

POSTGAME NOTES: NEW MEXICO 147, NORTHERN NEW MEXICO 76

Matchup Notes

- First ever matchup between UNM and Northern New Mexico
- Paul Weir's first official game as head coach of UNM
- Starters: Chris McNeal, Dane Kuiper, Antino Jackson, Joe Furstinger, Sam Logwood

In-Game Notes

- 147 points is the most points scored in a single game in Lobo history (broke the record of 136 vs. Texas-Arlington on Nov. 23, 1990).
- Tied the record for the largest margin of victory in Lobo history with 71 points (tied record against Dartmouth on Dec. 29, 1972, 107-36).
- 40 assists ties the record for most in a game in team history (had 40 assists vs. Central Florida on Dec. 16, 1978 and vs. Texas-Arlington on Nov. 23, 1990).
- In his official Lobo debut, Chris McNeal had the first points/assists double-double since Kendall Williams on March 2, 2014.
- Lobos had eight players score in double digits, with Joe Furstinger, Anthony Mathis and Dane Kuiper all tying their career-highs.
- Scored 74 and 73 points in the first and second half respectively.
- 74 points in the first half was just two shy of the all-time record for points in a half (76 vs. Texas-Arlington on Nov. 23, 1990, second half)
- 55 field goals is four shy of the record for most in a game in Lobo history. Lobos shot 64.7% on 85 attempts (record is 59 vs. Texas-Arlington, Nov. 23, 1990).
- 22 steals is the second-most in a game in team history (highest was 25 against Western New Mexico on Nov. 28, 1990).
- Forced 33 turnovers, the first time the Lobos have forced more than 20 since Dec. 17, 2016 vs UAPB (25).
- Made 18 three-pointers, shooting 46.2% on 39 attempts, two off the record of 20 vs. Santa Clara on Nov. 13, 2004.
- Lobos had 71 points from their bench.
