Requests for student-athletes for the post-practice interviews during the week must be submitted no later than 3 p.m. on Sundays to the Nevada Communications office.

Post-practice interviews take place at Wolf Pack Park Tuesdays (Offense) and Wednesdays (Defense).

CREDENTIALS

All requests for media access at Mackay Stadium, and seating in the Mackay Stadium press box, must be made by 5 p.m. two days before gameday. Please submit to Aaron Juarez (aaronjuarez@unr. edu). Those receiving accommodation will be notified later that evening.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

In general, no coaches or student-athletes are available to media on the field or en route to the locker room, with the exception of the live, originating television broadcast if pre-arranged. Nevada's locker room is closed to the media.

Interview requests should be submitted to Aaron Juarez of the Nevada Communications office no later than the five-minute mark of the fourth quarter. Assistant coaches are not available after games. Generally, the Nevada Communications office will live-stream postgame press conferences following home games via the Mountain West Network and archives will be available shortly after the conclusion of the press conference.

Postgame press conferences for home contests will take place in the Cashell Fieldhouse weight room, with head coach Ken Wilson and selected players. Postgame pressers for road contests will be subject to the current protocols of the game location. Please submit interview requests to Aaron Juarez via text (208-982-0040) no later than the five-minute mark of the fourth quarter.

MEDIA WORK AREA

The Paul R. Stuart Press Box in Mackay Stadium has wireless, ethernet and phone lines available during the game and after the conclusion of each game.

PARKING

Media parking permits for gameday are available via the Nevada Communications Office are generally for level two of the West Stadium Parking Complex. Local television satellite trucks have designated parking near the main (southwest) entrance to the stadium. These trucks must be in place at least two hours before game time and cannot leave while crowds are present outside the stadium.

CLEAR BAG POLICY

The University of Nevada, in an effort to provide a safer environment for the public and to expedite entry into the athletic venues, has implemented a new policy limiting the size and type of bag allowed for all events.

Approved Bags:

- Clear plastic, vinyl, or PVC tote bags that do not exceed 12" x 6" x 12"
- One-gallon clear plastic storage bags
 - Small Clutch Purses 4.5" X 6.5" or smaller

Exceptions: An exception will be made for medically necessary items and diaper bags after proper inspection. These bags will be tagged to inform venue security that the bag has been cleared by the gate inspection member and to limit any disturbance to the patron once inside the stadium. Accredited media may bring bags for working purposes into the facility but must enter at the press box elevator or gate 2 on the west side of the stadium and make bags available for search.

In Wilson's first campaign at the Wolf Pack helm, Nevada's defense made an impressive impact, ranking in the FBS top half nationally in multiple statistical categories. Putting a strong emphasis on takeaways, the Wolf Pack made 19 in 2023, with 11 interceptions and eight fumble recoveries, the latter ranking second among all Mountain West teams. Takeaways played a major role in the Wolf Pack's first two contests of the season, as Nevada made five in the season-opening win at New Mexico State, and four more in the following week's 38-14 victory over Texas State.

The Pack defense also ranked in the national top 50 in red-zone defense (47th) and tackles-for-loss (43rd, 6.3 per game).

Seven members of the Wolf Pack earned All-Mountain West honors in 2022, headlined by safety Bentlee Sanders baing named to the First Team. Of the seven honorees, four came from the defensive side, including ;defensive tackle Dom Peterson's second-team nod.

Two members of the Wolf Pack defense were recognized nationally in 2022, with Sanders claiming a spot on the Associated Press Midseason All-America Team, and redshirt freshman linebacker Drue Watts being named to the College Football News (CFN) All-America Third Team.

Wilson possesses over three decades of coaching experience, including 19 previous years on the Nevada staff (1989-98, 2004-12), which included five seasons as associate head coach (2008-12) and four as defensive coordinator (1996-98, 2007).

Wilson also coached the defensive line, linebackers, and safeties, during his time at Nevada. During his coaching tenures, the Wolf Pack reached a bowl game 11 times, including each of his last eight seasons, and captured two Western Athletic Conference titles (2005, 2010), five Big West Conference championships (1992, 1994-97), and two Big Sky Conference titles (1990-91) with Wilson on staff.

Wilson spent six seasons working with Ault from 1989-92 and 1994-95. He was also an assistant coach for Jeff Horton in 1993 and Jeff Tisdel from 1996-98, spending those final three seasons as defensive coordinator. As the nation's youngest Division I (now FBS) defensive coordinator, he directed Nevada's 1996 defense to the top of the conference in every defensive category and was part of the Las Vegas Bowl victory over Ball State.

He spent four years (1999-2003) in the Nevada administration, serving as Assistant Athletics Director, Sports Services, under then-athletic director Chris Ault. He oversaw football, men's basketball, baseball, track and tennis while coordinating grant-in-aid for all student-athletes in Nevada's 19-sport athletic program.

Wilson returned to the Mackay Stadium sidelines in 2004 when Ault returned to the football program's helm.

In 2009, Wilson coached the Wolf Pack linebackers and oversaw the development of a youthful group that included second-team All-WAC selection James-Michael Johnson, who went on to be taken by the Cleveland Browns in the fourth round of the 2012 NFL Draft. In 2008, he coached a pair of future NFL linebackers in Jushua Mauga (New York Jets & Kansas City Chiefs) and Jerome Johnson (St. Louis Rams).

In his final season at Nevada in 2012, Wilson helped senior Albert Rosette successfully move back to middle linebacker after playing defensive end the year prior. Rosette went on to lead the Mountain West Conference – Nevada's first year in the league – with 135 tackles, good for the third-most in program single-season history and earned first-team All-Mountain West Conference recognition.

The Wilson family's ties to Nevada run deep. Wilson and his wife, Heather, have a son, Tyler, who was a long snapper for the Wolf Pack from 2012-14, a daughter-in-law, Makenzie, and a daughter, Baylie.

Wilson served as co-defensive coordinator and inside linebackers coach from 2019-21 at Oregon. Over his coaching career, Wilson has been a part of 18 teams that have advanced to a bowl game, including 15 of the last 16 years.

Oregon's Pac-12 championship in 2020, its second in a row, was the 11th conference title Wilson has been a part of during his coaching career.

Wilson added co-defensive coordinator to his duties after helping Oregon to back-to-back Pac-12 Conference titles in his first two years on staff.

In 2020, Wilson helped the Ducks to a conference title with the defensive putting together a dominant performance in the Pac-12 Championship game, holding No. 13 USC to just 38 rushing yards on 28 carries (1.4 yards per carry) in a 31-24 win. Wilson's linebackers – Mase Funa, Noah Sewell, and Isaac Slade-Matautia – played a huge part in the win combining 17 tackles and a tackle for loss.

In Wilson's first season at Oregon, the Ducks' defense led Oregon to a Pac-12 Conference title, a win in the Rose Bowl, and a 12-2 overall record while ranking among the nation's elite units.

SERIES HISTORY

Nevada leads the all-time series against New Mexico, 5-3-1. The Wolf Pack is 3-0-1 against New Mexico at Mackay Stadium. Saturday's contest will be the first between Nevada and New Mexico at one of the schools' full-time home site since 2019's matchup in Reno. The last meeting between the teams, in 2020, was played at Sam Boyd Stadium in Las Vegas.

ABOUT NEW MEXICO

New Mexico (3-4, 1-2 MW) snapped a losing streak of its own with Saturday's 42-21 win over Hawai'i. The Lobos had lost 14 consecutive Mountain West games prior to the win over the Rainbow Warrios. New Mexico averages 179.7 rushing yards per game, led by Jacory Croskey-Merritt (545 yards, 11 TDs), while quarterback Dylan Hopkins has thrown for 1,367 yards and 10 touchdowns.





LAST TIME OUT

Nevada snapped its 16-game losing streak with a 6-0 shutout of San Diego State Saturday at Snapdragon Stadium.

The Wolf Pack defense made two Brandon Talton first-half field goals hold up. The defense held San Diego State to just 204 total yards, including only 47 yards passing, and did not yield a third-down conversion in 10 attempts. Including fourth downs, San Diego State converted just one of its 14 third- and fourth-down opportunities.

The Nevada defense came through one final time in the game's final two minutes, as Jonathan Maldonado recovered a Jalen Mayden fumble at the Wolf Pack 25. Quarterback Brendon Lewis rushed for a first down on the ensuing possession, enabling the Pack to kneel out the clock.

WELL-EARNED SHUTOUT

Nevada's 6-0 blanking of San Diego State marked the Wolf Pack's first shutout in 12 years. The last time the Pack defense put up a goose egg was in a 37-0 win over UNLV back on Oct. 8, 2011.

Saturday's shutout was also the first on the road for Nevada in 20 years--the last being a 42-0 victory at Louisiana Tech.

SEASON-BEST DAY FOR THE WOLF PACK DEFENSE

The Nevada defense had one of its best performances since 2019 in its outing Saturday at San Diego State. Along with pitching its first shutout in 12 years, the Wolf Pack held San Diego State to just 204 yards of offense, including a paltry 47 passing yards.

The Aztecs' 204 total yards were the lowest by a Nevada opponent in Ken Wilson's head-coaching tenure (2022-present), and the 47 passing yards were the fewest by a Pack opponent overall since Weber State managed just 63 on Sept. 14, 2019.

Nevada's defense also did not allow a third-down conversion Saturday night--San Diego State was 0-for-10 on third downs, and 1-for-3 on fourth downs.

ONE GAME, TWO CAREER RECORDS SET

Two Nevada career records were set in the Wolf Pack's 6-0 win at San Diego State Saturday night.

Kicker Brandon Talton, already the Mountain West's career field goals leader, became Nevada's all-time leader ith his 39-yarder in the first quarter. The kick was the 73rd of his career, passing Marty Zendejas (1984-87) on the Wolf Pack's career ledger. Talton added a 37-yarder in the second quarter, bringing his career total to 74.

With his 14-yard return on the second half's opening kickoff, senior Jamaal Bell became Nevada's career leader with his 71st kick return. That moved him out of a three-way tie atop the list with Mike Ball (2009-11) and Kendall Brock (2011-14).

TWO STREAKS SNAPPED, ONE WILL CONTINUE

Nevada and New Mexico each snapped a lengthy slide with their respective wins Saturday. For Nevada, the 6-0 win at San Diego State halted a streak of 16-straight losses. Meanwhile, the Lobos' 42-21 win over Hawai'i brought New Mexico's 14-game conference slide to a halt.

HOME FOR TWO

Wolf Pack hosts the Lobos before welcoming Hawai'i to Reno on Nov. 4.

Saturday's trip to San Diego was Nevada's sole roadie of the month. The Wolf Pack went on the road thrice over the first five weeks of the campaign, and, with these next two home contests, wraps a stretch of being home (whether on a bye or with a home game) for four of five weekends.

JOHNSON PUTTING TOGETHER A CAREER YEAR

Sixth-year safety Emany Johnson has emerged as one of the Wolf Pack defense's key leaders this season, and is in the middle of a career year. The Richmond, Calif., native leads the Nevada defense in tackles (54) and interceptions (two), along with having 2.0 tackles-for-loss and a forced fumble.

Johnson led the Pack with nine tackles in Saturday's shutout of San Diego State. He is currently on a solid five-game run, racking up 36 tackles (32 solo) with two picks and a TFL. In that stretch, he has two double digit-tackle games (10 against Kansas on Sept. 16, career-high 12 against UNLV on Oct. 14), and one two-INT game (Sept. 30 at Fresno State).

WATTS BLOWIN'THINGS UP

Linebacker and team captain Drue Watts has been the heartbeat of the Nevada defense the past two seasons, and Saturday's victory was well-deserved for the redshirt sophomore.

Watts, providing an aggressive blitz and blowing up Aztec pass protectors, finished the game with five tackles and a pass breakup. It was his full-speed blitz on the game's critical play which forced Jaden Maylen to scramble and lose control of the ball, resulting in Jonathan Maldonado's fumble recovery with just over a minute to play.

On the year, Watts leads the country with four fumble recoveries, and is third on the Pack with 30 tackles. He also has 2.0 tackles-for-loss and two passes broken up.

MULTI-THREAT RUSHING ATTACK

Saturday at San Diego State, Nevada featured four primary ball carriers which kept the Aztec defense off-balance. The Wolf Pack rushed for 144 yards in the contest, with four players gaining at least 28 yards apiece.

Sean Dollars led the group with 49 yards, while Jacques Badolato-Birdsell ran for a career-best 30 yards on nine carries, and wide receiver Jamaal Bell picked up 28 yards on four carries. Quarterback Brendon Lewis, always a threat with his legs, ran for 40 yards, including a game-sealing 11-yard rush to gain a first down in the contest's final minute.

TALTON NEVADA'S ALL-TIME LEADING FIELD-GOAL KICKER

Fifth-year kicker Brandon Talton enters his final season intent on reminding many around the Mountain West of his status as one of the top kickers on the West Coast. Talton, named to two preseason watch lists this summer (Lou Groza Award, Comeback Player of the Year Award), is the Mountain West's all-time leader in field goals made (74).

Talton, named to the Lou Groza Award watch list for the fifth time this past July, hit from 39 yards in his first attempt Oct. 21 at San Diego State, bringing his career total to 73 and passing Marty Zendejas (1984-87) atop Nevada's all-time list.





Talton also ranks third in kick scoring with 356 points. He is one of just eight players, including four kickers, in Nevada history to have 300 career points.

6/6 USC. The team's second-leading returning tackler from a season ago (53 tackles, 3.5 TFL, 2.0 sacks in 2022), Mateialona shared the Pack lead with six tackles in Los Angeles, including a strip-sack of Caleb Williams.

BELL ON PACE FOR CAREER YEAR

Wide receiver/kick returner Jamaal Bell is well on his way to a career year receiving in 2023. Bell caught eight balls in each of the first two contests, with his 16 receptions going for 188 yards and a score. On the year, he is at 27 catches for 250 yards and a touchdown.

The 2022 season was Bell's best in both categories, as he hauled in 28 passes for 279 yards. His 2023 campaign got off to a big start Sept. 2 at No. 6/6 USC, when he posted career highs of eight catches and 121 yards with a 77-yard touchdown reception.

MEIER GOES THE DISTANCE

Redshirt freshman cornerback KK Meier covered all but six feet of the length of the Texas State field Sept. 23, taking his first-quarter interception 98 yards for a score. The return was the second-longest in Nevada history (only Dameon Baber's 100-yard return against San José Stage in 2017 was longer), and the Wolf Pack's first defensive touchdown since Sept. 3, 2022, also against Texas State (Bentlee Sanders 34-yard pick-six).

LOCAL FLAIR TO THE PACK ROSTER

Among the numerous values head coach Ken Wilson promotes in the Nevada Football program is its local connections. To that end, the Wolf Pack roster features 16 players from Northern Nevada high schools. See the table on page six of the game notes for the entire list of players, by school.

PLENTY OF PAC-12 ON THE NEVADA ROSTER

Along with the Pac-12 ties on the Nevada coaching staff, the Wolf Pack roster features 17 players who have previously been on Pac-12 rosters. Among that number, eight joined the Pack since the end of the 2022 campaign. In total, the 17 Pac-12 transfers represent seven schools from the conference: Oregon (7), California (4), USC (2), Arizona State (1), Colorado (1), Oregon State (1), Utah (1).

Linebacker Eli'jah Winston and wide receiver John Jackson III are the former Trojans with the Wolf Pack, with Winston entering his second season in Reno after recording 14 tackles, 2.5 TFL, and 2.0 sacks over nine games in 2022.

A STINGY, GREEDY GROUP

Nevada's defense created 19 takeaways (11 INT, eight fumble recoveries) in 2022, with 11 of those leading directly to Wolf Pack points. The Pack has already made eight takeaways this season, with linebacker Drue Watts recovering a fumble in each of the first four games.

Bitonio has made five-straight Pro Bowls, and been named to the AP All-Pro First Team each of the past two seasons.

WR Elijah Cooks (Nevada, 2017-21) - Jacksonville Jaguars

Cooks signed with Jacksonville as a free agent following the 2023 NFL Draft, and made the team's 53-man roster following a strong camp. During his Nevada career (2017-21), he had season bests of 76 catches, 926 receiving yards, and;

G Austin Corbett (Nevada, 2013-17) - Carolina Panthers

Corbett will begin his sixth NFL season, and second with Carolina, in 2023. However, he will miss at least the first four games of the season while on the Panthers' PUP (physically unable to perform) list, after tearing his ACL in the 2022 finale.

WR Romeo Doubs (Nevada, 2018-21) - Green Bay Packers

Romeo Doubs enters year two with the Green Bay Packers, after a solid 2022 rookie season in which he caught 42 passes for 425 yards and three touchdowns over 13 games.

LB Daiyan Henley (Nevada, 2017-21) - Los Angeles Chargers

Henley played at Nevada from 2017-21, being named to the All-Mountain West Second Team in 2021, before finishing his collegiate career at Washington State in 2022. Henley was drafted in the third round of the 2023 NFL Draft by the Los Angeles Chargers, and made the team out of camp.

LB Nephi Sewell (Nevada, 2017-18) - New Orleans Saints

Sewell, the brother of current Nevada graduate assistant Gabe Sewell, played two seasons (2017-18) for the Pack, making 53 tackles while starting all 11 games in 2018. After transferring to Utah, where he finished his collegiate career, Sewell signed as a free agent with the New Orleans Saints, appearing in four games in 2022.

TE Cole Turner (Nevada, 2018-21) - Washington Commanders

Turner is back for his second season with Washington in 2023. Last year, Turner appeared in 10 games, making two catches for 23 yards.

PROGRAM HISTORY

Nevada is in its 116th season of collegiate football. The Wolf Pack sports an all-time record of 576-518-33. Since joining the FBS in 1992, Nevada is 200-182 overall and 130-100 in conference play. Nevada has posted winning seasons in 12 out of its past 15 campaigns.




BEHIND THE TRIDENTS

Nevada's Takeaway Trident has received plenty of TV time in its debut season, 2022. The original trident was presented to Nevada head coach Ken Wilson and Wolf Pack players Tyson Williams, Toa Taua, Devonte Lee, Dom Peterson, Grant Starck, and Shane Illingworth during a visit to the Naval Air Warfighting Development Center (NAWDC) in Fallon, on Aug. 19, 2022.

NAWDC commander Rear Admiral Max McCoy presented the trident to University President Brian Sandoval, Wilson, and the players as part of a tribute to the U.S.S. Nevada (BB-36). The battleship survived the attack on Pearl Harbor in 1941, and was repaired and put back to sea, going on to earn seven battle stars during World War II.

In 2023, Nevada has added a silver Touchdown Trident to the fold, in addition to medallion coins for takeaways and touchdowns.

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Caleb Williams threw for 319 yards and hit Tahj Washington with two of his five touchdown passes, leading No. 6 Southern California to a 66-14 victory over Nevada on Saturday night.

Williams passed for 258 yards and four TDs on just 15 completions while USC built a 35-7 halftime lead. He finished 18 of 24 while also rushing for 42 yards and adding another array of remarkable escapes and pinpoint completions to his collection.

Stanley Ta'ufo'ou returned a fumble 23 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter for the Trojans. South Carolina transfer Mar-Shawn Lloyd had 76 yards rushing and 59 yards receiving, while touted freshmen Quinten Joyner and Duce Robinson scored their first career touchdowns in the fourth quarter.

Brendon Lewis passed for 182 yards for the Wolf Pack (0-1), who scored on their opening drive before giving up 45 consecutive points. Freshman AJ Bianco threw a 77-yard touchdown pass to Jamaal Bell on his first career pass attempt during the fourth quarter for Nevada, which went 2-10 in coach Ken Wilson's debut last sea-

son after four straight winning campaigns under Jay Norvell.

Williams was in control from the opening drive, during which he improvised a stunning 30-yard completion to Dorian Singer while on a dead sprint to the sideline. Two plays later, he threw a perfect 22-yard TD fade to Branch. the freshman phenomenon who scored two touchdowns in the opener.

Nevada answered with a 73-yard catch by Spencer Curtis leading to a TD run by Sean Dollars two plays later. But Lloyd made a 24-yard TD run later in the quarter, and Williams ran 46 yards on a draw with the first snap of the second quarter before putting the Trojans up 28-7 with a 15-yard TD pass to Jackson.

 ${\bf IOWA~CITY,~Iowa~(AP)}$ — Kaleb Johnson rushed for 103 yards and two touchdowns, and Iowa endured a night of lightning delays for a 27-0 win over Nevada on Saturday night.

The game, which was delayed three times for 3 hours, 56 minutes, started at $6:40~\mathrm{p.m.}$ CDT, and ended at $1:39~\mathrm{a.m.}$

Johnson, a true freshman, had a 40-yard touchdown run in the first quarter for Iowa's first points of the game, then added a 55-yarder in the fourth quarter for the Hawkeyes' final score.

Iowa (2-1) had scored just 14 points in its first two games, but matched that in the first quarter. Johnson had his run, then quarterback Spencer Petras threw a 21-yard touchdown pass to Arland Bruce IV on the Hawkeyes' next possession

The Hawkeyes, ranked 131st in total offense through the first two games after gaining just 316 yards, had 337 yards against the Wolf Pack (2-2), who came in ranked 95th in total defense giving up 404.3 yards per game.

Iowa's other points came on two field goals by Drew Stevens — a 43-yarder in the second quarter and a 33-yarder in the third. Petras completed 14 of 26 passes for 175 yards.

The game, which was played in a steady rain, was finally affected by lightning in the second half.

The first delay lasted 1 hour, 19 minutes. The delay was called at 8:37 p.m. with 10:02 left in the third quarter.

The two teams returned and after a 12-minute warm-up session play started again. Nine minutes later, another lightning delay was called. This one lasted 1 hour, 50 minutes.

Nevada quarterback Shane Illingworth threw an incompletion on thirdand-22 on the first play after that delay. The Wolf Pack wouldn't get off their next play, as lightning lit up the sky and referee David Siegle announced there would be another delay.

The stadium was evacuated for all three delays.

The Hawkeyes' offense showed some life after struggles to start the season. It helped that Petras got back wide receivers Keagan Johnson and Nico Ragaini, who missed the first two games after beginning fall camp at the top of the depth chart at their respective positions. Running back Gavin Williams, also expected to be a starter, missed the first two games of the season, but he returned to rush for 57 yards on 16 carries.

Nevada, which came into the game ranked 105th in total offense nationally, couldn't move the ball against the Hawkeyes, who were ranked sixth in total defense. The Wolf Pack, who had 151 yards in the game, head into Mountain West Conference play next Friday against Air Force.

FRESNO, Calif. (AP) -- Mikey Keene connected with Jaelen Gill on two touchdown passes, Malik Sherod had 12 carries for 123 yards and a score and No. 25 Fresno State beat Nevada 27-9 on Saturday night for its 14th straight victory.

Fresno State (5-0, 1-0 Mountain West) is off to its best start since opening 10-0 in 2013. The 14-game winning streak is the second-longest active run in the nation (Georgia, 22 in a row) and the second-longest in program history. The Bulldogs won 17 in a row in 1988-89.

Keene was 26 of 34 for 269 yards with two interceptions. He connected with Gill on a 65-yard touchdown to open the scoring midway through the first quarter and Sherod ripped off a 72-yard touchdown run with 4:15 to go in the second to make it 14-0 at halftime. Dylan Lynch kicked field goals of 48 and 40 yards in the third quarter and Gill scored on a 12-yard reception early in the fourth to make it 27-0.

Fresno State's Carlton Johnston intercepted a pass at the Bulldogs 2 and, on the next play from scrimmage, Elijah Gilliam was stopped in the end zone to give Nevada (0-5, 0-1) a safety.

Backup quarterback AJ Bianco led an eight-play, 90-yard drive, capped

by his 19-yard touchdown pass to Spencer Curtis that made it 27-9 with 11 seconds to go. Bianco was 9 of 14 for 97 yards. Starter Brendon Lewis completed 10 of 21 for 70 yards with two interceptions.

SAN DIEGO (AP) -- Brandon Talton kicked two field goals Saturday night and Nevada beat San Diego 6-0 to snap a 16-game losing streak and record the Wolf Pack's first shutout in more than a 12 years.

Nevada (1-6, 1-2 Mountain West), which lost 10 in a row to close last season, won its first conference game since a 52-10 win at Colorado State on Nov. 27, 2021 and held an opponent scoreless for the first time since a 37-0 win over UNLV on Oct. 8, 2011.

Talton, who missed from 48 yards in the third and fourth quarters, made a 37-yard field goal midway with 7:03 left in the first quarter and a 39-yarder as time expired in the first half to make it 6-0.

Jack Browning missed a 34-yard field goal-attempt in the second quarter for the Aztecs.

The Wolf Pack had just 242 total yard but limited San Diego State (3-5, 1-3) to 204, just 47 yards passing.

The Aztecs were held scoreless for the first time since a 27-0 loss to Ohio on Dec. 19, 2018.
