modern era (WAC and Mountain West) with the 11-3 mark.

 The 20 conference games the Rams are scheduled to play this season will be the most in league action since 1950-51 when they played 20 in three straight seasons in the Mountain States Athletic Conference.

 This was the latest start for the program since the 1942-43 season during World War II when CSU did not start until Jan. 8, 1943 with a 35-33 loss at Northern Colorado.

Back-to-Back MW Players of the Week

- For the first time in the program's Mountain West history, CSU had back-to-back MW Players of the Week, with sophomore guard/forward David Roddy winning it on Jan. 5 and sophomore guard Isaiah Stevens following up with the honor on Jan. 11.
- Roddy upped his numbers to 16.5 points, 10.3 rebounds and 2.0 assists a game on 55.0 percent FG shooting and 45.5 percent from the arc in this week's opening conference games.
- After having just two double-doubles last season, the Minneapolis, Minn., native posted three consecutive double-doubles. In the sweep over Fresno State, Roddy had 19 points and tied a career-high with 13 rebounds in the opener Dec. 28 and followed it up with 17 points, 12 rebounds and three assists in the Dec. 30 win over the Bulldogs. In the historic comeback over #23 San Diego State, Roddy led the Rams to just their second win in Viejas since 2003-04 with 15 points and 12 rebounds on 63.6 percent (7-of-11) from the field. He then had 15 points, hitting 4-of-7 from the floor, and five rebounds in the week's finale.
- The Allen, Texas guard led CSU to a pair of last-minute wins against UNLV, who was picked ahead of CSU in the preseason poll. For the two games, he averaged 23.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 6.0 assists on 50.0 percent on field goals, 64.3 percent on 3-pointers and 83.3 at the free throw line.
- In Thursday's opener, he tallied 25 points (MW careeer high and one off his career high which was in a triple-overtime game) with six rebounds and four assists in leading CSU from a 13-point deficit to the victory. He then tallied 22 points, six rebounds and eight assists, including the game-winning three-pointer (one of his career-best six threes in the game) with 25.9 to play and a pair of free throws to seal it in the final 15 seconds in the second win over UNLV on Saturday.
- In the series, he had his eighth and ninth 20+ point games of his career and 21st 5+ assist game, all while leading the Rams to their best Mountain West start in program history at 5-1.
- The Rams did have it happen twice in the Western Athletic Conference -- Feb. 27 & March 6, 1989 (Joel Tribel horn, Pat Durham) and Dec. 8 & 15, 1998 (Matt Barnett, Ryan Chilton).

Some Thoughts The Sweep of UNLV

- CSU's rally from 13 points down in the opener against the Runnin' Rebels tied for the 19th largest comeback in program history.
- The 16 three pointers in the second matchup on Jan. 9 are a Mountain West high this year, tied for the second most by CSU in Moby Arena and tied for the third most in program history.
- The Rams won both games in the final minute, as David Roddy hit a layup to put CSU up for good in the opener and Isaiah Stevens hit a three off a screen for the game winner in the finale.
- This was the first season series win since 2016-17 and just the fourth time the Rams won both contests in a single season.
- The sweep ran CSU's home winning streak to eight games, dating back to the final two regular season games in Moby Arena in 2019-20.

The Historic Comeback at SDSU

- CSU's rally from 26 points down at #23 San Diego State on Jan. 2 made history in several ways.
- It is the largest comeback in both school and Mountain West history. The previous largest comeback in CSU history occurred under Medved last season, as the Rams rallied from 19 down at Wyoming to earn a 77-70 win on Feb. 15, 2020.
- It is the largest comeback win in Division I men's basketball this season and one of just five road comebacks of 26 points or more in a game between Division I opponents over the past 10 seasons, according to ESPN Stats & Information research.
- This was the first win over a ranked opponent since Feb.

- 29, 2012, a 66-59 win over #17 UNLV at Moby Arena.
- This was the first road win over a ranked opponent since Jan. 5, 1973, a 93-86 win at #15 BYU.
- CSU had lost 28 straight games on the road against ranked teams before the win.
- CSU moved to 3-0 in Mountain West play for the first time in the 22-year history of the league.

Non-Conference Winning Record in '19-20 & '20-21

- Unless CSU adds two more non-conference games, the Rams have secured a winning non-conference record this year at 3-1 with one game remaining against Northern Colorado.
- Last season with the victory over South Dakota State Dec.
 10, 2019, the Rams secured a winning non-conference record.
- The nine non-conference wins was the most since CSU posted a school-best a 13-0 mark in 2014-15.

Moby Arena Home Court Advantage

- CSU has a record of 570-240 (.704) record all-time at Moby Arena.
- With the victory over Boise State Jan. 27, the Rams guaranteed a winning record in Moby Arena for the second straight season.
- With the win over Nevada Jan. 29, CSU guaranteed a better than .500 home record in 2019-20.
- Last year's 12-4 mark had to do with some significant differences in major categories in favor of the Rams, and this year's are following some similarities, resulting in a 6-0 mark at this point in the year and eight consecutive wins entering this week's action (the longest home win streak under Medved at CSU).

Defense Setting A Tone

- CSU has showed an improved defensive effort and shows clearly in the stats.
- The Rams are ranked in the top 70 nationally in defensive rebounds and three-point field goal percentage defense.
- CSU held opponents under 60 points for five consecutive games. The last time CSU held opponents each under 60 points that many consecutive games was in 2012-13 (NCAA Tournament bid and win over Missouri season), where they held six straight opponents under 60.

Getting Offensive (Fouls Drawn That Is)

- Part of CSU's improved defense is drawing offensive fouls on its opponents.
- The Rams are averaging 3.4 offensive fouls drawn on their opponents and have at least 3 in 15 of the 18 games.
- CSU's season high is seven in the home win over Fresno State on Dec. 28.

Starters Get It Going

 CSU's starters getting the scoring going is big this year, as the Rams are 11-1 this year when that group scores at least 54 points.

In the 2020-21 Season

- · The pair both scored in double figures in the opener against CSU Pueblo, as Thsitlewood had 16 points, including three triples and 5-of-6 at the free throw line, while Moore tallied 13 points, hitting all six of his field goal attempts and adding three assists and two steals.
- · Against Northern Arizona, Moore had 12 points, four rebounds and four steals, while Thistlewood chipped in nine points and four rebounds.
- In the victory at Santa Clara, Moore had 12 points and four rebounds, while Thistlewood recorded 10 points and a season-best eight rebounds.
- Moore set a season-best with 18 points at San Jose State Jan. 14 and connected on nine three pointers in the twogame set with the Spartans.
- · Thistlewood tied a career high with 24 points, including a career-best five 3-pointers, against Boise State Jan. 29.
- Moore currently ranks third in scoring for CSU at 10.7 points per game while second in field goal percentage (47.5) and second in three-point percentage (39.4).
- · Thistlewood is fourth at 9.4 points per game, has hit 32 three-pointers and is 85.7 percent at the free throw line.

Sophomore Class Continuing Impact

- The sophomore class of guards Isaiah Stevens and John Tonie, forward David Roddy and center Dischon Thomas are showing the growth in their second year of collegiate
- · Stevens is second in scoring at 14.9 points and first with 5.8 assists (#2 MW) per game while Roddy is first in scoring at 15.9 points per game and the top rebounder at 9.3.
- · Tonje is ffith at 7.6 points per game, with Thomas averaging 5.0 points and 2.9 boards a contest.
- · Against Northern Arizona Dec. 14, Stevens had a gamehigh 23 points and nine assists, while Roddy added 14 points, eight rebounds and four assists. Tonje chipped in seven points and two rebounds off the bench.
- · In the win at Santa Clara Dec. 22, the group combined or 45 points and 22 rebounds, with Roddy leading with 16 points and Tonje recording a career-high with 12 off the

bench.

- Roddy recorded double-doubles in each of the games against Fresno State, going for 19 points and a career high-tying 13 rebounds in the opener and following it up with 17 points and 11 boards in the second victory.
- The group made a major impact on the historic comeback win over then-No. 23 San Diego State Jan. 2, combining for 41 points, 19 rebounds and 12 assists. Tonje capped off the win by hitting the game-winning four-point play with a triple from the left corner with 12.3 seconds left and converting the free throw from the foul to put the Rams ahead for good.
- Roddy earned his first Mountain West Player of the Week on Jan. 5 for his efforts against Fresno State and at San Diego State.
- Stevens then garnered the award on Jan. 11 for his efforts in two thrilling wins over UNLV.
- Thomas had a season-high 15 points, including a career-best three 3-pointers in the win at Utah State, Jan.
- Roddy posted career bests with 27 points and 15 rebounds in the win over Boise State Jan. 27. In 2019-20
- · Last season, head coach Niko Medved played the four freshmen in 31 of the 32 contests in 2019-20, with three playing in all 32.
- Stevens started all 32 games, while Roddy started the final 19 games of the season, while Thomas and Tonje both played at least 31 contests and contributed off the bench.
- Stevens led the team in scoring at 13.3 points per game, shooting 46.7 percent from the floor, 38.0 from the arc and 81.6 percent from the free throw line. He reached at least 10 points in 24 of the 32 games and had at least four assists in 20 of them, averaging 4.6 per game (3rd in the MW).
- Against Wyoming Feb. 15, Stevens set CSU's freshman assist record, surpassing Michael Morris (2002-03) at 121. He had 144 assists on the year, which is fifth on the CSU single-season chart (Milt Palacio in 4th with 147).
- Roddy was third at 11.4 points per game and second at 5.6 rebounds a contest, as the freshman scored in double figures in 22 of the last 28 games and 23 total contests last season.
- The duo earned honorablemention All-MW from the media, Stevens Third Team All-MW by the coaches and also MW Freshman of the Year by both the coaches and media.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – In the latest opener for the program since World War II, Colorado State put it together in the second half and came away with an 89-77 win over a pesky CSU Pueblo squad on Saturday afternoon in Moby Arena. The Rams made their latest start since 1942-43 due to the worldwide pandemic that delayed the start of the season nationally and then kept the team off the floor for almost three weeks due to positive cases.

The two teams went back and forth in the opening 20 minutes, as CSU Pueblo led by two at the break, 42-40. Junior guard Kendle Moore came out and canned a triple on the opening possession of the second half and the Rams never trailed the remainder of the game. The CSU lead grew to as many as 15 in the closing minutes.

Colorado State finished at 51.7 percent (30-of-58) from the field but just 37.5 percent (6-of-16) from the arc. CSU Pueblo was 42.2 percent (27-of-64) from the floor and 37.9 percent (14-of-29) on threes. CSU was a solid 23-of-29 (79.3 percent) from the free throw line, while the ThunderWolves were 12-of-17 (70.6 percent). CSU had a slight edge in rebounds, 35-34, and oustcored the visitors 19-13 off turnovers.

The Rams had four players in double figures, led by sophomore guard/ forward David Roddy with 25 points and 12 rebounds. Sophomore Isaiah Stevens added 18 points, six assists and three steals, while juniors Adam Thistlewood and Moore chipped in 16 and 13, respectively. CSU Pueblo was paced by Tre Brown's 28 points.

STAT OF THE GAME

 The Rams were aggressive in the paint, outscoring the ThunderWolves 42-28 in the interior.

- \bullet CSU has now won all seven meetings between the two schools, all of them occurring in Fort Collins.
- \bullet The Rams are now 89-28 in season openers (66-17 in the modern era), including 64-15 at home.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – Playing its second game in three days, Colorado State overcame a sluggish shooting first half and drained 10 three pointers to spur a closing 31-2 run to pull away for a 91-52 victory over Northern Arizona Monday night in Moby Arena. The Rams improved to 2-0 on the young season, while the Lumberiacks dropped to 0-3.

Down 5-4 in the early going, CSU went on a 17-2 run over the next seven-plus minutes to lead 21-7 with eight minutes remaining in the opening 20. NAU came back with a 12-0 run to cut it to a two-point game three minutes later, but sophomore Dischon Thomas hit a jumper to make it a two-possession game. The game stayed within five the rest of the opening half as CSU eventually took a 35-32 lead into the intermission.

The Rams came out and started lighting up the scoreboard early and often in the second half, connecting on its next seven three-point attempts to stretch the lead out to 20 at 57-37 with 14 minutes to play. The Lumberjacks put on a run to cut it to 10 at 60-50 with 9:17 to go, but junior Kendle Moore made a driving layup to start the final run that led to the 39-point victory.

Colorado State finished at 54.8 percent (34-of-62) from the field, including 50.0 percent (11-of-22) from the arc after going just 1-of-9 in the first half. Northern Arizona shot 35.8 percent (19-of-53) for the game and was limited to just 28.6 percent (8-of-28) in the final 20 minutes. CSU won the battle of the boards, 37-27, and converted 15 NAU turnovers into 25 points.

The Rams were led by sophomore Isaiah Stevens with 23 points, nine assists and five rebounds. Sophomore David Roddy had 14 points, eight rebounds and four assists, while junior Kendle Moore and redshirt-freshman James Moors each chipped in 12. Cameron Shelton was the leader for the Lumberiacks with 18 points.

• The Rams got a great contribution off the bench, as CSU had a 31-9 scoring advantage among the reserves after just 12 points off the bench in the opener.

MORAGA, Calif. — Colorado State went scoreless for almost six minutes to start the game and was unable to overcome that slow start against a muchmore seasoned Saint Mary's squad, falling 53-33 Saturday night. The Rams slipped to 2-1 on their young season, while the Gaels improved to 8-1 on the year.

Saint Mary's scored the first 14 points of the game over 5:32 until redshirt-freshman James Moors hit a pair of layups to start the CSU scoring. However the Rams made just three of their first 19 shots, went 8-of-31 (25.8 percent) in the opening 20 minutes and entered the intermission trailing the Gaels, 33-17.

Saint Mary's scored the first six points of the second half and eventually pushed the lead to as many as $24\,\mathrm{in}$ the final stanza.

Colorado State finished at 25.0 percent (12-of-48) from the floor overall and 13.3 percent (2-of-15) from the three-point arc. Saint Mary's was just 36.7 percent (22-of-6) from the field and 22.6 percent (7-of-31) beyond the three-point line. The Gaels won the battle of the boards, 41-30.

CSU's top scorer was sophomore Dischon Thomas with eight points, while the Gaels were led by Tommy Kuhse with 14.

SANTA CRUZ, Calif. — Colorado State rallied after an early deficit and led the entire second half en route to a 70-57 victory over Santa Clara on Tuesday afternoon in Santa Cruz. With the road victory at the home of the NBA G-League's Santa Cruz Warriors, the Rams improved to 3-1 while handing the Broncos their first loss of the year and dropping them to 6-1.

CSU didn't find the rhythm offensively early, spotting the hosts an early 10-2 run in the first 4:31 of the game. However, the Rams kept the defensive intensity high, forcing 11 turnovers and allowing just 15 points the rest of the half to grab a 31-25 halftime lead. The Rams used solid defense in the second half to build the lead to as many as 11 as the visitors led the final 25 minutes of the contest.

Colorado State finished the game at 41.7 percent (25-of-60) from the field, including 10-of-32 (31.3 percent) from the arc. Santa Clara finished at 36.4 percent (24-of-66) from the floor and were limited to just 17.9 percent on threes. The Rams were 76.9 percent (10-of-13) from the free throw line, while the Broncos were just 44.4 percent (4-of-9). SCU won the boards slightly 43-39.

The Rams had a balanced scoring attack with five in double figures, led by sophomore David Roddy with 16 points, eight rebounds and four assists. Sophomore Isaiah Stevens had 14 points, four rebounds and four assists, while junior Kendle Moore and sophomore John Tonje each chipped in 12. Junior Adam Thistlewood rounds out the Rams' leaders with 10. Santa Clara had just one in double figures as Christian Carlyle had 17.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – Colorado State led from start-to-finish and pulled away during the second half for a 75-53 win over visiting Fresno State Monday night in the Mountain West opener for both squads. With the victory, the Rams improved to 4-1 on the year and 1-0 in the league, while the Bulldogs fell to 2-1 and 0-1 in the conference.

CSU scored the first seven points of the contest, but Fresno State hung tough and cut the margin to two at 19-17 with 6:35 remaining in the first half. From there, CSU put on a 11-1 run and pulled out to a 30-18 lead late in the opening stanza before entering the intermission leading 33-22.

The Bulldogs cut into the lead early in the second half, getting it down to six, 36-30, with less than four minutes gone. However, the Rams scored the next eight points and never led by less than nine the rest of the way, eventually building the lead to 24 in the final minute of action.

Colorado State finished the game at 48.0 percent (24-of-50) from the floor, with half of their makes coming from the three-point line, as the Rams were 12-of-28 (42.9 percent) beyond the arc. Fresno State was held to 40.8 percent overall (20-of-49) and a paltry 17.4 percent (4-of-23) from the three. CSU was 71.4 percent (15-of-21) at the charity stripe while Fresno State finished at 47.4 (9-of-19). The Buildoos won the boards 35-31.

The Rams had three in double figures, led by sophomore forward David Roddy with game highs of 19 points and 13 rebounds. Sophomore guard Isaiah Stevens had 16 points and nine assists, while junior guard Kendle Moore chipped in 13 points, three assists and two steals. The Bulldogs had two in double figures, paced by forward Orlando Robinson with 14 points and 10 rebounds.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – Colorado State used a stingy first half defense and timely offense from the bench to build a 24-point halftime lead en route to an 81-59 win over Fresno State on Wednesday afternoon in Moby Arena. With their third straight win, the Rams improved to 5-1 on the year and 2-0 in Mountain West play, while the Bulldogs fell to 2-2 overall and 0-2 in the league.

Fresno State got the first two points of the game but that would be its only lead, as a three from sophomore forward Dischon Thomas put CSU pfor good, sparking an 11-0 run over just 1:46 for an 11-2 lead. The Rams used a stifling defense, limiting the Broncos to just 21.9 percent (7-of-32) in the opening 20 minutes in building a 41-17 halftime advantage. From there, CSU never led by less than 20 and stretched the margin to as many as 33 points late in the game before clearing the bench in the final minutes.

Colorado State was solid from the floor, shooting 52.3 percent (23-of-44) from the field and 50.0 percent (fl-of-22) beyond the arc. Fresno State was just 34.3 percent (23-of-67) overall and 20.0 percent (6-of-30) on threes. The Rams attacked and got to the free throw line, going 26-of-32 (81.3 percent) as compared to the visitors' 7-of-14. CSU did win the boards, 36-34.

Three Rams finished in double digits, led by sophomore forward David Roddy with 17 points and 11 rebounds. Junior P.J. Byrd tallied 14 points off the bench, including going 8-of-8 from the charity stripe, while freshman gaard Isaiah Rivera chipped in 11 points and six rebounds in his reserve role. Forward Orlando Robinson led the Bullldogs with 19 points and 15 boards.

SAN DIEGO, Calif. - Colorado State rallied from an early barrage from #23 San Diego State, completing the largest comeback in Mountain West and school history on a four-point play by sophomore John Tonje in the final minute that propelled the Rams to a 70-67 win over the Aztecs Saturday afternoon at Viejas Arena.

After the Rams got the opening bucket of the game, the Rams missed their next five field goal attempts and San Diego State went 5-of-6 from the floor for At unanswered points and eventually went on a 28-3 run to take control of the game at 28-5 midway through the half. The lead eventually grew to as many as 26 on 9-0f-18 shooting from the arc in the first half. However, CSU rallied with a 21-2 run to close out the half, including holding the Aztecs without a field goal

over the last 7:04, to enter the break down just 7 at 40-33.

SDSU started the second half on a 10-2 run but CSU again responded with a surge to cut it to 53-52 with 12:22 to play in the contest. The game remained within a handful of points the remainder of the way, as the Aztecs only led by as many as eight until the closing minutes. With SDSU up 67-59 with 2:06 to play and 67-60 with under a minute to go, sophomore guard Isaiah Stevens hit a layup to make it a five-point game. From there, Tonje scored on layup with 47 seconds to play and then, following a defensive stop, hit the three from the left corner to tie it, drew the foul and hit the free throw to put the Rams up one. CSU strongly contested SDSU's final attempt and junior guard Kendle Moore got fouled and sank both free throws with two seconds left to seal the win.

For the game, the teams were fairly even from the floor, as Colorado State shot 42.1 percent (24-of-57) from the floor and 40.7 percent (11-of-27) on threes, while San Diego State was 40.4 percent (23-of-57) from the field and 46.7 percent (14-of-30) from the arc. The Rams won the battle of the boards, 39-31, and outscored their hosts 24-12 on points on the paint.

CSU had five players in double figures, led by junior Adam Thistlewood and sophomore David Roddy with 15 points each, as Roddy also added 12 rebounds for his third straight double-double. Moore finished with 13 points and five rebounds, while Tonje and sophomore Isaiah Stevens each had 11, with Stevens adding a game-high nine assists. San Diego State had four in double digits, paced by Terrell Gomez with 19 points.

Colorado State closed the game on an 11-0 run over the final 1:53 to earn the win.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. - In a back-and-forth Mountain West Conference battle, Colorado State again found a way to get it done in the final minutes to overcome an early second-half run by UNLV and earn a 74-71 win Thursday night in Moby Arena. With the win, the Rams improved to 7-4 and 4-1 in the Mountain West, while the Runnin' Rebels are now 1-5 and 0-1 in the league.

Colorado State grabbed an early lead and was up 22-17 just over midway through the first half. However, UNLV put together a 17-4 run over the next 4:48 to take a 34-26 lead. The Rams rallied late and were able to go into the intermission down one, 35-34, after sophomore Isaiah Stevens hit a running layup in the final seconds.

The second half didn't start well for the hosts, as the Rebels scored the first eight points in two minutes to go up nine. The lead fluctuated before eventually growing to 13 at 59-46 with 8:52 left in the game. CSU then put on its own run, this one a 14-2 surge over just 132, capped off by a steal and a three-pointer junior Kendle Moore, to make it a 61-60 lead for the visitors. UNLV answered with an 8-2 run to lead 69-62 with 4:01 to play.

The Rams stayed aggressive, hitting 5-of-6 free throws in the next two minutes to again make it a one-possession game at 69-67 Rebels with 2:24 remaining. A defensive stop led to a post-up basket and foul drawn by sophomore David Roddy to tie the game and the made free throw put the Rams up for the first time in almost 30 minutes of game time. A fade-away jumper by Bryce Hamilton in the final minute put UNLV back up, but another Roddy bucket with 25.9 seconds to play. CSU got the stop on a challenged three, with Stevens grabbing the board, getting the foul and making both free throws with seven seconds to play. UNLV's last gasp shot rattled off and CSU pulled out

the conference win.

Colorado State finished the game at 41.8 percent (23-of-55) from the floor and 40.0 percent (12-of-30) from the three-point line, while UNLV ended at 41.8 percent (28-of-67) from the field but just 28.0 percent (7-of-25) beyond the arc. UNILY won the board battle, 45-33, including a 12-4 advantage on the offensive glass. The free throw line became a difference, as CSU went 16-of-22 (72.7

percent), while the Rebels were just 8-of-14 (57.1 percent). CSU was led by Stevens with 25 points on 8-of-15 shootings, six rebounds and four assists. Roddy had 18 points and five rebounds, while Moore chipped in 15. Dischon Thomas capped out the double-figure scorers for the Rams with 10 points and six rebounds off the bench. UNLV also had four in double figures, led by Hamilton's 23 points.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – In an instant classic Mountain West Conference game, Colorado State again made the plays they needed in the final minute to earn an 83-80 win over UNLV Saturday afternoon in Moby Arena. With the win, the Rams improved to 8-2 and 5-1 in the Mountain West, while the Runnin' Rebels are now 1-6 and 0-2 in the league.

After a back-and-forth first half, the Rams entered halftime with a 39-36 advantage. UNLV got the first four points of the second half to take the lead, as the battle continued in the second half, with teams exchanging 18 leads and tied 12 times in the contest. Tied at 78 in the final minute, sophomore David Roddy made a key block on Bryce Hamilton's 3 attempt with 41 seconds remaining.

Then next possession off the screen, sophomore Isaiah Stevens canned a three from the top of the key to put the Rams up 81-78 with 26 ticks to go. A two by UNLV cut it to a one-point game, but Stevens was fouled and drained both free throws and the final attempt fell off and into Kendle Moore's hands as CSU earned the hard-fought win.

Colorado State finished the game 53.7 percent (29-of-54) from the field, including a stellar 55.2 percent (16-of-29) on threes, while UNLV was 50.8 percent (3f-of-61) from the floor but limited to 27.3 percent (6-of-22) from the arc. UNLV won the boards, 34-24, but was only able to outscore the Rams 11-9 in second chance points.

PHOENIX, Ariz. – Colorado State jumped out early and built the lead throughout in easily handling San Jose State 90-57 Thursday night in Phoenix. With the win, the Rams improved to 9-2 and 6-1 in Mountain West play, while the Spartans fell to 2-9 and 0-7 in the league.

CSU scored the first five points of the game and just kept steadily building the first half lead behind solid shooting and strong overall defense. The Rams build the lead to as many as 26 in the first half and eventually went into the break leading 46-26. SJSU did get the lead down to 16 seven minutes into the second half, however CSU had an answer every time the rest of the half, including using a 17-2 run to lead by as many as 34 with under four minutes to play.

Colorado State finished the game at 54.7 percent (35-of-64) from the floor, including a stellar 63.0 percent (17-of-27) in the second half. San Jose State was limited to just 34.4 percent (22-of-64) and 32.0 percent (8-of-25) from the three-point line. The Rams won the battle of the boards 32-21.

Junior guard Kendle Moore led the Rams with 18 points, including four three-pointers, while junior David Roddy finished with 17 points and a game and team season-high 14 rebounds. Sophomore guard Isaiah Stevens finished with 14 points, while sophomore guard John Tonje came off the bench with 13. Richard Washington was the only Spartan in double figures with 35.

PHOENIX, Ariz. – Colorado State utilized a second half surge and pulled away from San Jose State for an 88-61 victory Saturday afternoon in Phoenix. With the win, the Rams improved to 10-2 and 7-1 in Mountain West play, while the Spartans fell to 2-10 and 0-8 in the leaque.

The two teams battled early on and the game was within six most of the opening minutes as the Rams led after the opening minute. Then, CSU stepped up its defense and held SJSU without a FB for more than 6 minutes – CSU went on a 10-3 run to extend the lead to 36-24 with just under two to go in the first 20 minutes. The Rams continued to push until the end of the half, building a 42-28 lead at the intermission.

In the second 20, SJSU continued to try to fight back, but CSU had an answer every time to keep the Spartans from making a run to close the gap to single digits. San Jose State got it down to 51-40 with 16:14 to play, but the Rams went on a quick 7-0 run over 41 seconds to extend the lead to 18 and never look back. CSU led by as many as 33 in the final minutes to earn the victory.

Colorado State finished the game at 51.5 percent (35-of-68) from the floor and 35.3 percent (12-of-34) on threes. San Jose State was held to 38.1 percent (24-of-63) from the field and just 27.3 percent (6-of-22) behind the line. The teams combined for just 18 turnovers in the contest.

Sophomore guard Isaiah Stevens and junior guard Adam Thistlewood tied for game-high honors with 16 points each, while junior guard Kendle Moore tallied 15. Freshman center James Moors was the other Ram in double figures with a season-high 14 points along with six board. Sophomore forward David Roddy led all players with 13 rebounds and added nine points. San Jose State had two players with 15 – Richard Washington and Sebastian Mendoza.

With the win, the Rams improved to 12-3 and 9-2 in MW play, while the Broncos had their school-record 13-game win streak snapped and suffered their first conference loss to fall to 13-2 and 9-1 in the league.

The visitors came out and took an early 7-2 lead, but a 9-0 run, capped by a David Roddy fast-break layup, put the Rams up 11-7 with just over five minutes gone. This ended up being the last lead change of the game, as CSU used a strong defense and effective offense to build a 40-25 lead at halftime.

Boise State made a push early in the second half, chipping away at the CSU lead and shrinking it to five on two occasions, the last at 50-45 with 11:36 to go. Sophomore John Tonje canned back-to-back three-pointers for the Rams and the lead stretched back to nine at 56-47. After trading free throws and baskets to make it 60-52 CSU, the home squad went on a 8-0 run over 2:33, capped by a Roddy transition triple, to make it a 16-point margin at 68-52 with 3:53 to go. From there, the Rams finished off the victory with a final 10-4 surge.

Colorado State finished the game at 55.8 percent (29-of-52) from the floor, including 40.0 percent (8-of-20) from the three-point line. Boise State, who entered the game hitting 47.4 percent on field goals, was limited to 38.2 percent (21-of-55) and just 21.7 percent (5-of-23) on threes. The Rams dominated the riless 40-24

CSU was led by Roddy with career bests of 27 points and 15 rebounds, while sophomore Isaiah Stevens finished with 12 points and 10 assists. Junior Kendle Moore and Tonje each added 11 points in the win. Boise State had two in double figures, led by Derrick Alston Jr. with 20 points.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. – In a battle featuring two of the top three teams in the Mountain West standings, Colorado State was unable to rally late against a pesky Boise State and fell to the visiting Broncos 85-77 Friday night. With the loss snapping CSU's nine-game home win streak, the Rams fell to 12-4 and 9-3 in MW play, while the Broncos improved to 14-2 and 10-1 in the league.

After a back-and-forth first half that had the Rams leading 39-38 at the break, Boise State came out and scored the first seven points of the second half and never relinquished the lead. The margin grew to as many as 23 in the second half, but CSU battled back and cut it to six with two minutes to play at 77-71. However, the Rams could get no closer as the Broncos shot 58.3 percent from the field in the final 20 minutes.

Colorado State finished the game at 50.0 percent (29-of-58) from the field and 40.9 percent (9-of-22) from the three-point line. Boise State was 52.7 percent (29-of-55) from the floor, including 42.9 percent (9-of-21) beyond the arc. CSU had a slight lead on the board, 31-30, but was outscored on points in the paint, 36-28.

CSU was led by junior Adam Thistlewood, who tied a career high with 24 points, including a career-best five three-pointers. Sophomore Isaiah Stevens had 17 points, nine rebounds and eight assists, while sophomore David Roddy was the only other Ram in double figures with 16 points and eight boards. Boise State had four players in double figures, led by Marcus Shaver Jr. with 21.

LARAMIE, Wyo. – Guard Kendle Moore's driving layup with 5.8 seconds left on the clock and a last desperation three for Wyoming rattled off as Colorado State escaped with a 74-72 win over the host Cowboys Thursday night in Laramie. With the win, the Rams improved to 13-4 and 10-3 in Mountain West action, while the Cowboys fell to 10-8 and 4-7 in league play.

Colorado State led a majority of the first half, building its biggest lead at seven at 19-12 with 12:12 to go in the period. From there, the Rams were limited to just 13 points, including a 2:47 drought late, and Wyoming led 38-32 at halftime. CSU was not able to get an offensive flow in the first 20 minutes due to 11 turnovers and 11 fouls against the Rams.

Wyoming was never able to push the lead to double digits in the second half as the Rams hung tough. CSU finally grabbed a lead with 6:34 to play in the game on a pair of free throws from forward David Roddy, part of five ties and three lead changes in the final minutes. The Rams led by five with 46 second left but a three-point play from Hunter Maldonaldo made it a two-point game. Moore hit one of two free throws to go up three. Marcus Williams tied the game up with 12 seconds to go, leading to the final dramatics for the CSU victory.

Colorado State finished the game at 55.1 percent (27-of-49) from the floor, including 37.5 percent (6-of-16) from the arc. Wyoming was 46.4 percent (26-of-61) overall and 27.8 percent (10-of-36) behind the three-point line. CSU won the battle of the boards, 33-27, and took advantage at the free throw line, connecting on 14-of-16 attempts (87.5 percent).

CSU was led by guard John Tonje with a career-high 16 points off the bench, including hitting all six free throws. Roddy finished with 15 points and eight rebounds, while Moore and center James Moors chipped in 11 and 10 respectively. Wyoming had four in double figures as well, led by Xavier DuSell with 17

LARAMIE, Wyo. – Colorado State built an 18-point first-half lead and made it hold with some late free throws and key baskets to defeat host Wyoming, 68-59, in the Border War finale Sturday afternoon in Laramie. With the win, the Rams improved to 14-4 and 11-3 in Mountain West action, while the Cowboys fell to 10-9 and 4-8 in league play.

Colorado State got off to a strong start on both ends of the floor, using smart at a strong start on both ends of the floor, using smart at 8 at 37-19 with 352 left in the first half. However, Myoming, as in a typical rivalry game, scrapped back with a 10-2 run to close the first half and cut the Rams lead to 39-29 at halftime. Part of CSU's first-half success came from good ball movement that resulted in hitting 55.2 percent (16-of-29) of its shots from the floor, including 13-of-18 on two pointers.

Wyoming kept chipping away at the Rams lead, eventually cutting it down to just one at 60-59 with 2:27 to play, as the Rams went more than eight minutes without a made field goal. Forward David Roddy connected on a pair of free throws and then made a driving layup to push it back to 64-59, as CSU scored the final eight points of the game to seal the win.

Colorado State finished at 51.1 percent (23-of-45) from the floor but just 17.6 percent (3-of-17) from the three-point line. Wyoming ended at 38.9 percent (21-of-54) on field goals, including 23.1 percent (6-of-26) on threes. CSU won the battle of the boards, 39-25, and went 76.0 percent (19-of-25) at the charity stripe.

The Rams had three in double figures, led by Roddy with 15 points and 11 rebounds. Guard Isaiah Stevens had 14 points and guard John Tonje finished with 10. Wyoming had two in double figures, as Graham Ike and Drake Jeffries each had 13.

NIKO MEDVED

Head Coach • Third Year at CSU • Minnesota (1997)

Niko Medved is in his third year as the head coach of the Rams' men's basketball program in 2020-21. Medved, a Colorado State assistant coach from 2007-13, has continued to show his prowess in program improvement, having led his respective squads to increased wins over the previous season in each of his seven years as a leader. That includes both seasons at CSU, resulting in a nine-win improvement over two years.

Last season, the Rams continued their upward trend under Medved and his staff, posting an eight-victory improvement over his first year with a 20-win season. The Rams were also headed to the postseason for the first time in three years prior to the season being halted for the worldwide pandemic. As part of that season, three Rams were recognized for their play on the court, including second-team All-MW pick and the league's all-time leading rebounder Nico Carvacho and the Mountain West Freshman of the Year and third-team All-MW guard Isaiah Stevens.

He previously served as the head coach at Drake University for one season where he guided the Bulldogs to their first postseason berth in six years. Prior to his appointment at Drake, he engineered considerable success as head coach at Furman from 2013-16.

As a Colorado State assistant coach for six years beginning in 2007 when former head coach Tim Miles took the reins of the Rams' program, Medved was instrumental in the rebuild of the program that saw it improve from seven wins in 2007-08 to five consecutive postseason berths, including NCAA tournament appearances in his final two seasons. As recruiting coordinator at CSU, Medved was responsible for recruiting many of the contributing players on the Rams' roster who helped return the program to prominence, a list that includes:

- two-time All-Mountain West selection and eventual Olympian Andy Ogide
- · 2013 honorable mention AP All-American and first-team All-Mountain West Conference choice Colton Iverson
- second team All-MW pick Dorian Green
- third team all-league and two time all-defensive team selection Pierce Hornung
- 2012 first team All-MW guard Wes Eikmeier
- 2013 MW Sixth Man of the Year Daniel Bejarano

During his season at Drake, he engineered a 10-game improvement over the previous season, including 10 wins in the Missouri Valley Conference, the most in 10 years and just the 11th time the squad had won 10 or more league games in a season. The turnaround was the 17th best in the nation this year from a 7-24 record prior to his arrival. The postseason berth in the CIT was the first since 2012 and the His squad defeated Wake Forest during non-conference play., the program's second-ever win against an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent. He also had a player named Missouri Valley Scholar-Athlete of the Week seven times during the season out of 11 opportunities and had four players named to MVC Scholar-Athlete teams.

In four seasons as head coach at Furman, Medved guided the Paladins from a seven-win squad prior to his arrival and led it to improved records each season. The run culminated in a 23-11 record in 2016 that earned him Southern Conference Coach of the Year honors and saw the program earn a share of its first SoCon regular season championship since 1990-91. Medved's team reached the semifinals of the CollegeInsider.com (CIT) postseason tournament in 2016-17, its second consecutive season in the CIT.

He spent seven seasons as an assistant coach at Furman (1999-2006),
