San José State record: 2-2, 0-1 Mountain West. Most recently, the Spartans lost their conference opener at Air Force, 41-24, on September 27.

New Mexico record: 2-2, 0-0 Mountain West. The Lobos lost a non-conference game at Liberty, 17-10, on September 28.

San José State head coach Brent Brennan: In his third season as the Spartans' head coach. Has a major college coaching record of 5-24, all at San José State. Brennan returned to San José State for 2017 after six seasons as a receivers coach at Oregon State. He was a Spartan assistant coach during the 2005 through 2010 seasons. He is 0-0 as a head coach against New Mexico.

New Mexico head coach Bob Davie: In his eighth season as the Lobos head coach. Has a record of 35-56 at New Mexico. Overall, Davie is in his 13th season as a major college head coach and has a 70-81 win-loss record. He is 1-1 as a head coach against San Jose State.

Series history: San Jose State leads the series, 12-5-1. The teams are beginning their second two-season cycle of Mountain West home-and-home conference games this weekend.

The Lobos won the most recent meeting between these schools, 48-41, in Albuquerque, on October 11, 2016.

San Jose State's last win in the series was a 31-21 victory at home on October 24, 2015. The Spartans have won the last four times these teams played in San Jose dating back to 1975. The last time New Mexico won in San Jose was a 27-24 decision on November 1, 1969. The 1971 game between these teams ended in a 21-21 tie.

San Jose State also has a bowl win over New Mexico winning the inaugural 2006 New Mexico Bowl, 20-12. San Jose State currently has a four-game post-season bowl winning streak dating back to 1990.

A 2-2 record at the end of September: For the first time since the 2015 season, San Jose State enters an October with a 2-2 overall win-loss record. The 2019 Spartans had an opportunity to finish September with at least 3-1 overall mark for the first time since 2012, but lost at Air Force, 41-24.

Mountain West openers: Since joining the Mountain West in 2013, San Jose State is 0-7 in conference openers after losing at Air Force on September 27.

Back-to-back Friday games: For the first time since 1950, San Jose State is playing football games on consecutive Fridays. This week's game vs. New Mexico follows the Friday, September 27 conference contest at Air Force.

In 1950, San Jose State hosted Loyola (Calif.), now LMU, on Friday, October 13, losing 14-7, and traveled to the University of San Francisco on Friday, October 20, suffering a 27-0 shutout loss. After losing to USF, the Spartans, coached by first-year head coach Bob Bronzan, went 4-0-1 to finish the season with a 6-3-1 win-loss record, the program's fifth consecutive winning season in the post World War II period.

KSJS (90.5 FM, San Jose) also will broadcast the San Jose State-New Mexico game starting at 6:45 p.m. (PT).

The Brent Brennan Show is available weekly on Facebook. The next show is Wednesday, October 2, at 6:00 p.m.. All Brent Brennan Shows originate from the Hukilau restaurant located at 230 Jackson Street in San Jose's Japantown district.

Here and there as head coaches: Dudley S. "Dud" DeGroot and **Bob Titchenal** are former head coaches at San Jose State and New Mexico. DeGroot is the most successful coach in Spartan football history with a head coaching record of 60-19-8 during the 1932 and 1939 seasons. He is the only head coach to coach San Jose State to an undefeated season and did it twice in 1932 with a 7-0-2 win-loss record and the program's only perfect season of 13-0 in 1939.

The captain of the 1939 team was Titchenal who would be among the first San Jose State players to play professionally starting in 1940. His pro career spanned five seasons with the Washington Redskins of the National Football League (1940-42) and the San Francisco 49ers (1946) and Los Angeles Dons (1947) of the All-American Football Conference.

Titchenal would return to his alma mater in 1957 as head coach and direct the Spartans to a 33-45-1 win-loss record for eight seasons through 1964. Super Bowl winning head coach **Dick Vermeil** was one of Titchenal's quarterbacks in his first season as head coach in 1957. **Bill Walsh**, another Super Bowl winning head coach, was a graduate assistant on that same 1957 San Jose State team.

At eight seasons each, DeGroot and Titchenal, both enshrined in the San Jose State Sports Hall of Fame, hold the longest tenures as a Spartan football head coach.

DeGroot and Titchenal were the head coaches at the University of New Mexico in consecutive three-year stints. DeGroot compiled a 13-17 win-loss record during the 1950 through 1952 seasons. Titchenal, who earned his master's degree from the University of New Mexico was the 1953 Skyline Conference "Coach of the Year" for leading the Lobos to a 5-3-1 win-loss record. Overall, his head coaching record at New Mexico was 12-15 from 1953 through 1955.

Titchenal was on the losing sideline when the teams played each other for the first time in a home-and-home series in 1954 and 1955. San Jose State won 26-14 in San Jose in 1954 and 14-0 in Albuquerque in 1955.

Emphasis on a positive turnover margin paying off: A point of emphasis for this year's San Jose State team is finishing in the top-25 in turnover margin.

After the first month of the season, San Jose State ranks tied for sixth nationally in turnover margin at +6 or 1.5 per game. The Spartans have seven interceptions, which is tied for fourth nationally, and came up with their first two fumble recoveries of the season in the Air Force contest.

For their first four games, San Jose State lost the ball only three times on two fumbles and one pass interception. Through games of September 28, the Spartans are tied for eighth nationally in fewest times losing the ball.

A year ago, San Jose State finished at +1, a significant improvement from the 2017 season when the team had a minus-26 turnover margin figure.

First blocked kick of the season: San Jose State notched its first blocked kick of the season when linebacker **Hadari Darden** was credited with deflecting an Air Force extra-point attempt following a Falcons' third-quarter touchdown.

The Spartans are one of 59 Football Bowl Subdivision schools to block a punt or a kick-scoring try in games played through September 28.

Aiming to control the run: San Jose State's 2-2 win-loss record parallels the team's success stopping the run.

In wins over Northern Colorado and at Arkansas, the Spartans yielded 110 and 131 yards, respectively, without rushing for a touchdown. In losses to Tulsa and at Air Force, San Jose State's opponents gained 256 and 382 yards, respectively. Tulsa scored three of its four touchdowns in the game rushing. Air Force rushed for five of its six touchdowns.

Quarterback versatility: In each of San Jose State's four games, senior Josh Love and freshman Nick Nash have played quarterback. Love is completing a personal season best of 60.7 percent of his passes. Nash is at 71.4 percent on 14 pass attempts.

Spartans continue with a national statistical leader: With three interceptions for the season defensive back **Bobby Brown, II** shares the national lead for most interceptions per game by a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) player at 0.8 with six other players. Heading into the New Mexico game, Brown shares the national lead for the second consecutive week.

Teammate **Nehemiah Shelton** is one of many players tied for 15th nationally at 0.50 interceptions per game or two in a team's first four games.

Aguayo #2 again: After two weeks as the national leader, San Jose State University linebacker **Ethan Aguayo** is second among Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) players for the second consecutive week in tackles per game at 14.5 in games played through September 28.

Aguayo had game-high honors in the Air Force contest with 14 tackles in a game for the second time this season.

A San Jose State first since 2007: In the Air Force game, freshman **Nick Nash** became the first San Jose State quarterback since **Adam Tafralis** in 2007 to have rushing and passing attempts and catch a pass thrown by a teammate in the same game.

Nash was San Jose State's leading rusher against Air Force with 62 yards on 11 carries and had the Spartans' longest run of the game at 19 yards. He completed 5-of-7 passes without an interception for 82 yards and two touchdowns. In the first quarter, he caught a Josh Love pass for 4 yards.

Nash joins former San Jose State quarterbacks Tafralis, **Scott Rislov** in a 2002 win over UTEP and current University of Oregon offensive coordinator **Marcus Arroyo** in a 2001 NCAA record-setting victory against Nevada as Spartan signal callers to display their offensive versatility rushing, passing and receiving in the same game since the 1976 season.

Since 1976, the feat now has been accomplished 16 times. Former San Jose State running back and current Arizona Cardinals running backs coach **James Saxon** did it four times, three times in 1987 and once in 1986.

Sharing the wealth: Twice this season in the Northern Colorado and Air Force games, at least 10 Spartans caught had a pass reception. In the Northern Colorado victory, 10 Spartans had a pass reception. At Air Force, 11 San Jose State players were credited with a catch.

Historic win at Arkansas: San Jose State's 31-24 victory at Arkansas on September 21 was its first against a member of the Southeastern Conference (SEC) and more.

- San Jose State was named the Reveal Suits National Team of the Week presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). The recognition was the first time the Spartans as a team were honored by the FWAA since the program began in 2002.

- San Jose State now has a 1-6 win-loss record against teams from the SEC. The Spartans are 0-2 vs. Auburn and Florida, each, and 0-1 vs. Alabama and LSU, each.

- San Jose State's 31 points vs. Arkansas are the most points the Spartans scored in a game against a SEC opponent. The team's previous high was 21 points once each against Florida, LSU and Auburn.

- San Jose State picked up its first win over an opponent affiliated with the Pac-12, Big Ten, SEC, ACC and Big 12 since a 35-34 triumph over Stanford on September 9, 2006. Between victories, the Spartans were winless 26 times against teams affiliated with those five conferences.

- San Jose State earned its first road win since defeating Fresno State, 16-14, on November 26, 2016. The Spartans stopped a 13-game road losing streak.

- San Jose State's first non-conference road win since defeating Navy, 12-0, on September 29, 2012.

• San Jose State's first FBS non-conference road against a school affiliated with the Pac-12, Big Ten, SEC, ACC, and Big 12 win since defeating Illinois, 38-35, on September 21, 2002, the same day on the calendar as San Jose State's win over Arkansas.

Spartans close out Arkansas win with fourth-quarter game-winning drive: For the first time since defeating Nevada, 14-10, in 2016, San Jose State's offense executed a late fourth-quarter game-winning touchdown drive in the Arkansas victory. With 2:56 remaining in the game and the score tied, 24-24, the Spartans drove 75 yards in five plays in 1:43 and scored on a 19-yard touchdown run by **DeJon Packer** with 1:13 to go.

Five pass interceptions key defense vs. Arkansas: For the first time since a September 27, 2008 win at Hawai'i, 20-17, San Jose State intercepted at least four passes in a game when the Spartans came up with five interceptions at Arkansas. **Bobby Brown, II** accounted for a game-high two interceptions. **Nehemiah Shelton**, **Ethan Aguayo**, and **Jay Lenard** each had one. The program's single-game school record is six accomplished twice.

For the season, San Jose State has seven interceptions and ranks tied for fourth nationally for most interceptions in games played through September 28. Arizona and Florida share the national leader with nine.

Sharing weekly-high national honors: San Jose State wide receiver **Tre Walker** shared national honors for most receptions in a game for games played on the weekend of September 21 with a personal single-game best 12 receptions for 161 yards against Arkansas. Walker shared the honor with Devin Duvernay of Texas and Colorado State's Warren Jackson, each of whom also caught 12 passes in a game the week of September 21.

Spartans break onside trend: For the first time since the November 1, 2014 Colorado State game, San Jose State recovered an onside kick when **Christian Webb** came up with the football in a successful attempt in the Tulsa game (9/7).

The Spartans had gone 0-for-10 in onside kick attempts during the 2015 through 2018 seasons.

First-time starters: Nine Spartans now can claim starting in a major college football contest. Offensive guard **Tyler Stevens**, running back **DeJon Packer**, wide receiver **Isaiah Hamilton**, tight end **Brett Foley**, defensive lineman **Viliami Fehoko**, linebacker **Rico Tolefree**, and cornerback **Brandon Ezell** made their first major college starts in the Northern Colorado game.

In the Arkansas win, **Derrick Deese, Jr.**, made his first major college start at tight end.

At Air Force, cornerback **Nehemiah Shelton** started for the first time this season.

The Spartans also began the year with newcomers on special teams. Against Northern Colorado, freshman **Andrew Gonneville** was the long snapper. Redshirt freshman **Matt Mercurio** was the placekicker. Sophomore **Chris Wood** took care of kickoffs. Punter and kick-scoring holder **Alex Galland** is a graduate transfer from Yale University.

Ground game moves ahead in opener: San Jose State's 158 rushing yards against Northern Colorado were its most rushing yards since gaining 173 yards at Nevada on November 17, 2017. Quarterback **Nick Nash** led the Spartans with 67 yards on five carries. His 49-yard run was the Northern Colorado game's longest play from scrimmage.

Nash on a dash: San Jose State freshman **Nick Nash** is the first Spartan quarterback to rush for as many as 50 yards since Kenny Potter gained 52 yards and scored three touchdowns on 22 carries in a 41-38 loss to Air Force on November 19, 2016 in CEFCU Stadium.

Nash's 67 rushing yards are the most by a San Jose State quarterback since Potter gained 69 yards and scored a touchdown on 15 carries in the 2015 Cure Bowl victory over Georgia State. Nash's 49-yard run against Northern Colorado was the first time a San Jose State quarterback ran for more than 40 yards in one play since Potter ran for 42 yards against Georgia State.

Pressuring the passer: San Jose State's 4.0 quarterback sacks in the Northern Colorado win was its first time with 4.0 sacks in a game since the 2017 loss to Utah State. Linebackers **Ethan Aguayo**, **Tysyn Parker**, and **Jessie Osuna**, and defensive lineman **Demanuel Talauati** were credited with a quarterback sack against Northern Colorado.

2019 opponents: San Jose State is the only Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) school with games in five different time zones this season. The Spartans will exceed 16,000 travel miles in 2019 with short trips to Nevada and UNLV in the Pacific Time Zone, Air Force in the Mountain Time Zone, Arkansas in the Central Time Zone, Army West Point in the Eastern Time Zone and Hawai'i in the Hawaiian Time Zone.

The only other year San Jose State played in five time zones was in 2015 with road games at Oregon State, Nevada and UNLV (PT), Air Force (MT), Auburn (CT), Hawaii (HT), and Georgia State in the inaugural Orlando, Fla., Cure Bowl (ET).

The 2019 season also marks the first time San Jose State plays two of the three service academies (Air Force, Army West Point and Navy) in the same season and the Spartans' first trip to state of New York.

Coordinator continuity: For the first time since the 2008 and 2009 seasons, San Jose State has the same offensive coordinator, defensive coordinator and special teams coordinator in consecutive seasons with **Kevin McGiven** in the offensive coordinator role, **Derrick Odum** as defensive coordinator and **Fred Guidici** as special teams coordinator.

In 2008 and 2009, the Spartans' offensive coordinator was **Steve Morton**. **Keith Burns**, the current defensive secondary coach at UTEP, was the defensive coordinator, and current San Jose State head coach **Brent Brennan** was coordinated special teams while coaching the wide receivers.

National Football Foundation honors five Spartans with bachelor's degrees: Tight end **Brett Foley**, punter **Alex Galland**, defensive back **Chandler Hawkins**, and offensive linemen **Deano Motes** and **Quinn Oseland** were five San Jose State football players among more than 1,400 honored by the National Football Foundation on August 27 as college graduates playing a final season for their respective schools at the NCAA Divisions I, II and III levels and in the NAIA (National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics).

Foley and Motes are enrolled in a San Jose State M.B.A. program; Galland and Oseland, in a master's in public administration curriculum; and Hawkins, in educational counseling.

New CEFCU Stadium look: During the summer, nearly 9,000 spectator seats were removed from the east grandstand to complete Phase #1 of the Spartan Athletics Center project at CEFCU Stadium. Scheduled to open in 2023, the Center will be the new home for San Jose State football, women's soccer and men's soccer and be available for use by the entire Spartan student-athlete population.

Phase #2, demolition of the east side of CEFCU Stadium, begins after the 2019 season is over. The Spartan Athletics Center will be under construction from 2020 to 2022. In 2023, the east side of CEFCU Stadium will be rebuilt with bleacher seating, concession stands and other amenities.

Versatile Spartans: Center **Kyle Hoppe**, defensive linemen **E.J. Ane** and **Deano Motes**, and defensive back **Zamore Zigler** are four San Jose State players to play both offense and defense for the Spartans.

Ane played on both sides of the ball in the 2018 UNLV and Nevada games.

Zigler was a running back his first two seasons before moving to a cornerback role in 2018.

Motes was a defensive lineman in his first two seasons before moving to the offensive side last season and started eight games.

Hoppe, last year's starting center, played a reserve defensive lineman in 2017.

Family ties: This year's San Jose State team has a wide range of internal family ties.

- Offensive line coach **Joe Bernardi** is the son of former SJSU offensive line coach Gary Bernardi.

- Head coach **Brent Brennan**, is the son of former SJSU wide receiver the late Steve Brennan.
- Running backs coach **Alonzo Carter** is the stepfather of freshman wide receiver **Malikhi Miller**.
- Safeties **Tre Jenkins** and **Andrew Jenkins** are twin brothers.

A master's degree in their future: Tight end **Brett Foley**, punter **Alex Galland**, defensive back **Chandler Hawkins**, and offensive linemen **Quinn Oseland** and **Deano Motes** are five San José State players playing as graduate students.

Foley, Hawkins and Motes are San Jose State University graduates. Foley and Motes are in their first semester as M.B.A. candidates. Hawkins is pursuing his master's degree in educational counseling.

Galland, a mechanical engineering major at Yale University, and Oseland, a business marketing major at the University of Minnesota, are enrolled in San Jose State's public administration master's program.

Beyond Football: The San José State University "Beyond Football" program encompasses personal growth, identifying career objectives and fostering community service. From August 1, 2018 through July 31, 2019, the Spartans logged more than 5,000 hours of activities, an average of about 50 hours a player.

Home stadium name history: San José State and Citizens Equity First Credit Union (CEFCU, pronounced SEFF-cue) are in year three of a 15-year naming rights agreement for the university's football stadium, built in 1933, to be called CEFCU Stadium - Home of the Spartans. CEFCU and San José State Athletics first became partners in 2011 with signage on the stadium scoreboard and at the West gate entry point.

Apparel: In July 2017, San José State University began a six-year, all-sports apparel agreement with adidas. The 2019 season is the Spartans' third with adidas.
