NOTING THE RAMS

- Colorado State University is celebrating it's 150th anniversary, it's sesquicentennial celebration, this year. As part of that celebration, the team will wear a white helmet which features the current Rams-head logo on the side, a 150th celebration sticker on the back and an EDGE sticker on the front during the 2019 Homecoming game vs. San Diego State.
- The Rams enter year five under head coach Mike Bobo, a former quarterback and offensive coordinator at Georgia. Bobo became the 22nd head coach in program history when he ws hired on Dec. 23, 2014.
- Bobo became the first CSU coach to win seven regular season games in his
 first season as the program's head coach as well as the first to lead CSU to a
 bowl game in each of his first three seasons.
- The Rams continued a trend of playing talent, regardless of class, under Mike Bobo in the season opener vs. Colorado. Five true freshmen appeared in the game including two as starters, WR Dante Wright and OL Nouredin Nouili. The pair became the 15th and 16th true freshmen to start in a game under Bobo's leadership (since 2015). More on Page 11
- After returning from a pair of ACL tears that hampered him in the 2016 season and before spring 2018, quarterback Collin Hill was off to a blazing fast start in 2019. However, Hill suffered a third ACL tear in his left knee when he was hit low at Arkansas.
- In his place, quarterback Patrick O'Brien started his first career game against Toledo. The offense didn't miss a beat as they tallied a school-record 694 yards including 405 passing yards, against Toledo.
- The Rams return two starters on the offensive line, Jeff Taylor and Barry Wesley, accounting for 25 starts in their career heading into the 2019 campaign. Wesley, who came to the program as a walk-on, started all 12 games as a redshirt freshman and played all five positions. Offensive Line Starts by Position on
- True freshman Nouredin Nouili became CSU's first true freshman to start on the
 offensive line in a season opener in at least the last 30 years. More on Page 12

NOTING THE GAME

- The Rams and Lobos enter Friday's game both in need of a victory. CSU is on a four-game skid while New Mexico has droped 3 of their last four. Both teams have a victory over an FCS opponent.
- Since defeating New Mexico last season on a walk-off field goal by Wyatt
 Bryan in Fort Collins on Oct. 13, 2018, the Rams have been winless vs. FBS
 opponents a stretch of 10 games and nearly a full calendar year. Similarly, the
 Lobos are 1-10 in their last 11 vs. FBS opponents (NMSU this season).
- CSU's nine-game winning streak over the Lobos is the program's longest active winning streak over an FBS opponent. The Rams have not lost to New Mexico since falling 29-27 in Albuquerque on Nov. 21, 2009.
- The Lobos are the first of three consecutive MW foes who Mike Bobo has never lost a game to: New Mexico: 4-0, Fresno State 2-0, and UNLV 2-0.
- It will be a Friday night game in Albuquerque the second Friday night game this season for CSU (vs. Colorado in Denver) out of four on the schedule.

Media INFORMATION

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request credentials, contact the Communications office. All requests should be made as early as possible and should be limited to working press only. Working space in the Canvas Stadium press box is limited and a photo work room is available on the ground level for credentialed photographers.

MEDIA WILL-CALL: If not received by mail, credentials may be picked up at the Staff/ Media Entrance inside Canvas Stadium. Please be mindful that parking passes cannot be picked up at will-call and must be received prior to gameday.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Credentials for photographers will be issued on the basis of circulation, with priority granted to agencies covering the participating schools on a regular basis. Per NCAA rules, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes.

SIDELINE ACCESS: Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive on the sideline without proper equipment will be removed from the sideline. Credentials must be worn at all times on the sideline. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area. This includes during pre-game activities.

RECRUITS: Per NCAA rule, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their visit (official or unofficial) to campus, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. Contact includes in-person conversations, phone calls, text messages, e-mails, etc. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

GAMEDAY SERVICES: Members of the media covering CSU will be provided with pregame notes for both teams, a game program and a flipcard. Approximately 30 minutes following the completion of the game, a final statistical book, including complete team and individual stats, running play-by-play and postgame quotes from players and coaches, will be available.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS: For home games, head coach Mike Bobo and select studentathletes will hold a postgame news conference with the media in the press conference room on the field level of Canvas Stadium. Media members covering the press conference can take the press box elevator down to the Field Level (FL) and proceed to the room straight ahead.

PRACTICES: CSU football practices are open to media Tuesday and Wednesday for periods 1 through 4. Video is permitted for individual drills only during the open periods, although media may be alerted of other portions that are not available for video. Requests for players and assistants should be made by 11 a.m. on the day of practice.

Head Coach MIKE BOBO

1-5 // FIFTH YEAR

25-32 Overall/Fifth Year

Mike Bobo is in his fifth season as head coach at Colorado State in 2019, having been appointed by CSU President Dr. Tony Frank on Dec. 23, 2014, as the 22nd head coach in program history. In his four seasons at the helm Bobo has guided the Rams to three bowl appearances and led some of the most prolific offenses in Colorado State history. His teams have re-written the school's record books and produced a number of NFL talents, including 2018 Dallas Cowbovs third-round draft choice Michael Gallup.

The former Georgia Bulldog came to Fort Collins from his alma mater, where he had been a record-breaking starting quarterback and spent 16 seasons coaching, including the last eight (2007-14) as offensive coordinator.

Bobo is the only head coach in Colorado State history to lead his teams to bowl games in each of his first three seasons, and joins Sonny Lubick as the only two to coach the Rams in multiple bowl games in their careers. The Rams' offense has been explosive throughout Bobo's time as head coach, with his teams ranking in the Top 10 in school history for yards-per-game in each season, including the school record of 492.5 in 2017.

Bobo's Rams have posted three of the top seven scoring seasons in CSU history and four of the top six figures for passing touchdowns in a season. In 2018 the Rams' 26 touchdowns passes--from two different quarterbacks--ranked fourth in the record books, and CSU ranked 13th among all FBS programs in passing offense (304.9). Despite scoring offense being down and the running game dropping off after the departures of seniors on the offensive line and at running back, Bobo's Rams still managed the 10th-best offensive season in CSU history in 2018, averaging 410.5 yards per game.

Wide receiver Preston Williams and punter Ryan Stonehouse earned second-team All-America honors from Sporting News in 2018.

The 2017 Rams finished the season with a 7-6 record and ranked 11th in all of FBS in total offense (492.5). CSU also ranked second in third-down conversions (50.3%) and eighth in first downs (25.1), also both school records.

Five Rams earned All-Mountain West honors in 2017, including first-team selections Jake Bennett (C), Michael Gallup (WR), Zack Golditch (T) and Nick Stevens (QB), and second-team selection Dalyn Dawkins (RB). Gallup was a consensus All-American (just the

fourth in CSU history) and was a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award.

In 2016, Bobo became the first head coach in CSU history to lead the Rams to a bowl game in each of his first two seasons.

In 2015 Bobo became the only head coach in program history to win seven regular season games in his first season at the helm. Bobo's Rams won four games in a row, and five out of six, to close the 2015 regular season, securing CSU's third consecutive bowl invitation en route to a 7-6 record. CSU's four wins in the season's final month marked the first undefeated November by a Rams team since 1948, and included three road wins--at Wyoming in his first "Border War," at New Mexico and at Fresno State

Five Rams earned All-MW in 2015, including Hunt, who was one of three finalists for the Ray Guy Award. CSU ranked fourth in the FBS in net punting average (42.0) and 17th in kickoff return average (25.1). Bobo's Rams were one of only two FBS schools to have three running backs each record at least one game with 140 or more rushing yards (Dawkins, Izzy Matthews and Jasen Oden, Jr.) and quarterback Stevens set passing records for a CSU sophomore with 2.679 vards through the air and 21 touchdowns (fifth-most in school history).

Bobo's 14-year stint at Georgia, where he had starred at quarterback in the late 1990s, began in January 2001 when head coach Mark Richt hired him as quarterbacks coach, for his second stint with the school. He was promoted by Richt to offensive coordinator in 2007. During his time at UGA. Bobo helped lead the Bulldogs to 135 victories, including two Southeastern Conference championships, five SEC Eastern Division titles and eight bowl victories. The 2012 Broyles Award finalist held the offensive coordinator spot for 92 games with the Bulldogs, scoring 30-plus points 57 times, 40-plus points 29 times and more than 50 points 13

In 2014 Bobo led a Bulldogs offense that averaged 41.3 points per game, which ranked eighth nationally, and racked up 457.8 yards of total offense per game. Against teams ranked in the Top 25, UGA compiled a 3-2 record while scoring 34.4 points per game. The 537 points scored in 2014 established a Georgia singleseason record. The previous singleseason record was set in 2012 while Bobo was offensive coordinator.

Bobo guided several talented

quarterbacks at Georgia, including Aaron Murray, who played from 2010-13. Murray, who was chosen in the fifth round of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Kansas City Chiefs, set more than 25 UGA records and four SEC marks. He became the first player in SEC history to have at least 3,000 passing yards in four consecutive seasons. The NFL's No. 1 draft choice in 2009, Matthew Stafford, also blossomed under Bobo's tutelage. The Detroit Lions' starting quarterback was second-team All-SEC and earned All-America recognition in 2008 for Georgia and was MVP of the 2009 Capital One Bowl.

In Bobo's time at Georgia he also mentored quarterback David Greene (2001-04), who was the winningest quarterback in NCAA Division I history at the time (42), wide receiver A.J. Green, running back Todd Gurley and many others. In all, Bobo helped mold four firstround NFL draft choices at Georgia: Stafford (No. 1 in 2009), running back Knowshon Moreno (No. 12 in 2009), Green (No. 4 in 2011) and Gurley (No. 10 in 2015).

Prior to joining Richt's staff at Georgia, Bobo served one year as an assistant coach at Jacksonville State, after working as an administrative assistant and graduate assistant from 1998-99 at LIGA

Bobo was a quarterback for the Bulldogs from 1994-97, earning four letters, and led the team in passing in 1996 and '97. Among all UGA quarterbacks, Bobo ranks first in single-season completion percentage (65% in '97), singleseason passing efficiency rating (155.8 in '97), second in career touchdown passes (38) and third in career pass completions (445), season passing yards (2,751 in '97), career passing yards (6,334) and single-season touchdown passes (19). In his career Bobo threw for 6,334 yards, which is third-most alltime by a Georgia quarterback.

Bobo, a native of Thomasville, Ga., was inducted into the Thomasville-Thomas County Sports Hall of Fame on Nov. 10, 2016. He joined his father, George, a longtime successful high school coach in Georgia, who was inducted in 2013.

Bobo and his wife, Lainie, have five children, a son Drew (14); triplets Olivia, Jake and Ava Grace (12); and Kate (11).

This Week in COLORADO STATE FOOTBALL HISTORY

25 Years Ago! The Greatest Upset of All-Time! Rams Beat #6 Arizona in Tucson

October 8, 1994 – Sports Illustrated ranked the Arizona Wildcats as the #1 team in the nation in their 1994 pre-season poll. The "Desert Swarm" defense was ranked as the nation's top defense going into their game against Sonny Lubick's #23 ranked team in Tucson that night while Arizona's AP ranking stood as the #6 team in the country. Few people anywhere thought this undefeated Colorado State Rams team could beat such a highly ranked Pac-10 team at home, but the stage was set for the greatest upset in school history.

The Rams came into the game with a 5-0 record riding an eight-game win streak dating back to 1993. Senior quarterback Anthoney Hill had already persevered in close games with BYU, San Diego State and New Mexico, so with the 1994 season in full swing, the Rams offense and defense had hit their stride. Arizona had a potent running back in Ontiwaun Carter, but their defense truly stood in the limelight.


The Rams struck first as Hill took control of his offense and drove the Rams on rushes by Leonice Brown and a leaping catch by Matt Phillips. The CSU offense stunned the "Desert Swarm" defense on a 43-yard pass from Hill to Paul Turner who took the Rams to the Arizona 10-yard-line. One play later Hill rolled out to the right and found Justin Shull in the end zone for the Rams' first touchdown of the night and 7:19 remaining in the first quarter.

Prime Sports Network announcer Drew Goodman described it best when he said, "Justin Shull has just made a library out of Arizona Stadium." The highly praised Wildcats defense had given up what looked like an easy drive for the CSU offense and the fans were silent.

While the CSU offense did their job, the highly motivated Rams defense took care of business holding Arizona and penetrating the Wildcats line continually. Both Garret Sand and Sean Moran continually broke into the Arizona backfield sacking Arizona's quarterback Dan White or hitting Carter quickly on numerous plays. A 4th and inches stop at the 50 by the CSU defense just pumped them up even further as the Rams continued to dominate both sides of the ball.

The CSU defense took over after the stop and although a nice catch from Eric Olsen drove the Rams to within field goal range, David Napier's attempt missed wide to the left. That allowed Arizona a little momentum, but the Rams defense held Arizona to a 45-Yard Steve McLaughlin field goal to make it 7-3 in CSU's favor.

While the CSU offense continue to move the ball, it was not enough to get within scoring range. Arizona's offense began to click with Carter carrying or catching most of the plays from White. Even after an Adrian Ross sack that stalled Arizona's drive, McLaughlin kicked a 35-yarder to bring the score to 7-6 with 2:13 left in the first half.



However, Arizona was not ranked #6 for nothing and they answered the Rams touchdown with an impressive drive of their own thanks to rushes by Carter and swing passes to Carter as well. As Arizona drove to the CSU 11 yard line and seemed in control on offense, it set up one of the greatest plays in CSU football history.

With White under center, Garret Sand busted through the line faster than a jackrabbit and hit the Wildcats quarterback as he prepared to pitch to Carter. The ball came loose and Rams #44 Sean Moran picked up the ball at the CSU 23-yard line and ran it, untouched, the length of the field to the end zone for a very memorable 77-yard touchdown. With CSU now commanding a 21-6 lead, they just needed to hang on to finish the amazing upset as the 4th quarter began

The Wildcats mounted a comeback as McLaughlin hit one more field goal early in the fourth quarter. Carter and White continued to run and pass all over the field as the Rams defense showed some signs of wearing down. With 7:02 remaining in the game, White threw a touchdown pass to take the score to 21-16 and plenty of time for #6 Arizona to win the game.

The Rams and Wildcats stuttered on offense and with 2:38 to play, the Wildcats had the ball and were at the CSU 45-yard-line and down to their last play. On 4th and 10 from the CSU 45, White threw a pass that was deflected by Rams safety Ray Jackson and caught by the immortal Greg Myers. CSU held on and the final score stood 21-16.

The Rams had never beaten a top-10 team on their own turf in their 102-year history to that date. Beating Arizona launched the 1994 Rams 10 spots in the AP poll to #13 nationally and gave them their 9th win in a row and 6th win on the season. There has never been an upset this great, and of this magnitude since that night in Tucson.

THE EDGE PROGRAM

EDGE is the program head coach Mike Bobo wants to serve as the foundation for the Colorado State football ream.

It stands for **Effort, Discipline, Gratitude and Excuse-Free**. It was put into place at the beginning of the off-season program with the intent of holding players and staff accountable for every aspect of their lives. How it works:

Captains were chosen to lead 10 accountability teams:

They are graded in performance, on and off the field, including the classroom, meetings and all team functions. Points can be added or deducted through player's actions. The discipline for being late to a meeting on the first or second offense is the entire team does 25 up-downs, the accountability team they are on does 50 up-downs and the individual does 100 up downs. The discipline increases for continued misses.

If a player loses focus, does a drill incorrectly or does not act appropriately, three up-downs are done by the team on the coach's command.

Awards are givein up weekly for academics, performance, in-season and each semester. The accountability team with the lowest total will have a task assigned by the coach, such as helping do team laundry. Winning teams have been awarded meals with Bobo or other activities.

TRUE FRESHMEN IN STARTING ROLES

Under head coach Mike Bobo, talented players see the field regardless of their classification. Two true freshman started the 2019 opener on offense (Dante Wright; Nouredin Nouili), marking the 15th and 16th times true freshmen have started under Mike Bobo. Mohamed Kamara started vs. San Diego State to become the 17th.

top 10 seasons for offensive yards per game.

THE WRIGHT STUFF

True freshman receiver Dante Wright burst onto the college football scene with his play in the Rocky Mountain Showdown vs. Colorado.

Wright was one of just 8 players to tally both a receiving and rushing touchdown in the same game through Week 0 and Week 1 and of those 8, only two were freshmen (Temple's Re'mahn Davis). He became the first true freshman to score twice in a game for the Rams since Warren Jackson did against Alabama in 2017, and the first to score in a season opener since Joe Hansley in 2012.

Through six weeks, only Wright, Wisconsin's Jonathan Taylor, and Duke's Deon Johnson have multiple games scoring a rushing and receiving touchdown. He was also the first Ram since Gartrell Johnson to score a rushing and receiving touchdown in consecutive games.

Wright leads the nation's freshmen in receiving yards (No. 18 overall) and receptions (No. 24 overall) and ranks 3rd among freshmen in touchdowns.

NOUILI MAKES HISTORY

True freshman Nouredin Nouili started the 2019 season opener at left guard, becoming the first true freshman OL to start for CSU in the opener in at least the last 30 years and first true freshman OL to start at any point since Blaine Saipaia did in week 4 in 1996 (UNLV).

Nouili was also one of only 8 true freshmen to start in all of the FBS in his season opener as well as the only one from a group of 5 school.

COLORADO STATE FOOTBALL -- A FAMILY AFFAIR

While teams across the country talk about their locker rooms being all about family, at Colorado State, the Rams are walking that walk as well.

CSU features three sets of brothers on the team along with a father-son duo in the defensive coaching room in defensive coordinator John Jancek and his son,

former Tennessee quarterback Zac Jancek.

2019 RULE CHANGES

Targeting Foul Changes

Under the new rule, a player who is ejected for a **third or more targeting foul** anytime during the season also will be ineligible for the entire next game.

It does not matter when this additional foul happens: whether it is in the first quarter or the fourth quarter, he will be ineligible for the whole next game. Also, it does not matter when the next game is played. It is the player's next scheduled game—whenever that is.

The role of **instant replay** in administering the targeting foul is also being changed. Every targeting foul goes for instant replay review, as in the past. However, starting in 2019 the replay official will look at all aspects of the play and make one of two rulings: either the call on the field is confirmed or it is overturned. A ruling of "stands" will no longer be possible for a targeting review.

Wedge Blocking on Kickoffs

The three-man wedge has been illegal on kickoffs (when three players on the receiving team align shoulder-to-shoulder within two yards of each other to block for the ball carrier). In 2019, this rule is even more restrictive: the **two-man wedge** will be illegal and will carry a 15-yard penalty. As in the past, the wedge is not illegal during an onside kick or when the play results in a touchback. The only change is that the two-man wedge is outlawed.

Blindside Blocks

A player delivers a blindside block when the opponent cannot see the block coming in time to defend himself. It will now be illegal to deliver a blindside block by attacking an opponent with forcible contact, no matter where the contact is made.

The words **attacking** and **forcible** will be key for the officials on the field in calling this foul. If the contact is to the head or neck area, it is still a targeting foul. However, it will now be a personal foul even if by rule it is not a targeting foul—that is, even if the block is not to the head or neck area. The blindside block foul will carry a 15-yard penalty.

Overtime

Beginning in 2019, starting with the **fifth overtime**, each team will have only one play: a two-point conversion attempt from the three-yard line. Beginning with the third overtime a team that scores a touchdown must still attempt a two-point conversion, but when the fifth overtime begins, the new one-play-per-team rule will take effect.

CANVAS STADIUM

Canvas Stadium is the new name for Colorado State University's 41,000-capacity multipurpose stadium that opened on the school's Fort Collins campus in 2017. The newly re-branded Canvas Credit Union received naming rights to the facility through a \$37.7 million partnership agreement announced in April 2018. The agreement, which stands as one of the largest collegiate athletic venue naming agreements in history, was part of an ambitious re-branding initiative being undertaken by the previously branded Public Service Credit Union, under the direction of company President and CEO Todd Marksberry.

Canvas Credit Union is a not-for-profit, state-chartered, member-owned financial cooperative that has been in business since 1938. Today, the credit union has more than \$2.3 billion in assets and more than 238,000 members – and a mission to help individuals and families make better decisions and grow stronger financially. Learfield's Rams Sports Properties and their Campus+ business brokered the agreement as part of its ongoing support for Colorado State University athletics.

The \$220 million, 727,000-square-foot stadium proved immensely popular and attractive to fans in its inaugural season of 2017, and drew rave reviews from local and national media, as well national television networks that broadcast Colorado State's games to large audiences. The Rams set an all-time attendance record with a total of 192,369 fans and a per-game average of 32,062, representing a 16-percent attendance increase from 2016—eighth-highest in all of college football. Season ticket sales also reached an all-time high of 15,477, a 40-percent increase from the 2016 total of 11,054.

The return of CSU football games to campus from Hughes Stadium in 2017 brought the pageantry and celebration of Rams game days back to the heart of the university for the first time in 50 years, providing countless new engagement opportunities for the entire university. The stadium's design embraces Colorado's natural beauty, topography and visual connections to the Rocky Mountains from campus and ensures functionality for both game-day and non-game day usage.

The agreement with Canvas Credit Union combined with \$20 million given in 2016 to name Sonny Lubick Field brings the total naming rights revenues at Colorado State to \$57 million for the stadium. This compares favorably with the recently announced \$69 million United Airlines Memorial Coliseum at University of Southern California and the \$41 million Alaska Airlines Field at Husky Stadium at the University of Washington. The Colorado State agreement with Canvas Credit Union is for 15 years and includes annual escalator clauses for inflation, as well as a signing bonus, in recognition of the visibility and success of the stadium.



DENVER -- Colorado State turned the ball over four times (2 INT, 2 fumbles) and Colorado turned those takeaways into 17 points as the Buffaloes beat the Rams for the fifth-straight season.

Quarterback Collin Hill threw for 374 yards in his first season opener of his career, and true freshman wide receiver Dante Wright was sensational. The Navarra, Fla. native tallied a pair of touchdowns - rushing and receiving - and was the offensive star of the night for the Rams.

CSU allowed just three tackles for loss in 78 offensive plays and looked much improved over the 2018 unit. Freshman Nouredin Nouili became the first true freshman to start a season opener on the line in at least the past 30 years.

Defensively, Jamal Hicks led all CSU tacklers with 13 tackles. However, the unit allowed CU running back Alex Fontenot to rack up 125 yards and three touchdowns on 19 carries, part of 243 total rushing yards for the Buffs on the evening.

The game was the final match-up between the two rivals in Denver after 10 years.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. (AP) -- Collin Hill had two long touchdown passes in the first quarter and two more scoring passes before halftime as Colorado State pounded Western Illinois, 38-13 in its home opener on Saturday.

The Rams let the season opener at Colorado slip away by turning the ball over four times. This time they forced Western Illinois into four turnovers en route to their first win. Hill wasted no time getting Colorado State on the board, dropping back on the first play from scrimmage and finding Dante Wright behind the Western Illinois secondary for a 75-yard scoring play 10 seconds into the game.

Less than a minute after Nathan Erickson kicked a 32-yard field goal to cut the Leathernecks' deficit to 7-3, Hill found Marvin Kinsey Jr. on a short pass that the senior broke for a 75-yard catch and run for a touchdown.

Hill hit E.J. Scott with a 10-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter and followed that with a 14-yard toss to Kinsey that made it 28-6 at intermission. Hill finished 25 of 32 for 367 yards passing and had four touchdowns without an interception. Kinsey carried 13 times for 89 yards and pulled in two passes for 91 yards and two scores.

FORT COLLINS -- Colorado State ended each half with a long pass completion to the two-yard line, and ultimately came up short at home on Ag Day, falling to Toledo 41-35.

In his first career start, Patrick O'Brien threw for 405 yards on 32-of-52 passing with one touchdown. O'Brien's performance was aided by a career-high 246 rushing yards by Marvin Kinsey, Jr., including his third consecutive game with a 74-yard or better scoring play.

After a tight first half, the Rams were overpowered on the ground in the second half of the frame. As part of 436 total yards on the ground, Toledo tailback Bryant Koback posted 228 yards and three touchdowns on the ground.

CSU tallied the second-most yards in school history in a single game, 694 total yards of offense, but untimely penalities and in-ability to get touchdowns in the redzone proved to be the difference. The Rams finished non-conference play at 1-3.

LOGAN, Utah -- CSU fell in its Mountain West opener despite winning the turnover battle for the first time in the 2019 season. The Rams benefitted from an interception return for touchdown as well as a blocked punt in the first half, but an inability to establish the running game proved to be the difference in the contest.

In a steady downpour for much of the game, both offenses were hampered in their ability to throw the football with any consistent success. However, the Aggies and quarterback Jordan Love were able to pull away with a steady dose of running back Gerold Bright.

Two fourth-quarter turnovers by the Rams led to the deciding points. Receiver E.J. Scott was stripped of the football following a long gain near midfield, but the CSU defense held Utah State to only a field goal late in the third quarter.

With under 10 minutes remaining in the fourth, the Rams were set to mount a long drive from inside their own 10 yard line, but running back Marvin Kinsey was held up in a pile long enough for USU's David Woodward to strip the football and recover it for a touchdown.

FORT COLLINS -- Colorado State was unable to get anything going offensively on Saturday as the Aztecs picked off three consecutive CSU passes and held the Rams to just 18 yards on the ground.

The Rams fell to their 10th-straight FBS opponent in the annual Homecoming game.

SDSU quarterback Ryan Agnew was efficient and steady, completing 16-of-20 passes for three touchdowns including two to receiver Kobe Smith on either side of halftime. CSU's Patrick O'Brien, in his third career start, found Dante Wright for a 57-yard completion, the longest reception of the season the Aztecs have allowed, but the big play offense of the Rams was held otherwise in check.

Colorado State's defense, which had allowed its first three FBS opponents of the season to tally more than 41 points, held SDSU to just 24 and allowed just 91 rushing yards as a part of a season-low 238 total yards to an FBS free
