Wyoming Home Success Since 2016 has Resulted in 23-8 Home Record:

The Wyoming Cowboys have been very successful at home over the last six seasons. Since 2016, Wyoming has won 23 of its last 31 home games for a winning percentage of 74.2 percent.

The Pokes have **also won 11 of their last 13 home games**, dating back to the last two home games of the 2018 season thru the 2021 season.

Wyoming's 23 home wins during this stretch began with the first game of the 2016 season when they won a triple overtime thriller over Northern Illinois by a score of 40-34.

The Cowboys went on to post a perfect 6-0 regular season in 2016 before hosting the Mountain West Conference Championship Game, which they lost 24-27 to San Diego State to finish 6-1 at home.

UW also posted a perfect 6-0 regular season home record in 2019.

Bouncing Back After a Home Loss:

Coming off last week's home loss to Fresno State, the Wyoming Cowboys are looking to continue a tradition of bouncing back at home following a home loss.

Since 2016, Wyoming has suffered only eight home losses.

Following six of those home losses the Cowboys have won their next home game.

Only twice have the Cowboys lost consecutive home games.

•In 2017, UW lost its last home game of the season to Fresno State and lost its 2018 home opener vs. Washington State.

•In 2018, UW lost consecutive home games to Boise State and Utah State.

UW and UNM Have Been Members of the Same Conference Since 1951:

Wyoming and New Mexico are meeting for the 23rd consecutive season since both became founding members of the Mountain West Conference in 1999. Prior to that, they were founding members of the Western Athletic Conference in 1962. The two schools have been in the same conference since 1951, when they were both members of the Skyline Conference.



Chad Muma, Linebacker

One of the Best in the Nation -- Cowboy Linebacker Chad Muma's Performance Continues to Shine in 2021, No. 1 in the Nation in Solo Tackles and Interception TDs:

A year ago in 2020, Wyoming middle linebacker **Chad Muma** ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West and No. 3 in the nation in total tackles per game at 11.8, and he ranked No. 5 in the MW and No. 16 in the FBS in solo tackles (5.5/game).

In 2021, Muma is averaging 9.7 total tackles per game to rank No. 1 in the Mountain West and No. 12 among all FBS players. He is also averaging 7.2 solo tackles per game to rank No. 1 among all FBS players.

Muma is tied for No. 1 in the nation in most interception returns for touchdowns in 2021 with two "Pick Sixes". He is tied with Iowa defensive back Riley Moss.

Wyoming Hosts 96th Homecoming Game This Week, Renews Tradition That Was Interrupted in 2020:

This week's game versus New Mexico will mark the 96th Homecoming game in University of Wyoming history, and the 71st Homecoming game to be played in War Memorial Stadium.

Wyoming renews its Homecoming tradition this season. In 2020, there was no Homecoming Game due to COVID-19.

The last time Wyoming hosted a Homecoming Game was in 2019, and that game also featured the New Mexico Lobos as Wyoming's opponent.

In Wyoming's most recent Homecoming contest on Oct. 19, 2019, Wyoming defeated New Mexico, 23-10.

Wyoming vs. the Mountain West at Home During the Bohl Era: Since the 2014 season when **Craig Bohl** became head coach at Wyoming, the Cowboys have been very successful in conference home games.

- During the Bohl era, Wyoming has posted a **17-10 (.630) record in Mountain West regular-season home games.**
- Twice during the Bohl era, Wyoming has posted a perfect 4-0 record in MW home games during the regular season. Those two seasons were 2016 and 2019.
- Since the 2016 season, the Cowboys have been even better in Mountain West regular-season home contests, posting a record of 14-5 (.737).
- Wyoming has hosted one Mountain West postseason game in the Bohl era. That was the 2016 MW Championship Game vs. San Diego State. The Aztecs pulled out a three-point win in that game (27-24), after Wyoming had defeated SDSU by one point (34-33) two weeks earlier in Laramie.

Wyoming-New Mexico Series: The Wyoming Cowboys and New Mexico Lobos will play each other for the 74th time this Saturday. Last year's meeting was a first as the two teams played in Las Vegas, Nev., due to COVID-19 conditions in the state of New Mexico forcing UNM Football to play its home games in the state of Nevada.

Wyoming Named the Most Stable FBS Program in College Football Entering the 2021 Season:

In a story by ESPN's Bill Connelly on July 28, the University of Wyoming football program was ranked No. 1 in the country in stability among all 130 Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) schools. Clemson was ranked No. 2 in the ratings.

Each FBS program was ranked in three categories of stability according to Connelly's system:

•**Coaching stability (up to 20 points).**
Points were awarded according to three

factors: how long your current coach has been on the job, how many head coaches you've had over the past five years (so, 2017-21, not including late-year interims) and how many coordinators you've had to replace this offseason.

•**Roster stability (up to 20 points).** This was based on two factors: your returning production averages (updated since February's piece on the topic) and the number of players you've lost to the transfer portal since the start of last season*. The former points directly at the value of who you've got returning, while the latter hints at a program's overall culture and stability.

•**Performance stability (up to 10 points).** This category is a bit blurrier. It asks three general questions:

- (1) How well have you done recently? We'll derive this from your five-year average SP+ rating.
- (2) How consistent have you been? We'll use the standard deviation of your last five years of SP+ for this.
- (3) How many games did you play last year? This one is 2021-specific, obviously.

Wyoming's combined ratings gave the **Cowboys an overall rating of 40.6** (15.5 coach stability, 19.2 roster stability, 6.0 performance stability). Connelly pointed out that, "The Cowboys have one of the most reliable defenses in the Group of Five, Craig Bohl is entering his eighth year in Wyoming (and with a pretty steady staff), and virtually everyone from last season's team is back. Bohl has proven to be one of the sport's most celebrated culture-builders, and it makes sense that a Bohl team would lead this list."

Clemson came in No. 2 with an overall rating of 40.3 (20.0 coach stability, 10.6 roster stability, 9.7 performance stability).

2021 Pokes Have Developed Into One of the Top Defenses in the Nation: As you look at Wyoming's defensive rankings this season, defending opposing offenses' has become a strength for the Cowboys.

Performing in Key Situations -- Cowboy Offense Among Best in the Nation in Third-Down Conversions and Red-Zone Offense:

Two key offensive statistics are how an offense is able to convert in third-down situations and how effective an offense is at scoring points once in the red zone. The Wyoming Cowboys are among the best in the nation in 2021 in both of those key stats.

Eight

Wyoming Cowboys return in 2021 after earning All-Mountain West Conference honors in 2020.

The All-Mountain West team as selected by MW head coaches and media included junior running back **Xazavian Valladay**, who earned First Team All-Mountain West honors for the second consecutive season. He was joined on the Mountain West First Team in 2020 by junior center **Keegan Cryder** and junior linebacker **Chad Muma**.

Freshman place-kicker **John Hoyland** was selected to the All-MW Second team. He was the only Mountain West freshman named to the 2020 First or Second Team.

Senior right guard **Logan Harris** earned Honorable Mention All-Mountain West honors for the second consecutive season. He was joined on the Honorable Mention list by senior safety **Esaias Gandy** and freshman wide receiver **Isaiah Neyor**.

The 2020 All-Mountain West team as selected by Phil Steele publications included: Valladay, Cryder and Muma on the First Team; Hoyland on the Second Team; Harris was named to the Third Team; and cornerbaack **C.J. Coldon** was selected to the Fourth Team.



Xazavian Valladay, Running Back

Valladay Becomes Only the 12th Cowboy to Rush for 2,000 Career Yards, Moves Into Fourth in Wyoming History in Career Rushing Yards:

Wyoming running back **Xazavian Valladay** rushed for 147 yards against Colorado State on Nov. 5, 2020, to become only the 12th Wyoming Cowboy in school history to rush for over 2,000 career yards. Valladay enters this week with **2,682 career rushing yards** to rank **No. 4 in Wyoming history**

Valladay rushed for 396 yards as a redshirt freshman, recorded 1,265 rushing yards as a sophomore and 550

rushing yards in only five games in 2020. This season, he has rushed for a total of 471 yards.

Kazavian Valladay Records 12th 100-Yard Rushing Game of His Career:

For the past two seasons, the most productive and consistent offensive weapon the Wyoming Cowboys have had has been running back **Kazavian Valladay**. Valladay once again displayed his consistency at UConn as he recorded the 12th 100-yard rushing game of his career. Valladay rushed for 101 yards at UConn.

When Valladay Rushes for 100 Yards, That Usually Means the Cowboys Win:

When **Kazavian Valladay** recorded his 12th career 100-yard rushing game, it got us to wondering how those games equate to Wyoming wins and losses.

When Valladay has rushed for 100 or more yards, **Wyoming has a 9-3 record**. Included in those nine wins are victories over: New Mexico (2018 and '19), Missouri ('19), Nevada ('19), Colorado State ('19), Georgia State ('19), Hawai'i ('20), Northern Illinois ('21) and UConn ('21).

The only three losses came in road losses: at Boise State, 17-20 in overtime ('19); at Utah State by five points, 21-26 ('19); and at Colorado State 24-34 ('20).

Running Back Depth: Wyoming has featured one of the top rushing attacks in the Mountain West Conference and the nation the past few years. This year, Wyoming is spreading out those carries among four running backs and quarterback **Sean Chambers**.

Putting Up Points, Pokes Score Over 40 Points in Consecutive Games, Rare Occurrence in Cowboy History:

Over the past two weeks, Wyoming has been putting up big point totals. Wyoming scored 50 in a 50-43 win at Northern Illinois and 45 in a 45-12 win against Ball State.

The last time Wyoming **scored 40 or more points in consecutive games was back in 2016** when UW scored 52 in a 52-28 win over Utah State and 66 in a 66-69 loss at UNLV in triple overtime.

Prior to 2016, the last time the Cowboys scored 40 or more points in consecutive games was in 2004. Wyoming scored 53 in a 53-45 win at UNLV in triple overtime and 43 in a 43-26 win at home vs. Air Force.

Before this season's two consecutive 40-plus point games, **the last time a Wyoming team scored 40 or more in two regular length games (not involving overtime) was back to the 1996 season**. **Joe Tiller's** 1996 squad scored 40 or more in four consecutive games at San Jose State (45-22 win), vs. Western Michigan (42-28 win), vs. Fresno State (42-21 win) and vs. SMU (59-17 win).

2021 Wyoming Offensive Balance -- 48 Percent Rushing and 52 Percent

Passing: Through the first six games of this season, Wyoming's offense has begun to develop the balance it has been striving for.

In game one vs. Montana State, the Pokes rushed for 151 yards and had 196 yards passing yards for a total of 347 yards of total offense. That equated to 43.5 percent from the running game and 56.5 percent from the passing game.

Wyoming generated 191 rushing yards and 204 passing yards in the win at Northern Illinois for 395 yards of total offense. The rushing attack was responsible for 48.4 percent of the offensive output and the passing game generated 51.6 percent.

Against Ball State, the Pokes accounted for 378 yards of total offense -- 177 rushing yards and 201 passing. The running game provided 46.8 percent of the offense and the passing game generated 53.2 percent.

Chambers Displays His Talents and Leadership Skills Early This Season:

Cowboy quarterback **Sean Chambers'** impact on the start of the 2021 season was key to Wyoming getting off to a 4-0 start.

Chambers led the Cowboys on a game-winning drive in each of UW's first two victories.

He connected with tight end **Treyton Welch** on a 21-yard TD pass to give the Pokes a 19-16 win over Montana State on Sept. 4.

Then at Northern Illinois on Sept. 11, Chambers ran a naked bootleg and scampered into the end zone from nine yards out to seal a 50-43 road win over the Huskies.

In week three vs. Ball State, Chambers passed for 201 yards and one TD and added 21 rushing yards and a rushing touchdown. He ended the day with 222 yards of total offense.

On the season, Chambers has thrown for 1,004 yards, six touchdowns and six interceptions. He has also added 173 rushing yards and three rushing TDs and leads Wyoming with 1,177 yards of total offense.

But beyond the statistics, it is the confidence he provides his teammates that makes Chambers special. Both of his game-winning drives were 75-yard drives.

Cowboy Defense Scoring Points of Their Own, Tied for Third in the Nation for Most Defensive TDs Scored in 2021:

Wyoming's defense has not only been effective in stopping opponent offenses this season, but the Cowboys have generated points of their own this season.

Wyoming has scored three defensive touchdowns this year -- one at Northern Illinois and two against Ball State.

The Pokes are tied for No. 3 in the nation in defensive touchdowns scored with three TDs -- tied with Auburn, Iowa and South Carolina. Only Ohio State, with five defensive TDs, and UTSA, with four, have more.

Chad Muma intercepted a pass against Northern Illinois and returned it 23 yards for a touchdown for Wyoming's first defensive TD of the season.

In Wyoming's win vs. Ball State, nickel back **Keyon Blankenbaker** intercepted a pass in the first quarter and returned it 50 yards for a touchdown. In the fourth quarter, linebacker Muma recorded his second "Pick Six" of the season on a 45-yard interception return for a TD. The two "Pick Sixes" in one game was the first time Wyoming had done that since 2016 against Eastern Michigan (**Marcus Epps** and **Logan Wilson**).

Sack Explosion -- Wyoming Records Six Sacks vs. Ball State:

After recording 2.0 sacks in each of the first two games of the season, Wyoming's defense exploded with 6.0 sacks against Ball State on Sept. 18. UW added 3.0 sacks at UConn and 1.0 against Air Force and Fresno State.

Leading the way for the Pokes was defensive tackle **Ravontae Holt**, who was credited with 2.5 of UW's six sacks versus the Cardinals. Holt also had five tackles on the day to go with his 2.5 sacks. Four other Cowboys contributed to the sack explosion. Defensive ends **Solomon Byrd** and **Victor Jones** recorded 1.0 sack each. Linebacker **Easton Gibbs** contributed 1.0 sack, and nose tackle **Cole Godbout** was credited with 0.5 sacks, combining with Holt on one of the Pokes 6.0 sacks for the day. The Cowboys added 3.0 sacks at UConn. As a team, Wyoming ranks No. 6 in the Mountain West and No. 45 in the nation in sacks this season, averaging 2.50 per game.

Cardiac Cowboys: In three of the Wyoming Cowboys' first six games this season, Wyoming has mounted fourth-quarter comebacks to win, and in two of those games the Pokes scored a touchdown in the final two minutes of the game to secure wins.

Wyoming trailed UConn 13-3 at halftime, but UW scored three second-half TDs to capture a road win, 24-22.

Against Northern Illinois, Cowboy quarterback **Sean Chambers** scored on a naked bootleg from nine yards out with 1:35 left in the game to give UW a 50-43 win over the NIU.

In week one versus Montana State, Chambers found tight end **Treyton Welch** down the middle of the field for a 21-yard TD completion with only 47 seconds remaining in the game for the victory.

Sean Chambers a Nominee for 2021 Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year:

University of Wyoming quarterback **Sean Chambers** has been named one of three new nominees for the 2021 Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year Award.

The College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), in association with The Associated Press (AP) and the Fiesta Bowl Organization have selected three college football student-athletes—Chambers, a junior quarterback for the University of Wyoming; McKenzie

Milton, a senior quarterback at Florida State University; and J.J. Weaver a sophomore linebacker at the University of Kentucky—as nominees for the 2021 Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year Award.

Ten times during the 2021 college football season, three inspiring student-athletes from all levels of college football who have overcome injury, illness, or other challenges, are recognized as Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year Nominees by a panel of writers, editors, and sports information directors from CoSIDA, AP and Touchdown Illustrated. In December, three of the 30 nominees will be chosen as winners of the Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year Award and will be recognized at a special ceremony during the PlayStation® Fiesta Bowl on Jan. 1, 2022, at State Farm Stadium in Glendale, Ariz.

Ayden Eberhardt a Semifinalist for 2021 NFF William V. Campbell Award:

Wyoming senior wide receiver **Ayden Eberhardt** from Loveland, Colo., has been named one of the semifinalists for the 2021 National Football Foundation (NFF) William V. Campbell Trophy, which honors the nation's best college football scholar-athlete each season.

Eberhardt is one of 176 semifinalists selected for this year's award from all levels of college football. He earned a 3.31 cumulative grade-point average as an undergraduate at UW. He earned his bachelor's degree in finance in May 2020, and is currently working on a second degree from UW in communication.

He began his college career at Wyoming as a walk-on and earned a scholarship. In the 2020 season, he rose to become Wyoming's top receiver in terms of both catches (16) and receiving yards (252) in the six games the Cowboys played.

The 2021 Season Marks the 125th Season of Cowboy Football: The 2021 college football season will be the 125th season of Cowboy Football. This coming season is one of the most anticipated in the history of Wyoming Football, as the team and fans alike are anxious to return to a normal season of college football.

The first season of Wyoming Football was 1893, but there were four seasons through Cowboy Football history where a season wasn't played leading to the 2021 season being the 125th. UW did not play any games in the 1918 season due to a flu epidemic. The Cowboys also did not play for three seasons (1943, 1944 and 1945) due to World War II.

Cowboys Second in the Nation in Terms of Returning Production, According to Bill Connelly of ESPN:

There will be a number of college football teams with a lot of returning players in 2021 due in large part to the NCAA granting student-athletes an extra year of eligibility following the COVID season of 2020. According to Bill Connelly of ESPN, the Wyoming Cowboys are among the team's with the most returning production, ranking No. 2 with 95 percent returning. The ranking was as of Connelly's updated list on May 28. Only Toledo at 97 percent had more returning production for the 2021 season, according to Connelly.

"Super Seniors": The terms "Super Seniors" has been placed on those student-athletes who would have played their final season in 2020, but due to the NCAA granting all student-athletes an extra year of eligibility those 2020 seniors were given the option to return in 2021.

Wyoming has seven players who fall in that category led by running back **Trey Smith**, who is actually playing his seventh season of college football and third at Wyoming after transferring from the University of Louisville. The other Cowboy "Super Seniors" who return in 2021 are: **Garrett Crall** (DE), **Ayden Eberhardt** (WR), **Esaias Gandy** (FS), **Logan Harris** (OG), **Braden Smith** (SS) and **Alonzo Velazquez** (OT).

Two Cowboys Earn Mountain West Player of the Week Honors vs. Montana State -- Chad Muma Wins Defensive Honor and Ralph Fawaz Named Freshman of the Week:

The Mountain West Conference announced its Players of the Week on Monday, Sept. 6 and Wyoming had two players selected for their performances in a 19-16 season-opening victory over Montana State. Linebacker **Chad Muma** was named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week and punter **Ralph Fawaz** was selected the Mountain West's Freshman of the Week.

John Hoyland Continues His Amazing Consistency: Wyoming place-kicker **John Hoyland** has gone from walk-on, to starter, to Freshman All-American, to one of the most consistent players on the Wyoming Football roster in a little more than a year.

All Hoyland did as a freshman in 2020 was lead the nation in field goals made per game (2.17), rank No. 6 in the nation in field-goal percentage (92.9 percent) and rank No. 19 in scoring.

In 2021, Hoyland has continued his amazing consistency, although he hasn't had as many field goal opportunities due to the fact the Cowboys are scoring more touchdowns.

It's Good to be Number 1: There was one Cowboy in the 2020 season who sat atop not only the conference rankings but also atop the national rankings. That individual was freshman place-kicker **John Hoyland**, who led the nation in field-goals made per game averaging 2.17 field goals per game. Hoyland also ranked No. 6 in the nation in field-goal percentage (92.9 percent), having made 13 of 14 field goals on the season. The true freshman from Broomfield, Colo., averaged 9.2 points per game to rank No. 19 in the nation in scoring. He ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West in all three of those categories.

John Hoyland Continues Tradition of Cowboy Kickers From Colorado: Current Wyoming starting place-kicker **John Hoyland** walked on to the Wyoming Football team in 2020 from Broomfield, Colo., where he played at Legacy High School. Hoyland joined a long line of former Cowboy kickers from the state of Colorado.

Former Wyoming place-kicker and Colorado native, **Cooper Rothe**, became the leading scorer in University of Wyoming history over his career from 2016-19. But Rothe wasn't the only successful UW kicker from Colorado, in fact four of the all-time leading scorers in Wyoming Football history were place-kickers who grew up in Colorado.

Freshman Punter Ralph Fawaz Impressing This Season: The Cowboys have had a new weapon appear on special teams this year in freshman punter **Ralph Fawaz**.

In his first college game, Wyoming freshman punter Fawaz from Cache, Okla., put on quite a show for the Cowboys. He helped shift field position throughout Wyoming's game vs. Montana State, averaging 45.7 yards per punt on six punts. He also placed five of his six punts inside the Montana State 20-yard line.

Fawaz's six punts went for: 43 yards to the MSU 28-yard line forcing a fair catch; 54 yards to the Bobcat 14-yard line with a -3 yard return; 33 yards to the MSU 1-yard line; 53 yards to the Bobcat 11; 44 yards to the MSU 11 forcing another fair catch; and 47 yards to the MSU 13.

All total, Fawaz had five punts of 43 yards or more, including two of over 50 yards (43, 54, 53, 44, 47). His sixth punt was a pooch kick that was downed by Wyoming at the MSU 1-yard line.

For his performance in the win over Montana State, Fawaz was named the Mountain West Conference Freshman of the Week.

Against Ball State, Fawaz averaged 48.0 yards per punt on five punts, including a long of 53 yards. He placed two of those punts inside the Cardinals 20-yard line.

Chad Muma, Linebacker

Captain Chad Muma Led the Mountain West and Ranked No. 3 in the Nation in Tackles in 2020: Cowboy middle linebacker **Chad Muma** has been a key contributor on the Wyoming defense for the last three seasons, but in his junior season of 2020 he made his mark as one of the nation's top defenders.

Muma ranked **No. 3 in the nation in tackles, averaging 11.8 tackles per game**, and ranked **No. 1 in the Mountain West in tackles in 2020.**

His freshman and sophomore seasons, Muma played alongside middle linebacker **Logan Wilson** and weak-side linebacker

Cash Maluia. Both Wilson and Maluia went on to be selected in the 2020 NFL Draft -- Wilson by the Cincinnati Bengals and Maluia by the New England Patriots.

Muma's intelligence and athleticism enabled him to spell both Wilson in the middle and Maluia on the weak side. While Muma entered the 2020 season having started only two games, it was unfair to describe him as a back-up. He ranked sixth on the Cowboy team in tackles in 2019 with 51 total tackles.

Muma shifted to middle linebacker full-time in 2020, and he enjoyed an outstanding season. He had a career high 14 total tackles and a career best 10 solo tackles against Nevada in the season opener. He added seven tackles in Week 2 vs. Hawai'i, and set a new career tackle best with 18 tackles at Colorado State in Week 3. He had his third double-figure tackle game of the season at UNLV in Week 4, with 10 total tackles, and added 10 in one half of play at New Mexico. Muma concluded the 2020 season with 13 tackles vs. Boise State.

Muma was also involved in creating two turnovers for the Cowboy defense during the 2020 season. He forced a fumble versus Nevada and recovered a fumble vs. Hawai'i.

Cowboys Again Among Mountain West Tackle Leaders in 2021: A year ago in 2020, Wyoming had four players rank among the top tacklers in the Mountain West. In 2021, the Pokes again have a quartet of defensive players ranked among the league leaders.

- **Chad Muma** currently ranks No. 1 in the MW, averaging 9.7 tackles per game.
- Safety **Esaias Gandy** is making 6.7 tackles per game to rank No. 16 in the conference.
- Cornerback **C.J. Coldon** has averaged 6.0 tackles per game in 2021 to rank No. 25 in the MW.
- **Easton Gibbs**, Muma's running mate at linebacker, is No. 29 in the league at 5.7 per game.

Wyoming Defense Intercepts Three Passes vs. Northern Illinois: The Wyoming defense came up with a number of big plays in its win over Northern Illinois on Sept. 11, 2021. Those big plays included three interceptions, one of which was returned for a touchdown.

- The first Wyoming interception was made by safety **Miles Williams** in the first quarter. It was Williams first career interception.
- In the second quarter, safety **Rome Weber** caught a deflected pass for his first interception of the 2021 season and second of his career.
- Midway through the third quarter, Cowboy middle linebacker **Chad Muma** intercepted NIU and returned it for a 23-yard "Pick Six". It was also Muma's first career interception.
- The last time Wyoming had intercepted three passes in a single game was Sept. 28, 2019, versus UNLV.

Wyoming Unable to Continue Undefeated Season with 24-14 Loss at Air Force: The Wyoming Cowboys entered their Oct. 9 game at Air Force as one of only 17 unbeaten FBS teams in the nation. Wyoming was 4-0 on the season entering the Air Force game. After fighting back to tie the game at 14-14 at halftime, the Pokes were outscored 10-0 in the second half by the Falcons to fall from the ranks of the unbeatens.

Wyoming was one of four undefeated teams to fall last week. Alabama, Penn State and BYU also lost their first game of the 2021 season on Oct. 9.



Cowboys Valladay, Cryder and Muma Selected to 2021 Preseason All-Mountain West Team, All Three Earned All-Mountain West Honors a Year Ago:

The Mountain West Conference announced its 2021 Preseason All-Conference football team in conjunction with 2021 Mountain West Media Days in Las Vegas, Nev. Three University of Wyoming juniors were named to the team. Running back **Xazavian Valladay**, center **Keegan Cryder** and linebacker **Chad Muma** were all named to the Preseason All-Mountain West team in voting by conference media members.

Wyoming was one of only five MW schools with three or more individuals on the Preseason All-Conference team. Wyoming and San Diego State each had three individuals named to the team. Nevada, Boise State and San Jose State each had four players on the team.

Dynamic Duo Scoring TDs on the Ground and Through the Air: Wyoming's offensive duo of running back **Xazavian Valladay** and wide receiver **Isaiah Neyor** have scored nine touchdowns between them this season, which is almost half of Wyoming's 20 total TDs.

Valladay has scored all four of this TDs on the ground, while Neyor has scored four receiving touchdowns and one rushing. Neyor ranks 10th in the Mountain West this season in touchdowns scored, and Valladay ranks ninth.

Isaiah Neyor Explodes for Three Touchdowns vs. Northern Illinois: He had not caught a TD pass in his first eight career games as a Wyoming Cowboy, but wide receiver **Isaiah Neyor** changed all that in Wyoming's win over Northern Illinois on Sept. 11. Neyor caught touchdown passes of 33 and 19 yards against the Huskies while catching four total passes for 87 yards on the day. And for good measure, he added his first career rushing TD from five yards out.

Wyoming Offense Adds Two New Coaches in 2021: Wyoming added two new offensive coaches this past offseason.

Tim Polasek took over as Wyoming's new offensive coordinator in 2021. Polasek comes to Wyoming from the University of Iowa where he was the offensive line coach the past four seasons. Prior to Iowa, Polasek was the offensive coordinator at North Dakota State from 2014-16 and was an assistant coach at NDSU from 2006 to 2012. The Bison won four FCS National Championships (2011, '12, '14 and '15) while Polasek was on staff.

Derek Frazier is Wyoming's new offensive line coach. Frazier most recently was the assistant offensive line coach with the NFL's New York Jets for the 2019 and '20 seasons. He has coached previously at FBS member schools Fresno State, Colorado State and Central Michigan. Frazier has strong ties to Wyoming Football as his father Tom Frazier was co-captain of Wyoming's 1966 team that posted a 10-1 record and defeated Florida State in the Sun Bowl. Frazier played on a national championship team himself at Northern Colorado in 1996 for former Cowboy head coach Joe Glenn. Frazier was the starting center on UNC's 1996 NCAA Division II national title team.

Deep Running Back Group Bodes Well for Wyoming's Rushing Attack This Season:

Not only does **Xazavian Valladay** return at running back after leading the Mountain West in rushing in both 2019 and '20, but Wyoming returns a deep running back group, including graduate student **Trey Smith**, who ranked No. 6 in the MW in rushing in 2020 and sophomore **Titus Swen**. Here are some details on the returning Cowboys.

Two Cowboy Receivers Posted 100-Yard Receiving Games in 2020: Redshirt freshman wide receiver **Isaiah Neyor** showed his talent in Wyoming's season opener at Nevada, catching three passes for 102 yards. His three catches went for 45 yards, 34 and 23, averaging 34.0 yards per reception. That was Neyor's first 100-yard receiving game.

It was also the first time a Cowboy had recorded a 100-yard receiving game since tight end **Tyree Mayfield** caught four passes for 112 yards in a 35-28 home win over Air Force on Nov. 17, 2018.

In Week 3 of the season, senior wide receiver **Ayden Eberhardt** recorded the first 100-yard receiving game of his career with seven catches for 132 yards. He had five receptions of 10 yards or more, including catches of 12, 15, 17, 21 and 56.

Isaiah Neyor Averaged 31.0 Yards per Reception in 2020: Redshirt freshman receiver **Isaiah Neyor** averaged an amazing 31.0 yards per reception in 2020. He caught eight passes on the year for 248 yards. He wasn't ranked nationally because he fell under the NCAA minimum of 2.0 catches per game (he needed 12 receptions through Wyoming's six games to meet that minimum).

But if he met the minimum, he would led the nation in receiving yards per catch (31.0 yards per reception).

Against New Mexico on Dec. 5, Neyor's explosive offensive abilities were on full display as he caught a 54-yard pass and recorded a 58-yard rush to account for 112 yards of all-purpose yardage in just two plays.

His eight catches on the season went for: 45, 34, 23, 33, 37, 7, 15 and 54 yards.



Cowboys Have Four Current Players Who Have Rushed for 100 Yards in at Least One Game During Their Wyoming Careers:

The Wyoming Cowboys recorded 11, 100-yard rushing games in 13 games in 2019, had four in 2020 and one thus far in 2021 have had two. Running back **Xazavian Valladay** has had 12, 100-yard career rushing games, quarterback **Sean Chambers** has had six, running back **Trey Smith** has had three and running back **Titus Swen** has had one.

Valladay Makes History, Tying School Record for Single-Game Carries:

Running back Xazavian Valladay rushed for 124 yards at Boise State in 2019 for his third-straight 100-yard game and was the first 100-yard rusher against the Broncos that season.

He did so on 37 carries for the night which tied a school record. Running back **Ryan Christopherson** was the last Cowboy with 37 carries against NE Louisiana in 1994 and quarterback **Steve Cockreham** had 37 for the Pokes against Arizona State in 1974.

Valladay's 1,000-Yard Rushing Season in 2019 the Seventh Best in School History and the Fourth by a Wyoming Running Back in the First Six Years of the Craig Bohl Era:

Wyoming running back **Xazavian Valladay** rushed for 154 yards against Colorado State on Friday, Nov. 22, 2019, to surpass the 1,000-yard mark on the season. Valladay rushed for 100 or more yards in seven of the 12 games he played in during the 2019 season, including rushing for 100 or more yards in five of his last six games, including rushing for 204 yards vs. Georgia State in the 2019 NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl victory.

Valladay's 1,000-yard rushing season was the fourth under head coach **Craig Bohl** in the first six seasons of his coaching tenure. Valladay joined **Brian Hill**, who rushed for 1,000 yards in 2016 (1,860 yards) and 2015 (1,631) and **Nico Evans**, who rushed for 1,325 yards in 2018, as the three running backs who have posted four 1,000-yard rushing seasons during the Bohl era at Wyoming.

Mr. All Purpose, "X" Among Mountain West Leaders in All-Purpose Yardage for the Second Straight Season:

Not only was Cowboy running back **Xazavian Valladay (X)** the No. 1 rusher in the Mountain West Conference in 2019, but he also led the Mountain West in all-purpose yards and ranked No. 26 in the nation, averaging 124.08 yards per game.

In the 2020 season, "X" again ranked No. 1 in the MW in rushing and he ranked No. 3 in the MW and No. 27 nationally in all-purpose yardage, averaging 131.00 yards per game.

He recorded 280 all-purpose yards in a 31-3 win over Nevada in 2019. It was the highest all-purpose yardage total in the Mountain West during the 2019 regular season and it was the most by a Cowboy since Brian Hill recorded 302 all-purpose yards against Nevada in 2016. Valladay rushed for a career-high 206 yards and grabbed two catches for 74 yards. Valladay recorded a 53-yard touchdown grab on the first offensive play of the game for the Pokes.

In Wyoming's 2019 NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl victory, he ran for 204 yards and one touchdown. Valladay also led all Cowboy receivers with three receptions for 91 yards, including a long reception of 63 yards that set up his rushing TD. It was the longest touchdown reception by a Wyoming running back in the Mountain West era of Cowboy Football. He ended the day with 295 all-purpose yards for the game, eclipsing his 280-yard performance vs. Nevada earlier in the season.

University of Wyoming quarterback **Sean Chambers** has been named to the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award Watch list. The Golden Arm Award, presented annually to the top upperclassmen quarterback by the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Educational Foundation encapsulates all that is positive in college sports. The award acknowledges performance on the field for sure, but it goes beyond completion percentage and touchdown strikes. The award values character, citizenship, integrity and those who honor the game. The 2021 award winner will be presented the Golden Arm Award trophy by The Johnny Unitas Educational Foundation President, John Unitas, Jr., at the Golden Arm Award banquet and celebration at the Four Seasons Hotel in Baltimore, Md., on Friday, December 10, 2021.

Keegan Cryder Makes the Outland Trophy Preseason Watch List for the

Second Straight Year: For the second consecutive season, the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) has named University of Wyoming center **Keegan Cryder** to the Outland Trophy Watch List. The Outland Trophy is presented annually to the nation's most outstanding interior lineman.

Only interior linemen on offense (centers, guards and tackles) and defense (tackles and nose tackles) are eligible for the Outland Trophy.

The 2020 season saw Cryder and his Wyoming offensive line mates help the Cowboys generate 219.5 rushing yards per game to rank No. 2 in the Mountain West and No. 14 nationally.

In 2019, Cryder was a key to the Wyoming offense ranking No. 2 in the MW and No. 23 in the NCAA in rushing offense, averaging 214.8 rushing yards per game. He also helped Wyoming rank No. 4 in the Mountain West and No. 32 in the nation in fewest sacks allowed (1.62 per game).

The Outland Trophy, celebrating 75 years since its founding, is the third-oldest major college football award. Created in 1946 when Dr. John Outland presented the FWAA with a financial contribution to initiate the award, the Outland Trophy has been given to the best interior lineman in college football ever since. Dr. Outland was an All-American at the University of Pennsylvania in the late 1890s.

John Hoyland Earns a Spot on the 2021 Lou Groza Award Watch List:

Wyoming place-kicker **John Hoyland** is coming off a great season in 2020, and due to that performance The Palm Beach County Sports Commission recognized Hoyland as one of the best kickers in the nation by naming him to the 2021 Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award Preseason Watch List.

The native of Broomfield, Colo., is one of only 30 place-kickers named to this year's Groza Award Watch List. He led the nation in field goals made per game in 2020 (2.17 per game), and he was one of the country's most accurate kickers, making 13 of 14 field goals (92.9 percent) to rank No. 6 in the nation.

Last season, he was one of only 32 freshmen nationally named to the 2020 Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) Freshman All-America team. He was the only place-kicker named to the team.

He missed only one kick all last season and ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West and No. 6 in the nation in field-goal percentage (92.9 percent). In addition to making 13 of 14 field goals on the season, he was a perfect 16 of 16 in PATs. The true freshman also ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West and No. 19 in the nation in scoring, averaging 9.2 points per game.

The Award is named for National Football League Hall of Fame kicker Lou "The Toe" Groza, who played 21 seasons with the Cleveland Browns. Groza won four NFL championships with Cleveland and was named NFL Player of the Year in 1954.

Logan Wilson and Cassh Maluia

Drafted in 2020 NFL Draft: University of Wyoming senior linebackers **Logan Wilson** and **Cassh Maluia** were both selected in the 2020 NFL Draft.

Wilson was selected as the first pick in the third round of the 2020 NFL Draft by the Cincinnati Bengals. Wilson became the 10th highest overall NFL Draft pick by a Wyoming Cowboy in school history. He also became the highest NFL Draft pick of a Wyoming Cowboy who also was a native of the state of Wyoming. The previous highest selection in the NFL Draft of a Wyoming native, who also played for the Cowboys, was running back **Jerry Hill** back in 1961, when he was the seventh selection in the third round by the Baltimore Colts. Hill was a native of Lingle, Wyo.

Wilson's senior season he became recognized as one of the nation's top linebackers. He was selected as one of six national finalists for the 2019 Butkus Award. He earned First Team All-America honors from Pro Football Focus, Second Team All-American from USA Today and Third Team All-American from Associated Press.

Maluia was the 25th pick in the sixth round of the 2020 NFL Draft by the New England Patriots. He joined his linebacker running mate Wilson as a 2020 NFL Draft pick. It is the first time since 2017 that Wyoming had two players selected in the same NFL Draft. In 2017, Wyoming running back **Brian Hill** was selected by the Atlanta Falcons and offensive lineman **Chase Roullier** was selected by the Washington Redskins. The last time Wyoming had two players taken in the same NFL Draft at the same position was the 1989 NFL Draft when Wyoming defensive linemen **Dave Edeen** and **Pat Rabold** were selected by the Phoenix Cardinals and Buffalo Bills, respectively.

Maluia was a 2019 Honorable Mention All-Mountain West Conference selection.

Chad Muma Selected to 2021 Chuck Bednarik Award Preseason Watch

List: The Maxwell Football Club announced on Monday its 2021 Watch List for the **27th Chuck Bednarik Award powered by Mammoth Tech**. The Bednarik Award is presented annually to the outstanding defensive player in college football. Among the players named to this year's watch list is University of Wyoming linebacker **Chad Muma**. This is the first time in his career that Muma has been named to the Bednarik Award Watch List.

Muma made his mark as one of the nation's top defenders in 2020. He ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West and No. 3 in the nation in tackles, averaging 11.8 tackles per game. He also ranked No. 16 in the nation in solo tackles, averaging 5.5 per game. The junior was selected First Team All-Mountain West by MW head coaches and media in 2020.

The winner of the 2021 Chuck Bednarik Award will be announced as part of the ESPN Home Depot College Football Awards Show held on Dec. 9, 2021.

Chad Muma Named to Butkus Award Watch List: Wyoming linebacker **Chad Muma** has been named to the prestigious 2021 Butkus Award Watch List. The Butkus Award honors the nation's best linebackers in the nation. It kicked off its 37th annual selection process by announcing its collegiate and high school preseason watch lists.

Each watch list contains 51 linebackers, mirroring the legendary "51" pro jersey associated with the Award's namesake Dick Butkus, who was recognized by NFL Films as the best defensive player in football history. The Collegiate Butkus Award watch list includes candidates from 51 different universities.

Muma made his mark as one of the nation's top linebackers in 2020. He ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West and No. 3 in the nation in tackles, averaging 11.8 tackles per game. Semi-finalists are expected to be named Nov. 1, finalists Nov. 22, and winners on or before Dec. 7.

Mammoth Tech and The Athletes' Corner are both Executive Partners of the Maxwell Football Club. The Maxwell Football Club has also once again partnered with Pro Football Focus (PFF), XOS ThunderCloud and Phil Steele Publications as selection committee partners.

Since 1937, the Maxwell Award has been presented to the College Player of the Year. It is named in honor of Robert "Tiny" Maxwell, a former standout at Swarthmore College who went on to become a well-known sportswriter and football official.

Valladay has been a First Team All-Mountain West Conference selection each of the past two seasons. He led the Mountain West in rushing yards per game in both 2019 (105.4 per game) and 2020 (110.0 per game) and ranked 18th nationally in 2019 and 17th in 2020.

Doak Walker Award Once Again Includes Xazavian Valladay Among

Nation's Top Running Backs: University of Wyoming running back **Xazavian Valladay** was named to the Doak Walker Award Preseason Watch List by the PwC SMU Athletic Forum for the second consecutive season in 2021. The Forum annually presents the award to the nation's top college running back.

The PwC SMU Athletic Forum Board of Directors will name ten semifinalists for the Doak Walker Award in November. Three finalists, as voted on by the Doak Walker Award National Selection Committee, will be announced later in November. The selection committee will cast a second vote in December to determine the recipient. The National Selection Committee consists of past recipients, former NFL All-Pro and college All-America running backs, media members and selected special representatives.

The recipient of the 2021 Doak Walker Award will be announced live on The Home Depot College Football Awards Show.

The award is named for SMU's three-time All-America running back Doak Walker. It is the only major collegiate award that requires all candidates to be in good academic standing and on schedule to graduate within one year of other students of the same classification.

Head Coach Craig Bohl



The 2021 season will mark Craig Bohl's eighth season leading the University of Wyoming Football program and his 19th season as a head coach at the collegiate level. The success that Cowboy Football has enjoyed and the excitement generated around the program under Bohl's direction is just what UW Athletics Director Tom Burman had hoped for when he hired Bohl.

When Bohl was hired as head football coach at Wyoming, he was open in saying that he wanted to bring Cowboy Football back to a place of national prominence.

In terms of success, the Cowboys have become regular contenders in the race for the Mountain West Conference title. UW won eight games in 2016, '17 and '19, hosted the 2016 Mountain West Championship Game, earned three bowl bids in four years and won the 2017 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl and 2019 NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl. In addition in the 2018 season, the Cowboys earned bowl eligibility. The last time that UW had achieved bowl eligibility in four consecutive seasons were the 1996-99 seasons. Wyoming also had two players, linebackers Logan Wilson and Cassh Maluia, selected in the 2020 NFL Draft, marking the fourth consecutive year that Wyoming had at least one player selected in the NFL Draft and the fifth year out of the past six NFL Drafts that the Pokes have had a player drafted.

The excitement surrounding Wyoming Football included the extensive coverage of former Cowboy quarterback Josh Allen, who was selected as the No. 7 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft by the Buffalo Bills. That marked the highest selection by a Wyoming Cowboy in the history of the program and was the second highest selection by a Mountain West player since Utah's Alex Smith was selected No. 1 in 2005. Leading up to Allen being

drafted, Wyoming's Pro Day was covered live by both ESPN and the NFL Network. At the conclusion of the 2017 football season and the 2018 NFL Draft, media coverage of Wyoming Football for the past year was estimated by Joyce Julius & Associates at over \$159 million.

Cowboy linebacker Logan Wilson was one of six national finalists for the 2019 Butkus Award, honoring the nation's top collegiate linebacker. Wilson earned multiple All-America honors, including being named a First Team All-American by Pro Football Focus. In 2018, Wyoming had two finalists for national awards for the first time in program history. Place-kicker Cooper Rothe was one of three national finalists for the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award, that honors the nation's top collegiate place-kicker each year. Free safety Marcus Epps was one of only three national finalists for the Burlsworth Trophy, which is awarded to the most outstanding football player in America who began his career as a walk-on. Epps went on to be drafted by the Minnesota Vikings in the sixth round of the 2019 NFL Draft. During Bohl's tenure as Wyoming's head coach, he has had a freshman earn Freshman All-America honors from the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) five times. The most recent Cowboy freshman to receive the honor was place-kicker John Hoyland in 2020. The other four Pokes coached by Bohl to be named Freshman All-Americans by the FWAA were: safety Andrew Wingard (2015), linebacker Logan Wilson (2016), center Keegan Cryder (2018) and defensive end Solomon Byrd (2019).

In the COVID-shortened season of 2020, Wyoming's defense ranked among the Top 30 teams in the nation in 10 defensive categories, including ranking: No. 16 in total defense, No. 21 in rushing defense, No. 24 in scoring defense and No. 29 in pass defense. Wyoming's 2020 offense ranked No. 7 in the NCAA in passing yards per completion, No. 14 in rushing offense and No. 24 in fewest turnovers committed.

The Cowboy defense ranked No. 11 in the nation in scoring defense and No. 11 in rushing defense in 2019. Wyoming's defense also was No. 6 in the country in red-zone defense and scored three defensive touchdowns to rank No. 12 in the FBS. The UW offense ranked No. 10 in the nation in passing yards per completion and was No. 23 in the country in rushing offense. That combination of offensive and defensive balance led to an 8-5 record and a victory in the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl.

Wyoming was also one of the best defensive teams in the nation in 2018. The Cowboys ranked No. 19 in the nation in total defense, No. 25 in rushing defense and No. 28 in scoring defense.

The 2017 season saw the Cowboys post an 8-5 record and finish second in the MW Mountain Division. The Pokes were led by their defense in 2017, ranking No. 1 in the nation in forcing turnovers (38) and leading the Mountain West and ranking No. 9 in the nation in scoring defense. Wyoming's defense also ranked No. 1 in fumbles recovered (18), No. 2 in interceptions (20), No. 8 in defensive touchdowns scored, 13th in the NCAA in pass defense, and 23rd in total defense. UW captured the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl in a convincing 37-14 win over Central Michigan.

In 2016, Bohl's team defeated two Top 25 ranked opponents, was named the National Team of the Week by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) for one of those wins and received votes itself in the national polls. Wyoming also captured the Mountain Division title of the Mountain West Conference, earned the right to host the 2016 MW Football Championship Game as the highest ranked team in the conference and was invited to the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl. His Cowboys ended the year with an 8-6 record and featured one of the NCAA's top scoring offenses, averaging 35.9 points per game to rank No. 25 in the nation. Bohl was recognized for his turnaround of Cowboy Football by being named the 2016 Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in voting by conference head coaches and media.

Two Cowboys earned All-America honors in 2016 in running back Brian Hill and center Chase Roullier. Linebacker Logan Wilson earned Freshman All-America honors in 2016, joining Andrew Wingard, who earned Freshman All-America honors a year earlier.

Bohl currently serves on the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Board of Trustees, having been elected by a vote of the membership at the 2012 AFCA national convention. He was also appointed to the 13-member NCAA Division I Football Competition Committee in January of 2017. He became a member of the NCAA Football Oversight Committee in August 2020.

Bohl, who was part of building National Championship teams at North Dakota State and Nebraska, was introduced by University of Wyoming Athletics Director Tom Burman as the new head football coach of the Wyoming Cowboys on Sunday, Dec. 8, 2013. Bohl became the 32nd head football coach in University of Wyoming history.

He came to Wyoming after building a national power at North Dakota State as a head coach for 11 seasons from 2003-13. His teams won three consecutive National Championships at the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level in 2011, '12 and '13. NDSU became only the second FCS school in NCAA history to win three consecutive national football titles, tied the FCS record for consecutive wins (24 from 2011-13) and became the first undefeated FCS National Champion since 1996.

Not only did Bohl win three national titles at the FCS level, but he was the linebackers coach at his alma mater, Nebraska, when the Huskers won the 1995 and 1997 National Championships.

In 2012 and '13, Bohl received both The Sports Network Eddie Robinson FCS National Coach of the Year Award and the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) FCS National Coach of the Year Award. He became the first coach in the first 27 years of the Eddie Robinson Award to win it in consecutive seasons. In 2013, he also received the Liberty Mutual FCS Coach of the Year Award, which is presented in partnership with the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame. His other National Coach of the Year honor came in 2006, when he was recognized by the Football Gazette as the FCS National Coach of the Year and the Northwest Region Coach of the Year.

Bohl grew up in Lincoln, Neb., and went on to attend the University of Nebraska where he was a reserve defensive back from 1977 to 1979 under head coach Tom Osborne. Bohl was part of Nebraska's 1979 Orange Bowl and 1980 Cotton Bowl teams.

The 2021 season will be Bohl's 41st year coaching at the college level. Born July 27, 1958, Bohl will be 63 years old when the 2021 season kicks off. He earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from Nebraska in 1982. Bohl's family includes wife Leia, and children Mallory and Morgan, Aaron and Elijah.

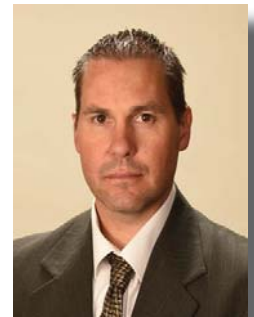

2021 Will Mark the 125th Season of Wyoming Football: The 2021 season will mark the 125th season of Wyoming Football. The Cowboys first season was 1893.

Since that first season, there have been only four seasons in which Wyoming has not played football. In 1918, Wyoming did not play any games due to an influenza epidemic. The other three seasons Wyoming did not field a team were 1943, '44 and '45 during World War II.

Wyoming Football's All-Time Record:

The Wyoming Cowboy Football program has played a total of **1,160 games** in its history. Wyoming is 36 games under .500 all-time (548 wins to 584 losses), and has played 48 more road games than home games in its history (546 home games to 594 road games). The Cowboys played their **1,000th game** on Sept. 6, 2008, against Air Force.

War Memorial Stadium Will Host Its 72nd Season in 2021:

The 2021 college football season will be the 72nd season of War Memorial Stadium

Wyoming has won **65.9 percent** of its games in War Memorial Stadium.

"The War" first opened on Sept. 16, 1950, with UW recording a 61-13 win over Montana State. War Memorial's original capacity was 20,000 in 1950. It was expanded to 25,500 in 1970, and the seating was increased to a capacity of 33,500 in 1977.

Following reconstruction of the upper deck on the West side of War Memorial Stadium in the summer of 2004, the new capacity of War Memorial Stadium was 30,514. With the construction of the Wildcatter Stadium Club & Suites in 2009-10, the current capacity is 29,181.

Mick and Susie McMurry High Altitude Performance Center Benefitting All UW Student-Athletes:

The University of Wyoming held a Grand Opening for the Mick and Susie McMurry High Altitude Performance Center (HAPC) on Aug. 18, 2018. The HAPC is one of the preeminent athletic facilities in the country. It will add 71,000 square feet of new space and will expand the current Curtis and Marian Rochelle

Athletics Center to over 118,000 square feet.

"A successful athletics program generates excitement," Wyoming Gov. Matt Mead said in when fundraising was announced. "This leads to better student recruitment, better alumni support and stronger schools. I recommended \$20 million in matching funds for the expansion and renovation of the Rochelle Athletics Center for these reasons. I thank Marian H. Rochelle for this generous gift and her continued support of the University of Wyoming."

The project is funded by \$24 million in private donations that were raised by UW Athletics and the UW Foundation and \$20 million in state matching approved by Gov. Mead and the Legislature. Overwhelming interest by donors—55 total—saw the fundraising efforts completed ahead of schedule. Marian Rochelle and her family donated \$3 million as a leadership gift to kick off the project, and the combined gifts of Marian Rochelle and her daughter April Brimmer Kunz have since grown to \$4.1 million.

"Mick and Susie McMurry's generosity and their commitment to making the University of Wyoming a premier university in both athletics and academics will be symbolized by the High Altitude Performance Center that will bear their name," says Tom Burman, UW athletics director. "We also want to thank Marian Rochelle and April Brimmer Kunz for their generous lead gift for this project. And we of course want to thank Governor Mead and the members of the Wyoming State Legislature for making funds available to match the private funds that we raised for this facility."

"The High Altitude Performance Center will be one of the best facilities of its kind in all of college athletics. It will provide the student-athletes in all of our sports the athletic training resources to compete with the best in the nation, and it will provide our academic counseling unit exceptional resources to help our student-athletes achieve their educational and career goals."

"The Mick and Susie McMurry High Altitude Performance Center will redefine Cowboy football," says UW Head Football Coach Craig Bohl. "This facility will play a critical role in our vision of recruiting to what we call the Wyoming Profile. That recruiting effort involves attracting a young man who is committed to earning a meaningful degree from an outstanding academic institution and has a laser-like focus to win Mountain West Conference championships. The High Altitude Performance Center will put us at the top of the league in terms of training and academic facilities, which is where we also aspire to be on the field of competition."

The new facility will focus on the unique advantages of training at an altitude of 7,220 feet. From strength and conditioning training, to nutrition, to recovery and rehabilitation services following injuries, the HAPC will serve the needs of all of Wyoming's 400-plus student-athletes.

The facility's design will stay true to the architectural tradition of iconic sandstone buildings featured throughout the UW campus.

Located just beyond the north end zone, the High Altitude Performance Center will enhance the aesthetics of War Memorial Stadium. Due to its location, the HAPC will be highly visible for national television audiences. It will show the commitment that the state of Wyoming has in ensuring Wyoming Athletics continues to successfully compete at the NCAA Division I level -- the highest level of competition in college sports.

The ground level of the HAPC will house both an Olympic sport weight-training area and a separate strength and conditioning center for the Cowboy football team that will overlook Jonah Field. Also on the first floor will be a sports medicine area that will nearly double the size of its previous space, allowing for more effective and efficient treatment of UW student-athletes. The football locker room, like the football strength and conditioning area, will overlook the field and will include a player lounge.

The second floor will include an expansive academic center to house academic counselors, tutoring areas and a computer lab, as well as enhanced and renovated football offices, meeting rooms, a new recruiting lounge and the nutrition center/training table. The theater-style team meeting room will span both the first and second floors.

Construction on the project will begin after the conclusion of the 2016 Cowboy football season. It is estimated that the project will take 18-20 months to complete.

The original Curtis and Marian Rochelle Athletics Center was opened in 2001 at a total cost of \$9.4 million. Fundraising for the RAC included a historic \$4.2 million gift from the Rochelles, which was the largest donation in school history at the time. A total of 167 donors contributed to the original RAC.

About New Mexico: The Lobos head to Laramie with a 2-5 overall record and a 0-3 mark in conference play. New Mexico has lost five-straight after opening the season with a pair of wins. UNM fell at home last Saturday to Colorado State by a score of 36-7.

New Mexico averages 14 points per game and allows 27.9 points per game. The Lobos are recording 253 yards of offense per game. UNM rushes for 98.7 yards per game and passes for 155 yards. Defensively, New Mexico allows 362 yards of total offense, as teams rush for 155 yards per game and pass for 207 yards.

The New Mexico offense is paced by quarterback Terry Wilson Jr. He missed the last contest for the Lobos. He averages 176.3 yards passing per game. Running back Aaron Dumas averages 50.3 yards rushing per game with five yards per carry. Fellow running back Bobbi Cole adds 38 yards per game. Wide receiver Luke Wysong averages 31.7 yards receiving a game and also returned a punt for a score against Colorado State.

The Lobo defense is paced by defensive back Jerrick Reed II with 60 tackles on the season. He also has one interception and four pass breakups. Defensive back Tavian Combs has 56 tackles and leads the team with two interceptions. Defensive lineman Joey Noble leads the team with 11.5 tackles for loss and five sacks.

Kicker Andrew Shelley is 7-of-9 on the season in field goals. Punter Aaron Rodriguez averages 42.7 yards per punt.

Head Coach Danny Gonzales: Danny Gonzales, a native of Albuquerque who played football at Valley High School before playing for UNM and then serving as an assistant coach is in his second season with the Lobos.

Gonzales, who has taken part in bowl games in 14 of the past 16 seasons, enters his second season as the head coach of The University of New Mexico. Gonzales was hired on December 17, 2019.

The new Lobo head coach is certainly familiar with UNM, as a player, staff member and as a Lobo assistant coach, as well as through his time coaching against UNM. He joined his mentor and former coach Rocky Long as Lobo football players returning to coach their alma mater. In a 2006 article in the Albuquerque Journal, Long predicted that Gonzales would one day be the head coach of the Lobos.

Gonzales came to UNM after spending the past two seasons at Arizona State as defensive coordinator, and the previous seven before that as safeties coach and defensive coordinator at San Diego State. In 2018, he was a nominee for the Broyles Award, given to the most outstanding assistant coach in college football.

Gonzales has a pair of degrees from The University of New Mexico, earning his bachelor's degree in business administration and general management in 1998 and a master's degree in physical education and recreation in 2002.

Pokes' Overtime History: Wyoming has played 17 overtime games in its history. The most recent overtime game the Cowboys played was Oct. 24, 2020. The Cowboys lost at Nevada in that game by a score of 34-37 in a single overtime. Wyoming has played four overtime games at home in War Memorial Stadium. Two of Wyoming's 17 overtime games have been played on neutral sites. The other 11 overtime games have been played on the road.

RECAP: The Wyoming Cowboys and Montana State Bobcats waged a war of wills against each other on Saturday in Wyoming's War Memorial Stadium. In the end, it was an eight-play, 75-yard drive by the Cowboys that gave Wyoming a 19-16 lead with only 47 seconds remaining in the game to give UW the victory. Montana State fought to the very end, running out of time on its final possession of the game at the Wyoming 40-yard line.

The two teams entered the fourth quarter with Montana State holding a 7-3 lead, but in the first five possessions of the fourth quarter the two teams scored on each of those five drives -- the Cowboys scoring two touchdowns and a field goal, while the Bobcats converted a 53-yard field goal and a 75-yard TD drive.

Wyoming scored 16 of its 19 points in the fourth quarter, with scoring drives of 52, 67 and 75 yards.

Outstanding middle linebackers Chad Muma for Wyoming and Troy Andersen for Montana State didn't disappoint. Each ended the game with 11 tackles for the teams. Muma added one fumble recovery, one blocked field goal, a huge sack and 2.0 tackles for loss. Anderson had a pass breakup to go with his 11 tackles.

On special teams, Wyoming's Hoyland continued his outstanding play from a year ago, converting both of his field-goal attempts on the day from 37 and 25 yards out to improve his career field-goal statistics to 15 of 16 field goals made (93.8 percent). Cowboy redshirt freshman punter Ralph Fawaz had an amazing career debut, punting six times for a 45.7 yard average while placing five of his six punts inside the MSU 20-yard line and hitting a long punt of 54 yards on two different occasions.

Since taking over as head coach of the Cowboys in 2014, Bohl returned the Cowboys to their traditional brown jerseys and gold pants for home games and white jerseys and gold pants for road games. On Saturday against Montana State, the Cowboys wore new gold jerseys and white pants.

Senior wide receiver Eberhardt said he felt the Cowboys were confident going into the game and were confident when they began the game-winning scoring drive. He also gave a lot of credit to the 27,007 fans who showed up for the season opener on Saturday.

RECAP: The Wyoming Cowboys got off to a fast start and held off the Northern Illinois Huskies in the final minutes to earn a 50-43 win on the road in Huskie Stadium in DeKalb, Illinois on Saturday. Wyoming moved to 2-0 on the young season, as the 50 points was the most in a road contest since scoring 66 in three overtimes against UNLV during the 2016 season.

The Pokes held a 42-16 lead in the third quarter, but the Huskies answered with 27-straight points to take a 43-42 advantage with just under five minutes remaining in the contest.

Wyoming responded with a 10-play, 75 yard drive that ended in a nine yard touchdown rush from Sean Chambers that proved to be the game winner. Chambers found sophomore wide receiver Isaiah Neyor on a 30-yard pass to the NIU four-yard line to set up the score.

Chambers had a career day completing a career-high 13 passes for a career-high 204 yards, as he also tied a career-best with two touchdown throws. Neyor also hauled in four catches with a career-high two touchdown receptions, as he also rushed for one score on the day. It was the first multi-touchdown game through the air for a receiver since Austin Fort against New Mexico on Oct. 28, 2017. Senior running back Xazavian Valladay added 101 yards rushing and had two catches for 50 yards.

The Cowboy defense was paced by linebackers senior Chad Muma and sophomore Easton Gibbs, as both added 10 tackles. Muma also recorded a pick six for the first interception returned for a touchdown by the Cowboys since Logan Wilson against Utah State in 2019. Senior Miles Williams and Junior Rome Weber each added interceptions on the day for the Cowboys, as it marked the first time since the 2019 season against UNLV that the Pokes recorded three interceptions in a game.

The Cowboys recorded 395 yards of total offense for the game. Wyoming threw for 204 yards in the game and rushed for 191. The Pokes extended drive for the game going 9-of-13 on third down.

The Huskies recorded 477 yards of total offense in the game. NIU rushed for 244 yards on the afternoon and threw for 233 yards. Running back Harrison Waylee recorded 179 rushing in the game and became the first back to rush for over 150 yards on the Cowboy defense since Royce Freeman of Oregon during the 2017 season.

RECAP: The Wyoming Cowboys improved their record to 3-0 on Saturday, with a convincing 45-12 home win over Ball State. Wyoming's offense accumulated 378 yards of total offense, scored four touchdowns and a field goal. The Cowboy defense was outstanding, forcing three turnovers and returning two interceptions for TDs -- those two "Pick Six" were scored by nickel back Keyon Blankenbaker and linebacker Chad Muma.

Offensively, quarterback Sean Chambers completed 61 percent of his passes on the day (14 of 23) for 201 yards and one touchdown pass to tight end Treyton Welch. Wyoming utilized eight different receivers and four different running backs in the game, concluding the day with 177 rushing yards. Running backs Xazavian Valladay and Dawaiian McNeely each scored a rushing touchdown -- the first of McNeely's career. Chambers added a TD run of his own. Valladay had 61 rushing yards and 43 receiving for 104 all-purpose yards on the day. Wide receiver Isaiah Neyor caught four passes for 84 yards to lead the Pokes. The Cowboys committed no turnovers, compared to three by Ball State.

The Cowboy defense made a real statement with one of the best performances in recent history. UW's defenders not only scored two touchdowns of their own but they forced another huge turnover right before halftime. With the ball at the Wyoming 47-yard line, defensive lineman Victor Jones sacked Ball State quarterback Drew Plitt and knocked the ball loose. The ball bounded toward the Ball State end of the field and Cowboy defensive end Jaylen Pate recovered the ball all the way down at the Cardinals 31-yard line with only 42 seconds remaining in the half. That led to a Chambers one-yard rushing touchdown five plays later to give UW a 31-0 halftime lead.

The two "Pick Sixes" by the Cowboys was the first time a Wyoming defense had accomplished that since Sept. 23, 2016, when safety Marcus Epps and linebacker Logan Wilson each had interception returns for TDs against Eastern Michigan.

RECAP: The Wyoming Cowboys once again showed their resilience and comeback ability on Saturday, as they improved to 4-0 on the season and concluded their non-conference schedule undefeated, heading into a bye week.

Unlike last week, when Wyoming built a 31-0 halftime lead at home over Ball State on way to a 45-12 victory, the Cowboys started slow on Saturday at UConn. But as they've done twice before this season, against Montana State and Northern Illinois, the Pokes fought back from a 13-3 deficit at halftime to out-score the Huskies 21 to nine in the second half and record a 24-22 road win.

Wyoming's comeback was keyed by a critical defensive stand by the Pokes early in the fourth quarter. Trailing 13-10, the Cowboys saw the Huskies put together a long drive of 74 yards, moving all the way down to the Wyoming five-yard line. It was critical that UW hold UConn to a field goal and keep the game a one-possession game. The Wyoming defense would rise to the occasion. On a third and five from the Wyoming five, Cowboy defensive end Solomon Byrd combined with safety Rome Weber to sack Huskie quarterback Tyler Phommachanh for 12 yards, pushing the ball back to the 17-yard line. UConn place-kicker Joe McFadden entered the game and made a 35-yard field goal -- his third on the day -- to extend the Huskies' lead to 16-10. But allowing only a field goal meant the Cowboys were still within one touchdown of taking the lead.

Wyoming concluded the game with 352 yards of total offense (203 rushing and 149 passing) compared to 281 for UConn (110 rushing and 171 passing). Cowboy running backs Valladay and Swen combined for 185 for the 203 rushing yards for Wyoming. Valladay recorded his 12th career 100-yard rushing game and second of the season, running for 101 yards on 22 carries and one TD Saturday. Swen racked up 84 rushing yards on 15 carries and also scored one touchdown. Swen led the Pokes in all-purpose yardage with 168, including 84 rushing yards, seven receiving and 77 on kickoff returns. Valladay accounted for 134 all-purpose yards -- 101 rushing and 33 receiving.

The Cowboy passing game saw Chambers complete 58 percent of his passes (15 of 26 passes) on the day for 149 yards, one TD and two interceptions. Eberhardt caught three of those passes for 40 yards. Valladay, fullback/tight end Parker Christensen and wide receiver Joshua Cobbs also each had three receptions. Wide receiver Isaiah Neyor had two catches for 24 yards and the one receiving touchdown for the Cowboys.

Nickel back Keyon Blankenbaker led Wyoming in tackles, with seven, including six solo tackles. Defensive end Byrd had six tackles, 1.5 sacks and two quarterback hurries. Cornerback C.J. Coldon recorded five tackles, 1.0 tackle for a loss and one pass breakup, and defensive end Garrett Crall also had five tackles and four QB hurries. Safety Weber was credited with four tackles, 0.5 sacks and the huge pass breakup on UConn's two-point conversion to preserve Wyoming's two-point victory (24-22).

RECAP: It was a typical, hard-fought meeting between the Wyoming Cowboys and Air Force Falcons on Saturday night at Falcon Stadium on the Air Force Academy campus. In the end, Air Force prevailed 24-14 to hand Wyoming its first loss of the season. Wyoming moved to 4-1 and 0-1 in conference play. Air Force improved to 5-1 and 2-1 in the Mountain West.

The first half began with Air Force taking a 14-0 lead, but the Cowboys fought back to score two touchdowns in the final 4:38 of the half to tie that game at 14-14 and grab the momentum heading into halftime.

In the second half, Wyoming began with a promising drive that stalled at the Air Force 36. The Falcons took their opening drive of the third quarter and turned it into their third TD of the game to regain the lead at 21-14.

Air Force would engineer its fourth scoring drive of the game on its first possession of the fourth quarter, driving 67 yards in 15 plays and capping it off with a 26-yard field goal to conclude the scoring 24-14.

“We played inconsistently tonight and we got beat by a good football team,” said Wyoming head coach Craig Bohl. “We were going to need to get some turnovers and stay on the field offensively tonight, which we weren’t able to do.”

“To Air Force’s credit, they threw the ball well in the second half and we weren’t able to stop that.”

“I’ll be guarded in my comments until we can evaluate things on tape, but our players are disappointed and our coaches are disappointed. In the end, we will learn from tonight and get back at it tomorrow..”

“We knew this was going to be a hard-fought game. Our players fought hard, but we weren’t able to make enough plays at critical times, and Air Force did a good job of coming up with plays when they needed them.”

RECAP: The Wyoming Cowboys fell for the first time at home this season as the Fresno State Bulldogs captured a 17-0 win on Saturday in Laramie. The Cowboys are now 4-2 on the season and 0-2 in the Mountain West Conference. Fresno State improved to 5-2 overall and 2-1 in the conference.

Wyoming's defense held Fresno State to 259 yards of total offense. That was half of what the Bulldogs were averaging on the season. Fresno State came into the game averaging 519.8 yards per game. UW's defense also held FS 22 points under its season scoring average of 39.0 points per game.

But the Pokes turned the ball over five times on four interceptions and one lost fumble. Three of those turnovers led directly to Fresno State's 17 points. Two of the three turnovers in the second half gave the Bulldogs the ball at the Wyoming six-yard line, leading to a touchdown, and the 27-yard line, setting up a 41-yard field goal. The 17-0 shutout marked the first time Wyoming had been shutout since 2010 when they lost at TCU by a score 45-0.

"I thought our guys played hard, but we've got to play smarter and we've got to do a better job of taking care of the football.

"Obviously, we have to generate some points. It's important that I don't make any broad-based comments right now until we watch the tape, but if you look at productivity you've got six (consecutive) quarters without scoring any points, and that's going to make it hard to beat anybody.

Wyoming ended the game with 271 yards of total offense (128 rushing and 149 passing) to out-gain Fresno State. The Bulldogs accounted for 259 yards of total offense (163 rushing and only 96 passing).

Chambers completed 8 of 23 passes for 111 yards, threw three interceptions and lost one fumble. Williams complete 1 of 7 passes for 32 yards and threw one interception. Fresno State's Haener completed 15 of 28 passes for only 96 yards, but did throw two TD passes.

Chambers led Wyoming in rushing with 51 yards on 12 carries. Swen added 36 yards on seven carries, and Valladay had 35 rushing yards on nine attempts. Bulldog tailbacks Jordan Mims and Ronnie Rivers rushed for 78 and 73 yards, respectively, for a combined 151 yards.

Valladay moved into fourth place on Wyoming's career rushing list in Saturday's game. He now has 2,682 career rushing yards and moved past former Cowboy running back Wynel Seldon, who accounted for 2,672 rushing yards during his career from 2005-08.

Defensively, the Cowboys were led by linebacker Chad Muma and free safety Esaias Gandy, who were credited with 11 tackles each. Wyoming defensive end Solomon Byrd added six tackles and recorded UW's lone sack on the day. Fresno State free safety Evan Williams recorded seven tackles to go with his two interceptions.
