BLOCK THAT KICK!

The hand of Gabe Peterson helped NM State's special teams unit come up with a blocked point after attempt for the first time since Dion Henrique did so at Florida on September 5, 2015.

BRADY BOOM

In year two with the program, sophomore wide receiver Jonathan Brady has already emerged as one of Aggies' go-to targets in the passing game. With three games in the books, the Las Vegas native paces all Aggie receivers with 143 total receiving yards.

His 102-yard receiving game against Western Illinois on Sept. 2 marked the first time an Aggie receiver eclipsed the century mark since Jared Wyatt did so on Nov. 27, 2021, against UMass.

TWO FOR TWO

Jordin Parker made his presence felt once again in the win over WIU as he caught his second touchdown pass of the season. With the touchdown, Parker now has two touchdowns on just two receptions to make him the only FBS player with touchdown catches on 100% of his receptions and multiple catches this season.

Parker is also one of just 90 FBS athletes with multiple receiving touchdowns this year - joining fellow Aggie Trent Hudson who leads the Aggies with three touchdowns - tying him for seventh most at the FBS level.

SATURDAYS ARE FOR COLLEGE FOOTBALL... JUST NOT IN LAS CRUCES

NM State is in the midst of a stretch of 63 days in which it will not play a home game on a Saturday. For seven consecutive weeks, the Aggies will either be on the road or hosting a midweek contest.

During this period, the Aggies will welcome FIU on Wednesday, Oct. 4, and Sam Houston on Wednesday, Oct. 11.

THE 'T' IN TRENT STANDS FOR TOUCHDOWN

During the first three weeks, Aggie newcomer Trent Hudson has caught three touchdown passes - making him the first Aggie to catch three or more touchdowns since 2017 when eventual fourth round NFL draft pick Jaleel Scott hauled in four touchdown passes in the Aggies' opening three games.

THROUGH THE UPRIGHTS

Since his arrival in 2019, Ethan Albertson has established himself among the top kickers in the country. Amid his senior season, the San Diego, Calif., native ranks inside the top-ten in NM State history for field goals made (7th, 30), field goals attempted (t-7th, 39), field goal percentage (1st, 76.9%), extra points made (8th, 73), extra points attempted (9th, 77) and extra point percentage (94.8%).

A NEW HOME: CONFERENCE USA

After spending the previous five seasons as one of just six schools at the FBS level to be labeled an Independent, the Aggies are now officially members of Conference USA and will open conference play this Saturday when they visit Liberty.

The last time that NM State resided in a football league was in 2017 when it competed as members of the Sun Belt - finishing 7-6 overall and 4-4 in conference play on its way to earning a spot in the Nova Home Loans Arizona bowl to end a 57-year drought without a bowl game.

The Aggies represent one of four new programs in CUSA as they were joined by Jacksonville State, Liberty and Sam Houston when they made the transition on July 1. Meanwhile, the league also consists of five returning members (FIU, Louisiana Tech, Middle Tennessee, UTEP and Western Kentucky).

SPREAD THE LOVE

In each of the Aggies' first three games, nine different receivers have caught at least one pass. In the opening trio of tilts, the Aggies have also had exactly eight different ball carriers in each game.

PRESEASON BUZZ

The last time the Aggies were in a conference was also the most recent time before 2022 that they finished with a winning record. This fact alone means that 2023 will be just the second time in the last 21 seasons that the program enters a year in which they finished with a .500 winning percentage or better in the previous campaign. With success comes expectations and that is exactly what this offseason has consisted of for NM State. In a recent poll produced by Big Game Boomer, the Aggies were labeled as the No. 22 ranked Group of Five team in college football. The 2022 Quick Lane Bowl Champions were also selected to finish fifth in the Conference USA Preseason Poll based on a vote of the league's nine head coaches.

RETURNING PRODUCTION

With the scope of college football being dominated by the transfer portal and realignment, the Aggie offense will go against the grain as the returners accounted for over 83% of its total yardage one season ago. This includes 97% of its rushing yards and 100% of its rushing touchdowns from 2022.

Additionally, the 2023 Aggie receivers were responsible for 71% of all receiving yards and 83% of all receiving touchdowns from last year.

CUSA PRESEASON HONORS

Individually, the Aggies garnered five preseason awards from the new conference as quarterback Diego Pavia, left tackle Shiyazh Pete, defensive tackle Dion Wilson Jr., defensive back Andre Seldon and wide receiver Jonathan Brady each were touted as players to watch this season.

Pavia and Pete led an up-tempo offense in 2022 and found themselves on the Offensive Watch List. Meanwhile, Seldon and Wilson Jr. represented the Aggies on the defensive side of the ball and Brady was one of just two kick returners to receive CUSA laurels.

QUICK LANE BOWL CHAMPIONS

After picking up a necessary seventh win in the final week of the season, NM State found itself bowl eligible for the first time since 2017 and second time since 1960.

With its regular season performance, NM State earned a spot in the Quick Lane Bowl in Detroit, Mich., where it met up with Bowling Green. On the back of game MVP, Diego Pavia who threw for 167 yards and two touchdowns while adding another 65 yards with his feet, the Aggies defeated the Falcons 24-19. The win also re-solidified NM State as the lone program in the country with at least one bowl game appearance and zero bowl game losses as it moved to 4-0-1 all-time in bowl games.

Throughout history, 75% of teams who won the Quick Lane Bowl have once again been bowl eligible the following full season. Western Michigan, the 2021 champions, snapped a six-year stretch of bowl eligibility. NM State has not pieced together back-to-back bowl eligible seasons since 1959-60.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

In addition to the CUSA awards, the Aggies have drawn several preseason award honors on a national scale.

From his center position, Canaan Yarro received HERO Sports Preseason Third Team All-American honors - a list that honors student-athletes competing for a Group of Five program. Yarro also found himself on the 2023 Wuerffel Award Watch List for his ability on the field and his contributions to the Las Cruces community.

Junior quarterback Diego Pavia earned a spot on the Maxwell Award Watch List after turning himself into a household name last December. The Maxwell Award honors the most outstanding player in collegiate football.

Electric Aggie return man and wideout Jonathan Brady also received national recognition as he was named to the Paul Hornung Award Watch List. With the listing, Brady is recognized as one of the most versatile players in all of college football.

Aggie left guard AJ Vaipulu was touted as one of 85 athletes to land on the watch list for 2023 Polynesian College Football Player of the Year.

Lastly, wide receiver Kordell David was selected to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List following a breakout campaign in 2022.

ATTENDANCE BOOM

Few schools across FBS football saw a larger attendance growth last season than NM State. The Aggies concluded the season averaging 14,993 fans per home game, up 27% from the 2021 season.

The Aggie faithful continued this trend into the season opener as 15,356 fans were in attendance to watch NM State battle with UMass on Saturday, Aug. 26. Aggie Nation then upped that number to 17,943 for the Week 1 matchup against Western Illinois.

AGGIEQUERQUE

This year's NM State roster features four Aggies from the Lobos' backyard, including starting quarterback Diego Pavia who played football and baseball and wrestled at Volcano Vista. During his high school days up north, Pavia won a state title in wrestling and also led Volcano Vista to a perfect 11-0 record in the regular season as a senior.

Fellow Volcano Vista alumni Tyler Martinez also makes his return home and will do so as one of the anchors of the Aggie defense. Colt Mangino and Tyler Devera also hail from Albuquerque.

FRESHMAN AGGIES

The 2023 Aggie roster will feature 34 true freshman this season including six from the Land of Enchantment.

BROTHERS ON THE BACK END

Defensive backs Andre Seldon and Myles Rowser are not only brothers on the field, but the two are also half brothers. Seldon is a returning leader on the Aggie defense while Rowser will make his NM State debut this season after starring for Campbell last year.

FAMILY AFFAIR

Maintaining the family theme, the Aggie team will have three student-athletes this season whose fathers also suited up for the Aggies during their respective playing days.

Wide receiver Ethan Singleton is the son of former Aggie running back Anthony Singleton who played for the Aggies from 1986-89. Anthony Singleton ranks tenth in program history in both rush attempts (420) and rushing yards (1,858 yards).

Freshman David Barela's dad David Barela also played for the Aggies from 1990-93.

Lastly, Las Cruces native Sideeq Shabazz will be the fourth member of the Shabazz family to wear Crimson & White. His father, Sideeq Shabazz played for the Aggies from 1999-02 and is one of 28 former Aggies earn a spot in the NFL. Additionally, his family members Shukree and Sina also played for the Aggies.

CONSISTENCY ON THE FRONT LINE

NM State returns four starting offensive lineman from 2022 - Shiyazh Pete (LT), AJ Vaipulu (LG), Canaan Yarro (C), and Isaiah Mursalat (RG). The four Aggies have put together 68 games played on the offensive line in the Crimson and White.

A WINNING TRADITION

With eight wins under his belt at NM State, Jerry Kill is the tenth winningest active coach in FBS football.

Interestingly enough, three of the top 10 coaches on the active wins list lead CUSA programs as K.C. Keeler (ranked 4th) and Rich Rodriguez (ranked

9th) lead Sam Houston and Jacksonville State, respectively.

Aside from Keeler and Rodriguez, Kill trails just Nick Saban (Alabama), Mack Brown (North Carolina), Brian Kelly (LSU), Kirk Ferentz (Iowa), Willie Fritz (Tulane), Chris Crieghton (Eastern Michigan), and Terry Bowden (Louisiana - Monroe).

DUAL THREAT

After an impressive first season in the Crimson and White, quarterback Diego Pavia already finds himself among the Aggie greats. He currently ranks 25th all-time in career passing yards (2,015) and 10th in career rushing yards (520).

REPRESENTING A COUNTRY

With the return of Nikhil Webb Walker, NM State fields the only player in FBS football with a hometown located in Jamaica. The linebacker hailing from Trelawny, Jamaica, joined the NM State roster as a walk-on ahead of the 2022 season.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

In 2022, the Aggies had two quarterbacks that started at least five games in Diego Pavia and Gavin Frakes. In total, the two combined to throw for 2,186 yards and 17 touchdowns.

This season, the quarterback room will only be more competitive as it gets bolstered by the addition of former four-star and Texas A&M transfer Eli Stowers.

IF IT AIN'T BROKE, DON'T FIX IT

When HC Jerry Kill replaced Doug Martin, the Aggies cleaned house for the remainder of the coaching staff as well. In fact, just one staff member was retained from the 2021 team - Defensive Graduate Assistant Quinn Thomas.

However, from 2022 to 2023, all 10 assistant coaches will make the return. This make Kill's staff one of just seven schools in the country to bring back its entire staff - joined by Colorado State, Louisiana, Kansas, USC, Iowa and Pitt.

In her second season as the NM State equipment manager, Paulina Mihelich becomes one of just four lead equipment managers across the FBS level.

Under Mihelich, the Aggies join Nevada, New Mexico, and Temple as the lone schools to be powered by women.

With Rachel Phillips also serving as the Aggies' Director of Football Operations, NM State and Temple are the only two programs that feature women at both the head equipment manager and DFO positions.

Phillips is one of just eight female DFOs around the country, joining women at Temple, Notre Dame, TCU, Kansas State, Maryland, Bowling Green, and FAU.

Also returning is Associate Athletic Trainer Sam Graff. With Graff leading the way for the Aggies, NM State is one of 12 schools at the FBS level with a female lead athletic trainer for football - Rice, Georgia Southern, Bowling Green, Troy, Kansas State, Western Kentucky, Western Michigan, Iowa, Virginia, BYU, and UCF are the other 11.

The Aggies also added Kaylee Nilsson to the staff as a Graduate Assistant Nutritionist. In her role, Nilsson keeps NM State at optimal nutrition levels for training, competition, recovery, hydration, immunity, travel, and more.

AGGIE FOOTBALL AND ESPN+

With the offseason shift to Conference USA, the Aggies were also recipients of a change in their media rights deal.

This season, all Aggie home football games that are not produced by ESPN or CBS Sports Network will be produced in-house by AggieVision on ESPN+ with Saturday's contest versus the Leathernecks being the first of this nature.

BEHIND ENEMY LINES (NEW MEXICO)

The Aggies will head north seeking their second straight win over the Lobos after defeating UNM 21-9 last season.

Led by Danny Gonzales, New Mexico hoists a record of 1-1 on the season and will be coming off of a dominant 56-10 win over FCS program Tennessee Tech.

Offensively, the Lobos are led at the quarterback position by UAB transfer Dylan Hopkins who has tallied 28 completions, 388 passing yards, four passing touchdowns and two interceptions through UNM's first two games.

The NM State defense will also be keyed in on running back Jacory Crosky-Merritt who enters Saturday as one of only 24 backs in the country averaging better than 100 rushing yards per game.

As a unit, th

e UNM offense is averaging 404.5 yards of offense per game while its defense is giving up 345.5 yards to opposing offenses.

THE VARSITY NETWORK

Last season, NM State Sports Properties and its parent company **LEARFIELD**, announced the creation of "**THE VARSITY NETWORK**" an interactive application that features free live gameday broadcasts, original content, and national college programming such as College Sports Now, College Football Blitz and the new College Football Saturday Night.

Fans can download the app for iPhone or android and will gain instant access to free gameday audio streams, including NM State football brought to you by Adam Young and Danny Knee, and receive push notifications to remind them of games starting or upcoming audio broadcasts.

THE VOICE(S) OF THE AGGIES

NM State broadcaster Jack Nixon returns for his 44th year of broadcasting Aggie athletics for the NM State radio network. A legend on the Aggie airwaves, Nixon has broadcast over 400 Aggie football contests and over 1,000 Aggie men's basketball games. An NM State Hall of Fame selection, Nixon will handle of the radio duties with former Aggie Cory Lucas, who joined the broadcaster ahead of the 2017 season.

FILLING THE GAP

The Aggie middle linebackers Chris Ojoh and Trevor Brohard were two of the best backers in the nation and combined to account for 177 tackles. Combine those two dominant forces with safety Bryce Jackson and Syrus Dumas and the Aggie defense will enter 2023 missing over 35% of its total tackles from one season ago.

Tasked with reloading on the defensive side of the ball, Head Coach Jerry Kill brought in big name transfers including Dion Wilson Jr., Jamari Buddin and Myles Rowser to play alongside returning defensive standouts Andre Seldon Jr., Keyshaun Elliott and Dylan Early in efforts of locking down opposing offenses.

JERRY KILL

FIRST SEASON

One of college football's most well-respected program rebuilders has been selected as the new leader of NM State football.

Monday, Nov. 29, 2021, NM State Director of Athletics Mario Moccia introduced Jerry Kill as the 35th head coach of the NM State football program.

"As the Director of Athletics and an alumni of New Mexico State University, I couldn't be more pleased to announce Jerry Kill as our new head football coach," Moccia remarked. "For our program to attract not only a proven winner at multiple levels of football, but also someone who has consistently turned programs around, makes this a very exciting day for Aggie Nation."

Over the course of his 23-year career as a head coach at the NCAA Division II, FCS and FBS levels, Kill has generated a 154-101 record while making six bowl game appearances.

Webb City High School

Following a playing career at Southwestern College, Kill signed on at Webb City High School in the mid-1980s. Before serving as its head coach for a period in the late 1980s and early 1990s, Kill was on staff at the institution and helped mentor quarterback Mike Gundy who is currently serving as the head coach at Oklahoma State.

Pittsburg State | 1985-87 (DC), 1991-93 (OC)

Three years after finishing his playing career as a linebacker at the NAIA level for Southwestern College in Winfield, Kan., Kill remained in his home state and took the position of defensive coordinator at NAIA program Pittsburg State in 1985.

A three-year run as the Gorillas' defensive play caller was followed by a three-year run as the head coach at Webb City High School in Missouri before Pittsburg State came calling again. After making the transition to the NCAA Division II ranks during the 1989 campaign, head coach Chuck Broyles tabbed Kill for the offensive coordinator position, a job he held from 1991-93. In Kill's first season in the offensive coordinator role, the Gorillas went 13-1-1 and claimed the NCAA Division II National Championship. During Kill's three-year run as the program's offensive coordinator, the Gorillas took part in a pair of NCAA Division II title bouts.

Saginaw Valley State | 1994-98

Kill earned his first head coaching job when Saginaw Valley State in University Center, Mich., tabbed the then-33-year-old as its head coach prior to the start of the 1994 season.

During his half-decade in charge of the Cardinals, Kill directed his squad to five consecutive winning seasons which included successive 9-2 campaigns in 1997 and 1998. Through his final season in charge, Saginaw Valley State topped the NCAA Division II charts in scoring (42.5 points

per game) while ranking second in total offense (498.3 yards per game). Under Kill, the ground game was a major strength of the Cardinals who led all NCAA Division II clubs in rushing in both 1997 and 1998.

Emporia State | 1999-00

After his father's untimely passing, Kill made a return to his home state in order to be closer to his family. He remained in the NCAA Division II ranks by taking over the reins of Emporia State University. Over the course of his two-year stint in charge of the program, the Hornets compiled an 11-11 record.

Southern Illinois | 2001-07

Kill's rise began in earnest when he was plucked from the NCAA Division II ranks by Southern Illinois ahead of the 2001 season. Tasked with turning around a program which had produced just two winning seasons out of the 17 that had occurred after capturing the NCAA I-AA national championship in 1983, Kill slowly but surely transformed the Salukis back into a national power at the FCS level.

Following a 1-10 mark in his debut season in Carbondale, Ill., Kill's team hit the double-digit win mark for the first time in 20 years by going 10-2 in 2003. That season coincided with the Saluki's return to the FCS Playoffs and set off a five-year run of greatness for Kill's program.

One of Kill's best teams was the 2004 edition of Southern Illinois who constructed a perfect 9-0 mark against FCS competition. That year, the Salukis generated a 7-0 mark in Gateway Conference action and held the number-one spot in the FCS national rankings for the final 10 weeks of the season. Kill's squad possessed one of the nation's best offenses, too, pounding opponents by an average of 30 points per game. His efforts that year resulted in Kill collecting the Eddie Robinson Award - a laurel handed out on an annual basis to the best head coach across all of FCS.

During 2007, Kill's final season in charge, the Salukis amassed the second-highest single-season win total in program history by going 12-2. Southern Illinois defeated a quartet of ranked teams that season and moved on to the semifinal round of the FCS Playoffs - the program's deepest postseason run since 1983. That season, Kill also became the first FCS coach in the history of the sport to be named the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year. That laurel honors coaches who succeed on and off the field, displaying sportsmanship, integrity, responsibility and excellence.

Northern Illinois | 2008-10

Following his highly-successful run at the FCS level, an FBS program - Northern Illinois - came calling for Kill. Installed as the Huskies' head coach in December of 2007, Kill again wasted no time in bringing another program back to national relevance.

In the 12 years prior to Kill's arrival, Northern Illinois had reached a bowl game on just one occasion and were coming off a 2-10 campaign in 2007. Through his three seasons at the helm, though, the Huskies made their way to a trio of bowl games. That three-year bowl game run was capped by the team's appearance in the 2010 Humanitarian Bowl in which the Huskies hammered Fresno State, 40-17, in order to secure the program's first 10-win season since 2003.

All told, Kill compiled a 23-16 mark for the Huskies. During his final season as the program's leader, Northern Illinois constructed an 11-3 record which represented the highest win total in a single season in the history of the program. Kill's success with the Huskies set the stage for multiple memorable moments for the program, including an appearance in the 2013 Orange Bowl. By making the cut for that bowl game, the Huskies became the first MAC squad in the history of the league to appear in a BCS bowl.

Minnesota | 2011-15

Taking notice of Kill's reputation for resurrecting programs around the region, Minnesota decided to see if Kill could do the same for its Big Ten squad. Before Kill's arrival, the Golden Gophers had failed to reach the .500 mark in four of the last five seasons.

Named the Golden Gophers' head coach in December of 2010, Kill proved he could rebuild teams in the highest echelon of the sport by leading Minnesota to three-consecutive bowl game appearances (2012, 2013 and 2014) through his five-year run in The Land of 10,000 Lakes.

The 2013 and 2014 campaigns saw Minnesota produce identical 8-5 records after putting forth respective 4-1 and 5-1 starts. Kill's efforts in the 2014 season resulted in him being named the Big Ten Coach of the Year while also leading the program to its first New Year's Day bowl game in 53 years. A number of notable victories also came Minnesota's way in 2014 including its first against Michigan since 2005. Kill's triumph over Nebraska in 2014 marked back-to-back wins for Minnesota over the Huskers since the 1950s while his victory over Nebraska in 2013 was Minnesota's first since 1960.

Kansas State | 2016 | Associate Athletics Director for Administration

A series of health issues caused Kill to retire from the position as Minnesota's head coach midway through the 2015 season and signaled the start of a year-long hiatus from coaching for Kill. In May of 2016, Kill made the move to athletic administration by accepting the position of Associate Athletics Director for Administration at Kansas State.

As a member of Athletics Director John Currie's senior staff, Kill served as the chief administrator for K-State's football program.

Rutgers | 2017 | OC/Quarterbacks

Kill's first stint as a college athletics administrator lasted less than a year as he returned to the ranks of college football's coaches in December of 2016 when he accepted the position of offensive coordinator at Rutgers.

The Scarlet Knights operated with a run-heavy offense under Kill, which resulted in 147 rushing yards per game and played a major role in their 18 points per game average.

Southern Illinois | 2018-19 | University/Athletic Administration

Kill returned to Carbondale, Ill., in 2018 as a special assistant to the chancellor. Kill then moved back into college athletics when he accepted the role of the Salukis' Director of Athletics in February of 2019.

Virginia Tech | 2019 | Assistant to the Head Coach

Three games into the Hokies' 2019 campaign, head coach Justin Fuente tabbed Kill to join his staff as a special assistant. Virginia Tech went 8-5 that year and made a trip to the Belk Bowl.

TCU | 2020-21 | Assistant to the Head Coach/Interim Head Coach

Longtime friend Gary Patterson convinced Kill to join his staff in Fort Worth in January of 2020 in a role similar to the one he was in at Virginia Tech.

After Patterson was dismissed as the Horned Frogs' head coach on Oct. 31, 2021, Kill stepped in as the interim head coach and has since directed TCU to a 2-2 record. The first of those victories was a 30-28 home win over 12th-ranked Baylor - TCU's first victory over a nationally-ranked opponent since 2019.

NM State | 2022-Pres. | Head Coach

Kill's first season in Las Cruces led to the Aggies first bowl win since 2017. After a six-win regular season, Kill led NM State to the Quick Lane Bowl in Detroit where the Aggies won 24-19.

Throughout the season, the Aggies saw a number of length streaks snapped under Kill's leadership. On October 29, NM State snapped a 1,498 day road losing streak with a 23-13 win at UMass. The Aggies first-year head ball coach also snapped a three-year skid to in-state rival New Mexico two weeks prior, winning 21-9 at Aggie Memorial Stadium.

Entering a late November road game at Liberty as 24-point underdogs, Kill and company went and completely flipped the script for a 49-14 victory, backed by six touchdowns from Diego Pavia.

With Kill at the helm, a flurry of upgrades are being made to Aggie Memorial Stadium and the surrounding football facilities. Ahead of the 2023 season, the turf inside Aggie Memorial Stadium and on the practice field were both replaced. NM State has also announced upgrades to the locker room.

PERSONAL LIFE

Much more than a football coach, Kill's civic honors are many as are his efforts as an advocate for epilepsy - a condition he has lived with for the majority of his adult life. Beginning with the formation of the Coach Kill Fund during his days at Southern Illinois, Kill also created the Chasing Dreams Coach Kill Epilepsy Fund during his time as Minnesota's head coach.

The National Football Foundation awarded Kill its Courage Award in 2009. In three successive years, Kill also secured the Cal Stoll Courage Award (2014), Bob McNamara Memorial Legends Award (2015) and the FCA Power of Influence Award (2016).

To this day, Kill continues to assist in fundraising monies for research for the National Foundation of Epilepsy. Kill's experiences as a head coach while living with epilepsy were chronicled in his 2016 book, "Chasing Dreams: Living My Life One Yard at a Time."

Four institutions, which include Southern Illinois (2014), Southwestern College (2004) and Kansas Sports (2016), have inducted Kill into their respective Halls of Fame. Hailing from Cheney, Kan., Kill is the father of two daughters, Krystal and Tasha. A grandfather, too, Kill has one granddaughter, Emery.
