MOUNTAIN WEST CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

The Mountain West Championship will take place on Saturday, Dec. 2, at 1 p.m. MT / 12 p.m. PT and will air on FOX. The winner will earn the Craig Thompson Championship Trophy.

For MW Championship Game host and participant tiebreaking procedures, see page 4 of these notes.

Tiebreaking scenarios:

- If UNLV beats San José State, it hosts the winner of the Air Force/Boise State game in the MW Championship.

- If SJSU beats UNLV, there will be a three-way tie between UNLV, SJSU and the winner of the AF/BSU game. The three-team round-robin tiebreaker wouldn't break either tie. The selected computer rankings will identify the two highest-ranked tied teams to participate in the championship game. Once those two teams are identified, the head-to-head result will determine the host. If the teams did not play each other in the regular season, the highest-ranked team in the computer rankings will host the championship game.



MOUNTAIN WEST QUICK HITS

- With one week to play in the regular season, four teams are still in contention for spots in the MW Championship.
- Six Mountain West programs are bowl eligible and another two – Colorado State and Utah State – are still in contention to reach the threshold in the final week of the regular season.
- Three MW squads are receiving votes in the national polls. UNLV and Fresno State are receiving votes in both the *Associated Press* and AFCA polls, while Air Force is receiving votes in the AFCA poll. Air Force and Fresno State have both appeared in the national rankings this year. The Falcons have been as high as No. 17 in both the AP and AFCA polls and were No. 25 in the initial College Football Playoff rankings. Fresno State has spent three weeks in the national rankings, topping out at No. 24.
- The MW has four wins over Autonomous 5 programs this season, the most of any G5 conference.
- The Mountain West has the No. 2 Schedule Strength Ranking among the Group of 5 conferences, according to SportSource.
- The Mountain West is the only FBS conference this season with all its teams averaging at least 19.0 points per game in conference play.

AROUND THE MOUNTAIN WEST

- UNLV, which has already clinched at least a share of its first MW regular-season championship, can claim the title outright with a win over San José State on Saturday. The Rebels, who would claim their first MW Football Championship appearance with a win, would also earn the right to host the Championship at Allegiant Stadium on Dec. 2 and would face either Air Force or Boise State.
- San José State can also earn a spot in the MW Championship and could potentially host it with a win over UNLV, pending the computer rankings that would come into play to break what would be a three-way tie atop the standings.
- The Rebels and Spartans are the hottest teams in the league, with UNLV having won three straight and eight of nine and SJSU riding a five-game winning streak, the longest active streak in the MW. All five wins in the streak have come by double figures, which gives the Spartans the longest active win streak in the FBS with every game being decided by 10-plus points.
- Air Force and Boise State square off on Friday in a championship elimination game. Both teams have paths to host, pending computer rankings.
- Boise State interim head coach **Spencer Danielson** got a win in his debut, as the Broncos downed Utah State 45-10 in Week 12. The BSU offense is rolling, as it has scored at least 30 points in nine straight games, the second-longest active streak in the FBS behind Oregon (11).

AROUND THE MOUNTAIN WEST

- UNLV quarterback **Jayden Maiava** earned his record fifth MW Freshman of the Week citation Monday after leading the Rebels to a 31-27 win at Air Force to take sole possession of first place in the MW standings. Maiava paced UNLV in passing and rushing for the second straight week, going 15-for-29 for 339 yards and two touchdowns through the air and adding eight carries for 36 yards on the ground. Sophomore linebacker **Marsel McDuffie** earned MW Defensive Player of the Week honors after logging a career-high 15 tackles (10) solo and forcing a fumble in the win. McDuffie helped UNLV hold Air Force scoreless after halftime, notably recording a stop for no gain on a second-and-goal try on the Falcons' final drive. Senior placekicker **Jose Pizano** connected on a 39-yard field-goal try to extend his streak to 18 straight makes, which is tied for the third-longest streak in MW history.
- New Mexico running back **Jacory Croskey-Merritt** had 21 carries for a career-best 209 yards and two TDs to lead the Lobos past Fresno State, 25-17, and earn MW Offensive Player of the Week honors. Croskey-Merritt had scoring runs of 50 and 10 yards and needs just 43 more yards to hit 1,000 for the season. The senior helped New Mexico eclipse 300 yards rushing in a game for the first time since 2018.
- Croskey-Merritt is tied for third in the FBS with 17 scrimmage TDs this season, while **Kairee Robinson** of San José State is second with 18. The only season in which the Mountain West has had multiple players finish among the top three in the FBS in that category is 2013 (Colorado State's **Kapri Bibbs** and Fresno State's **Davante Adams**).
- Colorado State graduate kicker **Jordan Noyes** scored 12 points on three field goals and three PATs in the Rams' 30-20 win over Nevada to earn MW Special Teams Player of the Week honors. Noyes connected on field goals of 30, 42 and 31 yards in the win as CSU remained in contention to become bowl eligible. Rams graduate defensive end **Mohamed Kamara** had one sack to push his career total to 30.0, three back of BSU record-holder **Clark Haggans** (1996-99) and four back of MW career leader **Curtis Weaver** of Boise State (2017-19).
- Wyoming graduate quarterback **Andrew Peasley** was 14-for-17 (82.4 percent) for 319 yards and three touchdowns in the Cowboys' 42-9 win over Hawai'i, earning recognition as a Manning Award Star of the Week. His passing TDs went for 44, 89 and 40 yards as Wyoming built a 35-0 halftime lead and finished 7-0 at home this season.
- Air Force boasts one of the top defenses in the FBS, ranking 13th in scoring defense (17.1 ppg), fourth in total defense (265.3), seventh in rushing defense (88.6) and 11th in passing defense (176.7).
- With 13,283 yards of total offense in his career, San José State senior quarterback **Chevan Cordeiro** is just 201 back of MW career leader **Brett Rypien** of Boise State, who logged 13,484 in his career from 2015-18.
- Nevada senior **Brandon Talton** hit a pair of field goals in the 30-20 setback to Colorado State in Week 12, extending his MW record to 81 career makes. Boise State senior **Jonah Dalmas** connected on his only field-goal attempt in the Broncos' 45-10 win over Utah State to push his career total to 72, good for second in MW history. Dalmas is the league's career leader with an 87.8 career field-goal percentage.
- Five MW coaches are nominees for the Broyles Award, which honors college football's top assistant coaches. Air Force defensive coordinator **Brian Knorr**, Colorado State tight ends coach **James Finley**, San José State offensive line coach/run game coordinator **Josh Oglesby**, UNLV offensive coordinator **Brennan Marion** and Utah State co-offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach **Kyle Cefalo** represent the MW among the 61 nominees for the 2023 award.

MOUNTAIN WEST BOWL SELECTION PROCESS

If the highest-ranked champion among the Group of 5, the Mountain West is guaranteed a spot in a New Year's Six bowl.



The LA Bowl has the first selection of available MW teams.



If a slot is open from the Big Ten or Big 12, the MW will be the primary backup in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl.

ESPN Events has the next selection of available teams for one of its four bowls.



* Fourth bowl game likely to be located in Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex.

The Barstool Sports Arizona Bowl has the next selection of available teams.



ESPN Events will then fill the remaining of its three bowls listed above.



CHAMPIONSHIP GAME PARTICIPANTS & HOST DETERMINATION

The two teams that complete the Conference season with the highest winning percentages will be the Mountain West Football Championship Game participants. The team with the highest winning percentage outright shall be declared the host for the Championship Game.

If there is a tie between two (2) or more teams for participation in and/or hosting of the Championship Game, the following tiebreaking procedures shall be administered in numerical order to determine the participant(s) and host for the Championship Game.

TIE BETWEEN TWO TEAMS:

1. Head-to-head result between the tied teams.
 - a. If the tied teams did not play each other, go to step 2.
2. Highest CFP Selection Committee Ranking (or composite of selected computer rankings).
 - a. If one team is ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee Ranking (November 21) and wins on the final weekend of the regular season, they will be declared a participant (and/or host). If, in that same scenario, the one ranked team in the latest available CFP Selection Committee Ranking loses in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used to determine the participant and/or host;
 - OR -
 - b. If both teams are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee Ranking (November 21), the highest-ranked team that wins on the final weekend of the regular season will be declared a participant (and/or host);
 - OR -
 - c. If neither of the ranked teams win in the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used to determine the participant (and/or host);
 - OR -
 - c. If neither team is ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee Ranking (November 21) going into the final weekend of the regular season, a composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude the final weekend of the regular season will be used to determine the participants (and/or host).

For use of composite selected computer rankings, if Team A is 28.24 and Team B is 28.34, Team A would be declared a participant (and/or host) for the football championship game.

3. Overall winning percentage against all opponents.
 - a. A maximum of one win against a team from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision shall be included in the calculation of the winning percentage.
4. Record against the next highest-placed team in the Conference standings (based on winning percentage in all games played within the Conference), proceeding down the standings. When comparing tied teams against positions lower in the standings that are also tied, those lower-tied positions shall be considered a single position for the purposes of comparison.
 - a. If one team did not play a certain team, move to the next highest-placed team(s) in the standings.
 - b. If one team did not play all teams in the group of tied teams, move to the next highest-placed in the standings.
 - c. If one team did not play the lowest-placed team in the standings, move to the next step in the tiebreaker.
5. Winning percentage against common Conference opponents.
6. Coin toss to be conducted virtually by the Commissioner.

TIE BETWEEN THREE OR MORE TEAMS:

In the event of a percentage tie between three or more teams, the following comparison procedure shall be used until one or more teams gain an advantage and/or the process reverts to the two-team tiebreaking procedures:

1. Winning percentages of the tied teams are compared in a mini round-robin format. If, within the mini round-robin, any of the tied teams did not play each other, the group of teams shall remain tied, unless one team defeated all other tied teams.
2. Highest CFP Selection Committee Ranking (or composite average of selected computer rankings). The two highest-ranked tied teams will be identified using the following criteria:
 - a. The tied team(s) who are ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee Ranking (November 21) and win in the final weekend.
 - b. A composite average of selected computer rankings for the tied team(s) that lose in the final weekend of the regular season OR were not ranked in the latest available CFP Selection Committee Ranking (November 21).

Note: CFP Selection Committee Ranking is superior to the composite average of selected computer rankings in (a.) and (b.) above.

Example 1. If Team A is the only ranked team at 21 and wins in the final weekend of regular season play, it will be declared a participant in the MW Championship Game and would advance to a two-team tiebreaker to determine the host. The second team to advance to the two-team tiebreaker will be identified using the composite of selected computer rankings.

Example 2. If Team A is ranked 21, Team B is ranked 22, and Team C is ranked 23 in the CFP Selection Committee Ranking (November 21) and all win in the final weekend of regular season play, Team A and B would be declared participants in the MW Championship Game, and would advance to a two-team tiebreaker to determine the host.

Example 3. If Team A is ranked 30.33, Team B is ranked 31.22, and Team C is ranked 32.11 in the composite average of selected computer rankings after all games conclude in the final weekend of regular season play, Team A and B would be declared participants in the MW Championship Game, and would advance to a two-team tiebreaker to determine the host.

3. Overall winning percentage against all opponents.
 - a. A maximum of one win against a team from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision shall be included in the calculation of the winning percentage.
4. Record against the next highest-placed team in the Conference standings (based on winning percentage in all games played within the Conference), proceeding down the standings. When comparing tied teams against positions lower in the standings that are also tied, those lower-tied positions shall be considered a single position for the purposes of comparison.
 - a. If one or all teams did not play a certain team, move to the next highest-placed team(s) in the standings.
 - b. If one or all teams did not play all teams in the group of tied teams, move to the next highest-place in the standings.
 - c. If one or all teams did not play the lowest-placed team in the standings, move to the next step in the tiebreaker.
5. Winning percentage against common Conference opponents.
6. Drawing to be conducted virtually by the Commissioner to determine the two teams.

TIED GAMES

A football game which ends in a tie shall count as half-a-game won and half-a-game lost in the standings.

ELIGIBILITY

A team ineligible under NCAA or Mountain West rules for post-season (bowl) competition shall not compete in the Championship Game.

INABILITY TO HOST

If the host institution is unable to host the Championship Game, the other Championship Game participant shall be declared the host team.

MW TEAMS IN SEASON OPENERS

Mountain West teams are 144-108 in season openers since the inception of the league in 1999. MW teams are 113-32 at home and 24-63 on the road. Below is an all-time breakdown of the Mountain West in season openers.

POSTSEASON SUCCESS

The Mountain West has earned 118 bowl bids and holds a 66-52 (.559) all-time record. Over the last 19 seasons, the MW has captured the Bowl Challenge Cup five times and owns the third-best win percentage in bowl games among the 10 FBS conferences with a 59-44 mark (.573), trailing only the SEC (.618) and Sun Belt (.576).

MOUNTAIN WEST POINTS OF PRIDE

Celebrating 25 years of innovation. 2023 will be the 25th season of Mountain West football. The Mountain West has been a thought leader in college athletics. It is a league of firsts:

- First conference to play on ESPN Thursday night football.
- The first to establish a sports television network dedicated solely to an intercollegiate athletic conference (The Mtn.).
- First conference to experiment with the coaches' challenge in the college football instant replay system.
- First conference to have a female play in a FBS game.
- First conference to push for a college football playoff beginning in 2009 and then advocated for an expansion of the CFP Playoff field since 2011.
- First Conference to propose better access and revenue for the non-automatic-qualifying FBS leagues.
- The first non-automatic-qualifying conference to participate in a BCS bowl game (Utah defeated Pitt in Fiesta Bowl).
- The first non-automatic-qualifying conference to participate in a CFP New Year's bowl game (Boise State defeated Arizona).
- First to broadcast a live football game on Twitter, ahead of even the NFL. Also, the first to stream a live college football bowl game on Facebook.
- First league to allow student-athletes in Joint Council and Board of Director meetings.
- The MW was the first conference to host an eSports event alongside an intercollegiate athletic event.
- First conference with an exclusively Spanish-language television broadcast in FBS football history.

2023 will be the first season without divisions since 2012 (not including the 2020 season, impacted by COVID-19).

- 2023 represents the debut of a new three-year schedule rotation.
- Within Conference play, each institution will face two opponents annually and six other teams on an alternating basis. Throughout the cycle, all institutions will play each other at least twice, including once at home and once on the road.
- The new schedule format will put the MW in the best position for a spot in the College Football Playoff.

Football officiating alliance.

- The Mountain West is part of an officiating alliance with the Big 12, American Athletic and Southland conferences.
- Over 300 officials will be under the alliance's umbrella, ensuring consistent training, evaluation, and grading processes across the conferences. The alliance will use this pipeline to develop a "bench" of officials who have been trained and evaluated under consistent philosophies and mechanics.
- Each conference will have its own coordinator of officials to manage their respective officiating programs.
