New Mexico Weekly Press Conference

The New Mexico Weekly Press Conference will take place on Mondays (which is a change from Tuesday) and Coach Bronco Mendenhall will meet with the media for about 30 minutes or so starting at noon.

Mendenhall Interview Opportunities

During the week, Mendenhall will be available on Mondays at his press conference, and then after games. After home games he will meet the media in the New Mexico Mutual Champions Training Center.

New Mexico Player Interview Opportunities

All player interviews must be arranged through the UNM athletics communications office. For the season, players are available after practice on Monday and Tuesday.

Postgame: The UNM locker room is closed. Requested players will be brought to the New Mexico Mutual Champions Training Center and outside the locker room for road games.

Game Credentials

Visiting team media should request single-game credentials through their team's media relations office. Media passes work as parking passes for the Baseball South lots.

Media members not associated directly with a team can email requests via our media request link, which is located near the top of the football page on GoLobos.com under "Credential Request Form".

For media members picking up credentials at will call without parking passes, it is located in the Northeast corner of the stadium by Gate 7 or 8. With parking passes credentials will be located at the University Drive entrance to the Baseball South lot with the parking attendant.

Parking

Media parking is located across and just south of the stadium off University Drive. Media members can park in the Baseball East lot which is located next to University Drive.

Visiting Radio

The visiting radio booth is located on the fourth level of the main press box, next to the main media area.

### Didn't Play, Moved to Four

The Lobos were off on Saturday, but not playing actually moved the team up two spots to fourth in total offense at 484.5 yards per game. In fact, UNM also ranks sixth nationally in rushing offense and UNM is second nationally in fewest sacks allowed with five.

In that category, UNM is behind only Army, a team that has only attempted 78 passes and has been sacked four times this season.

### Fewer, Not Less Than

As an English major, it feels important to note that UNM has won back-to-back games when scoring fewer than 50 points. You use fewer if you are using a definitive number (such as 50 points), and you would use less than when talking about a non-quantifiable number (such as UNM is 1-3 when its first down total is less than its opponents). While it's going to be tough for UNM to break the all-time record of 36.69 points per game, UNM would need 105 points over the next two games (or 69 points if it plays just one).

### Hey They Broke 500 Again

The Lobos for the fourth time this season broke the 500-yard mark in a game, totaling 534 yards in 74 plays. The Lobos burst through the 5,000 yard mark for the season, and now they have a legit shot with a bowl game of being the first Lobo team to break 6,000 yards. UNM's single season record is 5,939 yards, and UNM is 609 yards away from that total, which was in a 13-game season. The 12-game record is 5,664, meaning UNM is just 334 yards from that mark.

### You Better Score Early...

Remember about a month ago when the questions to Bronco Mendenhall were about allowing three 20+ point fourth quarters? That's not a question any more. Against New Mexico State, the Lobos allowed 23 points in the fourth quarter, 21 to Montana State in the fourth and 20 to Air Force in the fourth.

But, in the last four games, the Lobos defense is allowing an average of 4.25 points in the second half. After allowing none to Colorado State, the defense allowed just seven to Wyoming (there was a pick-six against UNM which doesn't go against the defense), against San Diego State, the only second half points were a field goal, and Washington State scored one touchdown.

### Red Zone Offense is Great, but What About the Other 80 Yards (The Silver Zone????)

New Mexico's red zone offense has been very good all season long, scoring 39 times in 43 trips (and one of those non-scoring trips was against San Diego State when it took a knee). UNM's scoring is 90.7% which is tied for 22nd in the nation and third in the Mountain West, and UNM's 29 red zone touchdowns is tied for 38th nationally.

But, if the 20-yard line and in is the red zone, emblematic of the scoring zone, what are the other 80 yards? For UNM, that's the silver zone, and that might be as scary a scoring zone as the red zone, especially when running the ball. UNM has 29 red zone touchdowns, but outside of the red zone, the Lobo rushing attack is LETHAL. According to PFF, UNM has 16 rushing touchdowns 20+ yards this season, and that is the most in the FBS.

Amazingly, 15 of the 16 have come in the last seven games. Eli Sanders has eight of the touchdown runs (31, 35, 20, 34, 75, 51, 68, 26) and Devon Dampier has six of them (24, 24, 33, 40, 85, 33). Javen Jacobs (51) and Na'Quari Rogers each have one (29).

### The answer to the ultimate question of life, the universe, and everything

If you've ever watched *The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy* (and yes, I'm one of those who would say read the book ... it's so much better, and you should read more ... it's good for you), you know that the answer to the ultimate question of life, the universe and everything is the number 42.

That bodes well for UNM then. Beside the fact that the No. 42 is retired for the great Bobby Santiago, 42 represents the number of transfers into the Lobo program this season as Bronco Mendenhall and company needed to replenish and fortify, and better the roster.

The 42 is easily the most in Lobo history, bettering the 30 from last year. Where does the 42 stand for the school with the most transfers? We did the research, and for the second straight year, Colorado has the most transfers, this time with 44 but they are tied with Charlotte, and UNM is third with 42. When you couple the transfers with the 17 freshmen, UNM has 59 newcomers, and that total ranks 12th overall.

### First Time Since Stat

That's the number of years since a Lobo offensive lineman has been honored by the Mountain West with a weekly award. Lajuan Owens was named the Mountain West Freshman of the Week as an offensive lineman, and it marked the first time an offensive lineman was honored by the league since October 27, 2003 when Jason Lenzmeier was named the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week.

### They Were Just Keeping Up With the Head Coach

In the past coaching cycle, two different publications named Bronco Mendenhall either an A or A+ hire, or the best hire of the coaching cycle. 247 Sports graded all the coaching hires (doing so twice, as it had looked settled until Nick Saban retired, kicking off a chain of coaching moves that necessitated some new grades). That didn't matter as the only coach in the complete hiring cycle to get an A+ grade was the hire of Mendenhall. CBS Sports also gave out one A+ and it was for Mendenhall's hire.

Athlon Sports ranked the hire of Mendenhall as the best of the cycle with an A+, well, the players had something to shoot for grade wise. Now, UNM's grade report history goes back to 1988 (obviously there were grades before 1988, but as for good record-keeping of those grades? Whoever had them doesn't work here anymore), so over the course of the previous 75 semesters, the best the Lobo Football had every done collectively was a 3.05 in the Spring of 2023. The team had a 3.10 in the pass/fail COVID semester of the Spring of 2020.

What did the team do in the first semester under Bronco Mendenhall? They destroyed the old record. The team, a team with over 30 newcomers and transfers last semester AND still had players on scholarship that were in the transfer portal, recorded a 3.22 GPA. It marked the highest GPA in the history of the program, and it was a very quick tangible piece of evidence that it's a whole new era.

### Eight is Enough? Is it?

Bronco Mendenhall has been a head coach for 17 previous seasons, so that's a lot of players that he has coached. Well, it would only stand to reason that at least one of them would eventually be on his staff for year 18.

But eight?

Among the 10 full-time assistant coaches on staff for Mendenhall, eight were coached by Mendenhall in college.

The great eight are Jason Beck (BYU), Famika Anae (BYU), Kirk Garner (Virginia), Matt Johns (Virginia), Nick Howell (BYU), Shane Hunter (BYU), Jan Jorgensen (BYU) and Charles Mack (Virginia). Only Micah Simon and Donte Wilkins were not coached in college at any point by Mendenhall.

It got us (and Bronco) wondering if that was the most in the country. It's not even close.

The only school with even FOUR assistant coaches that played at one time for the head coach is Iowa, as Kirk Ferentz has coached four of his players. Utah is close, but of their four players, two played under Kyle Whittingham when he was an assistant coach at Utah.

It should be noted that UNM's total doesn't include guys like Director of Operations Joe Spaziani or Director of Scouting Evan Butts or several of UNM's graduate assistants. Counting those guys, Mendenhall has coached 14 of his staff members.

### Rodriguez On Pace To Set a Record ... But Not That One...

Look, I have spent the last three years posting about how Aaron Rodriguez was on a ridiculous pace punting the ball, which let's face it he led the nation as a sophomore in 2021 with 81 punts in the regular season, and then did it again as a junior in 2022, again with 81 punts.

But the Lobos found an offense last year, and it was the nation's most improved in terms of yards per game, so Rodriguez didn't get quite the workout. This year, he has only punted five times in a game once, and it was in the last game against Washington State.

This year, after leading the nation in 2021 and 2022 in punts, has punted a grand total of 38 times. He is on pace for 42 punts on the year. The school record for fewest punts as a team is 37, but that was in the seven-game, COVID shortened 2020 season. Outside of that season, the fewest punts in a season is 41 in a 10-game season in 1962.

Rodriguez started his career at Missouri in 2019 and 2020, where he was not only a teammate of transfer Ishmael Az-Zahir, but both other those guys were teammates of current graduate assistant coach Tre'Vour Wallace-Simms.

Aaron, who went over the 10,000-yard mark becoming the fourth Lobo to do that, is still third on the career punting list at UNM.

### Total Football

If you ever watched Ted Lasso (and if you haven't seriously ... borrow an Apple password and watch it) you know that in season three they switch AFC Richmond to "Total Football". While it's sort of not known what "Total Football" actually is, in football there is a thing called "Total Offense", which combines passing yards per game and rushing yards per game ... that's total offense.

Devon Dampier is the Mountain West leader in total offense as the only player averaging over 300 yards a game. Dampier is averaging 329.0 yards per game of total offense, with 241.8 yards passing per game and 87.2 yards rushing per game. Among Group of 5 Group of 6 Group of 5 players, Dampier is second overall behind only Chandler Morris of North Texas as he is sixth nationally.

Dampier is on pace for 3,948 yards of total offense, which would break Stoney Case's school record of 3,649 yards set exactly 30 years ago in 1994. Dampier is 359 yards away from Case's record and he is third in school history. Additionally, he is eighth all-time among sophomores in Mountain West history.

Included in that was a season-opening 14-13 neutral site win over No. 3 Oklahoma State in Arlington, Texas. Once again the Cougars excelled on the field and in the classroom. Two more Cougars earned Academic All-America honors while quarterback Max Hall threw for 3,560 yards. Running back Harvey Unga rushed for 1,087 yards and tight end Dennis Pitta earned All-America honors as he broke the NCAA record for most career receiving yards by a tight end.

In 2010, Mendenhall took over as defensive coordinator after a 2-5 start and BYU won five of its final six games. That season culminated in a 52-24 thrashing of UTEP in the Gildan New Mexico Bowl, making Mendenhall a perfect 4-0 inside University Stadium.

Mendenhall led the Cougars into the uncharted territory of football independence from 2011-15, starting with another double-digit win season in 2011 as BYU went 10-3, winning a third-straight bowl game. The Cougars finished 22nd nationally in points allowed per game at 20.4, and BYU won nine of its last 10 including a come-from-behind win over Tulsa 27-24 in the Armed Forces Bowl. The Cougars finished the season ranked No. 25 in the Coaches Poll, giving BYU five seasons under Mendenhall in the final rankings.

The Cougars reeled off three straight 8-5 seasons under challenging schedules that saw BYU face off, and beat, the likes of No. 15 Texas (40-21 and 41-7), Boise State (37-20), Georgia Tech (38-20 and 41-17), Cal (42-35) and Washington State (30-6). BYU made it 10 straight seasons of bowl games as BYU earned bids to the Poinsettia Bowl in 2012, beating former conference foe San Diego State 23-6. BYU also faced off with Washington in the 2013 Fight Hunger Bowl and with Memphis in the 2014 Miami Beach Bowl.

In 2015, his final season with the Cougars, Mendenhall led BYU to a 9-3 record that included wins over No. 20 Boise State 35-24 and a season-opening win at Nebraska 33-28. The Cougars also won seven of their final eight games to finish off the regular season before facing Utah in the Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl.

After stepping down from BYU, Mendenhall took over the Virginia Cavaliers, who were suffering through four straight losing seasons. It took Mendenhall two seasons to get the Cavs back to a bowl game for the first time in six years as his 2017 team went 6-6 in the regular season, earning an invitation to the Military Bowl Presented by Northrop Grumman. He also continued to win games against ranked opponents, beating Boise State 42-23 in Boise, and he continued to win rivalry games, defeating North Carolina in "The South's Oldest Rivalry" for the first time in eight years.

Bronco Mendenhall, a 17-year veteran head coach who has twice turned around struggling programs, joined the Lobo Family on Dec. 6, 2023 when he was named the 33rd head football coach at The

University of New Mexico. The announcement was made by Vice President/Director of Athletics Eddie Nuñez. Mendenhall is no stranger to Albuquerque or The University of New Mexico, having served as defensive coordinator and associate head coach for the Lobos under Rocky Long from 1998-2002.

Mendenhall, 57, served as the head coach at former Mountain West rival BYU for 11 years and at Virginia for six, both times inheriting programs that were coming off a string of losing seasons and turning both into consistent winners.

After leaving UNM in 2002, Mendenhall spent two seasons as the defensive coordinator for BYU under Gary Crowton before being elevated to the head coaching position in 2005. In his first season at the helm of the Cougars, Mendenhall led BYU to a 6-6 record, returning BYU to a bowl game for the first time since 2001, losing 35-28 in the Las Vegas Bowl to California.

Mendenhall enamored himself to the Cougar fan base in that first season by returning the traditional "Y" to the team's helmets and more traditional uniforms. That opening season with BYU in 2005 would be his only non-winning season, as the Cougars reeled off double-digit wins four consecutive years from 2006-09, winning a pair of Mountain West titles as BYU would play in bowl games in all 11 of his seasons in Provo.

In 2006 and 2007, BYU went 11-2 each season and a perfect 8-0 in the Mountain West, finishing the 2006 season ranked No. 15 in the final AP Poll and No. 16 in the final Coaches Poll. In 2007, BYU finished 14th in both polls. The 2006 squad won its final 10 games including a 33-31 win over rival Utah to end a four-year winning streak for the Utes, a game in which BYU threw an 11-yard touchdown pass with no time left. Mendenhall was named Mountain West Coach of the Year as well as the Region 5 Coach of the Year by the AFCA.

In 2007, BYU again finished the season off with 10 consecutive wins, and by the time of season's end, it was the nation's longest winning streak. The Cougars again won the Las Vegas Bowl and this time they were able to exact some revenge with a 17-16 win over UCLA after the Bruins won the regular season matchup 27-17. The BYU defense finished 10th nationally, and overall BYU allowed 16 or fewer points in eight of the team's 13 games.

The 2008 Cougars again won double-digit games, going 10-3, and Mendenhall became the first Cougar coach to ever go unbeaten at home over three consecutive seasons. BYU opened the season 6-0 to run its winning streak to 16 straight, moving as high as No. 7 in the polls after a 21-3 win over New Mexico in Provo. BYU again played in the Las Vegas Bowl, and three Cougars earned Academic All-America honors, a program first.

His next two seasons saw Virginia go 8-5 in 2018 and 9-5 in 2019. The 2018 squad again won the "South's Oldest Rivalry" and Virginia picked up another ranked win, beating No. 16 Miami 16-13. Virginia was invited to the Belk Bowl, where Mendenhall's Cavs shut out South Carolina of the SEC 28-0.

In 2019, Virginia went 9-3 and won the ACC's Coastal Division with a 6-2 mark, playing Clemson for the ACC title. The Cavs went unbeaten at home and defeated Virginia Tech for the first time in 15 years, earning a New Year's Six Bowl appearance against Florida in the Capital One Orange Bowl. The Cavs finished the year ranked No. 25 in the final Coaches Poll, and defense was again a calling card as the Cavs had three players record double-digit TFLs.

Mendenhall navigated Virginia to a 5-5 mark over the abbreviated 2020 COVID season, passing up a bowl opportunity. The squad did pick up another ranked win with Virginia winning 44-41 over No. 13 North Carolina. In 2021, the Cavs went 6-6, finishing third nationally in total offense and 24th in scoring offense before Mendenhall stepped away from coaching. It marked the 16th time in 17

seasons as a head coach that his team was bowl eligible.

The Alpine, Utah native got his start in the coaching world at Oregon State as a graduate assistant after finishing a two-year playing career there as a defensive back in 1986 and 1987. His two years with Oregon State saw Mendenhall assist with the defensive line. He moved to the junior college ranks with the highly successful Snow College program, serving as the defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach in 1991 and 1992. He then spent two years at Northern Arizona (one as co-defensive coordinator) before returning to Oregon State in 1995 as a defensive line coach. In 1996, he served as the Beavers' defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach.

After a season at Louisiana Tech in 1997, he came to Albuquerque to serve as Rocky Long's first defensive coordinator, coaching five seasons from 1998-2002. UNM's defense excelled under Mendenhall, earning a quick reputation as a hard-nosed, hard-hitting unit led by safety Brian Urlacher, whom Mendenhall served as position coach for two seasons.

In his first seasons as defensive coordina-

tor, the Lobos had six players earn first team All-Mountain West honors and Brandon Ratcliff was co-Mountain West Freshman of the Year. Under Mendenhall, Urlacher was twice an All-American and Nick Speegle earned Freshman All-America honors as well.

Over his time with UNM, the Lobos improved from just three wins in 1998 to seven wins and an invitation to the Las Vegas Bowl in 2002. In the Lobos' 27-13 loss against UCLA in the Las Vegas Bowl, the Mendenhall-led defense held the Bruins to a season-low 167 yards.

Under Mendenhall, the Lobos led the Mountain West in rushing defense for three straight seasons. In 2001, New Mexico gave up just 87.4 yards per game over the season. In his final season in Albuquerque, Mendenhall led the Lobos to a top ranking against league opponents in total defense, allowing just 316.4 yards per game. The Lobos also led the MWC in sacks in the 2000 and 2002 seasons, totaling 46 and 38, respectively.

Mendenhall and his wife, Holly, have three sons, Raeder, Breaker and Cutter.

**ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.** --- Montana State outscored New Mexico 21-0 in the final quarter as the No. 4 FCS Bobcats defeated the Lobos. The Bobcats got the winning score on a 4-yard Scottre Humphrey run with 10 seconds left in the game. That score gave MSU its first lead of the game.

Until that fourth quarter, it was a stellar performance by the Lobos, which got two touchdowns by the offense and two by the defense to take a 31-14 lead. The Lobos scored twice on fumble recoveries, the first time that has happened in at least 50 years.

The Lobos got into Montana State territory on the opening possession but had to punt, but the defense ended up scoring first. On second down from midfield, Jayden Wilson sacked Tommy Mellott, who fumbled, and the ball bounced right to Christian Ellis, who raced 41 yards for his first career touchdown. Luke Drzewiecki added a 45-yard field goal later in the quarter and UNM led 10-0 at the break.

It was 17-0 after Devon Dampier hit Trace Bruckler for a 12-yard touchdown and just 1:15 into the second quarter UNM led 17-0. After that, Montana State started to get its offense in gear, and they got on the board with a 5-yard pass from Mellott to Rylan Schlepp. That was the first of five 75-yard touchdown drives for the Bobcats.

Mellott threw a second TD, this to an open Ty McCollouch to make it 17-14, but UNM answered as Dampier scored untouched from 24 yards out on a drive in which UNM never faced a third down. That made it 24-14, and it stayed that way into halftime.

UNM's only score in the second half came on the opening drive for Montana State when Gabe Lopez sacked Mellott and knocked the ball loose with Noah Avinger picking it up and scurrying 13 yards for a second defensive touchdown. That made it 31-14 and set up the fateful fourth quarter.

The Bobcats, after getting stopped by Ellis and Bobby Arnold III on the fourth-and-1 at the Lobo 25 in the third quarter, opened the fourth with a 15-yard run by Mellott.

UNM drove from its 25 to the Bobcat 23-yard line, but on third-and-5, Eli Sanders lost two yards and with the wind suddenly whipping to 40 miles per hour, Drzewiecki missed his second field goal of the game. In the end, UNM's defense got a stop as Ellis and Randolph Kpai got in Mellott's face and forced an incomplection from the Bobcat 42. UNM had the ball up 10 in MSU territory with just 6:15 to go.

However UNM couldn't kill much clock and on third down, Luke Wysong dropped an out-pattern that had the first down and a lot more, forcing UNM to punt. On the second play of the drive, Adam Jones went around the left end and raced 93 yards for the second-longest rushing touchdown in MSU history, and the second-longest one given up by UNM. That made it 31-28 with 4:35 left.

UNM again got the ball back, and picked up one first down, but another critical third-down drop, this by Caleb Medford, force a punt. A catch there would have forced MSU to use its final timeout with the two-minute warning and at worst-case gotten the ball back with under 30 seconds. Instead, a Rodriguez punt meant the Bobcats would start with 1:59 left at its 11.

The key plays on the drive were a pair of third-down conversions. The first was a broken play that went for 37 yards and put the Bobcats in field goal territory. The second came on third-and -6 from the Lobo 16 and set up MSU at the 4, where they took the lead on the next play.

**TUCSON, Ariz.** --- No. 21 Arizona scored two touchdowns in the opening 2:34 of the second half to give itself some breathing room and New Mexico couldn't ever quite close the gap as the Wildcats outlasted the Lobos 61-39 at Arizona Stadium. The loss dropped UNM to 0-2 on the year while Arizona started 1-0.

The loss spoiled a brilliant offensive day for UNM as Devon Dampier and Luke Wysong both had career days, but there was no stopping Terairoa McMillan, who had 10 catches for an Arizona record 304 yards and four touchdowns. The 304 yards were the most ever allowed by UNM, besting the 281 by Marshall Sperbeck of Boise State, who did that on 14 catches on November 14, 2015 in UNM's 31-24 win over the Broncos.

The Lobos went toe-to-toe with the Wildcats in the first half in what was a back-and-forth affair in the opening 30 minutes. Arizona scored on a 69-yard pass from Fafita to McMillan in what was the start of a career-day for him. However, UNM had an answer as Dampier led the Lobos right down the field, and two highlight reel catches by Luke Wysong, the last from 16 yards out tied the game at 7-7.

After Arizona responded with another Fafita to McMillan scoring strike, this from 17 yards, UNM again answered with Na'Quari Rogers scoring his first UNM touchdown on a short pass from Dampier. That made it 14-14 at the break. After the teams traded field goals at the start of the third, UNM got a stop when Noa Pola-Gates, who played terrific with two pass breakups, forced a tipped pass that Christian Ellis picked off. That led to a Dampier 13 yard touchdown run and a 24-17.

That lead was short-lived as Fafita had time and hit a crossing McMillan for his third touchdown of the half, this time going for a 78-yard catch and run for a 24-24 tie. A late 46-yard field goal by Tyler Loop gave the 'Cats a 27-24 lead at the break. The Wildcats opened the second half with the ball and on a third-and-1 from midfield, Quali Conley raced 51 yards for a touchdown and a 34-24 lead. The back-breaker came when a Dampier pass went off the hands of a Lobo receiver and into the waiting arms of Treydan Stukes. Arizona took that interception and turned it into six when McMillan caught his fourth TD on the next pass, this from 40 yards out for a 41-24 lead.

Dampier led UNM right back and got UNM within 10 with some nifty work. He hit Nic Trujillo to move the sticks on third down, and then eventually scored his second rushing touchdown when he faked a pitch and scored from seven yards out.

After another Conley TD made it 48-31, UNM was forced to punt, but Aaron Rodriguez' punt hit a Wildcat blocker and Hyrum Hatch, the long snapper, recovered for UNM. The Lobos couldn't capitalize on the short field and Conley eventually added his third TD to make it 55-31.

The Lobos stayed in the game with a 13-play, 75-yard touchdown drive with Dampier accounting for a fifth touchdown on the night, hitting Caleb Medford for a 9-yard score. UNM went for two and Dampier flipped the ball to Eli Sanders for a deuce and UNM was within two scores at 55-41. The Lobos didn't recover the onside kick and Arizona tacked on a late TD to account for the 61-39 final.

**AUBURN, Ala.** --- New Mexico threw a critical interception in the third quarter on a fourth-and-5 and UNM couldn't capitalize in the red zone in the first half and Auburn was able to outlast the Lobos 45-19 in a game that was playing in the rain for most of the game. Auburn pulled away after halftime in a game that was just 17-13 Tigers at the break.

UNM had four first half drives in the red zone but only got 13 points on a touchdown and two field goals. UNM opened the game with a 60-yard drive that led to a 33-yard Luke Drzewiecki field goal. UNM missed a shot at an early touchdown when Devon Dampier, who threw for a career-high 291 yards in the game, just missed a diving Luke Wysong in the end zone. It marked the second straight game in which Dampier threw for a career-high.

Auburn got a 66-yard kickoff return to the UNM 32, and the Tigers took nine plays to get into the end zone for a 7-3 lead. The Lobos answered right back with its lone touchdown drive of the opening half. A 3-yard Na'Quari Rogers touchdown was set up by a wild over-the-shoulder catch from Caleb Medford on a season-long 42-yard reception. The Lobos ran a version of the swinging gate and Justin Holaday ran the ball in for a two-point conversion, but a motion penalty negated that, so UNM was up 10-7.

Auburn eventually scored on its next two possessions for a 17-10 lead, sandwiched around a ricochet interception for the Tigers. UNM went down and got a second Drzewiecki field goal to make it 17-13, but could have had six as a long pass from Dampier to Jacobs was a little behind the running back, and he adjusted to make the catch but got caught from behind.

After a three-and-out, UNM again drove into the red zone, but Drzewiecki missed a 37-yard field goal in a driving rain storm as the game got sloppy due to the conditions.

After the break at 17-13 Auburn, the Tigers took the second half kickoff and went 75 yards in 10 plays with Hunter Brown tossing a 3-yard touchdown pass to Micah Riley. UNM drove the field but on fourth-and-5 from the 25-yard line, Bronco Mendenhall passed on a field goal and went for it, but a pass to Ryan Davis had its timing thrown off when he was clipped by a defender, and the pass was intercepted, eventually leading to a touchdown and a 31-13 lead.

The Lobos got back in it early in the fourth when Caleb Medford hauled in a four-yard touchdown pass from Dampier to make it 31-19, missing on a two-point conversion. Auburn then gave itself breathing room with a third straight second half touchdown after a long kickoff return to the UNM 43 set up a short field, with a third Hank Brown touchdown pass making it 38-19, and a fourth quarter TD after a missed fourth down conversion made it the final of 45-19.

UNM gained 448 yards on offense and allowed 503 but were hampered by a 16 penalties, third-most in school history, although they went for just 112 total.

**ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.** --- Fresno State took an early lead and never let UNM into the game, despite a solid effort, as the Bulldogs moved to 3-1 on the season and 1-0 in the Mountain West with a 31-10 victory over UNM, the seventh straight win in Albuquerque over UNM for the Bulldogs. The Lobos dropped to 0-4 and 0-1 in the Mountain West.

The Lobos head on the road next week to take on rival New Mexico State in Las Cruces.

UNM's defense opened the game with a three-and-out, forcing an early punt by the Bulldogs, but UNM coughed the ball up. On third down, Eli Sanders went around the end for a first down but the ball was punched out and recovered at the Lobo 39-yard line. The defense held tough, but Fresno State eventually scored on the 10th play of the drive on a 5-yard toss from Mikey Keene to Josiah Freeman, and then Fresno State ran the swinging gate for a two-point conversion for an 8-0 lead.

UNM then went right down the field, going 73 yards on 14 plays, but UNM couldn't punch it in on first-and-goal from the 10-yard line when on third down Devon Dampier's scramble only got to the three-yard line. Fresno State responded with a touchdown to go up 15-3, and eventually the Bulldogs went up 25-3 when a trick play halfback pass turned into a 26-yard touchdown with 1:24 to go in the half.

UNM started its next drive at the 7-yard line, but moved all the way down the field, scoring on a 5-yard Dampier to Trace Bruckler pass for a 25-10 deficit with six seconds left in the half. UNM then got the ball to start the third quarter, but couldn't move it. Eventually Fresno State kicked a field goal, and then UNM, down 28-10, got hurt with a pair of penalties.

First, a holding call nullified a 58-yard Dampier to Nic Trujillo score that would have made it 28-16 with the conversion pending in the third quarter. After that was marked off, UNM continued down the field and a Dampier scramble to the half-yard line was nullified by another holding penalty, and UNM had to settle for a second Luke Drzewiecki field goal.

After a stop, UNM in desperation mode down 28-13 went for a fourth-and-1 at its own 12-yard line and couldn't convert. Fresno State eventually punched that one in, somehow getting three first downs due to penalties, giving the Bulldogs a 35-13 lead.

After UNM got a 1-yard run by Javen Jacobs and then a two-point conversion run by backup quarterback James Laubstein, UNM looked to have recovered an onside kick, but Isaiah Chavez was called for being offside, although all replays showed otherwise. A second onside was almost recovered by UNM again, but Fresno State knocked it out of bounds, and Fresno State added a late field goal to close the scoring.

UNM outgained the Bulldogs 485 to 345, the 345 being the lowest output allowed by UNM this season.

LAS CRUCES, N.M. --- New Mexico rushed for seven touchdowns including a back-breaking 50-yard touchdown on an end-around by Javen Jacobs as the Lobos rolled to 579 yards of offense in taking the 114th meeting of the Rio Grande Rivalry, winning 50-40 over New Mexico State. The 50 points were the most by the Lobos in Aggie Memorial Stadium in 30 years.

The Lobos never trailed in the game, and were tied just once, at 7-7. UNM rushed for 331 yards in the game, it's most of the season, and never suffered an offensive play for a loss until Devon Dampier took two kneel-downs to end the game. The team's seven rushing touchdowns were rolled up by three players with three by Dampier, three by Na'Quari Rogers and one by Jacobs.

Rogers was the superstar with 122 yards rushing on just 21 carries with his career-best three touchdowns. Up 21-10, UNM opened the third quarter with a 75-yard drive that took just 3:01 with Dampier racing in from 24 yards out. UNM went for a two-point conversion and missed, keeping the game at 27-10. The Aggies answered with a touchdown to make it 27-17, but Luke Drzewiecki capped off a time-consuming driving with a short 20-yard field goal and UNM had a 30-17 lead at the end of three.

UNM then held on a first-and-goal, allowing just a short field goal to move the score to 30-20, but Na'Quari Rogers scored his second rushing touchdown of the day to make it 36-20. It stayed a two-score game when UNM missed the extra point. The Aggies scored but missed their own two-point conversion leaving it at 10 points, 36-26. After Nigel Williams recovered the onside kick, UNM faced a third-and-9 at midfield when Jacobs went around the end and outraced everyone for a clinching touchdown. The Aggies tacked on a touchdown on a quarterback scramble but Williams again recovered the onside kick, and again UNM ended up scoring as Rogers scored on the third play from 29 yards out with 1:46 to go, making it 50-33.

The Aggies ended the scoring with a 2-yard run on a drive that was aided by four penalties. UNM didn't need to recover the onside this time as it was kicked straight out of bounds, and Dampier knelt down twice for the win.

The Lobos took a 21-10 lead into the break when Dampier scored his second touchdown of the game with just 22 seconds left in the half. That capped a 67-yard drive, although UNM allowed a late long field goal by the Aggies to make it 21-10 at the break.

The Lobos pulled away in the second quarter when Dampier led UNM on a long 95-yard touchdown drive, capping that off with first of his three touchdowns. Dampier, who started the game just 6-for-15 passing, ended up 13-for-28 for 248 yards but his career-high three TDs led the way.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- New Mexico's offense rolled with five more rushing touchdowns, Luke Wysong had his second career punt return touchdown and the Lobos rolled to a second straight win, taking down Air Force 52-37 in a game that marked the first conference win at New Mexico for Bronco Mendenhall.

The Lobos overall rushed for 255 yards with Eli Sanders scoring two touchdowns on the ground, Devon Dampier scoring two and Sol-Jay Maiava-Peters getting one. Sanders scored on a pair of long runs, of 35 and 31 yards as he had a team-best 80 yards on just five carries. The 50 points by UNM in back-to-back games marked the first time UNM had done that in 108 years.

UNM's only drive in which they didn't score was the opening drive of the game in which UNM went three-and-out. Air Force went down the field after a 49-yard punt by Aaron Rodriguez, but on a third-and-5 from the Lobo 22, Christian Ellis and Bobby Arnold III tackled Tylor Latham for a four-yard loss forcing a field goal.

From there, UNM's offense was basically unstoppable. Dampier led a 75-yard touchdown drive, finishing it with a 7-yard touchdown run to make it 7-3 with 14 seconds left in the first quarter. On Air Force's next drive, Mose Tuitele sacked quarterback Quentin Hayes to force a punt, and Luke Freer outkicked his coverage with a 57-yard boot. Luke Wysong, returning his first punt of the season, took it at the Lobo 21, shook out of a tackle, got a great seal block from Max Lantzsch in his first game as a Lobo and he was off to the races for a 79-yard touchdown. That made it 14-3, and UNM really was never threatened after that.

The teams traded touchdowns for the rest of the second quarter, with Air Force scoring on a 5-yard Cade Harris run, but the Lobos quickly answered. After two Sol-Jay Maiava-Peters runs, Dampier hit Wysong for a 19-yard gain. Facing third down at the 18, Dampier hit Nic Trujillo for the freshman's first career touchdown, giving UNM a 21-10 lead. Air Force responded again on a short run set up by its first completion of the game, but UNM basically killed off the final 2:46 of the half, scoring a back-breaking touchdown with 11 seconds left.

On that drive, Dampier found Wysong twice, and then he combined with him on a lateral play for 16 yards. Eventually on first-and-goal with 14 seconds left, Dampier waltzed in from two yards out for his third touchdowns of the game, second rushing, and UNM had a 28-17 halftime lead.

On the first drive of the second half, Air Force went for it on fourth-and-1 from its 34 but Noah Avinger broke through for a tackle for loss, and UNM took over at the Falcon 32. Maiava-Peters entered at quarterback and rushed twice to convert the 32 yards for a 35-17 lead.

On its next drive, Air Force fumbled and Dimitri Johnson recovered, giving UNM the ball again in Air Force territory, and that led to a short Luke Drzewiecki field goal and a 38-17 lead. Eli Sanders then scored after another failed four down by Air Force for a 45-17 after three quarters.

The game was effectively over from there, although Air Force did put up 20 points in the final quarter. They got a little help when the only defensive penalty of the game continued a drive after a third-down stop. Overall, UNM seemingly solved its penalty issues, with just four on the day after a school record 17 in its last game.

Sanders completed the scoring for UNM with a second long touchdown run, giving UNM five rushing touchdowns one game after seven against New Mexico State.

**LOGAN, Utah** --- In a game in which both offenses combined for 1,055 and 95 points, it was the Lobo defense that came up with arguably the two biggest plays of the game, getting a fourth down stop with 2:18 to go leading to an Eli Sanders go ahead touchdown, and then Dimitri Johnson picked off Spencer Petras with 59 seconds left to give New Mexico a wild 50-45 victory in Logan. The win was UNM's third straight, its longest in-season winning streak in eight years, and it moved the Lobos to 3-4 overall and 2-1 in the Mountain West, good for fifth place in the 12-team league.

The Lobos overcame a 17-point first half deficit and a 16-point second half deficit. The 17-point comeback tied for the sixth-largest in school history, and it was the largest since a school-record 21-point comeback against UTEP on November 23, 1974. The 16-point second half deficit was the largest second half deficit overcome in school history.

It was keyed by a 21-point fourth quarter for New Mexico with the Lobos trailing 38-29. After forcing a three-and-out that followed a Devon Dampier interception at the 1-yard line, UNM set up shop at their own 49-yard line. UNM kept the ball on the ground and Eli Sanders did yeoman's work on the drive, carrying on five of the seven plays on the drive. He went around the end to cover the final 20 yards to make it 38-36. Utah State answered right back with a Herschel Turner 43-yard run for a score, and it was 45-36 with 7:43 left.

That's when UNM went to work again, twice converting long third downs and getting a fourth down conversion as well. The first was on third-and-10, a 14-yard gain to Luke Wysong. On fourth-and-6, Dampier went deep to Ryan Davis, and he somehow made the catch between two defenders for an incredible conversion. Dampier then hit Trace Bruckler for a 10-yard gain on third-and-9 from the 14 before Dampier finished it with a 5-yard run.

Up 45-43 with 3:53 to go, Utah State got three straight three-yard gains to set up fourth-and-1 from its own 34-yard line. Petras tried to keep it, but a host of Lobos including Devin Brandt-Epps and Garrison Walker made the stop for no gain giving UNM the ball.

The Lobos needed a first down to force Utah State to use all its timeouts, which it got on a 15-yard run by Dampier with a 1:40 to go. UNM then took the lead with 1:13 left when Eli Sanders was basically allowed to waltz into the end zone untouched. That gave UNM a 50-45 lead, and two plays later Johnson snagged a pass over the middle for a game-clinching interception.

Nothing went right for UNM in the opening quarter as the Lobos were outgained 169-31 in the first quarter as Utah State raced to a 14-0 lead after one. After an opening drive for UNM fizzled, the Lobos got a fourth down stop in Aggie territory, but a facemask penalty as they were riding the rusher out of bounds gave Utah State a fresh set of downs, and they made UNM pay.

Quarterback Spencer Petras rushed in from two yards out for a 7-0 lead, and after a three-and-out and short punt, the Aggies again went down the field, as Rahsul Faison scored from the 6-yard line. The Aggies then made it 17-0 on the first play of the second quarter on a 38-yard field goal by Tanner Cragun.

UNM finally got the break it needed when it punted and Aaron Rodriguez' 45-yard punt was fumbled and Noa Pola-Gates recovered at the Aggie 21-yard line. That led to a Devon Dampier to Javen Jacobs connection from the 21 and UNM trailed 17-6. The Lobos then run a trick play on the conversion to make it 17-8. After a long punt, UNM drove 90 yards in 10 plays with Dampier again finding the end zone, this time with Ryan Davis on the back-end of a 14-yard completion for a 17-15 deficit.

However, Utah State scored at the end of the half and on the opening drive of the second, to open up a 16-point lead in the third quarter.

**FORT COLLINS, Colo.** --- New Mexico's record-setting offense could never capitalize when it needed to, suffering from untimely penalties, a missed field goal and costly fumble inside the five-yard line and four turnovers overall as UNM's three-game winning streak ended at the hands of Colorado State, falling 17-6 in Fort Collins. It ran CSU's winning streak to 13 straight over UNM.

The Lobos dropped to 3-5 overall and 2-2 in the Mountain West and UNM hosts Wyoming at 2 pm at University Stadium on Saturday. Colorado State moved to 5-3 overall and 3-0 in the Mountain West. New Mexico was looking for its third straight road win, which would have been a first since 2007.

The loss dampened a terrific outing by the Lobo defense, which allowed just 10 points and just 334, it fewest allowed this year. The only touchdown came after a 30-yard Luke Drzewiecki field goal when Caleb Goodie hauled in a 46-yard touchdown pass from Brayden Fowler-Nicolosi, but that was the only offensive touchdown for Colorado State. The Lobo defense forced a punt on every drive of the second half until the Rams took a knee with under a minute left.

After a drive in which UNM looked like it was moving into the Colorado State down 7-3, Devon Dampier was called for an illegal forward pass, turning a 15-yard gain into a third-and-10. Dampier was then sacked and Aaron Rodriguez' ensuing punt was returned 82 yards for a touchdown by Kobe Johnson for a 14-3 lead. The Rams tacked on a 47-yard field goal at the end of the half.

From there, the Lobo defense came up with stop after stop, and UNM just could never cash in. On the opening drive of the second half, UNM moved right down the field to end up with third-and-goal at the 1-yard line, but a false start moved UNM back and Dampier fumbled on the next snap. After a three-and-out, UNM again was in Colorado State territory and convert a third-and-3 at the 34-yard line but a holding penalty moved UNM back, although it did eventually convert on fourth down. That drive ended in Drzewiecki's second field goal of the game, this from 44 to make it 17-6.

A second straight three-and-out gave UNM the ball, and again UNM moved into CSU territory. UNM took two shots to the end zone and from the 26, the Lobos ended up not scoring when Drzewiecki missed a 43-yard field goal. After a punt to the 1-yard line, the Lobos got to midfield before punting, and twice in the fourth quarter the Lobos drove into CSU territory but Dampier threw interceptions on both drives.

Penalties were both plentiful for UNM, but they were untimely, and almost exclusively on the offense. Driving for a potential score in the second quarter, a face mask on the offense moved them out of field goal range, and then on a 52-yard attempt for Drzewiecki, a substitution penalty moved UNM out of range. Overall UNM had 10 penalties with nine on offense and one on the field goal attempt.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- In a game where the two teams combined for 1,180 yards of offense, it was an interception return for a touchdown by Wyoming's Wrook Brown that set up a fourth quarter comeback to give the Cowboys a 49-45 win over New Mexico and deal the Lobos a blow to potential bowl hopes.

Wyoming moved to 2-7 overall and 2-3 in the Mountain West, and UNM is now 3-6 overall and 2-3 in the Mountain West. The Lobos must win the final three games to get bowl eligible. UNM plays at San Diego State on Friday night in San Diego.

After a wild first half in which there were 10 touchdowns and the game was even at 35, UNM built a 45-35 lead on a Luke Drzewiecki 30-yard field goal and then a dazzling 85-yard touchdown run by quarterback Devon Dampier, who cut right, broke a tackle and raced for the longest run ever by a UNM quarterback. That touchdown run came after a Noah Avinger interception at the Lobo 8-yard line that snuffed out a Wyoming drive and was another big play by the Lobo defense in the quarter. On the opening drive of the second half, UNM stopped Wyoming on a fourth-and-1, a play that led to the field goal drive and the UNM lead.

Wyoming drove to the Lobo 23 to open the fourth quarter, but that drive stalled and John Hoyland, who earlier in the game became the all-time leading scorer in Cowboy history, missed wide right from 40 yards. UNM took over with 13:02 to go at the 23, and a score could have put the game out of reach. Instead, it was Wyoming that scored. On the first play of the drive, Dampier threw towards Ryan Davis, but Wrook Davis stepped in front of it at the 29-yard line and raced untouched for a touchdown, and suddenly a Wyoming team that could do nothing in the second half was back within three at 45-42.

UNM got just one first down and had to punt, and the Cowboys drove 88 yards in 11 plays, overcoming a pass interference in the end zone. On second-and-goal after the pass interference moved the ball to the Lobo 27, Kaden Anderson, making his first start, hit Justin Stevenson for a 27-yard touchdown and a 49-45 lead.

UNM mounted a comeback attempt, moving the ball into Wyoming territory. Eli Sanders burst through the line to the Cowboy 27-yard line, but a holding call negated it and made it first-and-20. On third-and-14, Dampier was sacked from behind and fumbled, with Wyoming recovering. The Cowboys ran out the clock from there.

The opening half was wild with 717 yards and 70 combined points. UNM opened the scoring with a 10-yard touchdown from Dampier to Ryan Davis, but UNM's two-point conversion failed. Eli Sanders had a 34-yard touchdown run to answer a Wyoming score, but the Cowboys another touchdown pass and a rushing touchdown by Anderson. Dampier answered with an 18-yard score, and then UNM's Trace Bruckler scored his third rushing two-pointer of the season.

The teams traded touchdowns going into halftime, with Dampier scoring from 40 yards out and Sanders from 75 yards out.

SAN DIEGO, Calif. --- Ryan Davis made a one-handed catch in the end zone for the go-ahead score with 13:07 left, and Randolph Kpai led UNM's best defensive effort of the year with 15 tackles, two PBU's, a sack, a TFL and a QB hurry as UNM allowed just 341 yards to San Diego State as the Lobos stayed alive for bowl eligibility with a 21-16 win over the Aztecs in a Friday night prime time contest at Snapdragon Stadium.

The Lobos improved to 4-6 and 3-3 in the Mountain West while San Diego State dropped to 3-6 and 2-2 in conference play. The win was UNM's third road win of the season, giving UNM three away from home for the first time since winning three road games in 2014. The Lobos also now have three Mountain West wins, equalling the number of Mountain West wins over the previous three seasons combined (3-21).

The Lobo defense allowed just one touchdown despite 88 total plays against them, including 19 plays inside the red zone and 15 plays in an end-goal situation. UNM had a season-high tying eight TFLs and six pass breakups in allowing just 341 total yards and forcing five punts.

The winning score capped a nine play, 65-yard drive that was helped at the start by a face mask penalty on a tackle of Devon Dampier. Dampier converted a third-and-4 from the 30 with a 10-yard run, giving UNM its first play in the red zone of the game. After a short pass to Luke Wysong and another Dampier first down run, he hit Ryan Davis in the end zone. The pass was a little behind Davis but he snagged it with one hand and then secured it with both for the lead that UNM would never relinquish.

The Aztecs on their next drive twice converted third downs to move into UNM territory. After a 9-yard gain to give the Aztecs second-and-1 at the Lobo 35, UNM got a pair of big defensive plays. Drew Speech, playing his first defensive snaps of the season, broke up a pass in the end zone on second down, and then Noah Avinger dropped Cam Davis for a four-yard loss, forcing a punt.

UNM was backed up to its own 2-yard line, but UNM got three first downs to flip the field, and Aaron Rodriguez pinned the Aztecs at the 4-yard line. San Diego State got one first down but Kpai knocked down a pass, one of his two breakups on the day to force a punt, and UNM was able to run out the final 3:11 of the game.

Kpai was a monster, with 15 tackles, 10 of them solo. He had a hurry and a pass breakup on a hard hit on Danny O'Neill in the second half, and he earned a sack when he forced an intentional grounding with nine seconds left in the half to knock the Aztecs out of field goal range.

The Aztecs took their first lead with just over a minute left in the third quarter as Gabriel Plascencia finished off a long 16-play, 80-yard drive with a 28-yard field goal. After that long drive the Aztecs not only were leading in time of possession, nearly doubling UNM, but also in total plays with 73 to UNM's 33.

Sanders led UNM in the opening half with two long touchdown runs, and UNM's defense but didn't really break in the half. Sanders opened UNM's scoring with a 51-yard run, and then he followed that with a 68-yard touchdown. On the 51-yard run he broke a key tackle attempt by former Lobo Cody Moon to spring him, and on the 68-yard, he was virtually untouched.

Sanders' first touchdown capped a 99-yard drive that took just four plays and 1:24 on the clock. UNM opened with a short pass to Sanders to get off the 1-yard line, and then after a first down Devon Dampier run, he hit Caleb Medford for 35 yards to midfield before Sanders finished it off from 51 yards out.

The Lobos never ran a play in the red zone in the first half, and San Diego State ran 15, but the Aztecs only got one touchdown, that a 5-yard Marquez Cooper catch. Otherwise, all the Aztecs could muster were a pair of Plascencia field goals, one from 22 yards and one from 31.

**ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.** --- Devon Dampier finished a record-breaking evening with his fourth total touchdown to give UNM a lead with 23 seconds left, and then in a perfect microcosm of UNM's depleted defense somehow making plays time and again, Drew Speech, who entered the game having played two plays all year, knocked away a Hail Mary with no time left as the Lobos shocked No. 19/18 Washington State 38-35 to keep their Bowl hope alive. The win pushed UNM to 5-6 overall, and it marks the most wins for the team since 2016.

The win also ended a bunch of long streaks. It marked UNM's first win over any kind over a ranked team after 26 straight losses. UNM's last win over a ranked team was on October 25, 2003 when it beat Utah in Salt Lake City 47-35. It was UNM's first win over a top 20 team since November 5, 1994 when UNM beat No. 8 Utah 23-21 at University Stadium.

As for the last non-conference Top-20 win? You have to go back 84 years, to November 30, 1940 when UNM beat Texas Tech at Zimmerman Field 19-14.

Down 28-14 at the break, the Lobos defense for the fourth straight game looked like world-beaters in the second half, allowing just a solitary touchdown. The Lobos got back into the game on the legs of Dampier and a solid ground game as Dampier rushed for 143 yards in the second half and UNM as a group rushed for 268 yards after half time, punishing Washington State's defense.

The Lobos went to work on its opening second half drive, twice converting third downs after going 0-for-5 in the first half. After a punishing 13-yard run from Na'Quari Rogers, Dampier broke a tackle and raced in from 33 yards out to make it 28-21. The teams traded punts and then UNM's defense held on third-and-2 after an incompletion by John Mateer, who was brilliant for the Cougars, and UNM's offense went to work again. Dampier hit Ryan Davis for a key 16-yard gain to get the drive moving, and then he hit Luke Wysong for 15 yards to cross midfield.

Eli Sanders finished that drive off with a 26-yard run and with 25 seconds left in the third quarter, UNM had leveled it at 28. The fourth quarter featured three lead changes. UNM retook the lead with an 86-yard drive that stalled at the 2-yard line but ended in a 19-yard Luke Drzewiecki field goal. Washington State then mustered its only sustained second half drive with Mateer hitting Kyle Williams for the second time in the game for a 37-yard touchdown and a 35-31 Wazzu lead.

That was more than enough time for Dampier and UNM. Facing third-and-2 just before the two-minute timeout, Eli Sanders took a jet sweep for 33 yards, giving him over 100 yards and setting up UNM at the Washington State 34. After Rogers got UNM to the 12-yard line, Dampier carried the final four times, the last from a yard out for a 38-35 lead with 23 seconds left. Washington moved the ball to its own 43 yard line in time for a final Hail Mary which was knocked down short of the goal line by Speech, and the celebration was on.

Washington State's offense looked indefensible early on as Mateer led the Cougars to three straight touchdowns after UNM opened the scoring. The Lobos took the opening kickoff and went right down the field, moving 75 yards in 11 plays with Dampier finishing it off with a 7-yard run, the first of his four total touchdowns.

From there, it turned into the Mateer show, as he led touchdown drives of 90, 74 and 93 yards. He capped the first with a 28-yard pass to Carlos Hernandez, the second with a five-yard run on his own, and on the third, he hit Kyle Williams from 20 yards out. That made it 21-7 and after a third straight punt for UNM, the Lobo defense finally held, forcing a punt. That punt came after Mateer's first incompletion that ended his opening string of 11 straight completions.

UNM was able to follow that up with a touchdown to make it 21-14 when Dampier hit a wide-open Caleb Medford near the goal line for what in the end was a 42-yard touchdown pass. The Cougars answered that score with a 29-yard scoring toss from Mateer to take a 28-14 lead into the break.
