## THE BREAKDOWN

- Fresno State will host New Mexico on Saturday for Senior Day.
- Fresno State will honor 17 seniors who have exhausted their eligibility.
- Fresno State leads the all-time series with the Lobos, 13-5.

## THE BONES

- Fresno State Athletics is celebrating its centennial year and the 2021 football season is the 100th season of competition in program history.
- New Mexico is 3-6 (1-4 MW) this season, coming off a loss to UNLV.
- Saturday's game will be the 19th meeting all-time between the Bulldogs and Lobos. The 'Dogs currently lead the series 13-5. The 'Dogs have won 10 out of the last 12 meetings.
- Fresno State will honor 17 seniors this weekend, all of which have exhausted their collegiate eligibility.
- Fresno State prepares to play back-to-back home games for the first time this season.
- Fresno State junior wide receiver Erik Brooks has been named a Burlsworth Trophy nominee, the organization announced Nov. 2.
- Fresno State's 2021 team captains are quarterback Jake Haener, running back Ronnie Rivers, defensive end David Perales and linebacker Tyson Maeva.
- With a win against Nevada on Oct. 23, Fresno State became bowl eligible for the first time since 2018.
- Whether it be transfers or true freshmen, Fresno State has seen a handful of fresh faces see their first taste of Bulldog game action through the first 10 games this season. Twenty seven first-year 'Dogs have played in at least one game on the year.
- The Bulldogs have made quick work on the offensive scoring drives, having 10 touchdown scoring drives this season that have been scored in less than 1:00.
- Fresno State's top two receivers hail from the Central Valley. Jalen Cropper and Josh Kelly have paced the team and the stacked wide receiver room all season long.
- With 79 yards rushing against Nevada, Rivers made the jump to third in Fresno State history with 3,281 career rushing yards. Rivers slightly surpassed Ryan Mathews on the list, who left Fresno State with 3,280. Robbie Rouse (4,647) and Ron Rivers (3,473) are the only former Bulldogs ahead of him.
- Haener has passed for 3,167 yards and 25 touchdowns so far this season. Haener became the seventh Bulldog to have a 3,000-yard passing season in the history of the season - he joins Kevin Sweeney (1984), Trent Dilfer (1992, 1993), David Carr (2001), Paul Pinegar (2005), Derek Carr (2011, 2021, 2013) and Marcus McMaryion (2018).
- QB Jake Haener has 10 career 300-yard passing games, in just 15 career games. The senior passed Kevin Sweeney (1983-86) on the all-time list and is tied for third in program history with 10 300-yard passing games in a career.
- Fresno State is No. 5 in the FBS in fumbles recovered this season (10). The Bulldogs have recovered at least one fumble in all but one game on the year, with a season-best two at then-No. 13 UCLA.
- Fresno State's nine interceptions is its most since 2019 when the 'Dogs had 11. The Bulldogs' streak of four-straight games with an interception is the longest streak since Fresno State had at least one in eight games in 2018.

**DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR WILLIAM INGE**

“Our players are eager to get back out there. We had some players come in yesterday wishing they could get on the field and practice. We can tell by the messages we’ve heard and the eagerness to watch the film that they want to clean up this picture. That is a great feeling for us as a coaching staff to hear and see that coming from our players.”

“When the defense comes on the field, you need to stop the surge. That’s what playing on defense is all about. You come on as a fireman. You put the fire out and get the ball back for the offense.”

**OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR RYAN GRUBB**

“You can’t look at New Mexico’s record. When you watch the games that the Lobos have played this season, you see the number of TFLs and the problems that they’ve caused for good football teams. Their defense makes it difficult. We’ll have to be on all cylinders to beat these guys. This is the same defense that we played against last season and lost to. That challenge for our team is exciting. I think it’s exactly the challenge we need to bounce back.”

**HEAD COACH KALEN DEBOER**

“We have 17 seniors, and 10 of those are starters. We have a great group with a ton of class and integrity. We were hurt after the loss but the response of the team to get back up and fight is coming from this group of seniors. This is a group that puts the team first and sticks together. It’s a big week for them. It’s also a big week for us to get back on track.”

“We need to be positive and bring the energy this week. We can only worry about what we can control. We still have big games to play. This game is big and next week is even bigger. We aren’t out of the race to make it to the Mountain West Championship. We aren’t in control of our own destiny, but let’s finish strong to make sure we are right there if some things go our way.”

## THE LOBOS

### SCOUTING

New Mexico is 3-6 (1-4 MW) this season, coming off a loss to UNLV.

UNLV took advantage of three fumbles, scoring 17 points off those turnovers and that was enough for UNLV to end its 14-game losing streak as New Mexico lost 24-17 to the Rebels in front of 14,007 at University Stadium.

The Lobos won their first two contests to open the 2021 season before suffering a five-game losing streak. New Mexico's lone conference win came on Oct. 23 after defeating Wyoming on the road 14-3, snapping the losing streak.

### SERIES HISTORY

Saturday's game will be the 19th meeting all-time between the Bulldogs and Lobos. The 'Dogs currently lead the series 13-5. The 'Dogs have won 10 out of the last 12 meetings.

Fresno State is 7-1 in games against New Mexico played in Fresno. The 'Dogs have won the last three contests played in Bulldog Stadium.

The two teams have met nine times before as conference opponents with the 'Dogs winning four of five games as WAC foes from 1992-95 & 1998 before the two became conference foes again in the Mountain West in 2012. In four meetings as MW opponents, the 'Dogs are 4-1 with two wins on the road and two wins at home.

The only loss to New Mexico since joining the MW was in 2020, snapping the Bulldogs' seven-game winning streak against the Lobos.

### LAST TIME

Once owning a 31-21 lead midway through the third quarter, Fresno State's hopes to leave the desert with a win were dashed after surrendering 28 unanswered points before tacking on a late score to fall 49-39 to New Mexico on Saturday night at Sam Boyd Stadium.

Fresno State totaled 408 yards of offense with 350 of those coming off the arm of Jake Haener who was 26-of-43 through the air and tossed three touchdowns. Jalen Cropper hauled in a career-high 12 receptions for 134 yards and a touchdown. Fresno State's local receiving trio of Cropper, Josh Kelly (96) and Mac Dalena (88) accounted for 318 yards.

New Mexico's offense totaled 495 yards and went an astounding 12-of-16 on third downs while its defense produced eight sacks. It was the most since their program-record nine sacks in 2005.

## FRESNO STATE NOTES

### THANK YOU, SENIORS

Fresno State will honor 17 seniors this weekend, all of which have exhausted their collegiate eligibility.

Nick Abbs (OL), Alex Akingbulu (OL), Kevin Atkins (DL), DaRon Bland (DB), Ryan Boehm (DL), Jason Diaz (DB), Kenny Gagnon (DB), Kwami Jones (DL), Tyson Maeva (LB), Arron Mosby (DL), Deonte Perry (DB), Ronnie Rivers (RB), Juan Rodriguez (TE), Cesar Silva (K), Matt Smith (OL), Jacob Westberry (LS), and Keric Wheatfall (WR) will be honored prior to kickoff on Saturday.

### TOUGH STRETCH

Since its bye week (Oct. 9), Fresno State has played four tough Mountain West matchups.

Coming out of the bye week, the Bulldogs traveled to face a 4-1 Wyoming team on the road. The 'Dogs were going up against a run-heavy offense and a stingy defense. Fresno State, for the first time on the year, was able to show off its run game as it ran for 163 yards compared to only 96 through the air. Fresno State left Laramie with a 17-0 victory. It was the second shutout for the 'Dogs this season.

The Bulldogs came home to host Nevada, the top offense in the Mountain West behind the arm of QB Carson Strong. Fresno State proved it was the superior team that week, defeating Nevada 34-32 at Bulldog Stadium. Fresno State had more of a balanced attack against the Wolf Pack, passing for 256 yards and running for 150. The Bulldog defense sacked Strong five times, and held the Pack to only 47 yards rushing.

Switching up from a heavy offensive attack, the Bulldogs moved on to a ranked San Diego State team who has a name for itself as one of the top defenses in the country. Fresno State brought home a 30-20 win in the Battle for the Old Oil Can, en route to defeating its second ranked team of the season and blemishing SDSU's perfect record this season. Fresno State again used the power in the run game, rushing for 179 yards and adding 306 through the air.

Looking to win its fourth-straight game, Fresno State faltered to Boise State last weekend, 40-14. The Bulldogs had a tough stretch of games, and were headed into a matchup with a Boise State team that always puts up a tough battle. Fresno State gave up

### SHORT STAY

For the second time this season, Fresno State has dropped out of the national polls.

Entering last week's contest, the Bulldogs were the No. 25 team in the AP poll and the No. 23 team in the initial CFP ranking. Following its loss to Boise State on Nov. 6, Fresno State drops out of the ranking.

Fresno State earned its first national ranking following its win at then-No. 13 UCLA (Sept. 18), and remained ranked for two weeks before falling at Hawai'i. The Bulldogs earned a spot back in the rankings following their 30-20 road win at then-No. 23 San Diego State (Oct. 30).

No Mountain west school appeared in the rankings this week.

### SO YOU'RE SAYING THERES A CHANCE

With the Bulldogs seeking their first return to the Mountain West Championship since 2018, all eyes are on the road to the championship.

Although suffering a loss to West Division opponent Hawai'i (Oct. 2), and its second MW loss to Mountain Division opponent Boise State (Nov. 6), Fresno State is still in the mix to win the West Division title and make its way back to the Mountain West Championship game this season.

Entering Week 10, the Bulldogs no longer control their own destiny and will need some help. Fresno State is 3-1 against its West Division opponents, and 1-1 against its Mountain Division opponents.

Around the Mountain West this week, Nevada and San Diego State will play a pivotal West Division game in Carson, Calif. on Saturday. Utah State will play at San Jose State, as the Aggies take on the reigning MW Champions in San Jose.

With a win this weekend, Fresno State would move back in to a tie for second place of the West Division with the winner of the San Diego State-Nevada matchup.

Looking ahead, San Diego State plays at UNLV on Nov. 19 and Nevada hosts Air Force on that same day.

## BACK-TO-BACK

Fresno State prepares to play back-to-back home games for the first time this season.

The Bulldogs have a 4-1 record at home, and are coming off of their first loss at Bulldog Stadium of the season. Fresno State's loss to Boise State last weekend was its first loss at Bulldog Stadium since Oct. 24, 2020 in the season opener against Hawai'i.

The Bulldogs' schedule has alternated fairly well between road and home games this season, having played one home game and one road game every other week with the exception of back-to-back road games at Hawai'i and Wyoming with a bye week in between.

Fresno State has its second bye week of the season next week, before traveling to face San Jose State in a rivalry game on Thanksgiving Day.

## BURLSWORTH CANDIDATE

Fresno State junior wide receiver Erik Brooks has been named a Burlsworth Trophy nominee, the organization announced Nov. 2. The Burlsworth Trophy is given to the most outstanding football player in America who began his career as a walk-on and has shown outstanding performance on the field. Each nominee must have begun his first season of participation with a FBS (DI) football program without financial aid of any kind from his university's athletic department.

Brooks is one of 88 nominees from across the FBS this season.

When Brooks began his career as a Bulldog in 2018, he did so as a walk-on with no Division I scholarship offers. Brooks joined a wide receiver room that was deep with talent from the get-go, coming in as KeeSean Johnson and Jamire Jordan were seniors and two of the top wide receivers in the conference that season. The wide receiver position at Fresno State has continued to build its depth since Brooks' arrival, but he has quickly made himself a part of the rotation.

After utilizing a redshirt season in 2018, Brooks saw limited action in 2019 but played in all six games and started one in 2020.

Brooks was placed on scholarship by head coach Kalen DeBoer and staff during fall camp entering the 2021 season. Watch here for the moment Brooks found out he was being awarded a scholarship. The Corona, Calif. native has registered 15 catches for 165 yards in nine games this year.

The Burlsworth Trophy award ceremony to honor the three finalists and to announce the 2021 winner on December 6th at 7:00pm CST at Crystal Bridges Museum in Bentonville, Arkansas.

## CAPTAIN STATUS

Fresno State's 2021 team captains are quarterback Jake Haener, running back Ronnie Rivers, defensive end David Perales and linebacker Tyson Maeva.

Maeva, in his first year with the program after transferring in from FIU this spring, quickly earned the team captain role with the Bulldogs. Rivers and Perales join Maeva as first-year team captains this season.

## GOING BOWLING

With a win against Nevada on Oct. 23, Fresno State became bowl eligible for the first time since 2018.

Fresno State's last bowl game was a memorable one, defeating Arizona State 31-20 in the Mitsubishi Motors Las Vegas Bowl at Sam Boyd Stadium in 2018. The win in the bowl game secured Fresno State's first-ever 12-win season.

Running back Ronnie Rivers was named the game's Most Valuable Player after accounting for 286 all-purpose yards, the fourth-most in a game in program history. He totaled 212 yards rushing and two touchdowns on 24 carries, while adding 41 punt return yards and 33 yards receiving.

With a bowl appearance this season, Fresno State will play in its 15th bowl game since 2000, and its 30th in program history.

## NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

Whether it be transfers or true freshmen, Fresno State has seen a handful of fresh faces see their first taste of Bulldog game action through the first 10 games this season. Twenty seven first-year 'Dogs have played in at least one game on the year.

Evan Bennett (DT), DaRon Bland (CB), Elijah Gates (FS), Ty Jones (WR), and Tyson Maeva (LB) have been new faces to earn starts this season. All five Bulldogs are transfers with Bennett coming from Oregon State, Bland from Sacramento State, Gates from UCLA, Jones from Washington and Maeva from FIU. Last time out, true freshman Cale Sanders Jr. earned his first career start as a Bulldog cornerback.

Fresno State's top two receivers hail from the Central Valley. Jalen Cropper and Josh Kelly have paced the team and the stacked wide receiver room all season long. Cropper, a graduate of Buchanan High School (Clovis, Calif.) but native of Parlier, Calif., leads the team in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns. Kelly, a graduate of San Joaquin Memorial (Fresno, Calif.) and native of Fresno, is right behind Cropper in the rankings.

The duo has a strong connection off the field as well, having known each other and competed against each other for years growing up.

### J5

Jalen Cropper has led the Bulldogs in receiving consistently this season, recording 64 receptions for 710 yards and 10 touchdowns on the year. Cropper is averaging 11.09 a reception, and 71.00 yards per game on the year. Cropper leads the Mountain West in total touchdowns and in receiving touchdowns on the year. He ranked third in the FBS in receiving touchdowns.

Cropper had a streak of eight games with a receiving score, the first Bulldog since Davante Adams to register that many consecutive games with a receiving touchdown. Cropper has had two 100-yard receiving games this season.

### KE11Z

Sophomore wide receiver Josh Kelly has had a breakout season for the Bulldogs. Kelly sits second on the team in both receptions (42) and receiving yards (666). He is also second on the team in average receiving yards per game (66.6).

Kelly has proven to be one of many weapons for the Bulldog offense this season, being responsible for 10 chunk plays on the year including the second-longest reception of 69 yards.

The sophomore from Fresno, Calif. has had three 100-yard receiving games on the year so far - Cal Poly (Sept. 11), at UCLA (Sept. 18) and at San Diego State (Oct. 30). His best receiving performance was 127 yards and two touchdowns against Cal Poly.

### ITS NOT JUST ONE OR TWO, ITS ALL OF THEM

The Bulldog wide receiver room is deep with talent, that is no secret.

Of the eight wide receivers who have registered a catch this season, four of them have had 100-yard receiving games - Jalen Cropper, Josh Kelly, Keric Wheatfall and Zane Pope. Kelly leads the team with three 100-yard receiving games and Cropper has two. Wheatfall and Pope have one each.

Fresno State is one of just two schools in the Mountain West with four receivers having 100-yard receiving performances this year, joining Nevada who also has four.

Around the FBS, Fresno state is one of just five schools to have four or more receivers with 100-yard games as Ole Miss has six, Virginia has five, and Fresno State, BYU and Nevada have four.

## QB1, MAKING HIS NAME KNOWN

Fresno State senior quarterback Jake Haener entered the season with no preseason recognitions, despite leading the conference's top offense in 2020. Things have since changed as Haener turned heads quickly into the 2021 season. Earning spots on two watch lists, and receiving national attention, what Haener has done on the field through seven games this season has put himself and Fresno State back under national attention.

Haener has passed for 3,167 yards and 25 touchdowns so far this season. Haener became the seventh Bulldog to have a 3,000-yard passing season in the history of the season - he joins Kevin Sweeney (1984), Trent Dilfer (1992, 1993), David Carr (2001), Paul Pinegar (2005), Derek Carr (2011, 2021, 2013) and Marcus McMaryion (2018).

## DYNAMIC ATTACK

Jake Haener and the Bulldog offense showed glimpses of what it could be when it is firing on all cylinders, in the pass and run game late in this season. The Bulldogs ran for 163 yards to make up for the lack of presence in the air attack at Wyoming, and continued that as they ran for 205 yards against Nevada. The Bulldog offense continued to stay on this multi-dimensional path, passing for 306 yards and running for 179 at then-No. 21 San Diego State.

In total this season, Fresno State has passed for 3,313 yards and ran for 1,659 yards on the year.

## 9 MAKING HIS MOVE UP

QB Jake Haener has 10 career 300-yard passing games, in just 15 career games. The senior passed Kevin Sweeney (1983-86) on the all-time list and is tied for third in program history with 10 300-yard passing games in a career.

Haener is tied with Paul Pinegar (2002-05) in the standings. Derek Carr holds the record with 20 in his career (2009-13), and brother David Carr (1997-01) is second with 13.

• Haener's six 300-yard passing games this season ties for third in program history, in a single season. David Carr holds the record with 11 in 2001.

## RONNIE IN THE RECORD BOOKS

Senior running back Ronnie Rivers became the program's all-time leading touchdown scorer with touchdown No. 45 of his career against UConn on Aug. 28. Rivers broke the record in a big way, with a personal-best 61-yard receiving touchdown versus UConn. Rivers officially passed Anthony Daigle (1991-93) and sits as the leader in the category. On the same play, Rivers also became the program's all-time leader in career pass receptions by a running back and career receiving yards by a running back. He currently has 144 pass receptions for 1,321 yards in his career.

Rivers tied the program record for most career rushing touchdowns with his 64-yard touchdown run against Nevada (Oct. 23). The senior Bulldog is tied atop the record books with Ryan Mathews (39, 2007-09).

With 79 yards rushing against Boise State, Rivers made the jump to third in Fresno State history with 3,281 career rushing yards. Rivers slightly surpassed Ryan Mathews on the list, who left Fresno State with 3,280. Robbie Rouse (4,647) and Ron Rivers (3,473) are the only former Bulldogs ahead of him.

## MAKE WAY, #7 COMING THRU

The Bulldog run game is always exciting with Ronnie Rivers, but it has seen a spark the last few weeks as Jordan Mims has taken over with authority. Stepping in for an injured Rivers during the Nevada game, Mims was ready when his number was called.

The senior has carried the team to two-straight run-dominant performances. Mims has had back-to-back weeks with career-high numbers, while earning him Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week in those two weeks.

This season, Mims has rushed for 505 yards on 85 carries, and a team-leading four rushing scores. He is averaging 5.9 yards per carry and 50.5 yards per game. Mims is having his best statistical season since 2017, and is on track to surpass many career-bests this season.

## RETURN THIS

The Bulldogs have utilized three different kick returners this season, and saw some positive yardage from two last time out.

Running back Jordan Mims had a successful start to the season as the Bulldogs' primary kick returner before taking on a heavier role in the run game. Mims has 12 returns for 263 yards on the season, averaging 21.92 yards per return.

Last time out, the Bulldogs saw strong returns from running back Malik Sherrod. The young Bulldog has six returns for 106 yards, averaging 17.67 yards per return. All six of his returns were against Boise State.

Wide receiver Jordan Brown has two returns for four yards on the year.

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

### PLAY TO THE BALL

Fresno State is No. 5 in the FBS in fumbles recovered this season (10). The Bulldogs have recovered at least one fumble in all but one game on the year, with a season-best two at then-No. 13 UCLA.

Seven of Fresno State's 10 recovered fumbles have been from seven different players - Gates, Kwami Jones, Arron Mosby, Evan Williams, Kevin Atkins, Bralyn Lux and Leonard Payne Jr. DE Mosby, DT Atkins and DB Williams lead the team with two apiece.

Fresno State has recovered at least one fumble in 14 of its last 16 games dating back to the 2020 season opener against Hawai'i. Last week against Boise State was the first time the Bulldogs had not recovered a fumble since Oct. 24, 2020.

### NO FLY ZONE

After the Bulldog defense had only one interception through the first six games of the season, something has been ignited in the hands of the 'Dogs D.

In the last four games, Fresno State has totaled eight interceptions with four against Wyoming, one against Nevada, two at San Diego State and one against Boise State.

Evan Williams (DB) leads the defense with three interceptions on the year. Williams is the first Bulldog since 2018 with at least three interceptions in a season. Levelle Bailey (LB) and DaRon Bland (CB) are second on the team with two INTs, and Malachi Langley (LB), and LJ Early (S) have one each.

Fresno State's nine interceptions is its most since 2019 when the 'Dogs had 11. The Bulldogs' streak of four-straight games with an interception is the longest streak since Fresno State had at least one in eight games in 2018.

### TURNOVER TOWN

At Wyoming on Oct. 16, the Bulldog defense gained its most turnovers in a game (5) since the 2019 season. The five turnovers gained were from four different Bulldogs, as safety Evan Williams had two interceptions, fellow safety Elijah Gates had a fumble recovery, and L.J. Early (another safety) had his first career interception. Linebacker Malachi Langley was responsible for the remaining turnover, as he swooped in for an interception against the Cowboys.

The Bulldogs had three turnovers gained (2 INT, 1 FR) at San Diego State. Fresno State's three turnovers gained were the most that San Diego State had surrendered in a game on the season. The Aztecs entered the game with just six on the year.

Fresno State's defense is averaging 1.9 turnovers gained per game this season. Its 19 total turnovers gained (9 INTS, 10 FR) are the sixth-most by any team in the FBS.

### CASHING IT IN, AND MAKING IT COUNT

The turnovers gained are always a good thing, but its even better when the Bulldog offense gets its chance to score on those turnovers.

Fresno State has scored 71 points off turnovers this season. The Bulldogs have had a season-high 17 points off turnovers twice this season, its first in its 17-0 win at Wyoming (Oct. 16) and next at then-No. 21 San Diego State last weekend.

The Bulldogs have earned points off turnovers in all but two games this season.

### APPLY THE PRESSURE

Fresno State's defense has registered at least 7.0 tackles for loss in eight of 10 games played this season. The Bulldogs are third in the FBS in total tackles for loss (73.0) and are averaging 7.3 TFL per game this season, enough for fifth-most in the FBS.

### LEADER OF THE LOSSES

Kevin Atkins has 11.0 TFLs in the first 10 games this season, setting a new personal single-season mark.

Atkins has added 32 total tackles, 6.5 sacks and two fumble recoveries on the year.

## BIG KEY

“Super Senior” Kevin Atkins is good at getting to the quarterback, and he’s only getting better.

Entering the 2021 season, Atkins had 11.0 career sacks. Through nine games this season, Atkins has 6.5 for a new single-season career-best, passing his previous mark of 5.0 that he had in both 2019 and 2020.

The senior leader is 1.0 sack away from breaking into the top 10 in career sacks at Fresno State. He has 17.5 in his career as a Bulldog. Atkins would become the first Bulldog since Ejiro Ederaine (2012-15) to make the Top 10 list.

Atkins needs 3.5 more sacks this season to break into the Top 10 in single-season sack numbers at Fresno State, joining Ederaine who put up 10.0 in 2013 for that 10 spot.

## EXPERIENCE IN TRANSFERS IS PAYING OFF

Three of Fresno state’s top 10 tacklers through eight games this season are transfers.

- LB Tyson Maeva, a grad transfer from FIU and Boise State, is second on the team with 44 tackles (22 solo). Maeva also adds 5.5 TFL, 1.5 sacks, and a pass breakup.
- S Elijah Gates, a grad transfer from UCLA, is 10th on the team with 29 tackles (23 solo). Gates adds 3.0 TFL, five pass breakups and one fumble recovery on the year. Gates has only played in seven games, compared to 10 of the the rest of the top 10 tacklers.
- CB DaRon Bland, a grad transfer from Sacramento State, is ninth on the team with 30 tackles (22 solo). Bland adds 1.0 TFL, two interceptions, two pass breakup, one quarterback hurry and one forced fumble on the year.

All three transfer Bulldogs have started games in their respective positions this season, and have brought the experience of college football to a young Bulldog defensive group.

## HE’S EVERYWHERE

Fresno State junior safety Evan Williams flies around the field, and gets his job done each and every week.

Being named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week for the second time in his career as a Bulldog following a career-best performance at San Diego State (Oct. 20), Williams continues to find success as he leads the Bulldog defense.

Williams leads the team in total tackles this season with 81 tackles (53 solo), 4.5 TFL, 3 interceptions, 6 pass breakups, 2 fumble recoveries and a forced fumble.

Williams has double-digit tackles in five games this year, with a career-high 13 at then-No. 21 San Diego State. He is having the best season of his career, charting career-best numbers in season tackles, TFLs, interceptions, and fumble recoveries.

## BIG THINGS AHEAD FOR THE FRESHMAN FROM TEXAS

True freshman Cale Sanders Jr., from New Caney, Texas, has played all 10 games for the Bulldogs this season. Seeing early game time action as a special teams contributor this season, then working his way into the corner-back rotation, to securing a starting spot, Sanders Jr. has a bright future ahead of him.

Sanders earned his first career start last weekend against Boise State. The young Bulldog registered a career-high three tackles, 1.0 TFL, and a forced fumble in the game. Last weekend, Sanders became the first true freshman to earn a start on the defense in the 2021 season.

On the season, Sanders has 11 tackles, 1.0 TFL, two broken up passes and a forced fumble on the year.

### CFP RANKINGS



The 2021 season marks Kalen DeBoer's (pronounced duh-BOR) second season as head coach for the Fresno State Football program. He was named the 20th head coach in Fresno State history on Dec. 17, 2019, succeeding Jeff Tedford.

While he embarked on his first season at the helm of the program a year ago, he is no stranger to the Valley as he first arrived in 2017 with Tedford, hired as his offensive coordinator. DeBoer coached the Bulldogs for two seasons before departing for a one-year stint in 2019 at Indiana in the same capacity.

DeBoer earned his first career Division I victory as a head coach on Oct. 29, 2020 at Bulldog Stadium in a 38-17 win against Colorado State following one of the most challenging offseasons in recent memory, for any program, due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Fresno State finished with a 3-3 record in 2020, playing its first two games at home and final four on the road in an unprecedented year. The team sported 10 postseason All-Mountain West selections, highlighted by first-team running back Ronnie Rivers. The Bulldogs' offense shined in 2020 producing a conference-best 479.3 yards total offense per game. The Bulldogs' defense showed growth in a new 4-2-5 scheme, utilizing a large contingent of underclassmen and newcomers that caused havoc for opposing quarterbacks. Fresno State finished tops in the Mountain West, and third in the NCAA in sacks per game (4.17).

IU sported an 8-5 record in 2019 with DeBoer as its offensive coordinator, a resurrection season said by some in the Midwest, as it was the Hoosiers' best regular season in 26 years. Indiana posted a winning conference record for the first time since 1993 (5-3) and was nationally ranked for the first time in 25 years, breaking the oldest such drought in the country. The Hoosiers' offense, a catalyst of the success, excelled under DeBoer ranking inside the top five in the 14-team Big Ten conference in passing offense (302.4, second), first downs (23.4, second), time of possession (33:43, third) turnovers lost (15, third), total offense (432.8, third), passing efficiency (150.6, fourth), third down conversion percentage (.469, fourth) and scoring offense (31.8, fifth).

DeBoer's two years as the Bulldogs' offensive coordinator was one for the ages that concluded with a Mountain West Championship and Las Vegas Bowl win to cap a 22-6 run during the 2017-18 seasons. Those two seasons included double-digit winning seasons each year, coming off a 1-11 campaign by the 2016 team. That feat led to Fresno State becoming the first program in FBS history to secure back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

Fresno State reached unprecedented heights in year No. 2 with DeBoer as the OC as the Bulldogs posted a school-record 12 victories, and finished ranked No. 18 in both the AP Top 25 and Coaches poll. The offense ranked 26th nationally in scoring offense (34.6) and 29th in passing offense (267.1), and produced five all-conference honorees. The Bulldogs finished eighth nationally in team passing efficiency (156.58), tied for 15th in turnovers lost (14), tied for 19th nationally in red zone offense (89.5 percent) and 25th in third-down conversions (44.6). Up front, the Bulldogs' offensive line ranked in the top six nationally in fewest sacks and tackles for loss allowed per game in 2018 (6th, 5th).

Efficiency was the key in year one for the Bulldog offense under DeBoer as transfer quarterback Marcus McMaryion completed 62.1 percent of his passes, third-best in the Mountain West. Providing time for his quarterback was an offensive line that allowed only 10 sacks in 14 games (0.71 per game), which ranked third in the FBS and was 21 less sacks allowed than the previous year. The 'Dogs held six opponents without a sack in 2017. Fresno State also ranked third in the FBS in tackles for loss allowed per game at just 3.29 per outing.

Prior to joining the Bulldogs' staff, DeBoer spent three seasons as the offensive coordinator at Eastern Michigan where he helped guide the Eagles to their first bowl bid since 1987 following a 7-5 regular season. EMU tied the FBS mark for biggest turnaround in 2016, improving on its win total from one win in 2015. His offense shattered the school record for total yards with 5,917 yards, breaking the previous record of 5,010. School records were also set for points scored (385), passing yards (3,849), touchdown passes (25), first downs (303), pass completions (309), plays (999) as well single-game plays (99). His squad racked up the second-most touchdowns (47) and rushing TDs (21) in a season and the second-most single-game touchdowns (8) and first downs (35).

Prior to his three-year stint at Eastern Michigan, DeBoer spent four seasons as the offensive coordinator at Southern Illinois (2010-13) while also overseeing the wide receiver unit. In total, the Salukis beat 10 Top-25 opponents during DeBoer's tenure. In 2013, the Saluki offense led the Missouri Valley Football Conference (FCS) with 231.8 passing yards per game, the fourth highest total in school history. SIU's 25 passing touchdowns on the season tied for the third highest total in school history.

DeBoer served as the head coach at the University of Sioux Falls (2000-09), where he led one of the most dominant NAIA programs in the nation. DeBoer was named a three-time NAIA National Coach of the Year and compiled an astonishing 67-3 (.957) record while guiding USF to three national championships in five seasons. He won four Great Plains Athletic Conference Championships, 50-straight home games and 29-straight games overall in his final two seasons. He also boasted a 17-2 record in the playoffs. His teams won back-to-back NAIA National Championships in 2008 and 2009, and adding in his 2006 national championship, DeBoer had as many national championships as games lost during his five-year tenure as USF's head coach.

A graduate of USF, DeBoer played for the Cougars from 1993-96, where he was an All-American wide receiver. He set school records for receptions (234), receiving yards (3,400) and touchdown catches (33). Following his playing days, he became a student assistant for Sioux Falls under coach Bob Young in 1997. From 2000-04, he served as USF's offensive coordinator and succeeded Young as head coach in 2005.

**FRESNO, Calif.** – The Fresno State football team opened the 2021 season with a dominant 45-0 win over UConn, the first shutout for the Bulldogs since 2017, as senior running back Ronnie Rivers rewrote the record books becoming the program's leader in career touchdowns scored.

### HOW IT HAPPENED

Following a slow start for both sides, Arron Mosby woke everyone up, stripping Jack Zergiotis and picking up the fumble before racing 31 yards into the end zone late in the first quarter. Fresno State doubled its lead less than three minutes into the second quarter. After a 17-yard completion to Jordan Mims got the 'Dogs down to the nine-yard line, Haener tossed his first touchdown of the season to the corner of the end zone to Ty Jones to put the 'Dogs up 14-0 with 12:30 on the clock.

Late in the quarter, the senior signal caller connected on a pair of 60-plus yard touchdowns. With four minutes remaining in the period, Haener found Rivers on a slant and the senior running back did the rest, scoring the 45th touchdown of his career on a 61-yard reception. Two minutes later, on the first play of the Bulldogs' eighth possession, Haener hit Cropper over the middle. The junior wideout spun off a defender and away from two others, got to the sideline and raced out to an 86-yard score. Cesar Silva tacked on a 24-yard field goal in the waning seconds to put Fresno State up 31-0 at the break.

The Bulldogs added two more touchdowns in the second half, the first an 8-yard rush from Mims in the third, and the second coming in the fourth quarter, a 1-yard pass from Logan Fife to Raymond Pauwels Jr.

**EUGENE, Ore.** – The Fresno State football team showed what it can bring to the table Saturday afternoon, pushing No. 11 Oregon to its limit on its home field at Autzen Stadium. The Bulldogs fell 31-24 in front of 43,276 fans in attendance at the season opener in Eugene.

### HOW IT HAPPENED

Oregon got out to an early advantage on Saturday, getting a 14-0 lead before the Bulldogs could get on the board with a 33-yard field goal by Abraham Montano with 14:16 remaining in the half. It was Montano who would again score for the 'Dogs, this time on a 39-yard field goal to make it 14-6 in favor of the home team.

Oregon scored another touchdown with just over a minute to go in the half, but Fresno State responded with a 17-yard touchdown pass from Jake Haener to Jalen Cropper with seven seconds remaining. The score at the half was 21-13, Oregon.

Fresno State came out firing in the second half with an explosive 85-yard scoring drive. After taking over on downs, Jordan Mims got the 'Dogs into Duck territory with a 45-yard run. Three plays later, Haener broke into the endzone on a two-yard score. Fresno State completed the 2-point conversion on a pass by Haener to Juan Rodriguez to tie the game at 21-21 with 6:45 left in the third.

Montano nailed a 22-yard field goal to give Fresno State its only lead of the game with 13 minutes left on the clock.

The Bulldog defense held Oregon to a field goal mid-way through the fourth quarter, tying the game at 24. The Bulldog offense surrendered a fumble to the Ducks late in the fourth quarter, and they capitalized. No. 11 Oregon scored the go-ahead touchdown on a quarterback keeper score with 2:57 remaining in the game.

**FRESNO, Calif.** -- Fresno State's offense lit up the scoreboard on Saturday evening as the Bulldogs piled on a 63-10 win over Cal Poly on Heroes Night at Bulldog Stadium.

Fresno State totaled 671 yards of total offense, its most in a game since 2014.

### HOW IT HAPPENED

Following a slow start that saw Fresno State punt on its opening two possessions, the Bulldogs got on the board in the final minute of the first quarter with a two-yard run from Jake Haener.

That drive started a string of eight-straight offensive possessions with a touchdown by the 'Dogs as the game went from 7-0 to 56-10. Haener accounted for six of those touchdowns during the stretch, two on the ground and four through the air to four different receivers (Jalen Cropper - 24, Josh Kelly - 14, Zane Pope - 62, Kerik Wheatfall - 53).

Kelly caught touchdown passes on the final two possessions of the first half, a 51-yard reception from Cropper and a 14-yard pass from Haener. The 'Dogs held a 35-10 lead at the half.

Fresno State kept Cal Poly off the scoreboard in the second half, outscoring the Mustangs 28-0 during the final 30 minutes.



**PASADENA, Calif.** - The Fresno State football team had yet another impressive performance on Saturday, defeating the 13th-ranked UCLA Bruins 40-37 at the Rose Bowl to improve to 3-1 on the season. The Bulldogs won their fourth-straight meeting with UCLA, dating back to 2003.

Senior quarterback Jake Haener did just what he was expected to do on Saturday night. Throwing for a season-high 455 yards, Haener showed true toughness and grit to lead the Bulldogs to their last-minute scoring drive to secure the victory.

### HOW IT HAPPENED

Fresno State struck first as Ronnie Rivers broke into the endzone on a one-yard carry with just under six minutes to go in the first quarter. Fresno State was unsuccessful on its 2-point conversion attempt, adding only six points to the board on the score. UCLA answered on its following drive, and took a 7-6 lead into the second quarter.

The 'Dogs outscored the Bruins 17-3 in the second quarter behind touchdowns from Jalen Cropper and Rivers, and a field goal from Abraham Montano. The Bulldogs took a 23-10 lead into the locker room at the break.

UCLA gained some momentum after the half, coming out in the third quarter and scoring on its opening drive to cut the lead. Montano had another field goal to give Fresno State a buffer heading into the fourth.

UCLA took advantage of a Bulldog fumble, recovering it and responding with a touchdown on its following drive to cut the lead to two, 26-24. Fresno State fumbled again on its following drive, and UCLA would recover and respond with another score to take a 30-26 lead with 7:27 to go.

Staying poised under pressure, Haener capped a 10-play 75 yard scoring drive on a 19-yard touchdown pass to Erik Brooks. Fresno State led 33-30 with 2:55 remaining. Defense held tough, but UCLA's Dorian Thompson-Robinson hit Kyle Phillips in the end zone to retake the lead, 37-33 with 54 seconds left in the game.

Behind smart play calling, Fresno State made its way down the field and quickly into UCLA territory. Haener had passes of 10, 27, and 26 yards to set the Bulldogs up at the UCLA 38-yard line. Haener used a 13-yard pass to Cropper to score the game-winning touchdown.

**FRESNO, Calif --** No. 22 Fresno State remains undefeated at home after a come-from-behind 38-30 victory over UNLV in its Mountain West opener at Bulldog Stadium on Friday night.

The Bulldogs were led offensively by Jake Haener who threw for 378 yards and five touchdowns. Four of Haener's five touchdown passes were to Jalen Cropper.

### How It Happened

UNLV opened the game up 14-0, scoring on its first two possessions of the night. Fresno State got its first points of the game with 11:38 on the clock in the second, a 25-yard field goal from Cesar Silva.

Late in the quarter, a five-play, 46-yard drive was capped off by an 18-yard touchdown reception from Erik Brooks with 32 seconds on the clock. That cut the Bulldogs' deficit to 14-9 going into the half.

It took the Rebels one play on their opening possession of the second half to answer. An 80-yard screen to Tyleek Collins put UNLV up 12 at 21-9.

Then it became the Haener and Cropper show as the two hooked up for a touchdown on each of the next three Bulldog possessions. The 20 unanswered points gave Fresno State its largest lead of the night at 29-21 with 12:21 remaining in the game.

UNLV answered with nine unanswered to regain the lead. Haener and Cropper weren't done, though, finishing off a four-play, 61-yard drive with a 26-yard pitch and catch that put the Bulldogs up for good. Silva tacked on another field goal in the final minutes to make the final score 38-30.

**HONOLULU --** No. 18 Fresno State suffered a 27-24 loss to Hawai'i on the island on Saturday, moving the Bulldogs to 4-2 overall and 1-1 in conference play.

Fresno State struggled to maintain and capitalize on its offensive possessions, committing six turnovers (four interceptions and two fumbles) and converting on 1-of-4 red zone chances.

### How It Happened

**LARAMIE, Wyo.** - It was a battle of the defenses in Fresno State's 17-0 shutout victory at Wyoming on Saturday afternoon. Fresno State shut out its second opponent of the 2021 season, halting the offensive efforts of the Cowboys at War Memorial Stadium.

Going up against a heavy rushing offense, Fresno State held Wyoming to only 128 yards rushing. Wyoming was forced to move to an air attack, where it was quickly covered as the Bulldogs had four interceptions in the game - highlighted by two by Evan Williams. Williams also led the team in tackles with seven.

Offensively, the Bulldogs put up 163 yards rushing with a team-high 78 rushing yards from Jordan Mims. Quarterback Jake Haener finished the game with 96 yards passing, two touchdowns and no interceptions.

#### How It Happened

Fresno State scored first as Haener found Juan Rodriguez on a 2-yard touchdown pass with 6:57 left in the first quarter. The rest of the half was a defensive battle, as neither team scored and Fresno State took a 7-0 lead into the locker room.

The Bulldog defense held the Cowboys to 4-of-7 on their third down conversions while also recovering a fumble and snagging an interception in the half.

Fresno State's next score was set up by the defense's second interception of the day as Levelle Bailey tipped the pass from Sean Chambers and Malachi Langley was there for the grab. Langley returned the interception for 33-yards to the Wyoming 6-yard line. From there, it took the offense just three plays before Haener found Jalen Cropper on a 3-yard completion to give the 'Dogs a 14-0 lead with 1:52 remaining in the third quarter.

The Bulldogs tacked on a field goal with 10:25 remaining in the game. Cesar Silva cashed in Evan Williams' second interception of the day, converting from 41 yards.

Wyoming brought in Levi Williams at quarterback, but the Bulldog defense did not give in. Forcing a turnover on downs and then its fourth interception of the day, the Bulldog defense shut down what Wyoming was trying to do offensively to close the game.

**FRESNO, Calif.** -- Fresno State won a pivotal Mountain West matchup against one of the top offenses in the conference with a 34-32 win against Nevada on Homecoming at Bulldog Stadium.

The Bulldogs used 134 rushing yards behind the legs of running back Jordan Mims. Quarterback Jake Haener threw for 256 yards on 26 completions.

Fresno State's defense held tough, limiting the Nevada offense to just 47 yards rushing. The 'Dogs D totaled a season-high 5.0 sacks and 11.0 TFLs.

The Bulldogs moved to 6-2 overall and 3-1 in MW play.

#### How It Happened

Nevada opened the scoring with a 32-yard field goal just over nine minutes into the game. Fresno State had a quick response as Ronnie Rivers broke loose down the right sideline for a 64-yard touchdown run on the third play of the Bulldogs' ensuing drive.

Mims extended the lead to 14-3 less than a minute into the second quarter with a 1-yard plunge, capping off a 10-play, 91-yard drive.

A fumble inside Fresno State's 20-yard line gave the Wolf Pack a short field with 11:01 remaining in the half. Nevada used just a minute off the clock to move the ball into the end zone and cut the Bulldogs' lead to 14-10.

Out of the half Fresno State and Nevada traded touchdowns on each of their first two possessions. The game stood 28-23 four seconds into the fourth quarter. Following the Wolf Pack pulling back within five for the second time in the half, Cesar Silva extended Fresno State's lead to eight with a 47-yard field goal with 12:37 on the clock.

Needing a stop, the Bulldog defense came up with a three-and-out following an Arron Mosby sack on third-and-9. The 'Dogs turned the stop into another Silva kick, this time from 43 yards to extend the advantage to 34-23. Nevada answered, though, with one of its own with Brandon Talton converting from 38 yards out.

With Fresno State leading 34-26, Nevada drove 90 yards on its final drive to pull within two. Needing the two-point conversion to force overtime, Carson Strong looked to Romeo Doubs but Justin Houston pushed the receiver out of bounds before he could get his feet down to all but end the game with only two seconds remaining on the clock.

**CARSON, Calif.** – The Old Oil Can makes its way back to Fresno after the Bulldogs defeated No. 21 San Diego State 30-20 at Dignity Health Sports Park in a big Mountain West matchup on Saturday night.

Behind another strong performance on the ground by Jordan Mims, who finished the game with a career-high 186 yards and two touchdowns, the Bulldogs powered their way to their second win over a ranked opponent this season.

### How It Happened

On its second possession of the night, Fresno State put together its longest drive of the year, a 15-play drive that saw the 'Dogs go 86 yards. Jordan Mims broke into the end zone from 13 yards out to give the 'Dogs an early 7-0 lead.

Late in the opening quarter, Evan Williams picked off Lucas Johnson on a third-and-13 and returned it 36 yards down to the Aztec 31-yard line. Four plays later, Jake Haener connected with Keric Wheatfall from 16 yards to double the Bulldogs' advantage.

Following a defensive stop after San Diego State crossed the 50 again, the 'Dogs turned it into three points with a career-long 49-yard field goal from Cesar Silva. The Bulldogs did the same thing on the next set of possessions, a stop after SDSU crossed the 50, and Silva connected from 27 yards to put Fresno State up 20-0 with 2:48 on the clock. The Aztecs scored in the final minutes to make 20-7 going into the half.

Silva knocked in his season-high third field goal of the game 11 minutes into the third quarter to give the 'Dogs a 16-point lead. SDSU answered, though, with a 10-play, 80-yard drive to cut the Bulldogs' lead to 23-13 just before the end of the third.

With less than seven minutes remaining in the game, Carson King dropped a punt at the one-yard line into the awaiting hands of Deonte Perry. The Aztecs managed to get some breathing room, but on first-and-10 from their own 24, Johnson was picked off by Levelle Bailey. On the next offensive possession, it took Mims two carries to go 31 yards to seal the game, putting Fresno State up 30-13 with 4:28 on the clock.



**FRESNO, Calif.** – The Fresno State football team suffered its first home loss of the season, falling 40-14 to Boise State at Bulldog Stadium on Saturday. Fresno State moves to 7-3 on the season and 4-2 in Mountain West play.

### How It Happened

Boise State led 10-0 midway through the opening quarter following a touchdown that resulted from an interception. The Broncos added three more just over two minutes into the second quarter following a Bulldog three-and-out.

After forcing a turnover on downs at the Fresno State 46-yard line, the Bulldogs went 54 yards in five plays, cutting the deficit to 13-7 with 5:50 on the clock in the second through a Keric Wheatfall 10-yard reception.

With 41 seconds remaining in the half, Bronco Jonah Dalmas kicked a 27-yard field goal to make it a two-possession game at 16-7. That started a stretch of 27 unanswered points to give the visitors a 40-7 lead with less than two minutes remaining in the game. Zane Pope added a touchdown for the Bulldogs in the final minutes.
