The 2022 rendition of the Battle of I-25 will be the 112th meeting between NM State and New Mexico. The University of New Mexico leads the all-time series 73-33-5, including each of the last three meetings.

NM State captain Syrus Dumas recorded a career-high ten tackles against FIU. The cornerback's previous high was seven, which came against No. 1 Alabama in Tuscaloosa last season.

13

Chris Ojoh ranks 13th among active FBS players with 166 career solo tackles. Ojoh also sits in 15th among active players with 291 career tackles. This season, Ojoh leads all NM State defenders with 46 total tackles, including three sacks and five tackles for a loss.

14

Following their opening contest with Maine, the Lobos have converted just 14% of their third down attempts. After going 9-12 in the opener, New Mexico has gone just 9-63 on third down.

.17

Throughout the 2022 season, the NM State defense has been outstanding on punt defense. The Aggies have allowed just 0.17 punt return yards per game - The eighth-lowest total in FBS football. Fellow FBS Independent member Army leads the nation, allowing -10.0 punt return yards per game.

THERE IS A DIFFERENCE

Believe it or not, New Mexico State University and the University of New Mexico are actually two separate schools.

New Mexico State University was founded in 1888 and sits in Las Cruces, NM. NM State is home to 16 athletic teams, known as the Aggies, who mainly compete in the Western Athletic Conference. NM State uses crimson and white as the primary colors.

The University of New Mexico was founded in 1889 and now occupies nearly 800 acres in Albuquerque, NM. Also home to 16 varsity teams, the Lobos compete in the Mountain West and wear cherry and silver.

BATTLE OF I-25

Saturday will be the 112th meeting between NM State and New Mexico. The Lobos lead the all-time series 73-33-5.

NM State looks to win their first contest against UNM since September 9, 2017 and its first win in Las Cruces since September 10, 2016.

HISPANIC HERITAGE DAY

Saturday's contest will mark NM State's third annual Hispanic Heritage Day and Fan Fiesta. The fan fiesta will include Luchadore wrestling, Mariachi and Folklorico entertainment, and more.

NAVAJO BROADCAST

Saturday's game will be the first of two radio broadcasts in the Navajo language this season for NM State Athletics. 107.3 KCYZ FM in Carlsbad will carry the game with Cuyler Frank on the play-by-play call and Clenn King will be the color analyst.

Frank made history on September 23, 2005 when he was the first to announce an NCAA Division I game in the Navajo language - A 41-13 win for No. 13 California over NM State in Las Cruces.

LATE MEETING

The October 15th meeting between the in-state rivals will be the latest into the season that the two teams have met since 2001. The 2001 Battle of I-25 took place on November 24 and saw UNM win 53-0.

VICTORY LAP

For the first time this season, NM State took their victory lap around Aggie Memorial Stadium, taking down Hawai'i 45-20. NM State concludes every good practice with a victory lap - A tradition that Jerry Kill wants to begin in Las Cruces following wins.

A WINNING TRADITION

Following the conclusion of the 2021 season, Director of Athletics Mario Moccia quickly made a coaching change, hiring Jerry Kill to lead the Aggies football program. Kill enters the 2022 season as the eighth winningest active coach in FBS football.

Kill trails just Nick Saban (Alabama), Mack Brown (North Carolina), Brian Kelly (LSU), Willie Fritz (Tulane), Chris Crieghton (Eastern Michigan), and Terry Bowden (Louisiana - Monroe).

RUNNIN' AGS

The ground game was working in full force on Saturday over Hawai'i. NM State ran for 357 yards and five touchdowns in the victory.

The game marked the first time since September 21, 2019 against New Mexico that the Aggies ran for four or more touchdowns in a game.

With 133 rushing yards, Star Thomas became the first Aggie to finish with between 100-149 rushing yards since Christian Gibson ran for 103 yards at UTEP in 2018.

Jamoni Jones ran for his first two touchdowns of the season in the win and became the second NM State player this season to run for two or more touchdowns in a game, joining Diego Pavia (2) at UTEP.

EL CAPITANS

Chris Ojoh, Diego Pavia, Trevor Brohard, Lazarus Williams, Canaan Yarro, and Syrus Dumas have each represented NM State at the coin toss this season.

For the first time this season, NM State sent three players to the coin toss against FIU. Brohard, Pavia, and Yarro won the toss and elected to defer.

REPRESENTING A COUNTRY

With the addition of Nikhil Webb Walker, NM State now has the only player in FBS football with a hometown located in Jamaica. The linebacker recently joined the NM State roster as a walk-on.

SECOND QUARTER STRUGGLES

Through four games this season, NM State has struggled to get anything going. The Aggies are being outscored 93-30 in the second quarter thus far this season.

In the Hawai'i game, the Aggies made great strides towards erasing the deficit, outscoring the Rainbow Warriors 21-3 in the

DEJA VU

Both of NM State's games against UTEP and Wisconsin ended after exactly 3:23 of game time.

QB1/2

Throughout the early parts of the 2022 season, NM State has been platooning a pair of quarterbacks. Both Diego Pavia and Gavin Frakes have made starts and have seen action in every game for NM State.

After Frakes played nearly snap

YOUNG GUN

As Nate Dreiling prepares to take over as the NM State Defensive Coordinator, he also becomes the second youngest DC among the FBS ranks. Only Austin Armstrong of Southern Mississippi (29) will be younger than Dreiling (31) at the beginning of the season.

Dreiling is tied for the third youngest coordinator in FBS, regardless of offensive or defensive. Armstrong (DC - Southern Miss.) and Tommy Rees (OC - Notre Dame) are the lone coordinators who are younger than Dreiling. The Kansas native joins Zach Kittley (OC - Western Kentucky) as the only 31-year old coordinators.

ROAD WOE-RRIOIS

NM State has currently lost 21 straight road contests, tied for the longest road losing streak in the country with UMass. The Aggies' next road trip will be to Amherst, Mass. to take on the Minutemen on October 29.

WOMEN BELONG IN SPORTS

In her first season as the NM State equipment manager, Paulina Mihelich becomes one of just four lead equipment managers across the FBS level.

Under Mihelich, the Aggies join Nevada, New Mexico, and Temple as the lone schools to be powered by women.

With Rachel Phillips also serving as the Aggies' Director of Football Operations, NM State and Temple are the only two programs that feature women at both

the head equipment manager and DFO positions.

Phillips is one of just eight female DFOs around the country, joining women at Temple, Notre Dame, TCU, Kansas State, Maryland, Bowling Green, and FAU.

Also new to Las Cruces is Associate Athletic Trainer Sam Graff. With Graff leading the way for the Aggies, NM State becomes one of 12 schools at the FBS level with a female lead athletic trainer for football - Rice, Georgia Southern, Bowling Green, Troy, Kansas State, Western Kentucky, Western Michigan, Iowa, Virginia, BYU, and UCF are the other 11.

STEELE LIKES THE AGGIES

Led by Chris Ojoh and Trevor Brohard, the Aggies were well represented on Phil Steele's Preseason All-Independent team. In addition to the linebacker duo, tight end Thomaz Whitford, punter Josh Carlson, and kicker Ethan Albertson all earned spots on Steele's list.

MOJO FOR OJOH

After being named to Phil Steele's Preseason All-Independent team, Ojoh was also named to the Bednarik Award and Rotary Lombardi Award watch lists.

Ojoh continues to prove that he is one of the nation's best defensive players. Against Hawai'i, the linebacker accounted for a career-high 14 tackles. Ojoh's previous single-game high came against No. 1 Alabama in Tuscaloosa last season.

THE LAST MEETING

There has only been one previous meeting between the Aggies and Panthers - A 56-31 NM State victory in Las Cruces back on October 30, 2004.

Just three days later, George W. Bush was re-elected President of the United States, defeating John Kerry in the 2004 presidential election.

NOTABLES: LAST GAME (Hawai'i)

Following the first win of the Jerry Kill era, the NM State program suffered a disappointing loss to FIU. Mustering just seven points against a struggling Panther defense, the Aggies went into the bye

week tending some wounds.

After falling behind in the first quarter, Star Thomas and the NM State offense tied the game at the 12:58 mark of the second quarter. Thomas found the end zone on a two-yard run before Brett Money split the uprights to tie the contest.

From there, FIU would take a two-score lead into halftime and neither team could find the scoreboard in the second half.

Defensively, Syrus Dumas had a career day with seven tackles, including two for a loss. NM State recorded three sacks with Chris Ojoh, Sterling Webb, and Izaiah Reed each tallying one.

BEHIND ENEMY LINES (New Mexico)

Through six games in 2022, New Mexico holds a 2-4 record with wins over Maine and UTEP. Coming into Las Cruces, the Lobos have dropped three straight to LSU, UNLV, and Wyoming.

The Lobos have seen more success on the ground this season than through the passing game. Via the rush, New Mexico has gained 854 yards, led by 255 and a touchdown from Nate Jones. Miles Kendrick and Sherod White have both added three touchdowns on the ground this season.

Kendrick has completed 64 of 112 pass attempts with three touchdowns and six interceptions sprinkled in. On defense, the Lobos are led by Cody Moon and Jerrick Reed II, who have 47 and 46 tackles, respectively. Moon is tied with Justin Harris for the team lead at 3.5 sacks.

UNM made some changes to their offensive staff on Sunday evening. The Lobos relieved Derek Warehime of his duties as the offensive coordinator and tight ends coach. Quarterbacks coach Heath Ridenour has been elevated to interim offensive coordinator and graduate assistant Matt Clark will now serve as the interim tight ends coach.

AGGIE ADDITIONS

When HC Jerry Kill replaced Doug Martin, the Aggies cleaned house for the remainder of the coaching staff as

CRACK OPEN A COLD ONE

New Mexico State is one of only a handful of collegiate institutions in the United States to have an officially licensed beer.

Pistol Pete's 1888, a collaboration between NM State and Bosque Brewing Co., was released throughout the state of New Mexico in the fall of 2017 before the canned version was released in August 2018. The beer is available for purchase inside Aggie Memorial Stadium.

A brilliant pale straw-colored ale with a light malt sweetness and just enough late addition hops to add flavor and aromatic nuance, Pistol Pete's 1888 received a bronze medal at the 2018 Great American Beer Festival (GABF). It was recognized in the Golden or Blonde Ale beer-style category.

Bosque is headquartered in Albuquerque, N.M., with two locations in addition to its newest addition in the Bernalillo area. The brewery also has locations in Las Cruces.

ADDING TO THE COLLECTION

Just before football season, NM State officially added Wobble On Water to the university's expansive catalog of licensed products. Wobble On Water will be distributed statewide by Admiral Beverages and made its official debut on August 11.

The Aggies become one of just six colleges to have an officially licensed bottled water, joining Stanford, Washington State, Virginia Tech, Oklahoma State, and Idaho.

NM State also recently added Pete's Most Wanted Salsa in a collaboration with Young Guns Hatch Valley Chile. The salsa contains just four simple ingredients - Diced tomatoes, roasted Hatch green chile, salt, and garlic.

AGGIE FOOTBALL + FLOSPORTS

New Mexico State Athletics through its multimedia rights partner NM State Sports Properties, which is a locally based Learfield IMG College team, have resigned a one-year with FloSports to broadcast Aggie football home games through the 2022 season.

Through this new deal, FloSports, an innovator in live digital sports and original content, will once again provide live and on-demand coverage of all Aggie home football games on FloFootball.com. FloSports has been the home for Aggie football since the 2018 season.

"Partnering with FloSports to provide Aggie football games and additional Aggie related content will be a tremendous addition for Aggie Nation around the state, country and worldwide," NM State Director of Athletics Mario Moccia said. "We have traditionally had a strong linear presence, and now with FloSports as our partner, we will have a tremendous OTT presence as well."

JERRY KILL

FIRST SEASON

One of college football's most well-respected program rebuilders has been selected as the new leader of NM State football.

Monday, Nov. 29, 2021, NM State Director of Athletics Mario Moccia introduced Jerry Kill as the 35th head coach of the NM State football program.

"As the Director of Athletics and an alumni of New Mexico State University, I couldn't be more pleased to announce Jerry Kill as our new head football coach," Moccia remarked. "For our program to attract not only a proven winner at multiple levels of football, but also someone who has consistently turned programs around, makes this a very exciting day for Aggie Nation."

Over the course of his 23-year career as a head coach at the NCAA Division II, FCS and FBS levels, Kill has generated a 154-101 record while making six bowl game appearances.

Webb City High School

Following a playing career at Southwestern College, Kill signed on at Webb City High School in the mid-1980s. Before serving as its head coach for a period in the late 1980s and early 1990s, Kill was on staff at the institution and helped mentor quarterback Mike Gundy who is currently serving as the head coach at Oklahoma State.

Pittsburg State | 1985-87 (defensive coordinator), 1991-93 (offensive coordinator)

Three years after finishing his playing career as a linebacker at the NAIA level for Southwestern College in Winfield, Kan., Kill remained in his home state and took the position of defensive coordinator at NAIA program Pittsburg State in 1985.

A three-year run as the Gorillas' defensive play caller was followed by a three-year run as the head coach at Webb City High School in Missouri before Pittsburg State came calling again. After making the transition to the NCAA Division II ranks during the 1989 campaign, head coach Chuck Broyles tabbed Kill for the offensive coordinator position, a job he held from 1991-93. In Kill's first season in the offensive coordinator role, the Gorillas went 13-1-1 and claimed the NCAA Division II National Championship. During Kill's three-year run as the program's offensive coordinator, the Gorillas took part in a pair of NCAA Division II title bouts.

Saginaw Valley State | 1994-98

Kill earned his first head coaching job when Saginaw Valley State in University Center, Mich., tabbed the then-33-year-old as its head coach prior to the start of the 1994 season.

During his half-decade in charge of the Cardinals, Kill directed his squad to five consecutive winning seasons which included successive 9-2 campaigns in 1997 and 1998. Through his final season in charge, Saginaw Valley State topped the NCAA Division II charts in scoring (42.5 points per game) while ranking second in total offense (498.3 yards per game). Under Kill, the ground game was a major strength of the Cardinals who led all NCAA Division II clubs

in rushing in both 1997 and 1998.

Emporia State | 1999-00

After his father's untimely passing, Kill made a return to his home state in order to be closer to his family. He remained in the NCAA Division II ranks by taking over the reins of Emporia State University. Over the course of his two-year stint in charge of the program, the Hornets compiled an 11-11 record.

Southern Illinois | 2001-07

Kill's rise began in earnest when he was plucked from the NCAA Division II ranks by Southern Illinois ahead of the 2001 season. Tasked with turning around a program which had produced just two winning seasons out of the 17 that had occurred after capturing the NCAA I-AA national championship in 1983, Kill slowly but surely transformed the Salukis back into a national power at the FCS level.

Following a 1-10 mark in his debut season in Carbondale, Ill., Kill's team hit the double-digit win mark for the first time in 20 years by going 10-2 in 2003. That season coincided with the Saluki's return to the FCS Playoffs and set off a five-year run of greatness for Kill's program.

One of Kill's best teams was the 2004 edition of Southern Illinois who constructed a perfect 9-0 mark against FCS competition. That year, the Salukis generated a 7-0 mark in Gateway Conference action and held the number-one spot in the FCS national rankings for the final 10 weeks of the season. Kill's squad possessed one of the nation's best offenses, too, pounding opponents by an average of 30 points per game. His efforts that year resulted in Kill collecting the Eddie Robinson Award - a laurel handed out on an annual basis to the best head coach across all of FCS.

During 2007, Kill's final season in charge, the Salukis amassed the second-highest single-season win total in program history by going 12-2. Southern Illinois defeated a quartet of ranked teams that season and moved on to the semifinal round of the FCS Playoffs - the program's deepest postseason run since 1983. That season, Kill also became the first FCS coach in the history of the sport to be named the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year. That laurel honors coaches who succeed on and off the field, displaying sportsmanship, integrity, responsibility and excellence.

Northern Illinois | 2008-10

Following his highly-successful run at the FCS level, an FBS program - Northern Illinois - came calling for Kill. Installed as the Huskies' head coach in December of 2007, Kill again wasted no time in bringing another program back to national relevance.

In the 12 years prior to Kill's arrival, Northern Illinois had reached a bowl game on just one occasion and were coming off a 2-10 campaign in 2007. Through his three seasons at the helm, though, the Huskies made their way to a trio of bowl games. That three-year bowl game run was capped by the team's appearance in the 2010 Humanitarian Bowl in which the Huskies hammered Fresno State, 40-17, in order to secure the program's first 10-win season since

All told, Kill compiled a 23-16 mark for the Huskies. During his final season as the program's leader, Northern Illinois constructed an 11-3 record which represented the highest win total in a single season in the history of the program. Kill's success with the Huskies set the stage for multiple memorable moments for the program, including an appearance in the 2013 Orange Bowl. By making the cut for that bowl game, the Huskies became the first MAC squad in the history of the league to appear in a BCS bowl.

Minnesota | 2011-15

Taking notice of Kill's reputation for resurrecting programs around the region, Minnesota decided to see if Kill could do the same for its Big Ten squad. Before Kill's arrival, the Golden Gophers had failed to reach the .500 mark in four of the last five seasons.

Named the Golden Gophers' head coach in December of 2010, Kill proved he could rebuild teams in the highest echelon of the sport by leading Minnesota to three-consecutive bowl game appearances (2012, 2013 and 2014) through his five-year run in The Land of 10,000 Lakes.

The 2013 and 2014 campaigns saw Minnesota produce identical 8-5 records after putting forth respective 4-1 and 5-1 starts. Kill's efforts in the 2014 season resulted in him being named the Big Ten Coach of the Year while also leading the program to its first New Year's Day bowl game in 53 years. A number of notable victories also came Minnesota's way in 2014 including its first against Michigan since 2005. Kill's triumph over Nebraska in 2014 marked back-to-back wins for Minnesota over the Huskers since the 1950s while his victory over Nebraska in 2013 was Minnesota's first since 1960.

Kansas State | 2016 | Associate Athletics Director for Administration

A series of health issues caused Kill to retire from the position as Minnesota's head coach midway through the 2015 season and signaled the start of a year-long hiatus from coaching for Kill. In May of 2016, Kill made the move to athletic administration by accepting the position of Associate Athletics Director for Administration at Kansas State

As a member of Athletics Director John Currie's senior staff, Kill served as the chief administrator for K-State's football program.

Rutgers | 2017 | Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks

Kill's first stint as a college athletics administrator lasted less than a year as he returned to the ranks of college football's coaches in December of 2016 when he accepted the position of offensive coordinator at Rutgers.

The Scarlet Knights operated with a run-heavy offense under Kill, which resulted in 147 rushing yards per game and played a major role in their 18 points per game average.

Southern Illinois | 2018-19 | University/Athletic Administration

Kill returned to Carbondale, Ill., in 2018 as a special assistant to the chancellor. Kill then moved back into college athletics when he accepted the role of the Salukis' Director of Athletics in February of 2019.

Virginia Tech | 2019 | Assistant to the Head Coach

Three games into the Hokies' 2019 campaign, head coach Justin Fuente tabbed Kill to join his staff as a special assistant. Virginia Tech went 8-5 that year and made a trip to the Belk Bowl.

TCU | 2020-21 | Assistant to the Head Coach/Interim Head Coach

Longtime friend Gary Patterson convinced Kill to join his staff in Fort Worth in January of 2020 in a role similar to the one he was in at Virginia Tech.

After Patterson was dismissed as the Horned Frogs' head coach on Oct. 31, 2021, Kill stepped in as the interim head coach and has since directed TCU to a 2-2 record. The first of those victories was a 30-28 home win over 12th-ranked Baylor - TCU's first victory over a nationally-ranked opponent since 2019.

PERSONAL LIFE

Much more than a football coach, Kill's civic honors are many as are his efforts as an advocate for epilepsy - a condition he has lived with for the majority of his adult life. Beginning with the formation of the Coach Kill Fund during his days at Southern Illinois, Kill also created the Chasing Dreams Coach Kill Epilepsy Fund during his time as Minnesota's head coach.

The National Football Foundation awarded Kill its Courage Award in 2009. In three successive years, Kill also secured the Cal Stoll Courage Award (2014), Bob McNamara Memorial Legends Award (2015) and the FCA Power of Influence Award (2016).

To this day, Kill continues to assist in fundraising monies for research for the National Foundation of Epilepsy. Kill's experiences as a head coach while living with epilepsy were chronicled in his 2016 book, "Chasing Dreams: Living My Life One Yard at a Time."

Four institutions, which include Southern Illinois (2014), Southwestern College (2004) and Kansas Sports (2016), have inducted Kill into their respective Halls of Fame. Hailing from Cheney, Kan., Kill is the father of two daughters, Krystal and Tasha. A grandfather, too, Kill has one granddaughter, Emery.
