Media At Practice

Practice is only open for media for the first 30 minutes, and it is closed to the public. Contact Frank Mercogliano for more information about the class schedules for players needed for interviews (some players are not available due to class after practice, but we will make all efforts to get everyone the interviews they need). We ask for media to get all player interviews on Tuesday and Wednesdays. For special longer-form type of interviews, just contact Frank Mercogliano and we can make whatever arrangements are needed. The bottom line is we want to help you get the coverage you need.

Danny Gonzales Interview Opportunities

Coach Gonzales is available several times during the week. He has a weekly radio interview with The Opening Drive on Monday during the season, and holds a press luncheon on Tuesday. He is also available after practice on Wednesday and Thursday as well. He can be available by appointment on Mondays, but that is prep day for the upcoming week of practice.

New Mexico Media Luncheon

In the fall, the New Mexico Media Luncheons are Tuesdays from noon to 1 p.m. tentatively. Coach Danny Gonzales is available at 12:30 p.m. and he will be followed at the podium by offensive coordinator Derek Warehime and defensive coordinator Rocky Long. Audio and video clips from the UNM communications office, and also at www.golobos.com. The press conferences are also streamed on GoLobos.com by LoboTV. Please note that the Mountain West no longer conducts a football coaches teleconference. The luncheon is on the U.S Bank club level of the Tow Diehm facility.

New Mexico Player Interview Opportunities

All player interviews must be arranged through the UNM athletics communications office. The main time for interviews is after practice. Wednesday is the last day for player interviews. For lengthier interviews, please call the communications office to arrange, which we are happy to do, working around class schedules. These will normally take place in the communications suite in the Maloof Center.

Postgame: The UNM locker room is closed. For home games that aren't running overly long, we will bring Coach Gonzales and two players into the Tow Diehm weight room (no elevators any more!!!!). This is where press conferences were held previously. After the press conferences, if media need other players that didn't address everyone (say for a sidebar story or something along those lines), we will have them available in the weight room but separate and not as a group interview.

For road games, we will have a regular media session that will be available via Zoom for everyone to follow, but we will allow media on site to ask questions first. We will record these and send them out afterwards.

Wireless in the Press Box

The press box at University Stadium is fully equipped for wireless connections. Access is free, but those wanting access need their own internal or external wireless cards. Phone lines are available. There won't be a lot of media there this season, so it should be a very strong signal.

On Game Day, the northeast box office at University Stadium opens four hours prior to kickoff, and the Lobo Ticket Office at University Arena opens three hours before game time. The northwest University Stadium box office opens 90 minutes before kickoff.

Lobo Talk & The Lobo Coaches Show

In the fall, host Robert Portnoy and coach Danny Gonzales discuss UNM football at Lobo Talk on Thursdays. The show airs from 7-8 p.m. from a site to be determined. Fans can call 866-350-4309 to ask coach Gonzales a question. Also in the fall, the Lobo Coaches Show will be produced by LoboTV, with distribution channels to be announced in.

Game Credentials

Regular UNM media will receive game credentials prior to the start of the season. Media members with season credentials will also serves as a parking pass for a return to the Baseball East lot, where we were prior to the 2019 season.

Visiting team media should request single-game credentials through their team's media relations office. Media passes work as parking passes for the Baseball lots.

Media members not associated directly with a team, along with scouts can log onto GoLobos.com and click the "credentials" tab to request game-specific credentials.

All media members who are picking up credentials on the day of the game will need to head to at the University Drive entrance to the Baseball South lot. The parking attendant will have all the credentials there. This should allow you to get your credential without having to wait in line or deal with parking on the north side of the stadium.

Parking

Media parking is located across and just south of the stadium off University Drive. Media members hopefully can park in the Baseball East lot which is located next to University Drive in the lot just beyond the right field fence of Santa Ana Star Field. You just show your credential to park.

Visiting Radio

The visiting radio booth is located on the fourth level of the main press box, next to the main media area. A reminder that we can all hear you when you get too exuberant. We can actually hear everything, and it is at times quite entertaining.

The Opening List

Terry Wilson wanted to come to New Mexico for the opportunity to throw the ball, and that made him a very smart guy. He has been afforded plenty of opportunities to throw the ball, and against New Mexico State he was fantastic, going 26-of-37 for 381 yards and three touchdowns, giving him six in the first two games. The 381 yards obliterated his previous career-high, which came in a 15-14 victory over Missouri. In that game Wilson went 22-for-31 for 267 yards, including a walk-off touchdown with no time left from 11 yards out.

Wilson's 381-yard day hadn't been seen in these parts in a while. Like a really long while. The last time anyone threw for as many of 380 yards in a game was on November 1, 2003 with Casey Kelly threw for 406 against UNLV. Before that it was 1994 when Stoney Case threw for 403, meaning Wilson's 381-yard day was the second best passing day for UNM in the last 27 years and only Jeremy Leach's 390 was more against New Mexico State. Wilson's 381 is now 13th on the single-season list, and the top 15 passing games in UNM history are the basis of a very fun Opening List:

A Streaky Battle?

Texas A&M was able to keep its long winning streak with a late fourth quarter score for a 10-7 win over Colorado on the road on Saturday. That win meant the Aggies have won 10 straight, and that is second in the country only to ... shocker ... Alabama. So Texas A&M enters the game with the second-best streak in the land, but remember when UNM had the nation's longest losing streak four games ago? Yeah, about that ... the Lobos have flipped that, and have won four straight, which is tied for the eighth-longest active winning streak in the country. That means that there are two games this week featuring both teams with top-10 active winning streaks ... Arizona State at BYU, and New Mexico at Texas A&M.

Second Half Beatdown

New Mexico's defense under Rocky Long really picked it up at the end of last season, and the 2021 season looks to be more of the same. The Lobo defense has been stout, allowing just 266 yards per game, which is good for third in the Mountain West and 22nd nationally.

Where UNM is excelling is in the second half. Overall in the second half of games, UNM is allowing just 5.0 points per game in the second half, and just 116.5 yards per game in the second half.

Opponents are averaging just 3.28 yards per play in the second half of games, opposed to 4.53 yards per play and 16.0 points per game in the first half.

Start Spreading The Football ... I'm Not Leaving Today

New Mexico has seven touchdowns in 2021. No single player has more than one, and of the seven, three are by seniors (Bobby Cole, Mannie Logan-Greene and Kyle Jarvis) and three are by freshmen (Connor Witthoft, Trace Bruckler and Keyonta Lanier).

Interestingly, only Cole and sophomore Andrew Erickson (who has the other touchdown) had ever scored before. All three freshmen obviously got their first FBS TDs, as did Jarvis and Logan-Greene.

All of that spreading out of touchdowns is why senior Andrew Shelley leads the team with 19 points on seven extra points and four field goals.

Wilson Earns MW Offensive Player of the Week

It took 13 years between Lobo quarterbacks winning Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week honors from Donovan Porterie 2008 to Isaiah Chavez, who won the award the final week of the 2021 season. It took just three weeks to get another one. Terry Wilson was named the Mountain West's Offensive Player of the Week after leading UNM to a 34-25 win over New Mexico State.

Wilson went 26-or-37 for three touchdowns with no interceptions and 381 yards, the 13th-best passing game in terms of yardage in Lobo history. Wilson threw touchdown passes of 15 yards, 22 yards and 58 yards, with the 22-yarder coming on fourth down. Wilson spread the ball to 11 different receivers and had helped UNM dominate time of possession in the game at 36:34.

He also was named one of eight to the Sugar Bowl's "Manning Stars of the Week" List for the weekend of 9/11.

Speaking of Turning Streaks on Their Collective Heads

Terry Wilson has back-to-back three touchdown games for New Mexico, and that means he has six already in 2021 in two games. Where does that total stand since the 2010 season? Unbelievably, Wilson's six touchdowns are tied for third-most among any Lobo quarterback in the last 12 seasons.

He Already Has a Nickname ... It's Bobby

Bobby Cole was a one-man wrecking crew near the end of the 2020 season. The man who scored the first time he ever touched the ball in the FBS (scoring on a 37-yard run at Notre Dame) rushed for 107 yards on 20 carries against New Mexico State, with 71 of those yards coming in the second half. It marked his third 100-yard game in the last four, after breaking 100 in back-to-back games to end 2021 (Wyoming and Fresno State).

As for that nickname. Several media members in Albuquerque have suggested to Cole that he needs a nickname, and he always answers that he has one and that everyone uses it. Bobby is actually his nickname, as his given name is Joshua.

Rocky Long Doesn't Like Substitutes Apparently

Against New Mexico State, the Lobos defense was on the field for 68 plays (72 if you count plays nullified by penalties. Amazingly, Rocky Long's defense used just five substitute. Seriously, only 16 players played a snap on defense, and five players (Tavian Combs, Jerrick Reed II, Joey Noble, Donte Martin and Corey Hightower) played every single snap.

Cody Moon, who recorded three tackles, one interception and a pass breakup, played the most plays among all of the substitutes with 40 total snaps.

He Waited Long Enough ... He Sort of Earned It

Corey Hightower was signed to the New Mexico Lobos in the 2016 recruiting class. He redshirted in 2016, and then played as a reserve in 2017, getting into all 12 games. In 2018, he played in just four games, none as a start, and in 2019, he played in five games, again with no starts. For all three of those seasons, he was mostly used on special teams.

In 2020, he played in the first five games, mostly on special teams, without a start. And then December came, and Hightower was named a starter, after a five-year wait. UNM won. He started the next week in the finale, and UNM won again. Hightower has started four games in his career, and it's the four games that coincide with UNM's four game winning streak. And in case you are thinking "yeah, but is he doing anything?" He is doing plenty ... it's the receivers in his area that aren't doing anything.

Against New Mexico State, NMSU quarterbacks went after him six times, and they went 2-for-6 for 17 yards. That's a 57.13 NCAA passer rating.

Hightower is one of 14 super seniors on the team, that are using their extra year granted from the 2020 COVID season, but of those 14, Hightower is the only one who has already earned four varsity letters, meaning Hightower will be the first Lobo Football player in 127 years to earn a fifth varsity letter. He certainly persevered for it. Hightower's also sporting a new number, 96. That number isn't typical of a defensive back, but he wore it in the Spring Game due to his regular No. 24 being unavailable. He liked it and will wear it in 2021. It also doesn't hurt that Danny Gonzales coached Frankie Solomon, a former defensive back who wore 96 and played with a hard-nosed style that Gonzales hopes for Hightower to emulate.

Honoring Santiago and Urlacher

When you don't have a home game in forever, you can think up a lot of cool things. That's exactly what Danny Gonzales did one day while looking out his office window at the five jersey numbers on the stadium facade, four of which were retired. That's past tense. In a nod to the traditions of the past, and a bridge between that past and the present, Gonzales talked with the owners (or in one case, family) of those retired numbers, and came up with a brilliant idea.

Two of those numbers are now officially "unretired", and those are 42, worn by Bobby Santiago, and 44, worn by Brian Urlacher. Santiago, someone Gonzales looked up to (and who still comes around to practices) was perhaps the greatest football player to come out of the metro area. So, each season, one metro area player will be selected to wear Santiago's 42. This year, Dion Hunter of Rio Rancho will switch from 41 to 42 and wear the Santiago jersey. Urlacher, the best football player to come out of UNM and a native of Lovington, was a ferocious defender who did it all. Each year, one defensive player will be selected that best exemplifies how Urlacher played on the field for the Lobos. This year, Reco Hannah will switch from 23 to 44 and wear the Urlacher jersey.



Ye Old Stadium Tour Continueth...

University Stadium, the home of the Lobos, was opened in 1960, and of the 130 FBS stadiums, it's pretty much right in the middle in terms of age. There are 65 stadiums newer, 62 older, and two others that also opened in 1960. This weeks' game continues a trend of UNM playing in historic stadiums that were built before FDR became President in 1933. Looking ahead to what UNM has scheduled out, the Lobos will have eight such contests into 2027, including three at Kyle Field, home of Texas A&M, which was originally built in 1910 and then redone in 1927.

Lobos in the NFL

Jason Sanders **Miami Dolphins** **Kicker**
 Sanders is in his fourth season with Miami after getting drafted in the seventh round by Miami. Over his first three seasons he was 100-for-102 on extra points in his career and 77-for-89 on field goals, with a long of 56. He has hit 168 of 232 kickoffs for touchbacks. He was named to the PFWA 2018 All-Rookie Team and is Miami's all-time leader in field goal accuracy. He has four game-winning field goals in the final two minutes and in overtime, and he also has a touchdown reception in his career. He led the NFL in field goals and points in 2020.

Corey Bojorquez **Green Bay Packers** **Punter**
 Bojorquez is in his first season with Green Bay after his first three with Buffalo. He spent the 2018 camp with New England after earning an invite to tryout camp and then getting signed to a free agent contract. He then signed a free agent contract with the L.A. Rams, but was traded to Green Bay right before the 2021 season. He has played in 40 career games with a 45.0 career average. In 2020 Bojorquez led the NFL with a 50.0-yard average, just the fourth 50.0-yard average in NFL history.

The Crowd Was Huge ... Not 1.5 Million Huge, but Huge

New Mexico's game with New Mexico State drew a crowd of 28,470, and that crowd was the largest for a sporting event in the state of New Mexico since September 9, 2017 when the Lobos drew 32,427 fans in what turned out to be a 30-28 loss to NMSU. The 2019 version of the Rio Grande Rivalry (also the last time it was played) drew 27,269 fans for a 55-52 win over the Aggies.

#NeverForget (Because we know we won't...)

The story of the 2020 season wasn't UNM's record, quarterback injuries or anything else. It was about doing something that no college football team had ever been asked to do, and the team has been doing it while under the tutelage of an entirely new coaching staff in a world-wide epidemic. That might seem a bit dramatic, but honestly, what UNM did was unprecedented.

UNM lived at the Hilton Lake Las Vegas from November 2 through December 13, spending 43 days there in the same hotel where the Jersey Shore Reunion was held. Force to figure out things on the fly, UNM and head coach Danny Gonzales got pretty creative.

UNM brought free weights and had a make-shift weight room in a cordoned off ballroom, the team had its pregame meals (and its Thanksgiving meal) in an former casino at the hotel that had been turned into a dining hall (although UNM wasn't allowed to have the entire in there at the same time due to the local health ordinances, so the team ate in waves). The team performed walk-throughs in the fourth floor of the adjacent parking garage. There was also hydro-therapy with the training staff in the pool at times reserved for such things, and even head coach Danny Gonzales' TV Show was been taped in various parts of the hotel from his room to a hallway, where a visiting family and their dog made a cameo appearance in the background.

UNM's "meeting room" was the grand ballroom, that has three projectors in three of the different corners and sides of it. What there wasn't was a partition or divider, which made simultaneous meetings both interesting and loud. UNM didn't play all seven games last year on the road as they played four on the road and three neutral games, so all seven were played outside of its home state. When was the last time a team played at least a seven-game schedule with no home games and no games in its home state?

Never. It had never happened. No one had been asked to do it, probably because no teams in their right mind would have willingly said yes to that proposition. Now, when was the last time a team played at least a seven-game schedule with no home games? Well, the answers are nearly 100 years apart.

In 2005 due to Hurricane Katrina, the Tulane Green Wave couldn't play in New Orleans, and they had their six home games moved to, in order, Shreveport (Mississippi State), Baton Rouge (SE Louisiana), Lafayette (Houston), Ruston (UTEP), Mobile, Ala. (Marshall) and Monroe (Tulsa). Those all counted as home games for the Green Wave however and five of those were still home games in Louisiana, and they were at worst, neutral games although Tulane sold tickets and received ticket revenue. Also, technically Idaho played its entire 1999 season outside of its state, but the school at the time moved its home games eight miles away to Washington State's Martin Stadium, but that's where the school sold its season tickets and it was planned out in advance, so that one is just a technicality. Both of those teams at least practiced at home, went to school at home and just traveled for the game, most of those via bus.

The real answer is in Clemson in 1914. That year the Tigers went 5-3-1, playing nine true road games, although three were in the state of South Carolina (at Furman, at South Carolina and at The Citadel).

So it was 106 years ago that a team played an entire schedule of at least seven games all on the road, but no team to this point has ever played that large a schedule completely outside of its own state, as New Mexico did. Sadly, the hashtag #Roadbos didn't catch on, as it should have.

Stapley is the Leader, Literally and Figuratively

If there is a leader on the Lobo squad, certainly Kyle Stapley qualifies. The oldest player on the team (and a newlywed to boot), Stapley is the only player who is a three-year starter on the squad, and he not only owns the most starts on the team, but the most consecutive as well.

Stapley has played in and started 33 straight games, and that is the most on the team. No other player has a consecutive starting streak of longer than nine (and that is just four players, three of which are his linemates). The second-most starts on the squad is 19, by Donte Martin. Overall only five players entered 2021 with double-digit career starts. Along with Stapley and Martin, Jerrick Reed II had 13 (now 15), Cade Briggs had 13 (now 15) and Mannie Logan-Greene had 11.

Stapley, born on November 20, 1995, is the oldest player on the team at 25 years old. He would have been the oldest last year if not for 28-year old Tyson Dyer, a former punter from Australia. He will play a game on his birthday for the second straight season.

The youngest player on the team is true freshman Ronald Wilson, who will not turn 18 until October 8, having been born in 2003.

Seven-Year Itch for Andrew Erickson?

It already feels like Andrew Erickson has been around at UNM forever, and he sort of has. The fourth-year man is entering just his sophomore season, but he is just in the middle of his career. How? Glad you asked.

The former walk-on redshirted but was eligible in 2018. In 2019, he was a redshirt freshman, but tore his ACL in fall camp. Since he was eligible as a redshirt in 2018, he automatically earned a medical redshirt for 2019, making him a double redshirt freshman in 2020. Now, follow along. This season (2021) is his double redshirt sophomore season, and 2022 would be his double redshirt junior season. In 2023, that would be his double redshirt senior season, but he also has a chance for UNM to pick up his COVID year option, meaning he could play again in 2024 as a double redshirt super senior. Amazingly, he would be just 24 years old that year, meaning in year seven, he'd be younger than Kyle Stapley is right now in his fourth year with the team.

Last season he had two receiving touchdowns, and he tied for the team lead in touchdown catches with those two, becoming the first Lobo freshman to do that since UNM's Deon Long led the team in 2011 with four touchdowns. After a quiet opener, Erickson went for 75 yards on five receptions, including his first touchdown of the season, coming on fourth down on a 17-yard pass from Terry Wilson.

Jamie Christian, the Clock Is Still Ticking

In 2018, The University of New Mexico finally got a punt return touchdown, breaking the second-longest drought in the FBS. However, special teams coach Jamie Christian has a different streak to try and break, as UNM has not blocked a punt since over 12 years ago. The last blocked punt for UNM was on October 31, 2009 when Victor James did it against San Diego State.

That was so long ago Roy Disney, Brittany Murphy and Oral Roberts were all still alive, Windows 7 was nine days old, then Cowboys Stadium was about two months old and the New York Yankees took a 2-1 World Series lead with an 8-5 win over the Philadelphia Phillies.

UNM's opponents have attempted 561 punts since UNM's last blocked punt.

The Rocky Long Effect

In 2019, the defense that Rocky Long inherited was one of the worst defenses in the nation in causing turnovers, getting just 11 on the year with seven fumble recoveries and four interceptions. Those four picks were the third-lowest total in school history, behind the three passes intercepted in 1995 (on 282 attempts) and in 2011 (on 336 attempts). Last year opponents attempted 412 passes.

Overall, the 11 takeaways was the second-lowest total in school history behind the 10 garnered in 2013 (that season saw UNM get four interceptions and six fumble recoveries).

Under Rocky Long in his previous tenure as the head coach and defensive coordinator UNM had at least 11 interceptions in each of the final nine seasons under Long. The lowest total number of takeaways overall under long was 20, which happened twice, in his first season of 1998 and then again in 2005. The highest total takeaway number under Long during his 11 seasons was 29 in 2003. UNM's best interception total was 15, accomplished four times (2000, 2001, 2002 and 2005) and the best fumble recovery total was 16 in 2003.

Last year, despite a seven game season, UNM had 13 takeaways, improving the teams' turnover margin to +4. UNM already has five on the 2021 season, and the Lobo have had a takeaway in eight straight games, and at least three in four of the last eight.

But Can He Actually Keep the Stats?

Mannie Logan-Greene is doing a little bit of everything. OK that's a lie, he's doing a lot of everything. His 254 yards of all-purpose yardage nearly got him on the top-10 list for a single game at UNM, but he is currently in the top 5 nationally in all-purpose yardage, with an average of 197.5 yards per game. Here is that list:

Ranking Stuff

OK, it's been a while since New Mexico has defeated a ranked team, but that's the task at hand this week taking on Texas A&M, which is No. 7 in the AP poll, and No. 5 in the USA Today Coaches Poll. UNM all-time is 6-56 against ranked opponents, including 2-30 on the road. UNM's last win over a ranked team was actually on the road, a 47-35 win at No. 25 Utah in 2003. It's been 27 years since UNM beat a top-10 team, which also happened to be Utah. That was a 23-21 win on November 5, 1994. Utah was No. 8 going into the game, and that remains UNM's only top-10 win. The Lobos are 1-18 against Top-10 teams and 0-5 against Top-5 teams. UNM's last meeting with a top-5 team was against Wisconsin on September 8, 2018, a 45-14 loss that was 10-7 Wisconsin at the half.

Logan-Greene was too Young to Help From 2009-2015

Mannie Logan-Greene has returned two punts this year, and he is averaging 42.5 yards per return on those two punts. That's pretty good. Here's how good that is. Logan-Greene has 85 punt return yards this season. Over the past 12 seasons, those 85 yards are more than what UNM accrued as an entire team in eight of those years. Only from 2016-19 did UNM have more punt return yards than 85, and one of those seasons was just 117 yards. Last year UNM totaled 32 yards over the seven-game season.

Julian Wells Death was Sad ... Prove Us Wrong

In the 1987 drama *Less Than Zero*, Robert Downey, Jr.'s character of Julian Wells is a drug addicted, rich L.A. college kid who is best friends with Andrew McCarthy and Jami Gertz. Wells' death in the passenger seat of a long car ride was a bit of a shock in 1987

(and there is no spoiler alert here for a 34-year old movie), but honestly no more so than realizing that same actor would eventually become Iron Man and have a world-wide aggregate box office of \$2.4 billion in the 29 movies he has had a leading role (courtesy thenumbers.com).

What shouldn't be shocking anymore is this: The Lobos are pretty good against the run. UNM has allowed less than 100 yards rushing five times in the nine games with Danny Gonzales as head coach and Rocky Long as defensive coordinator, and New Mexico State BARELY got over that mark with 109. However, it's what UNM did in the opener that opened some eyes as the Lobos allowed less than zero yards, letting Houston Baptist rushed for -6 yards. It's the best defensive effort against the rush by any FBS team this season. Below are the nation's 10 best defensive efforts against the rush:

Campus Note of the Week - 2022 Best Colleges Rankings released by 'US News & World Report' highlight UNM's continued success

The University of New Mexico was ranked No. 196 in the Best National Universities in the 2022 U.S. News & World Report Best Colleges Rankings released today. The ranking includes more than 390 surveyed institutions and marks the second year in a row UNM was ranked among the top-200 in the nation.

In addition, in a new category this year, Top Nursing Schools for undergraduates, UNM was ranked No. 43 out of nearly 700 nursing schools surveyed placing it among the top six percent of all bachelor of science in nursing programs in the nation. To be ranked, an institution's nursing school or department offering a BSN degree must have met criteria including accreditation at the bachelor's level by either the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education or the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing, and a regionally accredited institution that awarded at least 35 BSN degrees according to 2018 the IPEDS Data Center.

The first-ever Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) rankings are based solely on the judgments of deans and senior faculty members of nursing schools and departments at institutions around the country who were asked to rate the academic quality of peer institutions' BSN programs using a five-point scale with five being the highest. Average peer assessment scores for each nursing program were then determined by computing a trimmed mean (eliminating the two highest and two lowest scores). UNM had a peer assessment score of 3.8 to earn its ranking.

Overall, UNM had six additional programs/schools ranked among the top in the nation. UNM was listed No. 96 for undergraduate engineering and is the only engineering program in New Mexico to rank in the top 100. More than 200 doctoral-granting programs across the nation were ranked. The U.S. News rankings of undergraduate engineering programs are based on the opinions of deans and senior faculty at peer institutions from a survey distributed in spring 2021.

Danny Gonzales, a native of Albuquerque who played football at Valley High School before playing for UNM and then serving as an assistant coach, has come home.

Gonzales, who has taken part in bowl games in 14 of the past 16 seasons, enters his first season as the head coach of The University of New Mexico. Gonzales was hired on December 17, 2019. The announcement was made by Director of Athletics Eddie Nuñez at halftime of a Lobo men's basketball game, and then he was formally introduced at a press conference the next day at University Arena.

The new Lobo head coach is certainly familiar with UNM, as a player, staff member and as a Lobo assistant coach, as well as through his time coaching against UNM. He joined his mentor and former coach Rocky Long as Lobo football players returning to coach their alma mater. In a 2006 article in the Albuquerque Journal, Long predicted that Gonzales would one day be the head coach of the Lobos.

Gonzales came to UNM after spending the past two seasons at Arizona State as defensive coordinator, and the previous seven before that as safeties coach and defensive coordinator at San Diego State. In 2018, he was a nominee for the Broyles Award, given to the most outstanding assistant coach in college football.

Gonzales came to UNM as a walk-on safety and punter after playing for the Valley Vikings. Gonzales lettered three times with the Lobos and was the 1998 winner of the Chuck Cummings Memorial Award, which is given for morale and spirit, and was the Lobo Club First Team Award winner for unselfish devotion to the team. At UNM, Gonzales played under Dennis Franchione and the aforementioned Long. Gonzales was a part of UNM's 1997 WAC division championship team that went 9-4 and played in the 1997 Insight.com Bowl against Arizona.

After his playing career, he served as a graduate assistant for Long, helping UNM start a school-record seven consecutive bowl eligible seasons from 2001-07. In 2003, Gonzales moved over a few offices to become video coordinator, a role he held from 2003-05. From 2006-08, he coached safeties and special teams, and he was a part of the coaching staff for UNM's 2007 squad that went 9-4 and won the New Mexico Bowl 23-0 over the Colin Kaepernick-led Nevada Wolf Pack. That win ended a 46-year bowl victory drought for the university.

Under Gonzales' watch in 2007, former walk-on placekicker John Sullivan became UNM's third consensus All-America selection, hitting a school-record 29 field goals. Sullivan did that despite a torn ACL. Sullivan was just one of many specialists that excelled under the tutelage of Gonzales, a former punter and defensive back. In addition, placekicker Kenny Byrd was a first team All-MW pick, punter Jordan Scott was honorable mention, and kicker James Aho was named a Freshman All-America.

Future NFL draft picks Glover Quin (Houston Texans) and Quincy Black (Tampa Bay Buccaneers) also earned all-conference honors at safety under Gonzales.

Overall, Lobo safeties had 55 pass breakups over the 2007-08 seasons, and the 2007 New Mexico squad ranked 13th nationally in total defense, 14th in scoring defense and 20th in passing defense.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. — New Mexico jumped out to a 14-0 lead after two drives and then held steady and UNM's defense held high-flying Houston Baptist to just 187 total yards, winning 27-17 in the 2021 season opener, UNM's first home game in 642 days. The win pushed UNM's winning streak to three straight, the longest for the program in four years.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. — Terry Wilson threw for 381 yards and three more touchdowns for the Lobos as UNM improved to 2-0 for the first time since the 2005 season with a 34-25 victory over rival New Mexico State in front of 28,470 fans. Wilson went 26-of-37 for the game and it easily topped his previous career best of 267 yards set in 2018.

Terry Wilson was solid in his Lobo debut, going 20-for-26 passing for 174 yards and three touchdowns. He opened the game after UNM ended HBU's opening drive with a Ray Leutele interception. Wilson, who actually caught a pass on the opening play, hit a wide open Kyle Jarvis from 11 yards out for a quick touchdown just 2:10 into the game.

UNM also won its fourth straight game dating back to last season.

After a three-and-out pitched by the Lobo defense, Wilson went to work again, this time driving UNM 74 yards in nine plays. He opened with completions to Mannie Logan-Greene and Andrew Erickson. He found his favorite target Luke Wysong three different times, for 15, 11 and 22 yards, the last of which put UNM on the 4-yard line. Wilson then hit freshman tight end Trace Bruckler for a bruising four-yard score to make it 14-0.

New Mexico never trailed in the game, but the Lobos could never quite put the Aggies away until the fourth quarter when Mannie Logan-Greene hauled in a 58-yard touchdown pass with 12:01 to go to give UNM what amounted to the final margin of 34-25. UNM had several opportunities to score and misfired, which allowed NMSU to stay in the game. The Lobos missed two long field goals, and got stopped three times in inside Aggie territory on downs including twice inside the 10-yard line. UNM also couldn't capitalize on a 53-yard punt return by Logan-Greene that gave UNM first-and-goal at the 8-yard line, getting only a field goal.

UNM's defense was stout, and didn't give much of anything to Houston Baptist. Overall, the Huskies gained just 187 yards overall, and -9 on the ground. The Huskies used two brilliant special teams plays to get back in the game. First punter Brady Buell hammered a 59-yard punt that went out of bounds at the 1-yard line. UNM couldn't move the ball for a first down, and Aaron Rodriguez' punt was returned by Tyrone Thompson 44 yards for a touchdown, making it 14-7.

However, UNM was able to keep the Aggies at bay for most of the game, forcing two more turnovers on interceptions by Jerick Reed II and Cody Moon. Offensively, UNM had its best day under Derek Warehime with 559 yards of offense led by Wilson's 381 passing yards. That total was the 13th best passing day in school history and was the most by a Lobo quarterback since 2003.

A field goal moved it to 14-10, but Wilson and the Lobo offense struck quickly. Bobby Cole rushed three straight times to move UNM into Husky territory after a 41-yard kickoff return by Logan-Greene. Wilson then faked a handoff and launched a perfect bomb into the waiting hands of true freshman Keyonta Lanier for a 47-yard score, and a 21-10 lead that held at halftime.

Bobby Cole helped UNM establish the run game with 107 yards rushing on 20 carries including his first touchdown of the season. That touchdown came on the opening drive that took just three plays and went 64 yards. That drive started with a 51-yard bomb from Wilson to Zarak Scruggs, Jr. that set up UNM in the red zone.

In the second half, UNM's offense bogged down a bit, gaining just 104 yards in the half after 208 in the opening half. However, UNM's defense was terrific. Overall the Lobos recorded five sacks, three takeaways, 10 tackles for a loss and six pass breakups. UNM extended the lead to 24-10 after three as Andrew Shelley hit a 30-yard field goal. Houston Baptist got back within seven with another short drive set up by a good punt return. HBU went 40 yards in seven plays, scoring on a 6-yard pass from Blaise Bentsen to Charles King with 4:03 left.

After a field goal cut it to 7-3, UNM got on the board against when freshman Connor Witthoft scored his first career touchdown from 15 yards out, making 14-3.

HBU then held UNM without a first down and got the ball back with 3:03 to go at its own 39-yard line, but on their first play, a pitch to Xavier Ford went through his hands, and Devin Sanders recovered at the HBU 27. UNM couldn't get a first down, but Shelley put the game basically out of reach with a 37-yard field goal.

State got a second Ethan Albertson field goal and then scored on a trick play when wide receiver Isaiah Garcia-Castaneda threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Thomas Whitford to make it 14-13.

Houston Baptist had one more chance, but Combs completed his stellar evening with an interception at the UNM 20-yard line on third-and-10.

After a punt, Cody Moon picked off a pass at the Aggie 48 while lying on his back, giving UNM the ball and Wilson was able to convert a fourth down pass to Andrew Erickson in the end zone for a touchdown to make it 21-13, but one play later Garcia-Castaneda got loose on a slant and raced for a 75-yard score to cut it 21-20, but Andrew Shelley's 45-yard field goal right before half made it 24-20.

UNM, which played in front of 15,908 in its first home game since 2019, now have a couple of extra days before heading into rivalry week against New Mexico State.

A safety call to open the second half gave New Mexico State two points. Wilson was flushed from the pocket while in the end zone, but his pass didn't get past the line of scrimmage. However, UNM's defense was stout, allowing just a field goal in the second half.
