### SETTING THE STAGE

- The Bulldogs are coming off of a 48-0 win over New Mexico State, the largest margin of victory over an FBS team since 2012.
- Fresno State and New Mexico will meet for the 22nd time in program history on Saturday.
- Fresno State will be making its fourth trip to the city of Albuquerque in as many seasons.
- Fresno State will be traveling to ABQ to face New Mexico for the first time since 2022, and just the fifth time since 2012.
- Fresno State interim head coach Tim Skipper earned his first win as Fresno State head coach at University Stadium in Albuquerque, serving as the team's acting head coach in the 2023 Isleta New Mexico Bowl against New Mexico State last December.
- Fresno State is 2-1 to open the season, following back-to-back home wins for the Bulldogs against Sacramento State and New Mexico State.
- Fresno State and New Mexico both open Mountain West play on Saturday.
- Fresno State has won two of its last five Mountain West openers (2021 and 2023)
- The Bulldogs are 7-5 in Mountain West openers.
- Fresno State is 2-4 when opening Mountain West play on the road.
- The Bulldogs look for their first road win of the season this weekend, falling in the season opener at then-No. 9 Michigan in their only road test so far.
- Fresno State will face a similar situation this weekend as last, going up against a 2023 opponent that isn't remotely similar to the team in 2024. The Lobos have a new head coach this season and have added 42 transfers into the program (the second-most in the country).
- For the third time this season, Fresno State will go against a team with a new head coach leading the way. The Bulldogs face five first-year head coaches in 2024.
- Fresno State has had its foot on the gas the last two games, recording over 500-yards of offense against Sacramento State and New Mexico State. It's the first time the Bulldogs have had back-to-back games with over 500 yards since early in the 2021 season.
- Fresno State used 281 yards rushing in the win against New Mexico State, its most rushing yards in a game since 2022.
- On the other side of the ball, Fresno State's defense showed out with its first shutout of the season against New Mexico State last weekend. It was the Bulldogs' first shutout in nearly a full calendar year, since shutting out Arizona State 29-0 on Sept. 16, 2023.
- Fresno State has had at least one shutout in four-straight seasons.
- On Sept. 12, it was announced that the Pac-12 Conference Board of Directors has unanimously voted to admit Fresno State, along with Boise State University, Colorado State University and San Diego State University, into the Pac-12 Conference effective July 1, 2026.

## DEEP DIVE

- Fresno State and New Mexico will meet for the 22nd time in program history this weekend.
- Fresno State leads their series against New Mexico, 15-6
- In their last matchup on November 18, 2023, Fresno State fell to New Mexico at home by a final score of 25-17.
- This is their tenth meeting in program history as Mountain West opponents, and Fresno State is 7-2 against New Mexico during MW conference matchups.
- The teams also shared a conference as members of the WAC. Fresno State was 4-1 in those WAC meetings.
- The Bulldogs are 11-2 over New Mexico as conference opponents.
- One of the most dominating wins in Bulldog history came against New Mexico on October 5, 1991, where the Bulldogs defeated the Lobos at home by a final score of 94-17
- Fresno State has never lost back-to-back games against New Mexico in the series
- In four of their last six contests, Fresno State has held New Mexico to less than 10 points, including their only shutout in the series which came on October 14, 2017 where they defeated the Lobos 38-0 at home.
- Fresno State won those four games when holding UNM to 10 points or less, and is 0-2 in that time when allowing more.
- Okiki Olorunfunmi, who is listed as an edge rusher for New Mexico, is from the Central Valley where he graduated from Clovis North High School while eventually making stops at Reedley College and Weber State before transferring to New Mexico.
- Justin Holaday, listed as a quarterback for New Mexico, is from the Central Valley, having graduated from Lemoore High School and spent time at Fresno City College before transferring to New Mexico before the start of his sophomore season.
- New Mexico is coming in to this game 0-3 following losses to Montana State, #20 Arizona, and Auburn
- Saturday is homecoming for the Lobos at University Stadium.

## TEAM NOTES

### 'Dogs in MW conference openers

Fresno State opens Mountain West play on Saturday at New Mexico. Since joining the conference in 2012, the Bulldogs are 7-5 in Mountain West openers. The Bulldogs have won two of their last five openers (2021 and 2023).

### Not so lucky on the road

When talking conference openers, the Bulldogs are 2-4 since 2012 when their MW opener is on the road. Fresno State's only MW opening road wins came in 2014 and 2018. The Bulldogs have lost the last two MW openers when on the road, in 2019 and 2022.

### They got us last time

New Mexico defeated Fresno State 25-17 in their last meeting on Nov. 18, 2023 in Fresno. It was New Mexico's first win in Fresno since 1994.

The loss for the Bulldogs came following a string of injuries and a point in the season that felt there was no way to turn this around, and nothing was going right for the 'Dogs. New Mexico ran for 345 yards against Fresno State that night as the Bulldogs allowed a season-high 528 total yards to the Lobos.

### Last time at their stadium was a good one, though

Fresno State faced New Mexico State at University Stadium in Albuquerque in the 2023 Isleta New Mexico Bowl. The Bulldogs came home with a win, securing their fifth-straight bowl game victory behind the leadership of then-acting head coach Tim Skipper.

The bowl game saw Skipper leading the way for the 'Dogs as head coach Jeff Tedford had to step away for medical concerns. Skipper earned his first official win as head coach at University Stadium.

### Back to Albuquerque...again

There shouldn't be a need for a walk thru or many players from Fresno State who are not familiar with University Stadium and the surrounding Albuquerque area. The Bulldogs have made a trip to ABQ at least once in the last three years with the fourth coming up this weekend – 2021 Bowl Game, 2022 regular season, 2023 Bowl Game and now 2024 regular season.

### Similar story, new opponent

Last week, Fresno State faced a New Mexico State team for the second time with just two games between the meetings. However, it was a completely different matchup as the Aggies came into 2024 with a new head coach and 36 transfer players added to the roster.

The Bulldogs face a similar obstacle in this weekend's matchup as well. The Lobos also have a new head coach for 2024, and have added 42 transfers into the program (the second-most in the country). The New Mexico team that defeated Fresno State towards the end of the 2023 season is not even close to the New Mexico team that the Bulldogs will travel to face this weekend.

### New head coach (again)

For the third time this season, Fresno State will go against a team with a new head coach leading the way. The Bulldogs face five first-year head coaches in 2024.

### Here we go again

For the third time since 2020, Fresno State has a new head coach leading its football program. On July 15, 2024, Tim Skipper was named the interim head coach for the 2024 season as Jeff Tedford stepped down for health concerns. Skipper held the title of assistant head coach and linebackers coach for the Bulldogs in 2022 and 2023.

### We have been here before, though

Although Skipper now holds the interim head coach tag entering the season, he has been put in this role before – and it wasn't long ago. Skipper had to step up and serve as acting head coach for the team's trip to the New Mexico Bowl to close out the 2023 season. Skipper led the Bulldogs to a 37-10 victory over New Mexico State on December 16, 2023. Leading to his 1-0 record as a head coach.

### So, who is he?

Tim Skipper, and the Skipper name in general, is a familiar name around the Bulldog program. Tim was a linebacker himself from 1997-2000, but he wasn't the first Skipper around the program as his older brother Kelly Skipper was on the Bulldog coaching staff in various roles from 1989-97.

Coaching runs deep in the Skipper blood as his father Jim coached for four decades before his retirement in 2019. After his stint at Fresno State, brother Kelly had stops at UCLA and Washington State before moving on to coach in the NFL. He is the current Buffalo Bills running backs coach.

## TEAM NOTES

### We're not alone in this one

In 2023, the Mountain West was flooded with some of the country's longest-tenured and winningest head coaches including Jeff Tedford. Entering 2024, the conference has EIGHT new head coaches.

### Welcome to the show

A handful of players saw their first action as Bulldogs, in all three phases of the game.

Offensively, Joshua Wood (QB), Jayden Mandal (QB), Chedon James (WR), Raylen Sharpe (WR), Lyndon Ravare (WR), Bryson Donelson (RB), Ponafatu Kamuta (OL), Nathan Acevedo (WR), Richie Anderson (TE) and Brock Lium (TE) appeared in their first games as Bulldogs.

On defense, Korey Foreman (DE), Jakari Embry (DB), RJ Regan (NKL), Makei Thompson (NKL), Gus Remlinger (DB), Justin Johnson (DB), Auckland Asiata (DL) and Jairus Satele (DL) all played in their first games as Bulldogs.

Several players mentioned above were also members of the special teams units, but primarily punter Clay Lawrence made his first standout appearance along with long snapper Wesley Brown. Nick Verdugo (P) also saw the field as the holder.

### Quick rewind

Taking a look back at the 2023 season, Fresno State got off on a high note, defeating Purdue on the road in the season opener for its 10th win in a row. The Bulldogs won their first five games of the season before falling to Wyoming. It was the program's first 5-0 start to a season since 2013.

Fresno State bounced back with three wins following the loss at Wyoming, but then saw three-straight losses to close out the season and drown any hopes of a Mountain West Championship.

Coach Tedford stepped away from the team to address health concerns for the bowl game, and that was when Skipper took over as acting head coach for the week. Skipper had full head coach responsibilities that week, and got the team juiced up to win the bowl game, despite coming off of three losses and the worry around Tedford's health.

### A sense of security

In this day and age of college football, change is normal. Change is expected. Change is inevitable. Changes to the rosters, rules and different realignments, college football personnel are forever living on their toes.

For Fresno State, there is a sense of security though. Although losing the head coach, Fresno State survived the coaching carousel for yet another year. The Bulldogs only lost one full-time assistant coach as OL coach Brian Armstrong left for Nevada. However, even that change wasn't a drastic one as Matt Smith was elevated from offensive graduate assistant to full-time OL coach.

The defense returns the same coaching staff for the third season in a row, led by defensive coordinator Kevin Coyle.

### Feelin' real comfortable now

The 2023 season had so many question marks around the offense with a new coordinator, new quarterback, new targets for that quarterback, and a new premier running back. The 2022 offense was one of the best offenses in Fresno State history, led by the trio of quarterback Jake Haener, wide receiver Jalen Moreno-Cropper and running back Jordan Mims. It was an offense that averaged over 400 yards a game.

It didn't take long to realize that things were going to be ok in 2023 with then-first year OC Pat McCann, first-year quarterback Mikey Keene, receivers Erik Brooks, Jaelen Gill and Jalen Moss, and running back Malik Sherrod.

For the first time since 2021, Fresno State enters the year with a familiar offensive coordinator with McCann set for his second season as OC. The Bulldogs had a new offensive coordinator in 2022 and 2023, but now find familiarity and stability in 2024.

Better for McCann, the Bulldogs also return their starting QB in Keene. McCann and Keene were both new in their roles in 2023, but were able to put up impressive numbers in year one.

The Bulldogs return the same OC/QB duo for the first time since 2021 with Ryan Grubb (OC) and Jake Haener (QB) after the transition from the 2020 to 2021 season. Similar to McCann and Keene, 2020 was also the first year for both Grubb and Haener in their respective positions in the offense. In 2021, the Bulldogs finished with a 10-3 record while leading the MW in total offense and ranking fifth or better in 17 offensive statistical categories.

- Additionally, McCann and Keene also have quarterbacks coach Matt Wade back to assist with the offense.

## TEAM NOTES

### Gets from the portal

The biggest talk of the offseason has been the addition of USC transfer Korey Foreman to the defensive line. Foreman joined as a mid-year addition for the spring semester, and got familiar with the program throughout spring football. However, Foreman wasn't the only big get for the 'Dogs. Fresno State added eight division one transfers, with the addition of eight junior college transfers.

### Didn't lose much either

There are pros and cons to the transfer portal for every team. Luckily, for the 'Dogs, there weren't many hits. Fresno State lost just one starter in tight end Tre Watson, who initially committed to Washington with former Fresno State head coach Kalen DeBoer but since flipped to play at Texas A&M.

In addition to Watson, Fresno State lost just seven other players who saw any sort of playtime in 2023.

However, the Bulldogs ran into more concern with the head coaching change as the portal window re-opens for teams with a new head coach for 30 days. In that 30-day period, Fresno State lost only one player.

### Give the JuCos a chance

Fresno State has 20 players on its roster that joined the program from a junior college.

Of those 20, 9 of them are on the two-deep and three of them are listed as starters at their position.

### Bulldog Born. Bulldog Bred.

Fresno State has four full-time coaches on its staff who are Bulldog football alumni, including interim head coach Tim Skipper. Defensive line coach Jethro Franklin, offensive line coach Matt Smith and defensive backs coach J.D. Williams were all former players. Notably, Williams was the first of five of Fresno State's first round draft picks in program history.

Going further down the list of coaches, the 'Dogs also have three quality control and graduate assistant positions who are former players as GAs DelVon Hardaway (offense) and Malik Forrester (defense), and special teams quality control Nick D'Ambra are all former Bulldogs themselves.

- In addition to the on-field coaches, the recruiting staff has Bulldog football ties as Director of Recruiting Operations L.J. Early was a safety for the 'Dogs from 2019-22.

### "Family" means more here

Programs always preach "family" and "brotherhood", but at Fresno State it goes far beyond just a recruiting pitch or casual phrase. It's much more than that. It's quite literal here.

Fresno State has two sets of brothers – Joe and Mac Dalena, and Gus and Charles Remlinger – and two set of cousins – Seth and Steven Scheidt, and Jairus Satele and Jordan Malau'ulu – on its current roster. The Bulldogs are one of 20 schools in the FBS with multiple sets of brothers on the roster in 2024.

Legacy player Devon Rivers (RB) enters his second season in 2024 and looks to follow in the footsteps of his father Ron Rivers (1991-93) and older brother Ronnie Rivers (2017-21) as greats in the program. Brother Ronnie left the program as the all-time leading scorer. Both Ron and Ronnie are among the top in rushing records in Fresno State history.

The Dalena duo just missed playing on the same team with older brother Frank who was a Bulldog wide receiver from 2016-19.

Former Bulldog head coach Pat Hill remains around the program as the analyst on the Bulldog Sports Network, calling the games as a part of the radio crew for nine seasons. Hill's son Zak Hill, who was a Bulldog safety from 2008-11, is also around the program in 2023 as one of the team's doctors.

### STUDENT-Athletes

Fresno State has 18 players on its team who have already earned a college degree. Of that group, three transferred in this season as graduate transfers in Wesley Brown (Cal), RJ Regan (Arizona State) and Raylen Sharpe (Missouri State).

In addition to those three, the following student-athletes rep that Mountain West graduate patch on their jersey -- Tyler Mello, Torean Penright, Ryan Wilson, Julian Polendo, Michael Munoz, Cam Lockridge, Jake Boust, Charles Remlinger, Devo Bridges, Tuasivi Nomura, Malachi Langley, Dean Clark, Jordan Brown, Steven Scheidt and Osmar Velez.

## TEAM NOTES

### The four captains

Interim head coach Tim Skipper announced the team's captains at the annual preseason Kickoff Dinner on August 15, 2024. Voted for by their teammates, Mikey Keene, Mose Vavao, Devo Bridges and Tuasivi Nomura were named captains for the season.

Vavao and Bridges repeat as team captains this season, both being long-time Bulldogs with Bridges joining the program in 2019 and Vavao in 2020.

Keene and Nomura have only been with the program for one season, but have earned the trust and respect from their teammates on their respective sides of the ball to earn the honor of team captain.

### Ron Cox to be Inducted into Fresno State Football Ring of Honor

Fresno State Athletics announced in July that former Bulldog football linebacker Ron Cox will be inducted into the Ring of Honor this coming season. Cox, a two-time All-American, will become the program's first defensive player and the 12th overall member added to the prestigious Ring of Honor.

Cox, who led the Bulldog defense from 1987-89, declared for the NFL following his junior season, and was drafted 33rd overall (second round) to the Chicago Bears in the 1990 NFL Draft.

Cox still owns a handful of defensive records for the Bulldogs, but was most known for his nearly unblockable pressure on opposing quarterbacks. In his Bulldog career, Cox totaled 50.0 sacks – a mark that has sat atop the program's record book ever since. No other Bulldog has come close to Cox's career numbers, as current Bulldog defensive line coach Jethro Franklin totaled 31.5 in his career, the second most in program history.

Cox's Bulldog career was highlighted by an astounding 28.0 sack season in 1989 – a program record for most sacks in a single season. Franklin again ranks second in the single season category with 19.5.

Cox helped the Bulldogs to a 27- 8 record in his three seasons, along with two California Bowl wins. Five of those eight losses came in his freshman season. He earned the honor of 1989 Big West Defensive Player of the Year. He was a two-time first team All-Big West selection in 1988 and 1989, and earned his back-to-back All-American honors in those same seasons.

Cox had a seven-year stint in the NFL, spending six seasons with the Bears (1990-95) and one as a free agent with the Green Bay Packers (1996). He helped the Packers to a Super Bowl championship in 1997 (Super Bowl XXXI). Cox's football career ended with his retirement from the NFL back in Chicago in 1997.

Cox is a native of nearby Easton, Calif. and went to high school at Washington Union. Cox graduated with a degree in electrical engineering. He and his wife Michelle have three kids, Kelsey, Caitlin, and Ron Jr., and they live in Illinois.

The former Bulldog will be officially inducted into the Ring of Honor during halftime of the October 26 homecoming game against San Jose State.

## OFFENSE NOTES

### Feed 0

Senior wide receiver had the game of his life against Sacramento State on Sept. 7. Dalena finished the game with seven receptions for 235 yards and a touchdown. His number of receptions and receiving yards are both career-highs for the senior.

Dalena wasted no time on his connection with quarterback Mikey Keene as the pair connected on the very first play of the game for a 75-yard touchdown reception. Dalena and Keene connected on five plays of 20 or more yards in the Week 2 win.

The Fresno native became the first Bulldog wideout since Jalen Moreno-Cropper (vs Utah State, Nov. 14, 2020) to record a 200-yard receiving game. His 235 yards total tie for the seventh-most in a game by a Bulldog in program history and are the most by a single player since Davante Adams in 2013.

Dalena averaged 33.6 yards per catch that night, the second-highest per catch average in a game in Fresno State history.

It was almost a deja moment in the following week's game as Keene and Dalena again connected early on a big play touchdown, this time the second offensive play of the game for a 69-yard touchdown.

With 384 yards receiving on the year, Dalena is fifth in the FBS. He leads that group, averaging 25.6 yards per catch.

### Got our juice back in the run game

Fresno State put an emphasis on getting the run game going ahead of the New Mexico State game, and it did just that. The Bulldogs ran for 281 yards on Saturday, their most in a game since 2022.

The Bulldogs saw eight different ball-carriers that got them to that number, but were led by none other than senior Malik Sherrod (113). Raylen Sharpe contributed with 74 rushing yards while true freshman Bryson Donelson added 58 in his first bit of action.

Fresno State scored four rushing touchdowns with two by QB Joshua Wood and one apiece by Sherrod and Elijah Gilliam.

- The Bulldogs running back room saw its first fumble in a very long time. In the first quarter, Gilliam fumbled the football and it was the first fumble by a Fresno State running back since Ronnie Rivers versus New Mexico on Nov. 13, 2021.

### He was all over the place

That fumble by Gilliam could be forgiven because Raylen Sharpe had a brilliant heads up play that saw him scoop the fumble and continue forward for 56 yards into the red zone. Sharpe finished the night with a team-high 132 all-purpose yards behind 74 rushing yards and 58 yards receiving. He was the most-targeted receiver in the game and finished with a game-high five receptions.

### Kept possession

For the first time this season, the offense did not have a turnover. It was the first time since Oct. 13, 2023 that the Bulldogs didn't have a turnover.

### Welcome Bryson Donelson to the chat

The true freshman running back saw action in his second game this season, but it was the first true offensive action of his young career. Donelson ran for 58 yards on 12 carries. It was the most rushing yards by a true freshman running back for the Bulldogs since Ronnie Rivers and Jordan Mims in 2017.

DEFENSE NOTES

Stopped the run, stopped pretty much everything

The Bulldog defense knew it had its work cutout for it against a New Mexico State team that liked to run the ball. Fresno State proved to have prepared appropriately as it held New Mexico State to just 77 net yards rushing. The Bulldogs kept the Aggies from doing much of anything, holding them to 138 yards of total offense in the game. It was the least amount of yards allowed by the Bulldogs since 2021.

Fresno State earned its first shutout in nearly a year to the day (364 days). It was the fourth-straight season with a shutout victory, and the first at home since 2022.

- Fresno State played a total of 31 players on the defensive side of the ball in the shutout victory over New Mexico State.

Cam (LOCK)ridge

The return of cornerback Cam Lockridge has been an exciting one to witness. The senior, who missed a majority of the 2023 season due to injury, has had quite the start to the 2024 season. In just three games, he has had three interceptions, one fumble recovery, one forced fumble and a plethora of tackles and passes defended. The spark in Lockridge is back, and he is playing to reach his goals.

Has an eye for the ball

Lockridge's three interceptions put him second in the FBS standings through four weeks of the 2024 season. With two last weekend against New Mexico State, the Tampa native is one of nine players around the FBS to have two INTs in a game so far in 2024. The two are the most around the country.

More notably, Lockridge's long career has paid off as he stands at the top of the FBS' active career leaders list with 12 interceptions. When asked about that feeling, his response was "where's 13?" And that is Cam Lockridge in a nutshell.

- Of his 12 career interceptions, nine have been at Fresno State and three at Hawai'i.
- In Fresno State's record book, 11 career interceptions would get Lockridge into the Top 10 all-time list. He would be the first player to join the Top 10 since Derron Smith in 2014. Lockridge would join the Top 10 with significantly fewer games as a Bulldog than the others in the mix.

Continuing to contribute

As the weeks go on, USC transfer defensive end Korey Foreman has found new ways to contribute for the defense. Last week was his best week in the Bulldog uniform, finishing with two tackles, 1.0 sack, 2.0 TFL, one forced fumble and a pass breakup.

Got to the QB

Fresno State's defense had five sacks in the shutout win over New Mexico State last weekend. It was the first time the Bulldogs had five sacks in a game since having the same in the shutout victory at Arizona State in 2023.

DE Korey Foreman led the team with 2.0 sacks, with one being a strip sack.

Young buck in the mix

The last two weeks, Fresno State has seen contributions from true freshman defensive lineman Auckland Asiata.

Last weekend, Asiata had two tackles with an assist on a sack. He added a tackle in his first career game against Sacramento State.

Safety talk

Senior Dean Clark is undoubtedly the leader of the safety group, playing the most snaps each week. Through the first three weeks of the season, Clark has nine tackles, one broken up pass and two quarterback hurries.

By the numbers, though, Clark is third in the safety room as Camryn Bracha leads the group and is second on the team with 15 tackles. Bracha adds two pass breakups, 1.5 TFL and one interception on the year.

Last week, senior Kosi Agina had his number called for his first start. Agina played in his 46th career game last Saturday, the third-most experienced player on the team but earned his first career start last weekend. Angina led the team against New Mexico State with six tackles and 0.5 TFL. On the year, Angina is fourth on the team and second in the safety room with 13 tackles. He also has a forced fumble and 0.5 TFL.

- Bracha and Agina are both local products of Fresno with Bracha from Clovis (Buchanan HS) and Agina from Fresno (Sanger HS)

## SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

### The Aussie

Many college football players in week one can say that they haven't played a college football game up to that point. However, not many college football players can say that they haven't even seen a college football game, or any football game, heading into their first start.

For Australian punter Clay Lawrence, he played in his first college football game inside the game's largest venue on the largest stage in Week One. Lawrence finished the game with seven punts for 295 yards. He averaged 42.1 yards per punt in his debut.

Lawrence has a background in Australian Rules Football, and kicked with ProKick Australia.

### Jalen Moss, welcome to the chat

Sophomore Jalen Moss is in a new role of return man this season, and it didn't take long for him to find his groove as he returned a punt return for 85 yards and a touchdown in Fresno State's win over Sacramento State. Moss had Fresno State's first punt return for a touchdown since 2022, and the 43rd in program history.

The young wide receiver has made plays for the Bulldogs on offense last year, and to start this season, but he is in a new role this season as a contributor on special teams. Moss, proving he is a versatile athlete, has 251 all-purpose yards on the season (6 rush, 154 receiving and 91 punt return).

He is one of 18 players with a punt return for a touchdown this season, and one of three from the Mountain West.

### Meet the kicker

As a true freshman walk-on in 2022, kicker Dylan Lynch was pushed into playing in place for an injured Abraham Montano. As we entered 2023, Lynch began to separate himself in the competition with Montano continuing to battle injuries. Lynch owned that starting kicker job, both in place kicking and kickoffs. He was named a semifinalist for the Lou Groza award, which recognizes the nation's top kicker. 2023 was the first time Fresno State had a kicker recognized as a semifinalist by the Lou Groza Award since Kody Kroening in 2016. Additional Bulldog semifinalists for the award since 2001 include Kevin Goessling, Clint Stitser, and Asen Asparuhov. Lynch was added to the award's preseason watch list in 2024.

The leg of Lynch was responsible for 112 points in 2023, the third-most in a season by a kicker in program history. His 24 field goals made are the fourth-most in a season in Mountain West history, and the second-most in Fresno State history. The native of Bakersfield, Calif., Lynch hit on 80 percent of his FG attempts as he went 24-of-30 on the year. He finished the year with a streak of five field goals made, but his longest streak throughout the season was eight consecutive made field goals over five games (Oct. 7-Nov. 11).

Lynch saw a career-long 52-yard field goal in the season opener at Purdue (Sept. 2), becoming the first Bulldog kicker to send one through from 50 yards out since 2017. Lynch hit his second from 50 yards out with a 50-yarder at Arizona State (Sept. 16) to become the first Bulldog kicker with multiple 50 yarders in a season since 2010.

Lynch tied the program record for the most field goals made in a game with five at Arizona State, it was the second-most made in a game in MW history. He had a program-record seven field goal attempts against the Sun Devils.

Tim Skipper joined the Bulldog staff for his second stint as a Bulldogs' coach on Dec. 23, 2021.

Skipper was named interim head coach on July 15, 2024 as Jeff Tedford announced he would be stepping down. The 2024 season is his third back on staff, serving as the linebackers coach and the assistant head coach in 2022 and 2023.

In 2023, Skipper was called upon to lead the Bulldogs as acting head coach for the Isleta New Mexico Bowl while Tedford temporarily stepped away to address health concerns. The former Bulldog student-athlete coached his alma mater to a 37-10 victory over New Mexico State in the bowl game, winning Fresno State's fifth-straight bowl game.

His linebackers corp was one of the more consistent on the defense in 2023 behind veterans Levelle Bailey and Malachi Langley. Bailey was a second team All-Mountain West selection in his final year playing in a Bulldog uniform.

Skipper played a role in keeping local talent home on the recruiting front, receiving commitments from linebackers Logan Studt (Buchanan) and Tytus Khajavi (Clovis West) from the Class of 2024. Studt was the No. 2 overall local recruit in the Class of 2024.

His first year back at Fresno State was a memorable one as Fresno State became the first program in FBS history to start the season 1-4, and finish with 10 wins. Fresno State ended the year on a nine-game winning streak, and won the 2022 Mountain West Championship and the Jimmy Kimmel LA Bowl.

Fresno State's defense was among the best in the conference in 2022, ranking No. 2 in scoring defense and No. 4 in total defense. A bulk of the defensive efforts came out of the linebackers room as Fresno State's leading tackler in 2022 was senior Levelle Bailey with 88 tackles. Bailey also added 5.5 tackles for loss, seven broken up passes, and one forced fumble. Third on the team in tackles was linebacker Malachi Langley who finished the season with 68 stops.

Bailey and Langley were both All-Mountain West honorable mention linebackers.

Skipper joined the Bulldog staff for his second stint as a Bulldogs' coach in transition from Central Michigan where he coached the linebackers from 2020-21. At CMU, he was elevated to the assistant head coach role in 2021 along with coaching the linebackers.

In 2020, Skipper led a linebacking unit that included standout Troy Brown, a first team All-Mid-American Conference honoree.

During his first six seasons at Fresno State, he coached running backs, linebackers and served as the defensive run coordinator.

The Bulldogs advanced to four bowl games during Skipper's first stint in Fresno, largely due to his development of all-conference linebackers Ben Jacobs and Travis Brown, and explosive running backs Ryan Mathews, Dwayne Wright, Lonyae Miller and Clifton Smith.

In 2008, Skipper's final season as the Bulldogs' running backs coach, three of his players turned in games of 150-plus yards, including Mathews, who ranked 10th in the country at the time of his October injury.

With Jim McElwain as offensive coordinator in 2007, Skipper's players averaged 4.7 yards per carry, and with 204.67 rushing yards per game, ranked No. 16 in the nation, helping the Bulldogs advance to the Humanitarian Bowl opposite Georgia Tech.

He has also had coaching stints at Florida, Colorado State, Sacramento State, UNLV and Western New Mexico.

Under Skipper, 11 players have been NFL draft picks. He has also coached up all-american and all-conference talent.

In 2014, he completed a Bill Walsh Minority Coaching Fellowship with the Miami Dolphins.

Skipper played his collegiate career at Fresno State. He was a four-year starter at Fresno State at middle linebacker from 1997-2000, he earned an appearance on both the 1999 and 2000 watch lists of the Butkus Award, presented annually to the nation's top linebacker. A two-year defensive captain and three-time All-WAC selection, he ranks second in school history with 418 career tackles, including 117 in his first campaign, when he earned freshman All-America recognition. Voted the team's most inspirational player as a senior in 2000.

He holds a bachelor's degree with a major in communications from Fresno State.

He comes from a family of coaches. His father, Jim, coached for four decades before his retirement in 2019. Tim's brother, Kelly, has been in the profession since 1989 and currently coaches running backs for the Buffalo Bills. Kelly was an All-American RB at Fresno State.

The Fresno State coaching staff is loaded with former Bulldog players and coaches, and years of experience in coaching at the college and professional level. Below are some notes about the staff:

- Six coaches on staff have previously coached at Fresno State at one point in their careers, including Skipper.
- All but two coach from the defensive side of the ball (Nelson and Watkins) coached together under Pat Hill in the late 90's.
- Notably, Kevin Coyle (DC) and John Baxter (ST) were all coordinators at Fresno State under Coach Hill.
- Defensive line coach Jethro Franklin coached the same group under legendary head coach Jim Sweeney.
- Four members of the coaching staff are Fresno State alums -- Tim Skipper (IHC), Jethro Franklin (DL), J.D. Williams (DB) and Matt Smith (OL).
- Since 1981, at least one member of the current coaching staff has been in the program as a player or a coach each season outside of the four years from 2012-15.
- Combined, the staff has over 200 years of collegiate coaching experience and 36 years of professional football coaching experience.

Additional staff notes:

- Outside of the full-time coaches, the Bulldogs have three former players assistant in quality control and graduate assistant positions on staff. As special teams quality control, 2022-23 Bulldog longsnapper Nick D'Ambra enters his first season on staff. As graduate assistants, Delvon Hardaway (offense) and Malik Forrester (defense) are new to staff this season. Hardaway was a Bulldog wide receiver from 2013-18 while Forrester was a Bulldog defensive lineman from 2016-17.
- Even the Bulldogs' recruiting staff has a Bulldog football alum on it as former safety L.J. Early is Director of Recruiting Operations. Early played for the Bulldogs from 2019-22.

**ANN ARBOR, Mich.** – Driving late, looking to cut its deficit at No. 9 Michigan to one score, a pick six ended Fresno State’s season opener. The Bulldogs fell 30-10 to the reigning national champions on Saturday night at Michigan Stadium.

The final score of the game wasn’t completely telling of the Bulldogs’ performance as Fresno State’s defense held Michigan to only 16 points through 54 minutes of play.

## HOW IT HAPPENED

Mikey Keene was intercepted on his second pass attempt of the game on a high ball off the hands of Chedon James. Five plays and 31 yards later, Michigan led 7-0 four minutes into the game.

Following the touchdown, Fresno State’s defense held Michigan to just 12 plays during its next four drives, the final three ending in an interception by Cam Lockridge at the 1-yard line, a stop on third-and-inches and a sack by Ezra Christensen on 3-and-11.

The Bulldogs turned the second of the three-and-outs into three points with a 41-yard field goal by Dylan Lynch with 7:35 remaining in the half. The Wolverines pushed their advantage back to seven at 10-3 with an 11-play drive which resulted in a 45-yard field goal for Dominic Zvada just before halftime.

Michigan’s lead stood at 16-3 with 12 minutes left in the game behind two more field goals from Zvada (53, 55). Fresno State answered in less than three minutes after Zvada’s 55-yarder, finding the end zone. Keene linked up with Raylen Sharpe for a pitch-and-catch outside the left hash and the newcomer used his legs to get the final 13 yards of the 19-yard score.

The Wolverines responded with a 7-play, 75-yard touchdown drive to extend their advantage back to 13 at 23-10 with 5:43 on the clock. The Bulldogs looked to answer right back, moving the ball to the Michigan 10-yard line following a plethora of Wolverine penalties, but on first-and-10, Keene was intercepted for the second time and saw it returned for an 86-yard touchdown by Will Johnson.

## UP NEXT

Fresno State will host Sacramento State next Saturday in its home opener. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. PT at Valley Children’s Stadium.

**FRESNO, Calif.** – With four different players finding the end zone, Fresno State defeated Sacramento State 46-30 in its home opener on Saturday night in front of a sold out crowd at Valley Children’s Stadium.

Mikey Keene threw for the third-most passing yards in his career with 358 yards on 24-of-35 attempts, throwing two touchdowns. Mac Dalena accounted for 235 of those yards, a career high for the senior wide receiver. He had a team-high seven receptions.

Tuasiva Nomura racked up a career-high 11 tackles, 2.5 for loss, on the defensive side of the ball to go along with a fumble recovery. The Bulldogs forced three turnovers on the night.

## HOW IT HAPPENED

Fresno State wasted no time, scoring on its first play of the game. Mikey Keene dropped back from his own 25-yard line, hitting Mac Dalena in stride over the top at the Sacramento State 36-yard line. The senior walked into the end zone. Fresno State converted the two-point conversion on a keeper by quarterback Jayden Mandal to go up 8-0 10 seconds into the game.

Three minutes later, a muffed punt by Jalen Moss set up the Hornets at the Bulldogs’ 19-yard line. Sacramento State managed just three yards, settling for a 34-yard field goal.

Following back-to-back three-and-outs, Moss went right on his second punt return of the night and found a crease to the sideline, racing in for a 85-yard score to put the Bulldogs up 15-3.

On the next play from scrimmage, Corey Foreman forced a fumble that Tuasivi Nomura jumped on at the 20-yard line. The turnover resulted in a 32-yard field goal for Dylan Lynch.

The Bulldogs made it 25-3 with 12:49 on the clock in the second. Malik Sherrod capped off an 8-play, 80-yard drive with a 2-yard touchdown run. Sacramento State got on the board again, but this time by touchdown following a 78-yard pass by Kaiden Bennett to make it a 25-10 game in favor of the Bulldogs. Fresno State got its second takeaway of the night off a forced fumble by Kosi Agina and the pickup by Cam Lockridge at the Fresno State seven-yard line. The Bulldogs quickly gave up possession as Keene threw an interception that would bring the defense back out to the field, but the defense responded just two plays later as Camryn Bracha picked off Bennett in the end zone.

Fresno State led 25-10 at halftime, but the Hornets scored on their first possession of the second half to cut the Bulldogs’ lead to 25-17 less than three minutes into the third quarter.

Fresno State extended its lead back to 15 with 3:32 remaining in the third quarter. A 13-play, 75-yard drive culminated in a fourth-and-1 touchdown pass to linebacker Tyler Mello, who was in as a fullback.That started a string of three-straight possessions with a touchdown. Sherrod scored his second of the night from one yard out and Joshua Wood ran in a 10-yard score that put the ‘Dogs up 46-23 with 8:06 left in the game.

Sacramento State added another score just over a minute later behind a three-play, 75-yard scoring drive.

**FRESNO, Calif. –** In front of a crowd of 39,079, Fresno State recorded its first shutout in 364 days, defeating New Mexico State 48-0 on Saturday night at Valley Children's Stadium. The Bulldogs held the Aggies to 138 total yards.

The Bulldogs' defense grabbed three interceptions and forced the Aggies to 12 drives of four plays or less. Cam Lockridge had two of Fresno State's interceptions.

Offensively, Mikey Keene was 12-of-22 passing for 221 yards and two touchdowns, with both going to Mac Dalena. The Bulldogs totaled 281 yards on the ground with 131 coming from Malik Sherrod. Joshua Wood rushed for two scores while Sherrod and Elijah Gilliam each had one.

## HOW IT HAPPENED

Fresno State opened the game scoring 14 points on its first four plays. On the second play from scrimmage, Mikey Keene connected with Mac Dalena for a 69-yard touchdown to open up the scoring with 12:04 on the clock.

Following a three-and-out, Elijah Gilliam rushed 10 yards up the middle but fumbled. Raylen Sharpe picked up the loose ball and ran 56 yards down to the 4-yard line. Gilliam finished the drive with a rush on the next play.

A minute into the second quarter, Fresno State started with the ball at its own 32-yard line. Six rushes later, Malik Sherrod was in the end zone from seven yards out. The running back set up his score with a 48-yard yard burst down the right sideline.

It didn't take long for the Bulldogs to regain possession as Cam Lockridge had two big plays on the Aggies' next drive. On the first play of the drive, Lockridge forced a fumble, but the ball was recovered by the Aggies. Two plays later, on third-and-7, Lockridge picked off a pass attempt to halt the momentum and give the Bulldogs back possession. The offense was unable to capitalize on that following possession.

With 6:35 remaining in the half, Fresno State got the ball back on its own 19. A 22-yard catch from Sharpe and a 32-yard run from Sherrod set the 'Dogs up at the 27-yard line. Four plays later, Keene lofted a 13-yard pass to Dalena in the back of the end zone to extend the lead to 28-0.

Fresno State tacked on a 36-yard field goal from Dylan Lynch with 59 seconds on the clock to take a 31-0 lead going into the half.

Receiving the opening kick of the second half, the Bulldogs scored on their first drive of the half. A 49-yard toss over the middle saw Jalen Moss come up with an acrobatic catch from his back at the NMSU 4-yard line. Three plays later, Joshua Wood rushed in from from a yard out.

Two plays later, Lockridge intercepted his second pass of the night. That led to a 40-yard field goal from Lynch.

After forcing a three-and-out, an 8-play, 45-yard drive ended in a 2-yard touchdown run from Wood with 5:15 remaining in the third. That was the fifth straight possession the Bulldogs scored.

The fourth quarter saw just two possessions by New Mexico State and one by the Bulldogs. As the Aggies strung together their longest drive of the night at 14 plays, approaching the red zone, Justin Houston intercepted a pass by the Aggies in the end zone to keep the shutout hopes alive.
