LOBO SKIING - TEAM NOTES

About the 2016 Lobos

The 2016 University of New Mexico Lobos return 12 letter winners from 2015's squad which finished fifth at the NCAA Championships. The team features plenty of experience on the women's side with two NCAA titles in Nordic in the form of Emilie Cedervärn in last year's classical race and Eva Sever Rus in the 2014 freestyle race.

Cedervärn and Sever Rus are the only two All-Americans that return from the 2015 season, but UNM is still plenty deep. While the only other member of the women's Nordic squad returning is Heleene Tambet, the women's alpine squad features five returnees from last year, and of those five, Sydney Staples (2015), Sara Ottosson (2015), Karoline Søvik Myklebust (2014) and Courtney Altringer (2014) all have NCAA experience, and Taylor Grauer is ready to make that leap as well in her third season.

Three newcomers in Kati Roivas, Julia Devaux and Brenna Egan will be looking to take the departed Jessica Gnüchtel's place at the 2016 NCAA championships, while Katharine Irwin is the only addition for the alpine squad.

It's the men's side where experience is lacking. Aljaž Praznik is the top Nordic returner, and he qualified for the 2015 NCAAs but was a late scratch due to illness. The rapidly improving Kyle Beling is the only other Lobo with Nordic experience, and they are joined by Austin Huneck, Petteri Vaherkoski and Niklas Rombock.

For Alpine, 2015 NCAA qualifer Carl-Johan Öster returns along with Patrick Brancher, who like Myklebust, missed most of 2015 with an injury. Five talented rookies in Alex Barounos, Rob Greig, Youri Mougel, Tyler Theis and Nick Veth will all have chances to showcase their abilities and qualify for NCAAs.

<u>Drew Judycki Memorial/Jade Enterprises/UNM</u> Invitational Recap

New Mexico suffered a bit in the regular season finale with some injuries and illness to a host of Nordic skiers, but the Lobos got a great showing from the alpine squad as the team finished in fourth place.

While not able to defend it's two-time championship in its own meet, the Lobos did have their best alpine showing of the season as Courtney Altringer had a career-best finish of second place on the first slalom day, her first collegiate podium. Carl-Johan Öster also had a career-best finish, just missing the podium as he came in fourth on day one.

While the alpine course became a hockey rink of sorts on Sunday due to a quick overnight freeze, UNM still recorded its highest alpine totals of the season.

In Nordic, defending national champion Emilie Cedervärn skipped the meet due to a cold, as did Austin Huneck for the men, putting UNM in a hole early. Then the Lobos lost Aljaž Praznik to a back injury on Sunday and Julia Devaux to shin splints on Sunday as well, meaning four scorers were missing, which factored in UNM's Nordic showing.

Still, the fourth place finish tied for the best finish of the season for UNM as the Lobos finished fourth at the Montana State Invitational.

Spencer James Nelson/Colorado Invitational Recap

New Mexico had its best showing of the season, recording 514 points and finishing a very close fifth place at the 2016 Spencer James Nelson/Colorado Invitational. The Lobos were easily led by Emilie Cedervärn, who won both Nordic races to score 80 points.

Katharine Irwin also picked up a podium finish with



a third place showing in the giant slalom, and the men's alpine squad continue its improvement as Carl-Johan Öster earned the men's alpine team a top 10 finish, coming in seventh place in the giant slalom. Overall, the Lobos had 12 top 10 finishes in the meet, easily the best showing of the season.

Cedervärn Named RMISA Skier of the Week

Emilie Cedervärn was named the RMISA Female Nordic Skier of the Week by league officials after sweeping the 5K freestyle and the 15K classical races at the Spencer James Nelson/Colorado Invitational at Steamboat Springs, Colo. Those races were also at the site of the 2016 NCAA National Championships.

Cedervärn's two wins gave her three for the season, and eight in her career, which ties her with Martina Stursova for the most Nordic wins in school history. Emilie has six meets left to break that mark, including two races at home.

Other winners from the RMISA this week were Taylor Shiffrin, Denver (Men's Alpine), Julie Mohagen, Utah (Women's Alpine) and Moritz Madlener, Denver (Men's Nordic).

Cedervärn ... Swedish for "Record Setter"

Emilie Cedervärn's two wins at the Spencer James Nelson/Colorado Invitational moved her into a tie for first place in the UNM record book for most career Nordic wins with eight. The win was her third of the season after having five wins last year. She is now tied with Martina Stursova for first place with her eight wins.

Emilie Cedervärn last year did something no Lobo skier had ever done before, and that was sweep the freestyle and classical races in a non-home meet. She finished off the feat on Thursday, February 25 at the Seawolf Invitational in Alaska. Three days later she repeated the feat at the RMISA/NCAA West Region Championships.

Welcome Back

The Lobos got two alpine skiers back from injury in 2016 as Patrick Brachner, who skied just the opening meet, and Karoline Søvik Myklebust, who skied in just the first two meets before suffering a broken bone in her foot, both returned to the squad with great results in the opening meet.

Myklebust, a 2014 NCAA qualifier and an All-America candidate, opened up her 2016 season with two top 10 finishes, including a fifth place finish in the slalom in her first race back.

Brachner, one of only two on the men's alpine squad with collegiate experience, competed in the giant slalom and finished 21st. He scored 16 points, besting his career total in his first race of the season.

Do You Believe in Miracles? Yes!

New Mexico finished fifth at the NCAA championships, behind only Colorado, Denver, Vermont and Utah. New Mexico recorded 402 points in the meet, and was just 41 points from fourth place. The meet was held at the site of the 1932 and 1980 Winter Olympics, Lake Placid, New York.

The Lobos sat tied for third after the opening day, the Nordic freestyle. The Lobos dropped to fourth after the giant slalom, but picked up big points with Mateja Robnik's win. UNM again got big points and leaped into third after day three when Emilie Cedervärn won the classical mass start.

UNM struggled in the slalom, particularly on the men's side, getting just 75 points, and 56 of those from the women, and the Lobos were passed by both Utah and Vermont.

So How's That New Ski Van for Alpine Working Out?

New Mexico picked up a second fancy van, this for the alpine squad, allowing the team to travel to meets safely and in style. Except for their own home meet, the alpine squad showed up in two white generic passenger vans from the UNM Motor Pool.

What gives? How about vandalism, as one of the windows was shot out of the van by a BB Gun. The culprits were caught immediately the vans were to be ready for the RMISA meets travel schedule.

Can I Buy A Vowel?

Because of Brachner's injury, there wasn't a lot of fun with his secondary school name, but officially, Brachner's graduated from Höhere Technische Bundeslehr-und Versuchsanstalt Waidhofen an der Ybbs. That's 72 letters, one hyphen and amazingly enough, only 18 of the 26 letters the alphabet. Somehow Pat Sajak would say sorry if you guessed G J K M P Q X or Z. If you bought an E you would get you money's worth, as there are 10 of them.

Youri Kidding Me, Right?

The Lobo men's alpine squad lost one of its top guns when newcomer Youri Mougel injured his knee and will miss the remainder of the season with a torn ACL. It's the third time that the alpine squad has suffered a season-ending injury in the last 13 months, following Patrick Brachner and Karoline Søvik Myklebust last season.

Mougel had just turned in his best run of 19th at Utah when the injury occurred. He can apply for a medical redshirt.

Carl Said That. But It's Not Gonna Happen. We Won't Get Weak. That's Not In Us Anymore. We'll Make It Work.

OK, truth....that's Rick Grimes from The Walking Dead ... but he could have said that about our Carl ... Carl-Johan Öster. UNM's most experience alpine skier on the men's side is also out with an injury, his an abdominal issue. He may try to go in Colorado, but if not he also has the option of getting his year back as a medical as well.

Öster was the only returning NCAA men's alpine participant on the team entering the season.

Lobos Finish Fourth at Montana State Invitational

New Mexico got a huge effort from its Nordic squad and finished fourth at the MSU Invitational. The Lobos were sitting in seventh place after the alpine events, but the Nordic squads picked up solid marks in the freestyle and then both the men and the women won their respective Classical races.

Emilie Cedervärn picked up two podium finishes, coming in second in the freestyle and third in the classical. Aljaž Praznik picked up the first podium finish for the men this season by coming in third in the classical race.

Overall, UNM had five top six finishes in the classical race with Cedervärn, Eva Sever Rus and Kati Roivas finishing third, fifth and sixth, and Praznik and Petteri Vaherkoski finishing third and fifth.

Things That You Don't See Every Day

When the Lobos swept the titles of the classical race in Montana at the MSU Invitational, it was the first time the Lobos swept both ends of the same race (men and women) since February 26, 2005 when the Lobos won both freestyle races at the NCAA West Regional meet, ironically enough in Bozeman, Montana. In that race, the Lobo men won by 14 points and the women won by six.

UNM also swept the freestyle races at the Western State RMISA Invitational on February 8,2003

The last time the Lobos swept both ends of the classical race was February 21, 1999 when the Lobos won the men's classic at the University of Utah Invitational 59-58 over Colorado, and the women won the classical race 59-58 over Denver.

That's a span of 16 years, 10 months, 4 weeks, or 6,175 days. Here's how long ago that was. The Mandalay Bay Casino and Resort hadn't opened yet (March 2, 1999), Wayne Gretzky was still playing hockey (retired April 18, 1999), there was no such thing as Spongebob Squarepants (debuted May 1, 1999), there were no Star Wars prequels (Phantom Menace would be released on May 19, 1999), Brandi Chastain hadn't scored the World Cup winning goal (July 10, 1999), and still alive were musician Dusty Springfield, director Stanley Kubrick, baseball legend Joe DiMaggio, musician Boxcar Willie, musician Al Hirt, actress Dana Plato, actor DeForest Kelly (Dr. McCoy from Star Trek) and John F. Kennedy, Jr.



Lobos Net Seven on All-RMISA Lists

Seven Lobos were named to the Rocky Mountain Intercollegiate Ski Association All-Conference team in 2015, including three first teamers in Emilie Cedervärn, Mats Resaland and Mateja Robnik.

Joining them on the second team were Sydney Staples, Aku Nikander, Aljaž Praznik and Eva Sever Rus. Denver led the way with 10 All-RMISA student-athletes, and Colorado and Utah had nine each. Alaska Anchorage and Montana State each had three.

The All-RMISA teams are selected based on the final NCAA Qualification lists, which includes the regular season races and the RMISA Championships. The first five on the list are named first team and then next five are second-team selections. The RMISA MVPs, which were determined and announced at the RMISA banquet in Alaska on February 26, were based on the four regular season meets, totaling 10 races for alpine and eight for Nordic.

Denver's Sebastian Brigovic was awarded the Men's Alpine MVP Award and teammate Monica Hübner won the Women's Alpine MVP. On the Nordic side, Colorado's Rune Oedegaard was named Men's Nordic MVP and Utah's Veronika Mayerhoffer took home the Women's Nordic.

Resaland, Cedervärn and Robnik earned first team honors for the first time in their careers. Resaland, a second team pick last year, was UNM's top point scorer on the season for men's Nordic with 250, and he broke the 1,000-point mark in his career at the RMISA Championships. He picked up a win on the season in the freestyle at the Jade Enterprises/UNM Invitational a win that marked the only time all season in 10 races that Rune Oedegaard or Mads Stroem of Colorado didn't win.

Cedervärn was a revelation, winning her last four races of the regular season. Had she competed the opening weekend she had a shot at RMISA Nordic MVP honors. Still, she led the entire team for the season with 293 points, and she became the first Nordic in school history to sweep the freestyle and classical at an away event, and she did it twice in the span of six days.

Robnik, a second team pick in 2014, has led the alpine squad with 219 points, scoring in eight of her 10 races on the season. She picked up a win at the Seawolf Invitational in the giant slalom, and then came in second in the slalom at the RMISA Championships.

Among the second team selections, Aljaž Praznik and Sydney Staples earned their first honors. Praznik was rock steady throughout the season, although he struggled with a shoulder injury in Alaska that hampered him a bit. Yet, he was the only other person not named Oedegaard, Stroem and Resaland to finish in the top two this season (coming in second behind Resaland in the Jade Enterprises/UNM Invitational). His 164 points were second-most on the men's Nordic side.

Staples entered the season with just one career top-10 finish, but raced her way to second team All-RMISA honors after scoring in six of eight regular season races and recording seven top-10 finishes. Staples earned herself her first career trip to the NCAAs with her breakout season.

Joining Praznik and Staples on the second team were Aku Nikander and Eva Sever Rus. Sever Rus, a first team pick last season, earned second team honors this year after missing the first three races of the season. Sever Rus had a pair of podiums and was the reigning NCAA freestyle champion.

Nikander missed more time than Sever Rus, missing the opening six races of the season while back in Finland. He arrived in time for the last two meets, scoring 105 points with a podium finish at the RMISA Championships.

Thirteen Named To National Collegiate All-Academic Ski Team

Thirteen Lobos were among the 276 student-athletes from 29 colleges and universities that were named to the 2015 National Collegiate All-Academic Ski Team, announced and awarded by the United States Collegiate Ski Coaches Association.

One of, if not the, most difficult academic teams of its kind nationally, to make the team student-athletes must maintain a cumulative 3.5 grade point average in the classroom and have competed in one of three NCAA Regional competitions.

For the Lobos, Kyle Beling, Jessica Gnüchtel, Taylor Grauer, Sean Horner, Mark Miller, Anni Nord, Christian Otto, Sara Ottosson, Juho-Pekka Penttinen, Mats Resaland, Mateja Robnik, Eva Sever Rus and Sydney Staples all were named to the team. Nine of those student-athletes (Gnüchtel, Horner, Otto, Ottosson, Penttinen, Resaland, Robnik, Sever Rus and Staples) competed for UNM this week at the NCAA Championships.

New Mexico's 13 honorees was tied for sixth nationally behind Alaska Anchorage (20), Williams College (19), Utah (15), Northern Michigan (14) and New Hampshire (14).

Head Coach Fredrik Landstedt

Head Coach Fredrik Landstedt, himself a former Lobo Nordic skier, is entering his eighth season as the head coach of the Lobo ski team and his 20th season overall as he served as a student assistant coach and assistant coach before becoming the second head coach in program history the summer of 2007. With Landstedt at the helm of the program, the Lobos have finished fourth, third, third, seventh, eighth, sixth, third and fifth at NCAA Championships.

During his tenure at UNM (assistant coach from 1990-91; 98-2007 and head coach from 2007-present) he has coached 45 Nordic Lobos to 72 All-American awards and four individual event Nordic team national championships, and one individual Nordic national champion. Since taking over as the head coach, Landstedt has fostered 35 Alpine All-America performers and four individual event Alpine team national championships. He has mentored three Nordic individual national champions in Kristina Strandberg (2000), Jimmy Vika (2003) and Eva Sever Rus (2014). He has been a integral part of the coaching staff for six Alpine individual national champions in Marte Dolva (2002), Jennifer Delich (2004), Malin Hemmingsson (2007, '10) and Joonas Räsänen (2013).
