RACING TO THE FINISH LINE

The Lobos are heading to Tallahassee, Fla., to compete in the NCAA Championships for the 14th season in a row, hosted by Florida State on November 20th. The women's 6K race is set for 10:20 am (ET), while the men's 10K will folow at 11:10 am (ET).

Florida State is 12th nationally with 191 points. NC State holds on to the first spot with six first-place votes and 325 points total.

The Lobos' women's team was ranked No. 2 in the nation by the USTFCCCA on Nov. 15. This was the last poll of the season and considered the Pre-Championships Poll. The team received four first-place votes and 319 points total to take the second spot.

In the Lobos' last meet at the NCAA Mountain Regional, the women's team placed first as a team and all seven runners placed in the top-35 individually. Gracelyn Larkin led the team with a fourth place finish and a time of 20:22.6.

Abdirizak Ibrahim qualified individually as he placed 12th with a time of 30:10.9 at the NCAA Mountain Regional on Nov. 12.

The Lobos' top six runners on the women's side (Larkin, Abbe Goldstein, Emma Heckel, Ali Upshaw, Amelia Mazza-Downie and Andrea Modin Engesaeth) earned All-Region, as well as Abdirizak Ibrahim.

The women's team dominates the competition at every meet they attend. The team ranks second in the nation in the final/Pre-Championships USTFCCCA Coaches Poll of the season and first in the regional rankings.

MOUNTAIN REGIONAL CHAMPS

For the first time since the 2018 season, the Lobo women's team won the NCAA Mountain Regional. New Mexico took first place with 62 points and placed all seven runners in the top-35. All of that while sitting out star runners Adva Cohen and Stefanie Parsons.

UNM QUALIFIES FOR 14TH STRAIGHT SEASON

After winning the Mountain Regional, the women's team automatically gualified for their 14th straight NCAA Championship appearance.

On the men's side, Abdirizak Ibrahim gualified individually for the Championships for his second straight appearance.

WOMEN'S FIELD AT CHAMPIONSHIPS

The women are set to face some great competition in the championships, including Arkansas, Colorado, Florida State, Georgetown, Harvard, Minnesota, NC State, North Carolina, Notre Dame, Oklahoma State, Ole Miss, Rice, Stanford, Syracuse, Washington, West Virginia, Wisconsin, Alabama, Butler, BYU, Colorado State, Iowa State, Michigan, Michigan State, Northern Arizona, Oregon, Providence, Utah, Utah State and Villanova.

MEN'S FIELD AT CHAMPIONSHIPS

Abdirizak Ibrahim gualified for the championships individually. He will face a tough field of teams which includes Alabama, Arkansas, BYU, Furman, Georgetown, Harvard, Iowa State, Northern Arizona, Notre Dame, Oklahoma State, Ole Miss, Princeton, Stanford, Syracuse, Texas, Wake Forest, Washington, Wisconsin, Air Force, Butler, Colorado, Florida State, Gonzaga, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, North Carolina, Oregon, Portland, Southern Utah and Tulsa.

HISTORICAL CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES

The Lobos last went to the championships in the 2020 season (which was conducted in the spring of 2021 due to COVID-19). The women's team finished sixth as a team as Adva Cohen led the team with a 22nd place finish. Abdirizak Ibrahim qualified individually and took 35th place to become the Lobos' first All-American since 2013 on the men's side.

The women have won the national championship twice in school history, during the 2015 and 2017 seasons. The team also has had two individual champions on the women's side-Ednah Kurgat in 2017 and Weini Kelati in 2019.

MAKING HER MARK

DII transfer Stefanie Parsons is showing why she belongs at this level. She has been the top Lobo runner at every one of New Mexico's meets. She placed 12th in the Nuttycombe Invitational, fourth in the Notre Dame Invitational and 1st at the NMSU Invitational. She also earned MW Athlete of the Week on Oct. 5 after her performance at Notre Dame.

GREAT DEPTH

The Lobo women have a roster of 31 and it has proven to be key to their success. New Mexico has been able to run its student-athletes in championship races and "B" races alike throughout the season. In the championships, the Lobos have the 10 potential runners in this meet: Samree Dishon, Abbe Goldstein, Emma Heckel, Gracelyn Larkin, Amelia Mazza-Downie, Elise Thorner, Andrea Modin Engesaeth, Aliandrea Upshaw, Adva Cohen and Stefanie Parsons. That's saying a lot about the amount of talent on the team to have so many potentials that the coaches know they can rely on to get the results.

TRANSFER POWER

The Lobos have found great talent through way of transfers this season. Adva Cohen, who has been with the team since the 2018-19 season, but started her collegiate career at Iowa Central Community College. She has proven herself to be a great leader for the Lobos and one of the consistent top runners. Abbe Goldstein is a transfer from Harvard and has established herself as one of New Mexico's top-five in every race. Emma Heckel has also earned her way into the lineup and finished in the top-five of New Mexico runners consistently. Stefanie Parsons has been the Lobos' top runner in every single race she faces, proving that she can make the jump from DII and be successful.

ALL-AMERICAN RETURNERS

The Lobos have three returners who were All-Americans last season. Abdirizak Ibrahim, Adva Cohen and Gracelyn Larkin all earned that honor in the 2020 season (which was conducted in the spring of 2021, due to COVID-19). They return and make a huge impact on the teams, both as leaders of the squads and talented on the course.

MAKE THAT 14 STRAIGHT!!!

Since Joe Franklin took the reins as head coach in 2007, the women's team has been wildly successful. Winning this years' MW Championship, the women have now won 14 straight conference titles, beginning in the 2008 season. The women's runners took the top seven individual places (in order: Amelia Mazza-Downie, Emma Heckel, Gracelyn Larkin, Abbe Goldstein, Samree Dishon, Stephanie Parsons) and placed all seven runners in the top-30.

The men also had a stint of six straight conference titles from the 2009-14 seasons. The men have earned five individual champions in the history of the program, as well. In this season's race, the men took seventh place and Abdirizak Ibrahim was the top finisher, coming in at fifth individually.



THE LOBOS' LAST MEET

PROVO, Utah – The University of New Mexico women's cross country team earned their first regional title since 2018 in the NCAA Mountain Regional hosted by BYU in Provo, Utah, on Friday morning. The men's team placed 14th in the 10K race at noon.

The top two teams at each regional advance to the NCAA Championships, so as the Mountain Regional winner, the women's team will advance to the NCAA Championship for the 14th year in a row and 17th time in program history. The Championship is set for Nov. 20 in Tallahassee, Fla., hosted by Florida State at Apalachee Regional Park.

The women placed first with 62 total points as all seven runners placed in the top-35 individually. Gracelyn Larkin led the Lobos with a fourth-place finish as she crossed the finish line in 20:22.6. Abbe Goldstein was the next to finish with a time of 20:28.2 for ninth place. Emma Heckel finished 11th with a time of 20:40.0. Ali Upshaw earned 17th place as she crossed the finish line at 20:49.8 and Amelia Mazza-Downie rounded out the Lobos' five counted runners with a time of 20:50.6 to place 21st. Andrea Modin Engesaeth came in next at 25th place and 20:54.3 time and Samree Dishon rounded out the Lobos' runners with a 34th place finish and time of 21:15.5.

The men's team placed 14th in the 10K race at the regional. Abdirizak Ibrahim was the Lobos' top runner, finishing 12th as he crossed the finish line at 30:10.9. Awet Yohannes was New Mexico's next finisher as he placed 73rd with a running time of 32:09.2. Iolo Hughes crossed the finish line at 32:28.1 for 85th place. Matthew Larkin finished 97th with a time of 33:19.4. Reece Donihi rounded out the Lobos with a 106th place finish and a time of 33:44.0.









THE JOE FRANKLIN FILE

NOTEWORTHY :

JOE FRANKLIN enters his 14th year as the head track and field/cross country coach at The University of New Mexico. Franklin took over the program on June 18, 2007 after 13 years in the same role at Butler University. He replaced Matt Henry who retired after seven years at New Mexico. Franklin is the seventh men's and fifth women's head track and field coach at UNM.

At the time of his hiring Franklin said, "I'm excited and thrilled. This is a very unique opportunity, especially when you look at the great tradition and history that New Mexico has had in cross country and track and field. I think the University of New Mexico and city of Albuquerque are tremendous settings for competition and training and places that provide unique opportunities for student-athletes."

Franklin said he has lofty expectations for the future of the UNM track and cross country programs. "The goals for the program are always to see where we can max out in every event," he said. "Let's see how high we can go. Let's see if we can get to be a top-10 team in cross country. Let's see if we can get to be a top-25 team in track and field. We want to have athletes in the sprints, throws, jumps, vaults and distance events qualifying for the NCAAs consistently and then see if we can build on that and start moving up in the team standings."

Since that time Franklin has wasted little time making his mark at New Mexico and achieved many of the goals he laid out in his hiring, which culminated with UNM's most successful season for the women in 2018-19. In 2008 the United States Track & Field and Cross Country Association created a "Program of the Year" award to honor those teams who succeeded in all three sports — cross country, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field — on a yearly basis at the NCAA Championships. Since the awards inception New Mexico has made the list six times on the men's side and five times on the women's side.

Franklin has also assembled a considerable collection of championship hardware while leading UNM. Since the start of the 2009-10 school year, the Franklin-led Lobos have claimed the most conference titles of any Mountain West member, with 23 total (11 women's cross-country; six men's cross-country; three men's indoor track & field; one men's outdoor track & field; two women's

indoor track & field). Franklin delivered two national
