2025 INDOOR SEASON UPDATE

New Mexico Track & Field hosts its biggest home meet of the season this weekend at the Albuquerque Convention Center when the Lobos welcome a combined 15 men's and women's teams that currently rank among the Top 25 in the nation to the UNM Collegiate Classic (Feb. 7-8).

The Lobo Men & Women are coming off another strong weekend of competition at three meets across the country that saw three new program records and nine additional all-time Top 10 entries -- as a result, they enter this week with their best combined showing in the USTFCCCA's national TFRI rankings since 2018, with the men ranking No. 20 in the nation and the women No. 24. They clocked in among the Top 50 in the nation in 10 events (four men's, six women's) in this week's #EventSquad rankings, including Top-10 team rankings in the men's mile (No. 3), men's 3,000m (No. 2), women's mile (No. 10), women's 3,000m (No. 5) and women's 5,000m (No. 2).

This weekend, the entire squad stays put in Albuquerque to host a 16-team invitational and get a taste of team competition ahead of Mountain West Indoor Championships. For the first time, this year's Collegiate Classic will feature a team scoring format similar to conference and NCAA Championships, with a team champion crowned at the conclusion of the weekend.

This weekend's competition gets started on Friday with field events at 11 a.m. and track events starting at 3:30 p.m. MT. SAMUEL NAMED TO THE BOWERMAN MID-INDOOR WATCH LIST; KOSGEI RECEIVING VOTES

Following a loud performance in Boston last weekend that saw him break his own 5,000m UNM and Mountain West record with a 13:04.92 clocking that moved him up to No. 4 on the NCAA All-Time list, New Mexico sophomore Habtom Samuel has been named to The Bowerman Mid-Indoor Watch List, the USTFCCCA announced on Wednesday. After opening the year on The Bowerman Preseason Watch List, Samuel has competed in two indoor races — he put down a 3:54.37 converted mile time (No. 13 in NCAA D-I) in his season debut in Albuquerque at the Dr. MLK Jr. Invitational (Jan. 25) before running the fastest 5,000m race — indoor or outdoor — in UNM and Mountain West history last Saturday in Boston.

On the women's Mid-Indoor list released Wednesday, Lobo freshman Pamela Kosgei received votes for the first time after breaking her third UNM indoor program record in as many races on Friday in Seattle. Kosgei is the first women's distance runner to receive votes for the preseason watch list as a freshman — Stanford's Grant Fisher (2016) and Oregon's Edward Cheserek (2014) are the only male distance runners to have held the same distinction. First awarded in 2009, The Bowerman is bestowed to collegiate track & field's top male and female athlete for the year, regardless of discipline. The Bowerman Advisory Board, and ultimately, The Bowerman Voters, are instructed to consider performances inclusively from the collegiate indoor track & field and outdoor track & field seasons only. In 2024, Samuel — then a true freshman — became just the second man from New Mexico to be named as a semifinalist, joining two-time semifinalist Josh Kerr (2017, 2018). Samuel swept the indoor 3,000m and 5,000m Mountain West titles and finished as a First Team All-American in both events at Indoor Nationals before winning the 10,000m and finishing sixth in the 5,000m at Outdoor Nationals to conclude the season with four First Team

LOBOS RAKE IN MOUNTAIN WEST WEEKLY HONORS

After splashy distance performances on the road last weekend that included two NCAA All-Time Top 10 performances, New Mexico Track & Field's Collins Kiprotich (Men's Freshman of the Week), Habtom Samuel (Men's Track Athlete of the Week) and Pamela Kosgei (Women's Freshman & Track Athlete of the Week) took home another Mountain West weekly award, the conference announced Tuesday. It's the third MW weekly track award of the indoor season for Kiprotich and Kosgei — and second in as many weeks. The duo combined for three weekly cross country awards during the fall 2024 season — Kosgei was named MW Athlete & Freshman of the Week twice (Oct. 8 & Oct. 22) and Kiprotich was named MW Freshman of the Week on Oct. 22. The duo swept the first MW weekly awards of indoor season on Dec. 10 as well last Tuesday (Jan. 28). It's the first weekly honor of the track season for Samuel, who took home a combined three weekly awards across indoor and outdoor season last year.

PAMELA KOSGEI | MW Track Athlete & Freshman of the Week

Kosgei broke her third UNM indoor record in as many races to highlight UNM's first day of competition at the UW Invitational Friday evening at Dempsey Indoor, putting down an 8:44.62 clocking that ranks No. 7 among NCAA performances all-time on the all-conditions list (UW track is a short track and is thus ineligible for primary USTFCCCA Top 25). Kosgei finished 15.82 seconds ahead of the next-fastest finisher and took more than nine seconds off Weini Kelati's UNM record that had stood since 2019 — the third race in a row in which she's broken a school record that Kelati held. That time also stands as a new Mountain West record as well.

In her first three collegiate indoor races, Kosgei has now broken the UNM 5,000m, Mile records and 3,000m — her 5,000m record set in Boston in December ranks No. 4 on the NCAA all-time list.

COLLINS KIPROTICH | MW Men's Freshman of the Week

In the men's 3,000m on Saturday in Boston, Collins

Kiprotich posted a new personal best that stands as the second-fastest in UNM history (7:46.90), finishing as the second-fastest collegian in the field behind Colorado's Isaiah Givens (7:45.01) in the top heat of the night. The reigning MW Athlete & Freshman of the Week after posting the fastest collegiate raw mile time ever ran at altitude, Kiprotich is now less than four seconds away from cracking the NCAA All-Time Top 25 in the 3K. That 7:46.90 time also stands as the fastest in the MW.

HABTOM SAMUEL | MW Men's Track Athlete of the Week

In his first 5,000m race of the indoor season, Samuel put down a 13:04.92 time that moves him from No. 15 to No. 4 on the NCAA All-Time List — a 9.93-second improvement from his UNM indoor record (13:14.85) and 8.44 seconds faster than his outdoor record (13:13.34).

It stands as the fastest 5K performance — indoor, outdoor or cross country — by any Mountain West athlete in history. It also ranks first among current D-I Athletes (Current No. 1 on indoor list, Graham Blanks, went professional over the semester and is no longer eligible).

LAST TIME OUT (UW Invitational/BU Terrier Classic/ UNM Team Open, 1/31-2/1)

So far this indoor season, UNM athletes have broken 9 program records and recorded 23 All-Time Top 10 entries. Last weekend across three different meets in Boston, Seattle and Albuquerque, UNM athletes broke three program records (all three with NCAA All-Time Top 10 marks) and recorded nine additional UNM Top 10 all-time performances.

Pamela Kosgei broke her third UNM indoor record in as many races to highlight UNM's first day of competition at the UW Invitational Friday evening at Dempsey Indoor, putting down an 8:44.62 clocking that ranks No. 7 among NCAA performances all-time on the all-conditions list (UW track is a short track and is thus ineligible for primary USTFCCCA Top 25).

Exactly a week after teammate and fellow Scot Hannah Taylor broke her indoor program record in the 600m, Rebecca Grieve took it back in dominant fashion. Fresh off a 300m program record last Saturday (37.81), the junior crossed in 1:26.91, 3.39 seconds ahead of the next finisher and 5.95 seconds faster than her previous best of 1:32.86 to etch her name at the No. 1 spot on the UNM all-time list.

— that 1:26.91 time ranks No. 7 among NCAA performances all-time. In the invitational sections of the 200m in Albuquerque, Lou-Anne Pouzancré Hoyer and Brodie Young both notched splashy new personal bests that ranked among the Top 3 in program history. Pouzancré moved up to No. 2 on the UNM all-time list with a 23.59 conversion (23.52 raw) and Brodie Young solidified his grip on the No. 3 spot with a 21.23 (21.16) — Young is now just a hundredth of a second away from tying Victor Akhalu (21.22) for the No. 2 spot. Pouzancré's time would slot in at No. 35 on the most recent NCAA Indoor Qualifying list, with Young just outside the Top 50 in the nation after clocking in at No. 81 this week. The UNM women's 4x4 squad — comprised of Lou-Anne Pouzancré, Eva Ngom, Hanna Kiess and Anaya Quarles — closed Saturday out with the second-fastest time in program history (3:39.25), finishing third overall. In Boston on Saturday, Collins Kiprotich put down a new personal best () in the 3,000m that moved him to No. 2 on the UNM all-time list and three Lobos put down new All-Time Top 10 times in the 5,000m. Behind Habtom Samuel's new program record, teammate Ishmael Kipkurui ran the second-fastest personal best — and third-fastest individual performance — in UNM history, finishing in 13:22.03 to place 13th in the first heat and 16th overall. In the following heat, Evans Kiplagat (13:37.40) recorded a new season best to finish 26th overall and Vincent Chirchir (13:44.55) moved from No. 10 to No. 7 on the all-time list with a new indoor best. Those four times stand as the four fastest in the Mountain West. In the men's 3,000m, Collins Kiprotich posted a new personal best that stands as the second-fastest in UNM history (7:46.90), finishing as the second-fastest collegian in the field behind Colorado's Isaiah Givens (7:45.01). The reigning MW Athlete & Freshman of the Week after posting the fastest collegiate raw mile time ever ran at altitude, Kiprotich is now less than four seconds away from cracking the NCAA All-Time Top 25 in the 3K.

THE ROAD TO NCAA INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

The top 16 qualifying individual men's, individual women's and combined events and top 12 relays (DMR and 4x4) at the conclusion of the indoor season — after scratches — will be selected to the 2025 DI indoor track and field championships, held March 14-15 in Virginia Beach, Va.

Heading into this weekend, five Lobos sit in qualifying position across six events— Pamela Kosgei ranks No. 2 in the nation in the 3,000m (8:44.62), No. 4 in the nation in the 5,000m (15:00.36) and No. 11 in the Mile (4:30.68 @), while Collins Kiprotich (3:53.41 @) and Habtom Samuel (3:54.37 @) rank No. 7 and No. 13 in the nation in the Mile thanks to their elevation-converted performances last Saturday. Kiprotich's PR in Boston (7:46.90) stands at No. 10 in the nation ahead of Lukas Kiproop (7:49.52, No. 14). Samuel's 5,000m PR from Boston (13:04.92) is the fastest among current D-I athletes, with Ishmael Kipkurui's 13:22.03 clocking ranks 15th.

UNM athletes have produced 28 marks (11 for men, 17 for women) that rank among the Top 100 in the nation heading into this weekend across 11 events (M & W 200m, W 800m, M & W Mile, M & W 3,000m, M & W 5,000m, W Long Jump, W 4x400m).

Last season, Evans Kiplagat (5,000m) and Habtom Samuel (3,000m / 5,000m) represented UNM at NCAA Indoor Championships in Boston, with Samuel earning two First Team All-American honors and Kiplagat finishing as a Second Team All-American.

RANKINGS CHECK-IN

In the second USTFCCCA TFRI rankings of the indoor season released this week, the UNM men and women both entered the Top 25 at No. 20 and No. 24 — they were both ranked No. 29 in the nation in last week's initial rankings. The women rank No. 6 in the Mountain Region and moved up to No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference, with the men at No. 6 and No. 3, respectively.

In this week's #EventSquad rankings, the Lobos cracked the Top 10 in the nation in five distance events — UNM ranks No. 3 in the nation in the men's mile, No. 2 in the men's 3,000m, No. 10 in the women's mile, No. 5 in the women's 3,000m and No. 2 in the women's 5,000m. UNM athletes have produced a total of nine times from five athletes that rank among the Top 25 in the nation currently in the Mile, 3,000m and 5,000m.

UNM COACHING STAFF



DARREN GAUSON

HEAD COACH / DIRECTOR OF TRACK & FIELD / CROSS COUNTRY

Darren Gauson was named UNM's Head Coach for Track & Field / Cross Country on June 30, 2023.

In his first season at UNM, the Lobo men won their first Mountain West Championship since 2014, and Gauson was named MW Men's Coach of the Year. Led by a Mountain Region individual title by freshman Habtom Samuel, the Lobos finished third at regionals — their best finish since 2013 — and qualified for the NCAA

Championship race as a team for the first time since 2014. They went on to finish 18th in the nation, with Samuel finishing as a national runner-up and Evans Kiplagat also earning All-American honors. Nicola Jansen, a Bradley transfer who followed Gauson to Albuquerque, qualified as an individual and finished 36th at the National Championship race to become the third XC All-American of Gauson's tenure.

In the first meet of the 2023-24 indoor season, Samuel broke the indoor 5,000m record and Lukas Kiprop broke the 3,000m record at the Sharon Danville-Colyear Season Opener. In Gauson's short tenure so far, the Lobos have already seen seven marks that ranked among the Top 10 in their respective events in the indoor all-time list.

PRIOR TO UNM

Gauson has spent the last eight years as the head coach of the track and field and cross country programs at Bradley University in Illinois. He led the Braves to 10 Missouri Valley cross country titles, six by the men and four by the women, including this past year when Bradley swept both the men's and women's titles at the 2022 Missouri Valley Championships. Prior to arriving in Peoria, Gauson was the cross country coach and assistant track and field coach at Lamar University, where he guided the Cardinals to back-to-back Southland Conference men's and women's cross country titles in 2013 and 2014.

"It's an incredible honor to join a storied program and become the next head track & field and cross country coach at the University of New Mexico," said Gauson. "UNM has developed into a championship program and I am excited to build on the tradition established at the school. Albuquerque is a place where athletes dream of coming to train and develop into national champions and Olympians. I want to thank Athletic Director Eddie Nuñez, Deputy Athletic Director David Williams and Senior Woman Administrator Amy Beggin for their faith in me and their desire to continue to elevate the program to new heights. I also want to thank Bradley University for all that they've done for me in my career. I can't wait to get to work at New Mexico and develop high-character student-athletes in the classroom and on the track."

During his time at Bradley and Lamar, in addition to the 14 team conference titles, Gauson has coached 75 conference champions,

14 conference athletes of the year and 15 conference freshman of the year. He has mentored four All-Americans and six conference outstanding track performers.

A 10-time Missouri Valley Coach of the Year and the 2018 USTFCCCA Midwest Region Men's Coach of the Year, Gauson built Bradley into a powerhouse. His teams included a record-setting performance by the men's cross country team in 2019, when the Braves had the top four

finishers at the conference meet to set the modern-day Missouri Valley scoring record with 17 points. A year earlier, Bradley qualified for the NCAA Men's Cross Country Championship for the first time in program history, finishing 24th at the 2018 meet. The Bradley women's team had the second-lowest score in MVC history in 2017, when it had five runners in the top eight en route to the conference title.

On the track, Gauson coached the first individual outdoor and indoor MVC champions for the BU men in 30 and 34 years, respectively, during the 2016 and 2017 championships. Additionally, the Bradley women won their first distance medley relay crown in school history in 2019. Bradley set school records for points scored at the MVC Indoor and Outdoor Championships by both the men and women over the past five seasons. In 2017, Daniel Gagne became the first BU man to qualify for the NCAA Track and Field Championship in 42 years, where he earned second-team All-America honors in the 1,500m run in 2017. In 2021, Wilma Nielsen became the first Bradley freshman to qualify for the NCAA Championship and finished the campaign as the nation's third-ranked rookie in the 800m. Earlier this month, Tiana LoStracco earned honorable mention All-America honors as she qualified for the NCAA Outdoor Championship in the 1500m.

In addition to success on the course and on the track, Bradley also had success in the classroom under Gauson. He has coached seven Academic All-Americans and 11 MVC Elite 17 Award winners. Bradley has earned USTFCCCA All-Academic Team honors in each of year of his tenure. The men ranked as high as fourth nationally in team GPA (2019 and 2021), while the women peaked at fifth in 2017.

Gauson came to Bradley from Lamar University, where he guided both the Cardinals men's and women's cross country programs to consecutive Southland Conference championships in 2013 and 2014. In addition to the championship success of the cross country teams at Lamar, Gauson coached the Cardinals runners to 29 individual Southland Conference championships in cross country and track in just three seasons. Among his star runners, Gauson helped Matt Johnsen to a 33rd-place finish at the 2012 NCAA Cross Country Championship and the first All-America honor for the Cardinals since 1969. Additionally, Sam Stabler posted the second-fastest 5,000m time in the nation in 2015 to go along with Academic All-America honors.

A 2006 graduate of Napier University in Edinburgh, Scotland, with a degree in sport and exercise science, Gauson competed two years at Butler University where he was coached by former UNM head coach Joe Franklin. He earned a master's of science degree in education from Butler in 2008. With the Bulldogs, Gauson earned a Horizon League title in the 1,500m during his final year of eligibility in addition to claiming Scottish national championships in the event in both 2004 and 2005.

Following graduation, Gauson was also an assistant cross country/track and field coach at Butler for four seasons. The Butler men were able to extend their streak of consecutive conference cross country titles to 14 during Gauson's time in Indianapolis and the team finished 29th at the NCAA Championship during his first season on the coaching staff. Butler boasted four All-Americans overall during his tenure at the school.

UNM COACHING STAFF



BRIAN MATY

ASSISTANT COACH: DISTANCE

A native of Palos Heights, Illinois, Maty joined the UNM staff in the Summer of 2023. Maty assists with all facets of all six programs, focusing on distance running with both indoor and outdoor teams as well as serving as the assistant cross country coach. In 2022, Maty was part of the staff that led Bradley to a sweep of Missouri Valley Conference titles in men's and women's cross country. Bradley's women basically lapped the field, scoring 22 points to outpace second place Belmont by 53 points. He also coached Wilma Nielsen, who turned in the NCAA's No. 2 time all-time in the 1,000m (2:38.95)

at the Dr. Sander Invitational in New York City. She also earned first team All-American 800m indoor honors. He also coached Tiana LoStracco and honorable mention All American Tiana LoStracco 1500m in Austin, TX

That came after a 2021 season that saw Bradley runners claim nine conference track titles in his first season on campus, while the Bradley women also set school records for most points at the Missouri Valley Conference meet, tallying 70 at the 2022 Indoor Championship

and 84 points at the 2022 Outdoor Championship.

Prior to joining the Braves, Maty spent the 2021 fall semester as a graduate assistant at Eastern Illinois. The EIU men's and women's cross country teams both posted record-setting seasons with Maty's assistance, highlighted by sweeping the Ohio Valley Conference individual cross country titles. The Panthers boasted a total of nine All-OVC performers (six men & three women) in addition to setting school records in the women's 6K and men's 8K. The EIU men's team also claimed the OVC title, with Dustin Hatfield going on to become the first NCAA Championship qualifier from Eastern Illinois in 20 years. On the women's side Lindsey Carlson became the first female all-region performer in school history, following a 20th-place individual finish at the NCAA Midwest Regional Championship.

Maty graduated from Loras College in 2021. He spent the 2020 indoor track & field season as an intern at the University of Portland where he assisted with videography, recruiting, coaching, social media management and home meet setup. Maty's indoor season with the Pilots was highlighted by a school record in the men's mile (3:59.61).

In January 2019, Maty completed an externship under Danny Mackey and the Brooks Beasts Track Club in Seattle, Washington, that featured instruction on running physiology and biomechanics, along with focusing on the facets of marketing such as brand advertising and social media management.



JENNA SCHWARTZ

ASSISTANT COACH: DISTANCE

Jenna Schwartz joined the Lobo XC/T&F staff as an assistant coach in August of 2024.

Originally from Waterloo, Ill., Schwartz joins the Lobos after a four-year career at Missouri, where she recently completed her Graduate Certificate in Positive Coaching and Athletic Leadership along with a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration with an emphasis in management. Competing in cross country and track for the Tigers from 2019 to 2024, Schwartz ranks No. 4 in program history in the Indoor 5000m (16:25.20), No. 6 in the

Outdoor 10,000m (33:56.58) and No. 9 in the Outdoor 5000m, earning a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll in every semester during her time in Columbia.

"I'm incredibly excited to join such a historic program and work with an incredible staff," Schwartz said. "Albuquerque is an outstanding place to train at an elite level and I'm humbled and grateful to do whatever I can to keep our successes going."

ASSISTANT COACH / DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS

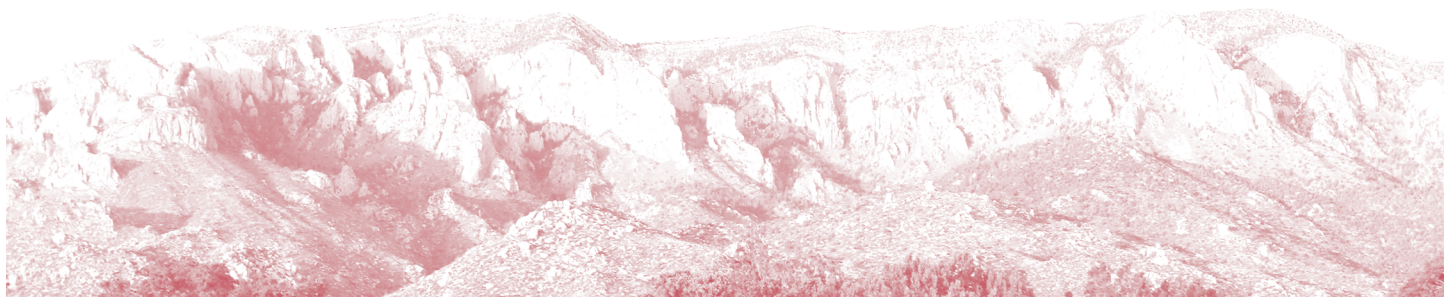
Berryman came to UNM in the Summer of 2023 from Bradley, where he was a part of Darren Gauson's staff as an assistant coach.

Among various duties as director of operations for both XC and track, Berryman is UNM's co-meet director along with Kyra Mohns.

During his season in Peoria, the Braves won the Missouri Valley women's cross country championship and had individuals qualify for the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field Championships. Berryman spent the 2021-22 season as an

intern at his alma mater, Cal State East Bay, assisting with the program's recruiting, meet management and social media.

A native of Long Beach, Calif., Berryman is a 2022 graduate of CSUEB, where he earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology with an emphasis in sport nutrition and wellness. He ran three seasons for the Pioneers and was a two-year captain of the Cal State East Bay track & field team.



UNM COACHING STAFF



KYRA MOHNS

ASSISTANT COACH: SPRINTS/HURDLES

Kyra Mohns, a former UNM student-athlete and Albuquerque native, joined the staff as a full-time assistant coach in August 2021. She works primarily with the sprints, hurdles and multis and serves as co-meet director alongside Jared Ber. Since joining the coaching staff as a graduate assistant in 2019, Mohns-coached athletes have produced nine school records indoors and five outdoors.

In 2022, she guided a women's 4x400m squad to break the women's indoor and outdoor school records, and Tianna Holmes (indoor and outdoor

200m and 400m), McKenna Watson (60m sprint), Rivaldo Leacock (400m hurdles) and Rebecca Grieve (600m) all set new program records under Mohns. Leacock and Holmes both qualified for NCAA West Region Preliminaries.

In 2023, the UNM women broke the indoor and outdoor 4x400m relay records yet again. Victor Akhalu matched the UNM 100m program record in the outdoor season, clocking a 10.28 at MW Outdoor Championships to finish as runner-up. Five women and two men

coached by Mohns qualified for NCAA West Region Prelims

Athletes coached by Mohns record 14 new personal bests that rank among the Top 10 in their respective events across the indoor and outdoor season in 2024, with Lou-Anne Pouzancze Hoyer running the second-fastest indoor 400m and 200m bests in program history en route to All-MW honors and Brodie Young closing his season with the third-fastest 400m in history at NCAA West Region Prelims. Along with Young, Victor Akhalu also qualified for NCAA Prelims in the 100m.

A graduate of Eldorado High School, Mohns specialized as a combined athlete for the Lobos during her time from 2015-18. She currently holds the 4th best score all-time in the pentathlon with 3807 points and the 4th result all-time in the heptathlon at 5391 points. In addition, she doubled in the 400-meter hurdles, an event that she currently holds the sixth best time in program history. She also ranks 9th all-time in the 100mH, 9th in Javelin, and 9th in the 60mH.

During her time at UNM, Mohns consistently performed at a high level. She secured third-place finishes in the pentathlon in both 2017 and 2018 and took third in the heptathlon in 2018, as well as a fourth-place finish in 2017 at the Mountain West Championships. Her excellence extended to the 400-meter hurdles, where she secured a second-place finish in 2018 and a third-place finish in 2017.



RYAN CONAN

ASSISTANT COACH: JUMPS

Ryan Conan was named Assistant Coach for Jumps in July 2024.

Conan – who joins the Lobos by way of Southern Utah, where he has been a part of the Thunderbirds' staff for the last seven seasons – will be primarily responsible for coaching long jump, triple jump and high jump athletes at UNM. Conan was an all-conference sprinter/hurdler for SUU during his time as an athlete from 2014-17 and coached in a volunteer/part time capacity for the Thunderbirds for the next four seasons before becoming a full-time coach ahead of the 2021-22 season.

In his last three seasons at SUU, Conan coached 19 All-Conference athletes, 14 NCAA regional qualifiers and five All-Americans, with his athletes breaking 28 school records in

that span. He also coached UNM outdoor and indoor program record holder Lizzie White to her first All-American honors in the long jump in 2022 before she transferred to UNM the following season.

"We're so excited to add Coach Conan to this key role on our staff. After conducting a national search, Ryan rose to the top of our list. He's done an incredible job of developing national level jumpers at Southern Utah and is a proven commodity."

Most recently in 2023-24, Conan's sprinters and Jumpers combined to score 99.5 points – with 79.5 from the men – at WAC Indoor Championships to help the Thunderbirds to win the conference title on the men's side, coaching three conference champions as well as Astley Davis, who finished as an All-American in the triple jump for the second time in as many years.

Originally from Idaho Falls, Idaho, Conan graduated from SUU with a Bachelor's degree in Exercise Science in 2017 and a Masters degree in Sports Conditioning and Performance in 2020.



GABRIEL BROWN

ASSISTANT COACH: POLE VAULT

Brown joined the Lobos' coaching staff in the summer of 2023. He coaches UNM's pole vaulters.

A UNM alum who competed for the Lobos during the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons, Brown's 5.20m (17'0.75") personal best in the pole vault in 2021 ranks No. 6 on the outdoor UNM all-time list – that season, he placed fourth at MW Indoor Championships.

Brown's first season coaching UNM's vaulters has seen unprecedented success. In the Lobos' first indoor meet of the 2023-24 season, three UNM pole vaulters notched PR's that put them on the

UNM Indoor All-Time Top 10 list in the event, with Maja Gebauer's 4.10m (3'5.25") mark ranking No. 2 to lead the way. Alyssa Gregory cleared 4.04m (No. 3 all-time) and Kiara Quezada-Arzate cleared 4.00m (No. 9 all-time) – the first time since 2014 that three UNM women's vaulters have joined the 4.00m club in the same season as well as the first

time that three women's vaulters cracked the all-time Top 10 in the same season. UNM's women's pole vault squad ranked No. 13 in the nation in that season's initial USTFCCA #EventSquad rankings and ranked No. 14 at the conclusion of the season.

At 2024 MW Indoor Championships, Kiara Quezada-Arzate became the first Brown-coached vaulter to get on the conference podium with a third-place finish – the first Lobo woman to do so since 2014.

In the outdoor season, UNM ranked among the Top 25 women's pole vault programs in the nation in the USTFCCA's #EventSquad rankings for six weeks, concluding the regular season ranked No. 23 in the nation. Maja Gebauer matched the UNM outdoor program record with a 4.06m vault at the Don Kirby Invitational and Alyssa Gregory jumped 4.02m at the Bryan Clay Invitational for the fourth-best outdoor mark in program history – they're the only entries on the list from the same season.

At MW Outdoor Championships, the duo both cleared 3.98m to finish first and third, respectively – Gebauer became UNM's first outdoor women's pole vault champion since 2009, with two podium finishers for the first time since 2013.

ABQ CONVENTION CENTER

The indoor track at the Albuquerque Convention Center has emerged as one of the preeminent indoor track & field facilities in the nation over the last decade. In concert with the Albuquerque Convention & Visitors Bureau and the Albuquerque Convention Center, New Mexico has capitalized on its unique venue and prime training location with the indoor track at the ACC. The facility has hosted 14 Mountain West Indoor Track & Field Championships, nine USATF Indoor National Championships, and five NCAA Division I Indoor Track & Field Championships — the first in NCAA history hosted at altitude. The ABCC has also hosted the NJCAA Indoor National Championships (2015) and NCAA Division II Championships (2012).

The most recent surface at the ABCC was unveiled in March 2021 and cost \$3 million in total, with renovations that helped solidify the city's ability to attract and keep hosting national meets that bring the best competition to Albuquerque. Since 2005, 102 indoor track meets have been hosted at the ABCC — 16 being national championship events at either the collegiate or national level — and indoor track has generated over \$30 million in revenue for the city of Albuquerque in that span.

The track — a state-of-the-art WSTY Mondo, the same surface used at the 2020 Olympics in Tokyo — is a 200-meter, 60-degree banked track with 60-meter straightaways running the entire length of the facility. It also includes men's and women's jumping runways and pits, as well as areas for shot put, pole vault and high jump events. The surface of the track is striped with cherry red and turquoise to reflect UNM's colors and the state color of New Mexico.

"Every time there is an Olympic Games we try to improve the formulation of the material and Tokyo has been no different," said Andrea Vallauri, the track's designer. "The track is very thin, 14mm. But we have added a new element: these rubber granules.

"In the lower layer of the track is this hexagonal design that creates these small pockets of air. They not only provide shock absorption but give some energy return; at the same time a trampoline effect. We have improved this

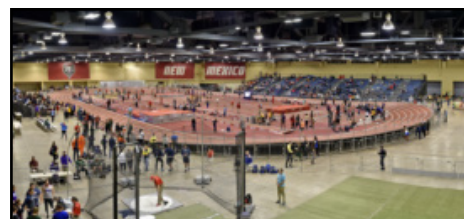


combination and this is why we are seeing the track has improved performance."

Bringing indoor track to Albuquerque was a confluence of good timing, a proactive city council and an irresistible sale. In spring of 2004, Albuquerque city leaders learned of a \$1 million unused and undamaged indoor track sitting in storage in Canada that could be purchased for a mere \$500,000. The state-of-the-art Mondo track had originally been ordered, then later declined, for use in the Los Angeles Staples Center arena.

That track finally found a home inside the Convention Center in downtown Albuquerque and made its debut on Jan. 15, 2005 for the inaugural Albuquerque All-Comers meet, ending a 20-year absence of an indoor track in the Duke City. It was the facility's primary surface until it was replaced in March of 2021.

The Albuquerque Convention Center's first indoor track

surface, operated from 2005-2021. Nearly identical to the track used by the University of Arkansas at the Randal Tyson Track Center, the first iteration of Albuquerque's new indoor facility received rave reviews from athletes, coaches and fans. Like the Arkansas facility, which has hosted a number of NCAA Indoor Championships in the new millennium, Albuquerque and University of New Mexico officials believed the city would become a destination for some of the nation's premier events — and they were right.

The Albuquerque All-Comers meet marked the University of New Mexico's first indoor competition at home since hosting the 1987 Western Athletic Conference Championships in Tingley Coliseum at the New Mexico State Fairgrounds. The Lobos under former Head Coach Joe Franklin and current Head Coach Darren Gauson now regularly host between four and six indoor meets per year, not only giving the Lobos a home track advantage but bringing in countless numbers of teams, participants, and fans that have pushed the economic impact of the track beyond the original estimates.

In the mid-60s Albuquerque was one of the nation's elite indoor track and field locations. At this time, Albuquerque's colleges would often enlist businesses to sponsor international athletes to make the trip and compete in Albuquerque, to great support from the community — Tingley averaged over 13,000 in attendance per meet over its time of operation. The 1966 AAU Indoor Nationals (now known as the USA Indoor Track & Field Championships) drew a two-day total of nearly 20,000 fans to Tingley Coliseum and was featured on the March 14 cover of Sports Illustrated. Albuquerque officials were able to lure the meet away from its regular home at Madison Square Garden in New York City that year.

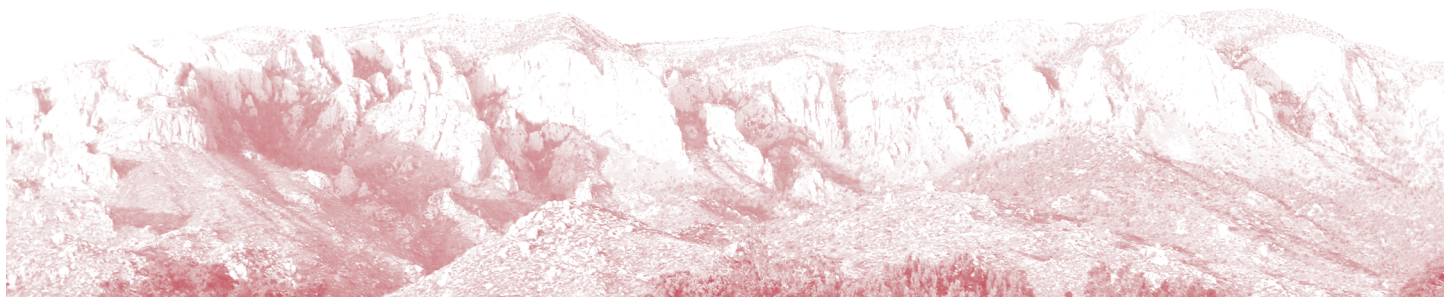

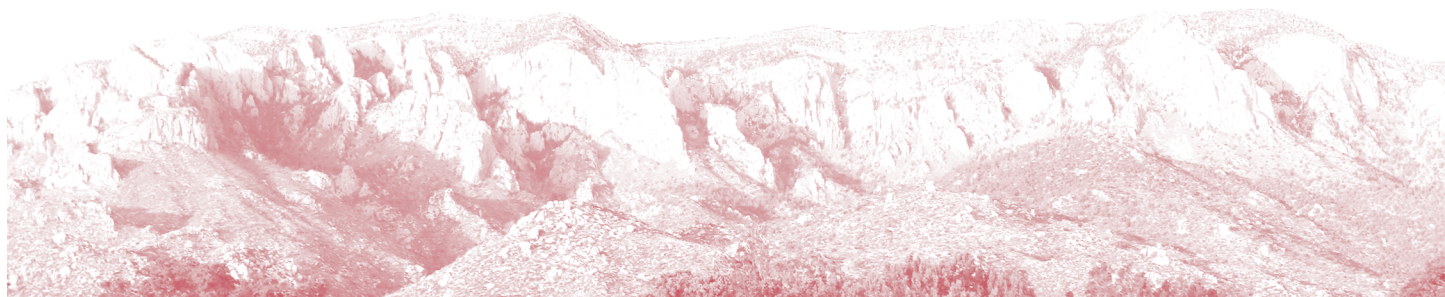

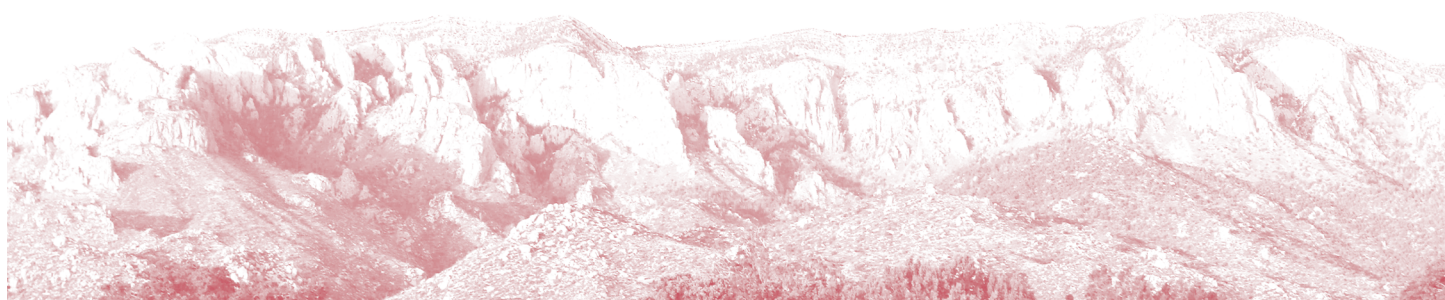
