Media At Practice

Practice is only open for media for the first 30 minutes, and it is closed to the public. Contact Frank Mercogliano for more information about the class schedules for players needed for interviews (some players are not available due to class after practice, but we will make all efforts to get everyone the interviews they need). We ask for media to get all player interviews on Tuesday and Wednesdays. For special longer-form type of interviews, just contact Frank Mercogliano and we can make whatever arrangements are needed. The bottom line is we want to help you get the coverage you need.

Danny Gonzales Interview Opportunities

Coach Gonzales is available several times during the week. He has a weekly radio interview with The Opening Drive on Monday during the season, and holds a press luncheon on Tuesday. He is also available after practice on Wednesday and Thursday as well. He can be available by appointment on Mondays, but that is prep day for the upcoming week of practice.

New Mexico Media Luncheon

In the fall, the New Mexico Media Luncheons are Tuesdays from noon to 1 p.m. tentatively. Coach Danny Gonzales is available at 12:30 p.m. and he will be followed at the podium by offensive coordinator Derek Warehime and defensive coordinator Rocky Long. Audio and video clips from the UNM communications office, and also at www.golobos.com. The press conferences are also streamed on GoLobos.com by LoboTV. Please note that the Mountain West no longer conducts a football coaches teleconference. The luncheon is on the Zia II level of the West press box.

New Mexico Player Interview Opportunities

All player interviews must be arranged through the UNM athletics communications office. The main time for interviews is after practice. Wednesday is the last day for player interviews. For lengthier interviews, please call the communications office to arrange, which we are happy to do, working around class schedules. These will normally take place in the communications suite in the Maloof Center.

Postgame: The UNM locker room is closed. For home games that aren't running overly long, we will bring Coach Gonzales and two players into the Tow Diehm weight room (no elevators any more!!!!). This is where press conferences were held previously. After the press conferences, if media need other players that didn't address everyone (say for a sidebar story or something along those lines), we will have them available in the weight room but separate and not as a group interview.

For road games, we will have a regular media session that will be available via Zoom for everyone to follow, but we will allow media on site to ask questions first. We will record these and send them out afterwards.

Wireless in the Press Box

The press box at University Stadium is fully equipped for wireless connections. Access is free, but those wanting access need their own internal or external wireless cards. Phone lines are available. There won't be a lot of media there this season, so it should be a very strong signal.

On Game Day, the northeast box office at University Stadium opens four hours prior to kickoff, and the Lobo Ticket Office at University Arena opens three hours before game time. The northwest University Stadium box office opens 90 minutes before kickoff.

Lobo Talk & The Lobo Coaches Show

In the fall, host Robert Portnoy and coach Danny Gonzales discuss UNM football at Lobo Talk on Thursdays. The show airs from 7-8 p.m. from a site to be determined. Fans can call 866-350-4309 to ask coach Gonzales a question. Also in the fall, the Lobo Coaches Show will be produced by LoboTV, with distribution channels to be announced in.

Game Credentials

Regular UNM media will receive game credentials prior to the start of the season. Media members with season credentials will also serves as a parking pass for hopefully a return to the Baseball East lot, where we were prior to the 2019 season.

Visiting team media should request single-game credentials through their team's media relations office. Media passes work as parking passes for the Baseball lots.

Media members not associated directly with a team, along with scouts can log onto GoLobos.com and click the "credentials" tab to request game-specific credentials.

All media members who are picking up credentials on the day of the game will need to head to at the University Drive entrance to the Baseball South lot. The parking attendant will have all the credentials there. This should allow you to get your credential without having to wait in line or deal with parking on the north side of the stadium.

Parking

Media parking is located across and just south of the stadium off University Drive. Media members hopefully can park in the Baseball East lot which is located next to University Drive in the lot just beyond the right field fence of Santa Ana Star Field. You just show your credential to park.

Visiting Radio

The visiting radio booth is located on the fourth level of the main press box, next to the main media area. A reminder that we can all hear you when you get too exuberant. We can actually hear everything, and it is at times quite entertaining.

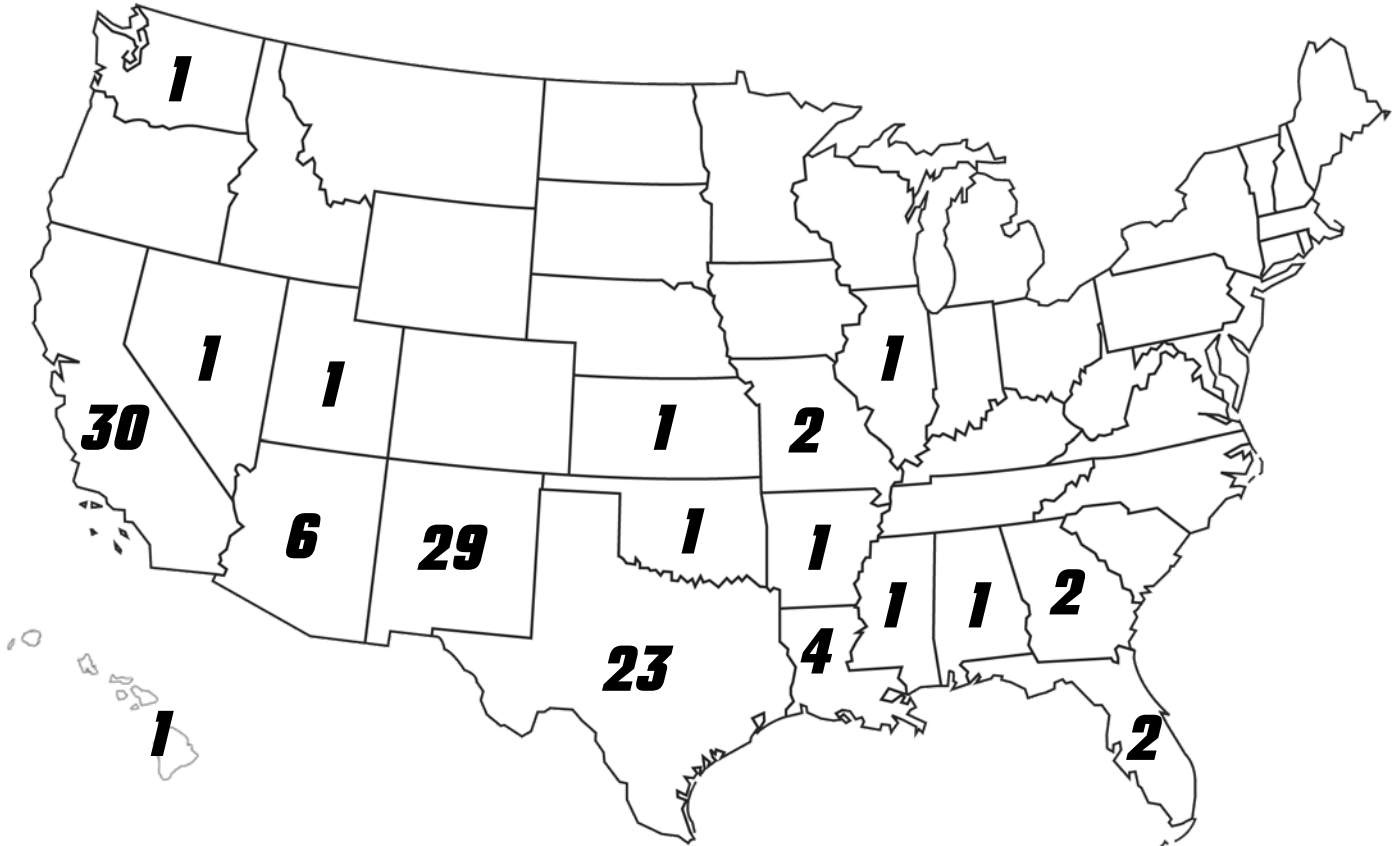

The Opening List

When the Lobos open their 2021 season, it will be at home. Finally.

The game will mark the return of four former Lobo coaches to the home sidelines at head coach Danny Gonzales will coach his first game at home, with for Lobo coaches Rocky Long, Jason Lenzmeier and Troy Reffett. However, what we are concerned with is the first that the first home game that Gonzales will serve as head coach will come in his eighth career game, and a wild 625 days since he was named the head coach on December 17, 2019.

Most Lobo coaches recently have played a home game either in their debut, or their second game. Certainly, none have ever had to wait until the eighth game, have they? They haven't. Danny Gonzales waiting until his eighth game to coach at home makes him only the third coach in Lobo history to ever have to wait until even game three, and that's out of 32 coaches. When Lobo coaches have made their home debuts is the subject of a very Bob Dylanesque "Subterranean Homesick Blues" type of Opening List.

And That's What We Call, A Winning Streak

The Lobos have a chance to turn a large losing streak into a nice little winning streak. The Lobos last year were sitting at 0-5 on the 2020 season and the team had lost 14 straight games dating back to September 20, 2019. New Mexico at the time shared the nation's longest losing streak with Kansas at 14 games for exactly eight hours and 54 minutes. Then UNM ended that streak, including a 20-game conference losing streak with a 17-16 win over Wyoming. After that win, head coach Danny Gonzales told his team that if you beat Fresno State, that's called a winning streak. That's exactly what happened.

New Mexico defeated Fresno State 49-39, giving UNM a two-game winning streak, meaning that the Lobos enter the 2021 season tied for the 13th longest winning streak in the nation. That two-game winning streak is on the line when UNM hosts Houston Baptist at University Stadium.

If UNM were to win, it would give the Lobos its first three-game winning streak since winning three in a row, winning the first two games of the 2016 season and then the 2017 opener. It would amazingly tie for the second-longest winning streak since the 2004 season, when UNM won five straight. The Lobos also won five in a row in 2016.

Incidentally, UNM has won six straight games against non-FBS opponents. Houston Baptist is a member of the FCS Southland Conference.

So Who is QB7?

Last year in just a seven-game season, the Lobos rather famously ran out of quarterbacks. The year started with five quarterbacks, but in order, the Lobos lost Brandt Hughes right before the season started. Tevaka Tuioti started games one and two before a season-ending injury. That gave the job to Trae Hall, who lasted until a season-ending injury in game five. Up stepped walk-on redshirt freshman Connor Genal in game six. He also exited in game six with a season-ending injury, placing Lobo football in the hands of true freshman, walk-on quarterback Isaiah Chavez, who led UNM to a pair of comeback wins. Chavez was nicknamed QB5 for his original position on the depth chart, and he is now one of six scholarship quarterbacks.

Hopefully, with seven on the roster, UNM won't run into any issues, but the current crop of Lobo quarterbacks do not have a lot of experience in the Cherry and Silver. Transfer Terry Wilson has the most collegiate experience, but the former Kentucky Wildcat went 17-8 in the blue and white in Lexington, and has yet to take a snap at UNM. Tevaka Tuioti will stay in the quarterback room, but he will transition to a student-coaching position. He would have been the most experienced. Instead, that mantle goes to Hall, who in three seasons has played in seven games with four starts. Genal and Chavez each have two games played, and Hughes has made one career start, that the opener in 2019. Two incoming freshman signees round out the quarterback room in Bear Milacek and CJ Montes.

It's Been a While, and We Think They Know Where the Locker Room Is...

When UNM takes the field on September 2, it will have been 642 days since UNM last played a game at home, easily the longest stretch between home games for UNM, and technically the longest stretch between games in a home stadium since Tulane went 665 days without a game inside their home stadium due to Hurricane Katrina (although they did play home games, just not in their stadium).

When UNM last played a game inside University Stadium, the U.S. Space Force hadn't been established yet, Carol Spinney, the puppeteer and actor who played Big Bird on Sesame Street was still alive, as was famed character actor Danny Aiello.

He Already Has a Nickname ... It's Bobby

Bobby Cole was a one-man wrecking crew near the end of the 2020 season. The man who scored the first time he ever touched the ball in the FBS (scoring on a 37-yard run at Notre Dame) enters the 2021 season with back-to-back 100-yard rushing games. Against Wyoming, Cole rushed 22 times for 131 yards, but his biggest contribution was a 44-yard touchdown catch in the fourth quarter that gave UNM a 17-16 win. The next week he rushed 18 times for 138 yards, scoring three touchdowns.

Cole was the leading rusher on the team with 548 yards on the season. After him, the returning running back with the most yards last year is Chad Alexander, who rushed for 14 yards. Cole would need four more 100-yard games to tie the school record for consecutive 100-yard games, as Mike Williams had six in a row over the 1976 and 1977 seasons.

As for that nickname. Several media members in Albuquerque have suggested to Cole that he needs a nickname, and he always answers that he has one and that everyone uses it. Bobby is actually his nickname, as his given name is Joshua.

Honoring Santiago and Urlacher

When you don't have a home game in forever, you can think up a lot of cool things. That's exactly what Danny Gonzales did one day while looking out his office window at the five jersey numbers on the stadium facade, four of which were retired. That's past tense. In a nod to the traditions of the past, and a bridge between that past and the present, Gonzales talked with the owners (or in one case, family) of those retired numbers, and came up with a brilliant idea.

Two of those numbers are now officially "unretired", and those are 42, worn by Bobby Santiago, and 44, worn by Brian Urlacher. Santiago, someone Gonzales looked up to (and who still comes around to practices) was perhaps the greatest football player to come out of the metro area. So, each season, one metro area player will be selected to wear Santiago's 42. This year, Dion Hunter of Rio Rancho will switch from 41 to 42 and wear the Santiago jersey. Urlacher, the best football player to come out of UNM and a native of Lovington, was a ferocious defender who did it all. Each year, one defensive player will be selected that best exemplifies how Urlacher played on the field for the Lobos. This year, Reco Hannah will switch from 23 to 44 and wear the Urlacher jersey.

Just Trying to Be the "Man"nie!

Way back in 2007, the Lobos had a receiving tandem that lit up the Mountain West. Marcus Smith caught 86 passes that season in 13 games (6.6 receptions per game) and Travis Brown had 76 catches over those same 13 games (5.8 receptions per game). In the subsequent 13 seasons, those numbers haven't really been approached, but Mannie Logan-Greene sure got close, despite an abbreviated season.

Last year the UCF transfer showcased his total game, but while he could return kicks and punts and even rush the ball, his bread and butter was made through the air. The super senior, how often is seen after practice working with younger players on offense, mentoring them in either the game, or just in life, caught a team-best 30 passes last year in just seven games. He averaged 4.3 receptions per game, and over the last 13 seasons, that average is the third-best total among all Lobo receivers.

Had he played a complete 12 game season, his average would have worked out to 51 receptions, which would have been the most since Smith and Brown in 2007. Here are all the players who have averaged three catches a game since 2008.

Lobos in the NFL

Jason Sanders **Miami Dolphins** **Kicker**
 Sanders is in his fourth season with Miami after getting drafted in the seventh round by Miami. Over his first three seasons he was 100-for-102 on extra points in his career and 77-for-89 on field goals, with a long of 56. He has hit 168 of 232 kickoffs for touchbacks. He was named to the PFWA 2018 All-Rookie Team and is Miami's all-time leader in field goal accuracy. He has four game-winning field goals in the final two minutes and in overtime, and he also has a touchdown reception in his career. He led the NFL in field goals and points in 2020.

Corey Bojorquez **Los Angeles Rams** **Punter**
 Bojorquez is in his first season with Los Angeles after his first three with Buffalo. He spent the 2018 camp with New England after earning an invite to tryout camp and then getting signed to a free agent contract. He has played in 40 career games with a 45.0 career average. In 2020 Bojorquez led the NFL with a 50.0-yard average, just the fourth 50.0-yard average in NFL history.

D'Angelo Ross **New England Patriots** **Defensive Back**
 Ross is in his third season after signing a free agent contract with the New England Patriots. After two years on the practice squad, he was activated for New England's final game of the 2020 season, but didn't play.

#NeverForget (Because we know we won't...)

The story of the 2020 season wasn't UNM's record, quarterback injuries or anything else. It was about doing something that no college football team had ever been asked to do, and the team has been doing it while under the tutelage of an entirely new coaching staff in a world-wide epidemic. That might seem a bit dramatic, but honestly, what UNM did was unprecedented.

UNM lived at the Hilton Lake Las Vegas from November 2 through December 13, spending 43 days there in the same hotel where the Jersey Shore Reunion was held. Force to figure out things on the fly, UNM and head coach Danny Gonzales got pretty creative.

UNM brought free weights and had a make-shift weight room in a cordoned off ballroom, the team had its pregame meals (and its Thanksgiving meal) in an former casino at the hotel that had been turned into a dining hall (although UNM wasn't allowed to have the entire in there at the same time due to the local health ordinances, so the team ate in waves). The team performed walk-throughs in the fourth floor of the adjacent parking garage. There was also hydro-therapy with the training staff in the pool at times reserved for such things, and even head coach Danny Gonzales' TV Show was been taped in various parts of the hotel from his room to a hallway, where a visiting family and their dog made a cameo appearance in the background.

UNM's "meeting room" was the grand ballroom, that has three projectors in three of the different corners and sides of it. What there wasn't was a partition or divider, which made simultaneous meetings both interesting and loud. UNM didn't play all seven games last year on the road as they played four on the road and three neutral games, so all seven were played outside of its home state. When was the last time a team played at least a seven-game schedule with no home games and no games in its home state?

Never. It had never happened. No one had been asked to do it, probably because no teams in their right mind would have willingly said yes to that proposition. Now, when was the last time a team played at least a seven-game schedule with no home games? Well, the answers are nearly 100 years apart.

In 2005 due to Hurricane Katrina, the Tulane Green Wave couldn't play in New Orleans, and they had their six home games moved to, in order, Shreveport (Mississippi State), Baton Rouge (SE Louisiana), Lafayette (Houston), Ruston (UTEP), Mobile, Ala. (Marshall) and Monroe (Tulsa). Those all counted as home games for the Green Wave however and five of those were still home games in Louisiana, and they were at worst, neutral games although Tulane sold tickets and received ticket revenue. Also, technically Idaho played its entire 1999 season outside of its state, but the school at the time moved its home games eight miles away to Washington State's Martin Stadium, but that's where the school sold its season tickets and it was planned out in advance, so that one is just a technicality. Both of those teams at least practiced at home, went to school at home and just traveled for the game, most of those via bus.

The real answer is in Clemson in 1914. That year the Tigers went 5-3-1, playing nine true road games, although three were in the state of South Carolina (at Furman, at South Carolina and at The Citadel).

So it was 106 years ago that a team played an entire schedule of at least seven games all on the road, but no team to this point has ever played that large a schedule completely outside of its own state, as New Mexico did. Sadly, the hashtag #Roadbos didn't catch on, as it should have.

Learning to Reed

Jerrick Reed II picked off four passes in the 2020 season and that total led the Mountain West. Jerrick's four interceptions were tied for the eighth-most in the FBS in 2020, and it was the second-most of any player who played in just seven or fewer games (Michigan State's Shakur Brown had five). Reed's 0.57 interceptions per contest ranked fifth nationally as well.

It was stats like that made Reed Mountain West First Team All-Conference, becoming the first defender to earn such honors for UNM since the 2014 season, when Dakota Cox was named First Team All-MW at linebacker.

He Waited Long Enough ... He Sort of Earned It

Corey Hightower was signed to the New Mexico Lobos in the 2016 recruiting class. He redshirted in 2016, and then played as a reserve in 2017, getting into all 12 games. In 2018, he played in just four games, none as a start, and in 2019, he played in five games, again with no starts. For all three of those seasons, he was mostly used on special teams.

In 2020, he played in the first five games, mostly on special teams, without a start. And then December came, and Hightower was named a starter, after a five-year wait. UNM won. He started the next week in the finale, and UNM won again.

Hightower is one of 14 super seniors on the team, that are using their extra year granted from the 2020 COVID season, but of those 14, Hightower is the only one who has already earned four varsity letters, meaning Hightower will be the first Lobo Football player in 127 years to earn a fifth varsity letter. He certainly persevered for it. Hightower's also sporting a new number, 96. That number isn't typical of a defensive back, but he wore it in the Spring Game due to his regular No. 24 being unavailable. He liked it and will wear it in 2021.

Stapley is the Leader, Literally and Figuratively

If there is a leader on the Lobo squad, certainly Kyle Stapley qualifies. The older player on the team (and a newlywed to boot), Stapley is the only player who is a three-year starter on the squad, and he not only owns the most starts on the team, but the most consecutive as well.

Stapley has played in and started 31 straight games, and that is the most on the team. No other player has a consecutive starting streak

of longer than seven. The second-most starts on the squad is 17, by Donte Martin. Overall only five players enter 2021 with double-digit career starts. Along with Stapley and Martin, Jerrick Reed II has 13, Cade Briggs has 13 and Mannie Logan-Greene has 11.

Stapley, born on November 20, 1995, is the oldest player on the team at 25 years old. He would have been the oldest last year if not for 28-yard old Tyson Dyer, a former punter from Australia. He will play a game on his birthday for the second straight season.

The youngest player on the team is true freshman Ronald Wilson, who will not turn 18 until October 8, having been born in 2003.

Seven-Year Itch for Andrew Erickson?

It already feels like Andrew Erickson has been around at UNM forever, and he sort of has. The fourth-year man is entering just his sophomore season, but he is just in the middle of his career. How? Glad you asked.

The former walk-on redshirted but was eligible in 2018. In 2019, he was a redshirt freshman, but tore his ACL in fall camp. Since he was eligible as a redshirt in 2018, he automatically earned a medical redshirt for 2019, making him a double redshirt freshman in 2020. Now, follow along. This season (2021) is his double redshirt sophomore season, and 2022 would be his double redshirt junior season. In 2023, that would be his double redshirt senior season, but he also has a chance for UNM to pick up his COVID year option, meaning he could play again in 2024 as a double redshirt super senior. Amazingly, he would be just 24 years old that year, meaning in year seven, he'd be younger than Kyle Stapley is right now in his fourth year with the team.

Last season he had two receiving touchdowns, and he tied for the team lead in touchdown catches with those two, becoming the first Lobo freshman to do that since UNM's Deon Long led the team in 2011 with four touchdowns.

Jamie Christian, the Clock Is Still Ticking

In 2018, The University of New Mexico finally got a punt return touchdown, breaking the second-longest drought in the FBS. However, special teams coach Jamie Christian has a different streak to try and break, as UNM has not blocked a punt since over 12 years ago. The last blocked punt for UNM was on October 31, 2009 when Victor James did it against San Diego State.

That was so long ago Roy Disney, Brittany Murphy and Oral Roberts were all still alive, Windows 7 was nine days old, then Cowboys Stadium was about two months old and the New York Yankees took a 2-1 World Series lead with an 8-5 win over the Philadelphia Phillies.

UNM's opponents have attempted 545 punts since UNM's last blocked punt.

The Rocky Long Effect

In 2019, the defense that Rocky Long inherited was one of the worst defenses in the nation in causing turnovers, getting just 11 on the year with seven fumble recoveries and four interceptions. Those four picks were the third-lowest total in school history, behind the three passes intercepted in 1995 (on 282 attempts) and in 2011 (on 336 attempts). Last year opponents attempted 412 passes.

Overall, the 11 takeaways was the second-lowest total in school history behind the 10 garnered in 2013 (that season saw UNM get four interceptions and six fumble recoveries).

Under Rocky Long in his previous tenure as the head coach and defensive coordinator UNM had at least 11 interceptions in each of the final nine seasons under Long. The lowest total number of takeaways overall under long was 20, which happened twice, in his first season of 1998 and then again in 2005. The highest total takeaway number under Long during his 11 seasons was 29 in 2003. UNM's best interception total was 15, accomplished four times (2000, 2001, 2002 and 2005) and the best fumble recovery total was 16 in 2003.

Last year, despite a seven game season, UNM had 13 takeaways, improving the teams' turnover margin to +4.

Dear Mr. Warehime, Please Feel Free to Use the Same Office

Derek Warehime, whose offense exploded for 49 points in the 2020 season finale, is back again as offensive coordinator, and that ends a streak of rotating offensive coordinators at UNM as UNM will have the same "big three" (head coach, offensive coordinator and defensive coordinator) for the first time since 2016-17.

Get Your TV Info Here...

The University of New Mexico was selected for four national television broadcasts on FOX networks, including a season finale against Utah State that has been moved to Friday of Thanksgiving weekend. UNM's game with Texas A&M was also announced to kickoff at 11 a.m. Mountain Time, noon in College Station on Saturday, September 18 on the SEC Network.

UNM's four FOX games will all be Mountain West contests. It will start with UNM's Mountain West opener against Air Force on October 2 in Albuquerque. That game will be on either FOX, FS1 or FS2 with the network and time announced closer to broadcast.

UNM has two other games on either FOX, FS1 or FS2 without a definitive start time yet, both on the road. The first is UNM's anticipated trip to San Diego State, which is on October 9. UNM head coach Danny Gonzales spent seven seasons at San Diego State, and his defensive coordinator Rocky Long was San Diego State's head coach from 2011-2019. That game at San Diego State will actually be played in Carson, California.

UNM also has a road game on the FOX networks on November 20 at Boise State in Albertsons Stadium. Due to a quirk in the COVID-19 altered 2020 schedule, the Lobos didn't face off with their Mountain Division foe last year.

The season finale against Utah State has been switched from the Saturday of Thanksgiving weekend to the Friday morning after Thanksgiving, Nov. 26, at University Stadium. The game will kickoff at 11 a.m. in Albuquerque, and it will be broadcast on FS1.

The Mountain West also announced its 10-game Stadium slate on Monday which features five New Mexico football contests in the 2021 season. Three of the five matchups are home contests and two are away.

Highlighting the Stadium slate is the Saturday, Sept. 11 in-state rivalry game against the New Mexico State Aggies, set for 5 p.m. MT. The remaining four are Mountain West matchups including Saturday, Oct. 16 vs. Colorado State, Saturday, Oct. 23 at Wyoming, Saturday, Nov. 6 vs. UNLV and Saturday, Nov. 13 at Fresno State.

Campus Note of the Week - 2020 Economic Impact Study

A recently completed report analyzed the entire University of New Mexico system and quantified its impact on the New Mexico economy in academic year 2020. As one of New Mexico's major employers, UNM enhances workforce productivity, improves quality of life, stimulates innovation, and drives economic growth statewide. The entire UNM system includes Albuquerque Main Campus, Health Sciences Center, Sandoval Regional Medical Center in Rio Rancho, and the four branch campuses in Taos, Valencia County, Los Alamos, and Gallup.

Key report findings include the following:

*Roughly half of UNM's annual revenue (about \$1.6 billion) came from out-of-state resources. Revenue originating outside the state produces a direct economic impact.

*Fifty-eight (58) percent of UNM's revenue in 2020 came from clinical services provided by UNM Hospitals, Sandoval Regional Medical Center (SRMC) and UNM Medical Group.

*UNM's 2020 operational expenditures contributed \$3.2 billion in net economic output and clinical operations accounted for the single largest share of expenditures.

*Net spending by the school's 4,473 non-resident students totaled \$62.4 million in economic impact.

Danny Gonzales, a native of Albuquerque who played football at Valley High School before playing for UNM and then serving as an assistant coach, has come home.

Gonzales, who has taken part in bowl games in 14 of the past 16 seasons, enters his first season as the head coach of The University of New Mexico. Gonzales was hired on December 17, 2019. The announcement was made by Director of Athletics Eddie Nuñez at halftime of a Lobo men's basketball game, and then he was formally introduced at a press conference the next day at University Arena.

The new Lobo head coach is certainly familiar with UNM, as a player, staff member and as a Lobo assistant coach, as well as through his time coaching against UNM. He joined his mentor and former coach Rocky Long as Lobo football players returning to coach their alma mater. In a 2006 article in the Albuquerque Journal, Long predicted that Gonzales would one day be the head coach of the Lobos.

Gonzales came to UNM after spending the past two seasons at Arizona State as defensive coordinator, and the previous seven before that as safeties coach and defensive coordinator at San Diego State. In 2018, he was a nominee for the Broyles Award, given to the most outstanding assistant coach in college football.

Gonzales came to UNM as a walk-on safety and punter after playing for the Valley Vikings. Gonzales lettered three times with the Lobos and was the 1998 winner of the Chuck Cummings Memorial Award, which is given for morale and spirit, and was the Lobo Club First Team Award winner for unselfish devotion to the team. At UNM, Gonzales played under Dennis Franchione and the aforementioned Long. Gonzales was a part of UNM's 1997 WAC division championship team that went 9-4 and played in the 1997 Insight.com Bowl against Arizona.

After his playing career, he served as a graduate assistant for Long, helping UNM start a school-record seven consecutive bowl eligible seasons from 2001-07. In 2003, Gonzales moved over a few offices to become video coordinator, a role he held from 2003-05. From 2006-08, he coached safeties and special teams, and he was a part of the coaching staff for UNM's 2007 squad that went 9-4 and won the New Mexico Bowl 23-0 over the Colin Kaepernick-led Nevada Wolf Pack. That win ended a 46-year bowl victory drought for the university.

Under Gonzales' watch in 2007, former walk-on placekicker John Sullivan became UNM's third consensus All-America selection, hitting a school-record 29 field goals. Sullivan did that despite a torn ACL. Sullivan was just one of many specialists that excelled under the tutelage of Gonzales, a former punter and defensive back. In addition, placekicker Kenny Byrd was a first team All-MW pick, punter Jordan Scott was honorable mention, and kicker James Aho was named a Freshman All-America.

Future NFL draft picks Glover Quin (Houston Texans) and Quincy Black (Tampa Bay Buccaneers) also earned all-conference honors at safety under Gonzales.

Overall, Lobo safeties had 55 pass breakups over the 2007-08 seasons, and the 2007 New Mexico squad ranked 13th nationally in total defense, 14th in scoring defense and 20th in passing defense.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. — The season opener between The University of New Mexico and Colorado State, scheduled to be played at CSU's Canvas Stadium, was canceled due to the COVID numbers in Bernalillo County, where UNM's campus is located. The game was declared a no-contest by the Mountain West.

The game was not canceled due to any COVID-related concerns within UNM's program or Colorado State's program.

SAN JOSE, Calif. — New Mexico was down three starters in the defensive backfield and San José State was able to take advantage, scoring on four long passes as the Spartans were able to hold off the Lobos 38-21 and spoil the head coaching debut of Danny Gonzales. San José State scored the final 17 points of the game after UNM tied it at 21-11 in the third quarter.

While UNM allowed a few long scoring plays, the trademarks of a defense from years back was there. UNM laid plenty of hard hits, had a key first quarter fourth down stop and they allowed just 98 yards on the ground. The issue was Nick Starkel, who two schools ago was at Texas A&M when the Aggies defeated UNM in 2017. He was brilliant against UNM, going 34-for-47 for 467 yards and five touchdowns.

Down 21-14 at the break, UNM's defense held firm on the opening drive of the second half, and the Lobos were able to drive and tie the game. Bobby Cole had a long 19-yard gain on a third-and-1 at midfield to keep the drive alive, and it sure looked like Jordan Kress scored on a five-yard run extending the ball over the pylon. Amazingly in a game with nine replay reviews, that wasn't one of them, but it was no matter as Tuioti scored on the next play diving over from a half-yard out. Ironically that score stood after another lengthy review.

San José State answered and took the lead for good with a 35-yard field goal on the next drive, and both teams traded punts afterwards. However with just four seconds left in the quarter, SISU went for a home run and hit it when Bailey Gaither, who had 10 catches and 208 yards on the evening, got past everyone for a 69-yard backbreaking touchdown.

"I think after we tied it we took a bad penalty that gave them a free 15 yards and then they got that long touchdown right at the break, and that took the wind out of us a little bit, and we have to respond better," said Gonzales after the game. "We have to get tougher and meaner, but that will come."

SISU iced the game in the fourth quarter, converting on fourth-and-goal from the one with a rollout pass that accounted for the final score. UNM did drive inside the 25 in the final minute but Tuioti's pass to Erickson was incomplete on fourth down.

The Spartans led 21-14 at the break, but UNM never backed down. After a highlight-reel catch from Tre Walker for a late first quarter touchdown that was aided by a huge penalty on a punt that gave SISU a first down, UNM trailed 7-0 at the quarter.

After the Spartans made it 14-0, Tuioti and the Lobo offense came alive. UNM got on the board as Tuioti found an open Cedric Patterson III behind the defense for a 39-yard touchdown pass. That play capped a picture-perfect four-play, 84-yard drive, all through the air. Then after an amazing toe-tapping touchdown by Walker for his second touchdown, Tuioti led another drive. He found Andrew Erickson for a 46-yard catch inside the red zone, and then UNM ended up with fourth down at the Spartan four-yard line. Danny Gonzales opted to go for it, and Tuioti was able to scramble and find Erickson again, this time for a score to make it 21-14 at the half.

HONOLULU, Haw. --- New Mexico couldn't quite seal the deal, as Hawai'i used a 33-for-43, 410-yard, four touchdown performance by quarterback Chevan Cordeiro, highlighted by a few improbable and ridiculous catches to edge out New Mexico 39-33 at Aloha Stadium.

SAN JOSE, Calif. --- When New Mexico was down 27-20 with just 2:34 to go, head coach Danny Gonzales already knew that UNM was going for two and the win with a touchdown. UNM fell 24 yards short.

The loss extended UNM's losing streak to 11 dating back to last season, and it was UNM's 17th straight conference loss and 17th straight road loss. UNM is 0-2 on the season while Hawai'i is 2-1.

The Lobos gave everything undefeated Nevada could handle, and UNM drove to the Nevada 24 before failing on a fourth down try in the waning moments, allowing Nevada to escape with a 27-20 victory that continued UNM's trend of improved play and hard-hitting. Now, UNM just needs a result.

UNM bolted out of the gate on its opening drive, with Tevaka Tuioti leading the way completing all three of his passes, the last a 59-yard catch to Jordan Kress. Hawai'i answered going right down the field and it looked like it might be one of those late-night shootouts as Cordeiro run one in to tie the game at 7-7.

UNM led for a good part of the game, opening the game with strong defense that befuddled Mountain West Player of the Year candidate quarterback Carson Strong. The Nevada signal caller eventually threw for 336 yards on 24-of-38 passing, but he had issues throughout the night as UNM came at him with an odd 2-4-5 scheme.

The Lobos scored on each of its first four drives. Up 7-7, UNM drove 61 yards but stalled at the 9-yard line, and George Steinkamp, the Los Alamos native that was playing in his second-ever football game at any level, hit a 27-yard field goal, the first of four on the night.

It was UNM that opened the scoring after Joey Noble sacked Strong on a fourth-and-six play. UNM drove down the field with Trae Hall calling the shots, getting his second career start after an injury to regular starter Tekava Tuioti. Taking over at its own 43, Hall and Bobby Cole combined to rush the ball all the way to the Wolf Pack 16-yard line. It looked like UNM was running the ball again as Hall handed the ball off to Bryson Carroll, but Carroll stopped and threw back to Hall, who had a convoy of blockers and scored on the reception.

Jerrick Reed II picked off Cordeiro and UNM scored one play later on another Tuioti to Kress connection, this from 29 yards, and then Steinkamp hit from 49 yards in the second quarter and UNM led 20-7. However, the same bugaboo that hurt UNM last week reared its ugly head again as Hawai'i hit on a long touchdown pass to make it 20-14. Hawai'i nearly got scored right before the half but Reed got his second pick of the night and UNM led 20-14 at the break.

UNM then dipped into the bag of tricks again with an inside kick that Syaire Riley recovered and that led to George Steinkamp's 26-yard field goal in the second quarter, making it 10-0. Nevada got a field goal in response, and then Hall was picked off and Nevada threw a home run ball, Strong to Romeo Doubs from 33 yards out to tie the game. It was the first of three TDs for Doubs.

The Rainbow Warriors then hit back-to-back long TD passes of 42 and 40 yards to give themselves a 28-20 lead. UNM responded in kind with a 76-yard drive that was capped by a 26-yard run by true freshman Nathaniel Jones to make it 28-27, and that was the score at the break.

UNM took the lead just before the half when Steinkamp added a 48-yard field goal after Jerrick Reed II intercepted Strong for his third of the season. The pick was the first thrown by Strong in 299 passes, just missing the Mountain West record by seven passes.

UNM took the lead with a 24-yard field goal to make it 30-28, but Hawai'i got a 64-yard touchdown on a weaving catch and run by Calvin Turner, and then Jared Smart somehow leapt and made a ridiculous catch for a two-pointer and a 36-30 lead. After a field goal made it 39-30, Tuioti took over and drove UNM to midfield on a 23-yard scramble, but as he went down, he was hit on a helmet-to-helmet hit that knocked him out of the game.

Nevada took deep shots throughout much of the game, and after tying it at 13-13 on the first drive of the half, Doubs reeled in a 61-yard touchdown. Hall then led UNM right down the field, but a curious sequence eventually put the ball back in Nevada's hands. Needing 19 yards to convert a third down, Hall hit Emmanuel Logan-Greene for what looked to be a first down, but the ball somehow was spotted two yards short, and then a replay review moved the ball up, but still short. Hall then couldn't handle a high snap on fourth-and-one, and Nevada took over as that play ended the third.

Trae Hall entered and threw an interception, UNM's only turnover of the game. UNM got the ball back and Hall led UNM to a fourth Steinkamp field goal to make it 39-33, and then the Lobos had a chance at Donovan Murphree's onside kick, but Hawai'i came out with the ball and took knees to end the game.

Both teams exchanged punts, and UNM again had a golden opportunity as the Lobos forced a fumble by Doubs on a punt, but UNM couldn't reel the ball in and Nevada cashed in with a 59-yard pass and a 27-13 lead.

UNM picked up 499 yards of offense and Hawai'i had 503. Tuioti had 181 yards passing before his injury, and Nathaniel Jones and Bobby Cole were a durable 1-2 punch with 96 yards each on the ground.

UNM then marched quickly down the field, keyed by a 42-yard haul by Andrew Erickson, and Bobby Cole, who led UNM with 90 yards on the ground, barreled in from a yard out to make it 27-20 with 4:02 to go.

UNM forced a three and out and Logan-Greene returned the punt into Nevada territory and UNM was in position to go for the win. With 2:34 to go, Cole rushed for six and Logan-Greene did the same to give UNM the ball at the Nevada 31. Hall then play-faked and hit Jordan Kress near the 14-yard line but Kress dropped it, and then Hall threw incomplete to make it third and 10. Hall hit Erickson for seven yards to the 24 bringing up fourth down, and UNM looked to have a first down when Hall found Logan-Greene in the flat for what would have been a first down, but he also couldn't catch it cleanly, and UNM was out of downs and time.

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. --- Air Force scored on its first three drives of the game, opening up a 21-0 lead on the way to defeating New Mexico for the ninth straight time at Falcon Stadium, winning 28-0, dropping UNM to 0-4 on the season. The Lobos now head to a Thanksgiving night matchup at Utah State at 5 p.m. in Logan on FS1.

UNM got into Air Force territory nine times including seven straight and all six of the second half, but UNM couldn't capitalize on any of them. Meanwhile, UNM's defense struggled out of the gate, but picked it up after the first three drives forcing four fumbles, recovering three and getting a fourth down stop in the fourth quarter inside the five-yard line.

UNM opened with the ball and moved it well behind sophomore Trae Hall, making his second straight start in place of the injured Tevaka Tuioti. UNM's drive stalled and the Lobos punted, and Air Force went 86 yards in 11 plays, all on the ground to go up 7-0. Haaziq Daniels capped the drive with a 4-yard run.

It stayed at 7-0 after the first quarter, but Brad Roberts scored from five yards and 12 yards out to make it 21-0. UNM was able to drive into Air Force territory three times in the half, but came away empty all three times. First, UNM got a big first down run to the 34 by Bobby Cole, but it was wiped out by a penalty, and UNM ended up punting from the Air Force 43. Down 14-0, UNM drove to the Air Force 34, but Marcus Williams was stripped just as he went to the ground, and the Falcons recovered the football.

To end the half UNM got to the Falcon 33-yard line with two seconds left, but George Steinkamp's 50-yard field goal attempt was blocked by Michael Purcell. It was one of four missed field goals for UNM.

UNM's defense tried everything to keep UNM in the game and give it good field position. Nico Bolden twice forced fumbles that were recovered by Joey Noble and Patrick Peek, and Noble got one as well in the third quarter with Jerrick Reed II recovering, all in Air Force territory, but all led to missed field goals.

In the fourth with Air Force threatening inside the five-yard line, the Lobos stops Daniels on a fourth-and-1 play to get the ball back, and UNM drove into Air Force territory, but whether an ill-time penalty or sack, UNM couldn't ever get on track.

LOGAN, Utah --- UNM nearly had a comeback for the ages but Utah State thwarted UNM's comeback attempt with a late touchdown and the Aggies won 41-27 in a Thanksgiving night battle 41-27 at Maverik Stadium in Logan, Utah. The Lobos now return to Las Vegas to play its final two games of the season, starting next Saturday against Wyoming.

New Mexico was down 34-27 after back-to-back touchdowns wrapped around the third quarter break and had Utah State in 3rd-and-5 at the Aggie 38, but Andrew Peasley somehow wriggled out of a sack and then raced for a back-breaking 62-yard touchdown with 4:03 to go to make it 41-27.

Down 34-13, New Mexico got back in the game with a trick play as Bryson Carroll hit Andrew Erickson for a 28-yard touchdown on a halfback option. 6-play, 65-yard drive that saw Trae Hall rush for 16 but take a punishing hit. Hall had to leave the game, giving way to fourth-string quarterback and walk-on Connor Genal. Genal's first two drives only gained one first down, but his third was UNM's second long touchdown drive of the game. He completed his first two career passes to open the drive including a dime-dropped 24-yarder to Marcus Williams. Bryson Carroll had a big run for 37 ayrs and then Genal took a targeting hit that earned another first down.

UNM capped it off with Bobby Cole's second touchdown of the game and with 7:08 to go, UNM was just one score away from tying the game or winning. UNM then forced Utah State into a passing situation at third-and-five and brought a blitz, but Peasley wiggled out of a sack, went right around the edge for the score that put USU in the driver's seat. Forced to hurry, UNM drove to the Utah State 40 but Genal was intercepted at the 12-yard line with just over a minute left.

UNM had a 13-7 lead, scoring the only touchdown of the first half on a long 13-play, 89-yard drive in the second quarter. Trae Hall was masterful, rushing the ball, reading the defense and hitting targets in the passing game. Hall looked to have scored on a 12-yard run, but after getting ruled down at the 1-yard line, Bobby Cole bulled over to give UNM a 10-6 lead. UNM made it 13-6 at the end of the half with a Donovan Murphree 31-yard field goal, his second of the game.

That field goal came after Utah State looked to have gone ahead as Peasley dove to the pylon, but Brandon Shook hit his arm as he extended and Peasley fumbled the ball through the side of the end zone for a touchback. Hall then led a long drive that culminated in the field goal just before the half.

However, a huge third quarter saw the Aggies score four times, once on defense, and that spelled doom for UNM. Utah State tied it up on its first drive of the half on a 36-yard touchdown pass and then took the lead on a 26-yard pass. Disaster then struck on UNM's next two drives. Tyson Dyer had a punt blocked, and USU turned that into a touchdown, and then Hall was sacked and lost the ball, and Kina Maile, who blocked the earlier punt, scooped and scored to make it 34-13 Utah State.

Hall then led UNM down the field, with UNM scoring when Bryson Carroll took a handoff and then threw to Andrew Erickson for a 28-yard touchdown pass to cut the lead to 34-20 late in the third.
