### LOBOS LOOKING FOR PODIUM FINISH AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

For nine straight Novembers, the Lobos have qualified to the NCAA Championships. Last year they won it all, and this year they head back looking to make it two straight.

The sixth-ranked New Mexico women's cross country team heads to the NCAA Championships looking to make it back onto the podium when it runs Friday at LaVern Gibson Championship Cross Country Course in Terre Haute, Indiana.

The Lobos, who have placed top 10 at every national championship since 2009, aren't the favorites to win it like the did last year, but they do have the athletes to contend for another top-10 finish and perhaps even more.

The women have been ranked in the top 10 all season, and have finished in the top four at every meet they've run at, including back-to-back fourth-place finishes at the prestigious Joe Plane Notre Dame Invitational and the Nuttycombe Wisconsin Invitational.

New Mexico also won its ninth-straight Mountain West title in October, a streak that has coincided with their run at the national championships.

However, if the Lobos wants to become the first team since Villanova (2009 and 2010) to repeat as national championships, they'll have to contend with some very talented teams.

No. 1 Colorado ran through the NCAA Mountain Region Championships, topping New Mexico in the meet. No. 2 North Carolina State and No. 3 Providence are also teams with title aspirations, with No. 4 Stanford and No. 5 Michigan also in the conversation.

And while those teams are certain among the ones capable of vying for the crown, the Lobos can counter with their own talented roster, which includes one runner eyeing the individual title.

**Alice Wright**, the 2016 Mountain West and NCAA Mountain Regional champ, looks to make it a clean sweep in the postseason as she guns for the NCAA title.

The USTFCCCA Mountain

Region Female Athlete of the Year, Wright is a definite challenge for the individual crown. A two-time All-American on the grass, Wright was the fifth-place finisher from a year ago — making her the top returner from last year's championship.

The Lobos can also rely on **Calli Thackery** for a scoring run. Another candidate to claim a repeat All-American plaudit, Thackery was 15th and hasn't finished outside of the top 11 at any meet this season.

**Natasha Bernal**, **Sophie Connor** and **Alex Buck** all scored at the Mountain Regional and will be looked on to provide solid runs. Although the Lobos have two proven low sticks, any bid for a podium finish depends on how the Lobos' depth performs.

**Kendall Kelly** (a scorer at the MW Championships), **Kathryn Fluehr**, **Kieran Casey** and **Kyoko Koyama** can also contribute, although the Lobos can, by rule, only compete seven runners at the meet.

### PUTTING NINE STRAIGHT NCAA QUALIFICATIONS IN PERSPECTIVE

The Lobo women have qualified to nine straight NCAA Championships, dating back to 2008. It's one of six active streaks in the NCAA that has reached at least eight years.

UNM's run is also one of just 22 streaks in Division I history to reach at least eight years, and ranks as the sixth longest current streak in Division I history

14, completing the six-kilometer course in 19 minutes, 59.9 seconds.

A two-time cross country All-American, Wright led the Lobo women to their ninth-straight NCAA appearance at the Mountain Regional, winning the race by nearly 17 seconds.

As a result, Wright has been accorded her second such honor in three years after winning the 2014 NCAA Mountain Regional in Albuquerque.

The award, as voted on by the Division I coaches, is the third received by any Lobo athlete in program history, along Wright's first and Sammy Silva's recognition in 2013. Wright is the third Lobo ever to win a women's region race after Silva and Lisa Mitchell (1981).

### THE TOP-TEN STREAK

Although the New Mexico women's cross country team won the NCAA title in 2015, the Lobos aren't a one-hit wonder.

As noted above, the UNM women have qualified to nine straight NCAA Championships. But since 2010, the Lobos have placed top-10 at every NCAA, too.

UNM's streak of top-10 finishes at the NCAA Championships is the longest active streak and is tied for the 10th-longest in NCAA history.

### LAST TIME OUT: WOMEN TAKE 2ND AT NCAA MOUNTAIN REGIONAL

Behind Alice Wright's second individual title in as many meets, the sixth-ranked New Mexico women's cross country team claimed runner-up honors at NCAA Mountain Region Championships in Logan, Utah, securing a bid for the NCAA Championships.

The Lobo women, who have qualified to the national championships for the ninth straight year, battled through illness to a key athlete en route to capturing one of the region's two automatic berths to the NCAA Championships.

On the men's side, New Mexico placed ninth as a team in the 17-team race, missing a potential at-large bid by just a handful of positions.

Wright paced the Lobo women at the Steve & Dona Reeder Cross Country Course,

combining with her teammates to power UNM back to the NCAA Championships.

The New Mexico women extended their streak to nine straight NCAA appearances, the sixth-longest active streak in the nation.

Wright won the race in dominant fashion, covering the six-kilometer course in 19 minutes, 59.90 seconds. She finished over 16 second ahead of the second-place finisher, and claimed the Mountain Regional title for the second time in the last three years. It's also the third title for UNM in the last four years, with Sammy Silva winning in 2013.

Calli Thackery also posted a superb race despite falling ill the night before the race, placing 11th with a time of 20:26.90.

Along with fellow scorers **Natasha Bernal** (27th place, 20:56.70), **Sophie Connor** (34th, 21:13.50) and **Alex Buck** (36th, 21:14.20), New Mexico tallied 109 points.

The Lobos' total was just enough to edge third-place Air Force (111 points) in the low-score-wins format, guaranteeing UNM a spot in Terre Haute. No. 1 Colorado won the 20-team meet with 35 points.

Also running for the Lobos were **Kendall Kelly** (58th, 21:40.30) and **Kieran Casey** (82nd, 22:15.70) as the Lobos, by rule, only ran seven women at the meet.

### WRIGHT NAMED MW ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

Alice Wright captured the individual title at the 2016 Mountain West Cross Country Championships in Kuna, Idaho. By virtue of her winning finish, she was accorded the honor of Mountain West Female Athlete of the Year, which is awarded to the top finisher at the conference championships.

Wright blitzed past Boise State's Peloquin, a two-time USTFCCCA National Athlete of the Week, about halfway through the six-kilometer race to earn her first individual MW title.

Wright finished in 20:02.70, to capture her first victory in cross country since winning the 2014 NCAA Mountain Regional Championships in Albuquerque.

She is the first Lobo to earn MW Female Athlete of the Year since Lacey Oeding claimed the honor in 2012. Ruth Senior (2011) and Natalie Gray (2010) are the other Lobos to have received the honor.

### NINE STRAIGHT

When the New Mexico women's cross country team won the 2016 Mountain West Cross Country Championships in Kuna, Idaho, on October 28, it was the team's ninth straight such title.

That victory broke a tie with former MW member BYU for the conference record for most team titles in women's cross country.

It's also the third longest run of consecutive titles in Mountain West history. Out of the 15

sports the league sponsors, the Lobo women's streak of nine straight is virtually unparalleled.

BYU owns the record with 12 straight titles in outdoor track & field (2000-11), while also sitting with a nine-year streak in indoor track & field (2003-11).

However, the UNM women own the longest streak in any women's sport sponsored by the MW and the longest active streak in any league sport.

The Lobos' run of nine straight is also quite impressive in regards to the entire nation. UNM's streak is the longest active streak in the NCAA, with Alabama State's string of six straight titles in the SWAC closest.

## POLL POSITION

New Mexico women's cross country team is currently ranked sixth in the most recent U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association National Coaches' Poll released Monday, November 14.

The defending NCAA team championships, the Lobo women earned 291 points to stay steady at sixth in the poll.

After starting the season ranked No. 1, it's the fifth straight poll UNM wasn't the top-ranked team.

New Mexico went from ranked No. 1 in the preseason and the first two regular-season polls to No. 2 in Week 3, No. 11 in Week 4, No. 7 in Week 5 and now No. 6 in weeks 6 and 7.

The Lobos were ranked No. 1 for 10 straight polls. However, it is the 40th-straight poll the UNM women's team was ranked, and it marks the 18th time in the last 19 polls that New Mexico was ranked in the top 10.

## WRIGHT NAMED MOUNTAIN WEST ATHLETE OF THE WEEK

Alice Wright was named as the Mountain West Women's Cross Country Athlete of the Week for meets contested September 29-October 1.

Wright, a redshirt junior from Worcester, England, placed second overall and guided the now 11th-ranked Lobo women's team to a fourth-place finish at the Joe Piane Notre Dame Invitational on Sept. 30 in Notre Dame, Indiana.

In her first race of the season, Wright finished with a time of 16 minutes, 16 seconds over the five-kilometer course at the Burke Golf Course.

She finished just 4.3 seconds behind individual champion Anna Rohrer of Notre Dame (16:11.7), who was running on her home course. Wright led the race through one mile and rallied from a third-place standing at four kilometers to finish second overall.

It's the third straight year Wright, a two-time cross country All-American, improved on her finish at Notre Dame. She placed fifth last year (16:29.5) and eighth in 2014 (16:23.2).

Wright is the only athlete along with teammate

Calli Thackery to place top 10 at the last three runnings of the Notre Dame Invitational.

This honor is Wright's first such accolade in cross country, and it's the team's first since Courtney Frerichs was selected after finishing runner up at the Notre Dame Invitational last year.

## 2015 LOBO WOMEN'S TEAM INDUCTED INTO UNM HALL OF HONOR

The Class of 2016 inductees for The University of New Mexico Hall of Honor certainly has a championship feel.

UNM's 2015 NCAA Champion women's cross country team provided that feel, as that team earned was enshrined in a the Hall of Honor Induction Dinner on October 21 at the Crowne Plaza in Albuquerque.

New Mexico cross country also earned coach of the Year with Joe Franklin and player of the year with alumna Courtney Frerichs.

## LOBO WOMEN PICKED NO. 1 IN MW'S PRE-CHAMPIONSHIP POLL

New Mexico women's cross country claimed the top spot in the Mountain West Pre-Championship Women's Cross Country Coaches' poll released Wednesday, October 26. The Lobo men were tabbed fourth in the men's midseason poll.

The polls have the seventh-ranked Lobo women extending their streak of eight straight MW cross country championships at the Mountain West Championships

The New Mexico women, the preseason and midseason coaches' favorites, remained in the top spot in the pre-championship poll, while men's team held steady in the No. 4 position after holding that slot in the preseason and midseason poll.

In the women's poll, New Mexico tallied 10 of the 11 first-place votes for a total of 100 points to earn the top spot. No. 28 Boise State collected the final first-place votes and 87 points to claim second place.

Air Force earned 81 points for third, followed by Colorado State with 71 points and Wyoming with 67 points. Utah State (56 points), Nevada (46), San José State (34), Fresno State (25), San Diego State (21) and UNLV (17) placed sixth through 11th, respectively.

On the men's side, the Lobos tallied 28 points total to place fourth. No. 17 Colorado State earned the top spot in the poll with six first-place votes and 48 points, while No. 24 Boise State came in second with a first-place vote and 41 points and No. 28 Air Force ranked third with the final first-place vote and 40 points.

Wyoming (23 points), Utah State (22), San José State (13) and Fresno State (9) rounded out the eight-team poll, placing fifth-to-eighth, respectively.

## REIGNING CHAMPS

New Mexico women's cross country won the NCAA team title in 2015 and start 2016 looking to repeat. Their title last season was the program's first, and was the University of New Mexico's second NCAA title in any team sport (skiing, 2004).

The Lobos captured their title behind one of the most dominating performances in NCAA history, placing all five of their scorers in the top 25 at E.P. 'Tom' Sawyer State Park in Louisville. UNM combined to score 49 points — the lowest team score by any team since 1982 — en route to a 80-point victory over runner-up Colorado.

New Mexico's margin of victory is the fifth-largest in NCAA history and the best since 2004. No. 2 Colorado finished with 149 points, while No. 5 Oregon was third with 214 points.

2016 Olympian Courtney Frerichs led New Mexico with a fourth-place finish, while **Alice Wright** was close behind in fifth place.

**Rhona Auckland** (13th), **Calli Thackery** (15th) and **Molly Renfer** (24th) also scored for the Lobos, who registered a team spread of 29.5 seconds, the lowest since the NCAA moved the distance of the championship race to six kilometers in 2000.

All five earned All-American honors (which are given to the top 40 finishers). Consequently, UNM was the first women's team to have five All-Americans in a single championships since Villanova in 2009.

New Mexico is also just the first team since the 2001 BYU women to place all five of their scorers in the top 25.

### FRANKLIN'S GOING TO NEED ANOTHER OFFICE TO FIT ALL OF HIS TROPHIES

If your team keeps winning championships, it's completely understandable is you keep racking up the honors yourself. For UNM head coach **Joe Franklin**, that's the reality.

Since he arrived at UNM in 2007, Franklin has claimed 13 (of a possible 18) Mountain West Cross Country Coach of the Year honors, with eight straight Women's Coach of the Year and five Men's Coach of the Year plaudits. He swept both in 2014.

However, since 2009, Franklin has earned all but two MW CoY honors. Air Force claimed two men's Coach of the Year honors, with Juli Benson in 2010 and Ryan Cole in 2015.

### BUT HE MIGHT NEED A WHOLE NEW BUILDING FOR HIS NATIONAL AWARD

The U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) named

New Mexico head cross country **Joe Franklin** as the 2015 NCAA Division I National Women's Coach of the Year.

Franklin coached the nation's top-ranked women's team to one of the most dominating seasons in the NCAA history, and capped off the 2015 campaign with a national title.

The Lobo women won the NCAA Division I Cross Country Championships Saturday at E.P. 'Tom' Sawyer State Park in Louisville, Ky., with a team score of 49 points, the lowest team score in modern meet history.

New Mexico placed all five of its scorers in the top 25, led by its group of All-Americans: Courtney Frerichs (fourth place), Alice Wright (fifth), Rhona Auckland (13th), Calli Thackery (15th) and Molly Renfer (24th).

Franklin and his harriers finished the season with perhaps the best performance at an NCAA cross country meet ever, as the Lobos registered the lowest team score by any team since 1982, the smallest team spread (29.5 seconds) in the history of the six-kilometer championship, the most All-Americans (five) since 2009 and the most top-25 finishers (five) since 2001.

For Franklin, this is his second national coach of the year honor. He was named the USTFCCCA National Men's Coach of the Year in 2004 while coaching Butler University.

### GREAT ON THE GRASS, GREAT IN THE CLASSROOM

New Mexico women's cross country was named the NCAA Division I Women's Scholar Team of the Year for the 2015 cross country season by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA).

Lobo men's cross country was also named as an All-Academic Team, making it the second straight year both the men's and women's teams were named All-Academic.

Individually, six members of the 2015 NCAA team cross country championship team were named USTFCCCA All-Academic, while one member of the men's team was accorded All-Academic honors.

For the women, the Scholar Team of the Year award is the first in both UNM and Mountain West history.

In order to receive the honor, the Lobos not only had to be the top finishing team for their respective gender at the NCAA Cross Country Championships, but also have at least a cumulative team GPA of 3.0. The Lobos posted a team 3.65 GPA last fall, which was also a program record and the 17th-straight semester of at least a 3.3 GPA.

## **LOBO WOMEN PICKED AS MW PRESEASON FAVORITES, MEN 4TH**

New Mexico women's cross country was selected as the favorite to win the 2016 Mountain West women's cross country title, as voted by the league's coaches in the women's preseason coaches' poll.

The Lobo men were tabbed fourth in the men's version of the poll.

It's the sixth straight year that the Lobo women, the reigning NCAA champions, were picked as the preseason favorite. The New Mexico women have won eight straight MW cross country titles, while the men have won six of the last seven men's championships.

The New Mexico women captured the top spot in the preseason poll by earning 99 points and nine of the 11 first-place votes.

The Boise State women scored the other two first-place vote and 92 total points to place second, while Colorado State registered 79 total points to place third. Air Force (67 points), Wyoming (63), Utah State (56), Nevada (53), San José State (30), Fresno State (27), San Diego State (20) and UNLV (19) claimed fourth place through 11th, respectively.

On the men's side, the Lobos tallied 31 points total to place fourth in the men's poll. Colorado State earned the top spot in the poll with five first-place votes and 46 points.

Boise State came in second in the poll with one first-place vote and 43 points, while Air Force was tabbed third with the final two first-place votes and 40 points. Wyoming (23 points), Utah State (19), San José State (12) and Fresno State (10) rounded out the eight-team poll, placing fifth-to-eighth, respectively.

## **WOMEN'S XC/TRACK FINISHES 8TH IN PROGRAM OF THE YEAR STANDINGS**

New Mexico women's cross country and track & field program placed eighth in the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association's Terry Crawford Program of the Year award standings for the 2015-16 academic year.

The Lobos combined to gain 46.5 points for their best-ever finish in the final standings, which combine the teams' finishes from the 2015 NCAA Cross Country Championships, 2016 NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championships and the 2016 NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships.

It's the third time in program history that the Joe Franklin-coached women earned the award, after placing 16th in 2012 and 14th last year.

New Mexico is the highest-finishing school from a non-Power Five conference.

The women's cross country team got New Mexico in the standings first as the Lobos won the NCAA Cross Country Championships in November. It's the second ever national title in

any sport in New Mexico history. UNM continued to shine during indoor track, as Sophie Connor (fifth in the mile) and Calli Thackery (6th in the 3000) helped the Lobos to a 30th-place finish in the team standings.

The UNM women's capped the year with another national title, as Courtney Frerichs captured the NCAA championship and NCAA record in the 3,000-meter steeplechase at NCAA Outdoor Championships. **Alice Wright** added a runner-up performance in the 10,000, helping the Lobos post program bests in team finish (15th) and team points scored (18th).

Presented annually since 2009, the NCAA Division I Program of the Year Award recognizes the most outstanding cross country and track & field programs in Division I based on the institution's performance through the academic year. Final standings are predicated on the institution's combined finishes at the NCAA Division I Championships in cross country, indoor track & field, and outdoor track & field.

To be eligible for the award, teams must qualify for all three NCAA Championships. Scores for award are calculated from the team's each finish at those championships (i.e., first place earns one point, second place two points, 31st place 31 points, etc.). The team with the lowest total score for all three championships receives the award.

15 women's teams scored at all three 2015-16 championships. Leading the final standings was NCAA indoor champions Oregon (six points), with NCAA outdoor champs Arkansas (12) and Oklahoma State (29.5) rounding out the top three.
