LOBO NOTES

NEW LOOK LOBOS

- The Lobos welcomed nine newcomers in the offseason, seven of which are freshmen. UNM added two juniors in goalkeepers Alyson Campbell and Jasmin Gonzalez-Rutt, however, entering the 2025 season, neither have played in a collegiate match.
- The 2025 roster is comprised of 14 underclassmen and 13 upperclassmen.

UNDERCLASSMEN UNKNOWN

- Of the 14 underclassmen on the roster, the Lobos have seven freshmen and six players who redshirted as freshmen last season, all who are seeking their first minutes this season. Ayla Dils, Savannah Sanchez, Macie Harris, Mackie McNulty, Gabby Beaudry and Sherry Diep all redshirted in 2024, with the only freshman getting minutes in their rookie season, Ashley Moody, selected to the Mountain West Women's Soccer All-Newcomer Team after starting in 12 of the 13 matches she appeared in and registering 1088 minutes.
- The Lobos have seven freshmen on the roster in 2025, comprised of two mid-fielders, four forwards and one goalkeeper.

PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

- The Lobos were picked seventh in the Mountain West Preseason Women's Soccer Coaches' Poll with two first-place votes and 80 points, one of five teams to receive first-place votes.
- The Lobos play three teams picked ahead of them in the polls at home and don't play one of the teams picked in the top three.
- Utah State, which the Lobos will host on Oct. 16, was the preseason favorite with six first-place votes and 128 points. Boise State, which the Lobos host on Oct. 19, was picked to finish second with three first-place votes and 121 points. Colorado State (111, one first-place vote) and San Diego State (109 points, one first-place vote) round out the top four with new MW member Grand Canyon, which UNM hosts on Oct. 9, picked fifth at 93 points.
- UNLV was picked sixth at 87 points, with Wyoming (59 points), Nevada (55 points), Colorado College (54 points), Fresno State (50 points), Air Force (44 points) and San José State (23 points) picked below UNM.
- In addition, Nicole Anderson, Kennedy Brown and Fiona Jenkins were among the Mountain West Women's Soccer Watch List, comprised of three players from each school that is expected to lead their respective programs.
- The trio started all 18 matches for the Lobos a season ago with Anderson the second-best goal scorer from 2024 behind four goals. Jenkins played 90 minutes in 12 of the 18 matches, playing the most minutes of any position player, and scored her first collegiate goal and was credited with her first collegiate assist against conference opponents last season. Brown played 90 minutes in seven matches and also was credited with her first collegiate assist in 2024.

HOME STATS

- The Lobos were 6-2-2 at home last season.
- UNM outscored opponents 17-12 with eight goals in the first half and nine in the second half and outshot opponents 185-100.
- Of UNM's 18 regular season matches, eight are at home in addition to having one exhibition at home.
- The Lobos will have a three-match homestand in October for their longest stretch at home during the season.
- Historically, UNM is 148-82-37 (.624) at home, 50-23-13 (.657) during Coach Dyche's tenure.

HOME GROWN

- The Lobos feature 8 players from The Land of Enchantment on the 2025 roster.
- Five Lobos are local Lobos, hailing from Albuquerque (Ayla Dils, Mercedes Morris, Savannah Sanchez, Kennedy Brown and Ainsley Capps), with two from Santa Fe (Laila Magaña Carter and Jasmin Gonzalez-Rutt) and one from Las Cruces (Mia Barela).
- Barela was named the 2024 Gatorade Player of the Year for New Mexico after leading Las Cruces HS to the Class 5A state final, scoring 31 goals with 12 assists on the year.
- Head Coach Heather Dyche is also a New Mexico native, a 1997 graduate of Eldorado High School and was a four-year all-state defender, a two-time district Player of the Year and the 1996 Defensive Player of the Year. She also played basketball for the Eagles and was a first-team all-state performer two years.

STEPPING UP

- The Lobos will be without their leading goal scorer and starting goal-keeper from a season ago as Presley Devey and Callie Droitsch will be redshirting this season due to injury.
- Devey accounted for eight of UNM's 23 goals (34.8%) in 2024 with the Lobos also losing seven goals to graduation (three, Natalie DeGagne; two, Ellie Robinson; one each from Sophia Roberts and Margaux Clarke).
- UNM returns goal scorers in Nicole Anderson (second on the team with four goals), Alysa Whelchel (tied for third with three goals) and Fiona Jenkins (one goal), with the trio combining to equal Devey's production.
- Savannah Sanchez proved capable of filling the role in the exhibition against UTEP with two goals, while Macie Harris and Whelchel each scored once against the Miners.
- Equally important, the Lobos will look to find a replacement in net with three possible options in junior Alyson Campbell, junior Jasmin Gonzalez-Rutt and freshman Avah Snodgrass. Regardless of who earns the start against Texas Southern, they will be making their first career start as Campbell didn't appear in a match in her time at LSU and Gonzalez-Rutt joined the UNM roster in spring 2024 after playing on the club team at UNM.
- Anderson enters her junior season with five career goals, Whelchel entering her junior season with three career goals and Mercedes Morris and Jenkins with one goal each in their career.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

- During the spring semester, the team emphasized community service in what they called the "Give and Go Project". Members of the team visited local soccer teams to coach and provide instruction to younger soccer players.

ACADEMICALLY SPEAKING

- 18 Lobos were named Mountain West Scholar-Athletes following the 2024-25 academic year as well as 18 named to the MW All-Academic Team.
- The Lobos turned in a 3.82 GPA in the fall semester and a 3.74 GPA in the spring.
- Historically, UNM has recorded 18 consecutive semesters (out of 20) above a 3.6 GPA.

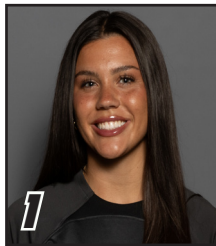

- Dyche is also a technical advisor for USL team New Mexico United (one of only two women in the country involved with men's professional team staffing)
- Vice president of United Soccer Coaches and set to be named the president of the organization in 2026
- Has been involved with U.S. Soccer as a coach with numerous youth national team programs and as part of the U.S. Women's National Team staff for the 2017 World Cup in Canada, 2019 World Cup in France and 2021 World Cup Qualifying in Monterrey, Mexico.

COACHING STAFF

Heather Dyche joined the Lobo family in 2015 as the fourth head women's soccer coach at The University of New Mexico. The 2025 season marks her 11th season in charge of the Lobos.

CAREER SUMMARY

Dyche was named the Mountain West Coach of the Year in back-to-back seasons, in 2020 and 2021. She has led New Mexico to six Mountain West Tournament appearances, including three championship games. Under her guidance, UNM has won four regular season titles (2018, 2020, 2021, 2022), the 2021 Mountain West Championships title, and made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances (2020 & 2021).

Dyche's 98 wins are second-most in UNM history behind Kit Vela, who went 122-105-45 (.529) from 2001-2014. Her seven postseason wins are also second-most behind Vela's 12. Dyche's .606 winning percentage is the best ever by a UNM head coach, as is her postseason winning percentage of .559.

Overall, she has coached 35 All-Mountain West selections (14 First Team, 12 Second Team), 16 All-MW Tournament Players, seven All-Region players, 14 CoSIDA Academic All-District selections, three CoSIDA Academic All-America, 19 Mountain West Players of the Week, 123 Mountain West All-Academic selections and 109 Mountain West Scholar-Athletes. Four student-athletes that she coached signed professional contracts under her tenure.

2024-The Lobos went 7-6-5, 3-5-3 in conference, which included a win over Oregon, their third win over a Power conference opponent under Dyche and the second over an (at the time) Big Ten team in program history. In addition, in UNM's 5-2 win against Nevada, Presley Devey paced the Lobos with a hat trick, registering a brace in the first 5:59, the first Lobo to record a hat trick since Jady Edwards did it against Cal State Bakersfield in 2022. Nicole Anderson recorded her first brace with a goal in the 29th minute and in the 55th minute for a career high in goals for the sophomore. Additionally, Anderson accounted for the game-winning goal, with both of her game-winning goals coming against Nevada. Of note, it was the first time UNM had two multiple-goal scorers in a match since Sept. 28, 2008 against Central Arkansas (Kate Wyrick and Zaneta Wyne) and the first time the Lobos scored five goals against Nevada since Oct. 14, 2018 (5-1) and the most goals scored since Sept. 9, 2021 when the Lobos scored six goals against NAU.

UNM had three players earn Player of the Week honors in Devey (Offensive Player of the Week), Ashley Moody (Freshman of the Week) and Callie Droitsch (Defensive Player of the Week), as well as two earn all-conference awards as Devey earned All-Conference Second Team and Moody was named to the Mountain West Women's Soccer All-Newcomer Team.

2023-The Lobos went 5-6-6, 2-5-4 in conference, which included a win over New Mexico State to extend the win streak to four matches and her record against the Aggies to 6-1. In addition, the Lobos opened the season with a 1-1 tie against Texas Tech, extending the unbeaten streak in the series against the Red Raiders to three matches, part of a four-match unbeaten streak to start the campaign.

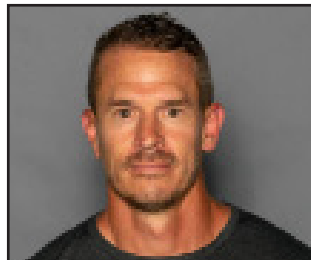
2022 - Mountain West Regular-Season Champions - Mountain West Championships Semifinal Dyche guided the Lobos to a share of their third-consecutive Mountain West regular-season title in 2022, with the team going 7-3-9 overall and 5-1-5 in conference play. The Lobos hosted the Mountain West Championships, falling to San José State in penalty kicks in the semifinals of the tournament. UNM broke the program record for consecutive shutout minutes with 602:51, ending the season with the streak intact. UNM's team goals-against average of .082 was the lowest the program had seen since a mark of .068 during the 2011 season.

2021 - Mountain West Regular-Season Champions - Mountain West Championships Champions - NCAA Championship First Round The 2021 season followed in the 2020 season's success. The Lobos won their first Mountain West Tournament championship since 2011. Dyche led the Lobos to many records, including a program-high eight-game winning streak and nine-game conference winning streak (dating back to the 2020 season). She guided the team to the second-most single-season wins as they finished the season with 14 wins, also going undefeated in conference play at home. In typical MW Coach of the Year fashion, she coached the Newcomer of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year.

2020 - Mountain West Regular-Season Champions - NCAA Championship Second Round The 2020 season saw records fall as UNM advanced to the second round of the NCAA College Cup and winning its first outright Mountain West title since 2011. The program went 10-2-1 under Dyche as she was named the Mountain West's Coach of the Year. The Lobos blasted their way into the record books by averaging 2.38 goals per game (scoring 31 in just 13 games). The team turned in a 0.90 goals against average, the lowest in seven years, and UNM was nearly unstoppable in the regular season, allowing just three goals in 10 games leading up to the title game. The Lobos of 2020 advanced to the NCAA Tournament after a thrilling 3-2 overtime win over San Diego State in front of a capacity crowd in Albuquerque. UNM then got past Navy in the

opening round, winning 4-2 in penalties after tying 1-1 in regulation.

Gwen Maly was one of five players to earn First Team All-Mountain West honors, and she became the first women's soccer player in the history of the Mountain West to be named Mountain West Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year, the highest individual honor bestowed to a student-athlete in the league.

2019 – Mountain West Championships Semifinal

The 2019 season saw the Lobos go 11-8-1 overall and finish 6-4-1 in the Mountain West, good for fourth place. The Lobos for the second straight season placed five players on the All-Mountain West squad and it gave UNM 36 wins over the previous three seasons, the second-best three-year win total in school history. One of those wins was a 1-0 season opening win over No. 22 Texas Tech at the UNM Soccer Complex, UNM's first win over a ranked opponent since 2010.

2018 – Mountain West Regular-Season Champions – Mountain West Championships Final

Dyche's 2018 Lobo team set a program record for goals scored with 45 and posted second-best program marks in assists (33) and points (123). In terms of individual player accolades, three standouts received All-Pacific Region honors from the United Soccer Coaches, which was a program record. From the Mountain West, the 2018 team had five honorees, three of which were first team selections. The Lobos won the Mountain West regular season title this season.

2017 – Mountain West Championships Final

The Lobos posted double-digit wins in 2017, going 12-8-2 overall and placing fourth in the Mountain West standings with a league record of 7-2-2. The Lobos advanced their way to the Mountain West Championships title game by virtue of two successful penalty kick shootouts, before falling to San Diego State in the title match.

2016-Dyche led UNM to another winning season in 2016, as the Lobos went 9-7-3 overall and finished 5-5-1 in league play to tie for seventh place.

2015 – Mountain West Championships Semifinal

In her first season, Dyche became the third coach in Lobo women's soccer history to begin her career with double-digit victories by going 10-8-2 in 2015. That record included a 7-3-1 record in Mountain West play and a run to MW Tournament semifinals.

BEYOND UNM

Along with leading the Lobos, Dyche is also a technical advisor for USL team New Mexico United. She is one of only two women in the country involved with men's professional team staffing. She is also the vice president of United Soccer Coaches and set to be named the president of the organization in 2026.

She is on the US Soccer Senior Instructional Staff as one of two women teaching the National A and B license, awarding licenses to candidates. Dyche is currently the only American woman on the FIFA Women's Development Team as a Technical Expert.

Dyche traveled to Brazil to assist the U.S. Women's National Team during the 2016 Summer Olympic Games – assisting with scouting and analyzing opponents. She also served as an assistant coach for the U-18 U.S. Women's National Team's trip to Australia in the summer of 2017. She also was on the U.S. Women's National Team staff for the 2017 World Cup in Canada, 2019 World Cup in France and 2021 World Cup Qualifying in Monterrey, Mexico.

Dyche is also a coach, instructor, and scout with the United States Soccer Federation (USSF). Dyche is an assistant coach for the U14, U15, U16, U17, U18, U19 and U20 US Youth National Teams. She helped lead the U20 team to a victory in the CONCACAF World Cup qualifier in the Dominican Republic. She also serves on the USSF instructional staff, instructing USSF B- and USSF C-licensed national coaching schools across the country.

Dyche's footprint at the elite level spans past the national stage, as she has also assisted for national teams from Antigua, St. Kitts and Nevis and Grenada. Dyche serves on the instructional staff for The Confederation of North, Central American and Caribbean Association Football (CONCACAF), teaching CONCACAF courses and licensing coaches throughout our confederation.

Dyche is a US Youth Region IV ODP head coach. There, she coaches the team at Olympic Development Interregional events and identifies top players in the region to participate in the Olympic Development Program Regional Team.

She is also the co-founder and head coach of LEAD Academy (Leadership and Empowerment through Athletic Development Soccer) – an all-girls soccer leadership training school located here in Albuquerque.

Prior to joining the University of New Mexico, Dyche was a presenter at the National Soccer Coaches Association of America/U.S. Youth National Conference in 2013 and at the U.S. Soccer National Symposium in 2011.
