## KEY STORYLINES

### NCAA TITLE RUN BEGINS IN ALBUQUERQUE

After claiming the first Pac-12 title in program history last month on their home course, the No. 2 ranked Oregon Ducks will begin their quest for a first-ever NCAA championship at the Albuquerque Regional on May 9-11 at UNM Championship Course. The top seed in the 12-team field, Oregon will need a top-four finish in the three-day tournament in order to advance to the NCAA Championships on May 20-25 at Grayhawk Golf Club in Scottsdale, Ariz.

### THE FIELD

Oregon has competed against six of the other 11 teams in the Albuquerque field this season, holding a combined 14-3 competitive record against Florida (1-1), Texas (3-1), Arizona (6-1), Georgia (2-0), TCU (1-0) and Louisville (1-0).

### NCAA REGIONAL HISTORY

Oregon heads to Albuquerque seeking the program's first-ever NCAA Regional victory. UO's best Regional showing was a third-place finish in Lubbock, Texas, in 2017, and Kathleen Scavo's fourth-place showing at the 2019 Cle Elum Regional is the program's best individual performance.

### PAC-12 CHAMPS, AND HUNGRY FOR MORE

The Oregon Ducks are the best team in the Pac-12 Conference, and now they're looking to prove they're the best team in the entire country. UO won the first conference title in program history on April 18-20 at Eugene Country Club, finishing seven strokes up on the field on the strength of a tremendous 3-under 285 in the second round. **HSIN-YU (CYNTHIA) LU** fueled Oregon's surge to the top of the leaderboard with a 6-under 66 in the second round, and she went on to join Caroline Inglis (2015) as the only Ducks ever to win the Pac-12 individual title. The Ducks battled through rainy and windy conditions all week to win the title, setting the stage for a run at the national title this month.

### LOADED LINEUP

Oregon's five-player starting lineup has emerged as one of the nation's elite this season, combining for 19 top-10 finishes and 32 top-20 showings through 10 tournaments. The entire lineup earned all-Pac-12 recognition, including a program-record three players on the first team in **HSIN-YU (CYNTHIA) LU, TZE-HAN (HEATHER) LIN** and **SOFIE KIBSGAARD NIELSEN**. All five players are currently in the top 60 of the national individual Golfstat rankings, with an average national ranking of 26.2.

## LIVING IN THE TOP FIVE

The Ducks enter NCAA Regionals with an impressive history of top-five finishes under head coach **DEREK RADLEY**. Oregon has placed in the top five in each of its 10 tournaments so far in 2021-22, headlined by a program record-tying four wins. UO has recorded 22 top-five finishes in its last 24 tournaments dating back to the 2019-20 season, with five total wins during that stretch. Overall, the Ducks have earned 28 top-five finishes in 35 total tournaments since Radley and assistant coach **MONICA VAUGHN** took over ahead of the 2018-19 season.

## LU NAMED TO ARNOLD PALMER CUP TEAM

**HSIN-YU (CYNTHIA) LU** has been selected to the international team for the 2022 Arnold Palmer Cup team, set to be hosted by Golf Club de Genève on July 1-3. The event is a Ryder Cup-style tournament featuring the top men's and women's university/college golfers matching the United States against a team of international players.

## CHACON, LU COMPETE AT AUGUSTA NATIONAL WOMEN'S AMATEUR

**BRIANA CHACON** and **HSIN-YU (CYNTHIA) LU** had a memorable weekend before joining their team in Napa for the Silverado Showdown, competing at the 2022 Augusta National Women's Amateur in Augusta, Ga. The pair played in the first two rounds of the event at Champions Retreat Golf Club, and they had the opportunity to play a practice round at arguably the most famous golf course in the world: Augusta National Golf Club. Neither Duck was able to make the cut and play in the final round at Augusta National, but it was an invaluable experience for Oregon's 2021 all-Pac-12 duo.

## TEAM EFFORT LEADS TO SECOND STRAIGHT WIN

The No. 2 Ducks outlasted a loaded field that featured 10 top-25 programs on March 13-15 at the Northrop Grumman Challenge to earn their second straight tournament win, third of the season, and fourth in the span of a calendar year. Oregon shot 5 under in the second round and 2 under in the final round to finish as the only team under par at -4 and win the team title by seven strokes. The Ducks got contributions from their entire lineup for the second straight tournament, with all five players finishing in the top 12 on the individual standings. **HSIN-YU (CYNTHIA) LU** and **SOFIE KIBSGAARD NIELSEN** each tied for fourth at 1 under, while **BRIANA CHACON** tied for sixth, **CHING-TZU CHEN** tied for eighth, and **TZE-HAN (HEATHER) LIN** tied for 12th.

## DUCKS PULL AWAY IN TALLAHASSEE

Oregon ran away with its second victory of the season on February 25-27 in Tallahassee, Fla., shooting 3 under for the weekend to win the Florida State Match Up by 14 strokes. The Ducks got contributions from the entire lineup, with all six competing Ducks finishing in the top 15 of the individual standings. Sophomore **HSIN-YU (CYNTHIA) LU** once again led Oregon to victory as the team's top performer, earning individual runner-up honors at 1-under par for the weekend.

Junior **CHING-TZU CHEN** finished one stroke back at even par to tie for third overall, **SOFIE KIBSGAARD NIELSEN** placed sixth at 1 over, and both **BRIANA CHACON** and **TZE-HAN (HEATHER) LIN** tied for seventh place at plus-3.

## NIELSEN SHINES IN SPRING OPENER

Oregon placed fourth at the Lamkin Invitational on February 14-15 to kick off its spring schedule, with **SOFIE KIBSGAARD NIELSEN** leading the way with the best finish of her career. The junior fired a 1-over 217 to tie for fourth place overall, opening with a 3-under 69 in the first round for her first sub-70 performance since the final 18 holes of her freshman season in 2019-20. **CHING-TZU CHEN** (+8) also earned a top-20 finish in a tie for 16th, and **HSIN-YU (CYNTHIA) LU** (+9) tied for 22nd.

## LU, DUCKS DOMINATE IN NASHVILLE

Oregon got its 2021-22 fall season started in historic fashion back in September, running away with the Mason Rudolph Championship in historic fashion. Led by a phenomenal week from **HSIN-YU (CYNTHIA) LU**, the Ducks fired an incredible 26-under 838 to win by 14 strokes and shatter the previous 54-hole program records for both total score and score vs. par. UO earned its second tournament win under head coach **DEREK RADLEY**, and the Ducks posted two of the top 10 single rounds in program history with a 12-under 276 in round one and a 9-under 279 in round three. Lu was lights out from start to finish, winning individual medalist honors by six strokes with fantastic 17-under 199 to shatter the UO individual 54-hole scoring records. Lu shot sub-70 in all three rounds, including a 7-under 65 in round three to tie for the third-best individual round in UO history. Lu led the field with 19 total birdies, and she closed the tournament with an incredible run of 42 consecutive holes without making a bogey.

## LIN LEADS OREGON DURING FALL SEASON

Senior **TZE-HAN (HEATHER) LIN** was terrific for the Ducks during the fall, leading the way with an impressive 71.67 scoring average. Lin opened the fall with a pair of top-20 performances before closing with back-to-back top-five finishes. She placed fourth at the Stanford Intercollegiate with a 5-under 208, recording the best single round of her career in round two with a 6-under 65 to tie for the third-lowest score in UO history. Lin followed that up with a 5-under 214 at the Pac-12 Preview, finishing with a 6-under 67 to tie for third place overall. On the season, Lin leads Oregon with eight top-20 finishes in nine tournaments, and she is four birdies away from No. 7 in program history with 259 in her career.

## NAGANO, VARMA COMING IN 2022-23

The Ducks will add two talented players to the roster for the 2022-23 season after **DEREK RADLEY** officially signed **MINORI NAGANO** and **ANIKA VARMA** back in November. Nagano will join the Ducks as a junior college transfer from Seminole State College in Florida, while Varma comes from Granite Bay High School in Roseville, Calif. Nagano led Seminole State to the NHCAA National Championship title last spring while shooting 5 under to also win the individual championship, and her current World Amateur Golf Ranking (No. 80) would be the second-highest on the Oregon squad. Varma is finishing out an impressive high school career this spring; she has won individual titles at events such as the IMG Academy Junior World Florida Challenge and the AJGA Reno/Tahoe Junior Championship.



NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS & NCAA REGIONALS HISTORY



**CHING-TZU CHEN** was Oregon's top performer at the 2021 NCAA Championships, shooting 2 under across the final three rounds to finish in a tie for 20th at 3-over par. Chen became Oregon's first top-20 NCAA finisher since 2016 as the Ducks tied for 11th place overall, just two strokes shy of advancing to match play.

Derek Radley was named the sixth head coach in Oregon women's golf history on June 13, 2018. He is in his fourth season at the helm of the program in 2021-22 after building a strong foundation through his first three years in Eugene.

Radley accepted his first head coaching job at Oregon after spending the previous six seasons at the University of Arizona, starting as an assistant coach in 2012 before being promoted to associate head coach in 2016. Radley helped lead the Wildcats to the 2018 national championship in his final season before coming to Oregon.

On July 30, 2021, the Oregon athletic department announced it had reached an agreement with Radley on a contract extension that runs through the 2024-25 season.

"Derek Radley has provided outstanding leadership for Oregon women's golf," UO athletic director Rob Mullens said. "Under his guidance, our program has built an exceptional student-athlete experience and a championship culture. Our program will be in contention for Pac-12 and national championships for many years to come. The future is extremely bright under Derek's leadership."

Radley has elevated the Oregon program to one of the nation's elite through his first three-plus seasons in Eugene. UO currently holds a No. 2 national ranking - the highest in program history - and won the Pac-12 Championships in 2022 for the first time in program history. Since taking over as head coach, Radley has compiled a stellar competitive record of 343-117-8 with five total tournament victories and 28 top-five finishes in 35 events. He has also recruited and coached two of the program's four all-time all-Americans in current Ducks Briana Chacon and Sofie Kibsgaard Nielsen.

### 2021-22 | 4th Season

Oregon enjoyed a terrific fall season to kick off 2021-22, headlined by a historic and dominant performance at the Mason Rudolph Championship. Radley's squad shattered the program's 54-hole records for both total score and score vs. par with an astounding 26-under 838, running away with the team's second tournament victory since Radley and assistant coach Monica Vaughn took over. Sophomore Hsin-Yu (Cynthia) Lu became the first Duck to earn outright individual medalist honors since 2016 with a phenomenal showing, breaking the program individual 54-hole records with a 17-under 199. Lu capped the tournament with a 7-under 65 and finished the week with a stretch of 42 straight holes without a bogey. UO closed the fall season with four top-five finishes in four tournaments.

Oregon carried its terrific fall season into a stellar spring campaign, earning back-to-back wins at the Florida State Match Up and the Northrop Grumman Challenge before running away with the first-ever team title at the Pac-12 Championships. UO's four total team tournament wins in 2021-22 is tied for the most in program single-season history. The Ducks were led at Pac-12s by sophomore Hsin-Yu (Cynthia) Lu, who shot 6-under par to join Caroline Inglis (2015) as the only UO players ever to win the individual conference title. Oregon made more program history with all five players in its starting lineup earning all-Pac-12 recognition, including a program-record three players on the first team in Lu, Nielsen and Tze-Han (Heather) Lin.

### 2020-21 | 3rd Season

After the COVID-19 pandemic eliminated the 2020-21 fall season, Radley guided the Ducks to a terrific 2021 spring campaign. The Ducks racked up six top-five finishes before reaching the NCAA Championships, where they placed 11th overall and came up just two strokes shy of advancing to match play. The Ducks posted a 23-over 1,175 in the NCAA Championships, the second-best 72-hole team performance in program history. UO auto-advanced to the NCAA Championships as the No. 4 seed at the Baton Rouge Regional after it was cancelled due to inclement weather.

Oregon's impressive spring season was highlighted by the program's first tournament win under Radley and first since 2016, as the Ducks used a stellar final round to finish as co-champions at the PING/ASU Invitational. After a slow start that saw UO in 10th place through 18 holes, the Ducks rattled off a phenomenal 9-under 279 to fly up the leaderboard and claim the victory. Chacon closed with a 4-under 68 to lead the comeback and tie as the individual runner up.

Chacon was fantastic for the Ducks throughout the 2021 spring season, becoming the fourth all-American in program history and second under Radley with WGCA second-team honors. Chacon led the team with a 72.73 scoring average and 12 rounds of par or better, and she notched top-10 finishes in five straight tournaments going into the NCAA Championships. Chacon was also an all-Pac-12 selection along with Lu, giving Oregon multiple first-team all-conference honorees in a season for the first time in program history.

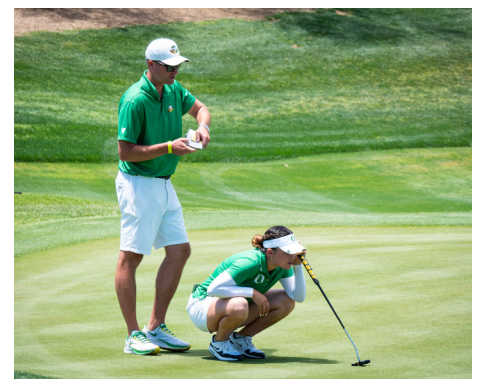

### OREGON: 2018-PRESENT

- » Named the sixth head coach in UO history on June 13, 2018, earning first-career head coaching job.
- » Hired Monica Vaughn - 2017 individual NCAA champion and Oregon native - as assistant coach.
- » Signed contract extension on July 30, 2021, that runs through the 2024-25 season.
- » Led Oregon to an 11th place finish at the 2021 NCAA Championships, finishing just two strokes shy of advancing to match play.
- » Has guided Oregon to five tournament victories in his first three-plus seasons, including four in 2021-22 to tie the program single-season record.
- » Led the Ducks to the first Pac-12 team title in program history in 2022, while Hsin-Yu (Cynthia) Lu became the second Duck ever to win the individual championship.
- » Oregon's entire five-player lineup earned all-Pac-12 honors in 2021-22, including a program-record three first-team selections in Lu, Sofie Kibsgaard Nielsen and Tze-Han (Heather) Lin.
- » UO shattered the 54-hole program records with a 26-under 838 to win the 2021 Mason Rudolph Championship.
- » Has recruited and coached two of the four all-Americans in program history - Nielsen (HM, 2020) and Briana Chacon (2nd team, 2021).
- » Coached Chacon and Lu to all-Pac-12 honors in 2020-21, giving UO multiple first-team all-conference selections in a season for the first time.
- » 2019-20 Ducks set program records for scoring average, scoring average vs. par, par-4 scoring and par-5 scoring, and tied record for rounds of par or better in a season.

### ARIZONA: 2012-2018

- » Started as an assistant coach in 2012 before being promoted to associated head coach in 2016.
- » Helped lead the Wildcats to the 2018 national championship in final season before coming to Oregon.

- » Joined Derek Radley's staff as Oregon's assistant coach on August 2, 2018.
- » Returned to her home state after growing up in Reedsport.
- » Won the NCAA individual and team championships as a senior for Arizona State in 2017, finishing with a 1-over 271.
- » Also won the individual title at NCAA Regionals as a senior, firing an incredible 8-under 208.
- » 2017 Pac-12 Women's Golfer of the Year and ASU's female recipient of the Tom Hansen Medal.
- » WGCA all-America first-team selection as both a sophomore - when she placed fifth at the NCAA championships - and a senior, and a second-team honoree as a junior.
- » Also a three-time Pac-12 first-team all-academic honoree.
- » Graduated magna cum laude from ASU in 2017.
- » Qualified for and competed in the 2021 U.S. Women's Open after winning her qualifier, finishing at 10-under par.
- » Set the Eugene Country Club course scoring record with an incredible 58 in October 2020, making 11 birdies and an eagle.

**2019-20 | 2nd Season**

Radley had the Ducks on pace for a historic season in 2019-20 before the sports world was shut down by the COVID-19 pandemic. Radley's young squad recorded six top-five finishes in seven events before the abrupt end to the season, with the Ducks setting new single-season records for scoring average (290.48), scoring average vs. par (3.05), par-4 scoring (4.18) and par-5 scoring (4.84) while tying the program record with nine rounds of par or better.

Nielsen led the Ducks as a true freshman with a 72.52 scoring average, the second-best in program history, while finishing in the top 20 in all seven events to open her collegiate career. Nielsen became only the third Duck ever to receive WGCA all-America honors, and first under Radley, earning honorable mention status.

**2018-19 | 1st Season**

Radley led the Ducks to the program's 12th straight NCAA Regionals appearance in his inaugural season at Oregon, earning the No. 7 seed in the Cle Elum Regional. The Ducks just missed out on qualifying for the NCAA Championships as a team, but Radley helped senior Kathleen Scavo earn an individual bid to the national tournament. Scavo went on to tie for 23rd overall, the fifth-best individual showing in program history.

**Relentless Recruiter**

Radley has already proven himself to be an ace recruiter in his time with the Ducks. He signed Nielsen, Chacon, and Ching-Tzu Chen in his first official recruiting class with the Ducks, three players who have played huge roles in helping the Ducks return to national prominence.

In November 2019, Radley bolstered the 2020-21 roster in a huge way with the signing of Lu, the top-ranked player out of Asia for the 2020 collegiate signing class. Lu was ranked as high as No. 77 on the World Golf Amateur Rankings entering her freshman season, and she is UO's highest-ranked player at No. 43 entering the 2022 spring season.

Radley bolstered an already talented and experienced roster going into 2021-22, signing 2021 Big West Player of the Year Brittany Shin as a transfer from Cal State Fullerton. OU also signed local star Baylee Hammericksen, the top-ranked high school player out of the state of Oregon.

Though the majority of Oregon's 2021-22 roster is expected to return in 2022-23, Radley continued to be aggressive on the recruiting trail and signed a pair of highly-regarded players to join the roster. Minori Nagano will come to Eugene in the fall of 2022 as a JUCO transfer from Seminole State College, and she would currently be UO's second-highest ranked player at No. 81 on the WAGR as of February 2022. Radley also signed Anika Varma, a decorated player out of Granite Bay High School in Roseville, Calif.

**Before Oregon**

Arizona earned five top-10 NCAA Championship finishes during Radley's time with the Wildcats, culminating with the national title in 2018. With Radley by her side during the championship round, junior Haley Moore birdied her first playoff hole to give Arizona a 3-2 win over Alabama. The Wildcats also earned a trio of top-three finishes at the Pac-12 Championships with Radley on staff, securing a conference title in 2015.

Radley coached seven All-Americans at Arizona, including two-time selection Lindsey Weaver in 2014 and 2015. The Wildcats were ranked in the top-12 nationally in each of Radley's six seasons. On the recruiting trail, Radley helped the Wildcats sign multiple top-20 ranked prospects, including Tigard, Ore., native Gigi Stoll, a two-time Pacific Northwest Women's Player of the Year.

**Personal**

A native of Cleveland, Ohio, Radley is a 2006 graduate of Ferris State, where he was a two-time all-conference selection on the Bulldogs' golf team. He earned a degree in marketing and professional golf management.

Radley served as LPGA tour pro Sara Brown's coach and caddie in 2010 and 2011. Radley is certified as a PGA Class A Professional. He began his teaching career at two top-25 golf schools, Crystal Mountain in Michigan and Dana Rader in North Carolina.

Radley and Brown were married in 2013. The couple has two sons, Palmer and Ryder, and one daughter, Azalea.

The University of Oregon athletic department, in partnership with Emerald Valley Golf Club, the University of Oregon Foundation and O&S Contractors, is excited to announce plans for a 6,000-square-foot, indoor/outdoor teaching facility at Emerald Valley Golf Club.

The new Peter and Jan Jacobsen Teaching Facility, nicknamed "The Jake," will serve as a state-of-the-art practice, instruction and teaching facility that allows Oregon men's and women's golfers use of the latest in golf technology and resources in a weather-protected environment. The facility will include three oversized driving range bays with integrated TrackMan technology, an indoor putting studio and covered outdoor heated driving range.

The Northwest-inspired design was conceptualized by Oregon golf coaches Casey Martin and Derek Radley, with University of Oregon alumna/architect Annie Usher.

"Peter and Jan have meant so much to Oregon Athletics, especially the golf programs," Martin said. "They have also been great friends and mentors to me personally. This facility is a special way to honor their contributions to the University of Oregon and continue our tradition of providing an amazing student-athlete experience. I cannot wait for this dream to become a reality."

Martin and Radley recently surprised the Jacobsens when they informed them of the University's decision to name the new facility in their honor.

"Jan and I both loved playing on the Oregon golf teams during our time at Oregon," said Peter Jacobsen, a former PGA Tour professional and NBC Sports commentator. "We are so happy, humbled and honored to be involved in this new and vitally important practice facility. As Oregonians we understand the challenges we face with inclement weather in the Northwest, but this state-of-the-art facility will allow our teams to practice and train all year long uninhibited by the occasional rainy day. I hope all of Duck nation joins us in support of this exciting initiative."

In addition to the practice features of the teaching facility, the building will also provide a "clubhouse" atmosphere in which the men and women of Oregon Golf are able to study, build camaraderie and host prospective recruits. A covered outdoor fireplace provides the perfect setting to enjoy the spoils of fall sunsets and crisp spring mornings in Oregon.

"We are beyond excited and thankful for everyone's efforts in making this facility a reality," Radley said. "The University of Oregon takes pride in offering a world-class experience to all student-athletes, and this facility will be no different. For the men and women of Oregon golf – past and present – we have always thought of ourselves as a family, and now we will have a place to call home."

A unique partnership with Emerald Valley Golf Club will allow Oregon Golf to add another tremendous resource that is exclusively available to Duck golfers, complementing existing partnerships with Eugene Country Club and Shadow Hills Country Club.

"As a past Oregon golfer and Duck fan, we are proud to host one of the nation's top practice and instructional facilities," Emerald Valley Golf Club owner Jim Pliska said. "This facility will not only propel our current student-athletes but help attract the best in the world for years to come."

Construction of the facility will be privately funded through gifts to the Oregon Golf program and the University of Oregon Foundation. Oregon Athletics aims to raise \$3 million in support of construction and ongoing operation/maintenance of the facility.

"The University of Oregon has a great tradition of championship golf," UO director of athletics Rob Mullens said. "Casey Martin and Derek Radley have built nationally recognized programs without having a dedicated facility. We are excited to provide men's and women's golf student-athletes this additional resource to continue competing at the highest level in the Pac-12. A special thanks to Jim Pliska and Emerald Valley Golf Club for making this facility possible."

The facility is in the final stages of planning with hopes of breaking ground midway through 2022.
