AROUND THE MOUNTAIN WEST

- Utah State can clinch the MW Mountain Division title and a spot in the 2021 MW Football Championship Game with a victory over Wyoming and a Boise State loss to New Mexico.
- The Aggies are one of just four FBS programs with a 5-0 record in road games this season.
- San Diego State, which controls its destiny in the MW West Division, is one of just 15 FBS teams with one loss or fewer this season.
- Air Force (7-3), Boise State (6-4), Fresno State (8-3), Nevada (7-3), San Diego State (9-1) and Utah State (8-2) are bowl eligible. The MW's six bowl eligible teams are tied for the third-most amongst the 10 FBS conferences, trailing only the Big Ten and SEC.
 - San José State can reach bowl eligibility with a victory over Fresno State on Nov. 25.
 - Wyoming can become eligible for the postseason on Nov. 20 with a road victory over Utah State.
- In 2021, the Mountain West has five victories over autonomous-5 opponents, the
 most of any non-autonomous-5 conference. Including all 10 FBS conferences,
 the MW is tied for the third-most A5 victories with the ACC, and trails only the
 Big Ten and SEC.
- This season, the Mountain West has a pair of nonconference victories over nationally-ranked opponents, including Fresno State's win over then-No. 13/13 UCLA and Boise State's defeat over then-No. 10/10 BYU. The MW is tied for fourth nationally with two victories against top-25 nonconference opponents, trailing only the Big 12, Big Ten and SEC (3).
- The Mountain West is one of just two FBS conferences with at least two nonconference victories against top-15 opponents (SEC 3).
- The league has a .500 record against opponents from the Pac-12 in 2021.
- Boise State and Fresno State both have two top-25 victories.
 - The Broncos went on the road and defeated No. 10/10 BYU (26-17) on Oct. 9 and won at No. 25 Fresno State (40-14) on Nov. 6.
 - The Bulldogs defeated No. 13/13 UCLA (40-37) on Sept. 18 and No. 20/21 San Diego State (30-20) on Oct. 30. Both wins came on the road, marking the first season Fresno State has earned a pair of road top-25 victories.
- In nonconference play, the Mountain West has compiled a 30-19 (.612) record, the fifth-best win percentage nationally and best among the non-autonomous-5 conferences.
- San Diego State and Fresno State have both been nationally ranked at some point in 2021. This is the sixth-consecutive season at least two Mountain West programs have been nationally ranked.
- San Diego State opened the 2021 season with a pair of victories over autonomous-5 opponents, including Pac-12 South Division leader Utah and Arizona. The Aztecs are the only non-autonomous-5 team with multiples wins over autonomous-5 opponents this season.
- Utah State has is sitting at 8-2 overall, 5-1 in the MW, and leads the Mountain Division. The Aggies seven-game improvement from 2020 is tied for best turnaround nationally (Michigan, Michigan State and Northern Illinois).
- On Oct. 16 against UNLV, Utah State senior Savon Scarver tied the NCAA and Mountain West record for career kickoff returns for a touchdown (7).

AROUND THE MOUNTAIN WEST (CONT.)

- Aggies senior WR Deven Thompkins leads the nation in receiving yards per game, averaging 144.1 yards and total receiving yards (1,441). Thompkins is 98 yards shy of entering the MW's top-five in single-season receiving yards.
- Dating back to the 2019 season, the Mountain West has won 16 games against autonomous-5 opponents, including 14 against the Pac-12.
- In the past 17 years, the Mountain West has been the top nonautonomous 5 conference nine times and second five times.
- The Mountain West has been nationally-ranked in 23 of the last 30 College Football Playoff Rankings.
- The Mountain West produced the first non-automatic-qualifying FBS team into a BCS bowl game (Utah - 2005 Fiesta Bowl) and into the College Football Playoff (Boise State - 2014 Fiesta Bowl).

The Mountain West, which has earned 106 bowl bids, including Boise State's 2018 appearance vs. Boston College, since 1999 and holds a 58-47 (.552) all-time record, owns the third-best win percentage in bowl games in the last 16 seasons among the 10 FBS conferences (.567), trailing only the SEC (.638) and Sun Belt (.582).

MOUNTAIN WEST COVID-19 CANCELLATION POLICY

The Mountain West 2021-22 COVID-19 Game Cancellation Policy applies to all MW-sponsored sports.

These provisions will continue to be reviewed by the MW Directors of Athletics and the MW Health & Safety Advisory Committee and will be adjusted should circumstances warrant.

- If a Mountain West contest cannot be played as scheduled due to a team's inability to participate related to COVID-19 issues, the game shall be considered a forfeit for that team and will not be rescheduled.
- If both teams are unable to participate due to COVID-19 factors, the game shall be declared a "no contest".
- There shall be no minimum roster thresholds for competition.
- Forfeited Mountain West games will be recorded as a loss for the team unable to compete, and as a win for the scheduled opponent, for the purposes of Conference standings, determining MW championship participants and MW championships seeding only. Per the NCAA, this does not change an institution's official won-lost record.

Situations related to participation in MW championships will be addressed on a case-by-case basis within the context of this policy and applicable MW Handbook language. Tiebreaking and seeding procedures will be implemented consistent with these provisions and, if it becomes necessary, modified to utilize unbalanced formulas.

MOUNTAIN WEST HISTORY

The Mountain West was conceived on May 26, 1998, when the presidents of eight institutions — Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming — decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference. The split from a former 16-team conference re-established continuity and stability among the membership within the new league and signaled the continuation of its tradition-rich, long-standing athletic rivalries. Three of the MW's eight original members have been conference rivals since the 1960s (New Mexico, Wyoming and Colorado State), while San Diego State (1978) and Air Force (1980) were longtime members as well. UNLV and TCU entered the fold in 1996 and the Rebels continued as one of the original eight institutions that formed the MW in 1999. TCU re-joined the group with its first year of competition in the Mountain West in 2005-06. With conference realignment sweeping the nation in recent years, the MW has been proactive in addressing membership changes. Boise State University joined the Mountain West in 2011-12, followed by Fresno State and the University of Nevada on July 1, 2012. Also on July 1, 2012, the University of Hawai'i became a football-only member of the Conference. On July 1, 2013, the Mountain West further expanded when San José State University and Utah State University joined the Conference, bringing to 11 the number of full-time member institutions and 12 football-playing members. On July 1, 2014, the Colorado College women's soccer program became the first non-football affiliate member of the Mountain West, expanding that sport to 12 Conference participants.

When the Mountain West officially began operations on July 1, 1999, the new league had in place a seven-year contract with ESPN, giving the broadcast entity exclusive national television rights to MW football and men's basketball, and three-year agreements to send the league's football champion to the Liberty Bowl and a second team to the Las Vegas Bowl. Commissioner Thompson also arranged a third bowl tie-in each of the first three seasons (1999 Motor City, 2000 Silicon Valley, 2001 New Orleans) before securing a four-year deal with the Emerald Bowl in San Francisco in 2002.

Entering the 2021 season, the MW has nine (9) postseason opportunities, including a spot in a New Year's Six Bowl (highest ranked non-autonomous 5 champion), six (6) primary bowl positions with the Jimmy Kimmel Los Angeles Bowl, Arizona Bowl, Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, New Mexico Bowl, SoFi Hawai'i Bowl and an ESPN Events-operated bowl, likely to be held in the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex - and two (2) secondary positions.

An innovator in the postseason bowl structure, the MW engineered many "firsts," as league teams have participated in seven inaugural bowl games (2000 Silicon Valley, 2001 New Orleans, 2002 San Francisco (Emerald), 2005 Poinsettia, 2006 New Mexico, 2015 Arizona, 2015 Cure), as well as placing the first non-automatic-qualifying FBS team into a BCS bowl game with Utah's appearance in the 2005 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and into the College Football Playoff (CFP) with Boise State's selection to the 2014 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.


