NEW MEXICO LOOKS TO MAINTAIN MOMENTUM AT UAB

New Mexico beach volleyball is aiming to build on its current run of success as it heads to Birmingham, Alabama, to compete in the Blazer Beach Duals this Friday and Saturday.

After stretching their hot streak to seven wins in their last nine matches, the Lobos (10-9) will look to continue winning when they play Lincoln Memorial (5-9), UT Martin (0-6) and host UAB (9-14) at the West Campus Athletic Complex.

With just two more weeks remaining in the regular season, the Lobos can finish their 2017 campaign on a high if they can keep playing at a high level.

UNM has performed exceptionally well over the past few weeks, coming together after posting a 3-7 record in the early goings of the season.

And while the Lobos did open their season with a challenging slate that featured eight matches against nationally ranked teams, their early tribulations have translated to success over the past few weeks of competition.

This weekend is shaping up to be another productive weekend for New Mexico as it heads to Birmingham.

Julia Warren & Lauren Twitty have reeled off five straight victories from the No. 5 position, and have climbed to within one win of the team lead. They're currently 12-5 on the season.

Just ahead of that tandem in the win column are the duos of **Devanne Sours & Lise Rugland** and **Marisa Doran & Eastyn Baleto**.

Out of the No. 2 spot, Sours & Rugland have compiled a at 13-6 record, and had won nine of their last 12 matches. They stumbled at home vs. Colorado Mesa last weekend, but have otherwise been rolling since mid-March.

Doran & Baleto have also been on a tear recently, eight wins in their last nine matches. Currently sitting at 13-5 on the season, the pair has been sweeping opponents left and right, with seven two-set sweeps since March 17.

However, the Lobos have been receiving contributions across the board during its run.

New Mexico's top-ranked partnership of Cassie House & Ashley Kelsey own an 11-8 record on

the season and have picked up points for UNM against some of the best pairs in the NCAA.

House & Kelsey have also played some of their strongest ball over the past three weeks of action, tallying 15 sets (out of 24) where they've held their opponents to less than 15 points in a set

Nelson and his staff have also seen some solid play from some other tandems, including Jackie Baro & Carly Beddingfield and Victoria Spragg & Chloe Crappell. Both of those tandems picked up wins last week playing out of the No. 4 position, and have provided a measure of consistency after UNM shuffled pairings and positions a month ago.

NEW MEXICO RECEIVING VOTES IN NATIONAL POLL

The University of New Mexico beach volleyball team is receiving votes in the AVCA Collegiate Beach Volleyball Poll as it enters the seventh week of the 2017 season.

Unofficially, the Lobos check in at 25th in poll, which was release on Monday, April 10. It's the fifth regular-season AVCA poll out of six that New Mexico has appeared in.

Ironically enough, however, UNM did not make an appearance in the DiG Magazine poll. After either being ranked or receiving votes in the 20-team poll for the entire season (vs. the 15-team AVCA poll), the Lobos were not listed among

the teams in the April 10 release.

Overall, New Mexico is 10-9 on the season, with all its losses were to teams ranked in the polls at the time. For the second straight week, the Lobos get break from ranked action, taking on UAB, Lincoln Memorial and UT Martin at the Blazer Beach Duals in Birmingham, Alabama.

The AVCA poll has USC (25-0), Pepperdine (18-2), UCLA (25-2), Florida State (18-6) and Long Beach State (21-5) as the top five teams, while the DiG poll ranks its top five as USC, UCLA, Pepperdine, FSU and LBSU.

By the end of the season, New Mexico will have played 11 of its 26 matches against teams ranked in the polls.

STREAKING

Coming into the season, there had been eight instances of a New Mexico pair winning at least five consecutive matches.

So far during the 2017 campaign, the Lobos have registered three more.

Eastyn Baleto & Marisa Doran reeled off six wins in a row, starting with a come-frombehind, three-set win over Georgia State. They added wins over Morehead State, Jacksonville State, No. 14/12 Stetson, Lincoln Memorial and CSU Bakersfield.

Their run of six straight wins is tied for the fourth-longest in program history. Last season, the duo posted the No. 1 (14 wins) streak and also have another streak of six wins.

Their winning streak also included 12 straight set wins, which also ranks as the fourth-longest such run. They also own the program record in this category with 22 straight set wins last season.

Additionally, **Devanne Sours & Lise Rugland** posted their own five-match winning streak, capturing five straight from March 12-18. The opened with a win over No. 13/8 Arizona, and followed that with victories over No. 17/RV Florida Atlantic, No. 12/8 Georgia State, Morehead State and Jacksonville State.

The tandem's winning streak included nothing but two-set wins, giving the tandem a 10-set winning streak. That streak ties for the fourthlongest in program history, just four behind a 14-set run they had last season.

Over the last two weeks, Julia Warren & Lauren Twitty have gotten in on the action, winning five straight matches. They've beaten CSU Bakersfield, Arizona, Santa Clara and Colorado Mesa (twice) for their five consecutive wins.

CLEAN SWEEP

When the Lobos sweep opponents, they leave no doubt in the final score.

Of New Mexico's seven sweeps this season, all but one were dominant wins where UNM won every court in two sets. UNM's only sweep where they didn't win every court in two sets

was vs. Colorado Mesa, where the No. 4 court went to three sets.

Of the 71 sets the Lobos have played in 5-0 wins this season, they've lost only one (vs. Colorado Mesa) with just 11 having been decided by three points or fewer.

The seven sweeps match the number of sweeps UNM tallied in 2016. Over the three-year history of the program, New Mexico has logged 17 sweeps.

FROM THRILLER TO KILLER

Cassie House & Ashley Kelsey face off against some of the toughest pairs in the nation playing out of the No. 1 position for the Lobos. And that duo had been giving the fans their money's worth during the early goings of the season.

During the first two weeks of the season (eight matches), House & Kelsey saw eight of their 16 sets decided by three points or fewer.

During that stretch of white-knuckle play, they posted five 21-19 scores, winning three. Two of those 21-19 victories came in a marquee win over Arizona State's top tandem of Bianca Arellano/Whitney Follette on March 12. They also went to extra points twice during the first two weeks of action, with a 25-23 loss to Loyola Marymount and a 22-20 setback to TCU.

However, over the last three weeks of action, they started to play some of their best ball, pummeling their opponents at a much higher frequency.

Over their last nine matches, House & Kelsey have won 14 of the 24 sets that they've played by at least seven points. During the same time, they've played just five sets that were decided by three points or less.

Last season, 19 of their 48 sets were decided by three points or fewer, while only six were won by at least seven points.

DOWNSIZING

Like their teammates in the No. 1 position, the Lobos' No. 2 tandem of **Devanne Sours & Lise Rugland** have also seen a change to their style of play the last two weeks.

During the first two weeks of the season, they played half of their eight matches to three sets. Three of those three-setters were losses, but they did manage a three-set win over Grand Canyon.

However, over the last three weeks of play, they have played virtually nothing but two-set matches. Sours & Rugland have won 15 of their 23 sets by at least six points (with nine by at least nine), and have only seen seven sets come down to three points or fewer.

RETURN TO FORM

Last season, Marisa Doran & Eastyn Baleto tore their way through their schedule to the tune of a 23-3 record. Two of their three losses were three-setters, which essentially meant Doran & Baleto were about as sure of a bet as your were going to get on the beaches of Albuquerque.

However, through the early goings of the 2017 season, they were just 5-4. But, over their last nine matches, they've returned to form, reeling off eight wins to improve to a team-best 13-5 on the season.

All eight of those wins during their run have been two-set sweeps. Just one set in those eight sweeps was decided by less than five points. In fact, Doran & Baleto held their opponents to less than 14 points in 10 sets.

WARREN/TWITTY NAMED TO WILDCAT SPRING CHALLENGE ALL-TOURNEY TEAM

Julia Warren & Lauren Twitty were named to the Wildcat Spring Challenge All-Tournament team after a 3-0 performance on March 31-April 1 in Tucson, Arizona.

The duo were the only Lobo tandem to post a spotless record during the tournament as they played on the No. 5 court and scored a point vs. CSU Bakersfield, No. 8/8 Arizona and Santa Clara.

They scored New Mexico's only point against the host Wildcats, winning 21-15, 16-21, 15-10. They also captured their matches vs. the Roadrunners and the Broncos in convincing fashion, winning 21-8, 21-15 and 21-15, 21-9, respectively.

SHE'S BEEN EVERYWHERE

Over the course of the three-year history of New Mexico beach volleyball, only one player has managed to play at least one match in every position. That player: **Chloe Crappell**.

With her debut at the No. 4 slot at the Wildcat Spring Challenge, Chloe has now seen action at the 1's, 2's, 3's, 4's and 5's positions for the Lobos.

She's played the bulk of her 20 career matches at the Nos. 2 and 3 courts, going 3-3 and 0-6, respectively. She is also 1-2 all-time at the 1's, 2-1 at the 4's (all this season) and 2-0 at the 5's

The only other players who have come close to the platinum sombrero are **Julia Warren** and **Lise Rugland**, who have played in four of the five positions.

20-Win Club, Pairs Style

Entering the program's third year of play, just one tandem, **Marisa Doran & Eastyn Baleto**, had reached 20 career pairs wins.

That duo, which is currently 36-8 all-time,

actually broke the 20-win plateau last season during their 23-3 campaign.

But, as the 2017 campaign has continued, two other Lobo partnerships have eclipsed that plateau.

Four weeks ago at the Stetson Beach Invitational, **Devanne Sours & Lise Rugland** joined their teammates in the 20-win club, as they won five of six matches. They are currently 27-12 all-time.

Additionally, Cassie House & Ashley Kelsey reached that mark after picking up two wins at the Wildcat Spring Challenge. They currently own an 22-18 all-time record.

Next up to join the club is **Julia Warren & Lauren Twitty**, who currently own 12 wins through their first season playing together.

30-WIN CLUB. INDIVIDUAL STYLE

While just three tandems currently reside in the 20-Win Club, that makes sense since pairs change over the course of players' careers.

However, with a handful of Lobos having played for better parts of 2 ½ seasons, a handful of student-athletes have won over 30 matches individually, earning a spot in the 30-Win Club.

Currently, **Eastyn Baleto** is the clubhouse leader with 45 career wins. Next behind is **Julia Warren**, who has 41 career wins.

But, after going 5-1 at the Stetson Beach Invitational during mid-March, **Marisa Doran** and **Lise Rugland** both surpassed 30 career wins individually. Doran currently owns 36 career wins, followed by Rugland's 34.

Devanne Sours also eclipsed the 30-win mark at the Wildcat Spring Challenge and owns 32 wins heading into the Lobos' home weekend.

Ashley Kelsey (26 wins) and Cassie House (23) can also make their way into the club later in the season with at least seven matches left in the season.

SCOUTING LINCOLN MEMORIAL

The Lobos will meet one familiar foe in this trip to Birmingham, as they'll face off against Lincoln Memorial for the second time in a month.

New Mexico swept by the Division II school from Harrogate, Tennessee, in their first meeting back on March 18 at the Stetson Beach Invitational in Tavares, Florida.

Since that weekend (the Railsplitters' first of 2017), LMU has had a streaky season. Lincoln Memorial dropped nine of its first 11 games, but is currently riding on a three-game win streak to sit 5-9 on the season.

The Railsplitters have also taken on some strong competition, facing off against Florida Atlantic, Tulane, College of Charleston, UAB and Georgia State. LMU has wins over Division I schools Austin Peay, Jacksonville State and Morehead State.

Lincoln Memorial has two pairs that have won at least six matches. Abby Cash/Jamie Jehne are 6-8 from the No. 1 position, with wins over College of Charleston, Jacksonville State and Austin Peay. Beka Wachob/Erica Whiteaker are also 6-8 from the No. 5 spot.

SCOUTING UAB

UAB is 9-14 on the season, but has won five of its last eight after dropping 10 straight during March. The Blazers, out of the Coastal Collegiate Sports Association, have wins over Austin Peay (four times), and ULM, but have also lost to Mercer (three times), Jacksonville and North Florida.

UAB is led by its top pair of Kenley Adams/ Emily Martinez, who have posted a 9-4 record, largely from the No 3 spot. The tandem has a win over Georgia State's 3's, and has won eight of its last nine matches.

However, the Blazers have had little consistency in their lineup during the season, having played 23 different pairs this season. Only three pairs — Adams/Martinez, Gabbi Moreno/Rachel Evans (7-8) and Avei Logoleo/ Erika Zembyla (3-12) — have played together in at least half of UAB's matches this season.

Individually, Martinez, Adams and Moreno are the only players to have a winning record this season.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN

UT Martin has compiled a 0-6 record so far during its first season of beach volleyball. The Skyhawks out of Martin, Tennessee, have played just two weeks, and have been swept in every match except one, a 4-1 setback to Missouri Baptist.

UT Martin has lost to Austin Peay, ULM and Morehead State in its last three matches.

Jemima Idemudia/Macy Reigelsperger are the only Skyhawks pair to have won a point this season, sporting a 1-5 record from the No. 3 position. The team's top two tandems, Macy Catlett/Hannah Phillips in the 1's and Hayley Gray/Rachel Noffsinger in the 2's, are both 0-6 for head coach Jaclynn Yocum.

And we meet again...

New Mexico is a bit of an island in the world of NCAA beach volleyball. The Lobos are the only team in the state of New Mexico to sponsor beach volleyball as an NCAA varsity sport, so with the lack of in-state competition, UNM has to find nearby neighbors for games.

With multiple schools in Arizona sponsoring the sport, the Lobos can travel west for some matches, which means New Mexico has played its fair share of games against those schools.

In fact, of the 59 matches ever played in UNM history, 17 have come against Arizona schools. (That's nearly 30 percent.)

The Lobos have played Arizona six times, plus

five matches against both Arizona State and Grand Canyon. The 17th match came in this season's opener vs. Benedictine University at Mesa.

UNM will get one more opportunity to add to this list when its faces off against Arizona State on April 22 in Tempe.

movin' on up

Although the Lobos have been on a roll their last nine games — winning seven during that span — it wasn't until their 4-1 win vs. Colorado Mesa on April 8 that the beach volleyball program at UNM once again rose above .500 for its all-time record.

After a 3-11 record during it inaugural season in 2015 (which featured a loss in the first game followed by one win in its next 12 games), New Mexico managed to make up eight games in 2016 to play seven games with an all-time record above .500. But the Lobos ended their 2016 campaign with a 20-20 all-time record.

UNM did surpass .500 after its first game of the 2017 season, moving to 21-20 all-time after beating Benedictine University at Mesa, but a 2-7 stretch pull the Lobos at 23-27 all-time heading into their current run off success.

With their win vs. Colorado Mesa, New Mexico currently sits at 30-29 all-time. Their match vs. Lincoln Memorial on April 14 will be just the ninth the team has ever played at .500 or better.

HEAD EAST

While also the name of a hard rock band from Illinois (their song "Never Been Any Reason" charted at No. 68 on the *Billboard* Hot 100 in 1975), Head East was also the mantra of the Lobos during their Spring Break trip to Florida on March 15-20.

When New Mexico headed to Tavares, Florida, for the Stetson Beach Invitational, it was the team's first-ever foray into the Eastern time zone and the eastern portion of the United States.

Last year, UNM made it as far east as Baton Rouge, but the state capitol of Louisiana is in the Central time zone and its arguably more "south" than "east".

The Lobos will also make a trip to Birmingham this weekend for the Blazer Beach Duals, but, again, Birmingham is more south than east and resides in the Central time zone.

New Mexico's trip to Florida also added to the Lobos' list of states visited. Of the 18 weekends of competition in program history, 10 have been to Arizona (including three this season), with four in Albuquerque, two in California and one each in Texas, Louisiana and Florida.

LOBOS FINISH 2016 WITH STRONG PRESENCE IN POLLS

The New Mexico beach volleyball team finished its second season with a strong presence in the national polls, ranking 18th in the season-ending DiG Magazine Poll and receiving votes in the final AVCA Collegiate Beach Volleyball poll.

The Lobos, who compiled a 17-9 record on the year, unofficially finished as the 17th-ranked team in the 10-team AVCA ranking released Tuesday, May 10, and closed their second season as the youngest program ranked in the DiG Magazine poll released Thursday, May 5.

Overall, New Mexico received votes in the AVCA poll in all but three releases since the start of the regular season, rising to an unofficial high of 13th twice (March 28 and April 11).

The Lobos also maintained a steady presence in the DiG Magazine poll, first being ranked on March 29 and climbing to a program-best No. 12 on April 12.

During the 2016 season, UNM played USC, Florida State, No. 6 Arizona and No. 10 LSU and had matches against six other teams — No. 11 Grand Canyon, No. 14 Tulane, No. 16 California, No. 20 South Carolina, (RV) TCU and (RV) Washington — that were either ranked or receiving votes in the DiG Magazine poll.

BEACH VOLLEYBALL POSTS PROGRAM-BEST GPA IN FALL 2016

After posting a tremendous campaign in the sand last spring, the University of New Mexico beach volleyball team posted a stellar semester in the classroom last fall.

The Lobos recorded a team GPA of 3.64 for the Fall 2016 semester, the highest in the five-semester history of the program. It's fourth semester that the team registered a mark of at least 3.4.

The beach team combined with the rest of the women's sports at UNM for a 3.55 GPA. It's the 13th-straight semester of at least a 3.4 by the combined women's teams, as well.

A PRIMER ON BEACH VOLLEYBALL

Beach volleyball and court volleyball share many of the same basic rules. Each side gets three hits, there's rally scoring, and a team earns a points when the ball hits the ground or goes out of bounds. But there are some key difference between the two sports:

- Beach volleyball is a partner sport played during the spring. Court volleyball is a sixplayer sport played during the fall.
- Beach volleyball plays the best of three sets, with the first two sets played to 21 points, and a tiebreaker set played to 15 points, if necessary. A set must be won by at least two points.
- Open-handed tipping is prohibited in beach

volleyball and the block touch counts as one of three permitted contacts.

- Coaches may only speak or give any kind of input to their players during timeouts or between sets.
- Beach volleyball players switch sides of the court every seven points during a 21-point set and every five points during a 15-point set.
- Beach volleyball is usually contested in dual matches, where the winning team is the school that wins three of five individual matches versus its opponent. Similar in format to tennis, each of those individual matches consist of a doubles — a pair of teammates ranked by ability — that are matched against their corresponding doubles from the opposing team.

BEACH VOLLEYBALL ENTERS 2ND SEASON AS 90TH NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Before the 2016 season, the NCAA approved beach volleyball as the 90th NCAA Championship at the 2015 NCAA Convention, which allowed the sport to advance from the emerging sports for women list to a full-fledged NCAA championship.

The NCAA Beach Volleyball Committee also determined the sport will be officially referred to as "beach volleyball". When the sport was placed on the list of emerging sports for women in 2009, it was called sand volleyball. But because the sport is known as beach volleyball at all other levels of play throughout the world, the committee made its decision to refer to the sport as beach volleyball.

The second-annual NCAA Beach Volleyball Championships will take place May 5-7, 20167 at the Gulf Shores Public Beach in Gulf Shore, Alabama. The championship will have an eight-team bracket that will be played in a double-elimination format.

USC won the inaugural NCAA National Championship 3-0 over Florida State.

Beach volleyball is the fastest-growing NCAA sport with 53 Division I colleges and universities sponsoring. NCAA rules require 40 sponsoring schools to request an NCAA championship. Data shows that on average, 60 percent of participants at a sponsoring school participate only in beach volleyball instead of playing both beach and indoor volleyball.
