#GoLobos at a Glance (#GoLobos)

The Season:

The University of New Mexico Lobos are in the seventh year of the Bob Davie era, and the team is 3-7 on the season. The Lobos are on a five-game losing streak. Boise State has won five straight, three of which were by a single-score. The Broncos are 8-2 on the season, and just reentered the national polls at No. 23 in the Associated Press poll and No. 24 in the Amway/USA Today Coaches Poll.

The Coaches:

The University of New Mexico Lobos are coached by Bob Davie, who is 33-52 in his seventh season with the Lobos, and he is 68-76 overall in his 12th season. He spent his first five seasons as a head coach manning the Notre Dame Fighting Irish. After leading the Lobos to back-to-back bowl games in 2015 and 2016, Davie has now been the head coach for five bowl teams, three at Notre Dame and two at New Mexico.

The Broncos are coached by Bryan Harsin, who is 50-14 in his fifth season at the helm of the Broncos. He also coached for one season at Arkansas State, going 7-5. He has coached in a bowl game in all five of his seasons.

All player interviews must be arranged through the UNM athletics communications office. The main time for interviews is after practice. Wednesday is the last day for player interviews. For lengthier interviews, please call the communications office to arrange, which we are happy to do, working around class schedules. These will normally take place in the communications suite in the Maloof Center.

Postgame: The UNM locker room is closed. Requested players will be brought to the second floor team room after home games and outside the locker room for road games.

Game Credentials

For media members picking up credentials at will call without parking passes, it is located in the Northeast corner of the stadium by Gate 7 or 8. For media members picking up with parking passes, credentials will be located at the University Drive entrance to the Baseball & Pit East lots with the parking attendant. This should allow you to get your credential without having to wait in line or deal with parking on the north side of the stadium.

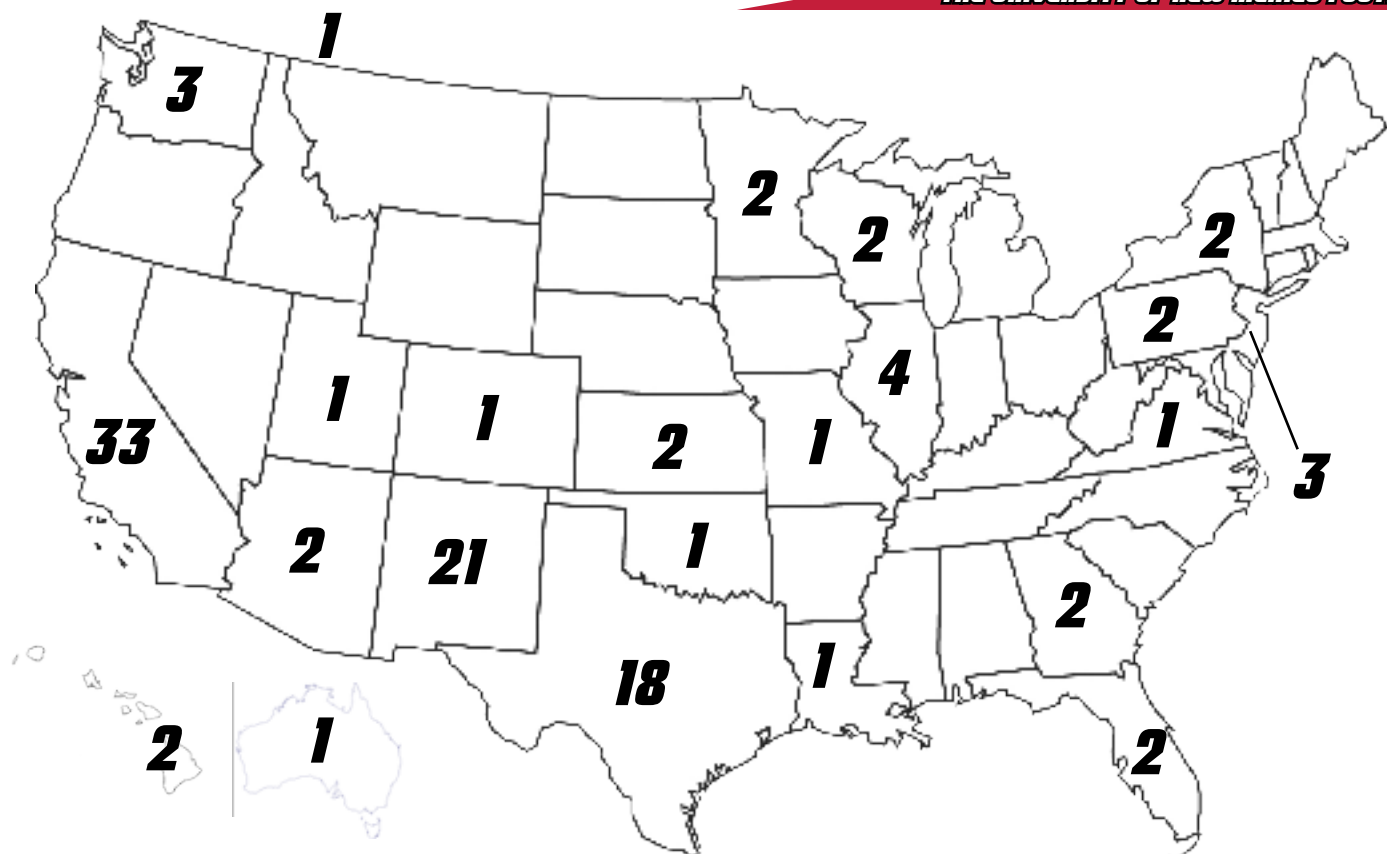

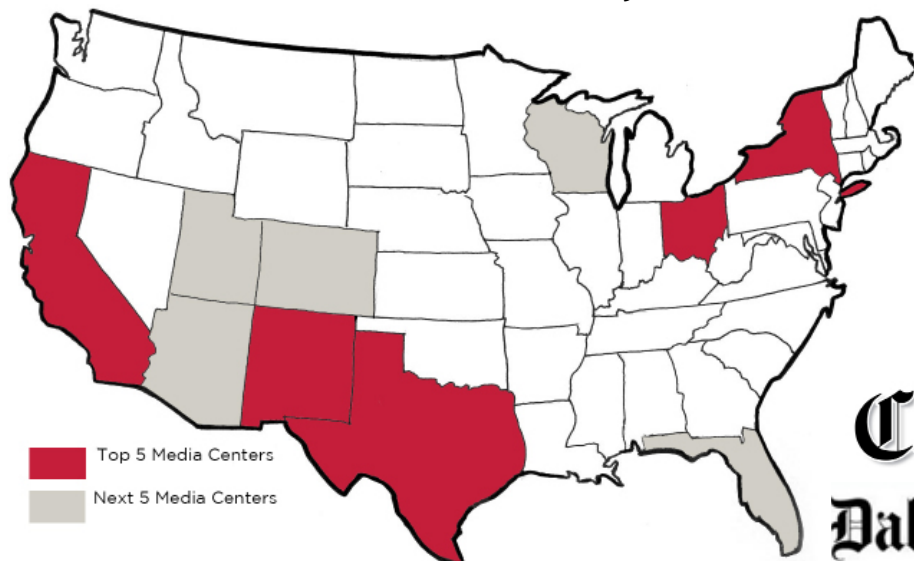

The Opening List

We will get to more of Tyson Dyer's exploits punting the football later, but this week's notes cannot start without a look back at his monster punt against Air Force. Dyer, with the Lobos sitting at fourth-and-six at their own 15 yard line and trailing 35-17, needed a big punt to turn around UNM's fortunes. He certainly did that. Dyer, standing on his goal line, unleashed a punt that flew well over the Air Force returners head, and landed at the Falcon 24, and from there it rolled and died on its own at the 1-yard line. That punt of 84 yards set a host of records. It was the longest punt in the history of The University of New Mexico, which has been playing football since 1892. It was also the longest punt in the FBS this season, and it was the longest punt in Mountain West history by a sophomore.

Since the start of the 2013 season, there have been 46,990 punts by FBS teams, including 6,224 punts in 2018 so far. Over those 46,990 punts, there has been just one punt longer than Tyson Dyer's 84-yarder on Saturday, and that was a 92-yard punt last year by Marshall's Kaare Vedvik. All punts more than 80 yards in the FBS since 2013, and the longest punts in UNM history and subject of a special double dose of this week's opening list:

Lobos Nearing Passing TD Record

The school record for a single season is 24, set over 13 games in the 1997 season. All of those were thrown by one quarterback, Graham Leigh, as UNM made it to the WAC Championship game and the Insight.com Bowl. UNM as a team has now gone over the 20-touchdown pass mark for just the sixth time in school history, and the first since that record breaking year of 1997. With just three more TD passes over the final two games, UNM will tie the school record. Currently, UNM's 2.10 touchdown passes per game is the highest mark in school history, and its currently only one of two seasons in which UNM has averaged at least two touchdown passes per game.

No Penalties? No Problem

When UNM played San Diego State, the Lobos didn't commit a penalty until partway through the fourth quarter. This time the team followed through. The Lobos against Air Force did not commit a penalty. It marked the first time that UNM played a game without committing a penalty since November 17, 1984, when the Lobos did not commit a penalty in a 37-31 at San Diego State. That's a span of 408 games. Five members of the coaching staff were not born yet when this feat last occurred.

Aussie Aussie

One of the toughest things is to replace an NFL starter, but that's exactly what Tyson Dyer has done, and he's done it very well. Dyer, just a sophomore despite his age of 26, took over for Corey Bojorquez as the teams' punter. Bojorquez, who was the starting punter for the Buffalo Bills (and was second in the NFL in punts inside the 20 before going on IR) set a school record last year with a 47.3 average. Dyer isn't quite that high, but he has a shot at breaking into the top five in single-season average.

Dyer is averaging 44.7 yards per punt, including six 60-yarders this season. Dyer is currently second in the Mountain West in punting, and 15th overall.

Defense's Fumble Return for TD Streak Reaches Three

The Lobo defense has turned in quite the unique streak, the only one in the nation in fact. New Mexico is the only school to have returned a fumble for a touchdown in three straight games. It started when Evahelotu Tohi returned a Utah State fumble 18 yards for a touchdown.

The next week against San Diego State, Adebayo Soremekun scored on a 44-yard fumble return against San Diego State. Last Saturday, UNM made it three straight weeks with a touchdown on a fumble return when Soremekun forced a fumble that flew back into the end zone where Jalin Burrell picked it up for a touchdown.

UNM's three fumble returns for touchdowns is tied for the most by a team in the NCAA this season. Ohio State, Fresno State and Temple have also had three fumbles returned for touchdowns this season. But only UNM has done it in three consecutive games. Alabama did have a defensive score in three straight games earlier this season.

Being Tied with Alabama and Michigan is Good, Right?

The fumble return against Air Force was not just the third fumble return for a touchdown, but it was the fourth defensive touchdown of the season for UNM. That puts UNM tied for third nationally in defensive touchdowns with four, as Marcus Hayes scored on an interception return against New Mexico State in the third game of the season. Only Temple and Fresno State, with five defensive touchdowns, are ahead of the Lobos. UNM is also tied with Alabama, Michigan, Ohio State, Utah State, Akron and Middle Tennessee State.

And Now Officially There are Five

Coltin Gerhart started for the second time this season on Saturday against Air Force, meaning UNM has now started three different quarterbacks at least two different games. While it's the third straight season UNM has started three quarterbacks, last year both Tuioti and Gerhart started just one each, while Lamar Jordan started 10.

The Lobos are one of five teams in the FBS to have started three or more quarterbacks in multiple games this season, with Gerhart two, Tuioti three and Sheriron Jones five. Western Kentucky, Coastal Carolina and Air Force have already used three quarterbacks in multiple starts, and Navy and UNM both had a third quarterback start for the second time this season on November 10.

It's the third time in five years that UNM has started at least three different quarterbacks in a season. The last time UNM had the same quarterback start every game in a season was 2007 when Donovan Porterie started all 13 for the Lobos, which went 9-4 and won the New Mexico Bowl 23-0 over the Colin Kaepernick-led Nevada Wolf Pack.

Lobos Scoring on a Top-10 Pace

New Mexico's points for, despite having to switch quarterbacks due to injury several times, is still moving along at a top-10 clip. UNM this season has scored 302 points through 10 games, averaging 30.2 points per game. That mark is good for seventh in the Mountain West, and tied for 58th nationally.

The Lobos have scored 41 touchdowns this season through 10 games. Last year for the entire season, the Lobos scored 31 touchdowns. UNM's record for touchdowns in a season is 63, set just two years ago in 2016.

This also showcases where Bob Davie has taken the Lobo offense, in the season prior to his arrival, 2011, the Lobos scored 144 points. Last year UNM scored 248 points for the season, so the Lobos have easily outscored last year's team. The 30.2 scoring average would rank eighth all-time in Lobo history as the 2018 team has a chance to become just the 10th Lobo squad to ever average over 30 points in a game.

It's Arrived!!! Jenkins To Set School Record on Friday

Aaron Jenkins will go down as one of the top linemen in UNM history. Jenkins was well decorated in the pre-season, earning First Team All-Mountain West honors from both Athlon Sports and Lindy's. Jenkins would have played as a true freshman in 2014, but he injured his shoulder against Arizona State in the second game of the season and earned a medical redshirt, and that medical redshirt has worked to his advantage in a chase for the record for most games played by a Lobo.

This season, Jenkins has played 691 snaps this season, and he has allowed just six total pressures (one sack, one hurry and four hits)

Among the Mountain West's 44 linemen that have played 500 snaps, Jenkins is tied for third in the conference in total pressures with those six, and every player that has fewer pressures allowed has played fewer snaps. Overall in the league he is fourth in pass blocking efficiency at 98.9.

Jenkins now has 50 games played, having started all 48 in the last four seasons. That means his start on Friday will break the UNM games played record with 51 games.

The game on Friday night will set a number of marks:

- *Most games played, 51 (record)
- *Most consecutive games played (49, 1 away from tying)
- *Most starts, 49 (record)
- *Most consecutive starts (record)

Owens Stays Ninth on the Top-10 List

Tyrone Owens is currently ninth on the career rushing charts for New Mexico. On October 27 he surpassed his former teammate Lamar Jordan (who rushed for the most yards in school history by a quarterback) and Willie Turrell. He now has 2,577 yards, and he is 112 yards away from moving into eighth place on the all-time list, ahead of another former teammate in Jhurrell Pressley.

Nearly half of the top 11 career rushing totals, five in all, have occurred in the Bob Davie era.

This is a Three Year Trend Worth Bragging About

As head coach Bob Davie coaches in his seventh season with the Lobos, one can really break up his career at UNM into two three-year segments. You couple that with the three years previous to his arrival and it's easy to see the truly remarkable job he has done in bringing back Lobo football to respectability and making UNM a team no one wants to play.

From 2009-11 under Mike Locksley (and for a few games George Barlow), the Lobos went 1-11 in 2009, 1-11 in 2010, and 1-11 in 2011, putting the Lobos 30 games under .500. Enter Bob Davie and the world's hardest reclamation project. All he did in those first three years was go 4-9 in 2012 (in a season without a bye week), 3-9 in 2013 and 4-8 in 2014. That 11-26 record was a 15-game improvement, as the team went from 30 games under the previous three-year span to 15 games under.

Fast forward to 2015-17, and the squad has gone 19-19. The team went 7-6 in 2015, 9-4 in 2016 and 3-9 in 2017. That marks the second straight 15-game improvement over a three-year stretch, virtually unheard of. Also, it's not just the wins that improved, as the following chart attests:

UNM lost starting defensive end Trent Sellers to a torn ACL prior to the season, lost receiver Q' Drennan on the opening drive to a dislocated hip, and then lost linebacker Alex Hart to an ACL during the New Mexico State game.

New Mexico's kickoff coverage unit never had to do much in 2017 with all of the touchbacks by Jason Sanders, as UNM's average opponent starting field position after a kickoff was the 25-yard line. UNM has used three kickoff specialists so far this year, with Danny Sutton missing the opener due to illness. But Sutton, combined with Dylan Kelly-Romero and Stephen Ruiz, have turned in a better job. The three have combined for 34 touchbacks on 56 kickoffs, but opponents are starting on average at its own 23-yard line. UNM is allowing just 14.89 yards per return over 19 returns this year, which puts UNM's kickoff coverage second in the nation, just behind Eastern Michigan which is allowing 14.83 yards per return this year.

Lobos Looking to Extend Kickoff Return Streak

One of the hallmarks of Bob Davie's teams at New Mexico are kickoff returns. Specifically kickoff return touchdowns. Through nine games in 2017, it was starting to look like a crazy streak for UNM was going to end, but then Elijah Lilly happened. Lilly went 100 yards against Texas A&M for a touchdown, extending UNM's streak of consecutive seasons with a kickoff return touchdown to eight straight. The University of New Mexico now has had 10 in the last six seasons, and it could have been 12, but Elijah Lilly's 100-yard return for a touchdown was called back against New Mexico State due to a holding call, and a 93-yarder earlier in the Texas A&M game was called back via a replay review. Still the 10 over the last six-plus seasons is one behind San Diego State and Kansas State for the most kickoff return touchdowns over the last six-plus years. Here the top 10 FBS teams in terms of kickoff return touchdowns since 2012 and the top streaks in years.

UNM made some changes to its coaching staff for the 2018 season. Along with the addition of a 10th assistant coach, UNM has two new coaches and a couple of responsibility switches.

Calvin Magee has replaced Bob DeBesse as offensive coordinator, the first new offensive coordinator for Bob Davie in his seven-year tenure. Additionally, Magee will coach running backs, necessitating a switch from running backs to receivers for Scott Baumgartner. Baumgartner coached receivers previously at UNM.

The Lobos added Perry Eliano to replace Al Simmons as the cornerbacks coach. Eliano, who came to UNM from Bowling Green, will also take over as special teams

The final coaching addition is Archie McDaniel, who previously coached at UNM before moving to SMU. McDaniel will coach outside linebackers as Kevin Cosgrove will handle inside linebackers. Additionally, Jordan Paterson is now the defensive passing game coordinator. UNM has also added a pair of former players as G.A.'s for the 2018 season with Jacob Girdle aiding the offense and Jake Rothschilder helping out on defense.

You Get a Scholarship...and You Get a Scholarship!

Head coach Bob Davie has announced that Albuquerque native Andrew Shelley, a kicker from Eldorado High School, and California native Johnny Hernandez, a safety from Temecula, have been placed on scholarship. They become the 17th and 18th former walk-ons placed on scholarship, and Shelley is now the 12th New Mexico native to earn a scholarship.

Shelley redshirted in 2017, and he won the starting placekicker battle in Fall camp. He is 20-for-22 on extra points this season, and he has attempted one field goal, a 38-yarder that he made against Liberty. Hernandez redshirted in 2017 as well after transferring from Saddleback Junior College. He is a starter on three of UNM's special teams' units, and he is second on the team in special teams tackles. Hernandez made the opening special teams tackle of the 2018 season.

"I'm very proud of both Andrew and Johnny and how hard they have worked," said Davie. "Both are excellent students and have earned their starting roles and they have been instrumental members not only of our special teams units, but our entire football program."

Of the previous 16 student-athletes put on scholarship by Davie, 11 were natives of New Mexico. Those names include David Anaya, Javohn Jones, Xavier Madrid, Jeric Magnant, Zack Rogers, Steven Romero, John Russo, Thomas Vieira, Michael Walsh, Randy Williams and Reece White. Additionally, Davie has also awarded scholarships to DaQuan Baker, Jared EnRico, Rafael Hidalgo, Kenneth Maxwell and Jake Rothschilder.

Davie Establishes Non-Conference Mark

Bob Davie is the only Lobo coach to record two non-conference wins in each of his first seven seasons at the helm of the Lobos. The only other Lobo coach to ever win at least two non-conference match-ups in his first five seasons was Ted Shipkey, who did it from 1937-41. Here are a few things that did not exist the last time a Lobo coach won at least two non-conference games in his first five seasons:

World War I (World War II hadn't started yet, so World War I was referred to as the Great War.

Daylight Savings Time (started in 1942)

Anne Frank's Diary (she started writing it on her 13th birthday in 1942)

The previous school record was under Coach Davie as well, in 2014 when the team picked up 20. Overall the 81 honorees over the last four years is the best four-year stretch in school history.

The Lobos in 2017 had a team GPA of 2.85, and that was the second-best grade point average over the past 30 Spring semesters. The Lobos also had eight players, Aaron Blackwell, Blaise Fountain, Coltin Gerhart, Javohn Jones, Gabe Ortega, D'Angelo Ross, Kyle Rothschiller and Anselem Umeh all earned Mountain West scholar-athlete.

Field Goals? That's a Thing?

The Lobos tend to go for touchdowns, scoring 41 so far this season. That's in sharp contrast to the amount of field goals that the team has attempted this season, which is six. Those six attempts are tied with Liberty for the fewest field goal attempts of any team in the nation.

New Mexico was the last of the 130 FBS teams to attempt a field goal in 2018, and UNM is one of just two teams in the nation that have not missed a field goal in 2018.

New Mexico will play 10 games in the Mountain Time Zone in 2018, and an interesting scheduling quirk has occurred out of this round of the schedule. With the Mountain West's eight-game conference schedule, the road games within the division are the same every two years, but the cross over games are different, and when you couple in UNM's two non-conference games, you can at least say that the Lobos shouldn't be too jet-lagged.

The 2018 Lobos have five flights and a road trip in the busses to New Mexico State. All told, UNM will travel 7,286 miles road trip from its six road games. Two years ago, UNM also went to New Mexico State, Colorado State and Utah State. However, the Lobos played Air Force in Dallas, and went to Hawai'i instead of UNLV, and Rutgers instead of Wisconsin. Two years ago, the Lobos logged 7,248 miles ... one way, meaning this year's round trip travel is just 38 miles less than what the team traveled just one way in 2016. The team in 2016 traveled 14,048 miles round trip.

UNM's last win over a ranked opponent was on October 25, 2003 when the Lobos won at No. 23 Utah 47-35. UNM's last win over a top 10 program was also against Utah, a 23-21 win on November 5, 1994. UNM is 1-16 all-time against top-10 teams, and this will be just the fifth top-five team UNM has played. Wisconsin is the highest ranked UNM opponent since playing No. 3 TCU to end the 2010 season in Dreamstyle Stadium.

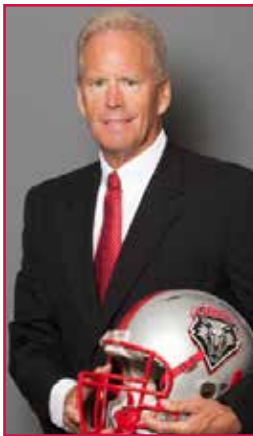

Bob Davie enters his seventh season at The University of New Mexico, where he has led the program to back-to-back bowl games, a 2016 Gildan New Mexico Bowl title, and increased respect in the form of nationally televised games and increased media attention.

The 2017 season saw him complete his 31st season as a collegiate football coach, and it marked his 41st season overall in the sport, including 10 years as a broadcaster at ESPN.

While the 2017 season did not see the results on the field that Davie and the Lobos got used too, it still had many successful moments. The season culminated with four Lobos making it into NFL camps, including the program's first draft choice in eight years with Jason Sanders as a seventh-round selection of the Miami Dolphins. Additionally, Lamar Jordan signed a free agent contract with the Atlanta Falcons and Corey Bojorquez did likewise with the New England Patriots.

The Lobos finished among the national leaders in kickoff coverage and punt coverage, and running back Richard McQuarley tied the school record with five touchdown runs against Air Force.

In addition, the Lobos continued their streak in which the team has returned a kickoff for a touchdown in all six of Bob Davie's seasons as Elijah Lilly took one back against Texas A&M. The touchdown was the 10th in the last six seasons, and that is tied for the third-most in the nation over that time period, and UNM's streak of one kickoff return for a touchdown over the last eight years is the second-longest active streak nationally.

UNM was also strong off the field, with a program record 23 Mountain West All-Academic selections and a 2.85 GPA in the Spring semester, the highest under Davie.

It's safe to say that his first five years at New Mexico has seen him orchestrate one of the best rebuilding jobs in the history of the sport. When he arrived on campus in 2012, he inherited

a program that had gone just 3-37 in the previous 40 games and had the lowest number of scholarship players in Division I. Knowing that back story makes UNM's recent stretch all the more remarkable.

After a big season in 2015 which saw UNM go 7-5 and tie for second place in the Mountain Division of the Mountain West, his team not only met that mark but surpassed it in 2016 as New Mexico went 8-4 overall and 6-2 in the Mountain Division, tying for first place and delivering UNM's first division title since 1997. The Lobos defeated four 2016 bowl teams in Air Force (45-40), Hawai'i (28-21), Wyoming (56-35) and UTSA (23-20), giving the program seven wins over bowl teams in the last two years after going seven straight seasons without a win over a bowl team. The 2016 Lobos feature the nation's best rushing attack, as UNM leads the nation in rushing yards, yards per game, yards per rush, and runs of 10, 20, 30, 40, 50, 60 and 70 yards. The 2016 squad has also set school records for total points scored, points per game, and total offense, nearly hitting the 6,000-yard mark.

The Lobos also tied for the most conference wins in a single season, going 6-2, a mark that was also accomplished in 1982 and 1997. In addition, the Lobos have excelled on national television, winning four games on ESPN's various networks, including a pair of games in November on ESPN2 with a 24-21 win at Utah State and 56-35 over Wyoming, a game in which UNM totaled 690 yards of total offense and 568 yards on the ground.

Defensively, UNM showed vast improvement in its rushing defense, going from 98th nationally to top 40. Dakota Cox led the team in tackles, marking the first time that a Lobo has ever led the team in tackles four straight seasons. Once again, New Mexico got three defensive scores, making UNM one of eight teams in the last two years to register three defensive touchdowns in 2015 and 2016. UNM's defense also had a stretch in 2016 where it allowed 350 yards or less in three straight game, the first time since 2007 it accomplished that feat. The Lobos had eight players earn All-MW honors, including four on the second team.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. — New Mexico racked up 680 yards of total offense and Tervaka Tuioti accounted for five touchdowns including four passing as the Lobos blitzed Incarnate Word 62-30 in the season opener for both teams. The Lobos now prepare to head to Camp Randall to take on a top-10 team in Wisconsin next Saturday at 11 a.m. Central Time.

Tuioti was brilliant in just his second career start. He led UNM to touchdowns on his first four drives. After Incarnate Word opened the game with a touchdown to go up 7-0, Tuioti went to work. He tied the game up with a 10-yard strike to Marcus Williams, and then he gave UNM the lead for good with a 12-yard run, which capped off a 66 yard drive. On the next drive, Tyrone Owens went over from 6 yards out for a 21-7 lead and then Tuioti on 3rd-and-12 hit Patrick Reed for a 69-yard touchdown pass for a 28-7 first quarter lead.

Incarnate Word eventually answered with a 90-yard run by Ra'Quanne Dickens to make it 28-13, but even that didn't work out for the Cardinals and Dickens was hit with an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty, his second of the game, earning an ejection.

After a field goal made it 28-16 with 1:01 to go, a wild sequence led to UNM scoring a back-breaking touchdown. Tuioti threw a deep interception, giving the ball back to Incarnate Word, but Willie Hobby forced a fumble and UNM recovered with 14 seconds to go in the half. Tuioti took over and immediately hit Elijah Lilly with a 51-yard touchdown strike and UNM took a 35-16 lead into the break.

UNM tacked on 13 more points in the third quarter with another Owens touchdown run, this from two yards, and another Williams touchdown catch, this from 33 yards. That made it 48-16. While UNM's offense was scoring seven touchdowns on 12 drives, UNM's defense allowed just one over that same stretch.

In the fourth quarter, both offenses kept rolling as both teams subbed liberally. Coltin Gerhart scored on a 1-yard run, and Sheriron Jones threw a 22-yard touchdown on third down to Anu Somoye for UNM to finish off a big offensive day.

MADISON, Wisc. --- New Mexico was in it for much of the game, but the paced by three All-Americans on the offensive line, the No. 5 Wisconsin Badgers rushed for 417 yards and pulled away in the second half to win 45-14 over the Lobos, dropping UNM to 1-1 on the season.

UNM took the opening kickoff and drove 87 yards in 17 plays with Tervaka Tuioti playing brilliantly, helping UNM convert four third downs on the drive. UNM rushed for 33 on the drive and passed for 44, and the final play was an 11-yard strike to Delane Hart-Johnson on third down for a 7-0 lead.

That lead held for most of the half, with UNM's defense bending but never breaking. On Wisconsin's first drive, the Badgers drove inside the Lobo 10 but could only come up with a field goal. Later in the second quarter on a second-and-goal play, freshman Marcus Hayes, playing close to his hometown in Illinois, forced and recovered a Jonathan Taylor fumble at the 5-yard line.

"We lost our rhythm offensively when Tervaka went out in the second quarter," said Bob Davie. "We needed to play really well, and we needed to get some breaks, and we got a few. I would have liked to have seen what Tervaka could have done playing the whole game, but that's not how football goes."

Wisconsin eventually took a 10-7 lead at the break and on its first drive of the second half, the Lobos got a big stop when Evahelotu Tohi picked off a pass as Alex Hornibrook got hit by Jordan Flack, and Tohi returned it to the Badger 26. UNM couldn't score however when Sheriron Jones, in for an injured Tuioti, went for the lead. He was looking for Elijah Lilly, who had a step, but safety Scott Nelson picked it off at the 2-yard line. That lead to the first of two third quarter touchdowns for Wisconsin, the first an A.J. Taylor 10-yard catch, the second a Jonathan Taylor 5-yard rush.

Wisconsin made it 31-7 on the opening play of the third quarter, but Jones led a nice 75-yard drive that saw Tyrone Owens rush for over 30 yards on it. Jones capped it with a third-down toss of five yards to Elijah Lilly to make it 31-14. The Badgers' Taylor tacked on a third rushing touchdown in the fourth to make it 38-14, and then with just 22 seconds left and the game well in hand, Wisconsin threw a 3-yard touchdown pass to account for the final margin.

UNM threw for 134 yards and went 14-for-24 combined with two TDs and two interceptions. Alex Hart led the way with 13 tackles, Stanley Barnwell added 12 and freshman Marcus Hayes had 10 with a fumble recovery. Tyrone Owens led the way with 57 yards on just 13 carries.

LAS CRUCES, N.M. --- Down 14-0 in the first quarter, down to a third-string quarterback in Sherion Jones, UNM's defense needed to make a stand. Boy did it ever. The Lobos picked three New Mexico State quarterbacks a total of five times, tying a school record, and the defense led the way in a thriller in Las Cruces, winning 42-25 to end a two-game losing streak in the Rio Grande Rivalry.

The win pushed New Mexico to 2-1 for the first time in 11 years, and it kept a hungry New Mexico State squad winless at 0-4 on the season. UNM heads into its bye week with some momentum before hosting Liberty at 4 p.m. on Saturday, September 29 at Dreamstyle Arena.

New Mexico found itself down 14-0 just 4:10 into the contest. On the game's third play, and Jones' first pass, Terrill Hanks picked off a screen and went 28 yards for a 7-0 lead. After a punt, the Aggies behind Matt Romero went 57 yards, the last 2 by calling his own number and just 4:10 into the game it was 14-0.

New Mexico State had the ball again with a chance to go up more, but UNM forced a punt, and freshman Marcus Hayes returned it 27 yards to the Aggie 30-yard line. That field position allowed for UNM to go the distance in five plays, the last a 1-yard run by Ahmari Davis, his first career touchdown. It was the first of four on the night for Davis, whose four were tied for the third most in school history.

NMSU's Dylan Brown tacked on a 42-yard field goal and after one quarter it was 17-7, but that would be the last real salvo for the Aggie offense. On 3rd-and-8, Romero threw the first of his five interceptions as D'Angelo Ross picked it off and returned the ball to the Aggie 27. With that field position, UNM got a second straight 1-yard touchdown run and it was 17-14.

After each team punted, Romero was picked off again as DeJean Rogers did the honors, returning the ball to the 6-yard line. Tyrone Owens, who led UNM with 110 yards rushing, scored to give the Lobos the lead for good, and make it 21-17 at the break after Nick Jeanty was picked off to end the half.

UNM got two more Davis touchdown runs to make it 35-17. The first was the caper of a brilliant 16-play, 80-yard drive that thrice saw Jones convert third downs. One was a 16-yard Jones run on third-and-13, the second was a 12-yard pass to Brayden Dickey and the third was a Davis 1-yard run. Davis' 3-yard TD capped it.

In the fourth, Davis' fourth TD made it 35-17 after Jones led a 12-play, 77-yard drive and Davis scored from 16 yards out. That looked like it was it, but the Aggies made one last push. They went to third string quarterback Josh Adkins, and his wheeler pass to Jason Huntley went for 58 yards, and after a two-point conversion it was 35-25 with 11:06 to go.

After both teams punted NMSU got the ball back and marched to a first and goal at the Lobo nine, and then somehow ran seven plays, recording two first downs, but not scoring. After getting to the Lobo three, a pass interference penalty moved the ball to the 2-yard line. Jason Huntley then scored, but a hold on NMSU moved the ball back to the 12. UNM held and it looked like the Aggies would have to settle for a field goal, but a personal foul on UNM made it first and goal at the 4-yard line. After an incomplete, Adkins tried to hit Huntley in the flat, but Marcus Hayes read it and turned in UNM's fourth interception of the night.

UNM couldn't get a first down and Tyson Dyer unloaded a 62-yard punt into the wind and pinned NMSU after a penalty at its own 19. On third-and-12, Hayes stepped in front of an Adkins pass for a record-tying fifth Lobo interception, and he housed it from 60 yards out for the final score.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- The largest deficit UNM has ever come back from in football was 21 points. The largest fourth quarter deficit was 15. Both of those marks nearly came down on a resplendent Homecoming evening, but UNM's epic comeback bid from 32 points down fell just short, as Liberty defeated the Lobos 52-43.

The game was significant for another key injury as Tervaka Tuioti was lost potentially for the remainder of the season. The quarterback broke his left clavicle (non-throwing shoulder) after getting tackled after a long run. It was a part of a frustrating first half for UNM that saw it jump to a 7-0 lead in just four plays, and then struggle afterwards.

Liberty posted 42 points in the opening half, 21 in each quarter as it bolted to a 42-10 halftime lead. Liberty threw for 303 yards in the opening half with three passing touchdowns from Stephen Calvert. The Flames (2-2) also blocked a punt by Tyson Dyer that Dyer was able to recover, but instead of a safety, the ball was ruled to be recovered outside the end zone at the 1-yard line, allowing for a short score to make it 2:34.

That made it 35-10, and Liberty then converted an interception by Sherion Jones into a touchdown with a quick 3-play, 63-yard drive for a 42-10 lead with 22 seconds left.

UNM's defense held on the opening drive, forcing a punt, and Jones needed two plays to bring UNM 80 yards. After a 1-yard run, Jones lofted a pass to a wide-open Patrick Reed for a career-long 79-yard score, making it 42-16, but the extra point was missed. After the teams traded punts, the offense went to work again. Tyrone Owens gained 31 yards on three carries, and after converting a 3rd-and-3, he hit Anu Somoye for 31 yards to the Liberty 8-yard line. Jones two plays later hit Delane Hart-Johnson on a perfect fade in the end zone to make it 42-23.

Hart-Johnson then had a highlight-reel 44-yard catch on the next drive, setting UNM up for a 3rd-and-goal to start the fourth quarter. Jones hit Marcus Williams for a 7-yard TD, but UNM's attempt at a 2-pt conversion failed, leaving the game 42-29.

The Flames finally answered with a touchdown with 12:26 to go to make it 49-29, and UNM turned the ball right back to Liberty on an interception, it all looked done. Liberty drove to the UNM 24, but on 4th-and-1, it eschewed a field goal for the first down attempt, and Michael Sewell timed it perfectly for a four-yard loss, giving UNM the ball with 8:48 to go.

UNM then went 73 yards in three plays, the final a tip-toe down the sidelines on a pass from Jones by Tyrone Owens to make it 49-36. After a punt, UNM scored again as Owens rushed for his second touchdown of the game and third overall, making it 49-43 with 5:07 to go.

UNM needed a stop but couldn't get it. Frank Hickson rushed four straight times, the last setting up a 3rd-and-4. Calvert hit Antonio Gandy-Golden on a 10-yard hitch route that he converted into a 50-yard gain. It was the last of his career-high 11 catches for 245 yards.

UNM held to force a field goal attempt, with Aaron Peart hit from 22 yards to ice the game at 52-43 with 1:02 to go. UNM drove to the Liberty 26 in the dying moments before Jones was intercepted with 38 seconds left at the 2-yard line.

Jones threw for a career-high 312 yards and threw for four touchdowns in the loss, doing so in just over two quarters of play.

LAS VEGAS, Nev. --- The New Mexico Lobos poured on the juice in the second quarter, exploding for 29 points as the Lobos raced past UNLV in Las Vegas 50-14. The win moved UNM to 3-2 on the season and to 1-0 in the league as the Lobos will now head for another conference road tilt, this at Colorado State.

Both teams were missing its opening day quarterbacks, but UNM's Sheriron Jones, who has played in every game this season, was stellar while UNM's defense made life miserable for UNLV's Max Gilliam. After a feeling out process in the opening quarter, UNM went to work, taking advantage of an Evahelotu Tohi interception of Gilliam that gave UNM the ball at the Rebel 14. On the first play of the second quarter, Zahneer Shuler scored from the 1-yard line to give UNM a 6-0 lead after the extra point was blocked.

That TD opened the floodgates as UNM's defense forced three-and-outs and Jones made the Rebels pay. Tyrone Owens made it 12-0 with a 1-yard run, and Andrew Shelley made it 15-0 with a career-long 44-yard field goal. From then on it was all Sheriron Jones. First, he hit Elijah Lilly over the top for a 74-yard touchdown with 2:56 to go in the opening half, making it 22-0. UNM got the ball back with just 1:14 left, but Jones led a quick drive, gaining 25 yards with his feet and then hitting Anselem Umeh with a perfect pass in the end zone to make it 29-0 with just 17 seconds left in the half.

It was more Jones in the third quarter as on third down he found Emmanuel Harris for a 33-yard touchdown, and then in the fourth quarter after a punt, Jones recorded a fourth touchdown pass with a fade to Delane Hart-Johnson in the end zone. That followed a special teams miscue by UNLV as Tyson Dyer's hit a Rebel in the back, and Dylan Horton fell on the ball for a fumble recovery.

The only blemishes were a pair of fourth quarter touchdowns on drives that were both extended by fourth down pass interference penalties. However, those were it for UNLV highlights as UNM's defense was lights out.

The team recorded eight three-and-outs and UNLV didn't cross the 100-yard mark until there was just 7:02 left in the fourth quarter. UNM's defense recorded a season-high five sacks, including two by Cody Baker and a one by Rhashaun Epting, giving him 5.5 on the season.

Jones became the first quarterback in school history to throw for four touchdown passes in back-to-back games, and he raised his season total to 10 overall. He totaled 322 yards of total offense with 250 passing and 72 rushing.

The win was the largest road conference win for the Lobos in 46 years, and it moved UNM into an early first place tie in the league standings.

UNM achieved near perfect balance offensively, with the Lobos rushing for 252 yards and passing for 250. UNM won the turnover battle 2-1, and converted both into touchdowns while UNLV couldn't turn its one takeaway into points.

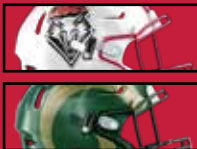

FORT COLLINS, Colo. --- Wyatt Bryan of Colorado State atoned for a shocking 18-yard missed field goal by just squeaking in a 26-yarder with no time remaining as Colorado State nipped New Mexico 20-18 at the wire at Canvas Stadium in front of a sell-out crowd. The field goal extended Colorado State's winning streak over UNM to nine straight, and this might have been the toughest of those to take.

New Mexico bounced back from a 14-3 halftime deficit on the arm of quarterback Sheriron Jones, who was masterful again, going 12-for-20 for 165 yards and two touchdowns without a turnover.

After forcing CSU to punt twice to open the second half, Jones led UNM on an 80-yard drive. Tyrone Owens opened it with an 18-yard run, and then Elijah Lilly went 20 yards on a short pass from Jones. Two more rushes put the ball at the 23, where Jones hit Lilly on a swing pass and Lilly turned on the jets for a 23-yard touchdown. UNM hit the extra point, but an offside penalty moved the ball closer, and head coach Bob Davie went for two and got it when Jones dove in to make it 14-11.

Colorado State answered with a 22-yard field goal from Bryan. After both teams punted, Marcus Hayes set up UNM's next drive with a 53-yard punt return to the Ram 12-yard line. Three plays later Jones hit Delane Hart-Johnson, who leapt over two defenders for a 5-yard score, and Andrew Shelley's extra point made it 18-17 UNM.

After a punt with 8:37 to go, CSU drove 59 plays in 6:08 to set up a chip shot field goal of 18 yards. Sitting at second and goal, Michael Sewell, Jr. made a stop inches from the goal line, and then Nahje Flowers and Evahelotu Tohi made a stop on Izzy Matthews at the goal line. That forced an 18-yard field goal that was missed.

UNM then couldn't get a first down to seal the game. UNM ran it twice to make CSU use timeouts, and on third and five, Jones looked for Jeffrey Jones, Jr., but the connection couldn't be made under tight coverage. CSU then moved down the field, getting a key 12-yard run on second down to get into field goal range. Bryan came on with three seconds left, and his kick started wide but sliced back in for the win.

Things looked bad early as on the second play from scrimmage, Tyrone Owens was hit in the backfield and lost the ball with Tre Thomas sliding on it just before the ball went out of bounds, giving the Rams the ball at the Lobo 12. CSU converted that turnover into points two plays later when K.J. Carta-Samuels hit Preston Williams for a 5-yard score just 1:10 into the game.

New Mexico and CSU both didn't get much going offensively in the opening half, but UNM twice got the ball inside the 6-yard line and could only come away with three points. Down 7-0 in the second quarter, UNM had 3rd-and-2 at the 5-yard line, but Tyrone Owens picked up just a yard on third down, and then Zahneer Shuler was short on the fourth-and-1 attempt, giving the ball back to CSU.

The Rams then went on their only sustained drive of the first half, covering 96 yards on 16 plays. On the drive, CSU twice converted third downs, and on a near identical fourth-and-1 at the Lobo 4, Izzy Matthews just did get the first down up the middle. Two plays later K.J. Carta-Samuels faked a hand-off and fooled everyone for a 1-yard naked bootleg touchdown to make it 14-0.

UNM did respond, getting a 52-yard pass from Jones to Anselem Umeh to the CSU 6-yard line, but UNM could go no further, and Andrew Shelley got UNM on the board with a 29-yard field goal.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- Fresno State was able to handle UNM's offense, and several drives that started in great field position paved the way for the Bulldogs to win their seventh straight game against New Mexico, taking a 38-7 decision over the Lobos. The loss dropped UNM to 1-2 in the Mountain West and 3-4 overall while Fresno State stayed undefeated in league play at 3-0 and 6-1 overall, earning bowl eligibility for the second straight year.

Fresno State twice started drives in UNM territory, and consistently had UNM starting far away from the goal line. UNM's best starting position was its own 29-yard line, and seven of its first eight drives started at the 25 or in.

UNM looked to be in business on its first drive, but Delane Hart-Johnson's 43-yard catch to the Fresno State 16 was wiped out on an offensive pass interference call, and it was a sign of things to come. The defense held on Fresno State's opening drive, forcing a missed field goal, but the Lobos only mustered one first down in the opening quarter.

After the Bulldogs opened the scoring with a 30-yard field goal, UNM was forced to start at its own 4-yard line after a bizarre call in which Elijah Lilly attempted to return a kickoff off, but the play was whistled dead when Emmanuel Harris signaled to his blockers that the ball would be returned and it was interpreted as a fair catch. That was really the sign of things to come.

Ronnie Rivers scored on a 16-yard run with 18 seconds left in the opening quarter to make it 10-0, and he did it again from the 1-yard line to make it 17-0 in the second. UNM got on the board with 57 seconds left when Elijah Lilly caught a pass from Sherion Jones and cruised it in to make it 17-7. However, UNM couldn't keep it there before halftime. After a short pass, UNM was whistled for two personal fouls on the same play, moving the ball 30 yards and well into UNM territory. Marcus McMaryion then hit Keesan Johnson for a 34-yard touchdown, answering with a touchdown in just 21 seconds, making it 24-7 at the break.

The Bulldogs put it away in the second half, scoring on both third quarter drives, the first a 15-yard pass from McMaryion to Johnson and the second a 23-yard pass from McMaryion to Ronnie Rivers.

The Lobos were bit by the penalty bug. UNM was whistled for nine personal fouls before finally getting a 5-yard false start. Twice UNM picked up two personal fouls on the same play, and a targeting ejection.

In what portended to a fitting end, the Lobos drove from their own 17 all the way down to the Fresno State 3-yard line, facing fourth and goal with 14 seconds left. On fourth, Jones threw over the middle to a wide-open Hart-Johnson. Hart-Johnson shook his defender, but as he was catching the pass, the umpire couldn't avoid the play, in effect breaking the pass up and denying UNM a touchdown.

The Lobos will face a second straight one-loss team as UNM travels to Logan, Utah to face the first-place team in the Mountain Division in 6-1 Utah State. That game will be on Stadium/Facebook and it will take place at 2 p.m. at Maverik Stadium.

LOGAN, Utah --- New Mexico had a chance to take a 10-7 lead on a pass to Elijah Lilly in the end zone, but Utah State's Shaq Bond picked it off and then went 100-yards for a score to give Utah State a 14-3 lead, and that opened the floodgates as the Aggies rolled to a 61-19 win at Maverik Stadium. The loss was New Mexico's third straight and drops UNM to 3-5 overall and 1-3 in the Mountain West. The win was Utah State's seventh straight.

The Lobos opened the game up by pitching a three-and-out with a pair of pass break-ups, from Jalin Burrell and Marcus Hayes. UNM then stalled at the Aggie 36-yard line, but rookie kicker Andrew Shelley hammered home a 53-yard field goal, the second-longest in school history. That gave UNM a 3-0 lead.

The Aggies went down the field, covering 82 yards for a 7-3 lead, but UNM drove right back. UNM got a key third-down conversion on a 30-yard pass from Sherion Jones to Delane Hart-Johnson, and then UNM got runs by Ahmari Davis, Tyrone Owens and Zahneer Shuler to put the ball on the 10-yard line. From there, Jones went for Lilly, who had a step on Bond, but Jones' pass was a little behind, and then Bond zigged and zagged his way to a touchdown.

From there, the wheels fell off as Utah State scored on five straight drives with quarterback Jordan Love throwing for four TDs and running for another. Three of those touchdown drives took less than a minute. The final touchdown was Love's 1-yard run on fourth-and-goal and made it 49-3.

The Lobo defense did get a score of their own as Jermaine Conyers recorded UNM's first safety in three years when he tackled Darwin Thompson in the end zone after a fumble.

Jones went 10-for-25 passing for 110 yards but three costly interceptions. He was replaced in the third quarter by Coltin Gerhart, who entered the season as UNM's No. 2 quarterback but got hurt on his lone series in the season opener. This was his first game back and he played well. He threw his first touchdown pass of the season, hitting Brayden Dickey for nine yards. UNM also scored a touchdown when Evahelotu Tohi recovered a fumble and scored from 18 yards out. Both Gerhart and Jones threw for 110 yards.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- San Diego State scored 17 points over the final 7:29, getting a beneficial replay reversal that wiped out a Lobo first down, and the Aztecs snatched a 31-23 win against the Lobos, sending UNM to a fourth-straight loss. UNM must now win its final three games, at Air Force, and at home against Boise State and Wyoming, to become bowl eligible.

UNM struggled throughout the game on offense, recording a season-low 142 yards, including just 41 yards passing. Yet, UNM led nearly the whole game, thanks to three fumble recoveries for the second straight week.

UNM's Adebayo Soremekun had a huge game with two fumble recoveries, a sack and a touchdown. That touchdown opened the scoring as he recovered a fumble by quarterback Ryan Agnew and raced untouched 44 yards for a touchdown to make it 7-0. The Aztecs answered quickly with an extended 14-play, 75-yard drive with Chase Jasmin scoring from 5 yards out.

The only other first half score was set up by Soremekun again, who recovered a Juwan Washington fumble in Aztec territory, and that was eventually converted into an Andrew Shelley field goal of 41 yards, and UNM led 10-7 at the break.

SDSU retook the lead in the third quarter when Washington took a pitch and raced 34 yards to make it 14-10. A third fumble recovery, this by Rhashaun Epting, set UNM to retake the lead. D'Angelo Ross stripped Jordan Byrd and Epting recovered at the Aztec 13-yard line. Coltin Gerhart converted that to a 12-yard touchdown pass to Anselem Ume. The extra point was blocked, which turned into a big deal later, making it 16-14. It stayed that way into the fourth quarter, when UNM went on its longest drive of the game, culminating in a ridiculous one-handed touchdown catch by Delane Hart-Johnson, making it 23-14 to go.

However, SDSU had answers. The Aztecs, behind Christian Chapman, who returned from injury along with Washington, led a 5-play drive to get SDSU right back in it, including a key completion after a 10-yard sack by Erin Austin. Kahale Warring scored from 19 yards out to make it 23-21 with 7:29 to go.

UNM took over on it's 25, and was still there on third down when Gerhart hit a sliding Delane Hart-Johnson for an apparent first down, but the play was reviewed, and the play was overruled, forcing UNM to punt instead of a first down at midfield. That was compounded when Tyson Dyer's punt was returned 34 yards to a Lobo 41.

That set up a short drive and John Baron II, who drilled a 32-yard field goal with 2:56 left for a 24-23 lead. Garhart was then picked off, and it looked like SDSU would just run the clock out, but Washington ended up scoring with 1:52 left in the game on a 50-yard touchdown, leaving UNM within eight points.

However, the Lobos couldn't get a first down, and from there SDSU ran out the clock.

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. --- Air Force rushed for 478 yards, the most allowed by UNM all season, and the Falcons took advantage of two big third quarter turnovers to turn a four-point game into a big lead as the Falcons kept their bowl hopes alive with a 42-24 win at Falcon Stadium. The Lobos will officially not qualify for a bowl for a second straight season.

The Lobos once again recovered three fumbles, and once again returned one for a touchdown, but it just wasn't enough of an answer to an Air Force offense that only punted twice in the game.

The Falcons opened up a 14-0 lead on the strength of a pair of touchdowns on the ground, one to open the game from Christian Mallard and then a second quarter score from DJ Hammond III. The Lobos answered behind Sheriron Jones, who entered in relief of Coltin Gerhart. Zahneer Shuler tumbled over from three yards out for cut the lead in half, and then Dawwon Vigilant scored his first career touchdown, tying the game at 14 apiece with 2:40 left in the half.

Air Force responded with a touchdown just 70 seconds later, as Kadin Remsberg scored from 54 yards out with just 1:30 to go, but Jones led UNM right back with Andrew Shelley kicking a 21-yard field goal before the half to make it 21-17 Falcons, but UNM getting the ball to start the third quarter.

That proved problematic as UNM suffered two turnovers over a three-play stretch, both turning into Air Force touchdowns to give the Falcons a commanding 35-17 lead. UNM got back in it on the strength of the leg of Tyson Dyer. Dyer blasted a school-record 84-yard punt, the longest in the FBS this season. That kick was downed at the one-yard line, and then on the next play, Adebayo Soremekun forced a fumble back into the end zone, and Jalin Burrell picked it up for his first career touchdown to make it 35-24 after three.

UNM then got another fumble recovery when Michael Sewell, Jr. stripped out a ball and Rhashaun Epting recovered, but the Lobos went three-and-out. Air Force then clinched the game with a 3-yard touchdown by Cole Fagan. UNM got just one possession after that.

Gerhart and Jones combined to go 13-for-18 passing for 186 yards. Delane Hart-Johnson had three catches, two highlight-reel variety, for 83 yards. Vigilant led the way with a career-best 67 yards.
