#### STORY LINES

**TEE OFF** The No. 2 seeded Florida women's golf team travels to Albuquerque, N.M., to compete in the NCAA Regionals starting on Monday, May 10 through Wednesday, May 11 at the UNM Championship Course hosted by the University of New Mexico.

#### FORMAT

The NCAA Regional format includes three rounds of stroke play over three days of competition. Earlier this year, the NCAA announced the expansion from four to six regional sites, matching the same amount on the men's side. At the conclusion of play, the top four teams and two individuals from non-qualifying teams will advance to the NCAA Championships, set to begin on May 20 at Greyhawk Golf Club in Scottsdale, Ariz.

#### TOURNAMENT HISTORY

The Gators have qualified for 28 of the 29 all-time women's golf regionals as they were introduced in 1993 - the only year missed was 1999. Florida has made every regional since 2000 and each year under head coach Emily Glaser. The program has won three titles with the first in 2008 and back-to-back in 2016 and 2017, to tie for 10th all-time with Vanderbilt. Kelly Grassel claimed the program's first individual regional title in 2017 at the Columbus Regional.

#### LAST TIME OUT

Florida finished runner-up at the SEC Championship in Birmingham. The Gators entered the match play portion of the conference tournament seeking its first-ever victory after back-to-back years (2018-19) of 3-2 setbacks in the quarterfinals as the format was added in 2018. The No. 5 seeded Gators knocked off the reigning conference champion and No. 1 seeded Auburn Tigers and the defending national champions, Ole Miss. Florida fell to No. 2 LSU in the finals 4-1, as the Tigers won its first SEC title in 30 years.

#### RUNNING UP

Four different Gators have placed runner-up this season, including a stretch with three consecutive - Jackie Lucena, Maisie Filler and Jenny Kim - all tied or set their career-best finish.

- The UC Davis transfer, Lucena turned in her second round under par (-1) in round three as she started the day with a birdie on 10 to end the weekend with 13 total. She battled Stanford's Rose Zhang and Texas' Bohyun Park for individual honors throughout the final day, only finishing one stroke behind Zhang (-4).
- Filler posted all three rounds in the 60's 69, 66 and 68. After setting her career low in round two, she turned in a 68 (-4) on the final day en route to tying second all-time in program history for low individual tournament at 203 (-13). The last Gator to record the mark was Camila Hedberg in 2012 at the Cougar Classic. Filler was one stroke away from the program record (202) set by current pro Sam Wagner in 2016. Her runner-up finish was the team's second straight and career best.
- Kim had a career outing with collegiate bests in round (66), finish (T2) and tournament score (204). Her 12-under tourney score is tied fourth all-time in program history and her round of 66 (-6) sits tied third.
- Fuller's runner-up outing concluded an improvement in the last three outings to end the regular season T4, T3 and 2. She was named SEC Golfer of the Week for the outing and only finished five strokes back from the eventual SEC Indv. Champion Ingrid Linblad of LSU.

#### THE BIG STAGE X3

For the third time in her career, Annabell Fuller was selected to the Great Britain and Ireland team for the 2022 Curtis Cup. She has competed in the event twice in 2018 and 2021. Last summer, the event was held at Conway Golf Club in Wales after the 2020 schedule tournament was canceled due to COVID-19. The Gator helped win three points in fourball action including two 4&3 victories.

She also made her third appearance at the Augusta National Women's Amateur (ANWA) only missing this year's cut by a stroke. A native of Kingston upon Thames, England, she made the weekend last year and finished T22.

#### **50 YEARS**

As the University of Florida celebrates 50 years of Women's Athletics, Gators Golf was one of the five original programs - swimming, tennis, track and gymnastics - to transition into a varsity team from club status after Title IV was signed into law.

The program also holds the milestone of participating as Florida's inaugural varsity women's team in October of 1972 at the Falconette Invitational at Hollywood Lake Golf Course in South Florida.

#### FALL RECAP

Florida concluded a successful fall with three consecutive third-place finishes to begin the season and a runner-up finish in the fall finale, including back-toback runner-up individuals in Jackie Lucena and Maisie Filler. The placement tied Lucena's collegiate best while marking Filler's career-best. Filler posted all three rounds in the 60's - 69, 66 and 68. After setting her career-low in round two, she turned in a 68 (-4) the next day en route to tying second all-time in program history for low individual tournament at 203 (-13). She was one stroke away from the program record (202) set by current pro Sam Wagner in 2016.

#### **ROBERTS ADDED**

Taylor Roberts was added to the roster after transferring in from Florida State at the start of the spring semester. A native of Parkland, Fla., she started every tournament as a freshman for the Seminoles and earned two top-10 finishes. She helped the program record its best finish at the NCAA Championship in ninth while her scoring average ranked 13th in program history.

#### PRESEASON RANKINGS AND RECOGNITION

The Gators were selected in two preseason polls - #19 by the GolfChannel.com and #21 by the WGCA. Additionally, Annabell Fuller was ranked as the No. 23 preseason player by GolfChanel.com and was selected to the ANNIKA Award Watch List for the second straight season.

#### THE TURN:

Florida will look to advance to its 29th NCAA National Championship and seventh time under head coach Emily Glaser. The Gators won back-to-back National Championships in 1985 and 1986, becoming the first program ever to win two straight titles since the Division I tournament began in 1982. Florida has finished in the top-10 on 15 occasions with a stretch of top-5 or better from 1982-1990.

## EMILY GLASER

Head Coach - Tenth Season

Emily Glaser is entering her 10th season guiding the University of Florida's women's golf program. Glaser has led the Gator to the NCAA Championships in six of her nine seasons, including four consecutive years from 2016-2019. Announced as UF's head coach on June 8, 2012, the former LPGA Tour player and collegiate All-American has brought experience as a student-athlete, coach and professional with an attitude for winning that has followed her at each stop along her career path.

Glaser led the Gators back into competition with a threetournament schedule highlighted by the East Lake Cup, which was broadcasted exclusively on the Golf Channel. Florida's season was highlighted by its sixth straight championship at home, capped off by sophomore Annabell Fuller's first individual championship after carding a career-low 66 in the final round of play. Glaser led the Gators back into the national field after qualifying for the NCAA Regional tournament. Individually, Addie Baggarly and Annabell Fuller were invited to play in the second-annual Augusta National Women's Amateur. Fuller also was a part of the Gators trio that earned league honors after being named to the Second Team All-SEC. Maisie Filler was tabbed to the All-Freshman Team while Lauren Waidner earned her third consecutive spot on the SEC Community Service Team.

Despite the 2019-20 season being cut short due to the CO-VID-19 pandemic, Glaser and the Gators still experienced immense success on the course. The Gators concluded the season ranked as the No. 7 team in the nation after finishing within the top five on six occasions, capturing three team titles and one individual title. Individually, junior Addie Baggarly earned a spot on the All-SEC Second Team and was named to the 2020 US Arnold Palmer Cup Team under Glaser.

Florida finished the 2018-19 season ranked No. 8 in the country with three team titles, two individual titles, and seven top-five finishes. Glaser also had her first NCAA medalist as junior Sierra Brooks finished second at the 2019 NCAA Championships. She also had another individual medalist at SEC's with junior Marta Perez finishing in a tie for second. Freshman Clara Manzalini finished T5 at SEC's, which was the highest finish by a freshman since Maria Torres in 2014, Glaser's second season st the helm of the Gators. Brooks, Perez, and Manzalini also earning a spot on the All-Freshman Team. Brooks was also named a WGCA All-American Second-Team honoree.

During the 2017-18 season, the Gators tallied two individual titles, two team titles, and nine top-10 finishes. Sophomore Sierra Brooks was named a WGCA All-American and Golf-week All-American after leading the team in stroke average with a 72.03 in her 26 rounds in the spring, the mark is tied for second in program history. She became the first player in program history to win two of her first three events in Orange and Blue and was the sixth player to earn WGCA honors and eighth to earn Golfweek honors under coach Glaser.

In the 2016-17 campaign, Glaser led Florida to six first-place finished which included the SEC Championship. It was the eighth time in program history that the Gators took home the conference championship and the first time under the direction of coach Glaser. Florida set an SEC Tournament record shooting 22-under-par for the tournament. After winning the NCAA Regional and advanced to the NCAA Championships, the Gators made a run all the way to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championships before falling to Arizona State. In addition to their team success, UF collected eight individual tournament titles as senior Maria Torres led the Gators with three medalist finishes. Glaser was named the Golf Pride WGCA East Regional Coach of the year for the second consecutive season. Glaser was also named the SEC Coach of the Year following the Gators win of the 2017 title. Torres, Kelly Grassel and Taylor Tomlinson all earned Golfweek and WGCA All-American honors. Torres became the first Gator golfer since Sandra Gal in 2007 to be named as a first team honoree.

Glaser led the Gators to seven first-place finishes in the 2015-2016 season, including the four straight tournament wins at the Allstate Sugar Bowl Intercollegiate, Sun Trust Gator Women's Invitational, Briar's Creek Invitational and the Clemson Invitational. Florida brought home its first regional championship ince 2008 after claiming a share of the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional Championship. Glaser was named the 2015-2016 Golf Pride WGCA East Regional Coach of the year after leading the Gators to the NCAA Championship. Junior

Maria Torres received Florida's first Southeastern Conference Golfer of the Year award since 1990, and was named a 2016 Honorable Mention All-American. Torres finished the season with a 72.03 stroke average, the lowest single-season average in school history. Torres recorded 10 top-25 finishes and two tournament wins, while also being named to the 2016 Baton Rouge All-Region Team.

Glaser oversaw nine top-10 team finishes during the 2014-15 season, including a tournament win at the Briar's Creek Invitational, and back-to-back runner-up finishes at the Allstate Sugar Bowl Intercollegiate and the SunTrust Gator Women's Invitational. The squad narrowly missed out on a third straight NCAA Championship appearance after placing eighth at the NCAA Raleigh Regional. In a breakout sophomore season, Karolina Vlckova individually qualified for the 2015 NCAA Championships after being named to the NCAA All-Region Team and was subsequently named a Golfweek Honorable Mention All-American. Vlckova competed in 32 rounds with the lowest average on the team of 74.06, she also led the team collecting seven top-25 finishes and five top-10 finishes.

The 2014-15 season brought with it the introduction of freshman standout Taylor Tomlinson and sophomore newcomer Kelly Grassel. As a freshman, Tomlinson was a staple in the Florida lineup - she was the only Gator to compete in every tournament during the 2014-15 season, and was twice tabbed as the SEC Freshman of the Week. Tomlinson was also named to the 2015 SEC All-Freshman Team, after finishing the 2015 SEC Championships tied for 20th. In her first season in Orange and Blue, Grassel competed in 23 rounds, with a 74.1 stroke average - second best on the team. Grassel played a huge part in the Gators' only team tournament victory of the season, as she recorded her collegiate best finish (2nd), best tournament score (-4) 212 and best round (69) at the Briar's Creek Invitational, before an injury sidelined her for the remainder of the season.

In 2013-14, Glaser oversaw eight top-10 finishes during the regular season for the Orange and Blue. The squad knocked off tournament host Oklahoma State in a playoff at the NCAA Central Regional to earn the program's 25th berth at the 2014 NCAA Championships. At the NCAA Championships, the Gators improved each day, with a significant 23-stroke difference from round one to round four, to tie for 18th. In her final round, lone senior Elcin Ulu climbed the leaderboard to a top-25 finish with a career-low 18-hole score of 66 (-4) and led the Gators to their lowest round, 282 (+2), of the event. Florida brough home the team and individual titles from its first tournament of the season, the Cougar Classic in Charleston, S.C. UF defended its crown at the event by one stroke over runner-up Clemson and junior Anna Young earned the first individual title of her collegiate career by finishing at five-under (211).

The 2013-14 season saw two-time All-American Camilla Hedberg tally three top-10 finishes, as she finished her junior year with a 75.4 stroke average in 33 rounds. Maria Torres finished her first year as a Gator with five top-25 finishes, the secondmost on the UF squad, and was a member of the SEC All-Freshman Team. Another first-year player, Karolina Vickova, was the only Gator to compete in every tournament during the 2013-14 season.

In her initial season as a head coach in 2012-13, Glaser directed the Gators to three team titles (Cougar Classic, Betsy Rawls Invitational, Florida Challenge), the program's most victories in a campaign since 2007-08. UF reached its thirdconsecutive NCAA Championships in 2013, marking Florida's first time advancing to the tournament for three-straight years since 1996-98.

While winning the Cougar Classic and Betsy Rawls Invite, the Gators also carded the top-two team round scores (279, 280) in UF history. At those same tournaments came the second (852 at Cougar Classic) and fifth (863 at Betsy Rawls Invite) lowest team tournament totals in school history. Four of the team's top-five players recorded at least two top-10 finishes, and seven of the eight UF golfers that recorded at least one competitive round had a top-25 finish. A total of 16 top-10 finishes were recorded among four Florida golfers and the team's 295.54 team round average in 2012-13 was the second-lowest in school history. A first-team All-SEC pick, Hedberg was named an All-American Honorable Mention by the WGCA for the second-straight year and also won three individual tournament titles in her second season as a Gator. Isabelle Lendl garnered second-team All-SEC recognition

and delivered five top-10 efforts, with individual titles at the Dale McNamara Invitational in Broken Arrow, Okla., and at the Tar Heel Invitational in Chapel Hill, N.C. A two-time All-SEC recipient, Mia Piccio was named to the WGCA All-Central Region Team and was the team's top finisher at NCAAs. Before her move to the Sunshine State, Glaser served as assistant coach for Duke University's women's golf team during the 2009-10 season. During her one season with the Blue Devils, the team finished third in the Atlantic Coast Conference and tied for eighth at the NCAA Championships.

Glaser, who played four years at Michigan State University and is considered the greatest Spartan golfer of all time, was an NCAA All-American in 2002, a four-time All-Big Ten selection (1999-2002), the 2002 Big Ten Golf Athlete of the Year and the 1999 Big Ten Freshman of the Year. She set the program's single-season record for stroke average during the 2002 season, while appearing in four NCAA Regionals and three NCAA Championships.

Glaser's storied collegiate career includes being named to the United States' Curtis Cup team in 2002, and being selected as the Michigan State George Alderton Athlete of the Year in both 2000 and 2002. After her stint as a player, she was hired as an assistant coach at MSU, a position she held during the 2002-03 school year. In 2012, Glaser was inducted into the Michigan State Athletics Hall of Fame to commemorate her success as a Spartan student-athlete and coach. Glaser competed on the victorious U.S. Curtis Cup squad in 2002 and also represented the Red, White and Blue at that year's World Amateur Team Championships. She was a semifinalist at the 2001 U.S. Women's Amateur, played in three U.S. Women's Open Championships (2002, 2004 and 2005) and is a three-time Ohio State Women's Amateur Champion (1999, 2001 and 2003).

Following her career at Michigan State, Glaser competed on the LPGA Tour in 2005, 2006 and 2008 and played on the Duramed Futures Tour in 2004, 2007 and 2009. She captured the Futures Tour Player of the Year Award and was the leading money winner in 2007. Glaser carded a career-low 66 at the 2008 McDonald's LPGA Championship and also registered a pair of top-10 finishes on the LPGA Tour.

## **JANICE OLIVENCIA**

Associate Head Coach - Tenth Season

Former professional player and collegiate All-American Janice Olivencia (Oh-lee-vin-see-ya) is in her 10th season, and fourth as an associate head coach at the University of Florida working alongside head coach Emily Glaser. Olivencia brought experience from her playing career and as a collegiate assistant coach to the Gator program. Florida has advanced to the NCAA Championships in six of her seasons on the staff.

With competition returning to the NCAA after the CO-VID-19 pandemic cut the previous season short, Olivencia was instrumental in guiding the Gators to their sixth consecutive title at home. Olivencia was on the course with Annabell Fuller in the final round, offering her advice that ultimately resulted in Fuller's first individual title. The associate head coach was on hand as Fuller and Addie Baggarly competed in the second-annual Augusta National Women's Amateur, serving as Fuller's caddie, and guided a Gators trio to league honors. Fuller was named to the Second Team All-SEC, while Maisie Filler was tabbed to the All-Freshman Team. Lauren Waidner capped the trio, earning a spot on the SEC Community Service Team for the third straight year.

Despite the 2019-20 season being cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Olivencia and the Gators still experienced immense success on the course. Through its seven events, Florida finished within the top five on six occasions, capturing three team titles and one individual title. With Olivencia's guidance, junior Addie Baggarly earned a spot on the All-SEC Second Team and was named to the 2020 US Arnold Palmer Cup Team.

Florida finished the 2018-19 season ranked No. 8 in the country with three team titles, two individual titles, and seven top-five finishes. The Gators also had the first NCAA medalist since 1986 as junior Sierra Brooks finished second at the 2019 NCAA Championships. The Gators had another individual medalist at SEC's with junior Marta Perez finishing in a tie for second. Freshman Clara Manzalini finished T5 at SEC's, which was the highest finish by a freshman since Maria Torres in 2014. Brooks, Perez, and Manzalini were all named to the All-SEC Second Team with Manzalini also earning a spot on the All-Freshman Team. Brooks was also named a WGCA All-American Second-Team honoree.

During the 2017-18 season, the Gators tallied two individual titles, two team titles, and nine top-10 finishes. Sophomore Sierra Brooks was named a WGCA All-American and Golfweek All-American after leading the team in stroke



average with a 72.03 in her 26 rounds in the spring, the mark is tied for second in program history. She became the first player in program history to win two of her first three events in Orange and Blue and was the sixth player to earn WGCA honors and eighth to earn Golfweek honors under coach Glaser and Olivencia.

In the 2016-17 campaign, Olivencia helped led Gators to six first-place finishes which included the the eighth SEC Championship in program history. Florida set an SEC Tournament record shooting 22-under-par for the tournament. After winning the NCAA Regional and advanced to the NCAA Championships, the Gators made a run all the way to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championships before falling to Arizona State. Florida also collected eight individual tournament titles as senior Maria Torres led the Gators with three medalist finishes. Torres, Kelly Grassel and Taylor Tomlinson all earned Golfweek and WGCA All-American honors. Torres became the first Gator golfer since Sandra Gal in 2007 to be named as a first team honoree.

Olivencia and Glaser led the Gators to four straight tournament wins at the Allstate Sugar Bowl Intercollegiate, Sun-Trust Gator Women's Invitational, Briar's Creek Invitational and the Clemson Invitational. Florida tied for first in the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional Championship to advance to their third NCAA Championship in four year. Maria Torres finished the season with a 72.03 stroke average, the lowest single-season average in school history, and was also named a 2016 Honorable Mention All-American

During the 2014-15 season, under Olivencia and Glaser's guidance, Florida recorded nine top-10 team finishes including first at the Briar's Creek Invitational, and runnerup at both the Allstate Sugar Bowl Intercollegiate and the SunTrust Gator Women's Invitational. The squad narrowly missed out on a third straight NCAA Championship ap pearance, after placing eighth at the NCAA Raleigh Regional. Karolina Vlckova individually qualified for the NCAA Championships, after being named to the NCAA All-Region Team, and was subsequently named a Golfweek Honorable Mention All-American.

With Olivencia's assistance, Florida recorded 10 top-10 team finishes throughout the 2013-14 season, including first at the Cougar Classic for the second year in a row, third at the Allstate Sugar Bowl Intercollegiate Golf Championship and fourth at The Alamo Invitational. The squad knocked off tournament host Oklahoma State in a play-off at the NCAA Central Regional to earn the program's 25th berth at the NCAA Championships. Maria Torres was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team and was recognized as the league's Freshman of the Week after tying for third at the Allstate Sugar Bowl event in New Orleans, La.

In 2012-13, the Gators finished with three team wins (Cougar Classic, Betsy Rawls Invitational, Florida Challenge) and celebrated six individual winners on the campaign. All-American and first-team All-SEC selection Camilla Hedberg became one of only 12 other players in school history to win at least three tournaments in their career and became the eighth person from UF to win three or more tournaments in a season. Isabelle Lendl collected second-team All-SEC kudos, while Mia Piccio was named to the Women's Golf Coaches Association All-Central Region Team.

Olivencia came to Gainesville after serving as the University of South Florida's assistant women's golf coach in 2011-12. The Bulls claimed their first Big East Championship in 2012 and advanced to NCAA Central Regional action. During the regular season, USF collected three team tournament titles and two individual titles. The Bulls also placed an individual in the top-five seven times, while Christina Miller was named the Big East Player of the Year in 2012, becoming the first winner of the award in school history.

Olivencia joined the USF coaching staff after playing on the Ladies European Tour from 2005-08 and LPGA Futures Tour from 2008-10. She was the first Puerto Rican woman to qualify to play on the Ladies European Tour.

As a professional, Olivencia qualified for the 2009 U.S. Women's Open in Saucon Valley, Pa. It was another first for Puerto Rico, as she became the first woman golfer from P.R. to qualify for a major event. The last Puerto Rican to qualify for a major golfing event was Professional Golf Association (PGA) Hall of Famer Chi Chi Rodriguez.

During her collegiate career at the University of Texas, Olivencia earned All-America honors from the National Golf Coaches Association in 2002 and 2003. The 2002 Big 12 Player of the Year and a three-time All-Big 12 honoree as a sophomore, junior and senior, she twice finished among the top-10 individuals in NCAA Championships play, tying for 10th as a sophomore in 2002 and sharing sixth in 2003. As a senior, Olivencia led the Longhorns to the 2004 Big 12 Tournament title with a runner-up individual finish. As a Longhorn, she recorded a pair of individual wins (Betsy Rawls Invitational and the Lady Northern Invitational), notched 15 top-10 finishes and claimed 20 top-20 finishes.

While playing at Texas, Olivencia posted impressive results as an amateur. She won the prestigious 2002 Women's Western Amateur Championship, was a 2002 Co-Medalist U.S. Open Qualifier, and both a quarterfinalist and semifinalist at the North & South Amateur Championship.

Olivencia was a member of the Puerto Rico National Golf team from 1998-2004, representing her country twice at the World Amateur Championships. In addition, she was a three-time Caribbean Women's Amateur Champion and a two-time Puerto Rico Island Champion.
