## RAM NOTES

### THE WEEK

- Colorado State continues Mountain West Conference action on the road this week at New Mexico and UNLV.
- The Rams will play the Lobos on Thursday night starting at 7 p.m., and will finish the week facing the Rebels on Saturday afternoon at 3 p.m. MT
- Both matches will be broadcast the MW Network.

### OPPONENTS AT A QUICK GLANCE

- New Mexico will begin the week with an 11-9 overall record and 5-3 in the Mountain West to be tied for fourth place.
- New Mexico suffered a pair of conference losses last week at San Diego State and Fresno State. The loss against the Aztecs also snapped a four-match winning streak.
- The Rams hold a 55-23 all-time record against the Lobos, with their last loss coming in 2012 in Albuquerque.
- UNLV begins the week with a 14-6 overall record and 5-3 in the Mountain West and will face Wyoming on Thursday night before playing CSU on Saturday afternoon.
- The Rebels split last weeks matches, dropping its first against Fresno State before defeating San Diego State.
- UNLV's Mariena Hayden leads the league in kills, holding a 4.68 average, while UNLV follows conference leader, CSU in hitting percentage with a .239 mark.
- The Rams hold a 39-7 record against UNLV with their last loss coming back in the 2014 season in Las Vegas.

### LOOKING AHEAD

- The Rams will return to Moby Arena and start the second half of the Mountain West schedule, hosting San Diego State on Thursday before playing Fresno State Saturday.

### RAMS AT A GLANCE

- Colorado State will continue Mountain West Conference action carrying a 14-6 overall record and 6-2 league mark to sit tied for second in the conference standings.
- The Rams recorded two sweeps last week in Moby Arena against Boise State and Utah State
- Paulina Hougaard-Jensen set new career highs as the middle blocker led the Rams with 16 kills, while also posting a .727 hitting percentage.
- The junior leads the Mountain West with a .390 hitting mark, while sitting fifth in blocks with a 1.32 average.
- Both Katie Oleksak and Breana Runnels have tallied five double-doubles apiece so far this season.
- The Rams rank 25th in the nation in blocks per set (2.60) as Paulina Hougaard-Jensen (47) and Kirstie Hillyer (85) rank in the top-100 in the country.
- Breana Runnels ranks No. 49 in the nation in kills per set with a 3.99 average. She has reached double-figure kills in nearly every match except for three.
- Katie Oleksak continues to lead the Mountain West in assists per set (11.42) and ranks 15th in the country.

# RAMS

## VOLLEYBALL

## OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Junior Paulina Hougaard-Jensen junior helped the Rams record a pair of sweeps last week against Boise State and Utah State.
- Hougaard-Jensen totaled 27 kills during the week to lead the Rams offensively, while also hitting at a .556 pace.
- The middle blocker also led the Rams defensively with seven blocks, including two solo.
- She also set new career-highs in the match against Utah State flooring 16 kills and hitting .727.

## DOUBLE-DOUBLE

- Breana Runnels and Katie Oleksak have led the Rams so far this season offensively and has contributed defensively to recorded five double-doubles a piece.
- The duo both reached double-figures in two stats at Colorado on Sept. 15 which was the third of the season for each of them.

## RARITY

- Colorado State suffered its first back-to-back conference losses for the first time in nearly a decade.
- The Rams loss at Fresno State, followed by a Border War downfall, was the first time since the 2008 season that CSU dropped consecutive Mountain West matches.
- The matches in 2008 were both road matches, the first at BYU followed by at No. 22 Utah.

## SERVE/RECEIVE

- The service line and serve receive has been a talking point this season as the Rams have been trying to solidify both key parts.
- CSU had total of 28 errors from both service errors and receiving errors at San Diego State.
- The Rams have had 11 matches with double-figure service errors, while having 10 matches with five-plus receiving errors.
- Colorado State has shown some positives this season, not getting aced in two matches this season (Air Force, Indiana State).
- Over the last three matches (all sweeps) the Rams have combined for four receiving errors, the least so far this season in a three match stretch.

## BALANCED ATTACK

- While the Rams lead the Mountain West and ranked No. 27 nationally with a .260 hitting percentage and even lower in kills per set so far this season, they have three different players averaging over two kills per set, including Runnels averaging nearly four.

Through the 2017 campaign, Hilbert owns a career record of 712-198 (.782), including a 538-126 (.810) mark during his tenure at Colorado State. Hilbert boasts a 291-41 (.877) record in conference play since coming to Fort Collins in 1997.

Entering 2018, Hilbert ranks 8th among active Division I head coaches (13th all-time) for winning percentage (.782), and 10th for total wins (712). Of those ranked in the top 20 for wins, Hilbert has coached the second-fewest total matches, owning a career record of 712-198. With the Rams' win vs. San Jose State on Oct. 13, 2017, Hilbert became just the 10th coach in NCAA Division I women's volleyball history to record at least 700 victories and a career winning percentage above .780.

On Nov. 4, 2010, he became the winningest coach in any sport in CSU history, earning a victory over UNLV, his 353rd in Fort Collins. The win surpassed former men's basketball coach Jim Williams' mark of 352 victories. A year prior, Hilbert eclipsed the 500-win mark for his career. At the time, he was one of just two active coaches with more than 500 victories and fewer than 22 years of head coaching experience. Also in 2009, the veteran coach earned his 300th career win at CSU, moving ahead of his predecessor, Rich Feller, who won 299 matches from 1983-96.

The Rams won a seventh-consecutive Mountain West Championship in 2015, also earning regular-season titles in 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014. The seven-year streak was the longest of its kind in the NCAA through 2015. In all, Hilbert has orchestrated 14 regular-season MW titles in 19 years, also adding five conference tournament championships in nine opportunities. The 19 total titles are more than all other MW teams -- past and present -- combined. CSU is 265-37 in MW action under Hilbert, never finishing lower than third. What's more, in 1998, CSU's final season in the WAC, the Rams won the Mountain Division. Of those who have played four seasons for the Rams under Hilbert, each has won at least two conference titles, with all but three winning three or more.

While at CSU, Hilbert has coached 13 players who have earned AVCA All-America selections, including five in the past eight years. On four occasions, a Ram has been named a Volleyball Magazine All-American, and 28 times one of Hilbert's players has been named All-America Honorable Mention by either the AVCA or Volleyball Magazine. Under Hilbert, CSU has also earned 13 MW Player-of-the-Year awards in the league's 19-year history, and a total of 88 all-conference selections.

In addition to 15 total Conference Coach-of-the-Year awards, Hilbert was named the 2013 AVCA Pacific North Region Coach of the Year, his second regional honor during a three-year period and fifth of his career. He was recognized at the NCAA Final Four in Seattle, Wash.

Hilbert has led his teams to 20 or more wins every season since 1992, a span of 26-consecutive seasons, including the final five at Idaho and every year while at CSU.

Expected to be a rebuilding year after graduating four senior starters, the 2013 Rams rewrote the CSU and Mountain West record books, winning their first 27 matches and finishing the season with a .933 winning percentage -- a program record.

The Rams carried over the momentum to 2014, a year in which CSU went 31-3 and advanced the Regional Semifinals of the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2009.

CSU switched to a 6-2 offense for the 2015 season, and did not miss a beat in league play, going undefeated in conference play for the second time (2003) with a 18-0 record against Mountain West foes and reaching a peak national ranking of No. 9.

With six freshmen seeing playing time (including four regularly starting) and only having one senior, CSU went 21-9 (15-3 MW) in 2016, finishing second in the conference and reaching its 22nd consecutive NCAA Tournament.

Colorado State returned to its championship caliber in 2017, adding its 14th Mountain West Championship trophy to the case. The Rams finished 29-4 and 17-1 in the conference, while defeating a pair of opponents in No. 16 Michigan and No. 15 Florida State - both within a week of each other. CSU made its 23rd consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance, rematching with Michigan in the first round. During the season, the Rams were ranked as high as 19 in the AVCA Poll set a program and MW record earning six conference selections.

Hilbert has also turned CSU's home court, Moby Arena, into one of the most effective in the nation, compiling a 301-35 (.896) all-time home record. The Rams are 47-49 at Moby against ranked opponents, most recently defeating No. 16 Michigan on Sept. 8, 2017. Hilbert has 46 total wins against ranked teams, including upsetting No. 1 UCLA in 2000.

With big wins come big crowds. The CSU faithful continuously rank in the top 15 nationally for annual attendance figures. The Rams ranked sixth in the NCAA in 2014, drawing 3,231 fans per match, including a school- and conference-record 7,018 vs. Wisconsin on Sept. 6. Between Sept. 18, 1998 and Nov. 18, 2000, CSU rattled off 44-consecutive home wins, a Moby Arena record for any sport. More recently, CSU has strung together streaks of 21 (2007-08 and 2012-13), 20 (2000-02) and 16 (2011-12).

CSU has been ranked in the AVCA top-25 poll more frequently than all but 12 Division I teams, with many of those rankings coming under Hilbert. In fact, Hilbert led CSU to its highest-ever ranking -- No. 3 for five weeks in 2000. On two occasions (2000, 2001), CSU has finished the year ranked in the top 10, and between Sept. 1, 1999 and Sept. 23, 2002, CSU was ranked 51 consecutive weeks.

Away from the court, Hilbert's teams have set the tone academically. During his tenure, two players have earned Academic All-America honors - Angela Knopf in 2000 and Dana Cranston in 2012. Additionally, the Rams have earned 85 academic all-conference nods under Hilbert's guidance, including 43 over the past five seasons. His team's cumulative GPA continues to be well above 3.0.

Before coming to CSU, Hilbert accumulated a 174-72 (.707) record at Idaho -- which remains the best winning percentage by a coach in Idaho history. He helped the Vandals to the Big West Eastern Division title in 1996, and in the Big Sky, his teams won either the regular season or tournament championship every year from 1992-95. In each of those seasons, Hilbert's Vandals played in the NCAA tournament - posting first-round wins in 1993 and 1994 - and Hilbert was named the Big Sky Coach of the Year.

In his first season in Moscow, the Vandals went 15-14, a drastic improvement from the program's combined 16-41 mark from the two prior seasons. Just five years later, in 1994, Idaho recorded a program-record 31 victories (31-3). Hilbert coached the Big Sky's first All-American in Mindy Rice. He also guided Idaho to its first national ranking - the first-ever ranking by a Big Sky team. In addition to Rice, Hilbert tutored nine AVCA All-Region selections, four Big Sky MVPs and 20 all-conference recipients.

Prior to Idaho, Hilbert spent five seasons as an assistant at his alma mater, Oklahoma, from 1984-88. The Sooners went 115-56 (.673) in Hilbert's five seasons in Norman, including two trips to the NCAA Tournament and an appearance in the 1988 Regional Finals.

Away from the college game, Hilbert has coached several international trips through Bring It Promotions, including winning the Global Challenge in 2009 in Croatia and coaching a USA Select Team in Argentina in 2005.

A native of Norman, Okla., Hilbert earned his bachelor's degree in business administration and marketing in 1984 from Oklahoma. In 1993, he received a master's degree in sports and recreation management from Idaho. Hilbert has resided in Fort Collins since 1997 with his daughter, Myles.

• The 25 digs was also good enough to be tied for second all-time at Colorado State in a three-set match and was just one dig shy of the record holder, Izzy Gaulia who recorded 26 saves against Wyoming in 2011.

## RECORD CROWD

• Colorado State set a Mountain West and program record in its season opener against No. 12 Illinois on Aug. 24.  
• The Rams packed in 7,745 fans into Moby Arena, which led to being ranked No. 2 for attendance in the nation the following week.

## RETURNING OFFENSE &amp; DEFENSE

• The Rams return 69 percentage of their defense, including lead blockers Paulina Hougaard-Jensen and Kirstie Hillyer.

• Over the summer, a trio of Colorado State players received some over-seas experience.

• Breana Runnels also was at the Global Challenge, but with the Mountain West All-Star team.  
• Both teams ended up facing each other in the championship match, with the U.S. coming out victorious via a sweep.

## #700 FOR HILBERT

• Head Coach Tom Hilbert tallied his 700th career win with a sweep against San Jose State (10/12/17) in Moby Arena.  
• The majority of his wins were recorded at Colorado State, while the rest were at Idaho where he was the leader for eight seasons before coming to CSU.  
• Hilbert is the 11th active DI head coach to reach the mark and the 25th of all-time.

## HOW SWEET IT IS

• CSU has qualified for the NCAA tournament all 21 years under Head Coach Tom Hilbert, and dating back to 1995 has played in the postseason in 23-consecutive seasons.  
• It is the seventh-longest active streak in the nation and the 10th-longest in NCAA women's volleyball history.

## MOBY ARENA - 'THE GREATEST VOLLEYBALL VENUE IN AMERICA'

Head Coach Tom Hilbert doesn't shy away when talking about Moby Arena – the home court for the Colorado State volleyball program – calling it the greatest volleyball venue in America. It is one of the most distinctive and effective home-court playing facilities in the nation. Thanks to its dedicated fans, Moby Arena is home to crowds and winning percentages matched by few programs across the country.

## HOME COOKING

Since the start of the 2011 season, CSU has been nearly unbeatable on its home court, going 109-11 (.928).

Including 2017, CSU has gone 23-straight seasons with at least 10 home wins. The Rams went 17-2 at home in 2017 marking 11th consecutive season with two or fewer home losses and the 20th time in program history.

## MOBY MADNESS

A large part of CSU's home-court dominance is the large crowds the Rams draw. CSU averaged 3,231 fans per match in 2014, sixth-best in the NCAA. The Rams attracted five crowds larger than 4,000 in 2014, the second time they've accomplished that feat (1987).

CSU has been ranked in the top 25 for average annual attendance each season since the NCAA began calculating attendance figures in 1986, including the top-10 eight times and No. 1 in 1988.

## RECORD-BREAKING CROWD

A program and Mountain West record crowd of 7,745 watched No. 25 CSU take on No. 11 Illinois on Aug. 24. The figure surpassed CSU's previous high of 7,018, set on Sept. 6, 2014 vs. No. 4 Wisconsin.

In total, eight of CSU's top-10 single-match crowds have occurred since 2010. CSU is 9-5 in home matches with at least 5,000 fans in attendance.

## STREAKING AT HOME

The Rams have had tremendous success at Moby Arena, winning nearly 90 percent of their home matches under Head Coach Tom Hilbert. Since 1997, Hilbert's first season in Fort Collins, CSU is 309-37(.896) at home.

From Sept. 27, 2012 through Nov. 15, 2013, CSU won 21 consecutive home matches. The streak was tied for the second-longest in program history and was the third-longest active streak in the NCAA at the time.

## MOUNTAIN WEST DOMINATION

The Rams have dominated the Mountain West since its inception in 1999, going 267-37. Prior to CSU's loss to San Diego State on Nov. 27, 2013, the Rams had won 25-straight conference home matches, a streak that began during the final regular-season match of the 2010 season. One of the most impressive stats, however, was CSU's 50-match home winning streak against current members of the MW, which dated back to Nov. 4, 2005.

## TAKING DOWN THE BEST

With large crowds come big wins. At home since 1987, the Rams have defeated nine teams ranked in the top 10, plus more than a dozen additional wins against ranked opponents.

During Hilbert's tenure, CSU has hosted 40 nationally ranked teams, coming away with victories in 26 of those contests, including seven of the last 11 dating back to 2007. CSU's most recent win over a ranked foe at Moby Arena was on in the second round of the NCAA tournament in 2014, against No. 19 Colorado.

## THE BIG STAGE

Moby Arena has been an NCAA tournament host in 11 seasons, most recently in 2014. Included in that figure is 2008, when CSU was a Regional Finals host. Being selected to play in front of its home crowd is important to CSU; the Rams are 13-2 in NCAA tournament matches at Moby Arena.

## MOUNTAIN WEST HOME STREAK

Losing a Mountain West match in Moby Arena is a rare occurrence - one that hasn't happen in the last four seasons. The Rams are carrying a 40 match streak that dates back to the 2013 season.

The Rams are have lost just one home Mountain West match in the last eight seasons, (Nov. 27, 2013 vs. San Jose State).
