**OPENING TIP:** Saturday will mark the 500th game for **Tad Boyle** as a collegiate head coach. He is 290-209 in his 16th season leading an NCAA Division I program.

**ABOUT THE BUFFALOES:** Colorado opened the 2021-22 season in thrilling fashion with a 94-90 overtime win over Montana State on Nov. 9, at the CU Events Center. The Buffaloes overcame a 13-point second-half deficit to force overtime, then outscored the Bobcats 14-10 in the extra session to record their sixth-straight season-opening win.

Senior guard **Elijah Parquet**, a member of the Pac-12 Conference's All-Defensive Team in 2020-21, had the game's biggest offensive moment. Parquet's 3-pointer with 18 seconds left in regulation tied the game at 80 and sent it to overtime. He finished with 17 points, hitting 5 of 11 from the field and 6 of 9 from the free throw line - all

Five Colorado players scored in double-figures in the opener - a feat achieved only once in 32 games in 2020-21. Two of those came from sophomores who had break out games after limited action a year ago. **Keeshawn Barthelemy** had a game and career-high 19 points and dished out five assists. **Nique Clifford** had 11 points and nine rebounds - both personal highs. Clifford had just 14 points and four rebounds total in 14 games as a freshman.

Senior forward **Evan Battey** had 16 points on a perfect 6 of 6 from the field; a career best for field goals made without a miss. Sophomore forward **Jabari Walker** had 14 points, eight rebounds and a career-best three steals.

**DEBUTS:** Colorado sophomore's **Jabari Walker** and **Tristan da Silva** made their first career starts against Montana State, while true freshmen **K.J. Simpson** and **Lawson Lovering** made their collegiate debuts.

**NOTING THE OPENER:** Colorado improved to 84-35 (.706) in all-time season openers and has won its last six. The Buffaloes are 10-2 under head coach **Tad Boyle** and 37-5 in overall season openers since 1980-81.

The Buffaloes improved to 95-24 (.798) all-time in home openers and have won their last 14, making Boyle a perfect 12-0 in home openers. The Buffaloes have won 20 of their last 21.

Colorado went to overtime in a season opener for the first time since Nov. 24, 1996, when the Buffaloes edged Drake 82-80 at the CU Events Center. That 1996-97 team, led by sophomore point guard Chauncey Billups, would win 21 games, finish second in the inaugural season of the Big 12 Conference and make the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

**NONCONFERENCE NUMBERS:** Colorado is 103-32 (.763) in nonconference regular season games under head coach **Tad Boyle** including a 56-15 mark (.789) since the beginning of the 2014-15 season.

Colorado is 77-5 in nonconference home games under Boyle, a record which includes a perfect 6-0 mark in postseason action.

**NOVEMBER 'REIGN':** Since the beginning of the 2017-18 season, Colorado has the best winning percentage in the month of November in NCAA Division I. The Buffaloes have won their last 11 games played during the month, a streak that began with a 93-56 win at Air Force on Nov. 24, 2018.

Mexico shot 53 percent overall and scored 56 second half points to outlast FAU.

Guard Jaelen House, a transfer from Arizona State, scored 30 points and dished out six assists in his New Mexico debut. Forward Jay Allen-Tovar had 18 points and led the Lobos with eight rebounds and three blocked shots. Forward Gethro Muscadin had 18 points on 6 of 8 shooting off the bench.

New Mexico, which finished 6-16 in 2020-21, shared the eighth spot with Wyoming in the 2021-22 Mountain West Conference Preseason Poll.

**THE SERIES:** This will be the 16th meeting in the series with Colorado holding an 8-7 edge. The Buffaloes have won the last two, a home-and-home series played in 2017 and '18. Colorado claimed a 75-57 win at the CU Events Center on Dec. 6, 2017. In the return trip to The Pit a year later, the Buffaloes overcame a 17-point deficit to sneak out of Albuquerque with a 78-75 victory on Dec. 11, 2018.

Colorado's **Evan Battey** is the only player on either roster to compete in that contest. Battey, a redshirt freshman at the time, just missed a double-double scoring 10 points and grabbing nine rebounds. Current Colorado seniors **Elijah Parquet** and **Benan Ersek** were on the Buffaloes' roster for that game, but did not play.

Tad Boyle is 2-1 as a head coach against New Mexico. This will be Richard Pitino's first game against Colorado as a head coach.

**BATTEY MILESTONES:** Senior forward **Evan Battey**, Colorado's active leader in scoring and rebounding, scored 16 points in the win over Montana State becoming the 44th player in team history to reach 900 - finishing at 915

With 85 points, Battey would become the 38th Colorado player to reach 1,000 in his career. Additionally, he would be the fourth member of the 2017 signing class to reach that milestone. McKinley Wright IV (2017-21) leads that group at sixth overall at 1,857. Tyler Bey (2017-20) is 29th at 1,113 while D'Shawn Schwartz (2017-21) is tied for 34th at 1,026.

Battey is 32nd in career rebounds at 518, needing 11 to jump into CU's top 30.

**LEADERS OF THE PAC:** Colorado has the second-best win total (57) and winning percentage (.704) among Pac-12 teams since February 2019. Colorado was 12-4 over the final two months of the 2018-19 season, culminating in a spot in the NIT Quarterfinals. The Buffaloes were 21-11 in 2019-20, well in line for an NCAA Tournament bid before the season was shut down on March 12 due to the coronavirus pandemic. Colorado was 23-9 in 2020-21, tying for the third best win total in team history and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Named after Class of 1993 Hall of Famer and 16-year professional basketball player Julius Erving, the annual honor in its eighth year recognizes the top small forwards in Division I men's college basketball. A national committee of top college basketball personnel determined the watch list of 20 candidates.

Walker averaged 7.6 points and 4.3 rebounds while shooting 53 percent from the floor as a true freshman in 2020-21. He earned Pac-12 Conference All-Freshman Team honors last year and was an honorable mention selection to the Preseason All-Pac-12 team this season.

Fans are encouraged to participate in Fan Voting presented by Dell Technologies in each of the three rounds. In late January, the watch list of 20 players for the 2022 Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award will be narrowed to 10 and then in late February to just 5. In March the five finalists will be presented to Mr. Erving and the Hall of Fame's selection committee where a winner will be selected.

**BUFFS SIGN TWO TO NLI:** Joe Hurlburt (6-10, 225, F/C, Enderlin, N.D.) and RJ Smith (6-4, 184, G, Chino, Calif.) have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball and continue their education at the University of Colorado in 2022-23.

Hurlburt, entering his senior season at Enderlin Area High School, was the 2021 Gatorade Player of the Year for the state of North Dakota. He averaged 22.6 points, 14.3 rebounds and just under five assists per game as a junior for the Eagles who finished 18-4, advancing to the Class B, Region 1 semifinals.

A four-star prospect, Hurlburt is a two-time member of the Class B All-State Team and a three-time All-Region 1 pick. Rivals lists him as the 113th ranked player in the nation while 247Sports tabs him at 121 and the top recruit in North Dakota. He is already Enderlin's career leader in points (1,607), rebounds, 1,133, assists (259) and blocked shots (180).

Smith is entering his senior season at Damien High School, one of the elite programs in Southern California. As a junior, Smith was named to the All-CIF Southern Section Open Division Team as he helped the Spartans to a 29-4 record and a spot in the CIF State Open Division regional semifinals.

Smith is a two-time, first team All-Area selection by the San Gabriel Valley Tribune. He was named Junior Class All-State First Team by CalHiSports.com. Smith played his club basketball for Prodigy Athletic out of Rancho Cucamonga, Calif.

**EXHIBITION SPLIT:** Colorado was 1-1 in its two exhibitions. The Buffaloes rolled to a 78-48 home win over the Colorado School of Mines on Oct. 27 and fell in a charity exhibition at Nebraska, 82-67 on Oct. 31.

Eleven Buffaloes scored in the win over Mines led by 12 points from freshman **K.J. Simpson**. Classmate **Lawson Lovering**, nearly had a double-double with 10 points and nine rebounds. Senior **Evan Battey** pitched in 10 points.

limitations for the first time since February 2020. The announced crowd of 2,406, while just over 20 percent capacity, was modest for an exhibition but a wonderful sight for a team that saw only a handful of home games last year with a limited number of friends and family capped at 100.

There were some jitters, understandably, for a group – aside from seniors Battey and **Elijah Parquet** – that haven't played in front of a collegiate crowd. Colorado struggled offensively from the outside – only 2 of 17 from 3-point range – but the Buffaloes evened it out with a solid defensive performance.

Colorado outrebounded the Orediggers by 20 (56-36) and forced 15 turnovers. Mines shot just 28 percent for the game

Colorado also helped themselves getting to the line. The second-best free throw shooting team in the nation a season ago, Colorado made 20 of 26 from the line.

Against Nebraska, the Huskers used a barrage of 3-pointers to build an early lead in Colorado's first trip to Lincoln since leaving the Big 12 Conference in 2011. Nebraska drained 12 3-pointers and hit 44 percent from long range. Colorado struggled to defend the outside shot early, leaving the Huskers with wide open looks.

Sophomore **Nique Clifford** led Colorado with 12 points and eight rebounds, sharing the team lead in both categories. **Keeshawn Barthelemy** had 12 points while **Luke O'Brien** pitched in 11. Battey had eight rebounds.

Colorado continued its exhibition season struggle from the 3-point

arc. The Buffaloes missed their first eight attempts and finished 3 of 19. Colorado was 2 of 17 in its exhibition against Mines.

Against Mines Colorado made up for their 3-point drought with stout defense and scoring at will in the paint. Against Nebraska, neither of those materialized.

Colorado had its opportunities. The Buffaloes outrebounded Nebraska by 10 (47-37) and had 23 offensive rebounds, resulting in 19 second chance points. Colorado still scored 36 points in the paint, but overall shot just 32 percent for the game (23 of 71).

Proceeds from the Nebraska charity exhibition went toward three Lincoln-area organizations affected by the COVID-19 pandemic: the TeamMates mentoring program; the YWCA of Lincoln for its Employ402 program and the Nebraska Greats Foundation.

Nebraska is scheduled to return the trip to Colorado for an exhibition in 2022 to benefit organizations in the Boulder area.

**PAC-12 PRESEASON POLL/HONORS:** Senior **Evan Battey** was named to the media's All-Pac-12 Preseason Team. He was an honorable mention all-league pick last year and a member of the Pac-12 All-Tournament Team. Sophomore **Jabari Walker** was given honorable mention on the preseason all-conference squad.

Colorado was picked to finish sixth in the annual Pac-12 Preseason Media Poll. The Buffaloes received 235 points, just 10 behind Arizona and Oregon State which tied for fourth at 245. UCLA was the overwhelming favorite to win the title with 404 points and 30 of 32 first place votes. Oregon came in second at 373 followed by USC with 320.

Arizona State was seventh with 224 points followed by Washington State (221), Stanford (151), Utah (105), Washington (85) and California (44).

**BOULDER** — Colorado coach **Tad Boyle** knew his young Buffaloes would endure some growing pains this season.

But his Buffs barely escaped a very painful season opener Tuesday, overcoming a 13-point second-half deficit to force overtime, then outscoring Montana State 14-10 in the extra period for a 94-90 victory at the CU Events Center.

**Keeshawn Barthelemy** led five Buffs in double figures with 19 points. **Elijah Parquet** added 17 and **Evan Battey**, despite playing with foul trouble for much of the game, finished with 16 points. **Jabari Walker** chipped in 14 and **Nique Clifford** scored 11 off the bench and added nine rebounds.

Abdul Mohamed and Jubilé Belo each had 16 points for MSU.

CU built a seven-point lead early in the game, but foul trouble, turnovers and some defensive lapses allowed the Bobcats to take a 38-35 lead into intermission.

CU's troubles continued early in the second half, as Montana State built a 13-point lead, 51-38. But CU slowly chipped away at the lead and went ahead with just under three minutes to play before Montana State regained a five-point advantage with less than a minute remaining in regulation.

Battey hit two free throws, MSU missed the front end of a one-and-one and Parquet hit maybe the biggest shot of the game, a 3-pointer off an assist from Walker to tie the game at 80-80 and send it to overtime.

CU scored the first five points of the extra period, with Battey tallying the first bucket and Parquet adding a free throw and basket to put CU in control for good.

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** The Buffs started strong, hitting their first six field goal tries, including four 3-pointers, to take a 20-13 lead nine minutes in.

But from that point on, things went south. Montana State slowly chipped away at the lead as the Buffs committed some critical turnovers and also ran into foul trouble inside. Battey played just six minutes in the first half after two early fouls, and freshman **Lawson Lovering** was whistled for his second soon thereafter.

That opened up the paint for the Bobcats and they took advantage. MSU finally tied the game at 33-33 late in the first half on a RaeQuan Battle dunk, then took the lead with 37 seconds left in the half on another dunk. CU momentarily tied the game at 35-35, but Battle hit a 3-pointer at the buzzer on an inbounds play and the Buffs trailed by three at intermission, 38-35.

CU's woes continued in the opening minutes of the second half. Battey drew his third foul early in the period and Lovering was whistled for his fourth and fifth soon thereafter. That opened the door for an 11-1 MSU run and Colorado trailed by 13 points, 51-38, less than four minutes into the half.

But the Buffs' defense finally started to kick in. Colorado managed to cut the deficit back to single digits at several junctures over the next eight minutes, then put together an 11-2 run to close the deficit to one, 70-69, with just more than five minutes to play.

**Tristan da Silva** started the 11-2 run with a bucket inside before Walker scored on a drive. Clifford then hit two free throws and Barthelemy hit a layup to cut MSU's lead to 68-66.

MSU temporarily stopped the run with a Belo bucket, but Walker added a three-point play with 5:05 to go to pull CU within one, 70-69.

The Bobcats then hit a 3-pointer to extend their lead to four, but Colorado came back again and finally took the lead.

Battey hit a jumper at the 4:25 mark to pull CU within two before Walker had a nice assist to Clifford, who cashed in a dunk to tie the game at 73-73. Parquet then hit two free throws with just under three to play and Colorado had a 75-73 lead.

But the Bobcats responded with five straight points to go up 78-75 with 1:44 to play, then pushed their lead to five with 53 seconds remaining, 80-75.

The Buffs, though, had one more rally in their pocket. Battey hit two free throws to cut the deficit to three before MSU's Xavier Bishop missed the front end of a one-and-one free throw opportunity. Parquet then drained a 3-pointer off a great assist from Walker to tie the game at 80-80 with 18 seconds remaining.

MSU called a timeout with 10 seconds remaining on the ensuing possession, but turned the ball over under the basket to send the game into overtime.

Battey finally gave the Buffs the lead for good early in the overtime period, scoring inside after an offensive rebound by Barthelemy. Parquet hit one of two free throws before he grabbed an offensive rebound and scored after an MSU miss, giving CU an 85-80 lead with 2:30 to play.

Colorado then pushed its lead to 91-82 in the final minute of overtime before MSU made a late push with five straight points. But Barthelemy hit two free throws with 13 seconds remaining to give CU a 93-87 lead and Parquet hit one more free throw after an MSU 3-pointer to wrap up the 94-90 win.
