#### ABOUT THE MATCHUP

- The Lobos enter Wednesday's game coming off of a 1-1 week, earning a 78-59 win over Evansville before falling 88-76 on the road at UTEP.
- The Lobos are still in search of their first away victory of the season.
- Colorado enters the matchup coming off of a disappointing rivalry loss against Colorado State, 72-63.
- CU's loss against Mountain West opponent Colorado State marked the first of the season for the Buffs.
- This week's match will mark the 14th time in history that the two programs have faced off.
- Last time UNM took on Colorado was in Las Vegas on Dec. 22, 2010. The Lobos claimed an 89-76 victory.
- UNM is on a three-win streak over the Buffs and holds a 7-6 advantage on the series.
- The Lobos are led by three players averaging in double figures including Sam Logwood (16.5), Chris McNeal (15.6) and Anthony Mathis (10.6).
- Colorado also boasts a trio of double-digit scorers including McKinley Wright (16.1), George King (15.0) and Namon Wright (11.6).

## SCOUTING COLORADO

Colorado enters Wednesday's game 6-1 on the season, coming off of its only loss of the season against in-state rival Colorado State on Saturday, Dec. 2 on the road. The final score was 72-63.

The Buffs average 76.3 points and 38.4 rebounds per game compared to 86.0 points and 35.0 rebounds for the Lobos. Both teams maintain a scoring margin over opponents of +8 (8.3 for UNM, 8.6 for Colorado).

Colorado is led by a trio of players that average double figures on the season including McKinley Wright (16.1), George King (15.0) and Namon Wright (11.6). King also averages 8.6 rebounds per game while McKinley Wright has posted six blocks and eight steals on the season.

## SERIES HISTORY

The Lobos and the Buffs began their series on January 27, 1926 and have played 13 games since. UNM holds a 7-6 advantage overall including a 3-2 record at home. On the road it's the Buffs that have an advantage, having gone 4-3 in Boulder. The Lobos also lead the neutral series as UNM is 1-0. The lone neutral game in the series history happens to be the last time the teams faced off, on December 22, 2010 when UNM earned an 89-76 win in Las Vegas, Nev.

## HIGH-SCORING LOBOS

While defensively the Lobos have struggled to stop the attack, UNM is still producing some strong offensive numbers. Even in Saturday's loss to UTEP, UNM scored 76 points - helping the Lobos to rank 33rd in the country in scoring offense.

## GO BIG OR GO HOME

The Lobos continue to look for the big points, focusing on an offense that fires from behind the arc. UNM is ranked 14th in the nation in 3-pointers attempted (254) and 7th in 3-pointers made per game (11.8). Leading the charge are juniors Chris McNeal and Anthony Mathis who have each scored 23 on the season and post a 41.8 and 50.0 percent success rate, respectively. In addition, UNM is 11th in the country in total made 3-pointers with 94.

## DON'T FOUL WITH US!

The Lobos remain among the best in the country from the free throw line, going 78.3 percent and ranking 17th in the NCAA. Anthony Mathis is 8-10, Troy Simons is 11-13, Makuach Maluach is 9-11, Dane Kuiper is 7-8 and Joe Furstinger is 15-16 from the stripe.

## ABOUT THE 2017-18 LOBOS

The 2017-18 Lobos have just five returning student-athletes from the 2016-17 squad and feature an outstanding nine newcomers. Under first-year head coach Paul Weir, the Lobos look to improve on their 17-14 overall record last season, 10-8 in Mountain West play.

Top returners for the Lobos include lone regular starter Sam Logwood who averaged 7.3 points per game for a .449 field goal percentage and a .671 percentage from the free throw line. All four other Lobos to return to UNM this season played in at least 10 games, including junior Dane Kuiper who started 13 games, averaging 6.0 points per game.

## NEW COACH, NEW ERA

At the helm of the Lobos in the 2016-17 season will be head coach Paul Weir, officially named the 21st head coach in UNM men's basketball history on April 11, 2017. Weir spent the last season with New Mexico State where he finished 28-6 and led NMSU to a WAC Tournament Championship and an NCAA appearance. Weir is the first basketball coach to serve as the head coach for both New Mexico DI institutions.

## LOBO TRANSFERS

Of the nine fresh faces to the UNM squad, the Lobos welcome in six new transfers, four of which will be eligible to compete in the 2017-18 season. Those that are eligible and will don the Lobo Cherry & Silver this season include junior Chris McNeal (Indian Hills), senior Antino Jackson (Akron), junior Jachai Simmons (Midland College) and junior Troy Simons (Polk State). The pair of transfers that will not see action this season is JaQuan Lyle (Ohio State) and Vance Jackson (UCONN) due to NCAA transfer rules.

## LOBOS ON TV

The 2017-18 schedule includes many national and regional broadcasts of New Mexico basketball. The Lobos are currently slated for TV 22 times, including 13 of 16 Mountain West games. UNM had 22 of 26 UNM and MW controlled games selected for TV while three non-conference road games, at New Mexico State, at UTEP and at Colorado are expected to be broadcast as well. The Lobos will be on ATT SportsNet/ROOT eight times, on CBS Sports Network five times, ESPN3 five times, and ESPNU and the Mountain West Network on Stadium once. Additionally, two games (at UNLV on January 17 and January 27 at home against Colorado State) are flex games that will be either on ESPNU or ESPN3.

## THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

After two years as WisePies Arena - The Pit, the famous home of Lobo basketball has been given a new name. While it will still be referred to as "The Pit," this season will be the first that the Lobos will compete in "Dreamstyle Arena" as part of an exciting \$10 million agreement for naming rights by Dreamstyle Remodeling of both of UNM's largest-capacity athletic venues. In addition to the official renaming of the Lobo basketball arena, the UNM football stadium, formerly referred to as "University Stadium" is now officially named "Dreamstyle Stadium."

In conjunction with the new name, The Pit was given a new floor this season, featuring both "New Mexico" and "The Pit" on the baselines, the new university interlocking UNM logo, fresh Mountain West logos customized in the Lobo cherry and silver, cherry free throw lines and dual Dreamstyle Arena logos on both sides of center court.

"The Pit" is nationally recognized as one of the top basketball venues. Need more evidence? How about Sports Illustrated ranking it as one of the top 20 sporting venues, of any sport, in the world for the 20th century. The Pit is truly a special place, and it has created an unparalleled environment for the New Mexico men's basketball program. Since the Mountain West conference began in 1999-2000, New Mexico has ranked in the top two in home attendance among MW teams in every year except one, including 12 seasons as the top-ranked MW team in overall attendance.

## LOBOS FROM NEAR AND FAR

Just one Lobo on the 2017-18 roster hails from near as a New Mexico native, freshman Matt Vail. Of the remaining 13 players on the roster, two are from California (Joe Furstinger and Vance Jackson) and two more are from Indiana (Sam Logwood and JaQuan Lyle). That leaves nine players all from different states or countries.

The Lobo melting pot includes players from as close as Arizona (Connor McDougall) and Texas (Antino Jackson) and as far as Alaska (Dane Kuiper), New Jersey (Jachai Simmons), Oregon (Anthony Mathis), Pennsylvania (Troy Simons) and Tennessee (Chris McNeal).

Not only are the Lobos' home towns spread across the United States, but two come from overseas including freshmen Makuach Maluach from Sydney, Australia, and Vladimir Pinchuk from Schwelm, Germany.

## Logwood Scores 22, Lobos Falter at UTEP

**EL PASO, TEXAS** --- Senior Sam Logwood of The University of New Mexico men's basketball team led the Lobos with 22 points on Saturday night for his third game this season registering 20+, but it wasn't enough to earn UNM the win as the Lobos fell to UTEP 88-76 in Don Haskins Center.

Midway through the second half, the Lobos (3-5) got a 14-point Miner lead down to five (61-56) on a 13-4 run before UTEP (2-6) rallied back with an 8-0 run of its own to reclaim the double-digit lead, push it to 15 (71-56) and hold out for the win.

The Lobos knocked down a pair of 3-pointers from juniors Dane Kuiper and Anthony Mathis in the final 45 seconds to reduce the Miner lead to nine (84-75), but UNM was forced to foul and UTEP's free throws sealed the Lobos' fate.

After discussing the Lobos' lackluster play in the first half, head coach Paul Weir spoke about the second-half spark that led UNM to outscore the Miners 45-43 over the final 20 minutes.

"Unfortunately, it was a halftime speech that got us to where we needed to be," coach Weir said. "But just like the Maryland game, it was just too late to come back from 15 on the road, it just doesn't happen every time. We'd like it to, but it just doesn't."

"I don't think I'll think offense was the problem... I think our inability to play defense is getting very troubling. Tonight we just couldn't stop those guys, it's concerning and we just need to improve."

As a team, UNM shot 37.5 percent from the floor compared to 53.7 percent for the Miners however, despite the lopsided overall percentages both teams fired at nearly the same rate from three. UNM went 11-of-31 from behind the arc (35.5 percent) while UTEP was 9-of-24 (37.5 percent). UNM has registered at least 10 3-pointers in five of its seven games.

The Lobos entered the game ranked third in the nation in free throw percentage, but had their lowest performance of the season from the stripe, going 23-for-35 (65.7 percent).

Defensively, the Lobos outrebounded UTEP 37-33 and turned them over 14 times, while committing 14 turnovers of their own. The Miners tallied 16 points off of UNM's turnovers compared to 11 for the Lobos.

Not only did Logwood register his fifth game scoring in double figures this season, but Mathis tallied 13 points for his sixth double-digit game and senior Antino Jackson scored 10 points for his third.

Logwood also added seven rebounds to go along with junior Troy Simons' eight and freshman Vladimir Pinchuk's seven.

The Lobos will return to action on Wednesday, Dec. 6 when they travel to take on Colorado at 7 p.m. MT on the Pac-12 Network.

### Lobos pound Colorado 89-76 to advance to title game

LAS VEGAS, NEV. – The Lobos powered past Colorado 89-76 behind 18 points by senior Dairese Gary and 18 by freshman Kendall Williams. Earlier Wednesday night Northern Iowa slapped down Indiana 67-61.

The 10-1 Lobos were in a run-and-gun shootout with Colorado in the semis. One key in the championship game will be tempo. The Panthers are more deliberate on offense and more disciplined on defense.

"They are a hard team to play against," Lobo coach Steve Alford said of Northern Iowa. "Their guys understand winning and our guys understand winning."

"We'll be up long into the night trying to put a game plan together. They (Panthers) compete. They fights and it should make for a great championship game because you have two teams who are very hungry for it."

There were some key stats that jump out in UNM's win over Colorado. The Lobos shot 61.2 percent from the field, 24-of-28 from the free-throw line and outrebounded the Buffaloes 35-23. UNM's high percentage was fueled by a solid inside game and a lot of power drives to the basket.

UNM's Phillip McDonald scored 14 points, 6-foot-9 Drew Gordon had 10 points and seven boards, and freshman Alex Kirk had 10 rebounds. Gary went 10-of-10 from the free-throw line and Williams shot 7-of-8. Colorado got 25 points from Alec Burks.

Williams had a monster game with 11 assists and three steals and often was the UNM defender on Colorado's Cory Higgins, who went 4-of-13 from the field. That assist number by the first-year Lobo was the most by a UNM freshman since John Robinson had 11 in 1999. Williams was named the Route 66 Casino/Hotel Player of The Game by the Lobo Radio Network.

"We are seeing a special freshman develop here," said Alford of Williams. "Kendall had a big-time night. He has great speed to him and we have to continue to turn him loose."

Williams' assist number obviously was aided by Lobos running good offense, taking high-percentage shots - and making them. "I thought we executed very well on the offensive end," said Alford. "Our freshmen are growing up and I don't know how much more I can say about Dairese Gary."

"This kid goes as hard as he can every minute he's out there. He is a very physical guard, who knows how to use his body. He does so much for our program."

Northern Iowa (8-3) went on a 16-3 run vs. Indiana to take a 42-29 first-half lead, but Indiana fought back into a 59-59 tie with 2:35 left to play. The Panthers held on for the win getting 24 points from senior point guard Kwadzo Ahelegbe. Ahelegbe made 7-of-14 shots from the field and made 8-of-10 from the foul line. UNI's Johnny Mora poured in 15 points, including 4-of-6 from beyond the 3-point arc.

Second Half: Lobos 48, Colorado 33

The Lobos came out of the half up by eight points and extended it to 48-38 on a jump hook inside by Kirk. At the 14:10 media break, Colorado had used a trey to cut UNM's lead to 48-41. The Buffs were having trouble cutting into UNM's lead, but at the 11:15 break, they were hanging around at 53-47.

The Lobos were running smoothly on offense, but couldn't get the stops on the other end. UNM got four points off Jamal Fenton drives and a soft dunk by McDonald to go up 59-51. An A.J. Hardeman move inside made it 61-53. Another Hardeman power move inside pushed UNM up 63-53.

A Williams drive 7:47 kept UNM's lead at 10 points, 65-55, going into the 7:47 break. Gordon handed UNM its biggest lead at 12, 67-55, on another power move inside. Coach Alford called a timeout at the 6:06 mark with his team up 69-57, off a long jumper by Tony Snell.

At the 3:29 media break, UNM was in good shape, up 71-63, off a Gary steal and coast-to-coast drive. The Lobos needed to throw out a few basics to finish the win: play defense, rebound, take care of the basketball, attack the basket and make the short shots or hit some free throws.

The Lobos stayed up 75-65 scoring on power drives by Williams and Gary. At the 2:20 mark, Gary was fouled on the Colorado full-court press. The Lobo senior made both shots: 77-66. The Buffs scored inside on an in-bounds play: 77-68. Gary was fouled at the 2:00 mark, again on the Colorado press. Gary made two again: 79-69.

Williams was fouled at the 1:17 mark and again at the 1:06 mark. He made all four to keep UNM up 83-74. Hardeman added two free throws and UNM was up 85-74 going into a UNM timeout with 38.8 to play. Gary got two more at the line at 37.1: 87-74. Williams went to the line at 19.9: 89-76, which cemented the final.

First Half: Lobos 41, Colorado 33

Stat Leaders: McDonald 10 pts., Williams 8 pts., 5 assts.; Kirk 9 rebs.

You shoot 65.2 percent in a half and you should take a lead into the locker room. The Lobos did just that, blistering the nets at a 15-for-23 pace. Colorado shot 40 percent - not bad, but bad enough to find itself in an eight-point hole.

The Lobos also had a 19-to-8 edge of the backboard, paced by nine boards by Kirk. The Lobos had 11 assists, five by Williams, to two assists for the Buffaloes.

The Lobos got off to a good start and took a 13-6 lead into the first media break. The Lobos punished Colorado early with a series of treys: two long bombs from Williams and Kirk, and an old-fashioned 3-pointer from Hardeman inside.

UNM came out of that break to take an 18-8 lead on a trey by McDonald and a driving, left-handed layup by Williams.

An alley-oop pass from Gary to McDonald for a running dunk gave UNM a 22-13 lead going into the second media timeout. Colorado threw down a couple of treys sandwiched around a short Gary jumper to make it 24-19 at the 10:00 mark.

At the 7:57 break, UNM was up 26-22. UNM went up 36-26 on a Snell trey from the left baseline. At the 2:57 mark, Gary hit two free throws to keep UNM up by 10, 38-28. Colorado cut UNM's lead to 39-33 when Burks scored on a drive. Snell closed the first-half scoring to hand UNM its 41-33 halftime lead.

### Bufs Rally Falls Short At Colorado State

**FORT COLLINS** — Call it a learning experience for the Colorado Buffaloes — a very painful learning experience.

Down by as much as 17 points in the second half Saturday at Colorado State, the Buffs rallied to cut the deficit to four in the final minute, but could never get over the hump in a 72-63 loss to the Rams.

The loss dropped Colorado to 6-1 while CSU improved to 4-4.

CU was without the services of senior center Tory Miller-Stewart, who suffered a foot injury earlier this week in practice and is out for an “indefinite” amount of time, according to head coach Tad Boyle.

McKinley Wright IV led CU with 19 points and eight rebounds while George King added nine points and seven rebounds — but King hit just 3 of his 13 field goal tries as the Buffs shot just 39 percent from the field (24-for-61).

The Rams also dominated the Buffs on the boards, 46-32, and blocked nine CU shots. Despite not recording a field goal in the final seven minutes of the game, CSU managed to hold on by hitting free throws down the stretch.

“CSU beat us at our own game,” CU head coach Tad Boyle said. “We want to hold our opponents to less than 40 percent, they did that to us. We want to be plus eight on the boards, they did that to us. We want to make more free throws than our opponent shoots — they did that to us. They beat us at our own game. That’s disheartening and hopefully it’s a learning experience for our young guys.”

But, Boyle refused to use the absence of Miller-Stewart as an excuse, even with the Rams dominating the backboard.

“This loss had nothing to do with Tory Miller not being here,” Boyle said. “We miss Tory, we love Tory. But we had enough guys in uniform. I don’t want that to play into this whatsoever.”

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** It was the first true road game of the year for the young Buffs, and they played like it at times in front of a raucous Moby Arena crowd. Colorado played well in spurts — CU trailed just 38-35 at the half — but the Rams broke open a tight game after intermission with an 18-7 run in the first eight minutes to open up a 56-42 edge with 11:48 to go in the game.

CSU hit the Buffs from every position on the floor in the decisive run, getting an early 3-point bucket from Prentiss Nixon before going inside for six straight points. J.D. Paige pushed the CSU lead to double digits with three free throws — the result of King’s third foul — and the deficit grew to 14 on a fast-break slam dunk, then as high as 17.

The Buffs, meanwhile, hit a cold stretch. Along with King’s 3-for-13 day from the field (1-for-5 from 3-point range), Dominique Collier was just 4-for-10 and Namon Wright just 2-for-9. Overall, CU hit just eight of its 25 3-point tries.

“You go on the road, you know the 3s may or may not drop,” Boyle said. “You know the free throws may or may not go in. You don’t do either of those two things well, your margin for error goes down significantly. We didn’t do anything well enough tonight to win this game.”

But, the Buffs never quit. McKinley Wright scored 11 straight points in a 1:27 span to cut CSU’s lead to six with 5:26 still to play and King’s only 3-pointer of the night with 2:41 to go pulled the Buffs to within five, 65-60.

Wright was spectacular in the run, hitting a pair of 3-point shots, a conventional 3-point play and a driving layup.

Wright, though, also had some difficult moments, including driving the lane for some ill-advised shots that were rejected by the Rams.

“They baited us into taking some shots we shouldn’t have taken,” Wright said. “We watched the film and know they dare you to shoot it. We bit into it ... I did personally, took some bad shots. It’s something I’m going to learn. I’m going to be better and this team’s going to better.”

The Rams went the last seven minutes without a field goal, but hit just enough of their free throws to keep the Buffs at bay. Colorado cut the CSU cushion to four, 67-63, with just under a minute to go when Collier hit one of two free throws, but that was as close as the Buffs would get. The Rams then hit five of six free throws in the final minute to salt away the win.

“This is a disappointing loss because it’s a game in my mind we could have won, a game we should have won but we didn’t win,” Boyle said. “I have to do a lot of soul-searching myself in terms of what my role was today. I wasn’t good enough today as a coach.”

The Buffs trailed by as much as eight in the first half after an early CSU onslaught of 3-pointers helped spur an 8-0 Rams run. But the Buffs came back with a 9-2 run, sparked by a pair of McKinley Wright 3-pointers and a George King 3-point play. Colorado then took the lead momentarily on a Dominique Collier trey, 33-32, but the Rams regained the lead just before intermission.

**TURNING POINT:** After a close first half, the Rams outscored Colorado 25-11 in the first 13 minutes of the second half. While Colorado cut the margin to four in the final minute, the Buffs could never completely get over the hump.

**WHAT IT MEANS:** The Buffs have three days to regroup before their next game, a Wednesday home affair vs. New Mexico. While no doubt a disappointing loss, the Buffs — especially the young players — have to use the defeat as a learning experience. It won’t be the last hostile environment they see this year.

**CU STANDOUTS:** McKinley Wright led CU in scoring with 19 points and in rebounding with nine. ... George King endured a difficult 3-for-13 day from the floor, but finished with nine points and seven rebounds. ... Tyler Bey had six points and six rebounds. ... Dominique Collier scored 10 points and added two rebounds.

**KEY STATISTICS:** The Buffs lost the rebound battle 46-32 and also had nine of their shots blocked by a team that had blocked just 22 total in its first seven games.

**NOTEWORTHY:** The game ended a win streak for the visiting team at four. It was CSU’s first win on its home floor vs. the Buffs since 2011.

**QUOTEWORTHY:** “We’re going to get better, no doubt about it. But this stings because it was a winnable game and we didn’t get it done. Hats off to CSU. We knew we were going to get their best shot and we did. Their guys played well and we didn’t. That’s on us. Something we have to live with the rest of our lives.” — CU head coach Tad Boyle

“Our next two games, New Mexico and Xavier, they’re going to watch this film. They’re going to see we got our (butts) whooped on the glass. It’s a challenge but we’re looking forward to the challenge. We’re going to take it.” CU’s McKinley Wright

“This is going to be a learning experience for us, for sure. We’re going to take this loss and we’re going to go back to practice and find the things we need to fix — and one of the things we need to fix is rebounding.” — CU’s Dallas Walton

Coach Jimmy Valvano and the Wolfpack downed the Cougars on a last second put back by Lorenzo Charles. - The Lobos have averaged an astounding 15,410 fans the past 49 years, an amazing 95% of capacity
- The Pit has ranked in the top 25 in attendance nationally nearly every season since the 1966-67 season with 35 seasons in the top ten in the NCAA in attendance
- Led the Mountain West in attendance in 10 of the conference's 15 years of existence
- The floor is named Bob King Court in honor of the former head coach who led the Lobos from 1963 to 1972.

Men's Basketball Upended by TTU in Final Minute

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- For the first time since 2006-07, the Lobos have opened their first four games with three scoring over 90 points, but it wasn't enough on Tuesday night as Tennessee Tech pulled ahead for good in the final minute for a 103-96 win over New Mexico in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit.

Junior Chris McNeal led UNM with 29 points on the night marking the third time this season he has scored in double digits, the second over 20 points. McNeal went 8-for-16 from the field and 7-for-11 from behind the arc to go along with 6-of-8 from the free throw line.

Tennessee Tech (4-1) started the game going 0-for-10 from the field over the first 5:31, allowing the Lobos (2-2) to go on an 8-0 run and claim a nine-point advantage (10-1) with 14:29 left to play in the first half. The Lobos extended their lead to 14 over the next four minutes (24-13, 10:10) until TTU's Aleksa Jugovic scored a trio of 3-pointers in the next three Golden Eagle possessions to cut the UNM lead to eight.

TTU closed the final 10:40 of the first half shooting 15-of-19 from the field. In the first half, Jugovic couldn't miss, going 8-for-8 from the field including 6-for-6 from 3-point range and 2-for-2 from the charity stripe. His efforts helped make it a one-point game with 10 seconds left in the half until a Dane Kuiper three with two seconds on the clock stretched the Lobo lead to four at the half.

"You have to tip your cap to them," head coach Paul Weir said. "They shot the heck out of the ball tonight and made a lot of shots at the back of it. Some of them were tough and some of them were probably on us. They were good, and they were better than us tonight."

McNeal got hot toward the end of the first half, drilling three-straight threes in under a minute and picked up where he left off. He opened the second half with a three 17 seconds in to give the Lobos what would be their largest lead of the second half, seven (58-81), before the teams battled throughout the remainder of the contest.

With the Lobos trailing by one point with 1:06 left to play, 94-93, the Golden Eagles took off on an 8-0 run over 35 seconds to get out to a nine-point lead, 102-93 with 21 seconds left. Kuiper drained another three with 12 seconds left to give the Lobos hope, 102-96, but the six-point margin was too much for the final seconds.

McNeal paced the Lobos with 29 points and was followed by senior Sam Logwood with 21. The last time UNM had a pair of 20-point scorers was almost a year ago on January 7 against Nevada.

The third Lobo to score in double figures on the night was junior Anthony Mathis who notched 11, going 4-for-7 from the field and 3-for-6 from three. The outing marked the third time this season that he registered double digits.

Senior Joe Furstinger neared a double-double on the night, scoring seven points and bringing down nine rebounds. He also tied his career-high in blocks with four.

As a team, the Lobos shot 40.6 percent from the field compared to 55.7 percent for TTU. Similarly, UNM went 41 percent from three compared to 54.5 percent to the Golden Eagles, but the Lobos did have the advantage in free throws, shooting 82.8 percent (24-29) from the line compared to just 75 percent (24-32) for TTU.

After suffering drastically on the glass against New Mexico State, the Lobos stepped up their rebound game but were still out rebounded 39-32.

TTU registered 42 points in the paint to 20 for UNM and held a 49-9 fast-break point advantage. The Lobos edged the Golden Eagles in second-chance points, 13-9, and in points off of turnovers, 24-22.

"We looked like the ninth-place team in the Mountain West tonight," Weir said. Which I never thought we were going to be and we just have to do everything in our power to make sure that this is not going to be our final destination. All I can tell you is that we are going to do whatever we can to work our way out of whatever we're in right now."

"We're not discouraged," McNeal said. "We're just going to try and bounce back, come back tomorrow and work even harder. Try to turn this around."

UNM will return to action on Friday, Nov. 24 when the Lobos compete in the third round of the Emerald Coast Classic against TCU at 5 p.m. MT. TCU is currently receiving votes in the USA Today Coaches Poll. Both Friday and Saturday's games will be available to watch on CBS Sports Network.

Lobo Comeback Falls Short vs (RV) TCU

NICEVILLE, FLA. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team lost a heartbreaker on Friday night after nearly pulling off an upset over (RV) TCU at the Emerald Coast Classic in Niceville, Fla. The Lobos came back from a 13-point deficit and looked to junior Chris McNeal for a game-winning 3-pointer with 1.9 seconds left in regulation, but it went wide and UNM fell 69-67.

Senior Sam Logwood led New Mexico with a career-high 27 points, leading a trio of Lobos who scored in double figures including McNeal and junior Antino Jackson (12 apiece).

The Lobos will face either St. Bonaventure or Maryland Saturday at 2 p.m. MT (3 p.m. CT).

As a team, despite being outshot and out-rebounded, the Lobos (2-3) forced 16 turnovers on TCU (5-0) and committed just nine to keep them in the game. UNM had 14 points off of turnovers (TCU had 11) and edged TCU 16-14 in second-chance points while the Horned Frogs dominated the paint, outscoring UNM 46-24 down low.

"You have to tip your cap to TCU, it's a big team, a good rebounding team that just kind of continued to punish us inside and they did a really good job," head coach Paul Weir said.

"We're going to play teams very similar to TCU this year, they're going to be bigger than us, stronger than us, they're going to be more experienced than us," Weir said. "They have a lot of things we don't, so we're trying to accentuate the things we have, which to me would be speed, shooting, depth and conditioning and trying to bring those into the game as much as we can."

The Lobos shot a season-low 34.3 percent from the field and 20 percent from 3-point range to hang in with the national vote recipient TCU. The Horned Frogs went 47.5 percent from the field and 28.6 percent from three while the Lobos dominated at the charity stripe, going 15-for-18 for 83.3 percent while TCU was just 9-for-17 (52.9 percent).

The victory marked TCU's ninth straight dating back to last season when the squad captured the NIT Championship.

New Mexico jumped out on top early, getting out to a 9-2 lead with 17:46 left in the first half before TCU chipped away and cut the lead to one.

The Horned Frogs followed with an 11-1 run over three minutes to take a seven-point advantage, 31-24 with 4:08 left in the half. TCU got up by as much a nine before a layup with eight seconds on the clock from senior Joe Furstinger made it seven, 40-33 at the half.

In the second half, TCU pushed the lead out to 13 before the Lobos roared back on a 12-3 run sparked by a jumper and a three from McNeal to get back within four, 61-57 with 8:31 left to play. The run was full of TCU turnovers and Lobo buckets to shift the momentum in favor of UNM.

McNeal hit a big three with the Lobos down five with 12 seconds left to bring the game within two, 69-67. Weir called his only full timeout to draft a play, but McNeal called the Lobos' final timeout on the inbound before the final shot went wide.

## Game 6 - New Mexico 65, Maryland 80

Nov. 25, 2017 | Niceville, Fla. (The Arena)

Early Deficit Determines Lobo Loss vs Maryland

NICEVILLE, FLA. --- The University of New Mexico men's basketball team fell 80-65 to Maryland (6-1) in the consolation game of the Emerald Coast Classic on Saturday afternoon, unable to overcome an early 24-point deficit. Senior Sam Logwood was named to the Emerald Coast Classic All-Tournament Team for his efforts in the tournament while the Lobos claimed fourth place in the tournament.

Chris McNeal led the Lobos (2-4) with 19 points in his fifth game registering double figures, followed by Anthony Mathis with 12 points on four 3-pointers. The Lobos shot 33.3 percent from the field on the day after opening the game a dismal 1-12 (8.3 percent) over the first nine minutes.

The loss is the fourth consecutive for New Mexico, as the Lobos have struggled since opening the season with two large victories. One day after falling to TCU at the buzzer, the Lobos never led against Maryland despite outscoring the Terps 62-53 after the opening 8:42 of the game.

The Terrapins jumped out to an 8-0 lead as the Lobos missed their first four shots of the night. Makuach Maluach put New Mexico on the board with a three to make the score 8-3 with 16 minutes on the clock, but Maryland went on a 19-0 run to take a 27-3 lead.

The Lobos didn't score again until the 11:18 mark on a Troy Simons free throw to make the score 27-4. UNM went on a 16-7 run to cut the lead to 34-19 on a Mathis 3-pointer with 6:25 left in the half, and the Lobos maintained a similar margin for the rest of the half, trailing 46-28 at the break.

The Lobos shot 29 percent in the first half, led by Mathis, who shot 3-for-3 from behind the arc. Joe Furstinger and Troy Simons were each whistled for three fouls of UNM's 13 total in the half.

New Mexico opened the second half with a quick Logwood steal and McNeal three-pointer to cut the lead to 15 at 46-31, but a 9-0 Maryland run made the score 55-31 to tie the Lobos' largest deficit of the game to that point.

## Game 7 - New Mexico 78, Evansville 59

Five score in double figures, Lobos claim 78-56 win

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- Paced by five Lobos in double figures, The University of New Mexico men's basketball team rebounded from a four-game losing skid on Wednesday night in Dreamstyle Arena - The Pit, topping Evansville by a score of 78-59 while shooting 49 percent from the floor (30-61).

Senior Sam Logwood and junior Troy Simons led the Lobos (3-4) with 14 points each, with Logwood adding five rebounds. Junior Chris McNeal added 13 points while junior Anthony Mathis and freshman Makuach Maluach chipped in 10 points apiece. The Lobos also posted 23 assists on 30 made baskets, 10 of which came from senior Antino Jackson.

"Obviously it was really good to get a win," head coach Paul Weir said. "I thought we played a lot better tonight. We had a little lull there in the middle of the second half... but you've got to give Evansville credit. I've coached against and scouted against a lot of teams, and Marty Simmons is as good of a basketball coach as I've ever had to scout against. He eats basketball for breakfast. The guy is just awesome."

Jackson's 10 assists marks the second time this season that a Lobo has posted 10 or more assists, despite scoring just two points on the night compared to his usual 9.3 average.

"We've talked about it all week: your shots can't dictate your effect on the game," Weir said. "Antino's ability to push the ball and transition in the second half really helped us win the game."

After entering Wednesday's game ranked fourth in the nation in forced turnovers (21.33) and eighth in turnover margin (6.5), New Mexico forced over 20 turnovers (21) for the fourth time this season while only committing 11, including just three in the second half.

Evansville (5-2) entered the matchup second in the country in three-point percentage (47.8) and the Lobos held the Purple Aces to just 3-of-13 from behind the arc, including 0-for-6 in the first half. Wednesday marked the first time this season that Evansville has been completely denied from the arc in a half.

In addition, the Purple Aces entered the game ranked eighth nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 58.2 points per game. Prior to the Lobos' 78 points, the most Evansville had allowed in a game this season was 63.

The Lobos got off to a quick start as Simons opened the game with an early three-pointer, and UNM followed with an 11-0 run four minutes into the game to take a 16-5 lead, highlighted by back-to-back threes from junior Dane Kuiper. Evansville answered with a 9-0 run to close the gap to 16-14 with six minutes left in the first half.

The Lobos extended the lead back to nine at 25-16 on a pair of Logwood free throws three minutes later, and held a similar margin the rest of the half to enter the break leading 35-27.

New Mexico shot 40 percent from the floor, including 6-of-15 from behind the arc and a perfect 5-for-5 from the charity stripe, compared to Evansville's 33.3 field goal percentage, no three-pointers and 77.8 from the free throw line.

The Lobos opened up a 52-40 lead eight minutes into the second half with threes from McNeal, Simons and Mathis to fire up the crowd and claim the momentum. Four minutes later, another three from Mathis extended the Lobo lead to 19, 62-43.

Senior Joe Furstinger followed with a dunk 30 seconds later and the Lobos continued to run away with the game. An eight-point run fueled by a pair of Logwood layups, a McNeal jumper and a swift jumper from freshman Vladimir Pinchuk increased the lead to 24 with 1:43 left before the final 78-59 score.

The Lobos were able to capitalize on Evansville turnovers, scoring 20 points, while also outscoring the Purple Aces 20-2 on the fast break.

"It feels great (to get the win)," Maluach said. "There's not a better feeling than winning in front of your home crowd. We're a resilient group and we like each other a lot. When we win, we win together, and when we lose, we lose together. Hopefully we win more games than we lose."

New Mexico travels to face UTEP in El Paso, Texas on Saturday, Dec. 2 at 7 p.m.

Logwood Scores 22, Lobos Falter at UTEP

EL PASO, TEXAS --- Senior Sam Logwood of The University of New Mexico men's basketball team led the Lobos with 22 points on Saturday night for his third game this season registering 20+, but it wasn't enough to earn UNM the win as the Lobos fell to UTEP 88-76 in Don Haskins Center.

Midway through the second half, the Lobos (3-5) got a 14-point Miner lead down to five (61-56) on a 13-4 run before UTEP (2-6) rallied back with an 8-0 run of its own to reclaim the double-digit lead, push it to 15 (71-56) and hold out for the win.

The Lobos knocked down a pair of 3-pointers from juniors Dane Kuiper and Anthony Mathis in the final 45 seconds to reduce the Miner lead to nine (84-75), but UNM was forced to foul and UTEP's free throws sealed the Lobos' fate.

After discussing the Lobos' lackluster play in the first half, head coach Paul Weir spoke about the second-half spark that led UNM to outscore the Miners 45-43 over the final 20 minutes.

"Unfortunately, it was a halftime speech that got us to where we needed to be," coach Weir said. "But just like the Maryland game, it was just too late to come back from 15 on the road, it just doesn't happen every time. We'd like it to, but it just doesn't."

"I don't think I'll think offense was the problem... I think our inability to play defense is getting very troubling. Tonight we just couldn't stop those guys, it's concerning and we just need to improve."

As a team, UNM shot 37.5 percent from the floor compared to 53.7 percent for the Miners however, despite the lopsided overall percentages both teams fired at nearly the same rate from three. UNM went 11-of-31 from behind the arc (35.5 percent) while UTEP was 9-of-24 (37.5 percent). UNM has registered at least 10 3-pointers in five of its seven games.

The Lobos entered the game ranked third in the nation in free throw percentage, but had their lowest performance of the season from the stripe, going 23-for-35 (65.7 percent).

Defensively, the Lobos outrebounded UTEP 37-33 and turned them over 14 times, while committing 14 turnovers of their own. The Miners tallied 16 points off of UNM's turnovers compared to 11 for the Lobos.

Not only did Logwood register his fifth game scoring in double figures this season, but Mathis tallied 13 points for his sixth double-digit game and senior Antino Jackson scored 10 points for his third.

Logwood also added seven rebounds to go along with junior Troy Simons' eight and freshman Vladimir Pinchuk's seven.

The Lobos will return to action on Wednesday, Dec. 6 when they travel to take on Colorado at 7 p.m. MT on the Pac-12 Network.
