NO. 19 COUGARS HEAD TO NEW MEXICO FOR SATURDAY NIGHT MATCHUP

No. 19 Washington State opens a two-game road stretch with a Saturday night matchup at New Mexico. Kickoff is set for 6:30 p.m. (PT) on Fox Sports 1.

ABOUT WASHINGTON STATE

Washington State enters the week ranked No. 19 in the Associated Press with a 8-1 record for the first their best start since 2018 and are bowl eligible for the eighth time in the last nine seasons. The Cougars own the nation's eighth-best scoring offense (39.3) while the defense is No. 20 in the country with 17 takeaways. Quarterback John Mateer is fifth in the country in total offense (329.1), sixth in passing touchdowns (22) and cornerback Ethan O'Connor is No. 22 in the country with three interceptions. Head coach Jake Dickert owns a 23-17 career record and is in his third full season.

SERIES HISTORY

Washington State has won the previous two meetings with New Mexico, winning 23-13 in a 2003 meeting in Pullman and a 2004 contest 21-17 in Albuquerque. WSU last played in Albuquerque in the 2013 New Mexico Bowl, a 48-45 defeat to Colorado State.

COLLEGE GAMEDAY RECORD

Dating back to the 2003 season, ESPN College GameDay has had the WSU flag appear throughout the show. The streak reached 314 last week at Alabama - LSU. The first appearance came in Austin, Texas (10/4/03) and the streak began two weeks later in Madison, Wisc. (10/18/03). Two flags - Ol' Crimson and Gray - have been flown in the background of the GameDay set. The Gray flag was added in 2014 after Whitey was retired in honor of Steve Gleason's "No White Flags." Appearance No. 217 was its first in Pullman (10/20/18), a 34-20 win over Oregon.

Cougar football broadcasts begin two hours before kickoff, carry through the game and conclude with post-game coach and player interviews and the Coug Talk call-in show.

MATEER PUTTING UP BIG DUAL THREAT NUMBERS (PAGES 8-9)

- In 1st career start, threw for 352 yards and 5 TD, rushed for 55 yards including 40-yard TD run
- Mateer's 6 total TD vs. Portland State were most by a Cougar QB in 1st start in program history
- Mateer's 5 TD passes vs. Portland State matched the WSU record for TD passes in a first start - Luke Falk, 2014 at Oregon State; Anthony Gordon, 2019, New Mexico State
- Mateer's 197 rushing yards against Texas Tech week 2 was a WSU record for QB rushing yards - 1st 100-yard game by a Cougar QB since 1987 (105, Timm Rosenbach vs. Oregon) - 8th 100-yard rushing game by a Cougar quarterback in program history
- Mateer had 2 rush TD and 1 pass TD in Apple Cup win, rushed for 62 yards, 245 pass yards
- In the win over San Jose State, set career-highs with 26 completions and 390 pass yards - 1st Cougar QB in program history with 300 pass yards and 100 rushing yards in a game - 2nd 100-yard rushing game of the season (197, Texas Tech - 111, San Jose State) - Mateer's 501 yards of total offense are the 3rd-most by any player in the FBS this season
- Mateer went 22-of-27 for 295 yards and 3 TD in the win over Hawai'i, the 85.0 completion percentage was 4th-best in WSU single-game history
- Mateer completed 18-of-24 passes 179 yards and 4 TD, rushed for 1 TD in win over Utah State
- Mateer has 4 games of 5 TD responsible for this season - Portland State (6), San Jose State (5), at San Diego State (5), Utah State (5)
- Mateer had a rush TD and pass TD in 7 of the 9 games this season
- Mateer's 630 rush yards are the most by a Cougar QB in single-season history (482, Ty Paine, 1971)
- Mateer's 11 rush TD are tied for most rush TD by a Cougar QB in WSU single-season history (Samoa Samoa, 1980)
- **Mateer is the ONLY quarterback in the country with 20+ pass TD and 10+ rush TD (22 pass, 11 rush)** - Mateer is 2nd Cougar QB with 20 pass TD - 10 rush TD, Timm Rosenbach (1988, 24 pass, 10 rush)

WHAT A START FOR WAYSHAWN

True freshman running back Wayshawn Parker showed off his all-around game in his collegiate debut in the season-opening win over Portland State and has continued to produce big plays.

- In week one against Portland State, 8 carries, 96 rush yards, 54-yard TD run, 52-yard TD rec - 1st WSU true frosh with a rush TD and rec TD in his debut since 2018 (Max Borghi at Wyoming) - Parker's 54-yard rush TD is longest TD run since 2021 (Max Borghi, 2021, Utah State, 64 yds)
- In week two win over Texas Tech, rushed for 69 yards including 43-yard TD run - 1st WSU true freshman with TD in back-to-back games since 2018 (Borghi, Arizona, at Colorado)
- In win over San Jose State, made 1st career start, rushed 22 times for 76 yards, long of 20
- In win at Fresno State, started, carried 12 times for 63 yards, long of 22
- In win over Utah State, rushed for WSU freshman record 149 yards, 1st career 100-yard game
- Parker's 75-yard TD run vs Utah State was longest by a Coug since 2006 (80, Chris Ivory, Idaho)
- Owns 9 carries of 20+ yards, tied for most among all freshman nationally
- Parker's 31 missed tackles forced are 3rd-most by a freshmen running back nationally
- Parker owns 103 carries for 595 yards and 4 TD, 5th-most rush yards among freshman nationally

WILLIAMS NAMED TO BILETNIKOFF AWARD WATCH LIST

Cougar wideout Kyle Williams was named to the 2024 Biletnikoff Award Watch List prior to the season, the award annually recognizes the college football season's outstanding FBS receiver. The senior from Inglewood, Calif. has caught 42 passes for 691 yards and eight touchdowns.

- Williams had 4 catches for 141 yards and 2 TD (58, 59) in season-opening win over Portland State - 1st career multiple-TD game at WSU
- Williams only catch in the win over Texas Tech was a 21-yard TD, had 3 catches in Apple Cup win
- Williams had 8 catches for 138 yards and a TD in win over San Jose State
- Williams set season-highs with 9 catches and 142 receiving yards at Boise State - 3rd 100-yard game of the season, 10th of his career and 5th as a Coug - 141-Portland State, 138-San Jose State, 142-at Boise State
- Williams caught a career-high 3 TD in win over Utah State, 2nd career multiple-TD game
- Tied for 2nd nationally with 46 consecutive games catching a pass - Owns a catch in all 46 career games (1st 25 games at UNLV (2020-22))
- 5th among active FBS players with 67.4 career rec ypg
- Tied for 8th among active FBS players with 3,102 career rec yards
- 9th among active FBS players with 220 career receptions
- Tied for 10th among active FBS players with 23 career TD rec, 14 career TD rec at WSU

DEAN JANIKOWSKI NAMED TO WUERFFEL TROPHY WATCH LIST, MORE THAN A KICK

Kicker Dean Janikowski was named to the 2024 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team and a Wuerffel Trophy Semifinalist, the AFCA and Wuerffel Foundation announced Tuesday. Janikowski is one of 11 FBS semifinalists up for College Football's premier award for community service and one of the most meaningful award in collegiate sports. The Allstate Wuerffel Trophy, announced later this year, is presented to one of the 11 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) players elected to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. This year's Allstate AFCA Good Works Team was selected from a record 178 nominees, representing players and coaches from colleges and universities across the country for their unwavering commitment to community service and their "good works" off the field. The Allstate Wuerffel Trophy is named after Danny Wuerffel, the 1996 Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback who parlayed his success on the football field into a lifetime of service. The Allstate Wuerffel Trophy embodies Wuerffel's commitment to being a humanitarian, while honoring student-athletes who are inspired to serve others and make positive impacts on society. In the classroom, Janikowski was named to 2023 Pac-12 Fall Academic Honor Roll with a 4.00 GPA while working towards his MBA and was a Campbell Trophy Semifinalist, give to the nation's best scholar athlete.

Off the field, Janikowski started a pledge called "More than a Kick" in 2021 where donations were made for each field goal and PAT by Janikowski and the donations go to helping children with cancer, in honor of his mom, Heather, who passed away from cancer. To date, More Than A Kick has raised over \$37,000. Janikowski later started the Heather Janikowski Foundation and began another event called "Kicking Cancer" with an annual goal of raising \$30,000 to support the Seattle Children's Hospital Cancer Research Center and those affect by cancer in the Pullman/Spokane area. The foundation has raised more than \$88,000 towards Kicking Cancer. Janikowski also donated \$2500 to former WSU basketball student-athlete Myles Rice, who was diagnosed with cancer and missed the entire 2022-23 season, he donated \$15,000 to Molly Rice, who was an art teacher in nearby Colfax, Wash. for over 20 years and made additional donations of 5K, \$10K and \$15K have been distributed to individuals in the Pullman community. Janikowski also organizes in hometown of Fallbrook "Do It For Her 5k" and "Monserate Memorial Hike," both raising money for Heather Janikowski Foundation.

On campus, at local Pullman church, Saint Thomas Moore Catholic Church, Janikowski helped run "Boot Camp" with current WSU football player Hudson Cedarland, which is a bible study with other members of the football team and in 2021 joined with then-teammates Liam Ryan and Abe Lucas (current member of Seattle Seahawks) in shoveling snow for elderly who were snowed in.

Mike Leach (football coach, 2012-19): Guided the Cougars to 55 victories in his eight seasons in Pullman, third-most in program history...was a two-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year and 2018 AFCA National Coach of the Year...is the only coach to lead WSU to six bowl games and in 2018, led WSU to a school-record 11 victories, a win in the Alamo Bowl and a No. 10 final national ranking...WSU led the nation in passing in four of his eight seasons, top 9 in all eight years...in his 21 seasons, compiled a 158-107 (.596) record, guided his teams to 19 bowl games and set school records for bowl appearances at both Texas Tech (10) and Washington State (6)...passed away at the age of 61 in 2022.

DeWayne Patterson (Football, 1990-1994): One of the leaders of the Palouse Posse defense of the early 1990's...finished his Cougar career with 154 tackles, and WSU records of 52.5 tackles-for-loss and 37.5 sacks, both of which remain school records following the 2024 season...senior year was named to Football News All-America First Team and Associated Press All-America Second Team...two-time All-Pac-10 Conference First Team selection...following WSU career, played three seasons in the Canadian Football League.

COUGS ADD JAMES MADISON TO COMPLETE 2025 SCHEDULE

Washington State added a road contest at James Madison University to complete its 2025 football schedule. The game at JMU is scheduled for Nov. 22, 2025, at Bridgeforth Stadium in Harrisonburg, Va, marking the first meeting between the two programs. The addition of James Madison finalizes WSU's 2025 football schedule, which includes six home games and six road contests. The 2025 schedule features contests against five autonomous five programs, a home-and-home series against Oregon State, first-time meetings against five opponents, opponents representing 10 different conferences and an Apple Cup matchup in Pullman. "We are thrilled to finalize our full football schedule for next season," said WSU Director of Athletics Anne McCoy. "The 2025 season includes contests against new opponents playing in Gesa Field, a September Apple Cup matchup in Pullman, as well as challenging road games against SEC and ACC opponents in Mississippi and Virginia. It's a schedule our fans will be excited for."

COUGS, BEAVS TO MEET TWICE IN 2025

Washington State added a road contest at Oregon State to its 2025 football schedule. The matchup has the Cougars and Beavers facing off in a home-and-home series during the 2025 campaign. The two teams will first meet Nov. 1, 2025 in Corvallis, followed by a previously scheduled contest at Gesa Field, Nov. 29, 2025. In the 108-game history of the rivalry, dating back to the first meeting in 1903, WSU leads the series 57-48-3. The 2025 schedule marks just the second time in series history the teams have met twice in the same season. In 1945, WSU won both contests, a 33-0 victory in Pullman Oct. 6 followed by a 13-6 win in Corvallis Nov. 17.

WASHINGTON STATE ADDS OLE MISS TO 2025 SCHEDULE

Washington State added the University of Mississippi to its 2025 football schedule. The contract is solely for the 2025 season. The game marks the first meeting between the two programs. The last Southeastern Conference school WSU has faced was at Auburn to open the 2013 season.

WSU, UW AGREE TO FIVE-YEAR CONTINUATION OF APPLE CUP

Washington State and Washington agreed in principle to a five-year continuation of the storied Apple Cup football series through at least 2028. This year's matchup took place week three at Lumen Field in Seattle, with the following four games alternating between the school's campuses: 2025 (Pullman), 2026 (Seattle), 2027 (Pullman) and 2028 (Seattle). The 2025 Boeing Apple Cup on September 20, 2025 at Gesa Field in Pullman.

INTERIM TAG REMOVED, ANNE MCCOY TO LEAD WASHINGTON STATE ATHLETICS

WSU President Kirk Schulz removed the interim tag and named Anne McCoy as the WSU Director of Athletics, it was announced June 25. McCoy, who spent the previous three months as Interim Director of Athletics, officially becomes the 15th person to lead Cougar Athletics and the first woman to hold the position. McCoy is no stranger to WSU, serving a variety of roles on the senior administrative team since arriving in 2001 as associate director of athletics for internal operations. McCoy, who was hired by former Cougar Athletic Director Jim Sterk, has risen within the athletic department. Most recently, she served as senior deputy director of athletics and senior woman administrator (SWA) before assuming the interim director of athletics title in March of this year. Throughout her time on WSU's senior leadership team, McCoy has been actively involved with all facets of the department, having a role in all head coaching hires since her arrival, including all current head coaches. McCoy has played a role in each area of Cougar Athletics during her tenure and served in a supervisory capacity for every WSU sport. Most recently, McCoy served as WSU's interim director of athletics since late March of 2024. In the span of three months in the interim role, McCoy secured the hiring of WSU Men's Basketball Head Coach David Riley, Head Swimming Coach Russ Whitaker and Head Women's Golf Coach Kevin Tucker, extending the contract of Women's Head Basketball Coach Kamie Ethridge, secured a home for baseball and women's swimming through affiliate membership with the Mountain West Conference for the 2024-25 and 2025-26 seasons, and was involved with the Pac-12 Conference' securing a media rights agreement with the CW Network and FOX for the 2024 football season.

WASHINGTON STATE ALUM CHRIS KING NAMED VOICE OF THE COUGS

WSU Athletics and Learfield's Washington State Sports Properties named Washington State alumnus Chris King as the new "Voice of the Cougs" in August. King, from Marysville, Wash., takes over play-by-play duties for Cougar Football, Men's Basketball and Baseball. King returns to Pullman — where he graduated from the Edward R. Murrow College of Communication in 2009 — after gaining 13 years of Division I broadcasting experience in neighboring Idaho. After two years announcing women's basketball at Boise State, King became the men's basketball broadcaster for the Idaho Vandals in 2013 before adding football broadcasting duties in 2021. In addition to his time calling college football and basketball, King also has extensive baseball experience, broadcasting Minor League Baseball for the Tri-City Dust Devils from 2012-2021. Away from the radio booth he has worked in a communications role with the West Coast League since 2016, most recently as the league's deputy commissioner. King has twice been honored as the Idaho Sportscaster of the Year (2017, 2023) by the National Sports Media Association for his work with the Vandals.

PULLMAN, Wash. – Redshirt-sophomore quarterback John Mateer threw for five touchdowns and 352 yards, and rushed for another score, as Washington State overcame an early deficit and cruised to a 70-30 win against the Portland State Vikings, Saturday, at Gesa Field in the season opener for both teams. “The biggest thing I told the team is the mission was to be 1-0, there was no score expectation, it was just to go out there and get the win and we did that,” WSU Head Coach Jake Dickert said. “We’re going to take a lot of positives from this game. We’re also going to take a critical eye on what we need to do to get better and be a team on the rise. Excited about the way we played. We had to respond in many different ways from special teams to offense to defense.” Playing under a Heat Advisory with temperature rising into the 90s, and even hotter on the field, the Vikings wilted under the relentless pressure from the Cougars after taking a 7-0 lead less than two minutes into the game. WSU scored seven first-half touchdowns, all 30 yards or longer. The blitz started when Mateer connected with Kris Hutson for a 30-yard touchdown pass to tie the game. A 39-yard TD pass from Mateer to Tre Shackelford put the Cougars up for good and Mateer closed out the first quarter with a 58-yard touchdown pass to Kyle Williams that put WSU up 22-7 after a successful two-point conversion. After a Vikings’ field goal, the Cougars returned to their big plays when freshman Wayshawn Parker scored on a 54-yard touchdown run, which was followed by a Mateer-to-Parker 52-yard touchdown connection. The defense got in the act when redshirt-junior Stephen Hall returned an interception 100 yards for a touchdown, the longest pick-six in program history. Mateer’s six total touchdowns were the most by a Cougar quarterback in their first start going back to at least 1976. He added 55 yards rushing, including a 40-yard touchdown run that capped the Cougars’ 49-point first-half scoring explosion. The Cougar offense rolled up 637 yards in total offense, including 224 yards rushing. Williams led a contingent of 10 WSU receivers who caught at least one pass with 141 yards. Parker rushed for 96 yards on eight carries. The 70 points scored by the Cougars tied for the sixth-most in program history and most since a 77-7 win over SW Louisiana in 1997.

TEXAS TECH AT WASHINGTON STATE

PULLMAN, Wash. – Quarterback John Mateer rushed for 197 yards and one touchdown, Wayshawn Parker burst 43 yards for a TD as part of a 14-point blitz in 16 seconds in the second quarter, and Washington State raced past Texas Tech 37-16 on Saturday night. Djouvensky Schlenbaker added a pair of short TD runs as the Cougars (2-0) dominated their highest-profile opponent to visit Pullman during this season of transition for Washington State. Texas Tech (1-1) was one of two Power Four opponents on the Cougars schedule. Mateer added one TD pass, but it was his legs that made the difference and he set a school record for yards rushing by a quarterback. Washington State finished with 301 yards rushing as a team, just the sixth time since 2000 the Cougars topped 300 yards on the ground and first since 2022. “They kept dropping eight on us so we just ran the ball and it was working,” Mateer said. “The (offensive) line was getting after it. They’re good. Like, straight up, the line’s very good.” The matchup of the two schools that were once coached by the late Mike Leach came on the weekend Leach was inducted into Washington State Athletics Hall of Fame. The schools each wore pirate themed stickers on the back of their helmets and Leach was recognized at halftime with the rest of the inductees. Leach would have loved the points on the board, although it wasn’t exactly a game of offensive efficiency. The first half alone featured interceptions thrown by quarterbacks for both teams, and Texas Tech turned the ball over on downs twice in its own territory and had a critical fumble. “I do know this, coach Leach would be really disappointed: ‘Why the hell are you running your starting quarterback?’” Washington State coach Jake Dickert joked. “I think a lot of things are possible for John.” Texas Tech QB Behren Morton threw for 323 yards and one TD on 58 attempts, but was intercepted twice. Texas Tech played without star running back Tahj Brooks a week after he rushed for 153 yards and a touchdown in the Red Raiders’ opening victory over Abilene Christian. The Red Raiders had a 20-yard double pass TD from Coy Eakin to Cam’Ron Valdez in the second quarter. Washington State took a 14-3 lead midway through the second quarter when Parker darted down the sideline for his long TD run. It came one play after Tech’s Jalin Conyers was stopped on fourth-and-1. On Tech’s next offensive play, Josh Kelly - who played last year for Washington State - was stripped by Buddah Al-Uqdah and returned the fumble to the 2. Schlenbaker immediately scored and Washington State’s lead was 21-3. “I told him before that we were going to get after him. I was going to get after him,” Al-Uqdah said. “And a few plays later I had my chance and I took full advantage of it.” The Cougars extended the lead in the final seconds of the first half after Morton was intercepted. Kyle Williams caught a deflected pass in the corner of the end zone to give Washington State a 27-10 lead at the break. Texas Tech: The Red Raiders were too sloppy for the caliber of opponent. It started on the opening kickoff, which the Cougars chipped short in a modified onside attempt and recovered. Throw in the two turnovers on downs and the Red Raiders gave the ball away five times in the first half. Washington State: Mateer was terrific on the ground but the pass game must improve to have a chance next week. Mateer was 9-of-19 passing for 115 yards.

2024 GAME RECAPS

WASHINGTON STATE VS. WASHINGTON

SEATTLE – The night before the strangest Apple Cup in recent memory was contested at a neutral site and as a non-conference meeting for the first time in more than 60 years, Kingston Fernandez was given a task. Washington State head coach Jake Dickert wanted cigars for the coaching staff to celebrate should the Cougars prevail. And he tasked his assistant director of operations with making sure they were on hand. “I texted him yesterday and said, ‘don’t tell any of the coaches, but be ready,’” Dickert said, with his celebratory cigar sitting on the table in front of him. The Apple Cup was reclaimed by Washington State on Saturday behind three total touchdowns from quarterback John Mateer and a late goal-line stand in a 24-19 win over rival Washington. Mateer ran for two scores and threw for another, and the Cougars stopped Washington on a fourth-and-goal running play from the 1 with 1:07 remaining to take home the Apple Cup trophy for just the third time since 2008. It will be housed on the third floor of the Washington State football complex. Dickert would like to keep it there permanently. “I think we might retire this trophy. I think it’s a Pac-12 trophy. I think that might stay in our place a long time and we’ll bring a new one next year,” Dickert said. The realignment chaos of the past year threatened to end the rivalry game with Washington now in the Big Ten and Washington State’s Pac-12 uncertainty. The Cougars did find some future security this week with news that the Pac-12 is starting to rebuild thanks to the addition of four schools in 2026. But winning the game felt more meaningful to the Cougars after being left out in the reshuffling of schools, conferences and allegiances. And while purple may have outnumbered crimson in the crowd for the game played at Lumen Field, the Cougars were the ones celebrating on the field at the end. “Coach kept saying we worked 9 1/2 months for this moment, just trust our preparation and everything,” Mateer said referencing last November’s 24-21 loss to the Huskies. “Looking back on those 9 1/2 months to come out here and perform, and it wasn’t our best, and we still got it done.” Mateer ran for touchdowns of 23 and 25 yards and threw a 16-yard touchdown to Josh Meredith in the third quarter that gave the Cougars (3-0) a 24-16 lead. Mateer finished 17 of 34 passing for 245 yards and added 62 yards rushing. The 25-yard touchdown run came on third-and-20 in the final seconds of the first half and was a significant momentum swing that gave the Cougars a 17-13 halftime lead. The TD capped a 91-yard touchdown drive and Washington State never trailed again. “End of the half and end of the game, we let up seven points on third-and-20 and we didn’t score on fourth-and-1 one the 1. That’s the story,” Washington coach Jedd Fisch said. The fourth-and-1 play Fisch referred to will be debated for a long time in Apple Cup lore. The Huskies reached the Washington State 10 and on third-and-goal, Denzel Boston was forced out at the 1, setting up the final play. Following a time out, the Huskies called an option play to the short-side of the field and Jonah Coleman had nowhere to go, getting stopped for a 2-yard loss. “(Washington’s) not really a speed option team, for them to run that I was kind of surprised,” Washington State defensive lineman Andrew Edson said. “But, you know, we stopped it.” Coleman, who topped 100 yards rushing in the first two games of the season, was limited to 75 yards on 14 carries. Will Rogers threw for 314 yards and a touchdown for Washington (2-1) and Giles Jackson had eight catches for 162 yards, including a 31-yard TD in the first quarter. But the Huskies were forced to settle for field goals on three trips inside the Washington State 25 and that proved the difference. “It’s never fun losing, especially to a rival, and just kind of feeling the pressure of the success some of my other teammates have had,” Rogers said. “I want to win, that’s all I really care about.” The takeaway Washington State: The Cougars will lament some of their fourth-quarter execution on offense. Mateer threw one interception, nearly threw another, and the Cougars threw incomplete on third-and-10 with 3:46 left. Not only did Washington State not get a first down, but the clock stopped. Washington: After being fairly clean with penalties the first two games, Washington’s discipline was awful. The Huskies were called for 16 penalties — third-most in school history — for 135 yards. Several were critical calls that kept drives alive for the Cougars.

SAN JOSE STATE AT WASHINGTON STATE

PULLMAN, Wash. – Redshirt-sophomore quarterback John Mateer accounted for 501 total yards and five touchdowns, as Washington State rallied from a 14-point fourth quarter deficit to defeat the San Jose State Spartans, 54-52 in two overtimes, Friday night, at Gesa Field. Washington State improved to 4-0 while San Jose State dropped to 3-1. “They found a way. That’s what player-driven teams do,” WSU Head Coach Jake Dickert said. “They never stopped believing tonight and I’m really proud of this football team.” In a game that featured a combined 1,118 total yards from both offenses, it was the Cougars’ defense that came up big in the end, stopping the Spartans’ two-point conversion attempt in the second overtime when Quinn Roff sacked quarterback Emmett Brown. After each team exchanged interceptions in the first overtime, Dylan Paine scored on a seven-yard touchdown run and Mateer ran in the two-point conversion, which was confirmed by replay review, to put the Cougars up 54-46. Brown connected with Nick Nash on a four-yard touchdown pass to pull the Spartans within two before the Cougars’ defensive stand. Down 24-17 at the half, San Jose scored 21 unanswered points in the third quarter to take a 38-24 lead into the fourth quarter. The Cougars responded with 19 unanswered points of their own to gain a 43-38 lead with 4:56 remaining in the game. The Spartans answered with an eight-play, 72-yard drive, capped by a 20-yard TD pass from Brown to TreyShun Hurry on fourth down. A successful two-point conversion gave San Jose a 46-43 lead with 26 seconds left in the game. Mateer engineered a four-play 40-yard drive that was capped by Dean Janikowski’s game-tying 52-yard field goal as time expired in regulation. Mateer threw for 390 yards and four touchdowns and ran for 111 yards and a touchdown, as the Cougars rolled up 627 yards of total offense.

WASHINGTON STATE AT NO. 25 BOISE STATE

BOISE, Ida. – Ashton Jeanty ran for 259 yards and four touchdowns as No. 25 Boise State surged past Washington State 45-24 on Saturday night. Playing its first game as a ranked team since 2020, Boise State (3-1) pulled away in the fourth quarter against its future Pac-12 Conference rival. Washington State (4-1) had no answer for Jeanty - and no ground game of its own. Jeanty, who entered the game leading the nation in rushing yards per game with 195.3, wasted little time piling up the yards. On Boise State's fifth play from scrimmage, he broke four tackles around the line of scrimmage before outracing the rest of the defense on a 64-yard TD run. He finished with 26 carries and had a 7-yard reception. The Cougars responded with a quick strike of theirs own when quarterback John Mateer needed only three plays to go 65 yards, firing a 14-yard TD pass to Cooper Mathers. Jeanty added a 14-yard touchdown run late in the second quarter to give the Broncos a 17-10 halftime lead. Despite stifling Boise State's offense early in the second half, Washington State coach Jake Dickert gambled on a fourth-and-inches from his own 27 late in the third quarter. But Boise State's defense stiffened, denying Mateer the half-yard he needed. Three plays later, Maddux Madsen hit Lauter on a 22-yard scoring strike to push Boise State's lead to 24-10 with 1:22 left in the third quarter. Then, after another Washington State touchdown halved the deficit, Jeanty ripped off another electrifying run, this time racing 59 yards by breaking three tackles and eluding another on the goal line to dive in for the score. Mateer threw for 327 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Wayshawn Parker led Washington State in rushing with 35 yards. Madsen threw for 184 yards and two touchdowns for Boise State. **THE TAKEAWAY** Boise State: The Broncos appear to be in the driver's seat for a playoff bid among the Group of 5 conferences-and on a collision course with Mountain West conference foe UNLV. The two teams clash on Oct. 25 and could meet again for the conference title with a playoff bid on the line. Washington State: The Cougars will use their off week to work on shoring up a porous defense that has given up 52 and 45 points, respectively, in their last two outings.

FRESNO, Calif. – Ethan Connor's 60-yard interception return for a touchdown gave Washington State a fourth-quarter comeback 25-17 victory at Fresno State Saturday evening. Fresno State held a 17-16 lead early in the fourth quarter before O'Connor's house call gave the Cougars a 22-17 lead with under seven minutes left. Dean Janikowski added a 23-yard field goal with 1:46 remaining for the eight-point advantage and the WSU defense turned the Bulldogs over on downs as time expired to give WSU their first 5-1 start since 2018. Cougar quarterback John Mateer rushed for 46 yards and a touchdown while freshman running back carried 12 times for 63 yards. Wideout Kris Hutson caught a team-high six passes for 45 yards and had a two-yard rushing touchdown. Janikowski connected on both field goal attempts, hitting from 34 yards out in the third quarter before his 23-yarder capped the scoring. Janikowski also averaged over 51 yards on three punts and kicked off six times. Defensively, Buddah Al-Uqdah made a team-high seven tackles while Kyle Thornton and Tyson Durant each added five with Durant adding an interception for the second straight game. Keith Brown and Khalil Laufau each recorded a sack for the defense who picked off a pair of passes, recorded a pair of sacks and held an opponent under 20 points for the third time this season. Washington State took the opening kickoff and capped the opening 75-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown run by Mateer and Hutson's two-yard rushing score on an end-around gave the Cougars the lead later in the first quarter. WSU nearly took a lead into halftime but FSU made a diving interception in the end zone right before the half to keep the Cougar lead 13-6 at the break. The Bulldogs took a 14-13 lead with a touchdown midway through the third quarter. Janikowski's first field goal allowed WSU to regain the lead but Fresno State's fourth-quarter 13-play drive was capped by a field goal for a 17-16 advantage. Minutes later, O'Connor stepped in front of a Bulldog pass attempt on the ensuing drive and raced 60 yards for the go-ahead score.

HAWAII AT WASHINGTON STATE

PULLMAN, Wash. – Redshirt-sophomore quarterback John Mateer accounted for 329 total yards and five touchdowns, and the Washington State defense forced three turnovers, as the Cougars cruised to a 42-10 Homecoming victory against the University of Hawai'i Rainbow Warriors, Saturday at Gesa Field. With the win, Washington State earned bowl eligibility improving its record to 6-1. Hawai'i dropped to 2-5. "We want to be more aggressive," WSU Head Coach Jake Dickert said. "After playing San Jose State and that run and shoot, we just came away saying 'we got to go attack,' then we came away with three sacks and three takeaways and a lot of them are effort plays. "Offense did a good job of taking those takeaways and turning them into points," Dickert added. "Great team football today." The Cougars, in their first home game since their 54-52 overtime victory against San Jose State, Sept. 20, rolled up 444 total yards. Mateer threw for 295 yards, connecting on 23 of 27 pass attempts, and three touchdowns. In addition, Mateer rushed for 34 yards and two touchdowns. As proficient as the Cougar offense was, the defense stymied Hawaii throughout the game, limiting the Rainbow Warriors to 300 total yards while recording three sacks and three turnovers that set up three of the Cougars' touchdowns. In addition, the WSU defense prevented Hawaii from converting a third or fourth down conversion in the game, 0-8 on third down and 0-1 on fourth. After a Hawai'i field goal on its opening possession, the Cougar offense answered with a 32-yard TD connection from Mateer to Carlos Hernandez to take a 7-3 lead in the first quarter. Two more Mateer touchdown passes followed in the second quarter, both set up by turnovers forced by the WSU defense. The first turnover occurred when Jamorri Colson stripped Hawaii receiver Nick Cernacle and Kapena Gushiken recovered the fumble. A nine-yard connection from Mateer to Cooper Mathers followed, extending the Cougars' lead to 14-3. Later in the second quarter, a Taariq Al-Uqdah interception set up the Cougars once again, and, once again, the offense took advantage when Mateer connected with Kris Hutson on a nine-yard touchdown pass to go into half with a 21-3 lead. Hawai'i opened the second half on a seven-play 75-yard drive, capped by a 17-yard touchdown pass from Brayden Schager to Tylan Hines to cut the deficit to 21-10. The Cougars erased any doubt by answering on their next possession with a 14-play, 75-yard drive, punctuated by a nine-yard touchdown run by Mateer. On the Rainbow Warriors' next possession, Parker McKenna sacked Schager forcing a fumble recovered by Bryson Lamb. WSU took advantage of the turnover when Mateer opened the fourth quarter with a 14-yard touchdown run and Leo Pulalasi scored on a three-yard touchdown run later in the fourth quarter to cap the game's scoring.

SAN DIEGO – Washington State used a pair of fourth-quarter touchdown drives to post a 29-26 road win over San Diego State at Snapdragon Stadium Saturday evening. WSU improved to 7-1 with their third fourth-quarter comeback win of the season to give them their best start since 2018. The Cougars trailed 26-14 early in the fourth quarter before John Mateer connected with Carlos Hernandez for a 34-yard touchdown and linebacker Buddah Al-Uqdah intercepted an Aztec pass inside WSU territory to set up the game-winning drive. Mateer capped a seven-play 63-yard drive with a two-yard rushing touchdown with 5:03 remaining and made it a three-point lead after catching the two-point conversion from wideout Kris Hutson. The Washington State defense forced a San Diego State punt with 2:19 remaining and the Cougar offense picked one first down before the Aztecs were called for roughing the punter with 22 seconds remaining, awarding WSU the game-sealing first down. The Cougars rushed for over 100 yards for the seventh time this season with Mateer rushing for a pair of scores, one and two yards, respectively. Mateer also threw for 257 yards including a pair of touchdowns, 26 yards to tight end Cooper Mathers and the fourth-quarter strike to Hernandez. The Cougar defense tallied season-highs of eight tackles-for-loss and four sacks including a career-high three from defensive tackle Ansel Din-Mbuh. Al-Uqdah's interception was WSU's 15th takeaway of the season, matching the 2023 total. The Cougars held a 14-12 lead at halftime but the Aztecs took a 19-14 lead midway through the third quarter after a WSU muffed punt. SDSU pushed their lead to 26-14 with an 11-play touchdown drive early in the fourth quarter before the Cougars began their comeback.

PULLMAN, Wash. — John Mateer threw four touchdown passes and ran for another score, Wayshawn Parker rushed for a career-best 149 yards on 11 carries and No. 20 Washington State rolled to a 49-28 victory over Utah State on Saturday night. Parker sprinted for a 75-yard touchdown and also plunged in from a yard out. Kyle Williams caught three TD tosses as the Cougars (8-1, No. 21 CFP) won their fourth straight game since a 45-24 loss at then-No. 25 Boise State. Mateer completed 18 of 24 passes for 179 yards without an interception and also ran for 55 yards on 13 attempts. Washington State racked up 303 yards on the ground and extended its best start to a season since 2018. “John is a tremendous player,” Williams said. “He has great potential and I feel like he’s going to be one of the best quarterbacks to play in college football. Seeing his growth through the first nine weeks has been amazing.” Derrick Jameson had a late 72-yard touchdown run for the Aggies (2-7). Spencer Petras was 28-of-45 passing for 208 yards and two scores with an interception. Herschel Turner ran for 85 yards on 16 carries. Parker became the first Washington State running back to eclipse 100 yards rushing in a game since Nakia Watson ran for 116 against Arizona State on Nov. 12, 2022. Much of Parker’s output came on his 75-yard touchdown run on the first play of the second half. “I’m really proud of him,” Mateer said. “He’s got a little burst when you let him break free.” Washington State took the lead on its first possession when Mateer connected with Williams, who shook a tackle and ran away with a 17-yard score. Utah State answered on its next drive when Jack Hestera caught a 3-yard pass before diving into the end zone to even the score at 7. The Cougars pulled back in front early in the second quarter with a 1-yard run from Parker, capping a drive that went 85 yards on 12 plays. Williams caught a 14-yard touchdown pass for a 21-7 lead going into halftime. Parker ran up the middle for 75 yards to open the second half and Mateer scored on a 1-yard run later in the third quarter. Utah State scored its first touchdown since the first quarter when Bryson Barnes surged into the end zone on a 2-yard run, making it 35-14 going into the fourth. Mateer threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to Williams early in the fourth. Petras responded with a 12-yard touchdown pass to Kyrese White that made it 42-21. In the final two minutes, the Cougars scored on a 3-yard pass from Mateer to Cooper Mathers, and the Aggies added another touchdown on a 72-yard run from Jameson. Williams, whose three touchdowns were a career high, led the Cougars in receiving yards with 55 on five receptions. Carlos Hernandez hauled in four passes for 42 yards. “When you have a dynamic offense, sometimes you’ve got to take your turn, and it was Kyle’s night,” said Washington State coach Jake Dickert. “Kris Hutson has had his night, and Carlos has made some big plays and Wayshawn, that’s part of being a mature offense.” Grant Page had seven receptions for 54 yards for Utah State. Takeaways Utah State: The Aggies couldn’t snap Washington State’s winning streak, but coach Nate Dreiling’s squad still posted four touchdowns and 395 yards. Washington State: Roughly half of Mateer’s touchdowns have come on the ground this season, but the sophomore quarterback did most of his damage through the air against the Aggies. Mateer still extended his streak to four games with a rushing touchdown.

Jake Dickert begins his third full season as the Cougars' Head Football Coach after being named to the position Nov. 27, 2021. Dickert became the 34th head football coach in program history.

The 2023 season began 4-0 under Dickert, including wins over nationally-ranked Wisconsin (#19) and Oregon State (#14). It marked the second-straight season Dickert led the Cougs to a win over the Badgers. A convincing 56-14 win over Colorado accounted for WSU's fifth win in a 5-7 season. Four of WSU's seven losses came by one possession. The Cougar defense continued its aggressive play from previous years as WSU led the nation in defensive touchdowns with five on the season, the third-most defensive scores dating back to the 1996 season. In 2023, WSU had five players named to All-Pac-12 teams, led by second-team edge Brennan Jackson. In the 2024 NFL Draft, three Cougars, all defensive players, were drafted, led by safety Jaden Hicks to Kansas City (4th round). Jackson (5th, Los Angeles Rams) and cornerback Chau Smith-Wade (5th, Carolina), were also selected, giving WSU its most draft picks in a season since the 2005 NFL Draft.

Dickert began the 2022 season, his first full year leading WSU, with three-straight wins, including a victory at No. 19 Wisconsin. The win was WSU's first in three meetings against the Badgers and WSU's first regular-season nonconference road win over a ranked team since 2003. The Cougars captured three of its final four games and reached a bowl game, the Jimmy Kimmel L.A. Bowl, for the seventh-straight season, then the second-longest current streak in the Pac-12. Under Dickert's leadership, WSU again was strong defensively, finishing in the top four of numerous Pac-12 categories, including second in Red Zone defense and tackles-for-loss, third in scoring defense and turnovers gained, and fourth in sacks. WSU also led the Pac-12 in Red Zone offense. In 2022, WSU had 10 All-Pac-12 players, including first-team linebacker and third-team All-American Daiyan Henley, while safety Jaden Hicks garnered third-Team Freshman All-America honors. Henley was selected in the third round of the NFL Draft by his hometown Los Angeles Chargers.

Dickert spent the final five games of the 2021 regular season serving as the Cougar's acting head coach, leading WSU to a 3-2 record with wins over Arizona State, Arizona and a dominating 40-13 Apple Cup victory in Seattle before WSU earned a trip to the Tony The Tiger

Sun Bowl. The Apple Cup win snapped a seven-game skid to Washington and was WSU's largest margin of victory in series history.

Under Dickert's leadership, the Cougar defense was a huge spark in 2021, leading the Pac-12 with 29 takeaways, fifth-most nationally, while also leading the Pac-12 and tied for ninth nationally in turnover margin. Last season, 14 players earned All-Pac-12 honors including first-team selections in right tackle Abraham Lucas, kicker Dean Janikowski and EDGE Ron Stone Jr. while punter Nick Haberer was named a Freshman All-American. In the 2022 NFL Draft, offensive lineman Abraham Lucas was selected in the second round by the Seattle Seahawks and cornerback Jaylen Watson went in the seventh round to the Kansas City Chiefs.

Entering the 2021 season, Dickert was in his second year as WSU's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. In his first season in Pullman, the Washington State defense produced four All-Pac-12 Conference selections including linebacker Jahad Woods, who was second on the team with 31 tackles and led the team with 4.5 tackles-for loss. The Cougars led the league with eight forced fumbles and was fourth in rush defense (154.8), a 30-yard improvement from the previous season.

Dickert arrived at WSU after working three seasons at the University of Wyoming (2017-19) including the 2019 campaign as the defensive coordinator while working with the linebackers and safeties.

In 2019, the Cowboys were sixth in the country in red zone defense, No. 11 in the country in rush defense (107.1) and scoring defense (17.8), No. 40 tackles-for-loss (83) and No. 43 in total defense. Dickert saw four Cowboys earned All-Mountain West Conference honors led by second-team All-American linebacker and Butkus Award Finalist Logan Wilson while redshirt-freshman defensive end Solomon Byrd was named a Freshman All-American by the Football Writers Association of America.

Dickert originally joined the Wyoming football staff in February, 2017 and coached the safeties for the 2017 and 2018 seasons before he was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2019 where he started the season coaching the linebackers and later coached the safeties. In his three seasons at Wyoming, Dickert coached a pair of future

NFL safeties including three-time first-team All-Mountain West Conference pick Andrew Wingard and saw four players earn All-MWC honors in 2019 while another earned 2019 Freshman All-America accolades on the defensive line.

In 2018, Wyoming's defense was among the best in the nation, finishing the season No. 19 in total defense (326.2), No. 25 in rushing defense (129.5), No. 28 in scoring defense (22.0) and No. 32 in pass defense (196.7). Dickert coached senior safeties Andrew Wingard and Marcus Epps as Wingard ended his career tied for the Mountain West Conference career tackle record with 454. Wingard earned First Team All-Mountain West honors for the third consecutive season after being named to the preseason watch lists for

the Chuck Bednarik, Bronko Nagurski and Jim Thorpe Awards in both 2017 and 2018. Epps concluded his career as the only three-time team captain in the modern era of Cowboy Football, recorded 325 career tackles and was a finalist for the 2018 Burlsworth Trophy, which is awarded to the nation's most outstanding player who began his career as a walk-on. Epps was selected in the sixth round of the 2019 NFL Draft by the Minnesota Vikings where he played in seven games before playing in eight more with the Philadelphia Eagles. Wingard played in the 2019 East-West Shrine Game, was invited to the 2019 NFL Draft Combine and signed a free-agent contract with the Jacksonville Jaguars where he played all 16 games and made two starts as a rookie.

In his first season at Wyoming, Dickert help the 2017 Cowboy defense become one of the best groups in the country as they led the country in takeaways (38), ranked ninth in scoring defense (17.5), were first in fumbles recovered (18), second in interceptions (20), eighth in defensive touchdowns scored (4 TD), No. 13 in pass defense (174.9) and No. 23 in total defense (335.2). Dickert coached first-team All-Mountain West strong safety Wingard while the safety tandem of Wingard and Epps led the Pokes in interceptions in 2017, with five and four interceptions, respectively.

Before arriving at Wyoming, Dickert spent the 2016 season as the safeties coach and co-special teams coordinator at South Dakota State. Earlier in his career, Dickert was a part of Bohl's coaching staff at North Dakota State from 2008-10.

In his one season on the South Dakota State coaching staff, Dickert helped guide the Jackrabbits to the 2016 Missouri Valley Football Conference Championship and a No. 8 seed in the 2016 NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Playoffs, where they advanced to the FCS National Quarterfinals.

As defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Minnesota State, Mankato for the

2014 and 2015 seasons Dickert was part of a coaching staff that led the Mavericks to back-to-back Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) championships and consecutive NCAA Division II Playoff berths, earning their way to the 2014 National Championship Game. Minnesota State posted a combined record of 24-3 over that two-year span. Dickert's 2014 defense ranked second in the nation in scoring defense (12.9), fourth in turnovers gained, No. 12 in pass defense efficiency and No. 15 in total defense. In 2015, the Mavericks ranked fifth in the nation in scoring defense (16.1), third in rushing defense, seventh in pass defense efficiency and sixth in total defense. He coached 16 All-Conference players, three First Team All-Americans and a two-time Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference Defensive Player of the Year.

In his first season as a college defensive coordinator in 2013 at Augustana, Dickert's defense ranked No. 20 in the nation at the NCAA Division II level in scoring defense, giving up only 19.5 ppg. Augustana ranked second in the NSIC in pass defense, third in rushing defense and third in total defense. He coached five All-Conference players at Augustana.

In 2012, he served as the defensive backs coach at Southeast Missouri State. The Redhawks ranked No. 18 in the nation



in turnovers gained (25) and No. 23 in interceptions (13). Southeast Missouri State ranked No. 2 in the Ohio Valley Conference in pass defense. Dickert also coached a First Team All-Conference strong safety at Southeast Missouri.

Dickert spent the 2011 season as the special teams coordinator and defensive backs coach at South Dakota, where the Coyotes ranked second in the Great West Conference in fewest passing yards allowed and interceptions. He coached three all-conference performers while at South Dakota and his special teams units ranked in the Top 10 in the nation in punting average and net punting and had an individual rank in the Top 10 in punt return yards.

He joined the North Dakota State coaching staff in 2008 as a defensive graduate assistant on Bohl's staff. In 2009 and 2010, he was elevated to serve as safeties coach for the Bison. The 2010 NDSU team advanced to the FCS National Quarterfinals. Dickert began his college coaching career in 2007 as a defensive graduate assistant at his alma mater, Wisconsin-Stevens Point.

He played football at Wisconsin-Stevens Point from 2002-06 where he earned All-Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) honors as a wide receiver his senior season of 2006 and was named his team's Wide Receiver of the Year both his junior and senior seasons. Dickert earned his bachelor's degree in secondary math education from Wisconsin-Stevens Point in 2007, and completed his master's degree in general education, also from UW-Stevens Point in 2009.

Dickert and his wife, Candice, have three children, daughter Rylee and sons Jett and Jace.

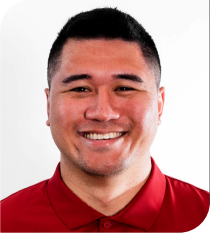

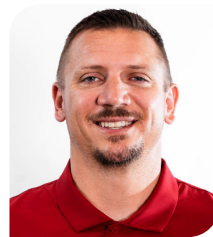
