RACING TO THE FINISH LINE

The Lobos are set to host the Mountain West Cross Country Championships on Oct. 29 at the UNM North Golf Course.


The championship meet was originally scheduled to be hosted by San Jose State but due to logistical reasons, the Spartans were unable to. Other conference teams put in bids to host the meet and New Mexico won the bid.

Now, the Lobos hope to use the home course advantage to cross the finish line first. Although the New Mexico XC teams don't actually practice on the course, the advantage of being at home will surely help their results.

The Lobos' women's team was ranked No. 1 in the nation by the USTFCCCA on Oct. 19. This marks the first time the Lobos have been ranked first nationally since Oct. 30, 2018. The team received six first-place votes and 324 points total to take the top spot.

In the Lobos last meet at the Nuttycombe Wisconsin Invitational on Oct. 15, the women's team placed first and outran then-ranked No. 1 NC State and then-ranked No. 2 BYU. New Mexico's top runner, Stefanie Parsons placed 12th in the race with a time of 20:21.9 to lead the Lobos to first.

In the Mountain West's Pre-Championships Coaches Poll, the women's team ranked first with 10 out of the 11 first-place votes and 100 points total. The men's team ranked sixth with 27 total points.

Lobos on top

The women's team dominates the competition at every meet they attend. The team ranks first in the nation in the USTFCCCA Coaches Poll and first in the conference prechampionships poll.

MAKING HER MARK

DII transfer Stefanie Parsons is showing why she belongs at this level. She has been the top Lobo runner at every one of New Mexico's meets. She placed 12th in the Nuttycombe Invitational, fourth in the Notre Dame Invitational and 1st at the NMSU Invitational. She also earned MW Athlete of the Week on Oct. 5 after her performance at Notre Dame.

GREAT DEPTH

The Lobo women have a roster of 31 and it has proven to be key to their success. New Mexico has been able to run its student-athletes in championship races and "B" races alike throughout the season. In the championships, the Lobos have 10 potential runners: Adva Cohen, Samree Dishon, Abbe Goldstein, Emma Heckel, Gracelyn Larkin, Amelia Mazza-Downie, Stefanie Parsons, Elise Thorner, Andrea Modin Engesaeth and Aliandrea Upshaw. That's saying a lot about the amount of talent on the team to have so many potentials that the coaches know they can rely on to get the results.

TRANSFER POWER

The Lobos have found great talent through way of transfers this season. Adva Cohen, who has been with the team since the 2018-19 season, but started her collegiate

career at Iowa Central Community College. She has proven herself to be a great leader for the Lobos and one of the consistent top runners.

Abbe Goldstein is a transfer from Harvard and has established herself as one of New Mexico's top-five in every race. Emma Heckel has also earned her way into the lineup and finished in the top-five of New Mexico runners consistently. Stefanie Parsons has been the Lobos' top runner in every single race she faces, proving that she can make the jump from DII and be successful.

ALL-AMERICAN RETURNERS

The Lobos have three returners who were All-Americans last season. Abdirizak Ibrahim, Adva Cohen and Gracelyn Larkin all earned that honor in the 2020 season (which was conducted in the spring of 2021, due to COVID-19). They return and make a huge impact on the teams, both as leaders of the squads and talented on the course.

WOMEN LOOKING FOR THE 14TH STRAIGHT

Since Joe Franklin took the reins as head coach in 2007, the women's team has been wildly successful. The women have won 13 straight conference titles, beginning in the 2008 season. With this strong history, the Lobos have high hopes for this season's championship meet. Franklin has also led the team to two NCAA Championships in the 2015 and 2017 seasons.

The men also had a stint of six straight conference titles from the 2009-14 seasons. The men have earned five individual champions in the history of the program, as well.



THE LOBOS' LAST MEET

MADISON, Wis. – Lobo cross country showcased their very best in its final meet before the Mountain West Championships in two weeks. The No. 3 nationally ranked women's team finished first in the A race, beating the No. 1 NC State Wolfpack and No. 2 BYU Cougars.

The Lobos ran eight student-athletes in the premier women's championship 6K race, and their depth proved to be key to them winning the race. The team ended with 93 points, which was nine points better than the No. 1 ranked NC State who placed second in the race and 59 points better than No. 2 ranked BYU who finished third in the race. This marks the third time the women have won the race since the 2011 season. The last time they placed first was at the 2017 meet on Oct. 13.

DII transfer Stefanie Parsons continues to prove why she belongs in the lineup. The newcomer led the way in the race, placing 12th with a time of 20:21.9. Gracelyn Larkin and Emma Heckel followed closely behind as they placed 15th and 16th, respectively, and ran times of 20:23.0 and 20:24.4.

Abigail Goldstein ran a time of 20:37.0 to place 24th and Samrawit Dishon placed 26th with a time of 20:39.9. Adva Cohen then followed in 32nd place with a time of 20:43.2. Andrea Modin Engesaeth rounded out the top 50 individuals with a time of 20:51.9 to place 47th. Amelia Mazza-Downie rounded out the Lobos in the championship race as she placed 70th and ran a time of 21:07.4.

The women also had a great "B" race, placing first with 24 points and running seven student-athletes. Elise Thorner led the way for the Lobos, as she placed first individually with a time of 20:57.8. Ali Upshaw followed in third place with a time of 21:02.1. Hannah Miller ran a time of 21:20.9 to finish sixth. Semira Mebrahtu Firezghi next came in 12th place with a 21:32.8 running time. Juanita Johnson ran a time of 21:36.3 for 16th place. Lauren Bettencourt placed 53rd with a time of 22:39.0. Celeste Martinez rounded the Lobos in the "B" race as she placed 63rd with a time of 22:59.1. Samantha Valentine also ran unattached and placed 57th with a time of 22:44.8.

In the men's "B" race, New Mexico ran five student-athletes for 146 points and fifth place out of eight teams. Iolo Hughes led the team with a 31st place finish and a time of 25:21.9. Nehemiah Cionelo came in 53rd with a time of 25:46.3 and Reece Donihi trailed him by just .4 seconds as he ran 25:46.7 and placed 54th. Matthew Larkin finished in 75th place with a time of 26:19.4. Awet Yohannes rounded out the Lobos in 89th place with a time of 27:42.1.

JOE FRANKLIN enters his 14th year as the head track and field/cross country coach at The University of New Mexico. Franklin took over the program on June 18, 2007 after 13 years in the same role at Butler University. He replaced Matt Henry who retired after seven years at New Mexico. Franklin is the seventh men's and fifth women's head track and field coach at UNM.

At the time of his hiring Franklin said, "I'm excited and thrilled. This is a very unique opportunity, especially when you look at the great tradition and history that New Mexico has had in cross country and track and field. I think the University of New Mexico and city of Albuquerque are tremendous settings for competition and training and places that provide unique opportunities for student-athletes."

Franklin said he has lofty expectations for the future of the UNM track and cross country programs. "The goals for the program are always to see where we can max out in every event," he said. "Let's see how high we can go. Let's see if we can get to be a top-10 team in cross country. Let's see if we can get to be a top-25 team in track and field. We want to have athletes in the sprints, throws, jumps, vaults and distance events qualifying for the NCAAs consistently and then see if we can build on that and start moving up in the team standings."

Since that time Franklin has wasted little time making his mark at New Mexico and achieved many of the goals he laid out in his hiring, which culminated with UNM's most successful season for the women in 2018-19. In 2008 the United States Track & Field and Cross Country Association created a "Program of the Year" award to honor those teams who succeeded in all three sports — cross country, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field — on a yearly basis at the NCAA Championships. Since the awards inception New Mexico has made the list six times on the men's side and five times on the women's side.

Franklin has also assembled a considerable collection of championship hardware while leading UNM. Since the start of the 2009-10 school year, the Franklin-led Lobos have claimed the most conference titles of any Mountain West member, with 23 total (11 women's cross-country; six men's cross-country; three men's indoor track & field; one men's outdoor track & field; two women's

indoor track & field). Franklin delivered two national





championships in cross country, the first individual national championship in cross country in Ednah Kurgat and eight individual track and field champions.
