**NCAA
Championships**
Hosted by University of Oregon

The Lobos are headed to Eugene, Ore., to compete in the NCAA Championships, hosted by Oregon on June 8-11.

The championships will be hosted by the University of Oregon at the historic Hayward Field and features the top-24 athletes in each event (top-12 from East regional and top-12 from West regional).

11 Lobos punched their ticket to compete in the championships this season, tied for the most in program history (last 11 was in 2009). Of the 11 competing, eight of them are first-timers to the big stage in outdoor season.

With 11 athletes, the New Mexico squad has submitted 12 entries. This is the 13th most amongst all the DI schools (tied with Duke, Kansas, NC State and Miami (FL)).

The championships, similar to the regionals are split by gender. The men will compete on Wednesday, June 8, and Friday, June 10. The women will compete on Thursday, June 9, and Saturday, June 11.

On Wednesday, Jovahn Williamson will open competition for New Mexico as he runs in the 400m dash semifinal at 6 p.m. (PT). Rivaldo Leacock will follow this as he runs in the 400m hurdles semifinal at 6:30 p.m. Williamson and Leacock will combine with Victor

Akhalu and Jevon O'Bryant to run in the men's 4x400m relay semifinal at 7:48 p.m.

On Thursday, Abbe Goldstein and Stefanie Parsons will start things off as they run in the 1500m semifinal at 5:46 p.m. Elise Thorner and Adva Cohen are set to compete in the 3000m steeplechase semifinal round at 6:02 p.m. Amelia Mazza-Downie and Emma Heckel will close the night out in the 10K final at 8:08 p.m.

Friday's schedule depend on who of the men advanced to the final round. If everyone advances, Williamson will run in the 400m dash final at 7:02 p.m. Leacock will compete in the 400m hurdles final at 7:27 p.m. The 4x400m relay team will compete in the final round of the event at 8:21 p.m.

Saturday's schedule will also depend on who advanced to the final rounds in their events. Should they advance, Goldstein and Parsons will run in the 1500m final at 2:41 p.m., while Thorner and Cohen will compete in the 3000m SC final at 2:54 p.m. The trio of Gracelyn Larkin, Heckel and Mazza-Downie close the championships out in the 5000m final at 4:25 p.m.

The top eight finishers in each event will earn USTFCCCA First Team All-American while the 9-16 finishers will earn Second Team, which will be announced by the organization next week.

LOBOS REMAIN IN TOP-15

The women's team started the season with just a few qualifying teams, debuting at 194 in week 1 of the USTFCCA rating index, but quickly moved its way up. In week 2, the Lobos moved up to No. 19, then to No. 18 in week 3.

In week 4, the squad debuted in the top-25 at No. 9. They spent weeks 5-7 at No. 12, then dropped to No. 15 in week 8, before moving up to No. 13 in week 9. In the final week of ratings before championships that was released on May 31, the team ranked No. 15.

This is the first time a men's relay team from New Mexico has competed in the event at the national championship stage since 1966 - a 56 year gap! All four Lobos of the relay team will also be competing in any event in the championships for the first time in their careers.

PROGRAM-HIGH 11 QUALIFIERS EARN THE TURQUOISE

11 Lobos punched their ticket and earned their right to don the turquoise jerseys to the NCAA Championships, tied for the most in New Mexico program history. The last time 11 qualified was in 2009.

On the men's side, four Lobos qualified for three total entries. On the women's side, seven student-athletes qualified for nine total entries.

NOTABLE NUMBERS

Not only is 11 qualifiers tied for the most in program history, it's also the most amongst Mountain West schools this season by a landslide. The second most is three by Colorado State.

The 12 entries going into the championships is 13th most amongst DI schools, tied with Kansas, Duke, Miami (FL) and NC State.

FIRST-TIMERS CLUB

Of the 11 qualifiers, nine of them are competing in the NCAA DI Outdoor Championships for the first time in their careers.

For Elise Thorner, Gracelyn Larkin, Emma Heckel and Abbe Goldstein, this is the first outdoor qualification. All three of them have competed in another championships (XC or Indoor). DI transfer Stefanie Parsons qualified for her first Division I outdoor championships.





The men's relay team all qualified for their first ever championships. Victor Akhalu and Jevon O'Bryant transferred from junior colleges, while Jovahn Williamson and Rivaldo Leacock transferred from DI schools but this is their first time qualifying for the big stage in any NCAA Championship (indoor or outdoor).

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

There's a few events that the Lobos have not qualified for in a while... a long while.

New Mexico has not had a 4x400m relay team qualify for championships since 1966 - a 56 year gap!

Before Rivaldo Leacock, the last time a Lobo qualified for 400m hurdles was in 2014 (Charles Lewis).

THREE IS A LUCKY NUMBER

Both the men's and women's teams finished in third at the Mountain West Outdoor Championships, which were on May 11-14 in Clovis, Calif.

The women's team ended with 116.50 team points, while the men's team ended with 100 team points.

BEST IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

16 Lobos placed in the top-three finishers in their respective events at the Mountain West Championships, earning All-Conference Team selections - an even split of eight Lobos on the women's team and eight on the men's team.

The Lobos earned the top spot in eight different events - Samree Dishon in the 10K, Adva Cohen in 3000m SC, Aidan Quinn in triple jump, Elise Thorner in the 1500m run, Jevon O'Bryant in the 400m dash, Jovahn Williamson in the 200m dash, Gracelyn Larkin in the 5K, Rivaldo Leacock in the 400m hurdles, and the men's 4x400m relay team.

The women's team earned podium sweeps in three events - the 1500m, 5K and 10K, just further proving New Mexico's dominance in distance events.

The women that earned All-Mountain West are Adva Cohen, Samree Dishon, Emma Heckel, Tianna Holmes, Gracelyn Larkin, Amelia Mazza-Downie, Stefanie Parsons and Elise Thorner.

The men that earned the All-Conference honors are Victor Akhalu, Camillo Dunninger, Matthew Larkin, Rivaldo Leacock, Jevon O'Bryant, Aidan Quinn, Jovahn Williamson and Awet Yohannes.

SPRINTING TO SCHOOL RECORDS

New Mexico is not necessarily known for their sprints like they are known for their distance runners. A few transfers to the men's team has changed that legacy that this season.

Jevon O'Bryant transferred in from Barton County Community College, Jovahn Williamson is a graduate transfer from Harvard, Rivaldo Leacock is a graduate transfer from South Carolina and Victor Akhalu transferred in from New Mexico Junior College.

These four have had an immediate impact on the program as the 4x400m relay team this season. For the first time in school history, the relay team took first at the MW Championships. Just a few weeks before that, they also ran the fastest time in the event in 45 years at 3:06.76, which set a stadium record and was the fifth fastest time in conference history.

At the NCAA West Regional, they set a school record with an impressive sub-3:05 time of 3:04.98, a record that went untouched for 45 years (1977).

FROM BEST IN BARBADOS TO THE BEST IN THE WEST

After transferring from South Carolina, Rivaldo Leacock has shined bright for the Lobos. His event of choice is the 400m hurdles. His time of 50.04 in the event is the best by a Barbados-born athlete this season and second best all-time.

He was named the Mountain West Men's Track Athlete of the Week on March 29, after placing first in his event at the ASU Invitational the week prior.

At the NCAA West Regional, he beat his own record, going sub-50 with a time of 49.63s to further write his name in the records.

THORNER CONTINUES LEGACY OF LOBO 3000M SC DOMINANCE

Elise Thorner is the latest Lobo to find success in the women's 3000m steeplechase event. Earlier in the season, she took the No. 1 spot in the nation with a time of 9:40.98. It was short lived though as Courtney Wayment of BYU claimed the top spot the very next day.

Since then, Thorner improved by eight whole seconds in the event, earning the ninth-fastest time in NCAA collegiate history and fastest in U23 UK history with a time of 9:32.42. After this performance, she was named the MW Women's Track Athlete of the Week.

Her time is currently ranked No. 3 in NCAA Division I and No. 29 in the nation this season.

BOWERMAN GETS THE CALL

Associate head coach Laura Bowerman was officially named to the USATF staff for this upcoming summer's World Athletics Championships Oregon22, set for July 15-29 in Eugene, Ore.

Bowerman has coached 43 All-Americans on the oval through her past six years at New Mexico. She also led two NCAA Champions - Courtney Frerichs in the 3000m SC in 2016 and Weini Kelati in the 10K in 2019. She has also led the cross country team to seven straight MW titles, extending their streak to 14 seasons in a row.

NOTEWORTHY :

JOE FRANKLIN enters his 14th year as the head track and field/cross country coach at The University of New Mexico. Franklin took over the program on June 18, 2007 after 13 years in the same role at Butler University. He replaced Matt Henry who retired after seven years at New Mexico. Franklin is the seventh men's and fifth women's head track and field coach at UNM.

At the time of his hiring Franklin said, "I'm excited and thrilled. This is a very unique opportunity, especially when you look at the great tradition and history that New Mexico has had in cross country and track and field. I think the University of New Mexico and city of Albuquerque are tremendous settings for competition and training and places that provide unique opportunities for student-athletes."

Franklin said he has lofty expectations for the future of the UNM track and cross country programs. "The goals for the program are always to see where we can max out in every event," he said. "Let's see how high we can go. Let's see if we can get to be a top-10 team in cross country. Let's see if we can get to be a top-25 team in track and field. We want to have athletes in the sprints, throws, jumps, vaults and distance events qualifying for the NCAAs consistently and then see if we can build on that and start moving up in the team standings."

Since that time Franklin has wasted little time making his mark at New Mexico and achieved many of the goals he laid out in his hiring, which culminated with UNM's most successful season for the women in 2018-19.

In 2008 the United States Track & Field and Cross Country Association created a "Program of the Year" award to honor those teams who succeeded in all three sports — cross country, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field — on a yearly basis at the NCAA Championships. Since the awards inception New Mexico has made the list six times on the men's side and five times on the women's side.

Franklin has also assembled a considerable collection of championship hardware while leading UNM. Since the start of the 2009-10 school year, the Franklin-led Lobos have claimed the most conference titles of any Mountain West member, with 23 total (11 women's cross-country; six men's cross-country; three men's indoor track & field; one men's outdoor track & field; two women's indoor track & field). Franklin delivered two national

championships in cross country, the first individual national championship in cross country in Ednah Kurgat and eight individual track and field champions.
